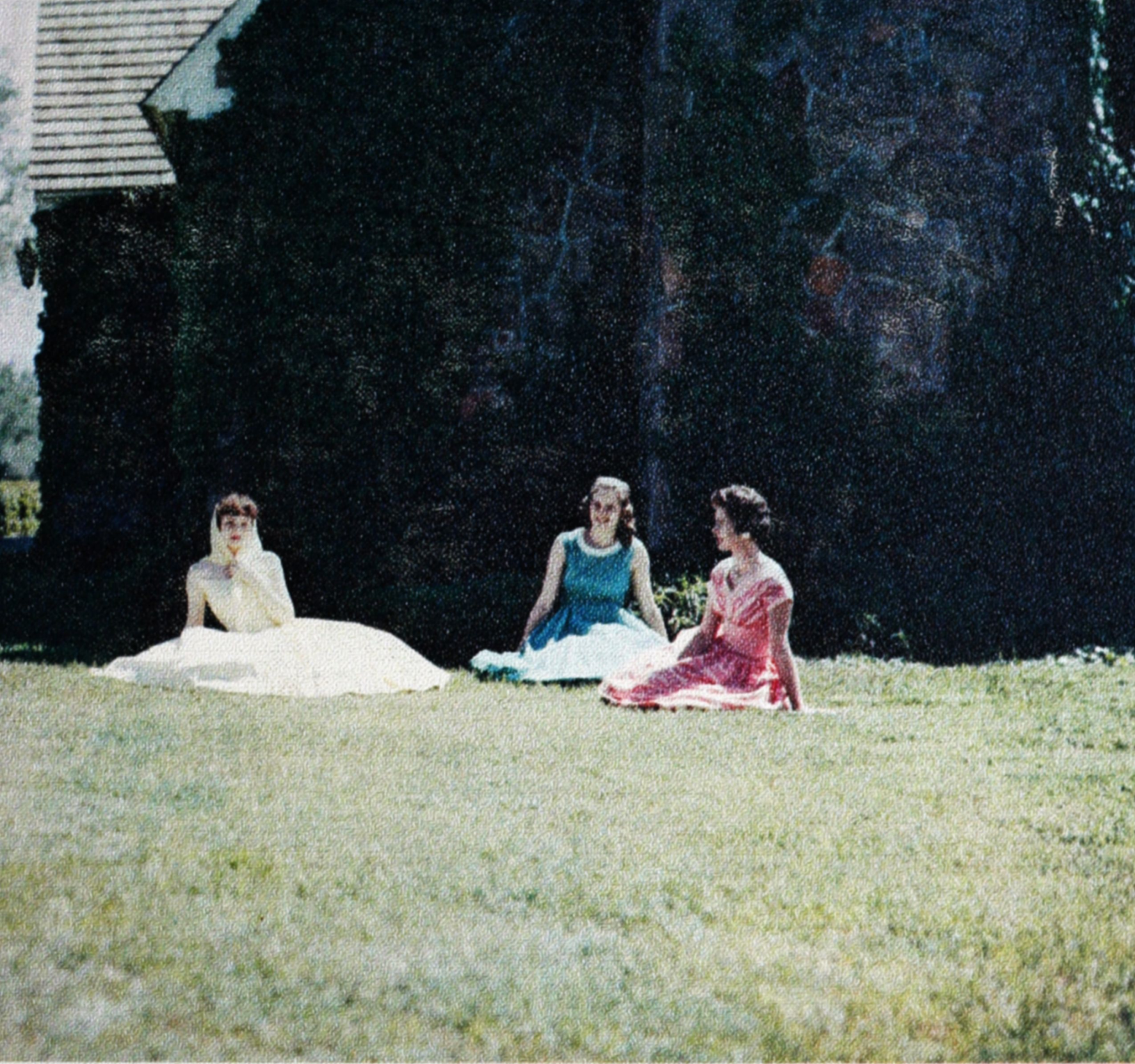

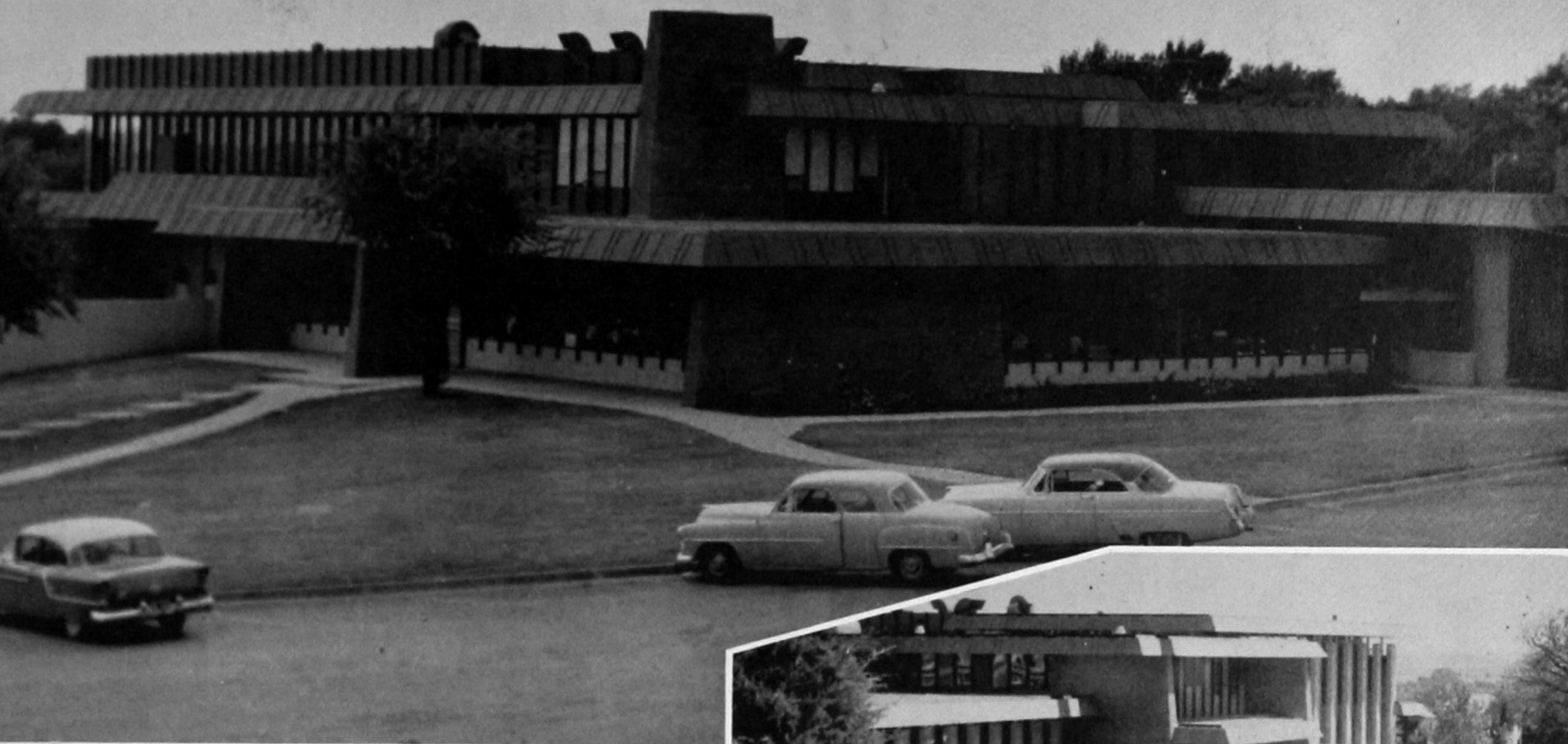

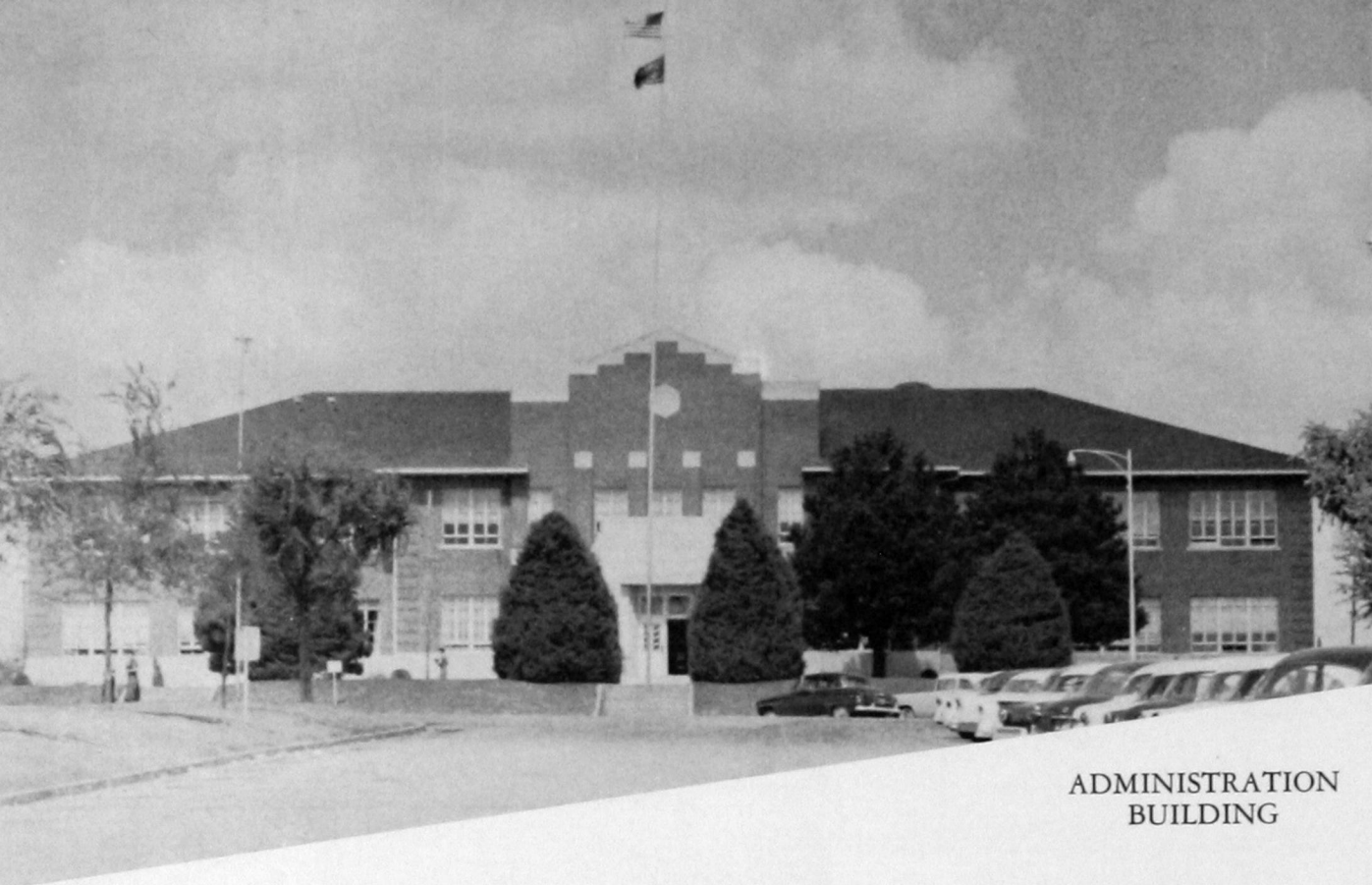

In its second year on the campus the Memorial Student Center