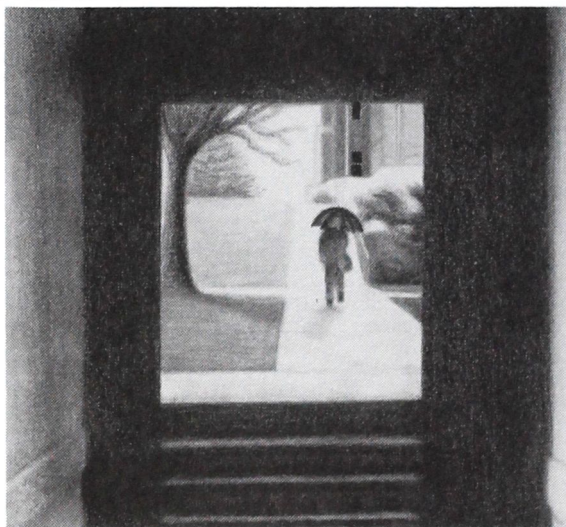
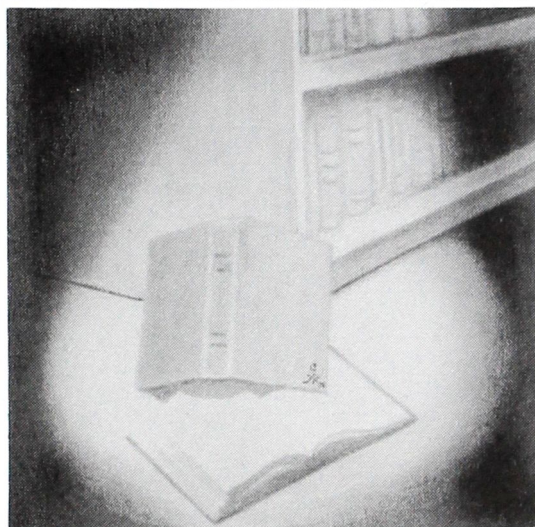
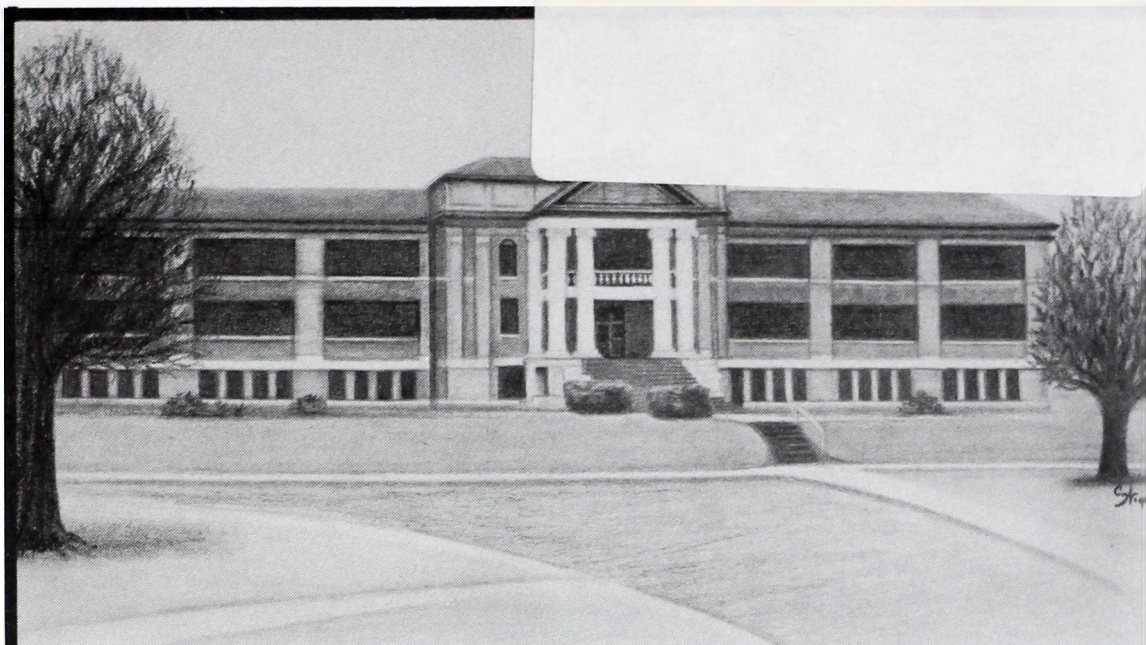

