New head coach J. W. Cole inherited a green squad in his debut season, and his Bulldogs found the going rough while they compiled a 2-6-1 record in the autumn wars.

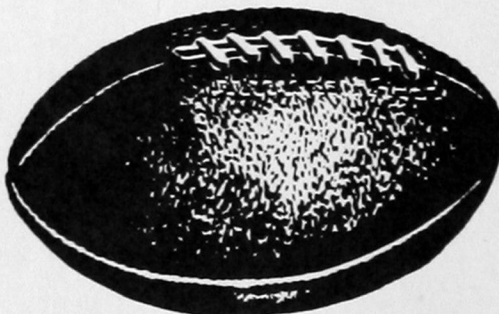
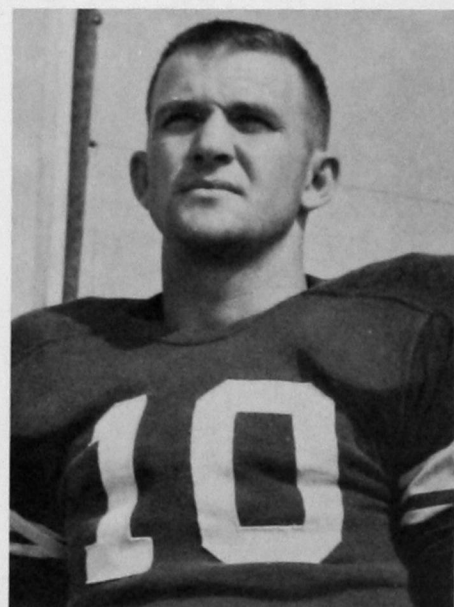

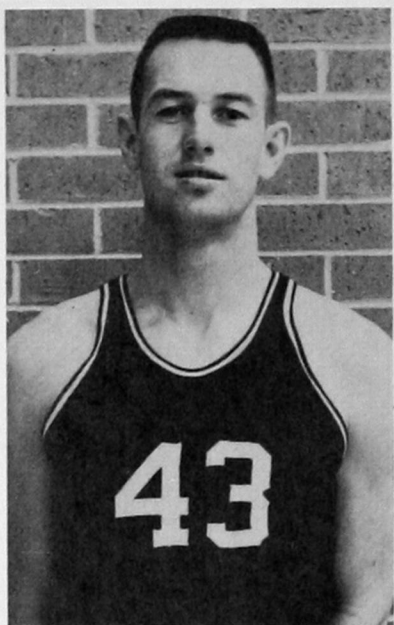
Lost were his two top outside men, Keith Wiginton, by graduation, and John Martin, who was involved in practice teaching the first semester.

