SOUTHWESTERN STATE COLLEGE:


During this school year we have seen the largest enrollment ever attained by our college. There are many reasons for the growth and development of Southwestern.

I wish for the students and staff of Southwestern continued success in whatever their future endeavors may be.



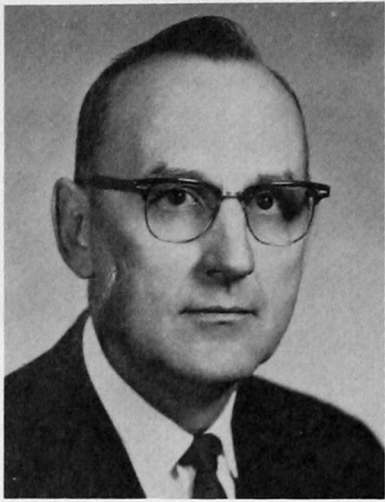

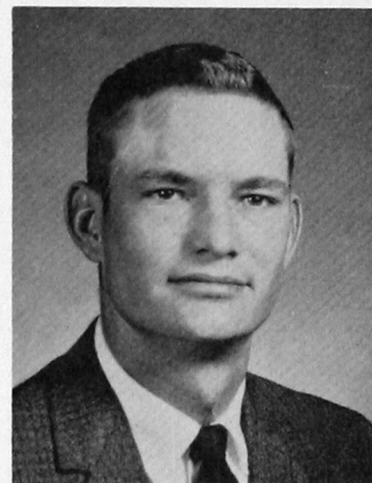

For Southwestern Roger Van Cleef, Gary Abercrombie and Joe Richardson were outstanding on defense.

