The two honorees will be recognized at the Southwestern Alumni Luncheon at 11:45 a.m. in the Student Union Ballroom with formal inductions scheduled at half-time of the 2:00 p.m. homecoming football game.

Dr. Leonard Campbell, Southwestern Oklahoma State University President, will present each with a plaque which will read

in part, "Presented with pride the achievement of eminence in his community and to his nation."

A color portrait of each honoree will be displayed in the Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame located in the Southwestern Oklahoma State University Student Union.

Also, other activities scheduled during the homecoming weekend include reunions of the classes of 1928 and 1938 and an All-Greek Reunion.

FRANK L. POLK was born near Reydon, Oklahoma, in Roger Mills County. His father, Louis, died of a heart attack when Polk was only three years old. There were seven children for his mother, Nettie, to raise. Polk had an older brother who was 19 and took over the farming for the family. In order to complete high school, Polk lived in Strong City with his sister and brother-in-law, Lee and Nig Wells.

When Polk attended SWOSU he worked at the College Book Store which was owned by Lee Ratcliffe.

Always a friendly and outgoing man, Polk was a member of the Bulls, the men's pep organization at SWOSU. When he was a senior, he was elected President of the group. He was Junior Class President while at SWOSU and a member of the Student Council which was very active at the time.

Polk graduated from SWOSU on a Thursday and was sworn into the Air Corps as an Aviation Cadet the following Sunday in 1941, leaving immediately for San Diego. Primary flight training followed at Lindberg Field. Then he was transferred to Moffett Field near Palo Alto for the second phase of pilot training. Next came a transfer to Luke Field, Phoenix, Arizona for advanced training. He was commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant and received his pilot wings on January 9, 1942.

Frank became acquainted with a lovely young woman named Shirley Douglas, whose mother, Frances Douglas, taught at Weatherford Junior High School and was later H.S. librarian.

During her grade and high school years in Weatherford, Shirley often performed as a singer and dancer and was in many programs. While earning her Bachelor of Arts degree at SWOSU, she was active in the chorus and glee club. She was also a member of Tri J's.

Frank and Shirley were married on March 16, 1942 in Las Vegas,

Nevada and were stationed at Minter Field, Bakersfield, California for 3½ years. Frank was an instructor, a flight commander and for two years a Squadron Commander while there.

In April of 1945, Polk was transferred to Lincoln Army Air Field in Nebraska to join a "Bomber group" which was to be sent overseas. The war in Europe ended while the group was being formed. Polk was made a group commander, assigned to Lincoln Field. He was not discharged until June of 1946.

Returning to Oklahoma and civilian life, Polk worked with the War Assets Administration as a negotiator to dispose of all of the airports in Oklahoma which the army had taken over during the war. Every major airport in Oklahoma was included in the group. Polk worked with the mayors, councils, and city managers of towns all across Oklahoma. Despite the responsibilities of the job, it was a wonderful opportunity for Polk to meet many "fine people" which he enjoyed very much.

Shirley became the homemaker for the family which soon was enlarged by three children, Frank Lee, Douglas Lyons, and Shirley Lynn.

In 1948, Polk became associated with Southwestern Stationery and Bank Supply in Amarillo as a salesman. Nine months later, he transferred to Oklahoma City and began selling for the company in the metropolitan area. The company had stores in Lawton, Ponca City, and Amarillo, Texas.

In 1953, Polk became a Vice President and member of the Board of Directors. He had begun accumulating an interest in the various store locations.

Southwestern Stationery and Bank Supply offers a number of business related items for sale and also is a major printer and lithographer. The company went from 20 employees in the early 1950's to over 50 employees in the early 1960's in just the Oklahoma City area.

Since Polk became President and Chief Executive Officer in 1963, other changes have taken place in the company, as of course is the general pattern as people

# 1988 Summer Enrollment Figures

Enrollment figure for the 1988 summer session at Southwestern Oklahoma State University was 2,563 which reflected an increase from the 1987 enrollment.

The figure included enrollment on both the Weatherford and

Sayre campuses.

