ADMINISTRATION BUILDING . . . houses the Pharmacy and commerce departments. Also offices of the President, Deans, registrar, and financial secretary.

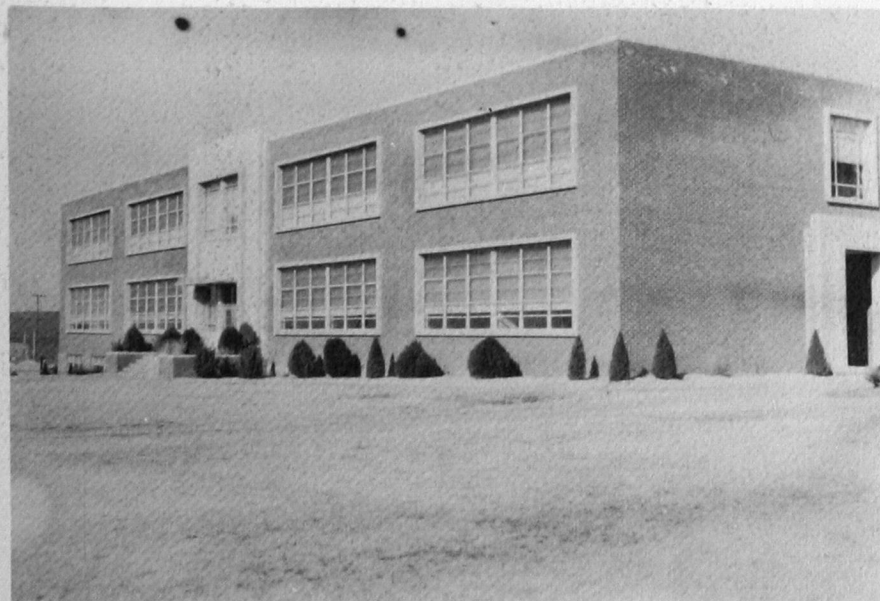


SCIENCE HALL . . . research and progress . . . in the broad realm of life itself, are furthered by concentrated study of its many forms.

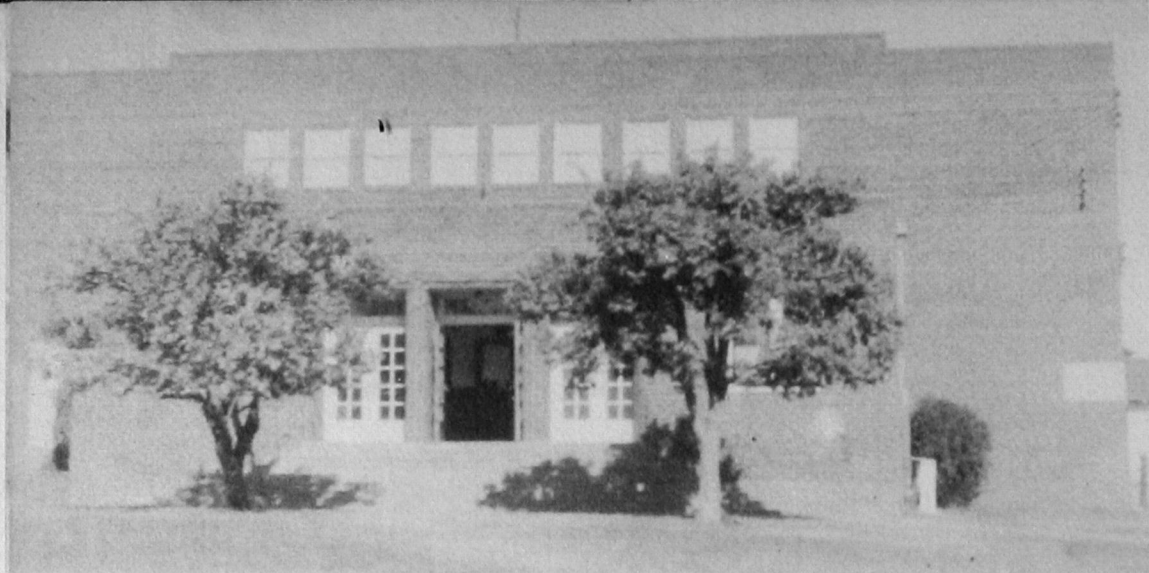


"Y" CHAPEL . . . the center of student worship has given many students an hour of worship and discussion of vital problems.