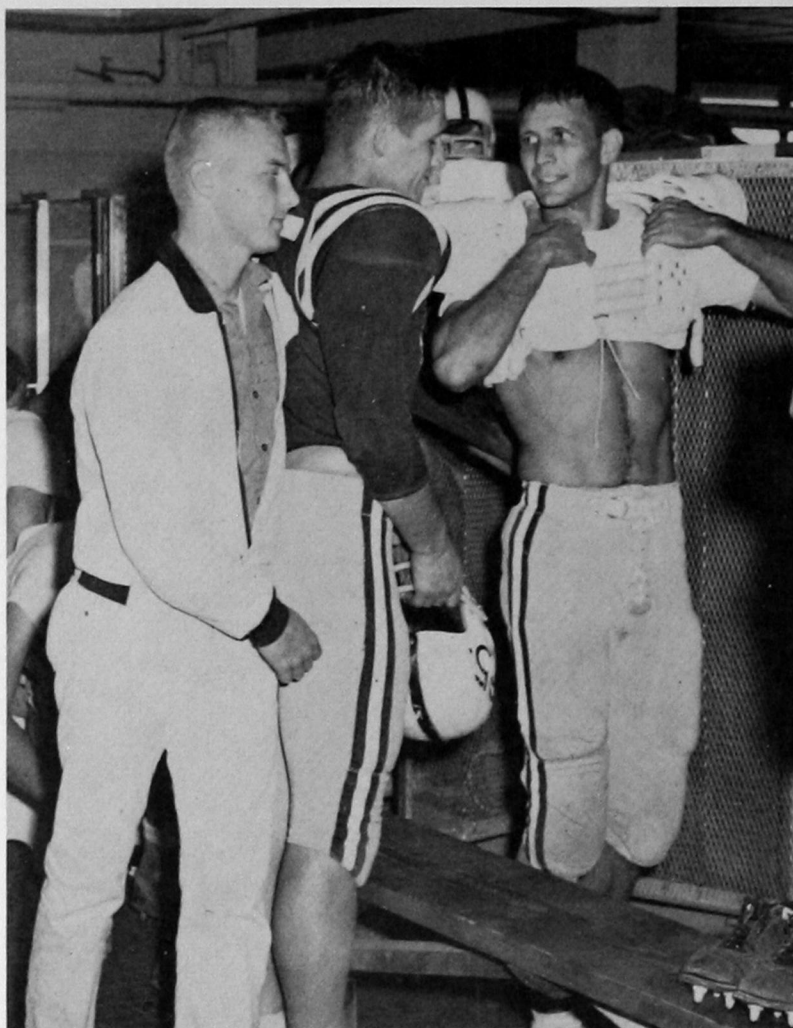

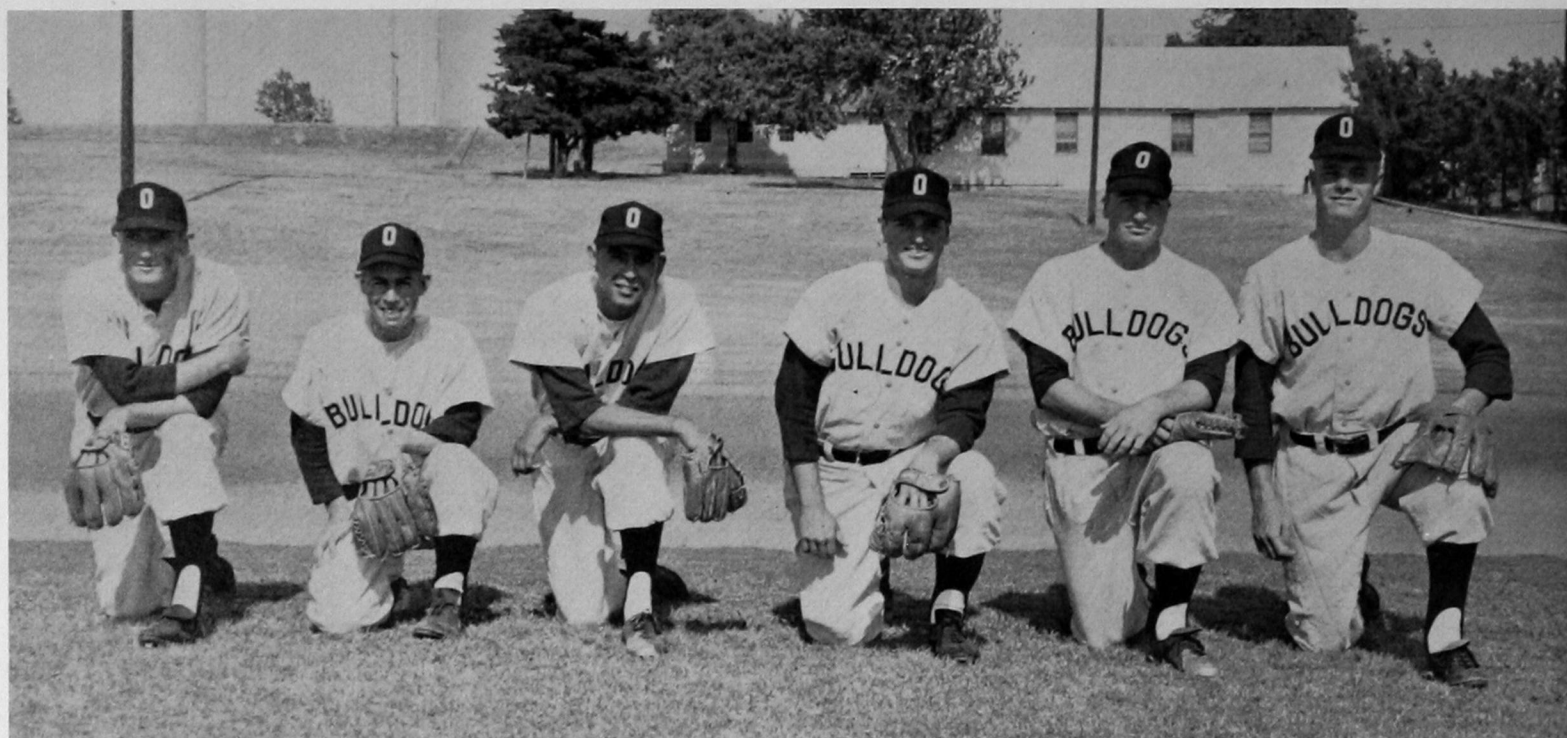

BULLDOGS HAVE BANNER SEASON

For the second season in a row, the Bulldogs lost a playoff with Phillips for the West Side title after tying the Haymakers in the regular season race. Southwestern posted a 20-8 record overall and a 13-4 mark in conference play.

The 1961 squad ranked among the best ever at Southwestern, as five of the eight losses were by one-run margins. Upset defeats at Northwestern and Central cost the club an outright championship. The Bulldogs were undefeated on their home field.

Coach Rankin Williams reached a milestone with the 1,000th win of his career in all sports in the 3-0 win over Central. He is believed to be the first coach in the United States to accomplish this feat.

