Darrel Bose is a native of Bessie and graduated from Southwestern Oklahoma State University with a bachelor's degree in mathematics and physics in 1970. He completed a master's degree in mechanical engineering at Oklahoma State University in 1971.

After receiving his master's degree, he was hired by ARCO (Atlantic-Richfield) as an operations analytical engineer in Midland, Texas. He was transferred to Alaska in 1976. Later that year, he was promoted to senior operations analytical engineer. In 1980, he became equity area engineer and in 1982 he was promoted to Kupasuk engineering manager.

In 1983, Darrel was transferred to Houston as off-shore operations manager. In 1985 he became operations manager for both off-shore and on-shore. Later that year he was transferred to ARCO International Oil and Gas Company in Los Angeles as vice president of engineering and technology. During this year, he was transferred to ARCO Oil and Gas Company in Dallas as manager of planning and evaluation.

Darrel and his wife, Dianne, have four children: Tanya, Holly and twin boys, Brock and Brent. They make their home in Plano, Texas.

Bryan Potter is a graduate of Thomas High School and received his pharmacy degree in 1957.

In October 1989, he became the executive secretary of the Oklahoma State Board of Pharmacy, replacing Joe Schwemmer who retired.

Potter was installed as the 1988-89 president of National Association of Boards of Pharmacy in its annual meeting in San Antonio, Texas. The National Association of Boards of Pharmacy is an organization of the state boards along with Virgin Islands, Puerto Rico and the provinces of Canada. Its purpose is to provide pharmacist licensure transfer in the U.S. and Canada and testing of competency for candidates for licenses.

He was long associated with Paul Jones Drug, now Healthmart, located in Elk City and has been active in civic and political affairs in western Oklahoma for many years.

Potter has been a member of the Oklahoma State Board of Pharmacy since 1971 and a member of the board of the national organization since 1981. He has served two years as secretary-treasurer, then vice president and most recently as president-elect of the national association.

Through the years, Potter has served on the Bureau of Law Enforcement Committee and as liaison to both the Advisory Committee on Examinations and the Nabplex review committee.

In 1988, Potter served as the liaison to NABP's Committee on Education.

Potter has been the recipient of the NABP Distinguished Service Award, the Syntex Preceptor of the Year Award, Southwestern Oklahoma State University Alumnus of the Year Award and also the SWOSU Dean's Special Recognition Award.

Potter and his wife, Katy, reside in Elk City. Currently he is the Executive Director of Pharmacy Providers of Oklahoma, Inc.

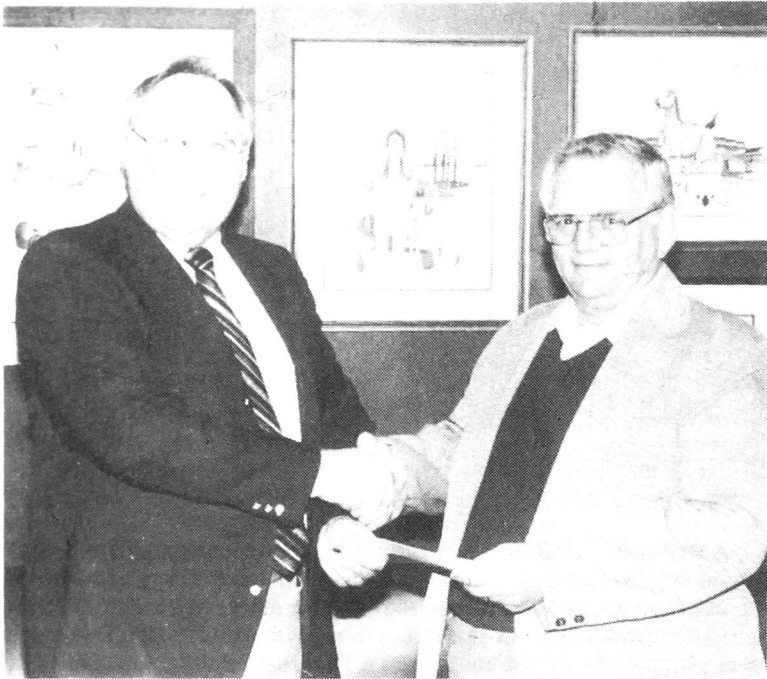

Alum inducted into Hall of Fame

Carroll Graham, veteran Oklahoma and New Mexico official and coach was inducted into the New Mexico Officials Association Hall of Fame in Las Cruces, New Mexico. The induction took place at the Hilton Inn during the state coaches and officials convention held in Las Cruces.

Graham is a native of rural Vashita County, Oklahoma. His parents Clarence and Edna Graham still reside in Carnegie, Oklahoma. He is a 1946 graduate of Cowden High School in Vashita County. He received his S.S. degree from Southwestern Oklahoma State University and his Masters degree from the University of Oklahoma. He started his coaching and teaching career in Oakwood, Oklahoma when he was only 20 years of age. He worked his first varsity allgame at the age of 18 at Linger, Oklahoma. He has worked the state championship games in both Oklahoma and New Mexico. (basketball and football) In addition to coaching in Clovis, N.M. he has served the following

schools: Hobart, Okla., Port, Oklahoma, Burns Flat, Oklahoma and Anaheim, California. He also worked the National American Legion baseball tournaments held in Oklahoma. He is at the present time Commissioner of Officials for the State of New Mexico and is on the National Committee of the AAU Junior Olympics basketball

team.

