



## **Dobson Family Sponsoring SWOSU Human Exploration Rover Challenge Team**

Everett and Jeanetta Dobson of Edmond have made a major gift in support of Southwestern Oklahoma State University's National Aeronautics & Space Administration Human Exploration Rover Challenge (NASA HERC) Team for 2019-20.

This year marks the eighth consecutive Challenge in which SWOSU, with locations in Weatherford and Sayre, has competed.

The NASA HERC each year features an engineering design challenge to engage students worldwide in the next phase of human space exploration. The annual event is a more complex follow-up to the successful NASA's Great Moonbuggy Race.

The competition challenges high school and college students to create a vehicle designed to traverse the simulated surface of another world. During its 20-year run, NASA's Great Moonbuggy Race engaged more than 10,000 students and demonstrated that these budding scientists and engineers were capable of complex work. The NASA HERC continues that tradition by providing an authentic engineering experience. Student teams design, build and test technologies that enable rovers to perform in a variety of environments. The HERC inspires participants to become the engineers to design NASA's next-generation space systems.