Firstbaseman Bob Cargal led in homers with five and Sinclair in runs batted in with 22. Centerfielder Arnold Boyd, thirdbaseman Mickey Tims, and reserve catcher Elwood Pryor were season-long defensive standouts. Shortstop Ray Huber was the only sophomore to crack the starting lineup.

Larry Lobaugh and Bill Pitts were invariably called upon to pitch the important games, and Jerry McCullough, Len Tahsuda, and Jim Lindsey rounded out the starting staff. Tahsuda and Lobaugh were especially effective in relief. Freshman Mickey Garrison pitched a five-inning perfect game against West Texas State May 6.



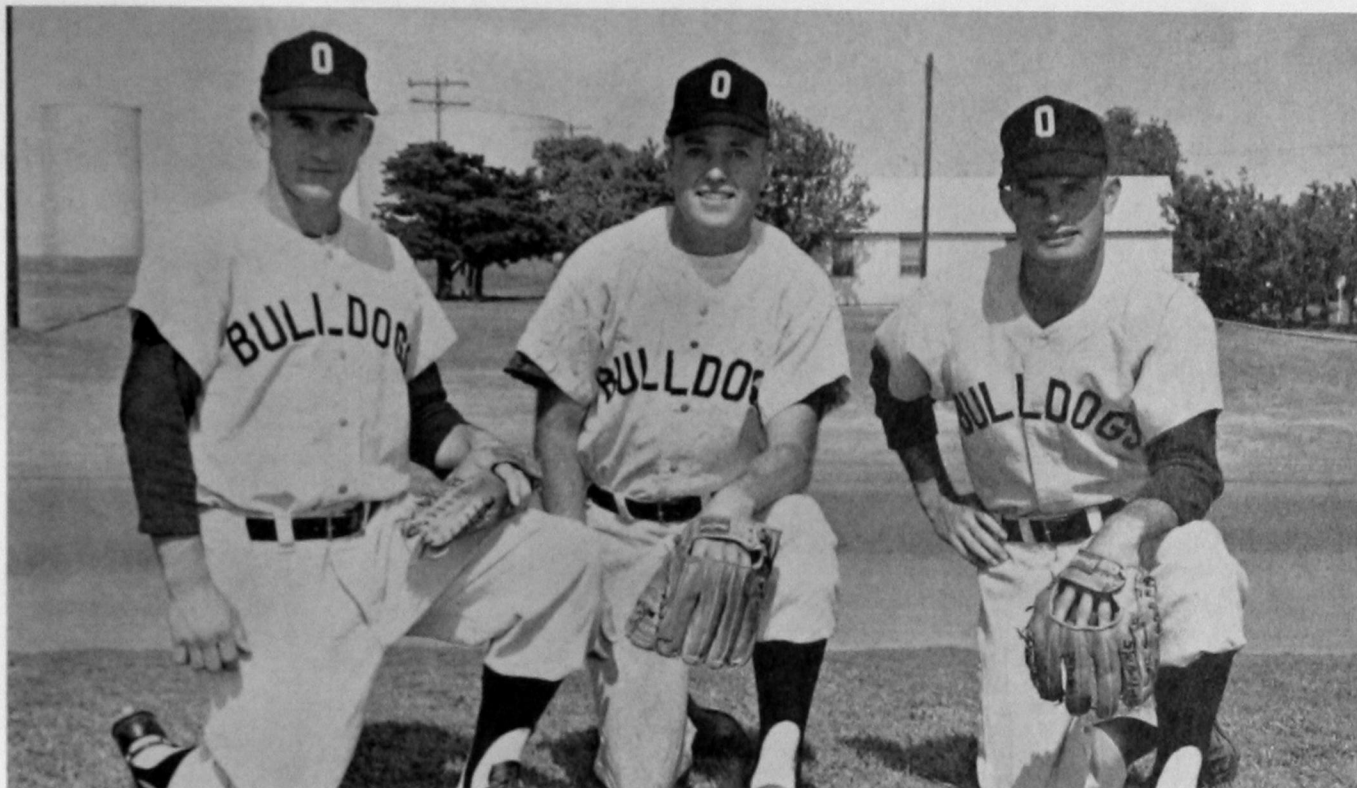
Roger Autry shows perfect form in connecting for a double to left center against the Central Bronchs.