When asked who influenced his officiating career he named the following: Cotton Vickers, Luther French, Johnny Goodwin and Joe Cross. When asked who influenced his coaching career he named the following: O.B. Bradley, N.G. Carter, Red Miller and Steve Graham.

Graham said, "His greatest award from working with the youth of these communities is to see them grow and become a productive citizen."

Graham is now retired from teaching but not from working with the youth. He and his wife, Patricia, reside in Clovis where she is a school librarian in Muleshoe, Texas.

SWOSU alumnus Prock inducted into Harding Hall

John Prock was one of 15 individuals inducted as charter members of the Harding University Intercollegiate Athletic Hall of Fame. The induction ceremonies took place in Harding's American Heritage Dining Hall.

Prock, who served as head football coach at Harding for 24 years, joined three of his former players as charter inductees in the newly formed Hall.

A former player for Hollis High School and SWOSU head coach, Joe Bailey Metcalf, Prock directed the Bisons to two Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference titles during his tenure, in 1972 and 1976. He was named NAIA District 17 Coach of the Year in 1969, 1972 and 1976, and NAIA IV Coach of the Year in 1976. His 1972 squad finished the season 10-1, including a 30-27 win over Langston University in the Cowboy Bowl,

and ranked sixth in the final NAIA poll.

Prock, who is a native of Hollis, graduated from Southwestern Oklahoma in 1955, and was a lightweight, hardnosed guard for Metcalf. He served as an assistant coach under former University of Oklahoma great, Carl Allison, at Clinton High School until Allison came to Harding in 1959 as head coach. A year later, Prock joined Allison at Harding as an assistant and served in that capacity until 1964 when Allison stepped down.

When Prock retired from coaching in 1987, he was the sixth winningest active head coach in the NAIA with 114 wins. During his tenure, he coached 10 NAIA All-Americans, four Academic All-Americans and 63 All-AIC honorees.

Funeral services for Millie Fay (Alexandar) Thomas, 87-year-old former registrar at Southwestern Oklahoma State University, were held March 13, 1989 in the Federated Church of Weatherford.

"Millie", as she was known to the many alums and friends of Southwestern Oklahoma State

University, died March 10, 1989 at Clinton Regional Hospital. She had been in ill health for the past four years.

Even though Millie had not been in the best of health in her latter years, she still made valiant efforts to attend all homecoming and alumni association meetings and events.

Born June 8, 1901, in Taloga, she attended school near Arapaho and graduated from Arapaho High School in 1919.

She attended Southwestern Normal School in Weatherford receiving a teaching certificate in 1930. She worked in Sayre for the Beckham County superintendent

of schools before coming back to Southwestern in 1928 where she worked for 38 years. She spent 26 years of that time as registrar. She retired in 1966. After her retirement, she served as treasurer of the SWOSU Former Students Organization.

She married Clyde Thomas on Jan. 15, 1949, at Wheeler, Texas. Mr. Thomas died Jan. 12, 1976.

Survivors include three brothers: Joe Alexander of Gore, George Alexander of Borger, Texas, and Arch Alexander of Stillwater; one sister Goldie Friedrich of Clinton; and a host of nieces and nephews.



Alum completes basic training

While attending The Basic School, located at the Marine Corps Combat Development Com-