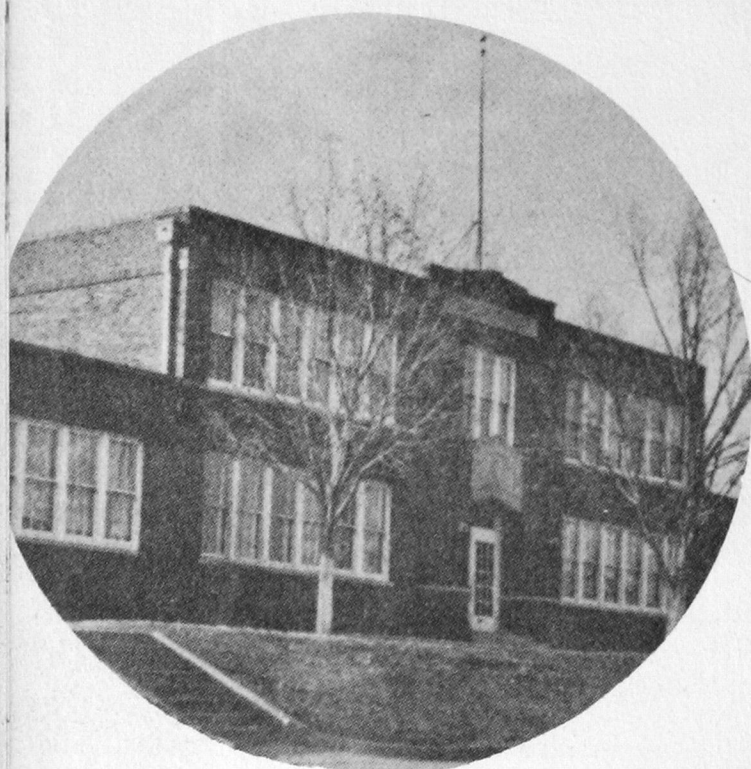
NEFF HALL . . . two story dormitory for men, situated one block from main campus.



EDUCATION BUILDING . . . houses departments of History, Education, and English.



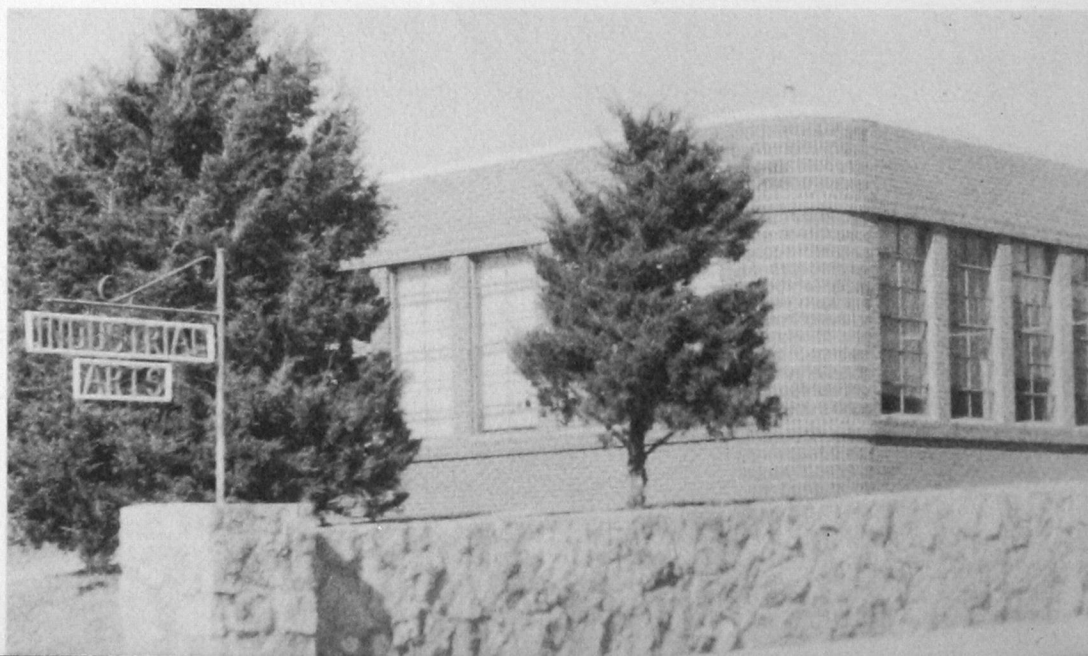
GYMNASIUM...site of Southwestern's physical training program, Bulldog basketball games, and offices of the athletic department.



