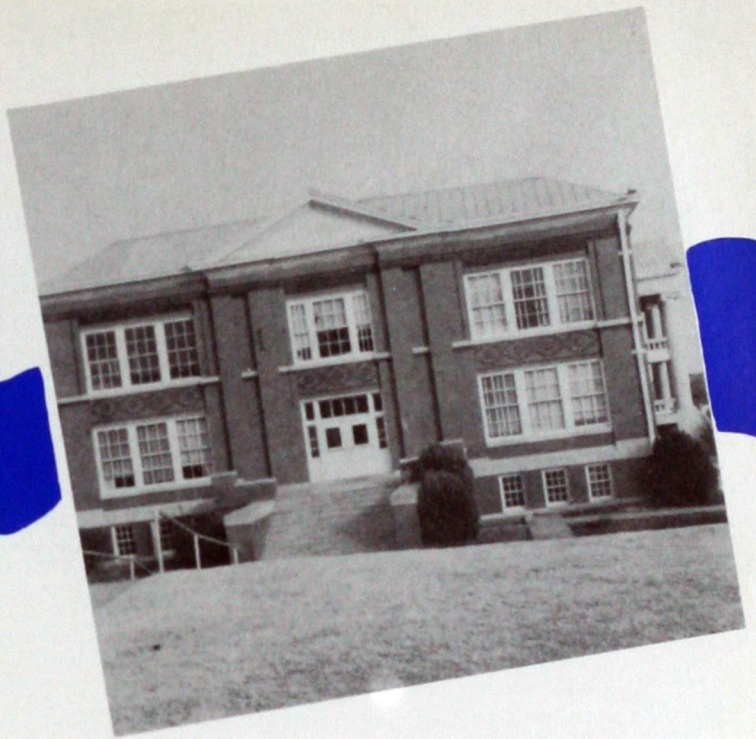

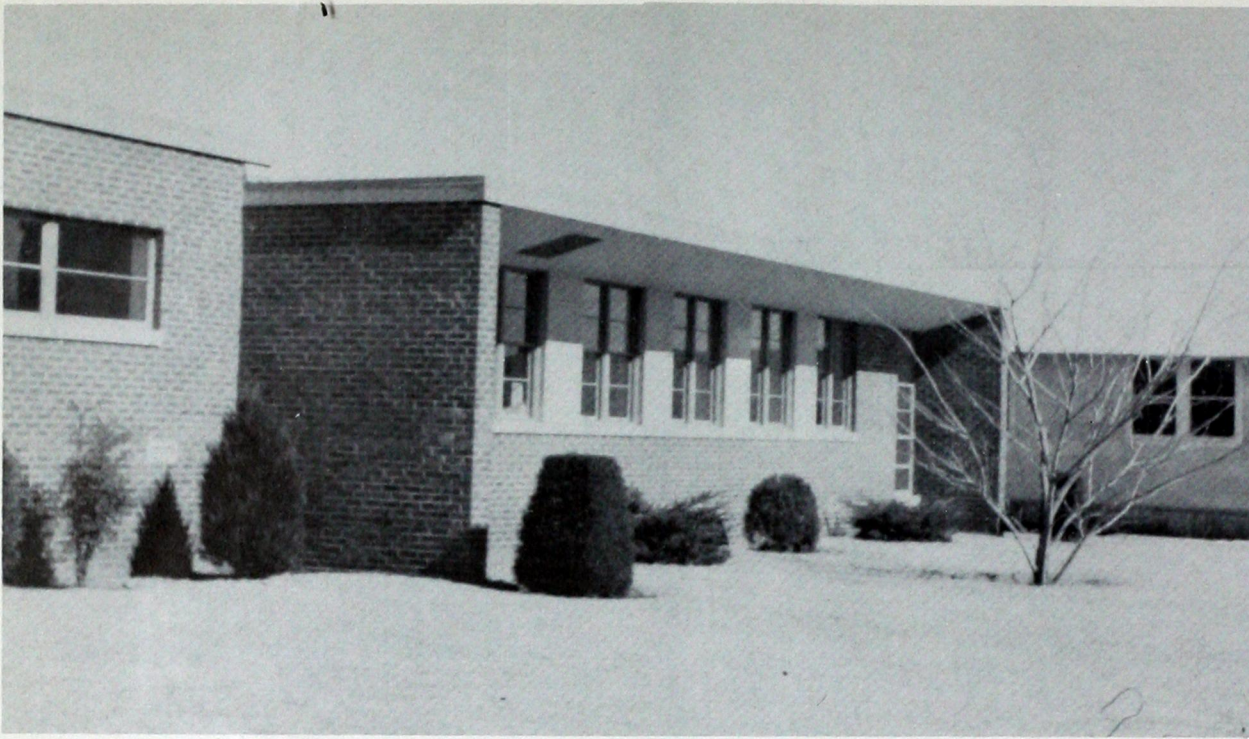

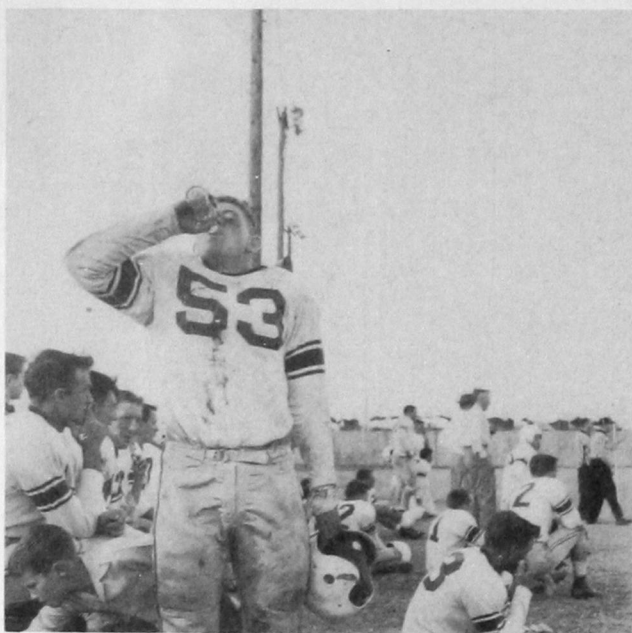

Southwestern's Students Spend a Busy Year

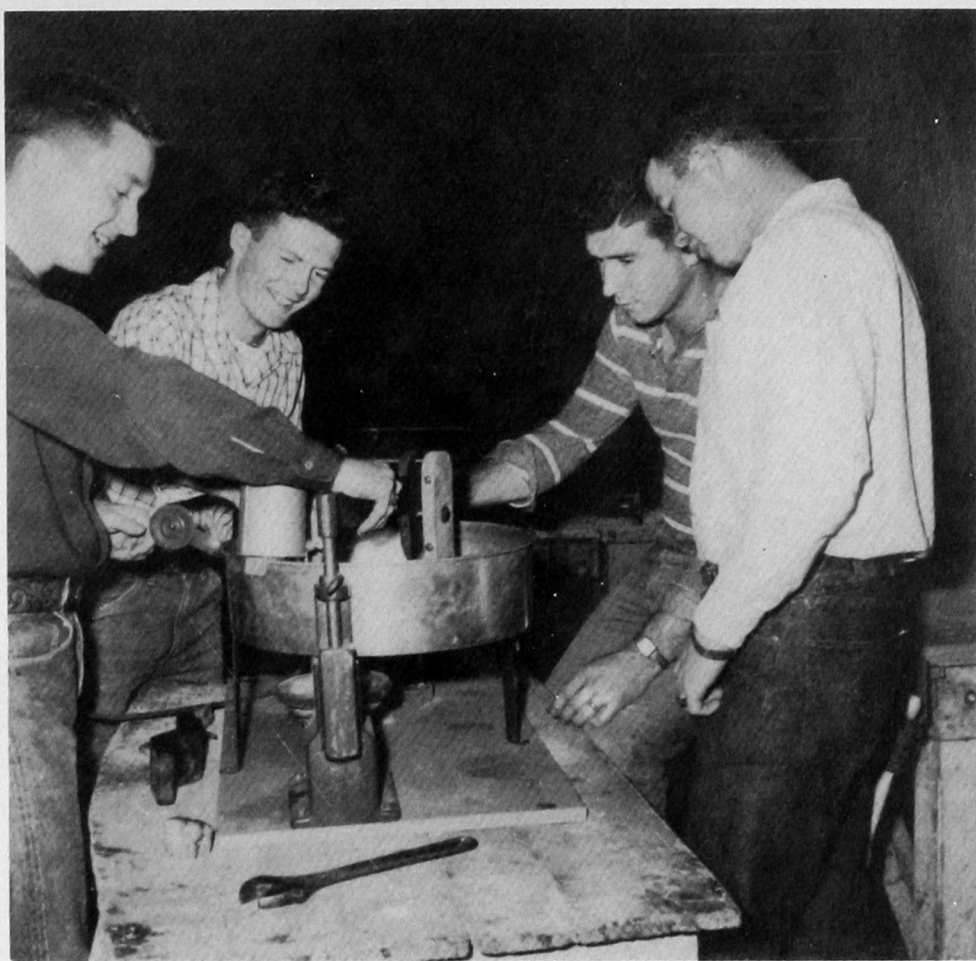

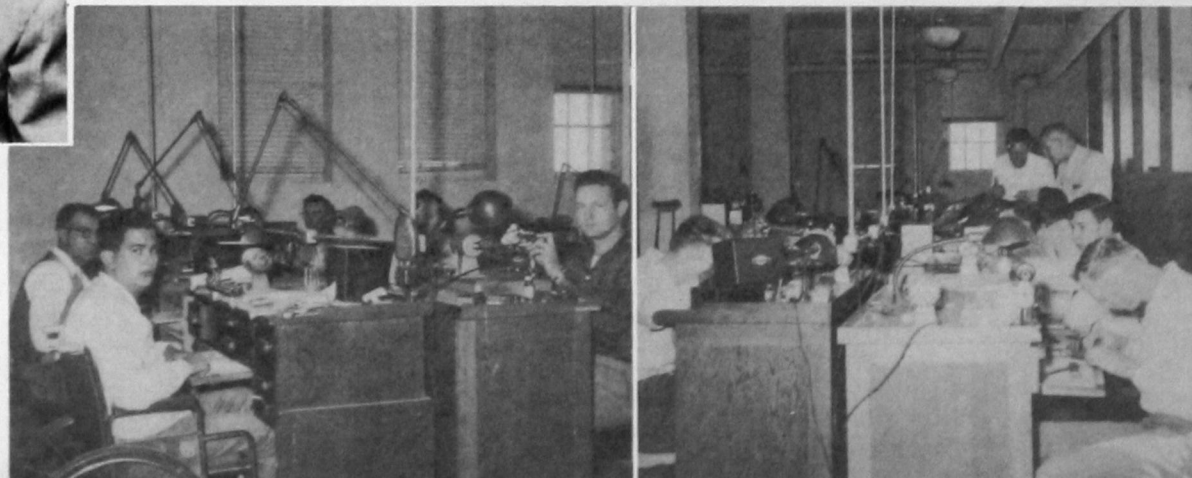

