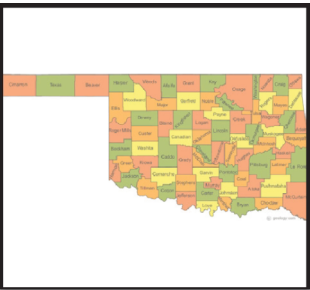

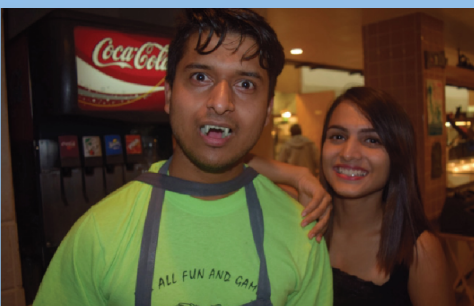

Regents to meet at Southwestern

The Regional University System of Oklahoma regents will meet on Nov. 6 at SWOSU.

President Randy Beutler explained the meeting by stating that there are two boards that SWOSU deals with — the Coordinating Board and the Governing Board.

“There is the state regents, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, which oversee all public colleges and universities. They are what is called the Coordinating Board,” Beutler said. “The Coordinating Board distributes money to colleges, decides what degrees are offered, and budgeting.”

The Governing Board, called the Regional University System of Oklahoma (RUSO), governs six universities: East Central University, Northeastern State University, Northwestern Oklahoma State University, Southeastern Oklahoma State University, Southwestern Oklahoma State University, and the University of Central Oklahoma. These six universities are generally teaching colleges,

which at one point were called normal universities.

The Governing Board hires presidents, approves functions like building plans, degree programs, and budgeting. The RUSO schools have to seek approval from the Governing Board before seeking approval from the Coordinating Board. The board functions much like that of a school district.

RUSO has nine members. Eight of these members are appointed by the Governor with the consent of the Senate, for nine years. The ninth member is the elected State Superintendent of Public Instruction. Currently, Joy Hofmeister is the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. President Beutler said that "the reason that Superintendent Hofmeister is on the board probably goes back to the fact that these colleges were teaching institutions."

The RUSO generally meets seven times a year. Six times, once at each university, and once in OKC at the

office. November is always the time that SWOSU hosts the meeting. Generally, the board and the other presidents of the colleges arrive around noon on Thursday. All six presidents of the RUSO schools will have a meeting, discussing current events, money, and anything that is currently happening with the schools. Around 2 p.m., the committees will hold a meeting, like the building committee and others.

The committees will meet for most of the day. Usually, a small dinner is held that night with the board. The actual RUSO meeting will start at 9 a.m. on Friday. Each school will have subjects to address, which are all listed on the agenda for this meeting. All the meetings open to the public.

Southwestern Oklahoma State University is hosting a Veteran's Day celebration on Saturday, November 14, at the Pioneer Cellular Event Center in Weatherford. The event is sponsored by the SWOSU Collegiate Activities Board (CAB).

The event is for all western Oklahoma veterans.

There will be a lunch at 12 noon in the Skyview Suite featuring a presentation by Scott Deatherage, spokesperson for Honoring America's Warriors.

CAB will have a POW/MIA table to honor fallen soldiers, and a Vietnam War table to honor the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam

War. There will be a presentation and later retirement of the colors by the SWOSU Guard Officer Leadership Development (GOLD) program.

Bulldogs come back to win on Senior Day, finish unbeaten at home

WEATHERFORD, Okla. – After falling behind 10-0 against Harding on Senior Day, the SWOSU Football team showed their resilience to come back for a 21-13 victory over the Bisons, giving the Bulldogs a perfect 5-0 record at ASAP Energy Field this season as they finished unblemished at home for the first time since 2002.

SWOSU was stagnant offensively until late in the first half when they drove 54 yards in six plays, the final of which an untimed down with no time remaining on the clock following a pass interference call against Harding. On the untimed down, Bulldog quarterback Marc Evans was hurried before he found a crossing Derrick Styles, who made a one-handed catch for a three-yard touchdown. The extra point made it 10-7 Harding going to the half but left the Bulldogs with all the momentum.