TRAINING SCHOOL...example of long service in training teachers.



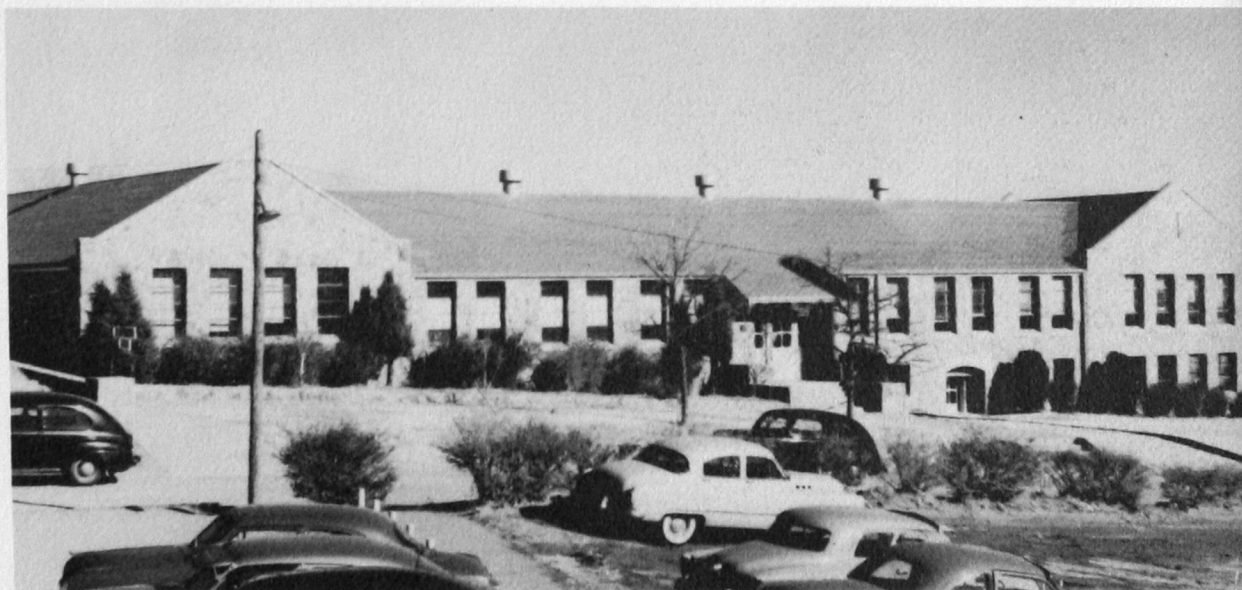
LIBRARY...as in the knowledge it houses, fulfills its obligations as a quiet sanctuary for study.



INDUSTRIAL ARTS BUILDING...is the home of the trade schools.