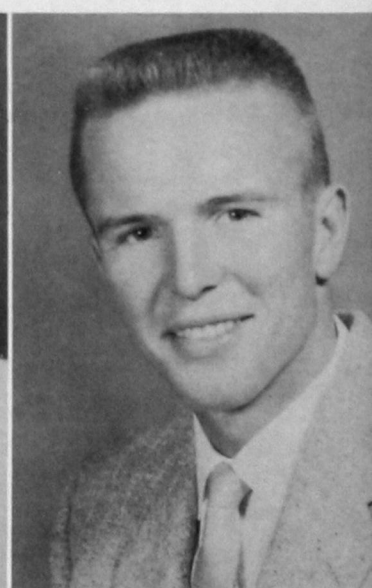
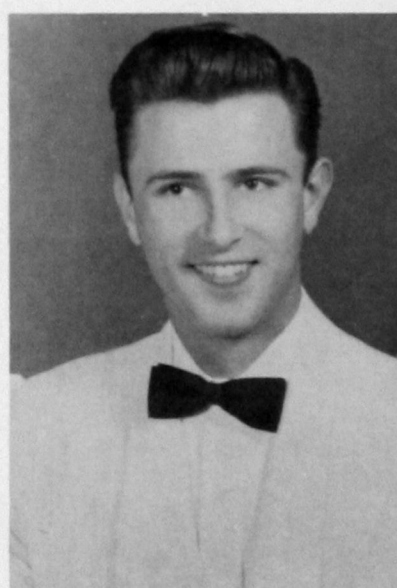
The Student Senate is composed of 18 members and one sponsor. Three officers are elected at large, two members are chosen from each class, and six members chosen by organizations complete the membership.

Aside from the annually sponsored activities of the Senate, such as student mixers and other social activities, the Senate manages the Union and carries on routine duties.