Harding extended the lead back to 13-7 with a 10-play field goal drive, but the Bulldogs scored the final 14 points for the victory. Kartrell Henderson scored the go-ahead touchdown with 2:59 to play in the third quarter, capping off a 10-play, 64-yard drive with a four-yard plunge into the end zone that put the Dawgs up 14-13.

SWOSU was stopped on their opening drive of the fourth quarter, but Clinton Horn recovered a fumble on the Bisons first play of the ensuing possession to give SWOSU the ball back. The Bulldogs needed five plays to cash in with Evans finding Carlos Smith on a back shoulder throw in the endzone from 14 yards out that upped the lead to 21-13.

Trevon Hartfield picked off Harding quarterback Park Parish to end the Bisons next possession, giving SWOSU the ball back with 8:47 to play. The Bulldogs ran nine rushing plays in their 11-play drive, draining 6:28 from the clock before turning the ball over on downs with 2:19 to play. Harding was able to drive to the Bulldog 24 on the next drive before turning the ball over on downs with 45 seconds to play as SWOSU’s defense came up with yet another stop, this time sealing the victory.

The Bulldogs defense held Harding’s rushing attack that had been averaging 395.4 yards per game – ranked second in NCAA Division II – to just 186 yards on 44 attempts and SWOSU became the first team since 2011 to outrush the Bisons in a game. Harding had just 243 yards of total offense, averaging 4.3 yards per play. The Bulldogs had two big takeaways in the game and they were led in tackling by Kapena Olsen, Clinton Horn and Collier Ward with six stops apiece. Tanner Thompson had two tackles for loss and the Bulldogs finished with five TFL as a team.

The majority of SWOSU’s offensive damage was done on the ground as the Dawgs had 190 net yards rushing and 159 yards through the air. Kenneth Martey had 106 yards rushing on 25 carries with Kartrell Henderson rushing for 64 yards

and one touchdown with 16 carries. Marc Evans was 14-for-31 passing in relief of Brooks Robertson, throwing for 152 yards and two touchdowns, giving him 18 touchdown passes for the year, tying the third-most single season total at SWOSU in the NCAA era.

“The kids just played hard today and all the credit goes to those players,” SWOSU Head Coach Dan Cocannouer said during his postgame interview. “They never gave up and kept on playing. What happened out here is because our guys believe in themselves and believe in this program.”

With the victory, the Bulldogs improve to 6-3 on the year, clinching their second winning season in the past three years with two games to play. SWOSU will be on the road the next two weeks, starting with a trip to Russellville next Saturday to face Arkansas Tech, one of two teams that still sits ahead of the Bulldogs in the Great American Conference standings.

Seniors lead soccer team

WEATHERFORD, Okla. – A pair of seniors combined for the only goal during SWOSU’s 1-0 victory over Oklahoma Baptist on Senior Day. The win put to bed a three-game losing skid as the Bulldogs gear up from the Great American Conference Tournament next week.

Samantha Nunez tied the career record for points set by former SWOSU All-American Josie Price with her goal in the 15th minute of play to put the Bulldogs up 1-0. The senior picked up the ball in Oklahoma Baptist’s defensive third before pushing it to Eva Rule out wide on the right wing. Rule lifted a cross over a pair of Lady Bison defenders, and Nunez met it with her head, placing the ball in the bottom left corner for her ninth goal of the season.

SWOSU failed to put another shot on goal in

the half, but also held Oklahoma Baptist to just one shot. That shot was easily saved by Courtney Flores to preserve the lead. A last-minute corner for the Dawgs came to nothing, and SWOSU entered the break leading 1-0.

The Bulldogs took five more shots in the second half, trying to double the advantage. Cori Kelly was able to put a shot on goal, but OKBU’s Emma beck recorded a save to leave

the score line unchanged. SWOSU’s defense held the Lady Bison to an additional two shots in the second half, but neither shot threatened Flores.

With the final match of the regular season concluded, SWOSU finishes with an 8-3-1 record in conference play and claims the third seed in the GAC Tournament. The tournament begins on November 5 against No. 2-seeded Ouachita Baptist.

