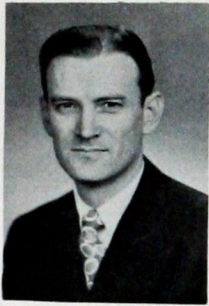
It is a fast-moving and sometimes frustrating world in which we live. Knowledge, understanding and an open mind are basic requirements for a full and happy life.

If you do, there is no limit to what your future accomplishments may be. Ours is a young, energetic state filled with opportunities on every hand.

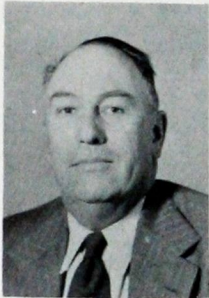

The purpose of the Y Chapel is to serve as a center of campus religious life. Throughout the school year inter-denominational groups meet daily for noon-day services and evening vespers.



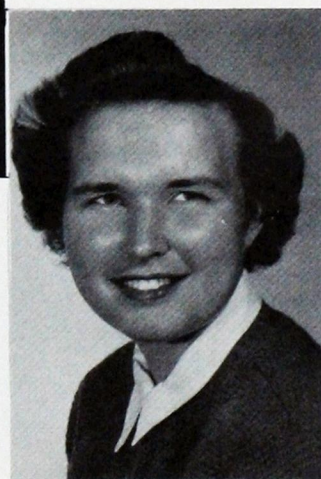

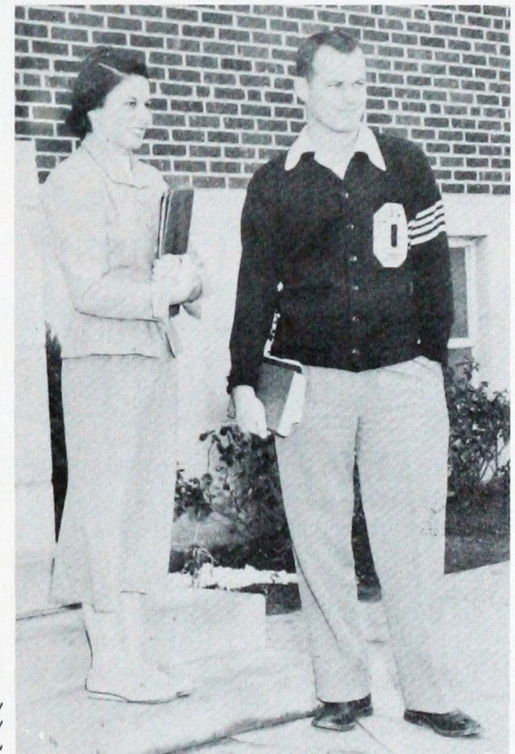
Future Teachers of America

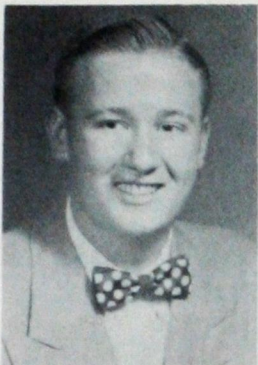
Lambda Mu

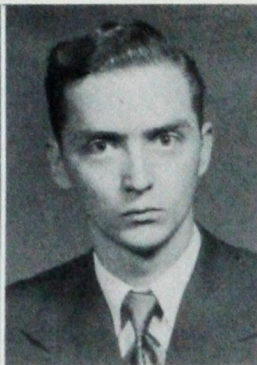

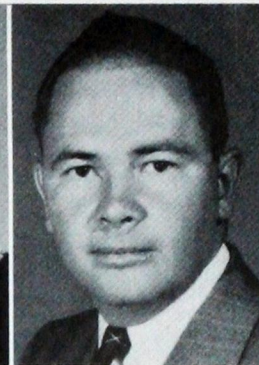

After the end of World War II, when the veterans returned to the campus, the membership consisted of boys, girls, and veterans wives. The membership now consists of boys and girls.