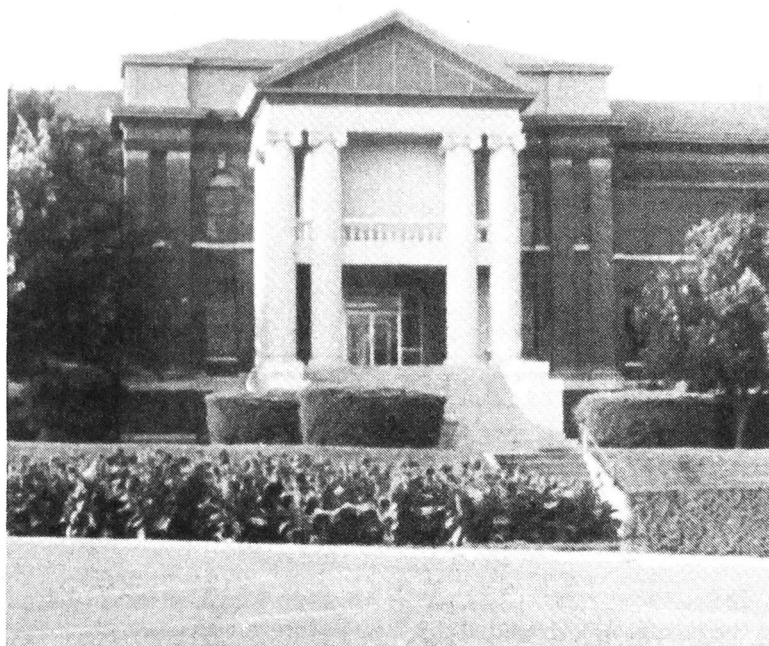
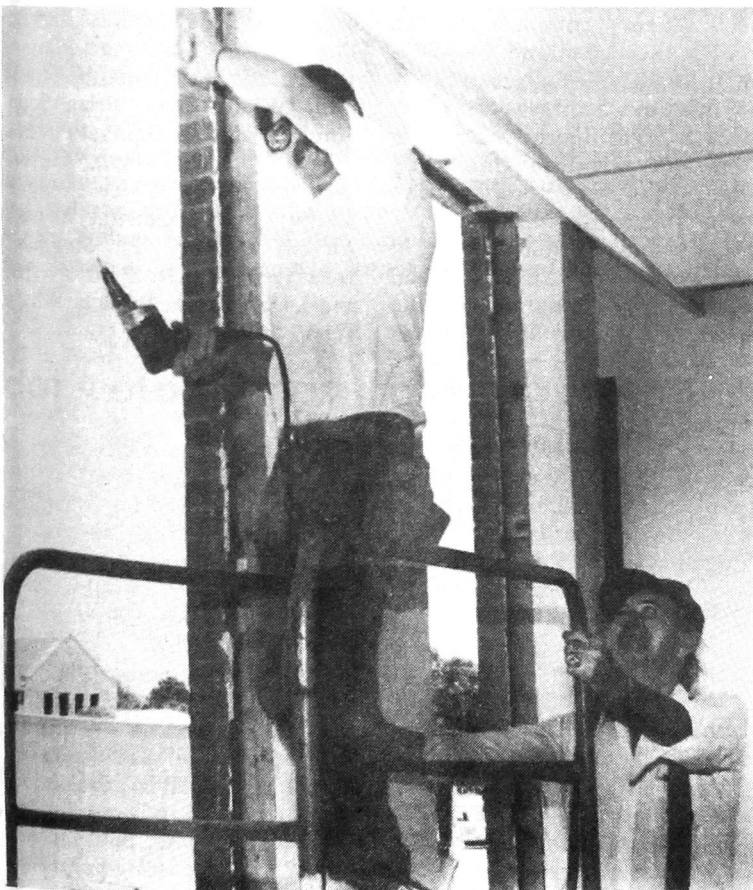

Physics students accept job offers

Several Southwestern Oklahoma State University senior physics students who have been very active in Southwestern's nationally-recognized outstanding chapter of the Society of Physics Students have accepted or are considering job offers from several nationally-known firms and one student has chosen to continue his studies in engineering physics.

They are: Terence Stegman, graduating senior from Weatherford; Melissa DuBiel, graduating senior from Enid; Edwin Farrar, graduating senior from Dover; and Thad Gardner, senior from Hydro who will graduate in December 1989.

Stegman has accepted a posi-

tion as a reliability engineer with the Texas Instruments Missile Division in Lewisville, Texas. DuBiel is considering an offer from NASA in Huntsville, Alabama. Farrar has a graduate assistantship to study for the Ph.D. in engineering physics at the University of Virginia in Charlottesville, VA.

Gardner has a summer engineering position with the Central Research Division of Texas Instruments in Richardson, Texas. He will be working in a group which is headed by Joe Abernathy, a 1972 SWOSU physics alumnus from Sweetwater. Four other Southwestern physics graduates work in the Abernathy group at TI. They are Mark

Crowder, a native of Weatherford; Craig Huffman, a native of Attica, Kan.; and brothers Tyler and Andy Weaver, natives of Hollis.

All four students have been quite active in the society of Physics Students chapter at Southwestern. Farrar has served

as president, DuBiel as vice president and Stegman as public relations officer. Gardner will serve as upcoming vice president. Gardner and Carl Jantz of Weatherford were authors of a successful proposal for a 1988 Allied-Signal grant for research on high-temperature superconductors.

Southwestern graduate featured speaker

The Department of Physics at Southwestern Oklahoma State University held its annual spring banquet for alumni, students and faculty on the SWOSU campus in Weatherford.

Featured speaker for the evening was Ronald D. Scott, a native of Cheyenne, who spoke on the future of the United States space program. Scott graduated from Southwestern in 1957 with degrees in physics and mathematics. He then began a long career in Huntsville, Alab., with NASA.

He later became a U.S. Government senior executive in the NASA headquarters in Washington, D.C. Scott also ran the U.S. Solar Energy program for the Energy Research and Development Agency for four years. During this time, Scott was chosen as the U.S. Solar Energy Man of the Year and was also chosen by Engineering News Record as Man of the Year in Engineering.

Scott retired from NASA in 1983 and spent a year as the head of an energy program for the Governor of Puerto Rico. Then, in

1984, he established an engineering consulting firm, R.D. Scott & Associates, in Houston, Texas.

During the SWOSU physics banquet, Scott was inducted into the prestigious Sigma Pi Sigma national physics honor society. He was the 116th inductee into the honor society at Southwestern Oklahoma State University.

Others inducted into Sigma Pi Sigma included Cari Marie Farrar, Mustang; Bradley Leon Mitchell, Arapaho; and Dowlan William Smith, Carter.

Other Southwestern students who received honors at the banquet were: Melissa DuBiel, Enid, Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges; Edwin James Farrar, Dover, Who's Who and Leadership Award; Carl Jantz, Weatherford, Who's Who; Brian Scott, Porch, Watonga, General Physics Award; Dowlan Smith, Carter, Who's Who; Royce Wayne Snider, Perry, General Physics Award; Terence R. Stegman, Weatherford, J.R. Pratt Award; and Logan Willis, Verden, Who's Who.