has proved to be a very popular site. Students gather here to study, work, and play together.

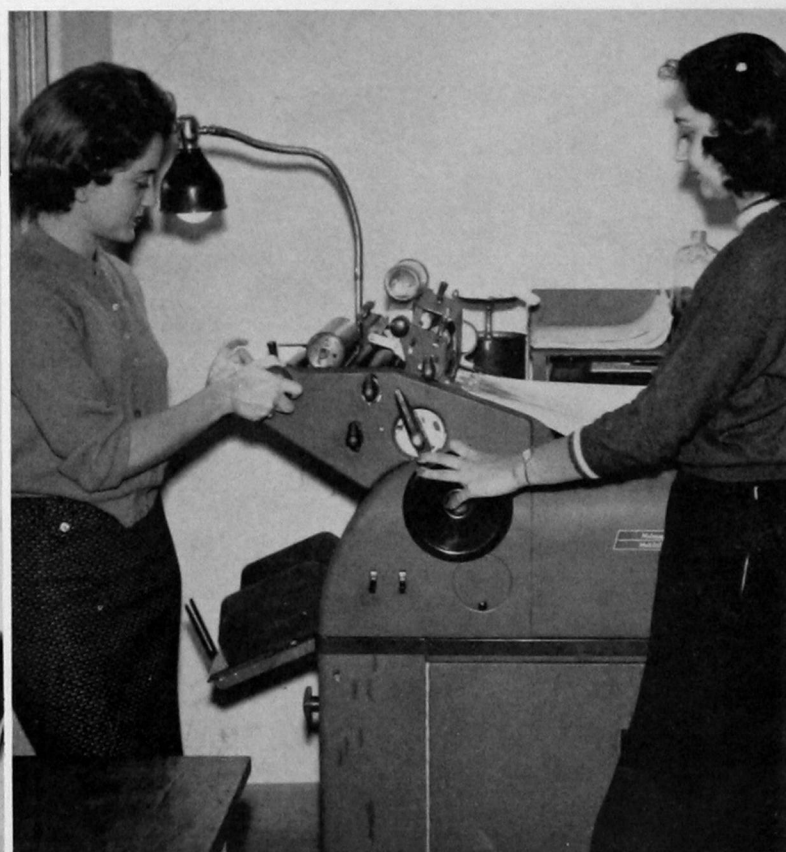

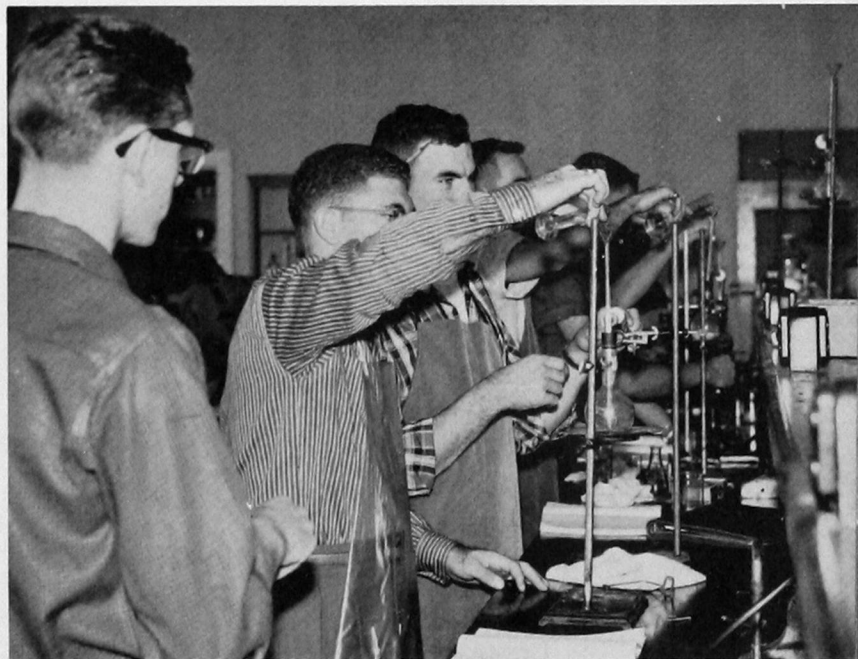
Centered on the semi-oval drive is the Administration Building. In this building the President and the Business Staff do their jobs. The Pharmacy Department is also located in this building.