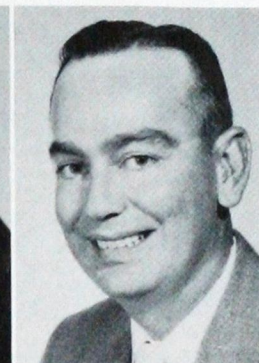

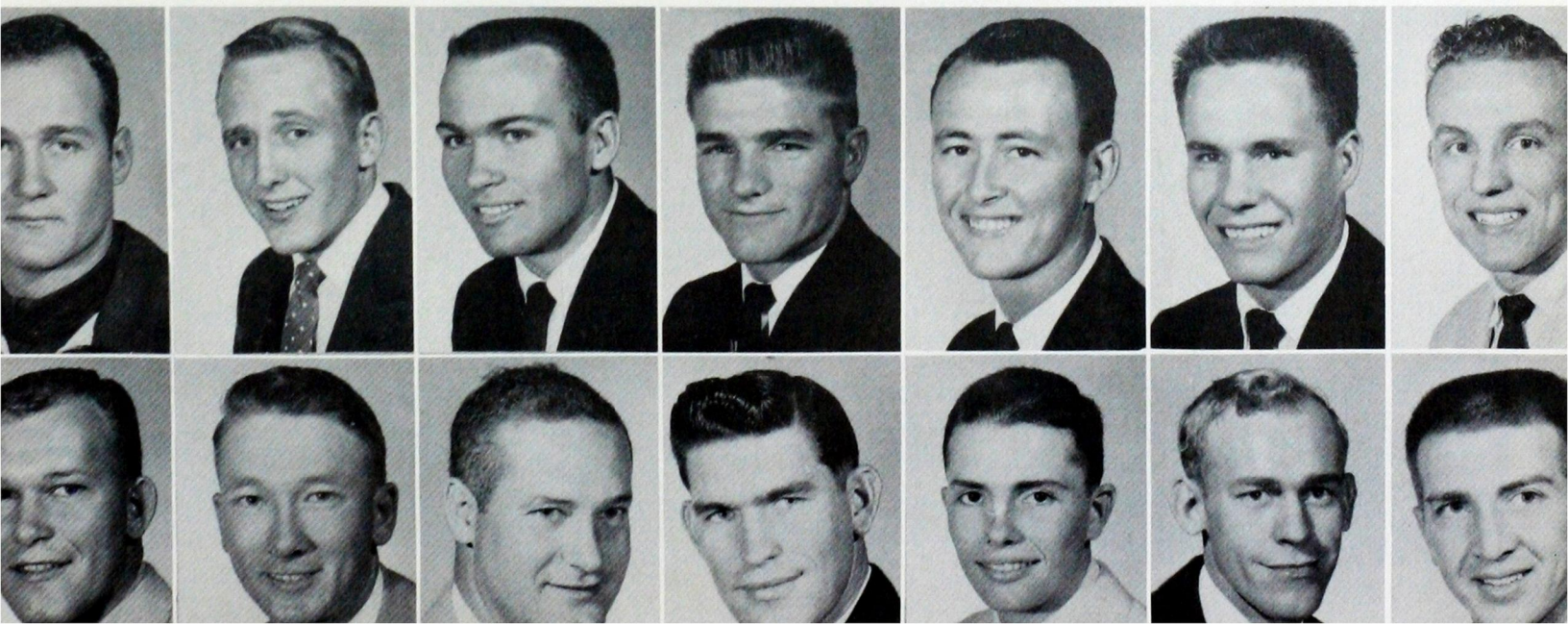
"O" Club

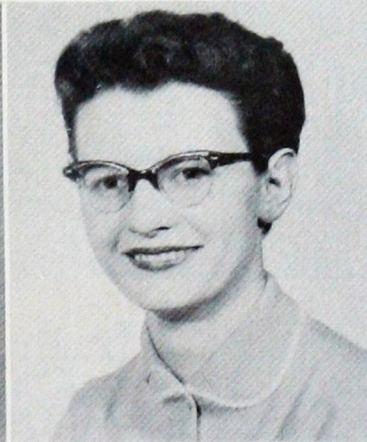
Future Business Leaders of America

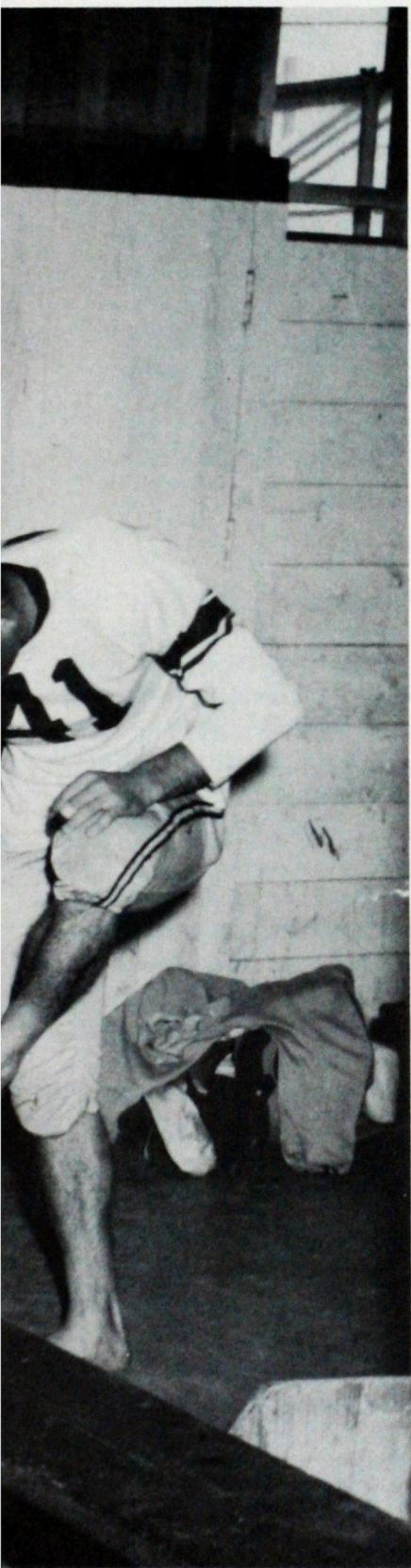

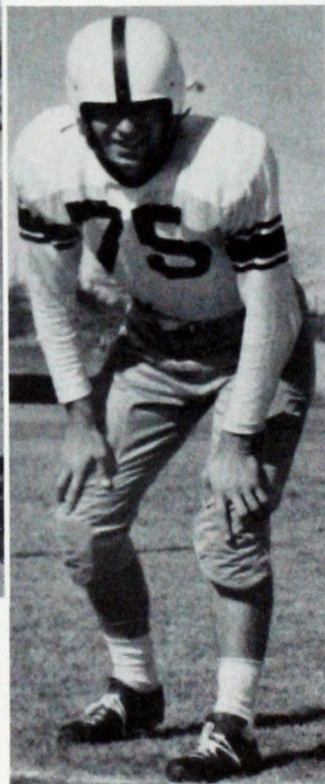

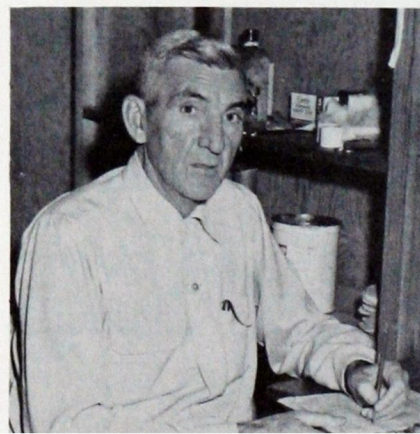

It was a **great** season. That was the general consensus at Southwestern after Coach Joe B. Metcalf's tenacious Bulldogs wound up the 1954 grid season with a record of seven wins, two losses, and were able to bite off a chunk of the conference title.

