It was in October, 1949, that the Southwestern Former Students Association had its beginning at a reunion in Oklahoma City during a state teachers meeting. Walter P. Marsh, El Reno educator, was elected president.

For two years Marsh, working with Don A. Eaton, Weatherford, then Association executive secretary, laid a solid foundation that now includes more than 1000 members and a stable organization that will build with the future.

The Association is completely independent of the college but works closely with the school administration in policies that are for the betterment of Southwestern.

Following Marsh as president is dynamic Richard W. Moore, Altus, elected during Homecoming last fall. Moore has continued the fine program already started and is looking toward an even greater organization.

Mrs. Clyde Thomas, "Millie" to all former Southwesterners, has been secretary since the Association was organized three years ago. To old students Southwestern and Millie are almost synonymous.

The vice-president is Mrs. E. B. Savage, Hammon, who was the first Southwestern co-ed when she enrolled at the school's opening in 1903. Her children are former students and graduates. Her famous brothers, Tom Mabry, former governor of New Mexico; John Mabry, district Attorney at Trinidad, Colorado, and Harry Mabry, Los Angeles corporation lawyer, are all members of the Association.

The Association is the tie that binds the ex-student to his alma mater. It includes the great, like Southwestern's famous son of radio fame, Bob Hawk, as well as the lesser known who came here to school for a semester or so and left with a memory of friends never to be forgotten.

Only a dozen men with college experience reported in September to W. C. Whiteside, head coach; Dean Morgan, line coach, and Rankin Williams, athletic director. The squad had fewer than 30 men all season.

Early defeats at the hands of Emporia Kansas Teachers, 6-26, and Lamar Tech, 21-43, were to be expected. Then the Bulldogs began to roll as they won their conference opener against East Central at Ada, 27-0. Sonny Tims, Eddie Krewall, Jim McKoy and George Dickey scored.

McKoy counted twice on a muddy field as Southwestern clipped New Mexico Military Institute at Weatherford, 14-0, before winning their second league start, this time against the Northwestern Rangers. Playing in Milam Stadium, the Bulldogs were spearheaded by Krewall and Tims in a smashing 34-7 decision. Scoring were Bill Davis, Duane Bates, Jimmy Pruitt, Tims and Krewall.