The Science Building is the scene of many activities on Southwestern's campus. Located in this building are the Auditorium, Home Economics Department and many Science lecture and laboratory rooms.

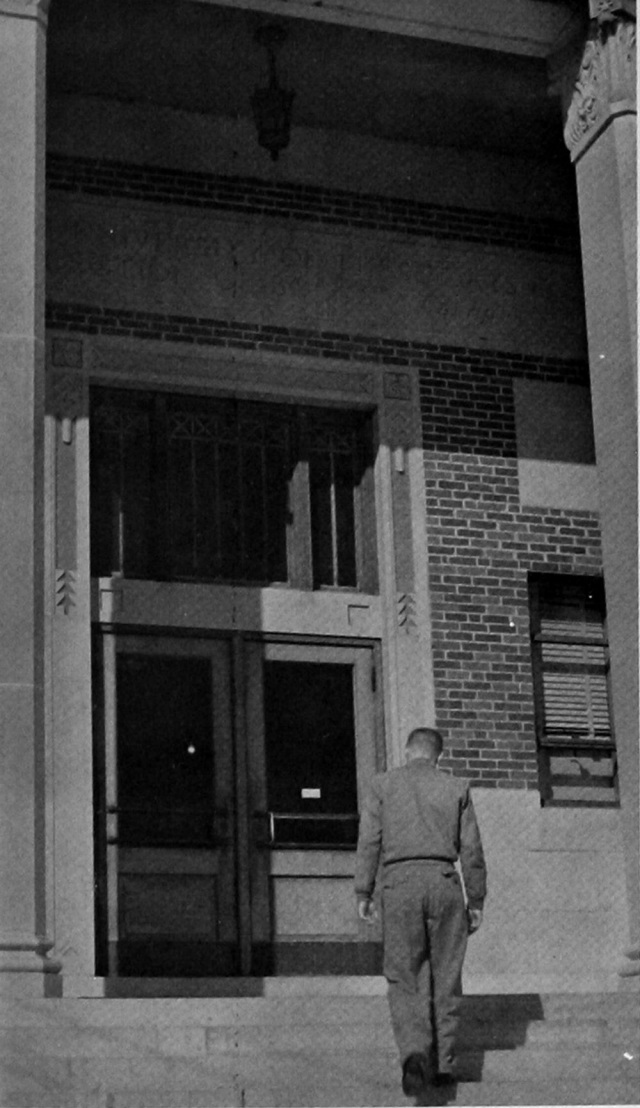