Only one loss was to a conference opponent—that to Central, who shared the title with Southwestern by posting an identical 4-1 conference record. In non - conference games Southwestern emerged victorious in three out of four.

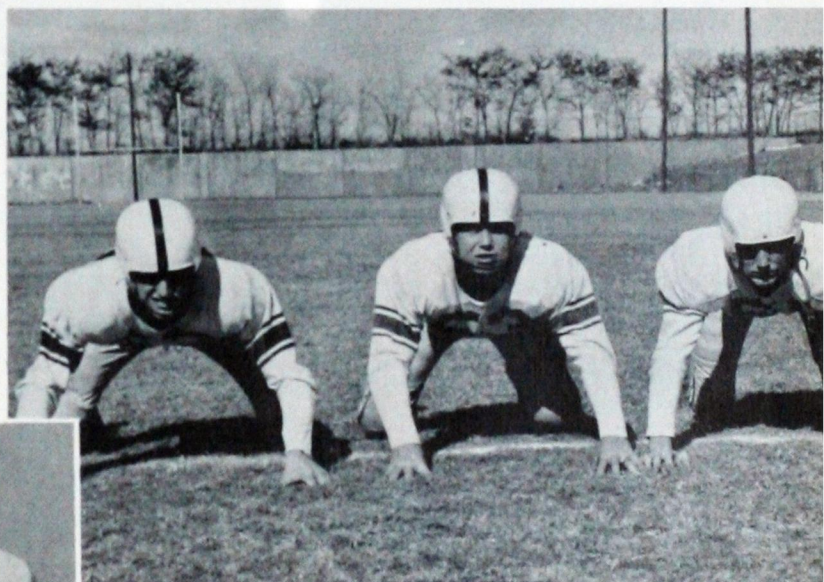




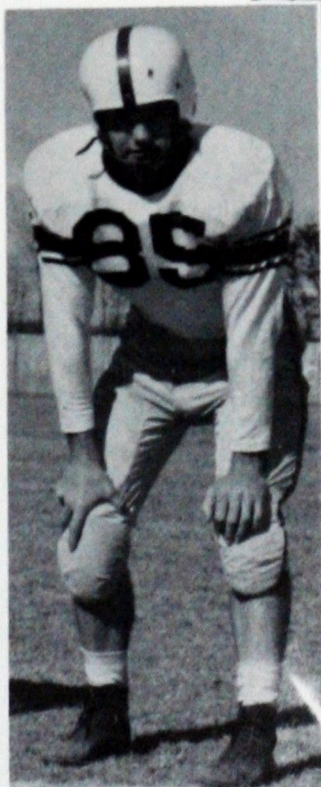

Impressive, too, was the building job done by Coach Metcalf, who started with a scarcity of material in 1952 and built the team to its present strength. Assistant Coaches

