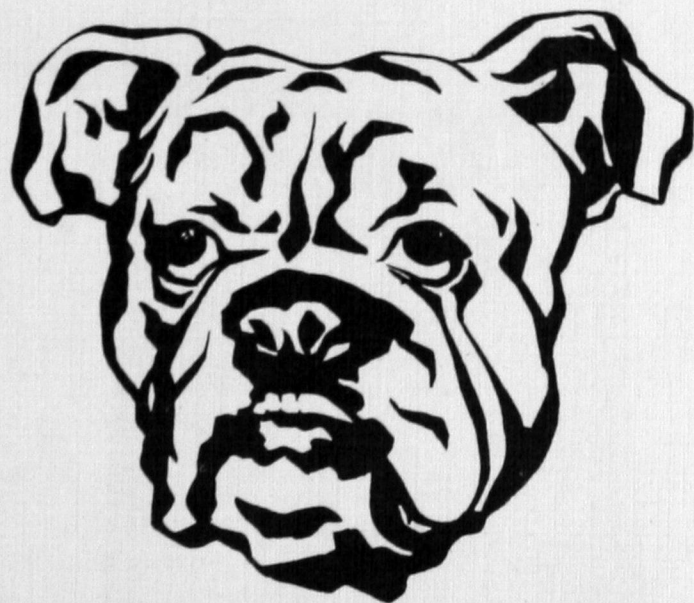

# Dedication

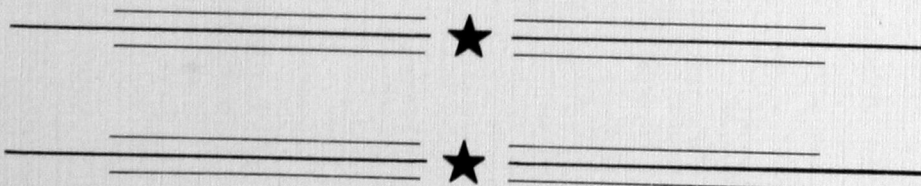