In 1987, the two college campuses--at the time Sayre campus had not been consolidated yet with Southwestern--had a total of 2,391 students.

Bill Wilmeth, registrar at

Southwestern, said the number of first-time freshmen was up compared to 1987. There were 225 first-time freshmen in 1988 com-

pared to 105 in 1987. He said the increase was mainly due to the new curriculum standards which went into effect this fall.

## Alum Named Director Of Development

Bob Neel, subject to approval by the Board of Regents for the Oklahoma State University and A & M Colleges, has been named as director of development at Panhandle State University.

Neel served as principal of the Granite (OK) Junior High and Senior High School before reporting for duty at PSU. He acted as assistant to the superintendent of schools, as school lunch director, curriculum coordinator, grant supervisor and policy coordinator.

He currently serves as a member of the advisory board of directors, an educational consultant to KXON-TV educational television located at Rogers State College in Claremore, Okla.

Neel is a graduate of Mangum High School and attended college at the University of Oklahoma, at Altus Junior College and graduated from Southwestern

State College at Weatherford.

He received his master of education in school counseling and psychology from Southwestern State College and received his doctorate of education May 7, 1988.

Neel and his wife, Linda, have two children, Melanie Dawn, 15; and Kelly Renae, 10.

The Neel family will be living in faculty housing on the PSU campus. He reported for duty June 1, 1988.

Neel is working in a Panhandle State University Foundation that had \$1,463,024.56 as of spring 1988. Their annual drive from October 15, 1987 to February 15, 1988 raised \$63,262.32, an increase of \$6,000 over the 1986-87 drive. An additional \$1,715 was raised to replace their carillon chimes. The Panhandle State Foundation was started in 1975.

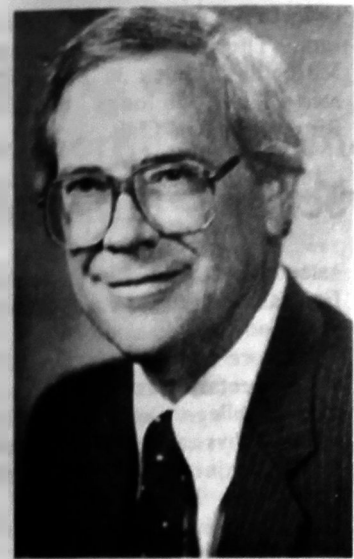

# Alum Elected To National Office

Kermit married the former Shirley Welk, whose husband was also deceased. The couple are proud of their 13 grandchildren.

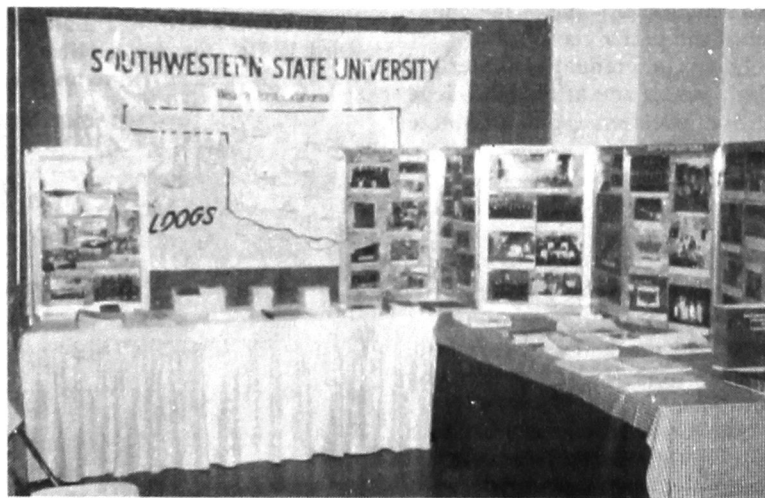
Kermit says music is his real love, and he and Shirley are both very active in the activities of the United Methodist Church and choir.

# Bergman Named New Dean Of Pharmacy School

Dr. H. David Bergman, Assistant Dean of the School of Pharmacy at the University of Pittsburgh since 1981, has been named Dean of the School of Pharmacy at Southwestern Oklahoma

State University at Weatherford.