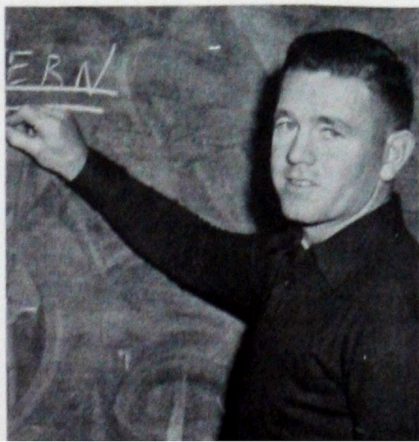


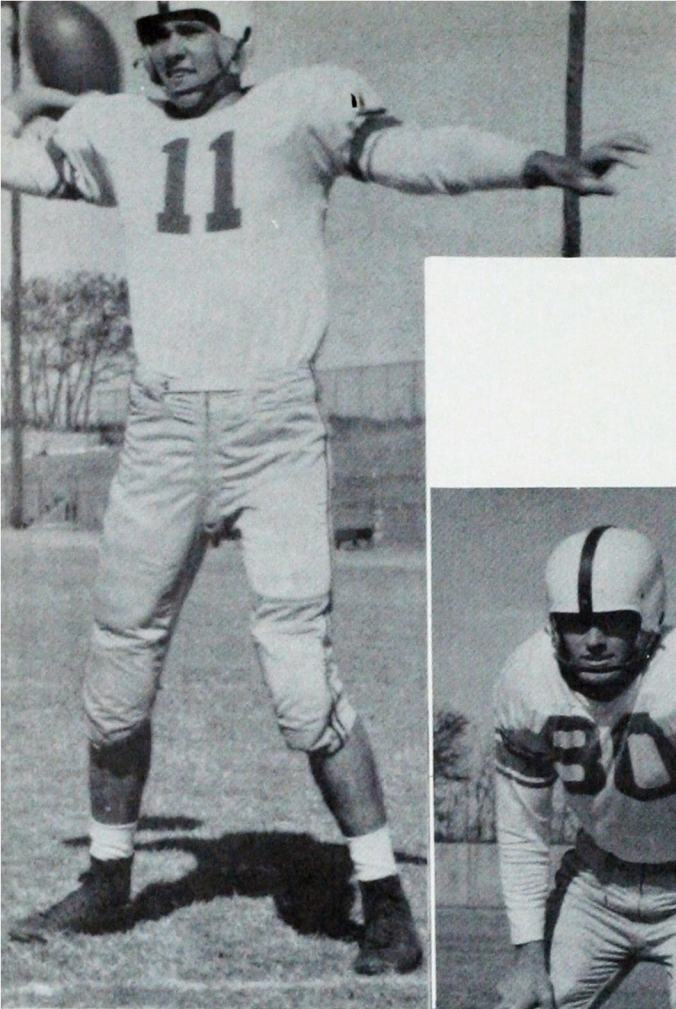

ing the second half. There are those who think that one more long pass—John Buck's specialty—might have saved the game for Southwestern. That is, of course, guess work, for as it was, the Greyhounds won the game, 13-7, with the Bulldogs' only tally coming early on a pass from Buck to Ladd Morris, who scampered 55 yards to score.

Southwestern's Bulldogs recovered sufficiently from losing the opener to take the next three games. They slipped by a heavier, but more sluggish, East Central team in rather convincing style. The 21-0 win over the Tigers was in large part the result of efficient line play, in addition to outstand-

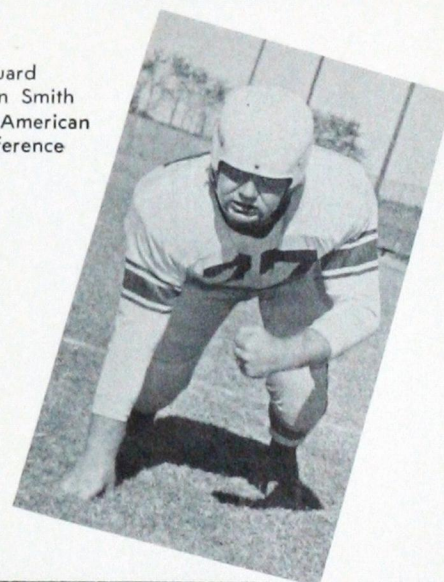
ing runs by Vern Harris and Buck. Southwestern College of Winfield, Kansas, was a tougher opponent, and the Bulldogs squeaked by to win, 7-0. Statistics of the game, however, were more lop-sided than the score would suggest. The following Saturday, at Northwestern's homecoming, the Bulldog team spoiled the day for the Rangers, 14-0. The Rangers were completely unable to penetrate the 5-3-2-1 defense.