MUSIC HALL

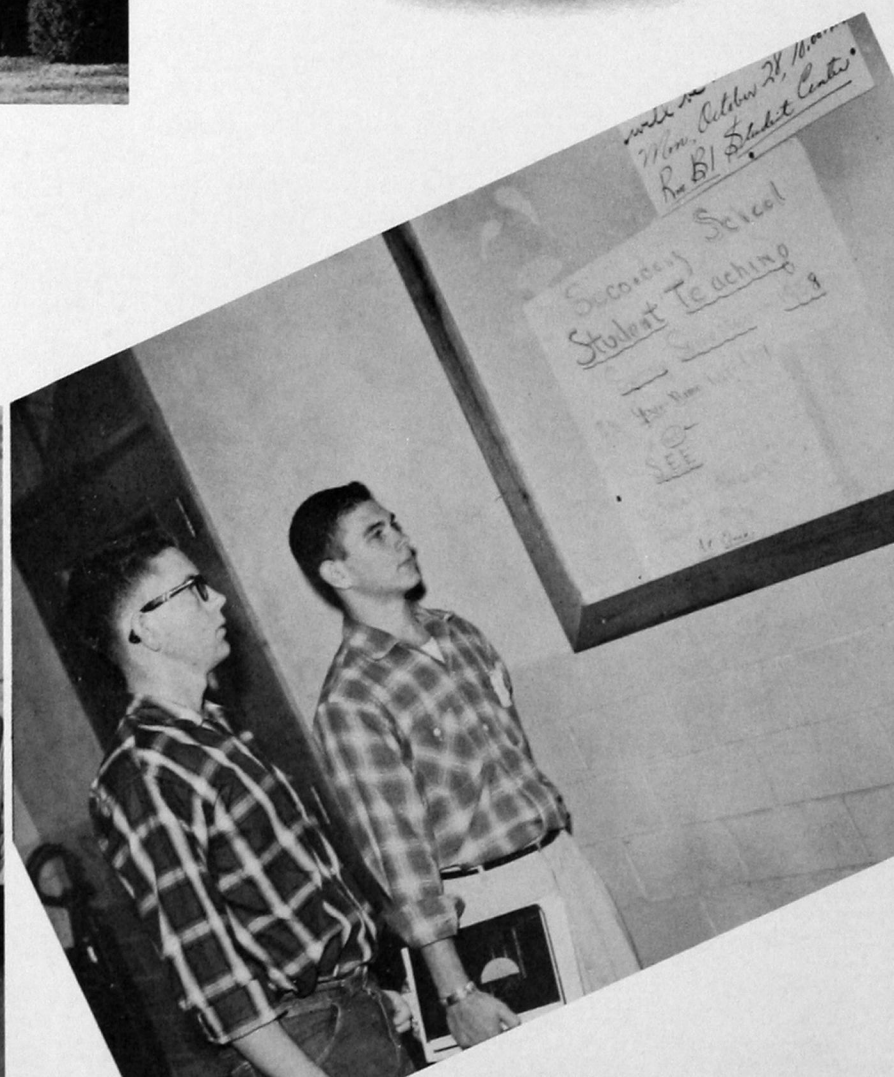


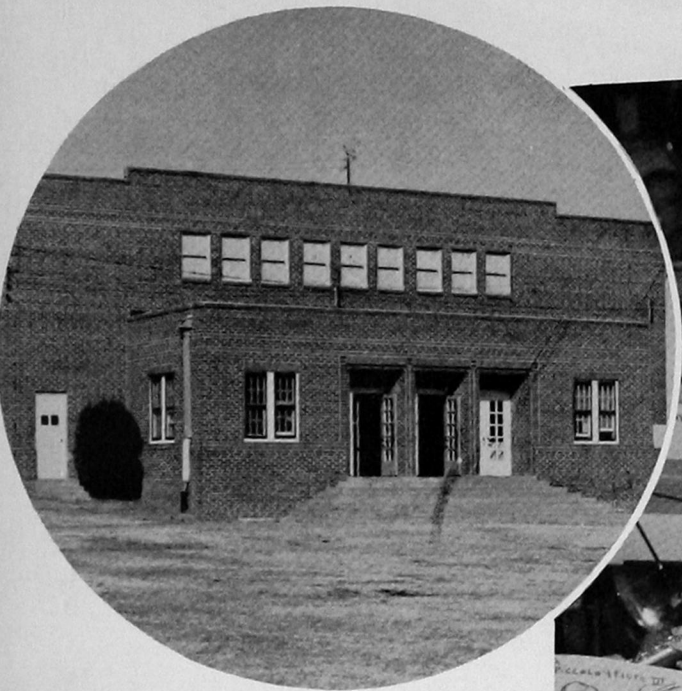


EDUCATION BUILDING

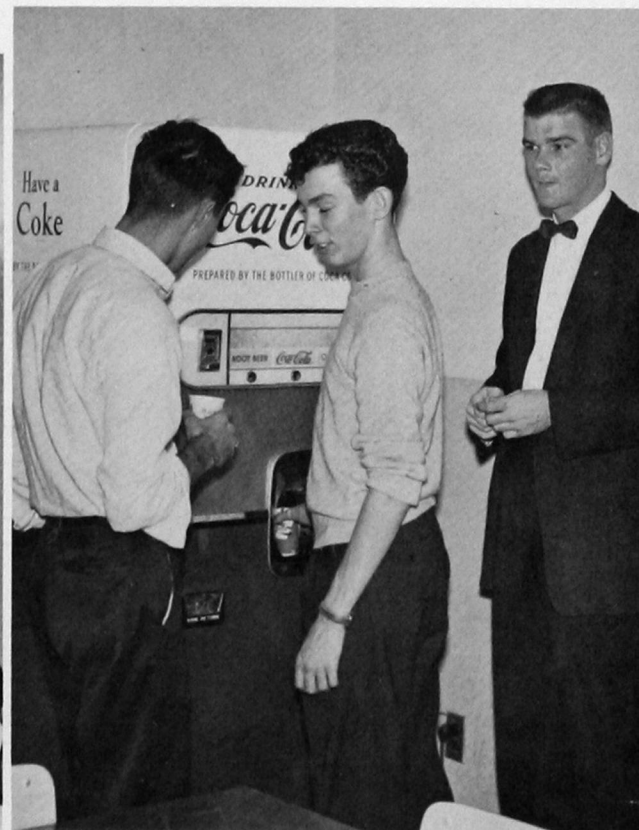
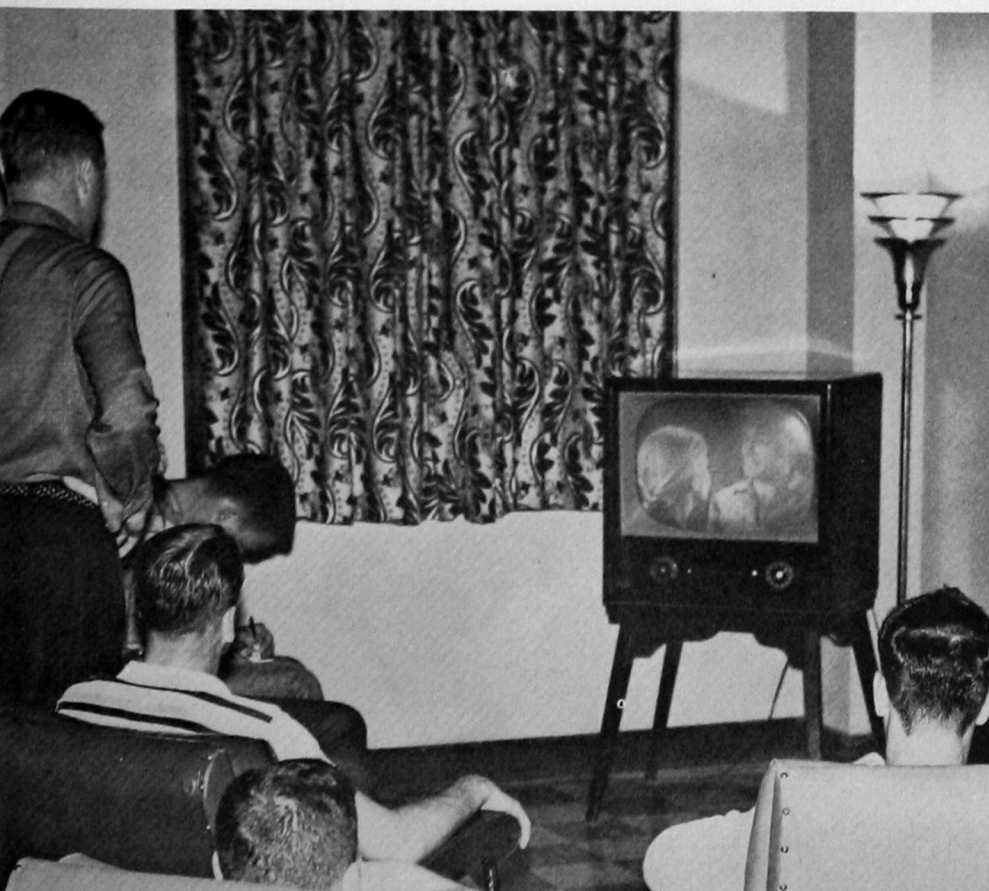

