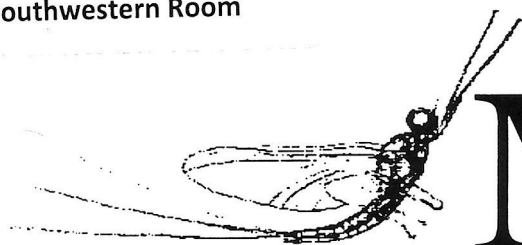

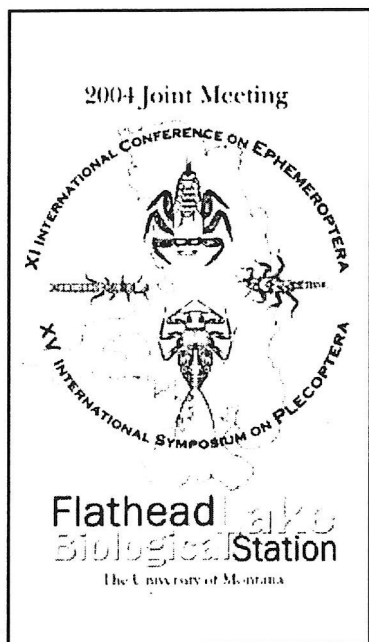

## Guidelines for Conference Proposals

As reported in the February 2002 newsletter, the representatives from the International Conferences on Ephemeroptera and the International Society of Plecopterologists agreed, during the joint business meeting on 9 August 2001 in Perugia, that there should be a set of guidelines for submitting proposals to host conferences. Peter Zwick, Michel Sartori, and Peter Grant were appointed to prepare these guidelines.

### Final proposals to host 2007 conference

1. Proposal should be submitted at least one month prior to the conference during which the proposal will be officially presented.
2. A copy of this proposal should be sent to the chair of each committee - International Conferences for Ephemeroptera and the International Society of Plecopterologists.
3. Proposal should be submitted by email. This facilitates distribution of the proposal to the members of the two committees.

## Auction for W. L. Peters Scholarship Fund

An auction will be held at the XI International Conference in Montana to benefit the William L. Peters Scholarship Fund. This will be a silent auction, where all items to be auctioned will be displayed during the first two days of the meeting. A sheet of paper will be placed next to each item so that individuals may write down the amount they wish to bid for the item. At the deadline, the person who submitted the highest bid wins that item. Since this meeting is in the US, bids will be in US dollars.

For now we are asking you to think about what you might like to donate to this auction. Certainly anything with a mayfly theme would be appropriate, such as books or other publications, color slides, photographs, artwork or jewelry. Collecting equipment, rare or unusual mayfly specimens, and tied flies for fly-fishing would be good options, too.

Donated items do not have to deal with mayflies, though. For example, consider donating interesting art or craftwork from your country or possibly souvenirs of Montana or the USA.

## Lewis Berner 1932-2004

Lewis Berner of Gainesville, Florida, died 19 January 2004, at Palm Garden. He was 88.

Dr. Berner was born in Savannah, Georgia, and moved to Gainesville from Miami, Florida, in 1932. He was a retired professor of biological sciences at the University of Florida.

He received a bachelor's degree with honors in 1937, a master's degree in 1939 and a Ph.D. in 1941, all at the University of Florida, where he was a member of Phi Kappa Phi, Alpha Epsilon Delta, Phi Sigma, Sigma Xi and Phi Beta Kappa.

He was a U.S. Army veteran of World War II, and served in West Africa and the Philippines. He retired from the U.S. Army Reserve in 1969 as a colonel.

He joined the University of Florida faculty in 1946, was promoted to associate professor in 1951 and became professor in 1954. He served as chairman and director of the department of biological sciences, and was named professor emeritus in 1984.

He was a member of Entomological Society of America and Rotary Club of Greater Gainesville, and received the Blue Key Distinguished Faculty Award in 1967, Paul Harris Fellowship in 1982 and Florida Entomological Society Certificate of Merit in 1984.

Survivors include his wife, Amelia Pauline Berner of Gainesville; daughters Cheryl Thompson of Jacksonville and Roberta Berner of Lebanon, New Hampshire; and two grandchildren. (Reprinted with permission from the *Gainesville Sun*.)

### Nomenclatural News: Maintaining Prevailing Usage (ICZN 23.9.3.) Proposed for *Baetis pentapleobodes* UJHELYI, 1966

By some authors the name *Baetis pentapleobodes* has recently been considered a junior synonym. The matter has been referred to the International Commission on Zoological Nomenclature (case no. 3322) for a ruling under the plenary powers. While the case is under consideration the use of the name *Baetis pentapleobodes* is to be maintained until an opinion on the case is published in the *Bulletin of Zoological Nomenclature*.

## FreshwaterLife Website: Pan-European Key to Larval Ephemeroptera Proposed

I'd like to take this opportunity to introduce you to FreshwaterLife – a collaborative website providing easy access to freshwater information.

The main aim of FreshwaterLife is to bring together information on freshwater and the organisms that live in freshwater habitats. By giving easy access to information, FreshwaterLife will educate, inform and promote the importance of the world's freshwaters.

Within the overall framework, FreshwaterLife has four principle focus areas or work programmes:

1. The habitat and life history of freshwater animals and plants is captured in the FreshwaterLife ecological database.
2. Identification guides and training tools, principally through online taxonomic keys.
3. Collation and promotion of standards and methods for scientific research, monitoring, policy implementation and biological data storage and exchange.
4. Improving the flow of information and discussion between different parties involved with freshwater (researchers, regulators, policy makers, implementers and the general

public). A vehicle for this is the FreshwaterLife Network.

FreshwaterLife works on the principle of collaboration. That by working together, with each individual or organisation contributing their part, the whole can become much more useful to everyone.

One of the major projects for FreshwaterLife commencing in 2004 is to produce a truly pan-European key to larval Ephemeroptera to be made freely available on the FreshwaterLife website. Success with this project will only be possible if experts from around Europe share information and experiences.

Preliminary proposals to host a conference may be submitted six years prior to the year of the proposed conference, but a final vote on the conference site will not be made until three years prior to the actual conference date.