The 44-year-old Bergman is a 1967 graduate of the University of Houston where he received his B.S. in pharmacy. He earned his M.S. in pharmacy from the

University of Iowa in 1969. His Ph.D. in clinical pharmacy was earned in 1973 from Purdue University.

He has taught at Purdue University, Northeast Louisiana

## Governor Signs Alumni Pharmacy Bill

Gov. Henry Bellmon has signed HB 1636, which cuts 500 hours from the required intern time that pharmacy graduates will have to spend on the job before they can secure a state license. Pleased with the governor's action was Rep. John Lassiter, D-Moore, the author.

But Lassiter said that the first class to reap the benefits of the change will be the class of 1989, seeing its intern time cut from 2,000 to 1,500 hours.

The Moore druggist and Southwestern Oklahoma State University alumnus pointed out that the law goes into effect Nov. 1 and the 1988 class will face the 2,000-hour requirement. Phar-

macy examinations are given in January and July.

Lassiter said pharmacy students receive 648 intern hours under the Southwestern school program. The remaining hours are collected by working under supervision in pharmacy shops and medical facilities.

"Many of Southwestern's students graduate with 1,500 hours and I still expect most of this year's class to leave the state," Lassiter said. That is because other states will permit them to take the board examination after graduation. The Moore lawmaker said he introduced the bill because he was concerned

that Oklahoma was training pharmacists and 75 percent were leaving the state.

The students leaving the state have two options, Lassiter said. If they want to come back they can take the Oklahoma test after ac-

quiring their hours, or they can remain away a year and come back under a reciprocal agreement Oklahoma has to recognize other state licenses. He expects the latter because students would not want to take two tests.

In 1988, Potter has served as the liason's NABP's Committee on Education.

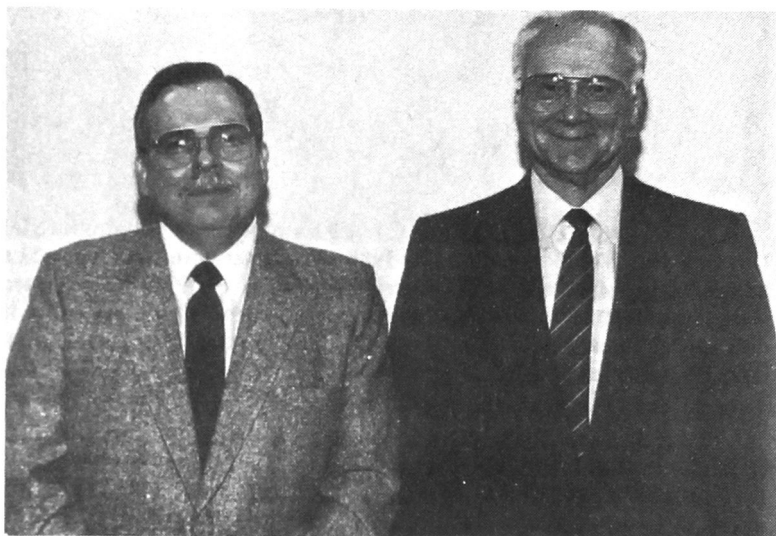

# SWOSU Pharmacist Of The Year: Shannon Brewer

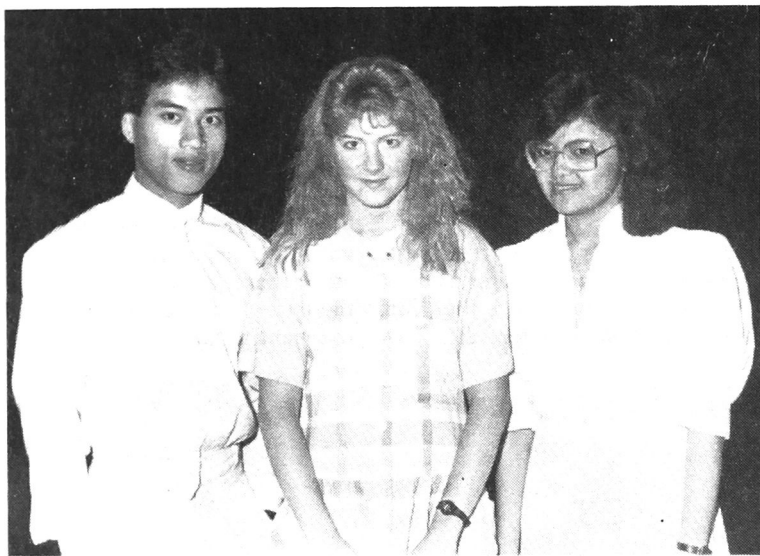
Shannon Barker Brewer (Class of '83) was named the Oklahoma Pharmaceutical Association's Young Pharmacist of the Year.