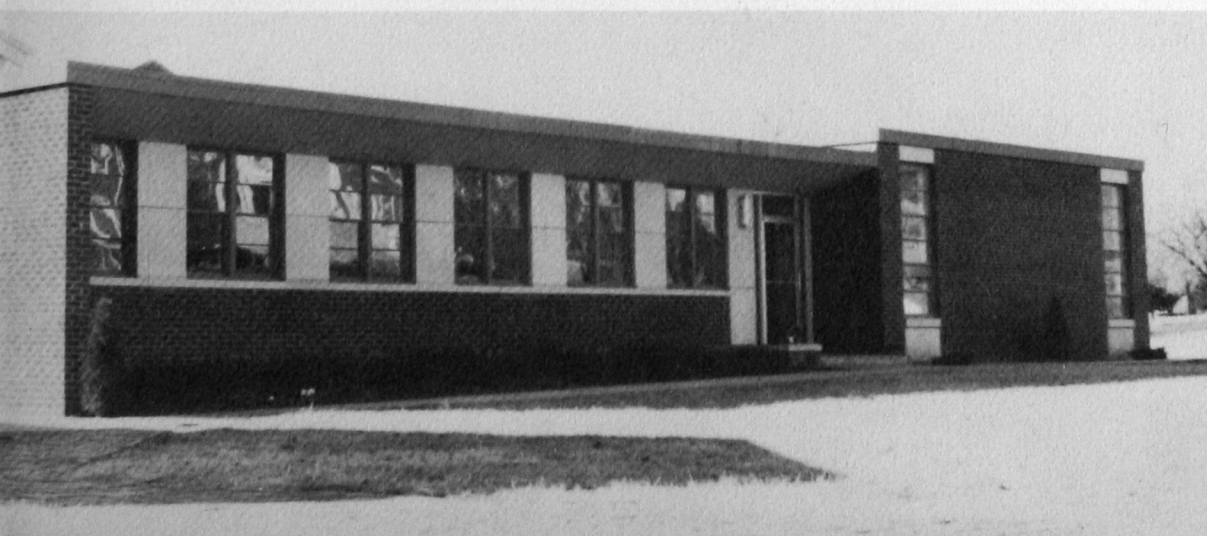


STEWART HALL . . . home to almost two hundred co-eds. Houses the college cafeteria.



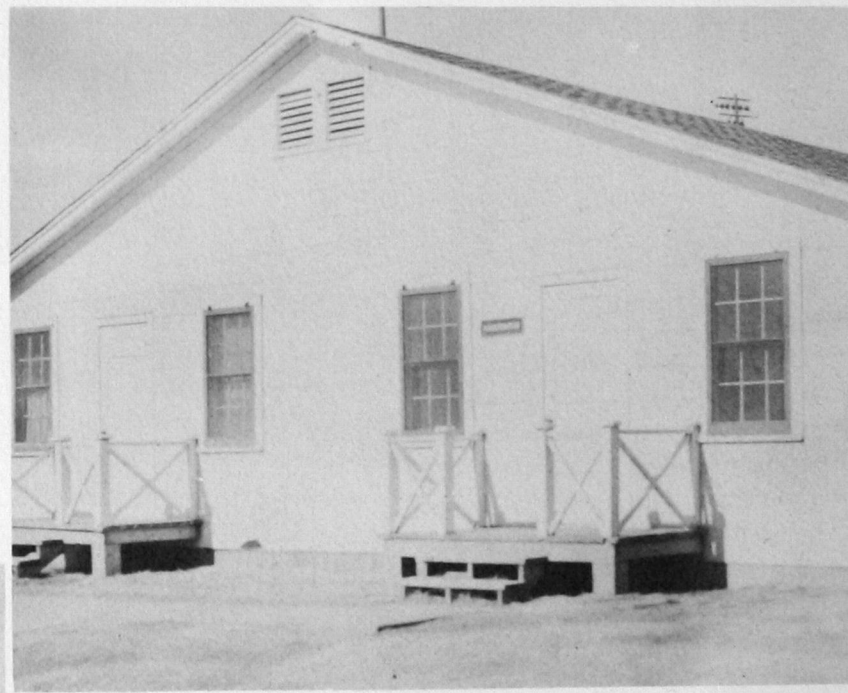
SHOPS BUILDING . . . houses auto mechanics, and carpentry.

You college students of today are properly equipped to carry Oklahoma forward to the full greatness of which she is capable--in agriculture, industry and the arts.

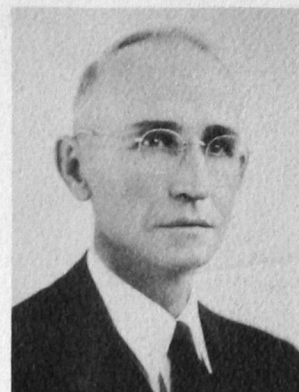

Although fielding a rugged team that outplayed all opponents, the 1953 Bulldog football squad finished in a last-place tie with Northwestern in conference standing.

Southwestern bested the Rangers twice, 26-0 and 26-19, but lost to the four remaining loop foes by a combined margin of 13 points. The Southwestern-Northwestern rivalry was conducted on a home-and-home basis this year with each game counting one-half win in the conference race.

The Bulldogs opened the season by trouncing Eastern New Mexico University, 19-0 at Weatherford, then lost, 32-14 to Midwestern University at Wichita Falls, Texas. They lost their first Oklahoma collegiate conference match to East Central at Ada, 13-12, then topped Southwestern College of Kansas at Winfield, 20-13 in a non-league contest.

Southwestern was still in the fray after soundly whipping Northwestern, 26-0, at Weatherford in celebration of the college's Golden Anniversary Homecoming. The Bulldogs blew an early lead to bow to Central at Edmond, 33-28.