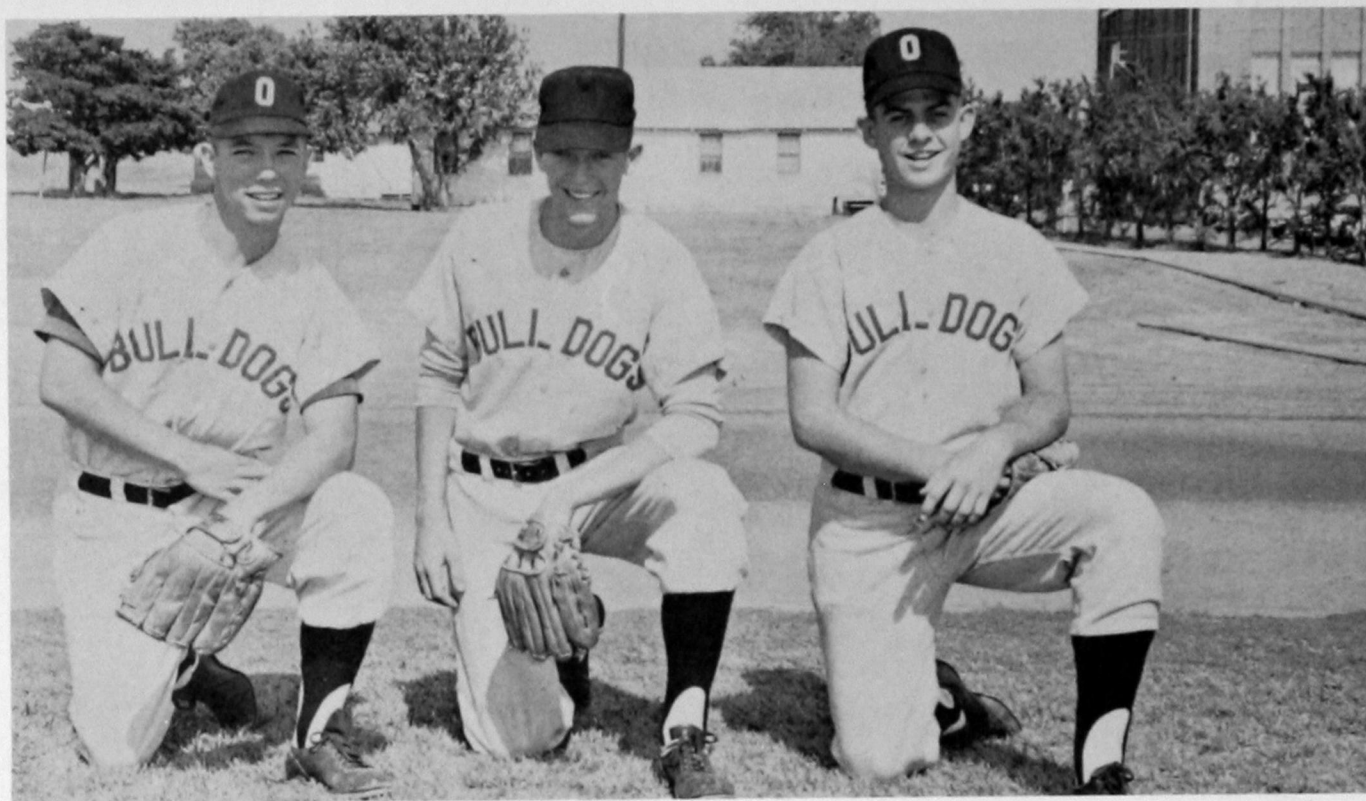

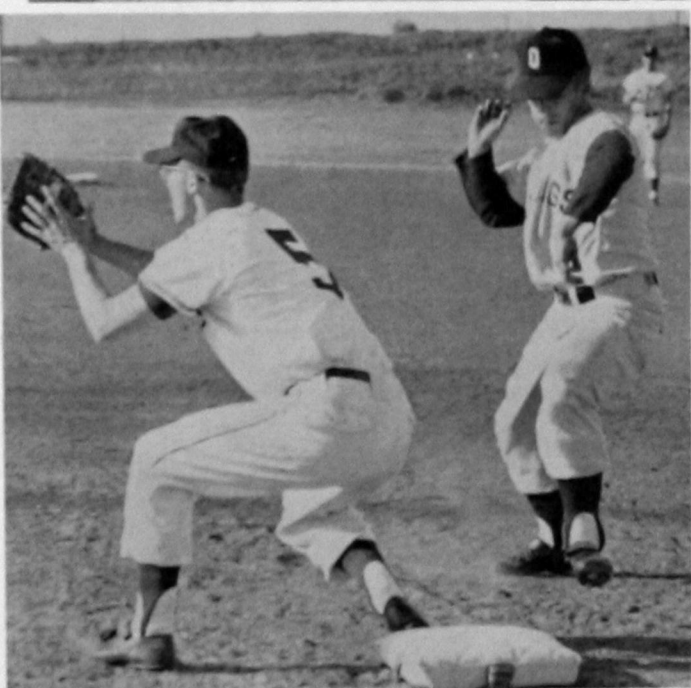

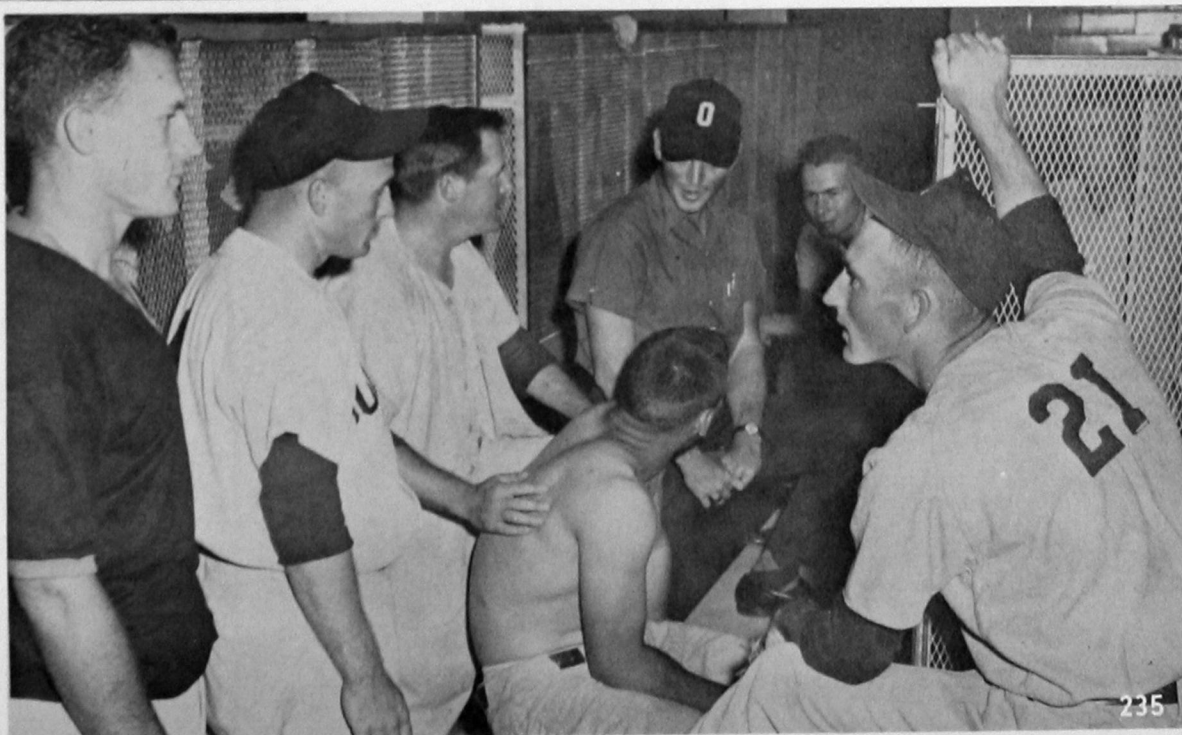