# Nursing Department Making Progress

In conjunction with National Nurses Day held May 6, Southwestern Oklahoma State University's Division of Nursing at Weatherford celebrated its 10th year of graduating professional nurses.

Southwestern is proud of the accomplishments of its nursing graduates and salutes them and all members of the nursing profession who make valuable contributions to health care each and every day of the year.

Although there are nearly 2 million registered nurses in the U.S., current statistics indicate hospitals and nursing homes are experiencing a "moderate" or "severe" shortage. Vacant budgeted nursing positions in hospitals more than doubled between 1985 and 1986, and the vacancy rate of 13.6% represents a shortage of nearly 100,000 RNs. Federal estimates say the supply of bachelor's degree-prepared Rns will fall short of the demand

by 1990 and by about 578,000 by the year 2000.

Since 1979, Southwestern has graduated 167 bachelor's degree-prepared nurses. Over 60% of these graduates currently practice in western Oklahoma. Graduates practice nursing in a wide variety of health care delivery settings including hospital nursing, community health nursing, maternal-infant nursing and many others.

According to many reports, one of the biggest challenges nurses are facing today is an increasing demand for their services. In 1972, hospitals used 50 registered nurses per 100 patients; in 1986 the number had risen to 91 per 100 patients--an 82 percent increase--because of the increasing complexity of care.

There have also been dramatic shifts in where and how health care services are being delivered. The result is a shortage of registered nurses in hospitals and other settings despite the fact that more nurses than ever before are working in the field (more than 1.5 million).

Professional nursing offers challenges, opportunities and diverse choices in a variety of health care settings. Southwestern graduates make many significant contributions to health care. The following is a sampling of professional roles performed by Southwestern graduates:

**Hospital Staff Nursing:** Kay Villines, a 1979 graduate, and Marla Eichelberger, a 1983 graduate, are both staff nurses at Southwestern Memorial Hospital in Weatherford. Tambllyn Cecil, a 1982 graduate, is a staff nurse at Community Hospital in Elk City.

**Community/Public Health Nursing:** Kim Short, a 1984 graduate, is a staff nurse at the Custer County Health Department in Clinton. Norma Harder, a diploma R.N., returned to Southwestern to earn a bachelor's degree in nursing. She is district supervisor for the health department for Blaine, Custer, Dewey, Beckham, Roger Mills and Washita counties.

**Home Health Nursing:** Marilyn Williams, a 1981 graduate, lives in Hinton and works in home health care in El Reno. Vicki Miller, a 1985 graduate, provides home health services through Health Watch in Weatherford.

**Nursing Home Care:** Terri Schmidt, a 1984 graduate, is nursing supervisor at Little Bird Nursing Home in Weatherford.

**Diabetes Care:** Gale Wilson, a 1982 graduate, is diabetes education coordinator at St. Anthony's Hospital in Oklahoma City.

**Infection Control:** Frankie Jenkins, a 1983 graduate, is Director of Infection Control and Risk Management at Clinton Regional Hospital.

**Nursing Management:** Tana Mashaney is Director of Nursing at Southwestern Memorial Hospital in Weatherford, and Carolyn Walker is head nurse on a medical-surgical unit at Baptist Medical Center in Oklahoma City. Both are 1980 graduates.

**Maternal-Infant Nursing:** Cathy Penner Dick, a 1982 graduate, lives in Corn and works part-time in the obstetric department at Clinton Regional Hospital. Diane Perales, a 1987 graduate, also works in the same department.