## Want to have your cake and eat it, too? It's possible

Successful alumni of our colleges agree they owe their success to the faculties and institutions that graduated them. Many alumni plan to "give back" to their schools some kind of remuneration, as a thank you, for their success.

Some wish to give money; others endow property to a school of their choice. In every case, schools are always in need of additional funds for their budget. Most colleges and universities have special committees dedicated to fund raising for their institutions.

If you have been planning to

give back to your school, here is an idea you can use. The feelings of most Alumni is that they want to make gifts, but they would also like to have control of their funds in case of an emergency.

Controlling the funds of your gift until your death, or until you are sure you won't need them can be accomplished now through a special type of Certificate of Endowment Annuity. You may have access to your gift at anytime, but at your death, the gift will be passed directly to the school of your choice without probate. Furthermore, it is not necessary to mention this gift in your will.

ied during the 1993-94 school year. All four students hope to have mastered the English language by the time they leave in May.

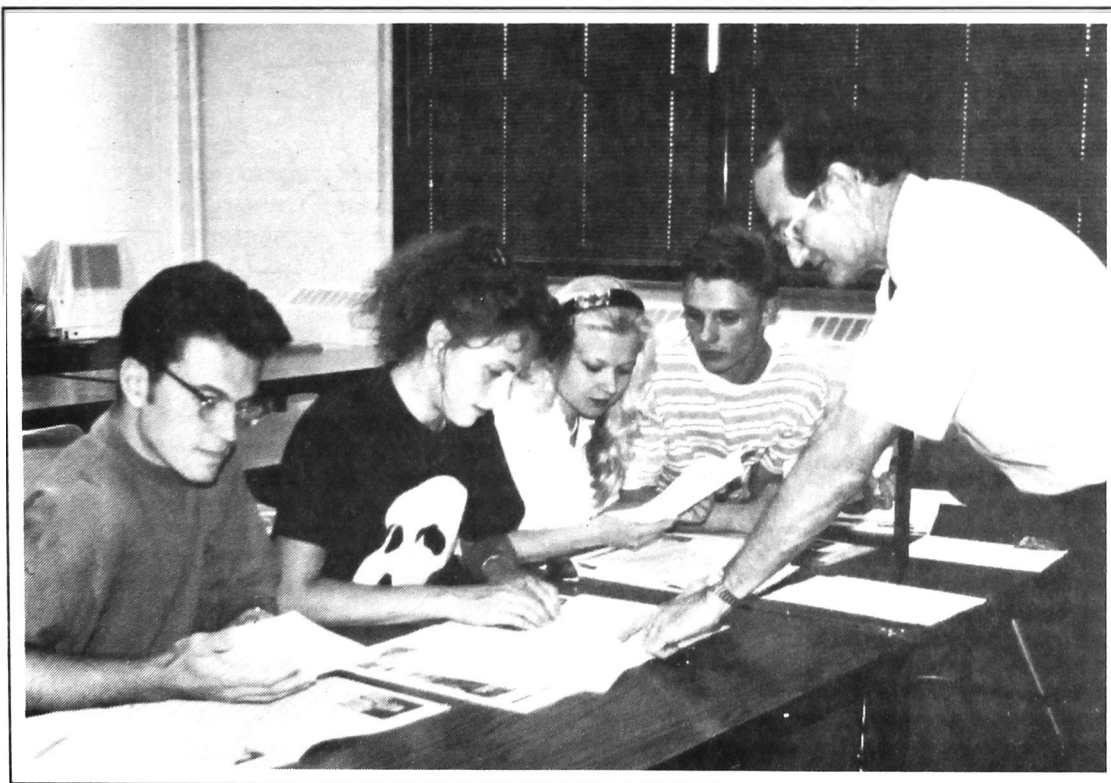
Christophe, 22, is studying general business

# Resumé service to assist job hunters

Southwestern now offers a resumé referral service that promises to assist both Southwestern graduates and prospective employers.