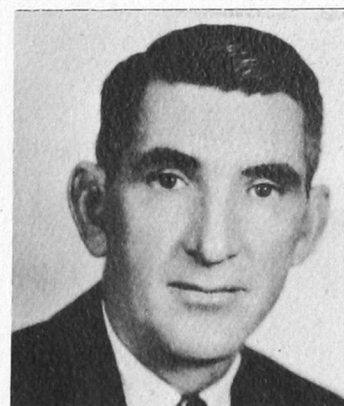
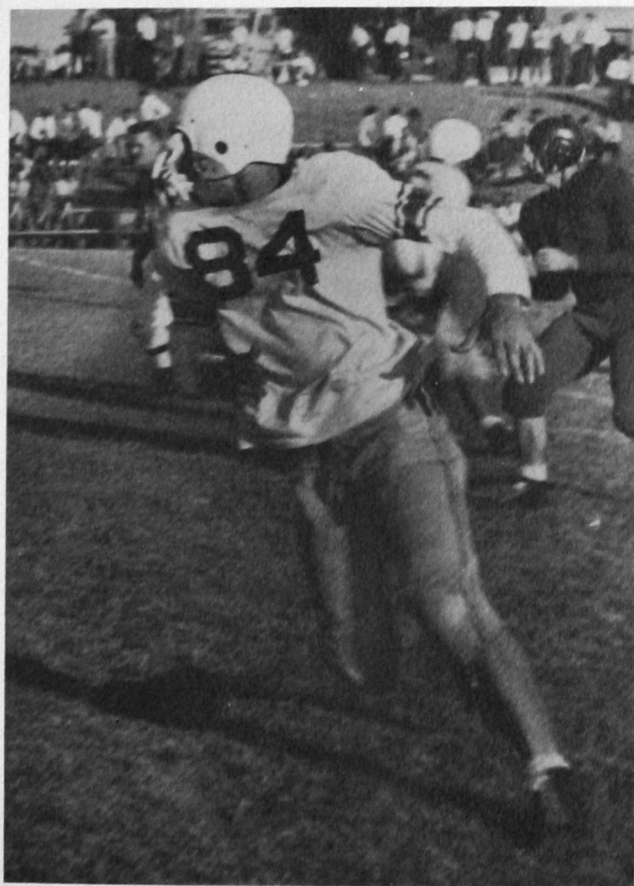
A stubborn Northeastern eleven, which went on to cop the title, subdued the Bulldogs, 6-0, here to definitely drop them from contention. At Durant, Southwestern lost another close one to Southeastern's Savages, 7-6.

Panhandle A and M's New Mexico collegiate conference champions overcame a 12-point half-time deficit to nose out the Bulldogs in their final home game of the season, 14-12. The team finished the campaign by beating Northwestern at Alva, 26-19.

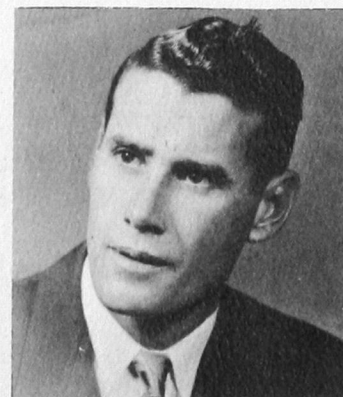

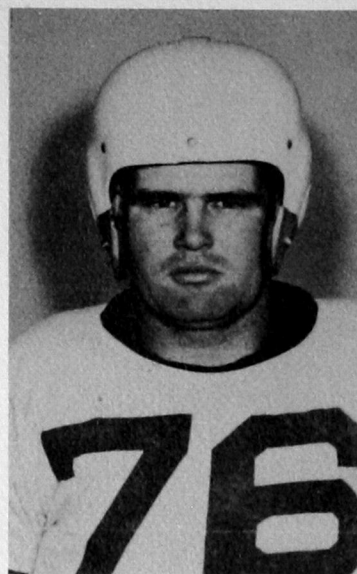

The two freshmen were Buck and Vern Harris, both backs.