At Homecoming, October 16, the stage was set for a stirring dramatic spectacle. Southwestern's rooters wanted to win this one especially. For one thing, a win would mean a holiday for students the following Monday. After the tradi-

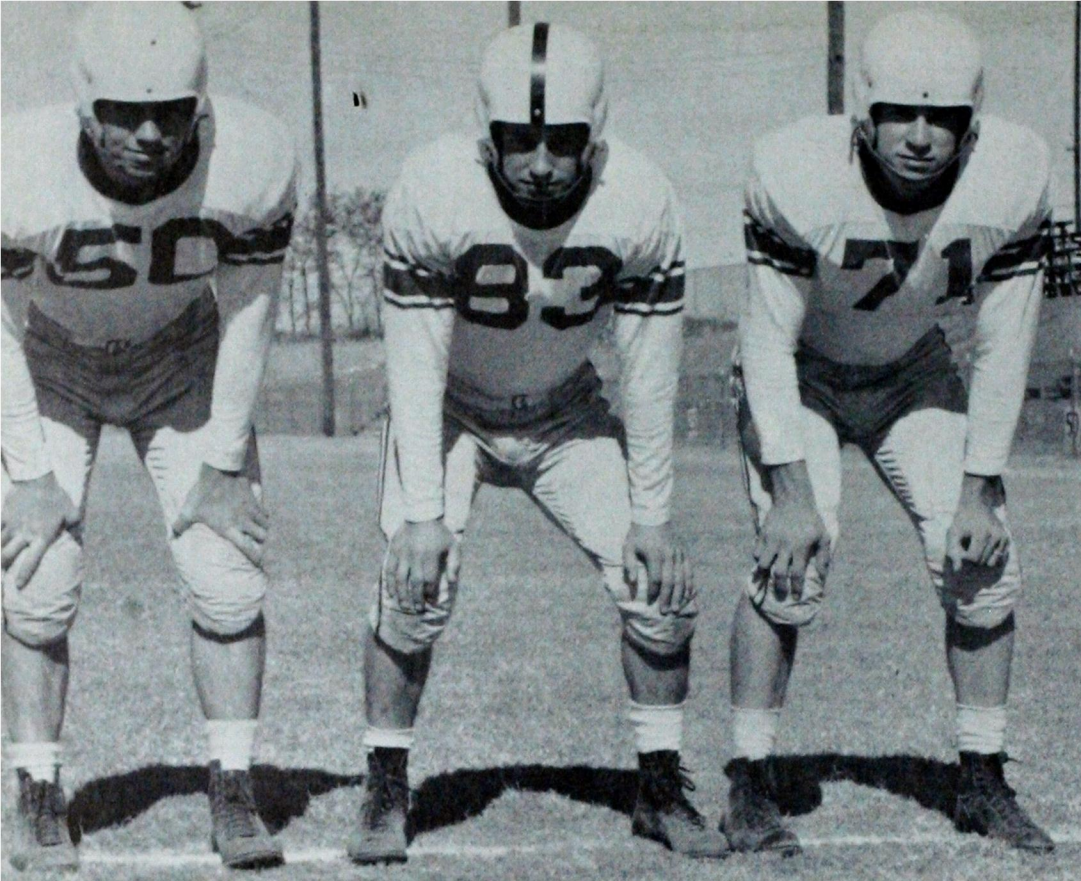

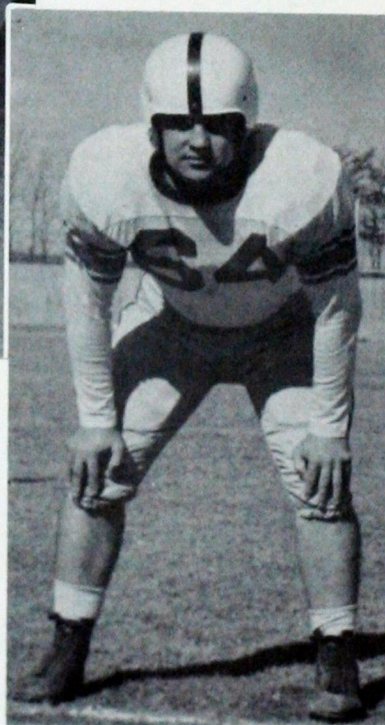

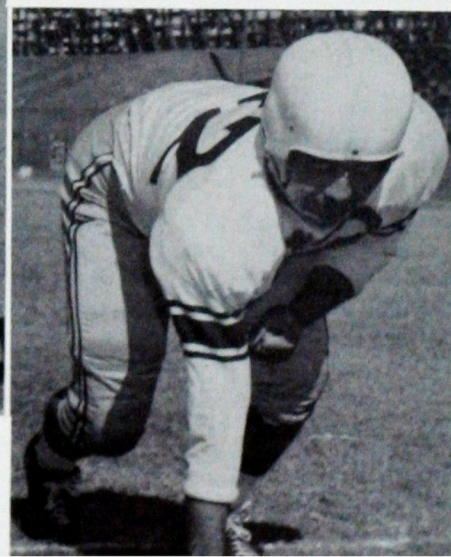

tional morning festivities, a crowd estimated as being the largest ever to assemble for a game in Weatherford took their seats at Milam Stadium. The weather was perfect. Everyone was aware that both Central and Southwestern were battling to stay in the running for the conference championship and that a victory would give Southwestern undisputed possession of first place, Southeastern's Savages having forfeited a game to Northwestern.

Central scored first but failed to convert. Southwestern came back fast to go ahead, 7-6. During the entire game tension became evident in the play of both teams. Blocking and tackling was sometimes fierce. The Bulldogs maintained their slim advantage until the fourth quarter. Then Hayden Battles, a recent transfer from O. U., got off a bad punt which gave the Broncos the ball somewhere in the vicinity of the Bulldogs' twenty-yard stripe. Central's Broncos pushed hard to a first down inside the ten. Then the Bulldogs' defenses tightened to make a heroic