Last fall the university's Placement

Office began contacting several corporations concerning anticipated openings and employment possibilities for graduates. Southwestern then added these companies to their growing list of possible employers.

Qualified seniors and graduates then had the opportunity to sign up with the employee of their choice. After the designated sign-up period, the office forwarded resumé and transcripts of interested students to the companies for consideration.

Upon reviewing the requested material, the companies contacted those individuals with whom they wished to set up personal interviews. Several companies chose to perform their interviews on Southwestern's campus, while others opted for on-site interview sessions.

After three semesters, this new service has proven to be highly beneficial for not only the corporations using the program, but also for Southwestern's students. Southwestern promises to continue and hopes to expand the

service to include more diverse list of possible employers.

Todd Boyd, Director of Placement Services asks for alumni support.

"We'd like to encourage Southwestern alumni to consider Southwestern graduates when they are in a position to hire new staff members. After all, alumni already know what Southwestern stands for and the capabilities graduates possess," he said.

This service is individualized and can be tailored to meet each company's specific needs.

"All of our resumes are categorized by the candidate's college major," Boyd said. "This way an employer can call, tell us their needs and our office will select candidates matching the job description. We can also select candidates based on minimum requirements."

*The Record* was edited by junior Leslie Hinds of Keyes and produced by journalism students and free-lancers within the language arts department. All printing other than the cover was done by the University Press.

## Post collection of drama books donated to SWOSU

SWOSU has received a private collection of drama books and biographies in memory of the late Broadway and movie actor William Post.

Post's widow, Doris Broiles of Granite, recently gave the Al Harris Library approximately 350 biographies and 800 drama/drama history books. Library Director Beverly Jones said the books are something students and faculty will enjoy and benefit from for years to come.

William Post's acting career included more than 20 movies, dozens of Broadway plays and numerous television and radio productions. He appeared in such movies as *The House on 92nd Street*, *The Moon is Down*, and *Northside 777*.

He also played parts in television shows *The Edge of Night*, *Days of Our Lives*, *All My Children*, *Another World*, *As the World Turns*, *Guiding Light* and *Love Is a Many Splendored Thing*.

For 25 years, Post was head of the drama department of Finch College in New York. He and his wife Doris returned to the Granite area in the late 1980's to retire. Mr. Post passed away following a short illness on September 26, 1989. Mrs. Post continues to live in the Granite area.

The donated books were a lifetime collection from the Post private library. Former SWOSU Library Director Sheila Hoke had been working on the project prior to her retirement last year.

# Faculty and Staff Clips

Art Department Chairman **Patrick Riley** invited area residents to view an exhibit featuring the works of the late Myrle E. Kelly. Kelly served as head of the SWOSU Art Department for more than 30 years. While visiting, Mr. Kelly's family donated one of his works to the University.

The University's Technology Department has received a \$34,370 grant from the Society of Manufacturing Engineers. **Dr. James Jent** wrote Southwestern's application for the grant. Specifically the grant provides items in the categories of capital equipment, student development and faculty development.

Southwestern's library is currently under new direction. **Sheila Wilder Hoke** announced her retirement, and the library is now under the direction of **Beverly A. Jones**.

**Charles "Skip" Klingman**, assistant professor in the music department, has been selected to perform this summer as tenor soloist with the Oklahoma City-based Canterbury Choral Society during the group's concert tour in Washington, DC.