Neff Hall is the scene of many happy hours for the men of Southwestern State. Here they spend their time working, studying, and playing.

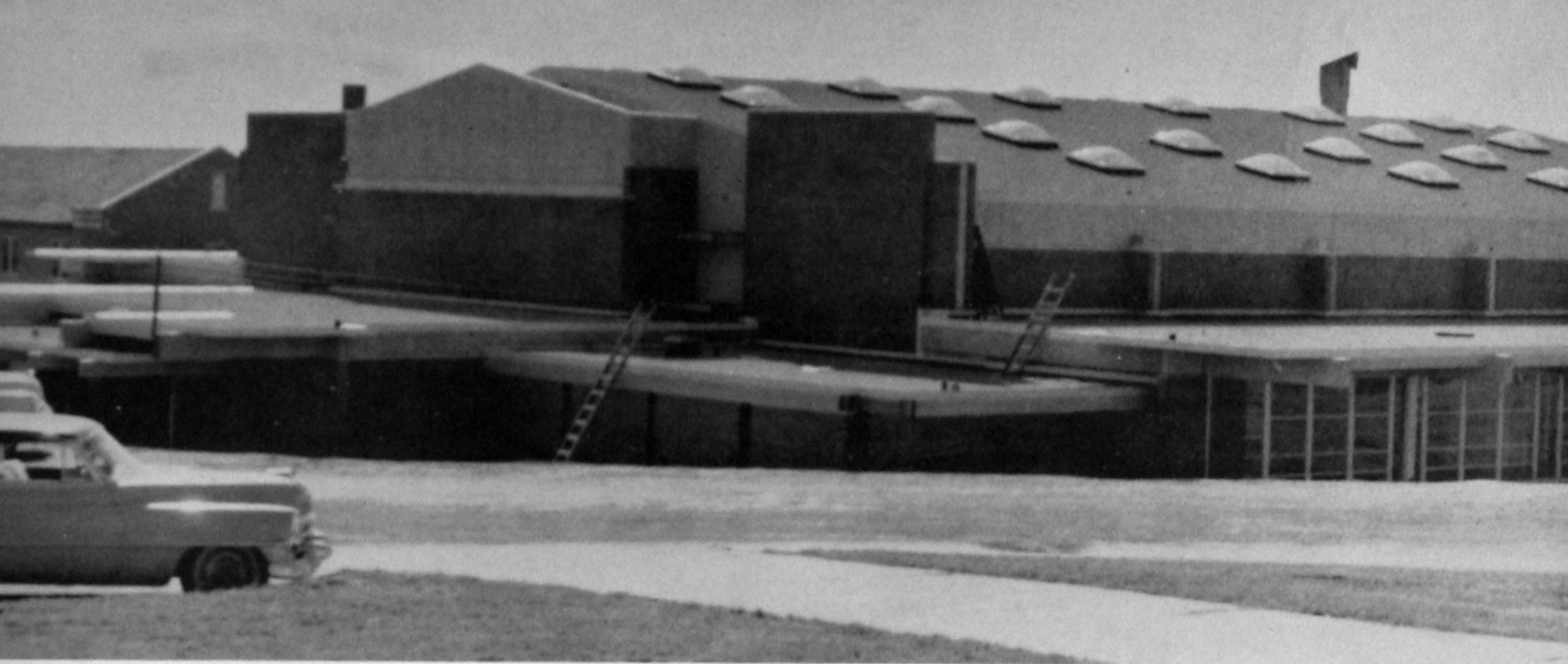




STEWART HALL

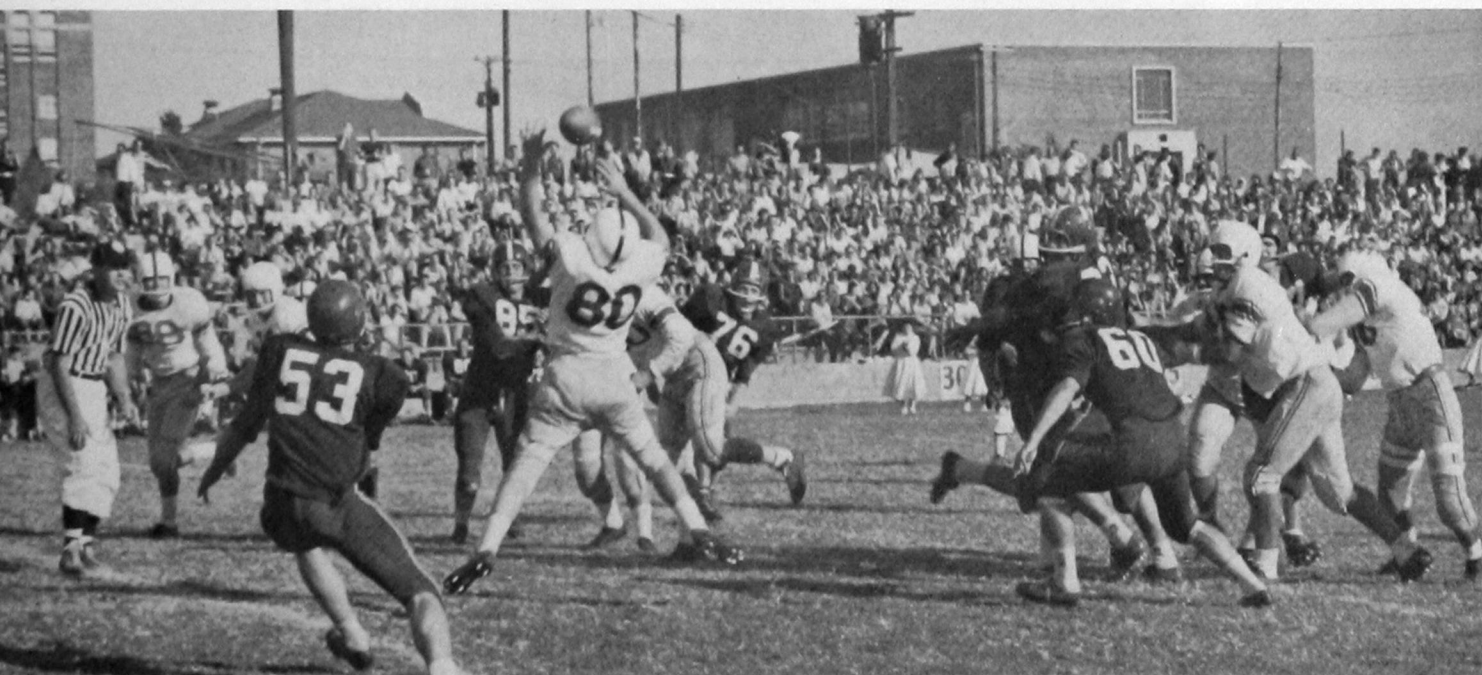

George Nigh, State Representative from McAlester, gave the main address at the banquet held for the student senators.



