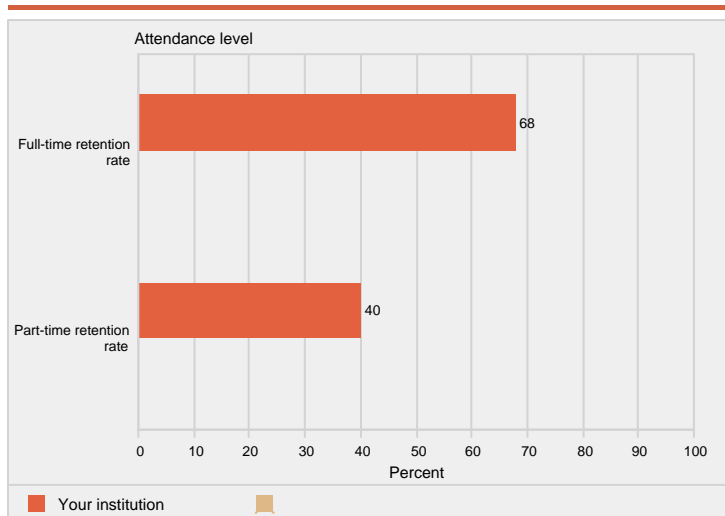

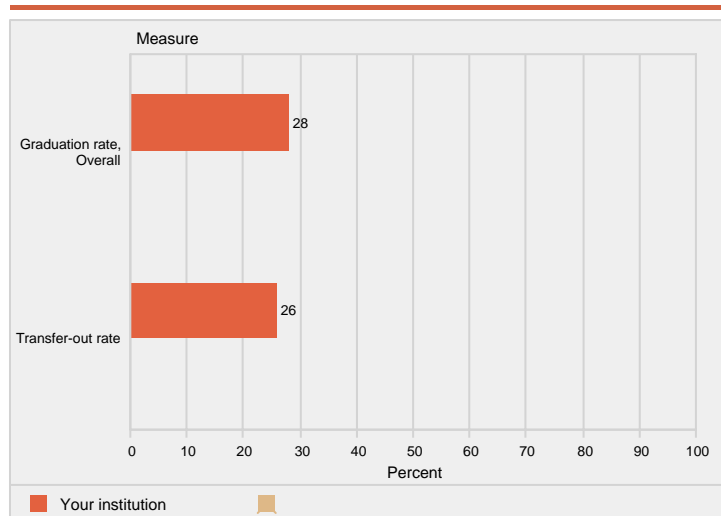
Figure 1. Retention rates of first-time bachelor's degree seeking students, by attendance level: Fall 2015 cohort



NOTE: Retention rates are measured from the fall of first enrollment to the following fall. Academic reporting institutions report retention data as of the institution's official fall reporting date or as of October 15, 2015. Program reporters determine the cohort with enrollment any time between August 1-October 31, 2015 and retention based on August 1, 2016. Four-year institutions report retention rates for students seeking a bachelor's degree. For more details, see the Methodological Notes. N is the number of institutions in the comparison group. Medians are not reported for comparison groups with less than three values.

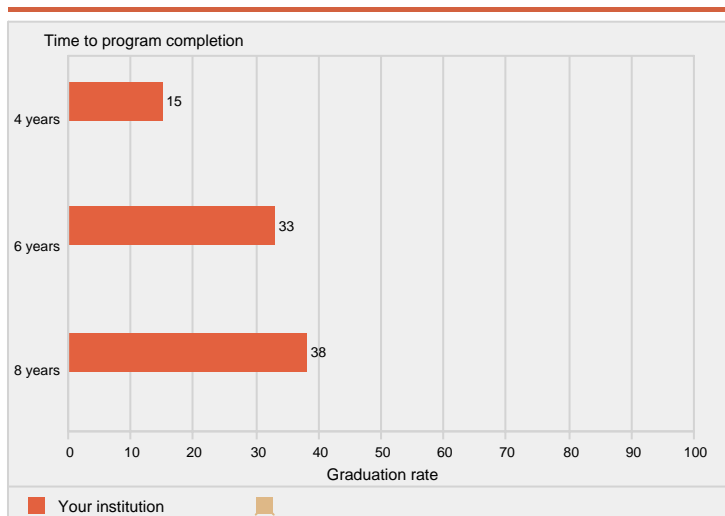
Figure 2. Graduation and transfer-out rates of full-time, first-time degree/certificate-seeking undergraduates within 150% of normal time to program completion: 2010 cohort

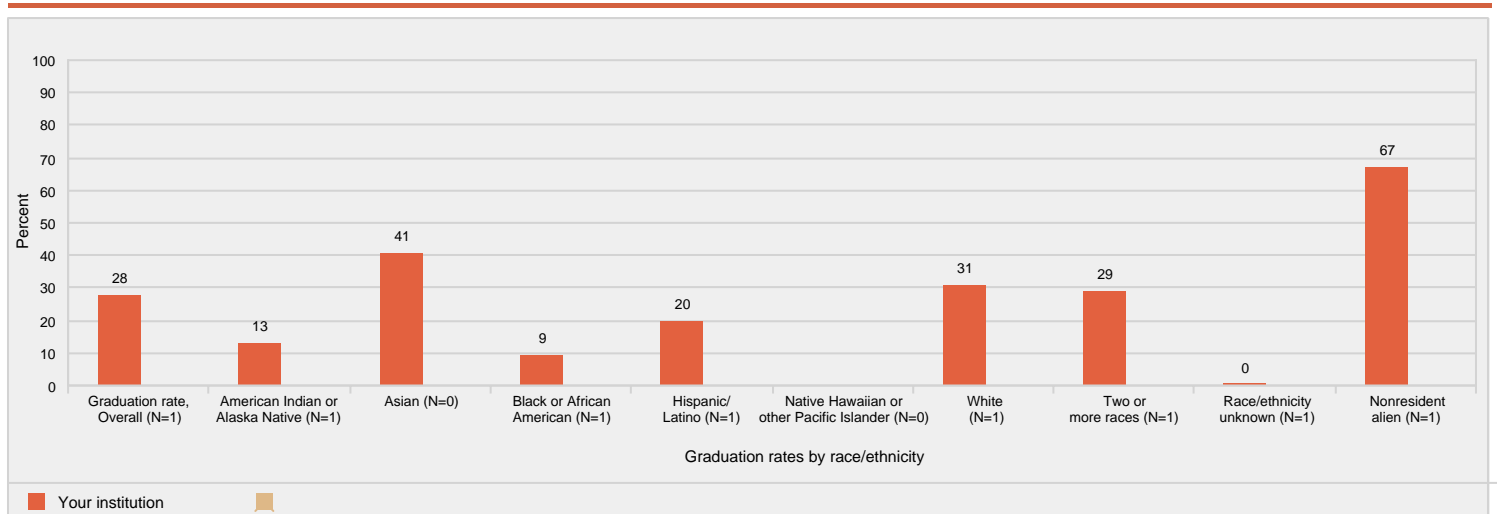
Figure 3. Bachelor's degree graduation rates of full-time, first-time degree/certificate-seeking undergraduates within 4 years, 6 years, and 8 years: 2008 cohort