The Canterbury Choir will perform at the Washington National Cathedral and in the Concert Hall of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in late June. The performance will feature works of Leonard Bernstein and Carl Orff.

Monetary efforts are needed to continue beautifying the campus at Weatherford with various types of trees, according to SWOSU biological sciences faculty member **Dr. Bill Seibert**.

Alumni and friends are invited to make donations to the SWOSU Foundation and earmark the funds for the campus beautification fund. **Seibert** said various members of the Southwestern community will be planting a variety of trees across the Weatherford campus.

**Glenda Creach**, counselor in the Student Development Services Office and instructor in the School of Education at SWOSU in Weatherford, was one of 15 counselor educators selected to participate this past summer at the Career Development Training Institute held at the University of South Carolina.

SWOSU students and prospective students will have the opportunity to benefit from a new scholarship search program which was recently purchased for the university by the Alumni Association.

SWOSU Financial Aid Director, **Larry Hollingsworth**, said students will be able to look at some 550 different scholarship search programs. Over 45,000 awards offering approximately \$100 million are available, with most of the programs being non-need based.

**Dr. H. David Bergman**, Dean of the School of Pharmacy, authored the entire October 1993 edition of the *Southern Pharmacy Journal*.

**Dr. Bergman**, who has been dean at SWOSU since 1988, has authored approximately 200 publications for scientific and professional pharmacy journals.

*Southern Pharmacy Journal* is approved by the American Council on Pharmaceutical Education as a provider of continuing pharmaceutical education.

**David Corbly**, systems librarian in the Al Harris Library, was recently honored by the Oklahoma Library Association with the Outstanding New Librarian Award in recognition of significant contributions to the profession of librarianship and potential for professional development. **Corbly** is serving as chairman of the Automation Roundtable for the OLA in 1993-94 and fellow librarian **Carolyn Torrence** is serving as chairperson of the Government Documents Roundtable.

**Leslie D. Crall** of the School of Business was recently notified that his paper on "Frivolous Tax Litigation: A Summary of Consistently Rejected Tax Arguments" will be printed in an issue of *The Southern Law Journal*. Only 35 percent of the articles submitted were accepted for publication.

**Dr. Gary Gilliland**, Dean of the School of Education since 1979, recently resigned his position. He will remain at Southwestern as a professor in the school of education starting this upcoming 1994 summer semester.

**Dr. Gilliland** has been at SWOSU since 1974. He served as assistant professor and chairman of the secondary education department before succeeding **Dr. Earl Reynolds** as dean of the school in 1979.

Dr. Charles Chapman, music, published an article in the *Oklahoma School Music News*. The article was entitled "Let's Destroy the Fine Arts: Here's My Plan."

Foundation Board of Directors. He was inducted in the SWOSU Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame in 1991.