**Operating Room Nursing:** Gwen Schenberger-Fuchs, a 1982 graduate, is the operating room supervisor at Community Hospital in Elk City. Sherry Nunemaker is an operating room nurse at Clinton Regional Hospital in Clinton.

Southwestern is proud of its graduates and the important contributions they are making to the health care of individuals, families, communities and countries.



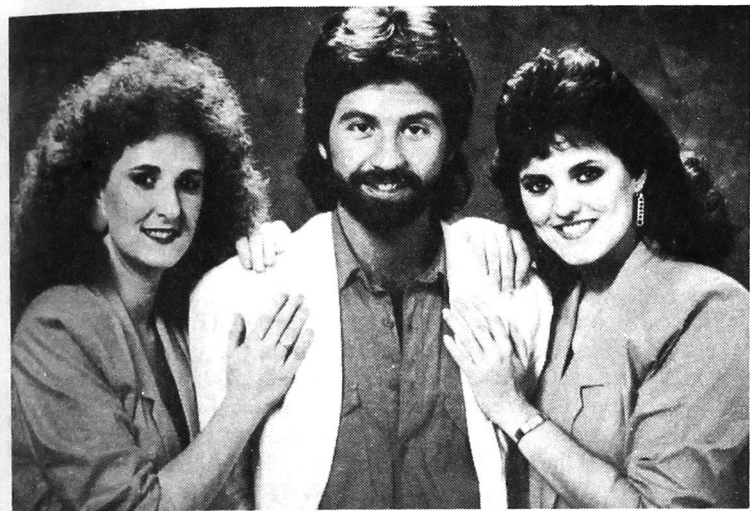

# Where Are They Now?

Former MVHS graduate, Arnold Shockley came back to Mountain View to teach and then retire here after a busy life in other places. He was well known for his abilities as a football player at MVHS and Southwestern Oklahoma State University at Weatherford. He was inducted into the Southwestern Athletic Hall of Fame in 1965.

Shockley played football at SWOSU in 1924-27 at the position of tackle. A pro recruiter heard of a star lineman at SWOSU by the name of Perry Jackson and cabled

him offering him a tryout with the Providence, Rhode Island Steam Rollers. Jackson, who was Shockley's friend, was ill and unable to go, so Shockley went in his place, made the team and played pro football for three years under the name of Perry Jackson. In the meantime, the real Jackson recovered and tried out with the Steam Rollers under the name of Arnold Shockley but failed to make the team. He went on to Boston and played one season with a pro team under Shockley's name.

In 1928 the Providence Steam Rollers played the Green Bay Packers for the National Football League Championship and won. In 1929 they participated in the first NFL game under night floodlights at Providence, home of one of the smallest teams in the league.

After getting his degree in 1930 from SWOSU, Shockley married and began to teach. His first job was at Hobart, and from there he went to several other schools in that part of the state. He was superintendent at Harmony for

three years.

During World War II he worked three years in a shipyard in California.

He came to Mountain View as highschool principal in 1952 and retired in 1964 after having been an educator for 30 years. While at Mountain View he also coached and farmed.

Shockley and his wife Ruth, (who is also a retired school teacher) now reside in Mountain View. They have one son, Ralph, who is a counselor in the Liberal, Kansas schools.

## BULLDOG HALL OF FAMER KAISER DEAD AT 75

### GORDON WILLIAM KAISER

Gordon William Kaiser, a Weatherford native, member of the Southwestern Oklahoma State University Hall of Fame and longtime area public school educator, died April 9, 1988, at his Napa, Calif., residence. He was 75.

Private funeral services were held for the immediate family in Napa, with private interment at Greenwood Cemetery of Weatherford.

Mr. Kaiser, who attended SWOSU from 1930-34, was a

center/placekicker on the undefeated 1933 Bulldog football team, and that year was named to the All-Oklahoma team, all-star selections from among the players at the teacher's colleges as well as the University of Oklahoma and what was then Oklahoma A&M College.

In all he earned 11 athletic letters at Southwestern--four in football, three each in basketball and tennis and one in track. After obtaining his bachelor's degree in 1934, he played semipro basketball at Enid.