Alumnus hired for state job

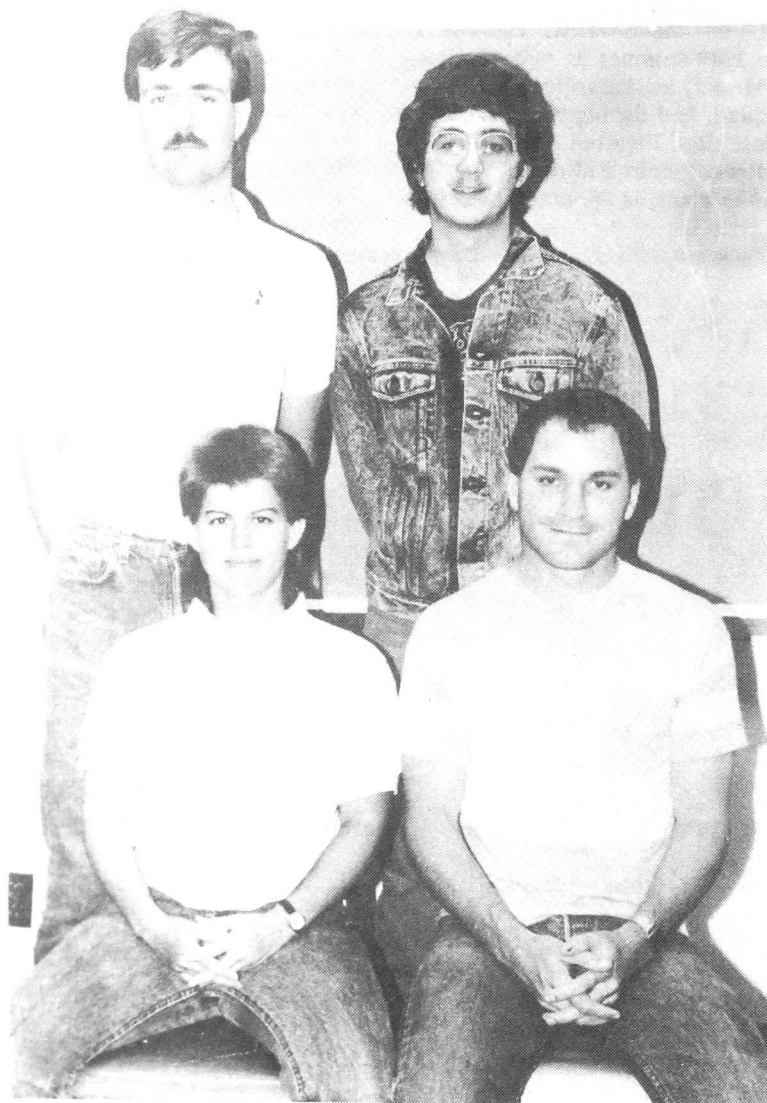
As assistant state supervisor, Bowers will make visits to technology education programs

He and his wife, Betty, have a son, Troy and daughter, Tracy Thorpe. Both are students at SWOSU.

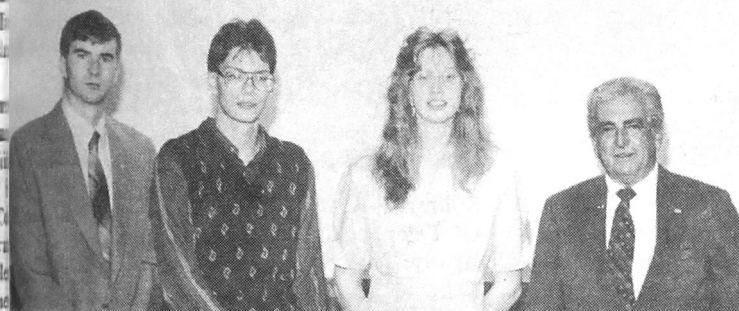

Orville Long dealing with wood differently

With many years experience of woodworking and teaching shop classes, Orville Long of Cordell has and is dealing with wood in a different manner.

Long has been working in his shop behind his home in Cordell and is taking a different angle on woodworking. Long is presently making bowls, and all sorts of them.

Most of the bowls that Mr. Long makes are laminated or stave. Laminated bowls are made of different sizes of layers, while the stave bowls are made with different sections and angles.

Uses of many different types and colors of woods make each bowl unique. Mr. Long uses mahogany, walnut, oak, purple heart, or any other type of wood for his bowls.

Although not complicated, the bowls that are made do take time and plenty of patience. Some bowls can be made in 15 to 20 hours time over a period of days

or weeks, and sometimes can take close to 40 hours of work.

To make a bowl, layers of wood are glued together to form a design. The middle of the layer should be cut out at any desired diameter. The layers are then put on a wood lathe to be formed and designed into a bowl. The process of making one of these bowls is actually harder to explain than to do.

Mr. Long has been making regular bowls for a number of years, and laminated and stave since winter. He also says that there is not many around the area that do make bowls.