Rodeo teams finish fall

ALVA, Okla. – After a two-week break, the SWOSU Rodeo teams returned to action over the weekend in Alva for their final Central Plains Region event of the fall season. Both Bulldog teams brought home a third-place finish from the event, while freshman Paige Wiseman was the All-Around Cowgirl at the rodeo.

Wiseman helped the Bulldog women’s team to a third-place finish with 187 points. She was third in the average of breakaway with times of 3.3 and 3.0 seconds, taking third place in the short round, while also earning a sixth-place finish in the average of goat tying with 15.3 seconds on two runs. Mikayla Harrison shared fourth and fifth place in the average of goat tying with a time of 15.0 seconds on two.

SWOSU had a trio place in the long round of barrel racing as Kylee Cahoy was fourth in 13.00 seconds with Rachel Pozzi and Stacey Bailey splitting sixth and seventh place in 13.11 seconds. Pozzi improved her time to 12.85 seconds in the short round to place third in the round and fourth in the average.

SWOSU’s men’s team was led by

some strong rides on the rough stock. Jake Stemo took second in the average of bareback, sharing second in the long round with a 75-point ride before taking second in the short round with a ride of 77 points. Levi Nicholson matched Stemo in the long round while Connor Hamilton and Hunter Green both had two qualifying rides and finished fourth and fifth in the average, respectively.

Nick Shenold split first and second place in the long round of saddle bronc, scoring 72 points on his first ride before a no score in the short round dropped him to a share of second place in the average. Mickey Andrews had a similar fate, winning the long round of bull riding with 77 points, which was enough for reigning regional champion to hold on and win the average of the event despite getting bucked in the short go.

“I’m really pleased with our teams’ efforts and accomplishments during this fall season,” SWOSU Head Coach Mike Visnieski said. “We have a lot of room to improve and we will be working on everything we can during the offseason to get better.”

SWOSU hit .267 or above in each set while holding the Eagles to a hitting percentage of .100 or less in each set, including a -.161 mark in the second set. SCU reached 15 points in the first set, but their scoring went down in the final two as the Bulldog finished off the sweep with wins of 25-12 and 25-11.

Kelsi Schmidtberger and Kayla Hebert had eight kills apiece to lead the Bull-

dogs, who hit .353 for the match with only seven hitting errors. Hebert was the most efficient with all eight of her attack attempts scoring for the Dawgs, while she also added a double-double with 21 assists and 11 digs. DeLayni Fine had a team-high four blocks and the Bulldogs had seven blocks compared to three for Southwestern Christian.

The victory improves the Bulldogs to 17-9 on the year with four conference matches remaining. SWOSU is back in action twice next week, traveling to Oklahoma Baptist on Tuesday before Senior Night at the Pioneer Cellular Event Center on Thursday evening against East Central.

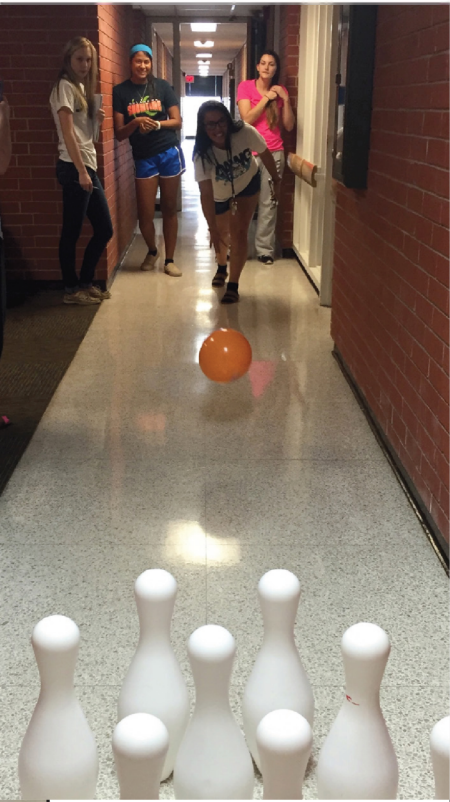