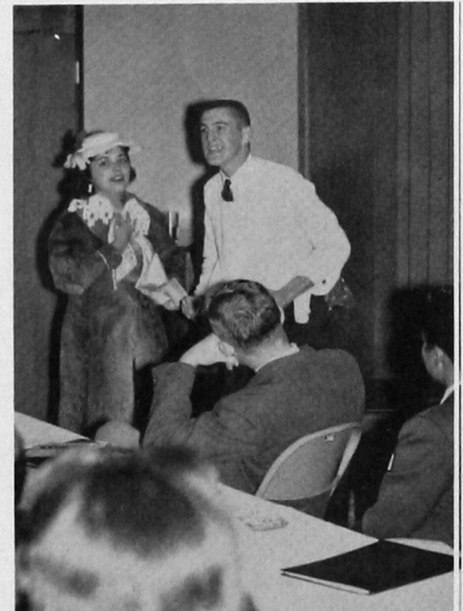

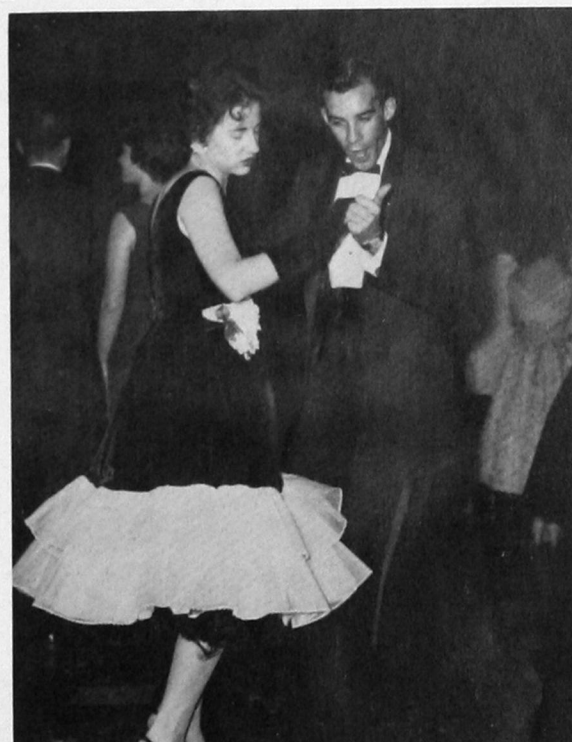

SOUTHWESTERN 19—NORTHEASTERN 7

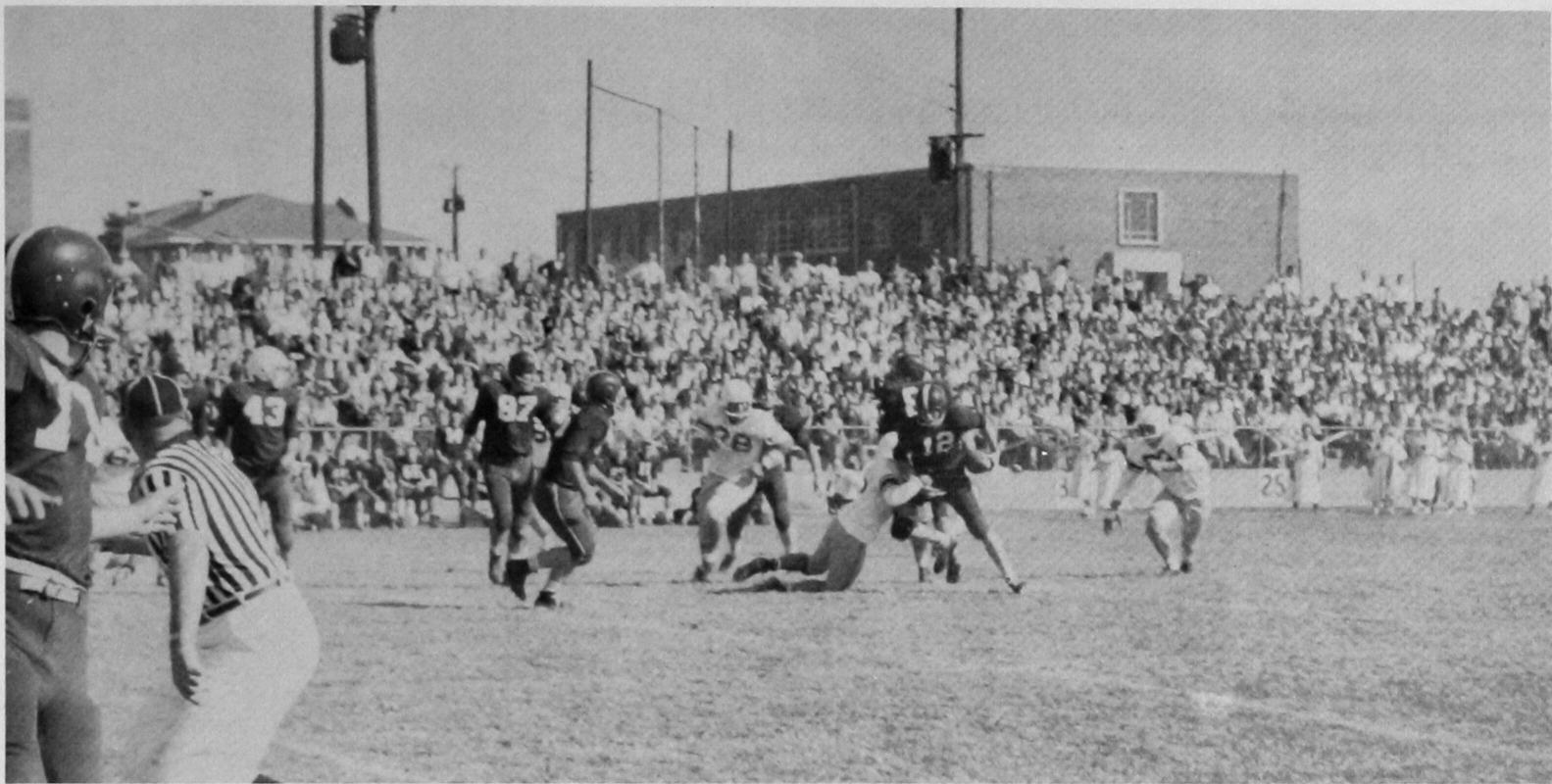

During the initiation ceremonies, the college honored members of the Bulldog championship teams of 1923, 1926, 1927, and 1953.

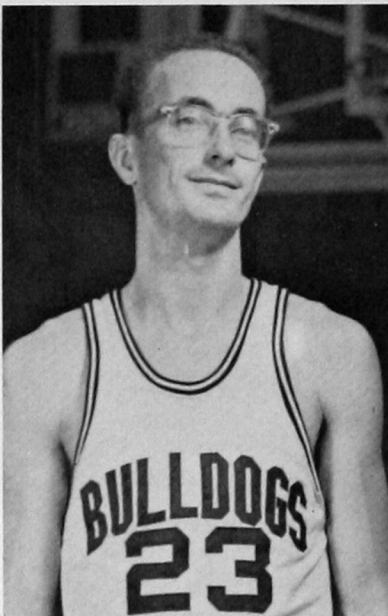