The wood is expensive and one bowl could cost in the range of \$80 to \$90, but Mr. Long knows that he is getting something in return each time a new and different type of bowl is complete--satisfaction.

Orville is a 1950 graduate of Southwestern Oklahoma State University.

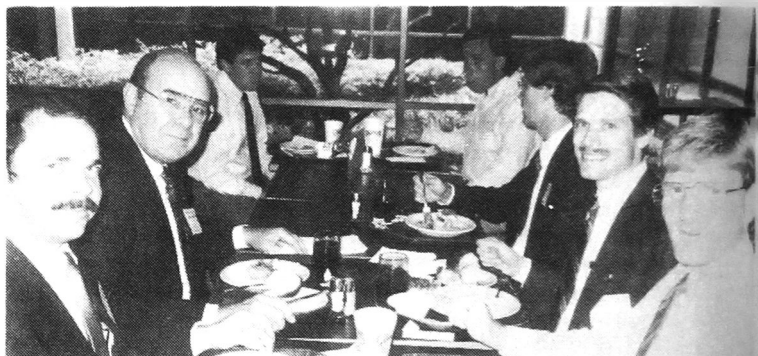

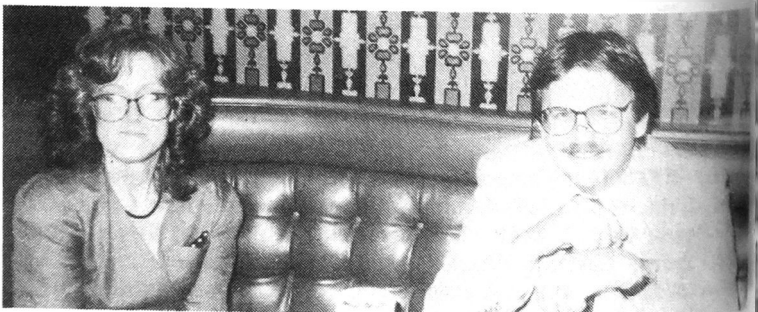

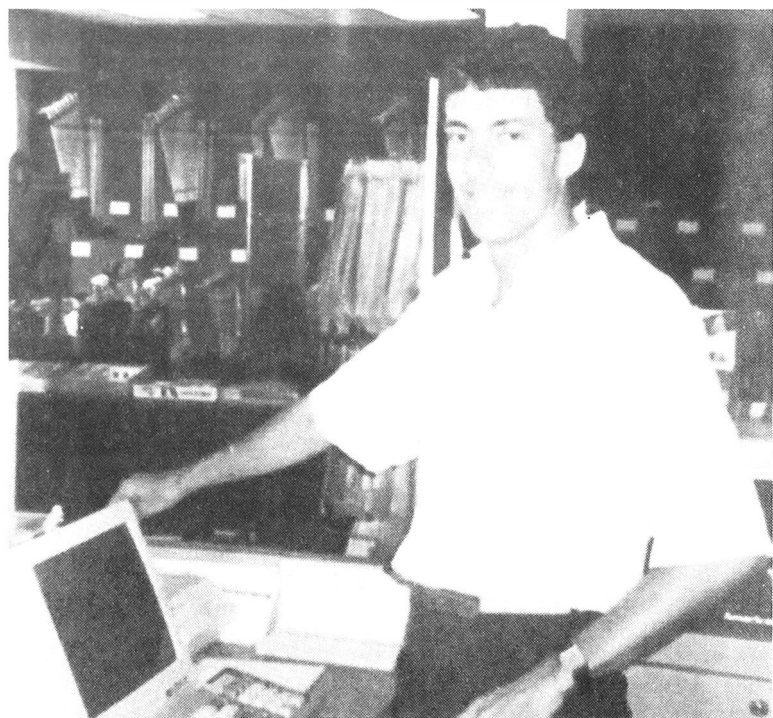

Rodeoers take 2nd

Southwestern Oklahoma State University women's rodeo team came close to winning its second straight national championship title at the 1989 College National Finals Rodeo, held June 11-17, in Bozeman, Montana.

The SWOSU women ended up as national champion runnerup to California State Polytechnic University. Southwestern had won the women's title in 1988.

Cal-Poly accumulated 834 total points to outdistance second place Southwestern which had 498. Rounding out the top five were Walla Walla, Wash., 480; Idaho State, 300; and Wyoming, 255.

Leading the Southwestern women was Tuscon, Ariz., senior Shannon Lord who won CNFR individual national championships in both breakaway roping and all-around competition. She also won the breakaway national championship title based on performances throughout the year. Lord also took third place in both the short go and average of team roping with partner Nick Sarchet of Arizona.

Also doing well at the CNFR were Staci Barber of Devol and Lesa Arnold of Pryor. Baber took

first place of the first round of barrel racing, while Arnold placed fourth in the first round of barrel racing.

Southwestern's women's team advanced to nationals by winning the 1989 Central Plains Regional championship title which is comprised of schools in Oklahoma and Kansas. It was the sixth straight championship for Southwestern. The women's team has also been a strong competitor at nationals during the 1980s. In addition to the 1988 national championship title, the women finished 3rd in 1983, 1985 and 1986.