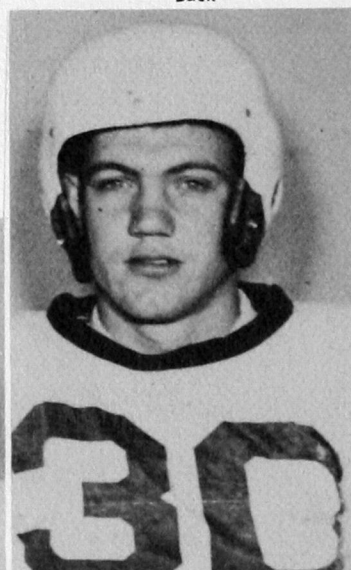

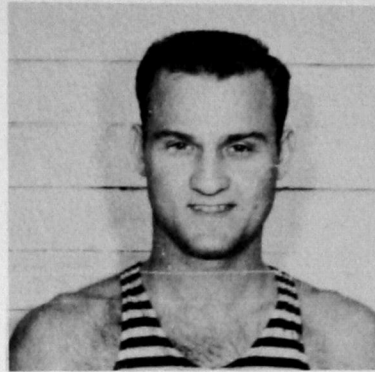
1953-54 Season

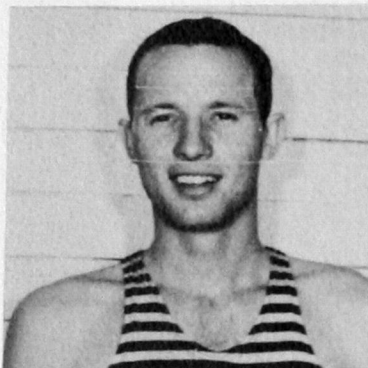

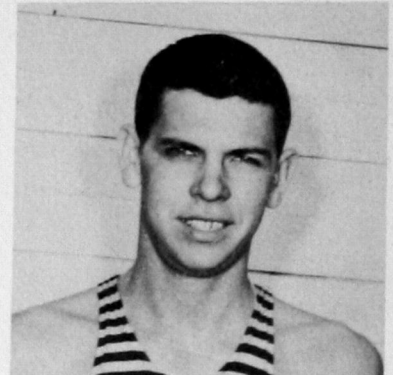

Southwestern scored 73.71 average points against their opponents 70.07. High point was Davis, followed by Litsch and Chesney.

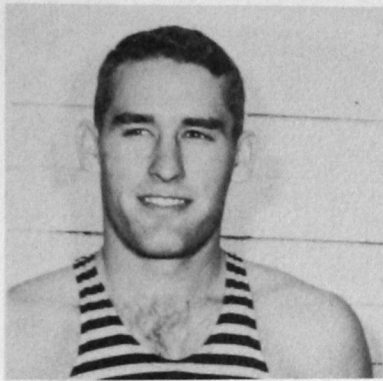

Southwestern's 1953 Bulldogs captured the third consecutive Oklahoma collegiate conference baseball championship for the Blue and White. It was their 12th league title in 20 years.

The Bulldogs cinched the crown by virtue of a 9-0 forfeit from the Eastern division champion East Central crew after taking the playoff opener 20-2 and dropping the second 3-2. They were undefeated in regular season play.

Three seniors inked professional contracts after graduation. Eddie Krewall signed with the Oklahoma City Indians and was optioned to Pampa of the West Texas-New Mexico league. Gerald Nipp and Jerry Doyle joined the Chicago White Sox farm system and were sent to Topeka, Kansas, of the Western Association.

Krewall led the club in batting, with a .545 average in conference play. W. E. Jackson and Jay Jones hit .500, followed by Virgil Cravens with .353. Nipp, Bill Haney, Kelly Chadwick and Darill Leveritt all had .333 records. The team average was an amazing .303.

COACH OF THE YEAR

For the second time in three years, Southwestern athletic director Rankin Williams was named "Coach of the Year" for 1953 by his fellow mentors of the Oklahoma collegiate conference.

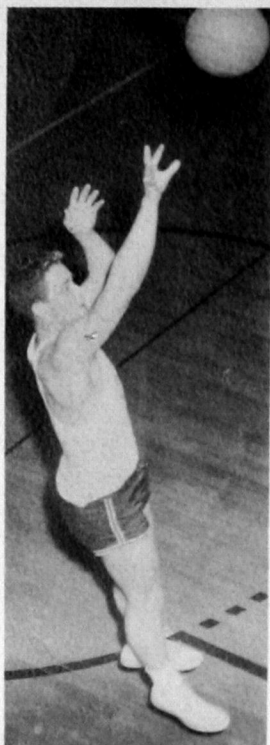