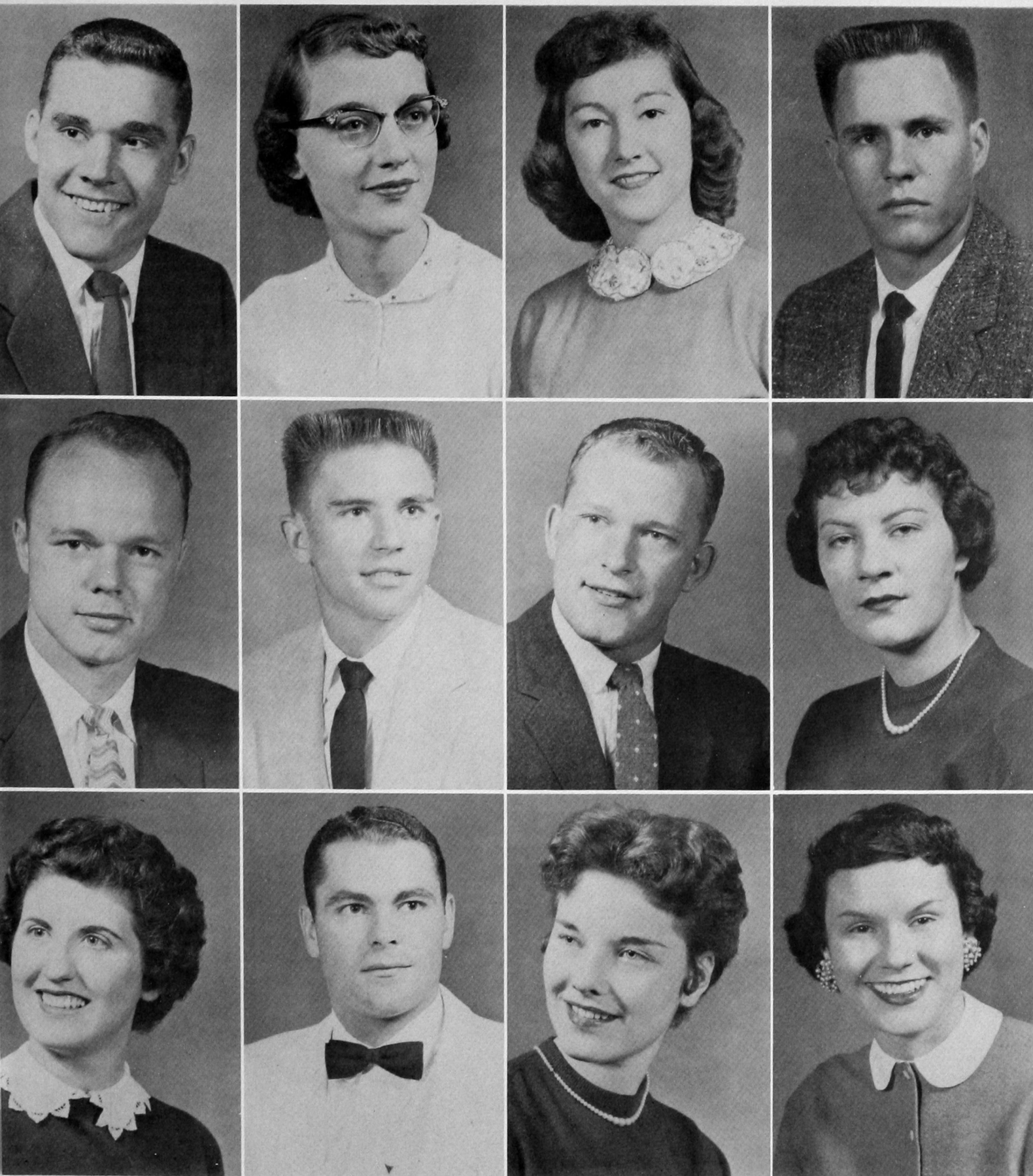

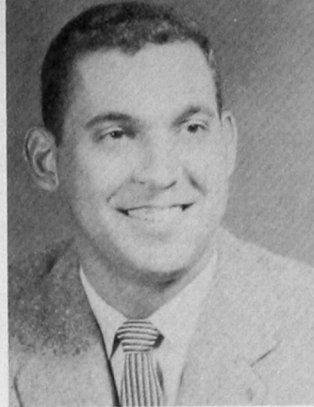
NEWMAN CLUB

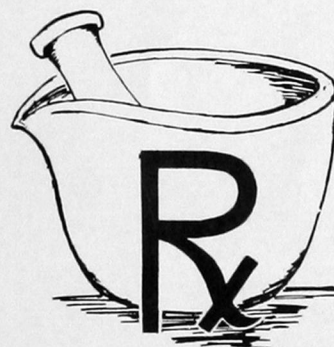
In 1954, at a State Meeting, the college clubs voted unanimously to drop present individual club names and call all clubs Home Economics Club, followed by the name of the local college.