As for the Southwestern men, they ended up in 10th place at the CNFR. Southwestern had two starters in the finals. John Opie of Crane, Oreg., ended up winning second place in the CNFR steer wrestling competition. He also placed second in the first round of team roping and wound up taking fourth place in the men's all-around competition at the finals.

Another SWOSU starter, Raymond Holyan of Crownpoint, N.M., placed sixth in the average of calf roping.

Odessa, Texas, won the men's championship title with 1,410 points. Finishing second was host Montana State with 801.

SWOSU graduate hired as WHS basketball coach

It has been an exciting past two basketball seasons for Southwestern graduates Allen and Ruth (Maynard) Boyd. Allen was a graduate assistant coach at the University of Oklahoma and is now boys basketball coach at Weatherford High School.

Allen, a 1984 graduate of Southwestern from Watonga, was with the Sooners during the 1987-88 and 1988-89 seasons. While assisting with on-the-floor coaching in practices and games kept him busy, Boyd also was heavily involved in coordinating and maintaining recruiting files. In addition, he helped coordinate

Billy Tubbs' summer camps.

Allen joined OU after coaching for three years at Altus Junior High School where he served as the freshman head basketball coach, assistant baseball coach and assistant football coach.

He earned a master's degree in education (secondary administration) at OU.

His wife, Ruth, is the daughter of Weatherford's Bob and Millie Maynard who both work at Southwestern. Ruth is a 1985 SWOSU graduate and she earned her MBA from Southwestern in 1986. The 1982 Weatherford High School graduate worked as a student aid counselor at OU.

Roundball starts soon

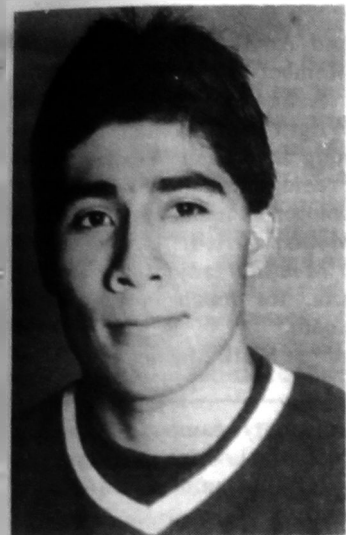
Basketball season will soon be here and, as always, Southwestern basketball fans look forward to watching the Lady Bulldogs and Bulldogs.

Castaneda named to NAIA baseball team

One Southwestern Oklahoma State University baseball player was named to the 1989 NAIA District 9 baseball team, while three others from the Weatherford university were named to the second team.

SWOSU third baseman Rick Castaneda of Midland, Texas, was named to the first team, while outfielder Mike Wilson of Cleveland, outfielder Nick Scalf of Altus and pitcher Brian Leaver of Oklahoma City Putnam City West were named to the second team. In addition, first baseman Dean Hodge of Moore was named honorable mention.

Castaneda, a Vernon, Texas Junior College transfer, was the

leading hitter for the Bulldogs in 1989. He had a .388 batting average which included a team-leading 69 hits. The junior also led the team in doubles with 16.

Wilson, a senior, was the second-leading hitter on the Bulldog squad at .340. He also led the 'Dogs in stolen bases with 19. Scalf, a senior who had a .309 batting average, led the Bulldogs in the RBI department with 35. Scalf was also a District 9 Academic Team selection with his 3.45

grade point average in math education. Leaver, a freshman, had a 10-2 pitching mark. Leaver threw a total of 88 innings and had a team-leading ERA of 4.295. Hodge, also a senior, had .312 batting average for the Bulldogs.

Castaneda, Wilson, Scalf and Leaver were also named to the first team to the Oklahoma Intercollegiate Conference. Hodge was an OIC second team selection.

Southwestern ended the season with a 30-23 record.

Alum wins state championship

Rick Beene said 'Luck of the Irish' wasn't the reason Bishop McGuinness won its first state basketball championship.

Beene, The Oklahoman's Coach of the Year, emphasized team play and hard work were the key ingredients.

McGuinness, ranked 18th in pre-season, returned just one full-time starter. The Irish, rated fourth in the final ratings, posted narrow wins over No. 1 Millwood, No. 2 Beggs and No. 3 Hugo to win the Class 3A title.

"It really was a dream season," Beene said. "I was just happy to be at McGuinness, knowing the opportunities I would have. When I first got the job no one thought we had a lot of talent, and I didn't either when I first saw them."

But then Beene saw the work ethics. His five starters had ACT scores of 31, 31, 26, 25 and 21.

"They took practice very seriously. There wasn't any horsing around," Beene said. "We could accomplish a lot more in two hours than most teams could in three. None of them will probably play in college but that's because most of them want to go and accomplish something in academics."

Beene, a Fort Cobb High School and Southwestern University graduate, was at Alex for seven seasons, the final six as head coach. He was used to challenges. Alex had won just one game in three years, but the Longhorns won seven his first season, 19 his second year and 24 his third.

"I took pride that we turned a program around there," Beene said, "but they already had tradi-

tion here."

McGuinness, finishing 26-4, won five Catholic state titles in the 1940's and '50s, but this was the Irish's first OSSAA championship. The only three regular season losses came against 5A schools.

"Towards the end of the regular season we realized we were capable of competing against anyone in 3A after the teams we played," Beene said. This was the first time McGuinness played an all 4A, 5A schedule.