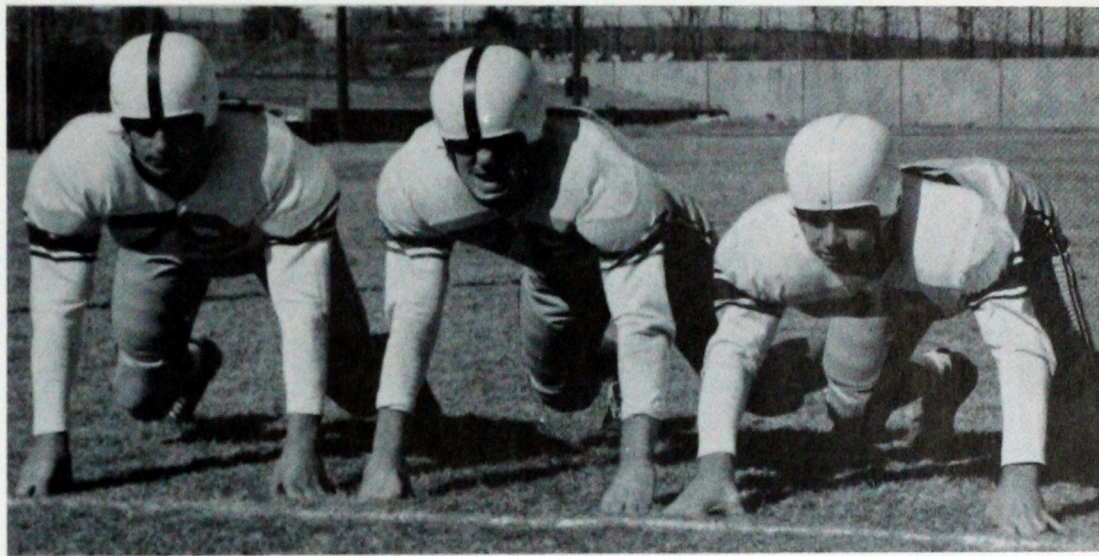

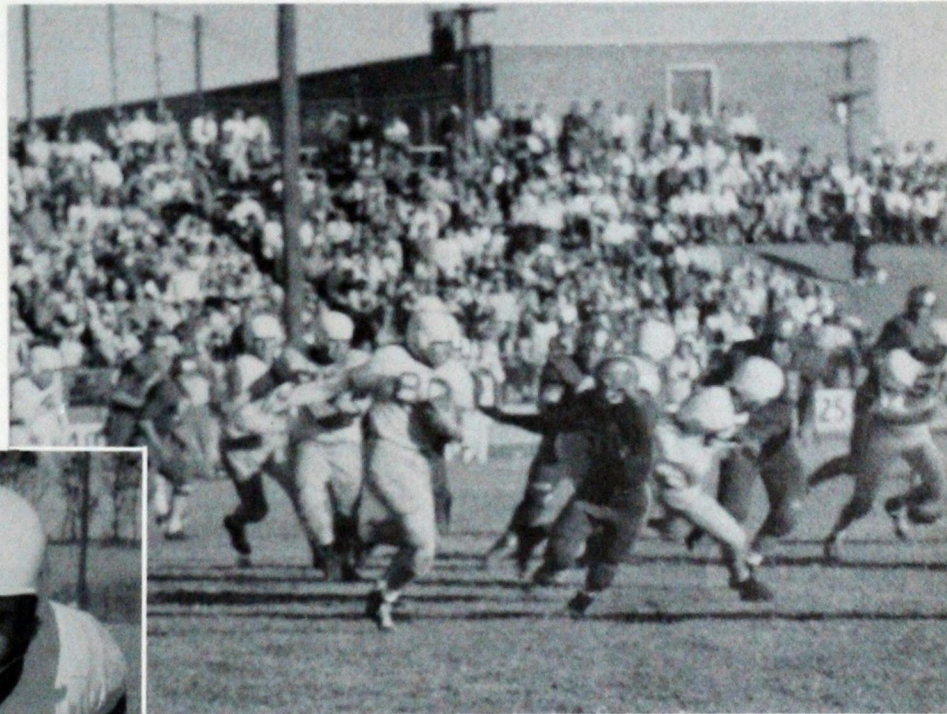

For the final two games the Bulldogs went on long trips. Playing the Panhandle Aggies, champions of the New Mexico Conference, they came from

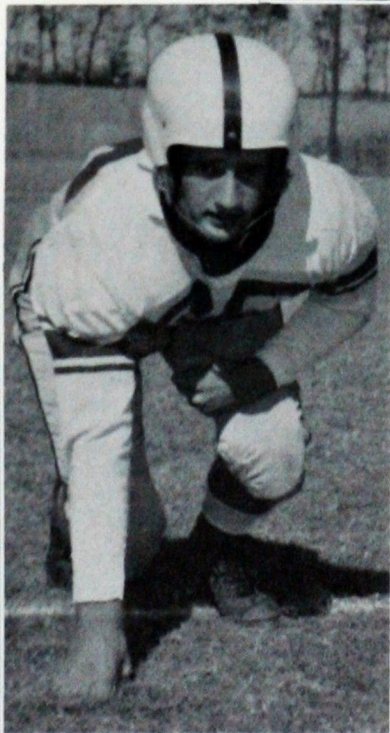
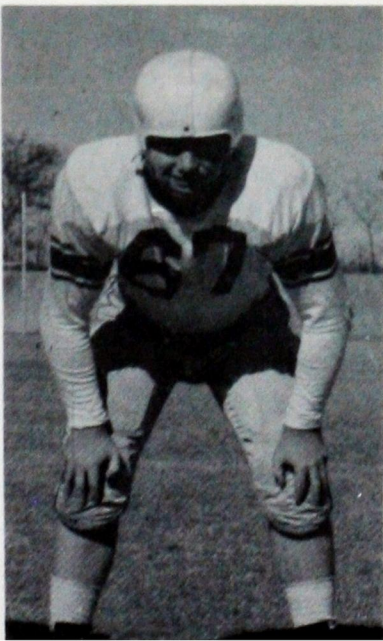

Bulldog Cagesters Tie for Second Place

Winding up the season with a record of 9 wins, 5 defeats in regular conference play, Southwestern's basketball team tied with O. B. U. for second place behind the league leading Southeastern Savages. Jerrel Chesney and Jim Litsch, standouts on the court all season, set a torrid pace in the last five games to win high national rankings in free throw and field-goal accuracy respectively.

On those nights when he was hitting, Chesney was especially effective in pacing the Bulldog attack. For example, at Alva on January 21, the six-foot forward set the individual record for the season by dunking 38 points. And in the last game against Phillips, he hit 34 points, sinking 18 out of 18 for a perfect record at the charity line.

Litsch outdid himself in the February 25 contest against Northwestern. The 6-5 Bulldog post-man pushed in 36 points, 30 in the second half. Most of his shots were the difficult twisting kind, under the basket, but Big Jim's accuracy from the field that night was well over 75 percent.