The concert band of 45 members performed two concerts during the second semester on March 26 and May 14. The band also made a concert tour and played for Commencement May 24.



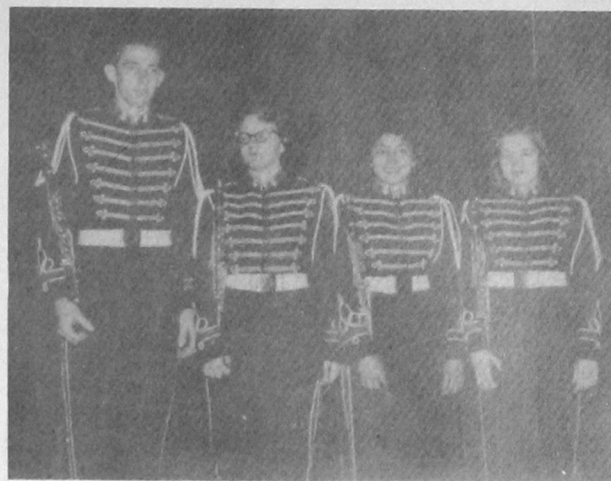

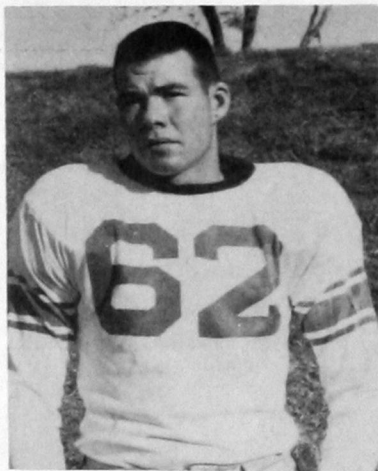
A little short of paydirt