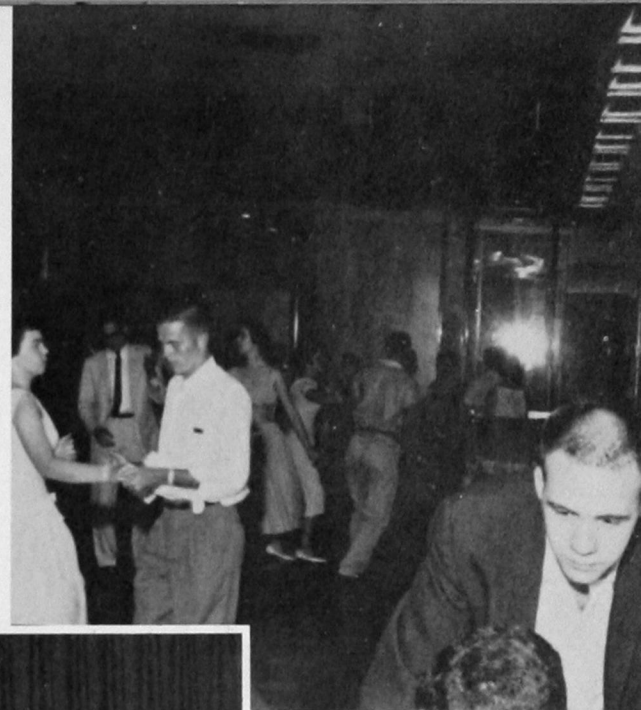
MRS. EDNA MULDROW retires after 23

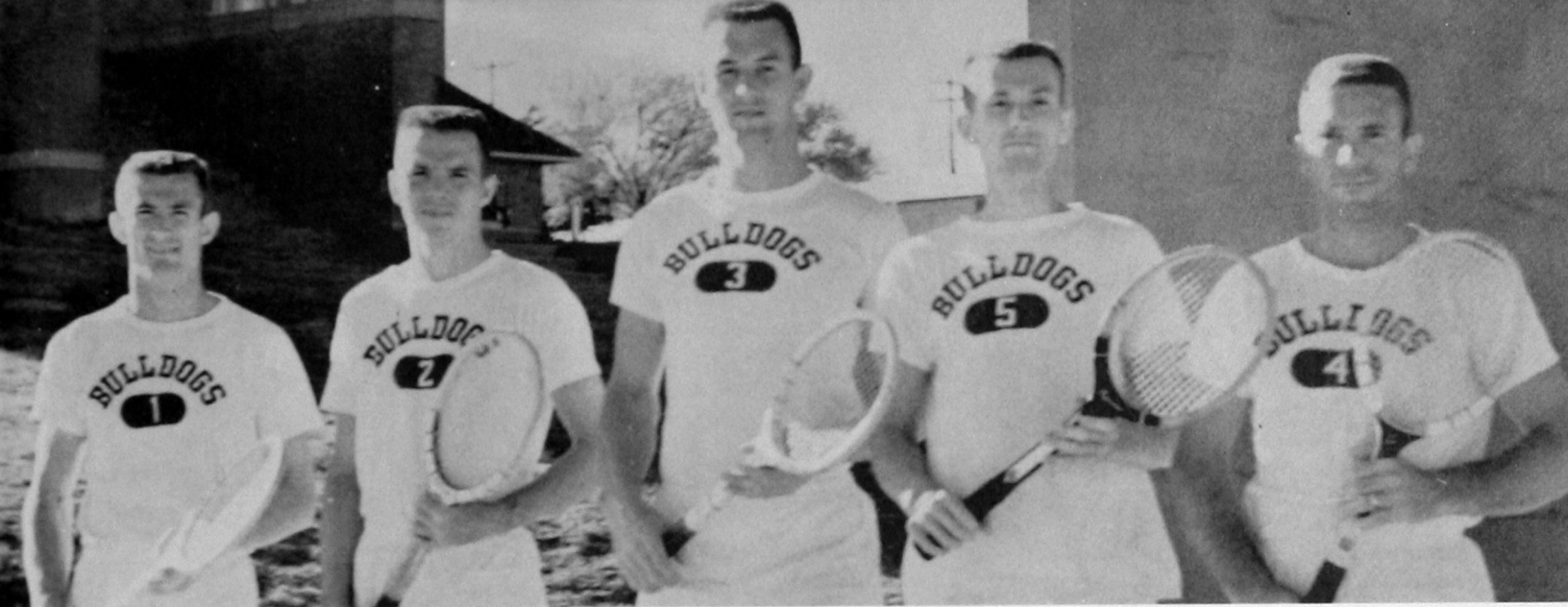

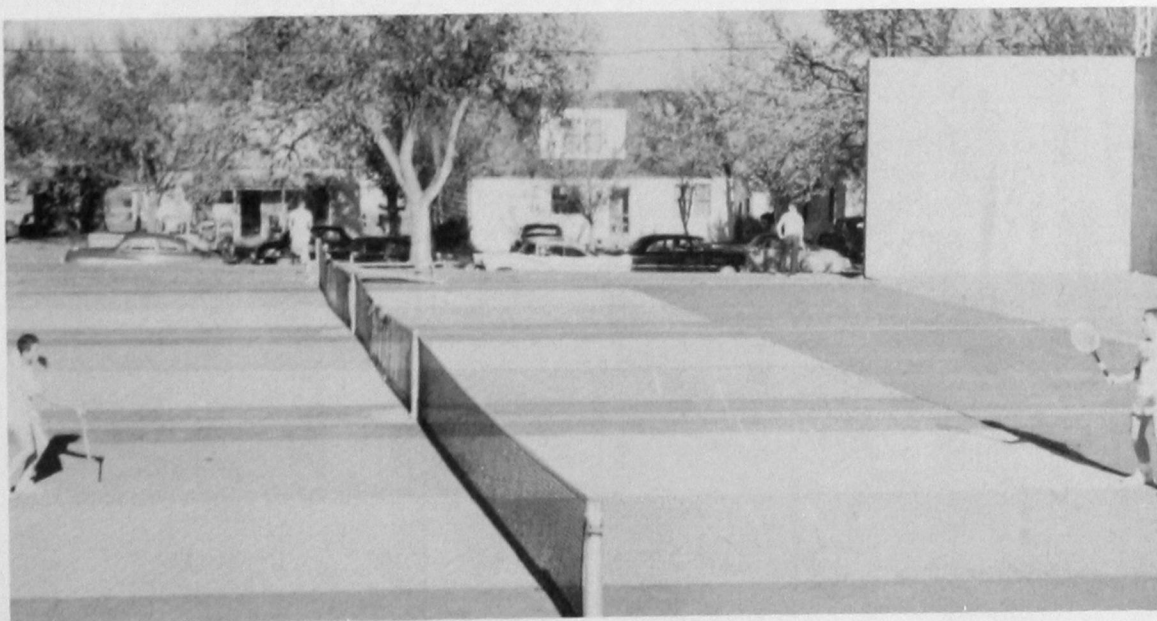