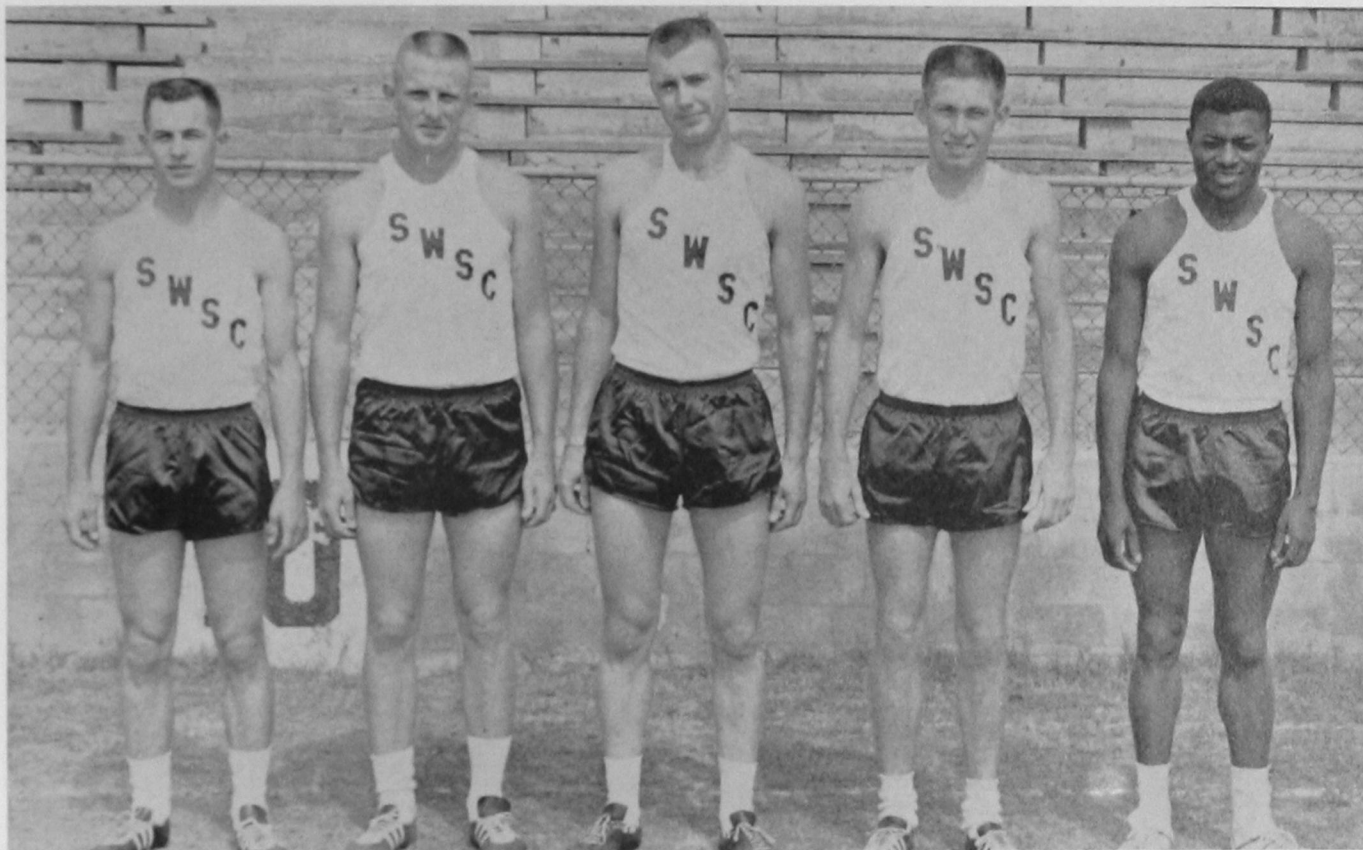

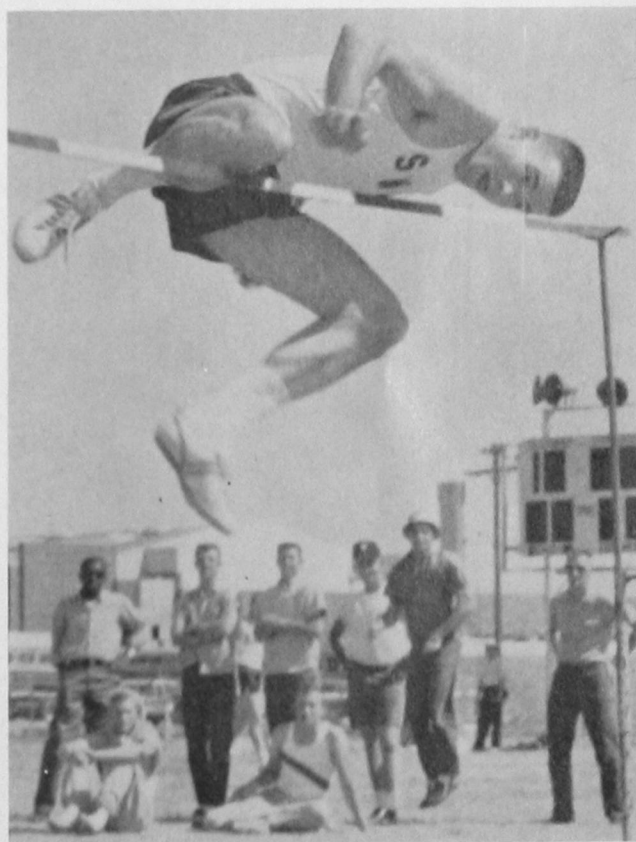