"Even though we knew there were six or seven powerhouses in 3A, we felt very confident. We didn't have a big man inside like Millwood, but we had tremendous balance. This team played as a team better than any team I've seen."

Millwood was the only 3A school to beat the Irish, and McGuinness avenged that loss with a 61-60 triumph in the finals.

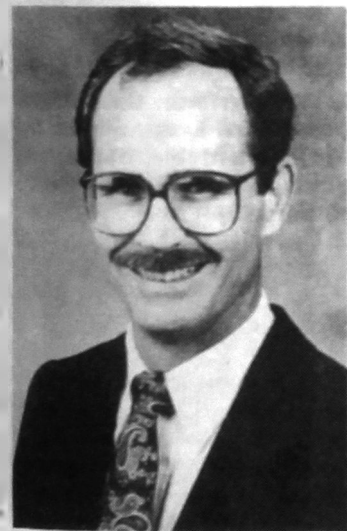
"We've sort of been Millwood's shadows over the years," Beene said. "It was really nice to reverse the roles once. Obviously, we couldn't match their size, but we felt we had more experience and there were some things we could do."

Beene doesn't see a dramatic dropoff despite graduating his six top players.

"Our freshmen team averaged 84 points and was 16-6," he said. "Three losses came against Southeast which had a 6-8 kid. Our junior varsity, playing only 4A and 5A schools, was 13-6. I know we won't be ranked as high as Millwood or Broken Bow next year, but we'll be competitive."

Meeting adjourned at 11:30 a.m. for lunch in the Skyview Room.