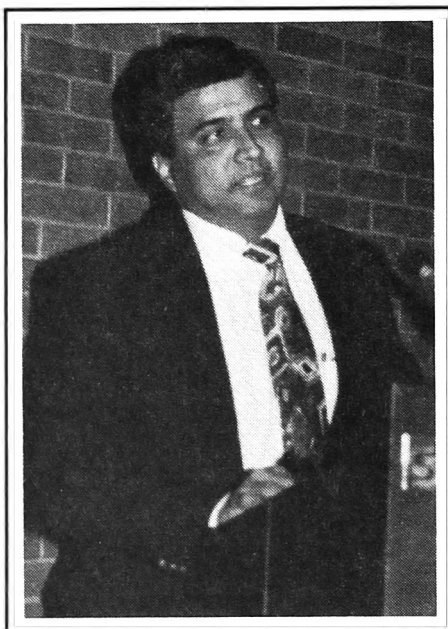

## Grizzles of Edmond contribute \$50,000

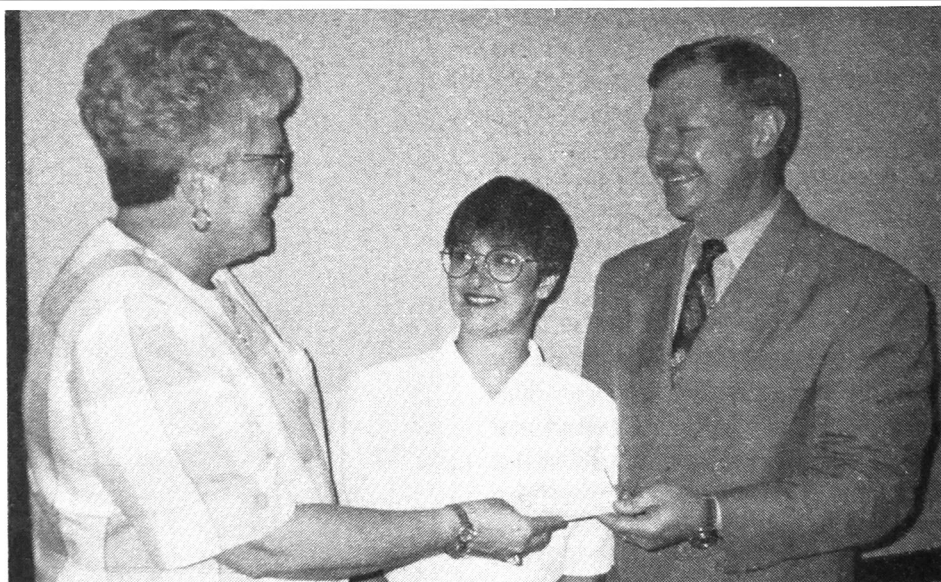
Jerry and Shawn Grizzle of Edmond have contributed a \$50,000 gift to the SWOSU Foundation in Weatherford.

# Tax changes make donations more attractive

## *Now deductible at fair market value*

Gifts of appreciation property are now deductible at their fair market value instead of their original cost, with no portion of the appreciation subject to the alternative minimum tax.

This change, made in the tax law this past summer, should provide donors with more incentive to give charitable organizations more stocks, bonds, artworks, collectibles, real estate and other property which has appreciated in value since it was acquired.

Under the old law, the appreciated portion of the gift was a tax preference item for donors subject to the alternative minimum tax, which diminished the tax planning opportunities of such a gift.

The new law, retroactive as of December 31, 1992, allows the full value for gifts of appreciated securities up to 30 percent of adjusted gross income.

Giving gifts of appreciated securities to the community foundation can be especially easy for donors.

A single gift can benefit several different funds just through the donor's designation at the time of the gift. The security does not need to be re-issued to multiple beneficiaries and savings on commissions can be generated when the security is sold.

At a time of declining services from government, charitable organizations will be asked to play a more important role. Removing the limitations on gifts of appreciated property should greatly help non-profits serve their communities.