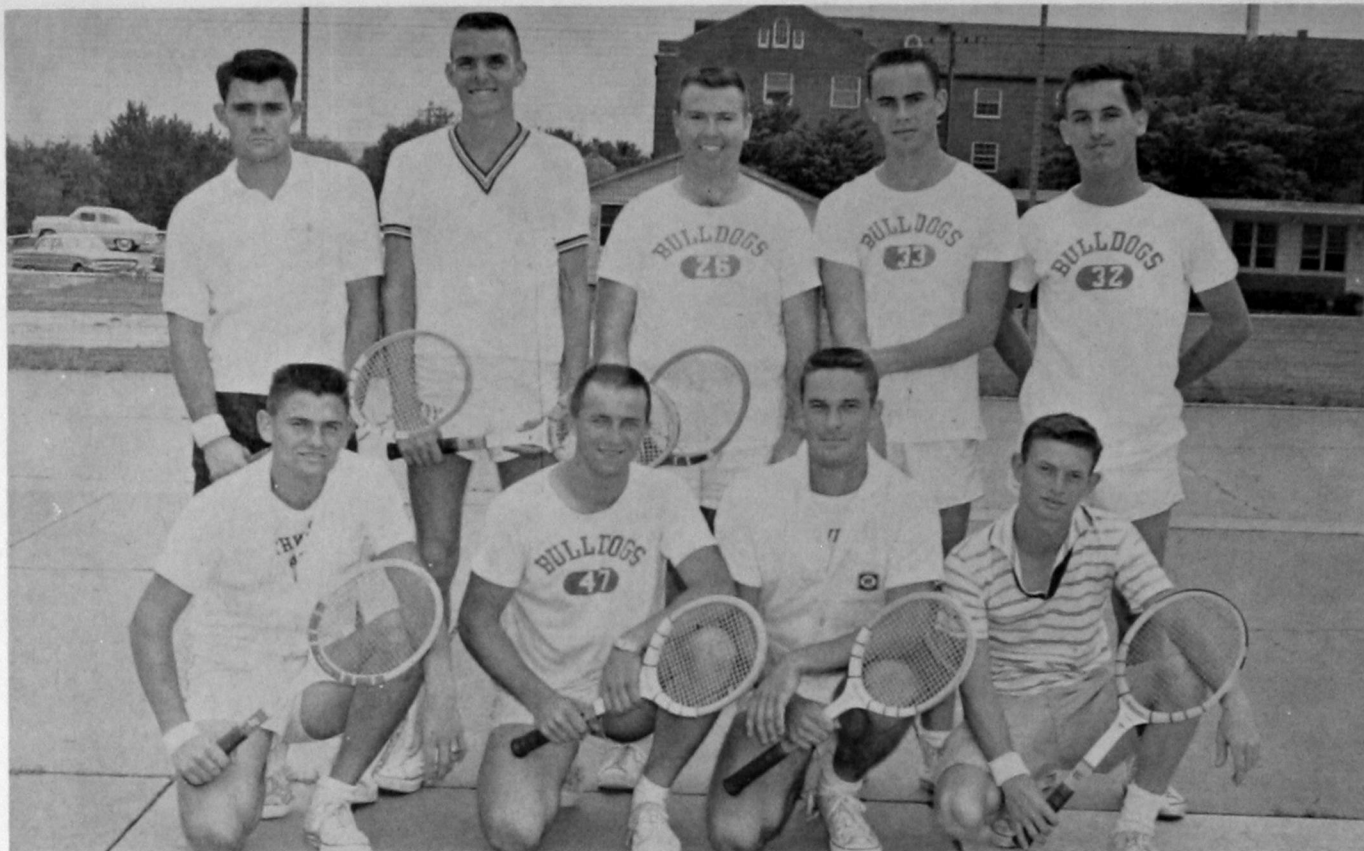
TRACK

Gary Abercrombie clears a familiar hurdle—the six foot level.