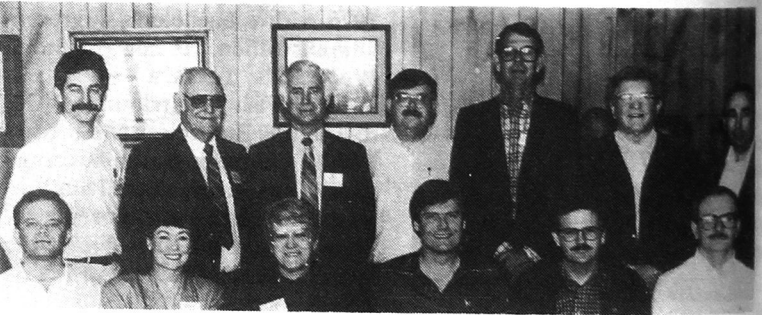

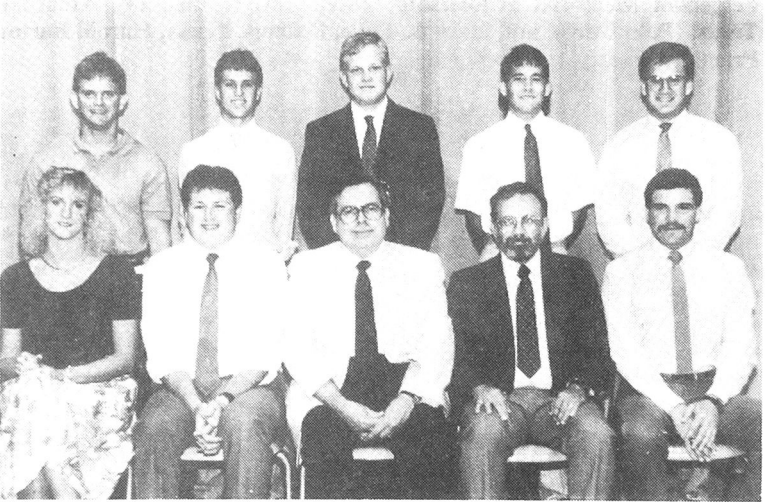

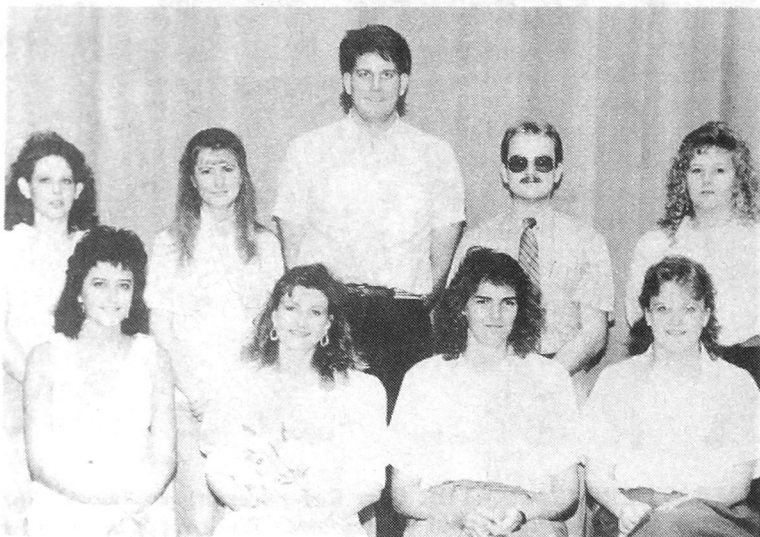

New county 4-H agent

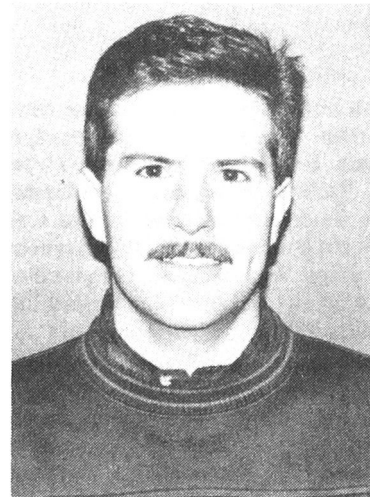

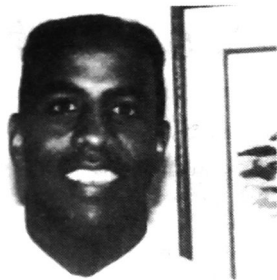

CHARLES WILLIAM SHEID

Charles William Sheid, 53, of Oklahoma City, died in Hackensack, New Jersey.

Sheid was born Oct. 25, 1935 at Hollis, the son of William and Alma Sheid. He graduated from Hollis High School in 1955, and received a bachelor's degree and a master's degree from Southwestern Oklahoma State University. He also worked on his doctorate's degree at the University of Oklahoma.

He moved to Oklahoma City in 1962. He served the Western Heights School system 27 years as teacher, coach, athletic director, principal and was, at the time of his death, assistant superintendent.

ROY P. STEWART

Roy P. Stewart, author, historian and newsman whose column "Country Boy" linked him with thousands of Oklahomans, died after an extended illness. He was 83.

Born in Tennessee in 1905, Stewart spent most of his life in Oklahoma. His journalism career spanned more than 60 years, and earlier this year he was inducted into the Oklahoma Journalism Hall of Fame.

He was a staff member of The Oklahoman, assistant Sunday editor, general assignment reporter, city editor, Washington correspondent, roving feature writer, editorial writer as well as author of "Country Boy."

After retiring from The Oklahoman, he was executive director of the State Advisory Council on Vocational Education from 1970 to 1985.

He was an Oklahoma National Guardsman, too, and a charter member of Battery D, 158th Field Artillery, 45th Infantry Division. He served in WWII. He retired from the Oklahoma Guard in 1965 with the rank of colonel.

Stewart's awards included the Distinguished Achievement Award of the Military Order of the World Wars and the Heritage Endowment Award of the Oklahoma Historical Society. The Roy P. Stewart Library of the West was dedicated last month at the Museum of Unassigned Lands in Oklahoma City.

Survivors include his wife, June; and three children, Ronald L. Stewart, Oklahoma City; Dr. Roger M. Stewart, Seattle, Wash., and Dr. Judith Kaye Shank, Fort Worth.

DONA KELLEY

Dona Kelley, wife of longtime Weatherford businessman F.L. Kelley, died at her local home at the age of 83.

Born at Tahlequah Aug. 13, 1905, she moved to Weatherford at the age of eight. She attended Weatherford Public Schools and graduated from WHS in 1922.

After high school, she attended Southwestern Teachers College (now Southwestern Oklahoma State University) in Weatherford, graduating in 1928. While in college she was employed as an assistant librarian.

She then taught school for a year in the Washita County community of Bessie, before returning to her job at the Southwestern library.

On June 1, 1930, she married F.L. Kelley in Clinton. They lived in Chickasha for a short time before moving to Weatherford to open their first jewelry store. The store chain was expanded to include stores in Elk City and Watonga during the 1940's, which the Kelleys operated until their retirement.

Mrs. Kelley was a member of the First United Methodist Church, Probieren Club and was one of the founders of the Girl Scouts of western Oklahoma.

She is survived by her husband F.L. of Weatherford; one daughter and son-in-law, Pat and L.V. Baker of Elk City; twin sons

and their wives, David and Nita Kelley and Don and Glenda Kelley, all of Weatherford; 11 grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.

DR. MERLE EUGENE TAFF

Dr. Merle Eugene Taff, longtime SWOSU music professor, died at M.D. Anderson Hospital in Houston after a six-year illness. He was 70.

Mr. Taff was born in Dustin on February 15, 1919. He was raised in that area and attended high school in Graham, graduating from there. He then attended East Central University in Ada where he obtained his bachelor of arts degree in music.

During WWII, Taff served in the U.S. Navy. He married Doris Arrington November 23, 1946, at First Christian Church in Ada.

After their marriage they moved to Norman, where he attended the University of Oklahoma, graduating in 1948 with a master's degree. In August of that year they moved to Weatherford, where he became a professor at SWOSU.

He worked on his doctorate at the University of Indiana, graduating in 1964. All told, he taught at SWOSU for 34 years before his retirement in 1982.

He was a member of the Federated Church of Weatherford and was also a member of Kiwanis Club, National Association of Teachers of Singing, Music Education National Conference, American Choral Directors Association, Weatherford Golf Association and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia.

At the Federated Church, he served as music director from 1948 to 1982.

Survivors include his wife, Doris, of the home; one daughter, Carolyn Bjerke and husband Scott of Sugarland, Texas; two brothers, Homar A. Taff of Louisa, Kentucky, and James Maurice Taff of Ada; and one sister, Billie Frew of Henryetta.