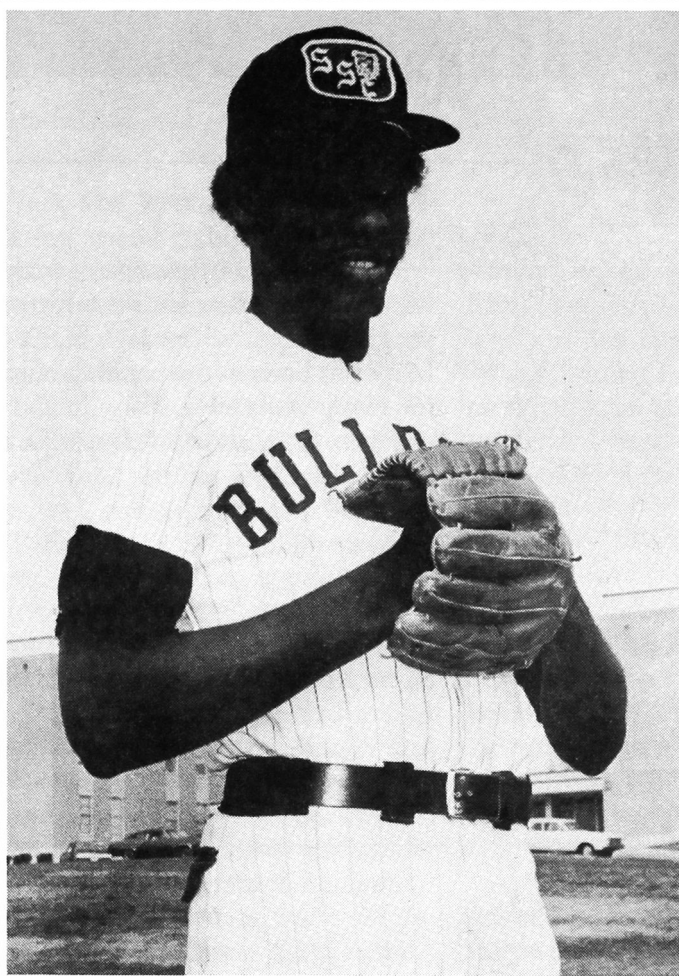
SWOSU also had five players named to the 1993 OIC first team. Three players were honored on the second team

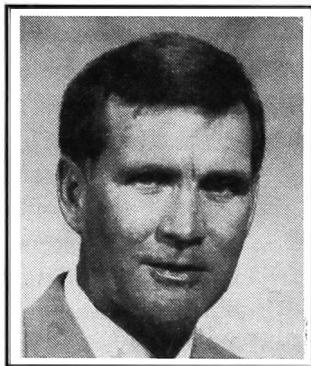

# 1994 Commencement: A Family Affair

After years of research papers, endless lectures, and excruciating exams, most students expect to step onto the platform at graduation, blush, and wave at their proud parents in the audience.

Not so for one Weatherford family.

Russell Dodson, his wife Fran, and their daughter, Karla Wilson, were to find themselves side by side as graduates at the commencement exercises Friday May 13, 1994.

Russell graduated with a BS in General Technology, Fran received a Master in Agency Counseling degree, and Karla finished with her BS in Elementary Education. Their youngest son, Randy, one of three boys, also attends Southwestern as a computer science major and is expected to graduate in the spring of 1995.

The Dodsons have been married for 38 years, but their road has not been an easy one. Russell and Fran were high school dropouts when they married in 1956.

"She was a real cute little girl in high school and I just snatched her up," Russell said by way of explanation.

Russell received his GED in 1956, after joining the Air Force. He spent four years in the military as a basic electronics instructor at Keesler Air Force Base in Mississippi. He spent the next four years teaching for the Army at Ft. Sill, Oklahoma, but has since been in the cable TV business.

Fran received her GED in 1986, after having been out of school for over 30 years. Even though she took no preparatory courses, she scored in the 89th percentile.

"With the encouragement of some friends," as she put it, she enrolled as a full time student in the fall of 1990.

"Coming back as a non-traditional student was difficult," Fran said. "Back then there were fewer adults enrolled, and I was conscious of the fact that I was older than the others."

with psychology" and graduated with a BS in Applied Psychology and a minor in chemical abuse counseling in the spring of 1993.

During this same period, Fran was a counselor at the Oklahoma State Reformatory in Granite. She counseled inmates and taught substance abuse education classes until last January.

Karla Wilson, their only daughter, is currently student teaching in the fourth and fifth grades at West Elementary School in Weatherford.

"It's been fun and it's kind of ironic to be graduating from college with my parents...especially since they never even graduated from high school," Wilson said.

Inevitably, once in a while in the past few years the Dodson family's schedules crossed and they ended up in the same class.

"Because my major, electronics, is Randy's minor...we have had several classes together," Russell said. All three

of them enrolled in a concepts of physical science class one semester.

"He (Dr. Brown) will remember us, that's for sure," Fran said.