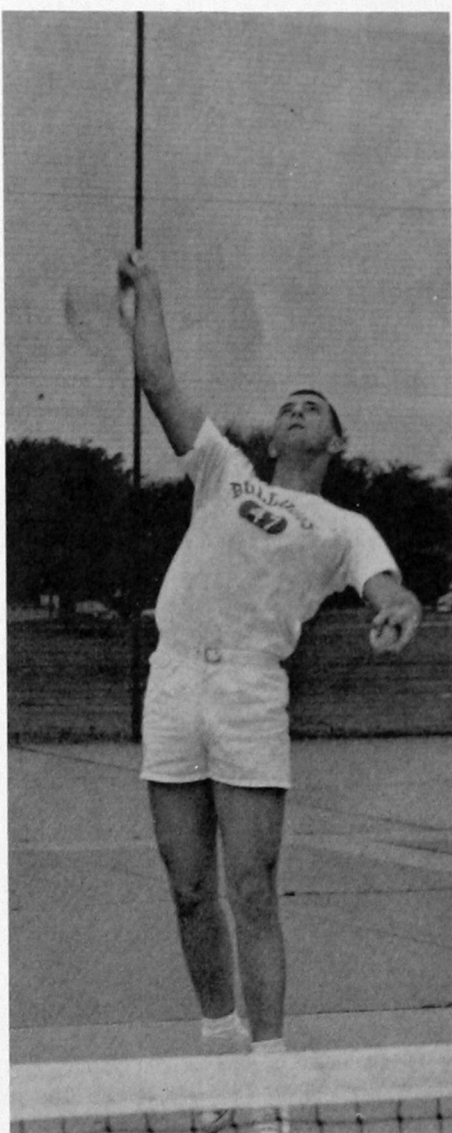

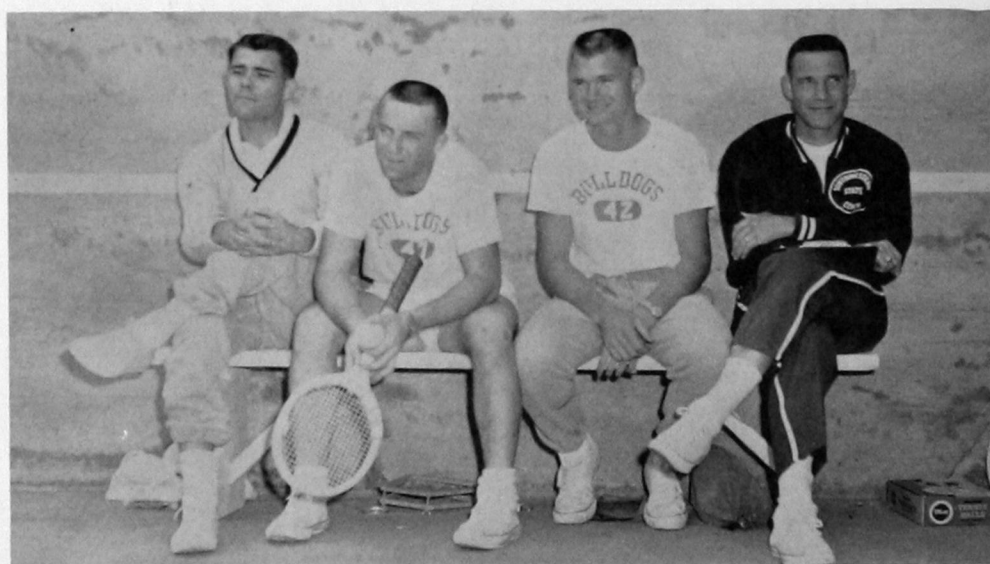

TENNIS

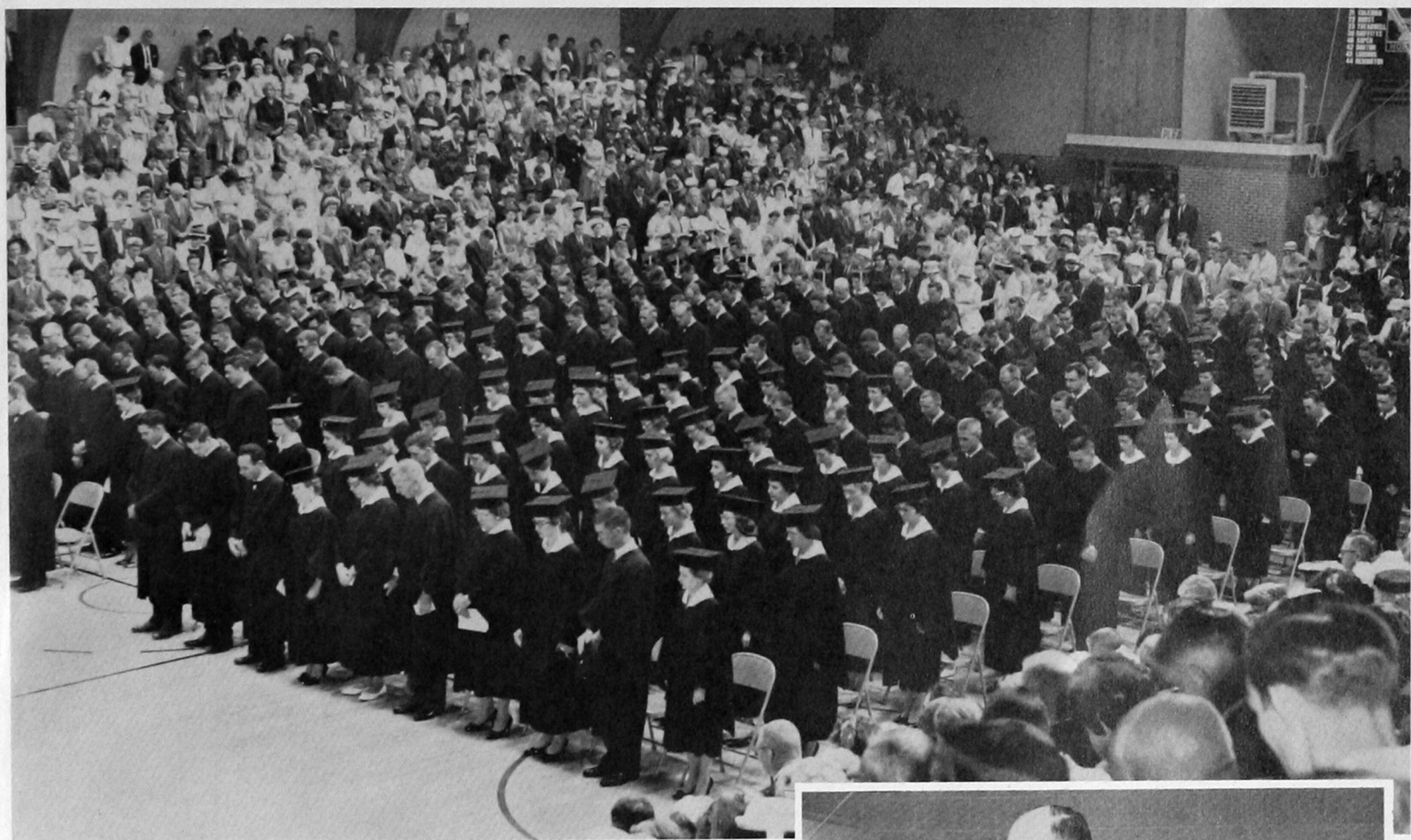