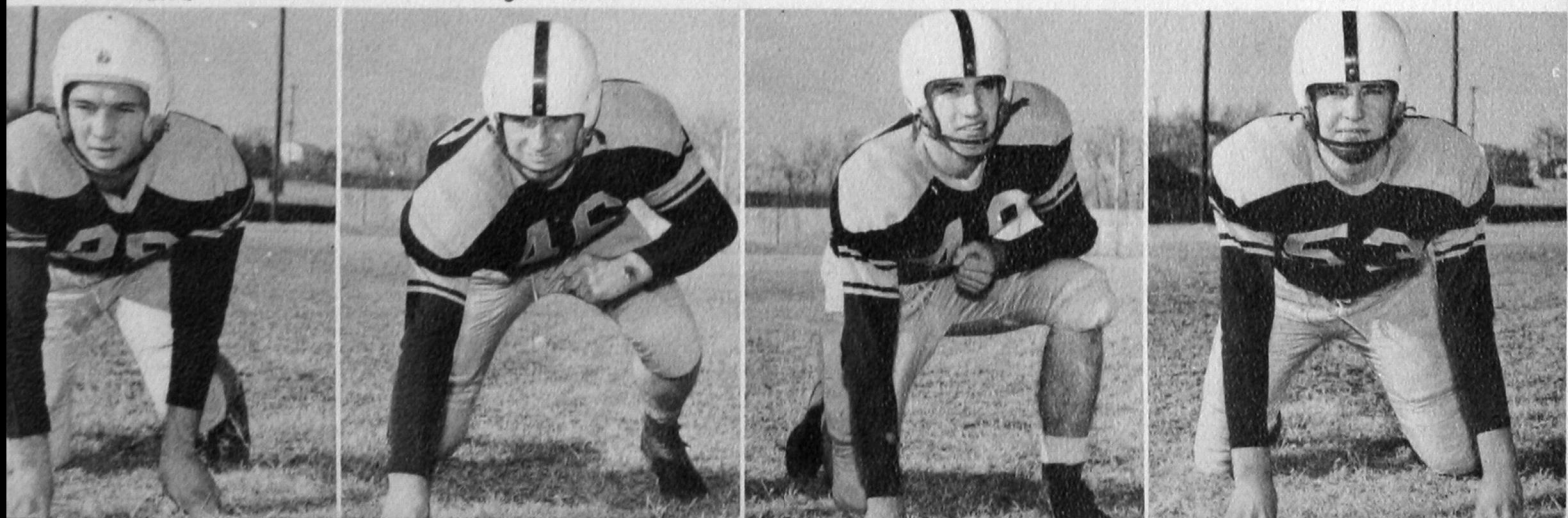

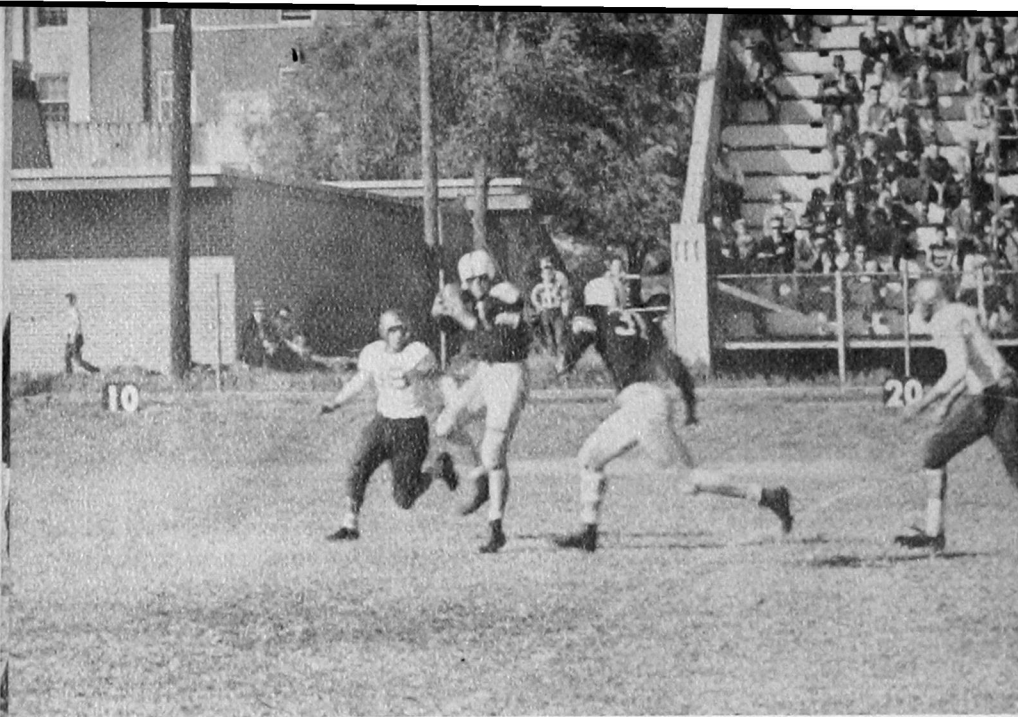

A week later Northeastern's great team, their first conference champions in any sport, made the most of a weakened Bulldog eleven to break Southwestern's 14-year-old tradition of not losing at Homecoming. The score was 44-7.

After that Southwestern found the going rough. Krewall was out with a wrecked knee after Panhandle Aggies won at Weatherford, 13-7, and Southeastern won at Durant, 33-6. The season ended at Wichita Falls with a powerful Midwestern team piling up a 77-8 margin.

## COACH OF THE YEAR

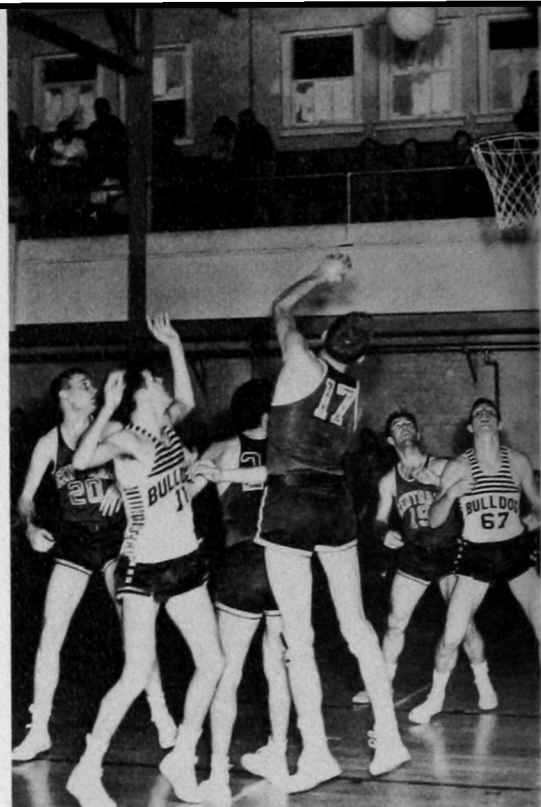

At the end of the collegiate conference race, the Bulldogs found themselves tied for third place behind the champion Southeastern Savages and the East Central Tigers.

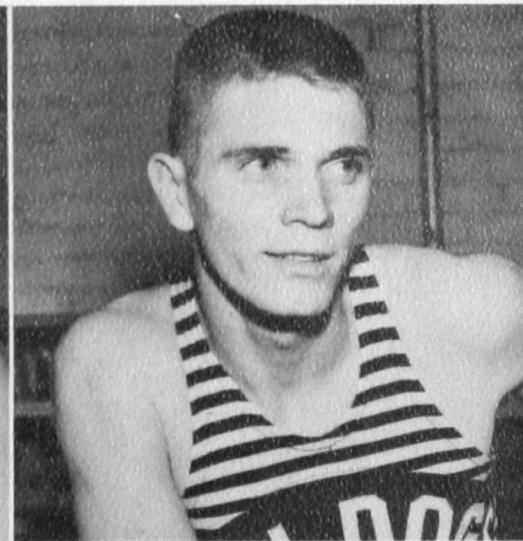

Tied May 1 with six victories and one defeat each, the Bulldogs and Haymakers opened their championship series with an 8 to 1 win for Phillips at Enid. Roy "Bud" Tinney, Southwestern's freshman southpaw, evened the count with a 6-1 pitching chore at Weatherford as he let the Haymakers down with five scattered blows.

The payoff came on a neutral diamond at Watonga May 8. The Haymakers jumped on big Kyle Wright for a 3-1 lead in the first inning, but Southwestern's ace hurler grew stronger as the game wore on to throttle every threat thereafter.

Meanwhile the Bulldogs pecked away for a single run in each of the first four innings to gain a meager 4-3 advantage for the championship. Wright scored the winning run himself on Gerald Nipp's double in the fourth.