Others on the starting fiver were Travis Flippin, who was a standout on defense; Keith Wiginton, freshman who won a place for himself with his superb floorwork; and Jack Ware, who frequently took scoring honors. 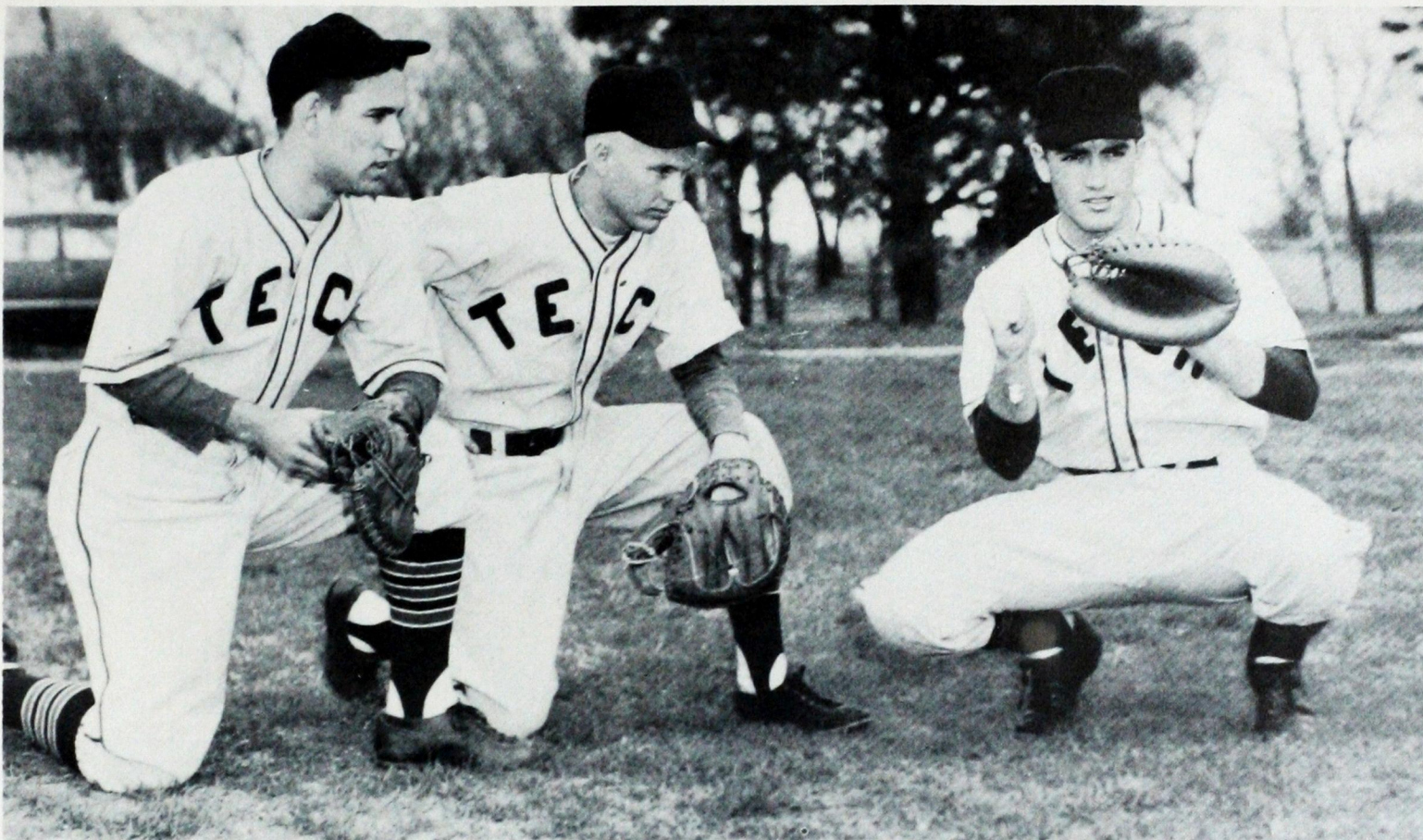
Baseball 1954

With so many lettermen back Coach Rankin Williams is looking forward to another successful season in 1955, hoping it will end with Southwestern's fifth consecutive conference title.

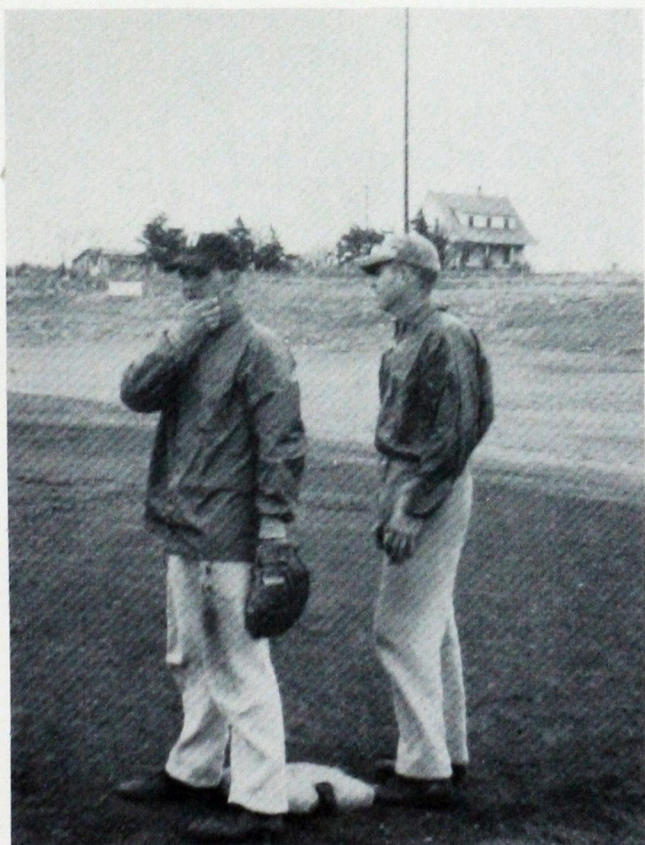