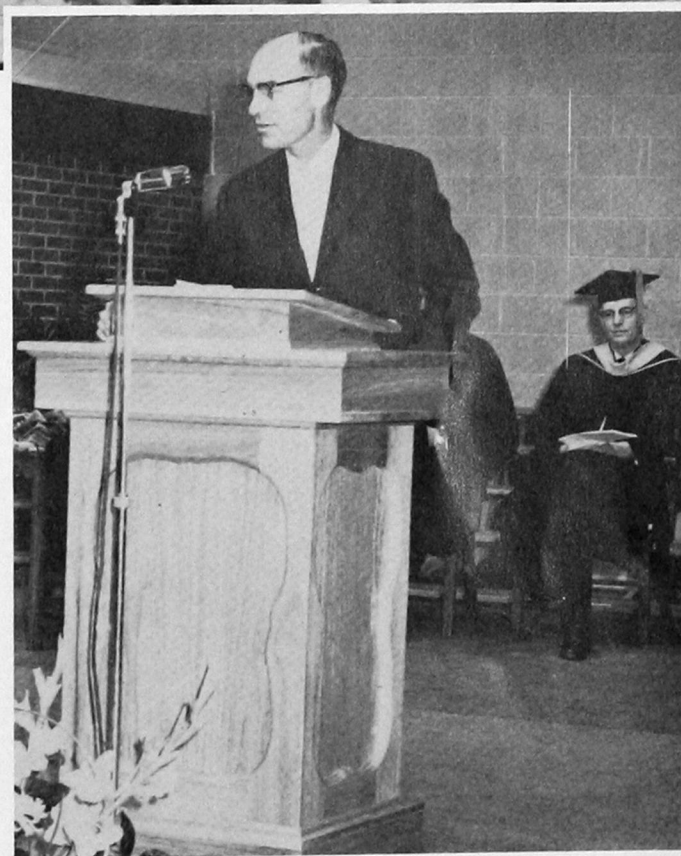

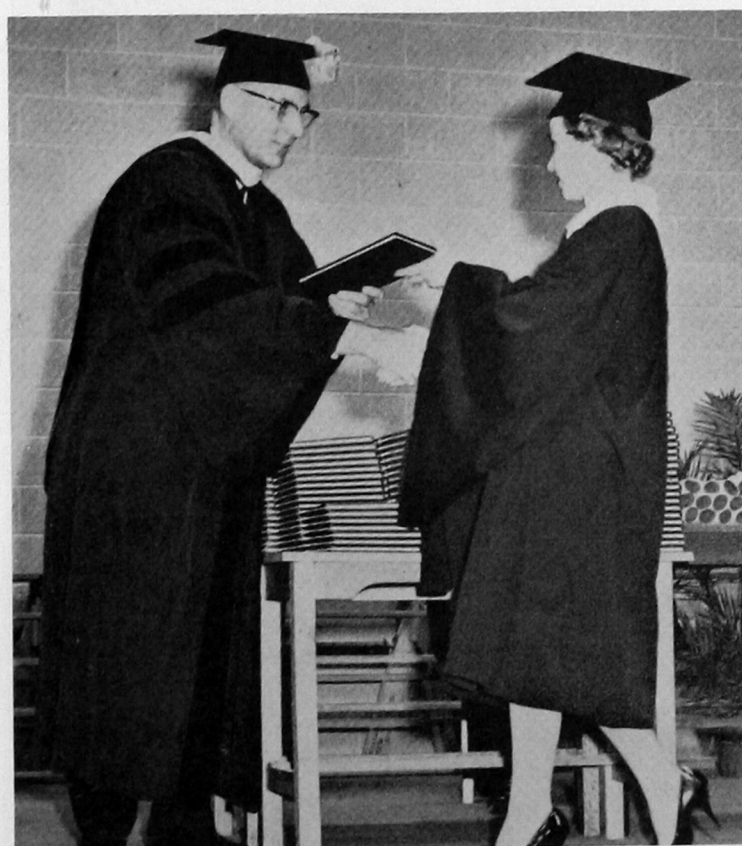

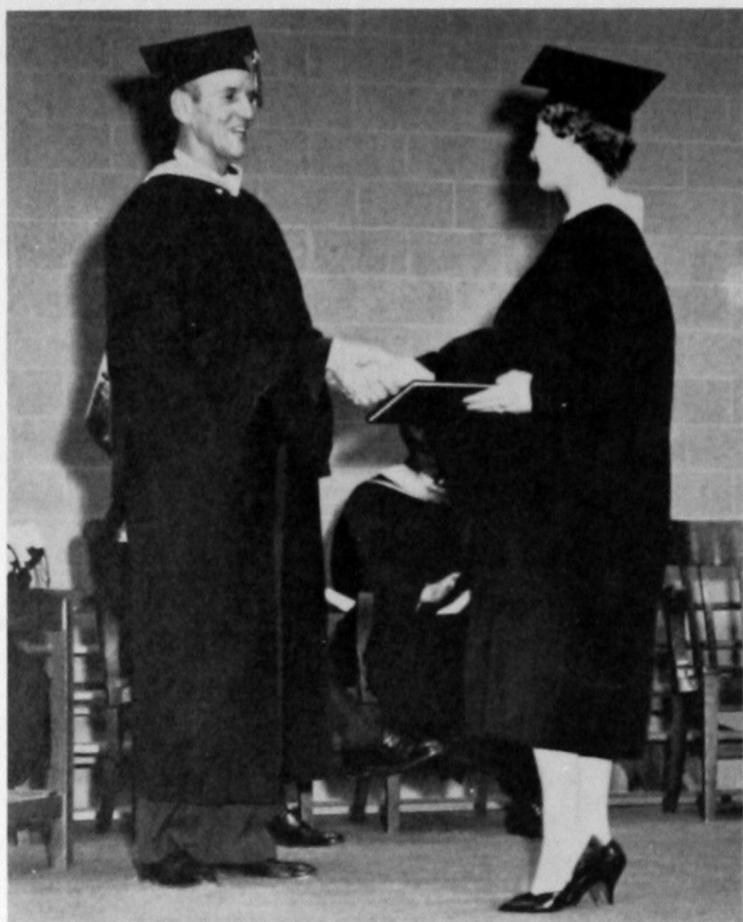

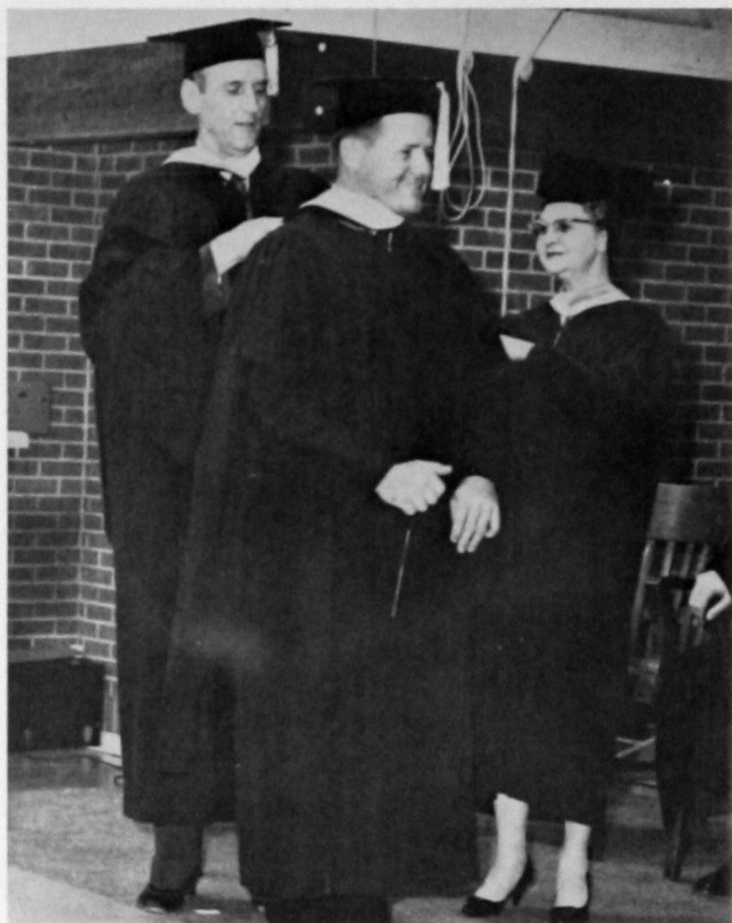