In 1935, he married J.J. Williams, sister of Rankin Williams, SWOSU athletic and coaching great. Kaiser accepted a teaching position at Sentinel, then moved to Fairfax where he was principal and assistant football coach.

After a stint in the Air Force, he became principal at Arapaho for six years and then Clinton.

He later accepted a mathematics teaching post at Redwood Junior High in Napa, where he retired in 1978 after 43 years in education.

He was inducted into the Bulldog Athletic Hall of Fame in 1979.

## Women Win National Championship

Southwestern Oklahoma State University at Weatherford won another national championship title on June 18, 1988 as the Southwestern women's rodeo team claimed the championship trophy at the College National Finals Rodeo in Bozeman, Montana.

The championship was the first-ever national team title for the women's program at Southwestern. In 1985, the Southwestern men won a national title.

Southwestern's women accumulated 578 total points to out-distance second place West Hills College of California by 134 points. West Hills finished with 444 points. Rounding out the top ten were: Eastern New Mexico, 327; McNeese State, 255; Weber State, 222; Idaho State and Dickinson State, tie, 210; University of Wyoming and Texas Tech, tie, 108; and Scottdale Communi-

ty College of Arizona, 78.

Leading the Southwestern women were Denton, Texas senior Donelle Kvenild and Tucson, Ariz., junior Shannon Lord. Kvenild won the CNFR individual national championship in breakaway roping, while Lord finished second in both women's all-around competition and breakaway roping. In addition, the two young ladies also did quite well in national competition based on performances throughout the year. Kvenild picked up a national title in breakaway roping, while Lord placed eighth in the same competition.

Also doing well at the CNFR was Moore freshman Lynn Burrough. She ended up placing fourth in breakaway roping. Burrough also wound up third in the national standings for competition throughout the year.

"It always feels good to win," Southwestern rodeo coach Don

Mitchell said about the national championship title. "I feel real good for our women because they have come so close so many times."

Southwestern's women's team has been a dominating force in the Central Plains Regional during the past five years. The Southwestern women have won the CPR championship each of those years, but this year is the first time that the women have been able to win the national championship.

As for the Southwestern men,

they ended up in 9th place at the CNFR. Southwestern had two starters in the finals.

Lee Rice and Payne Dobler finished fourth and seventh place, respectively, in bareback riding. In addition, Canadian, Texas freshman Shawn Wright won the Bill Robinson Award which went to the best freshman or sophomore performer in steer wrestling. Wright, who won first place in the 1st Go Round of the rodeo, won a \$1,000 scholarship for the Southwestern rodeo program.

## SW Roundballers Open Nov. 9-10

University at 8 p.m.

Southwestern basketball fans are looking forward to the 1988-89 basketball season as both the men's and women's teams should be quite competitive.

The two teams will open play at home on November 9 and 10. The Lady Bulldogs host Langston at 7 p.m. on November 9, while the Bulldogs start their season on November 10 by hosting Phillips

Both teams each have only three home games during the first semester so Southwestern basketball fans will see most of the home action during the second semester.

Head coach of the men's team is George Hauser, while John Lottin coaches the women's squad.

## Two Sign With Bulldogs

Southwestern men's basketball coach George Hauser signed two outstanding high school seniors to letters-of-intent during the recent recruiting period. Signing with the Bulldogs were Butler's Phil Drouhard and Oklahoma City Millwood's Michael Parks.

Drouhard led Butler High School to the Class B state tournament in 1988. He was named to the second team all-tourney squad. In addition, Drouhard was selected an all-stater and was named MVP of the Five County Conference and at the West Central Tournament.

Drouhard averaged 27.9 points and 14.5 rebounds per contest in 1987-88. He was a 75% freethrow and 47% field goal shooter. In addition, he shot 37% from the three-point range.

While at Butler, Drouhard played for Steve James both his sophomore and freshman seasons. He played for Mickey

Kauk during his junior and senior seasons. He was a starter during his sophomore, junior and senior years.

Parks, who graduated in May from Millwood, was a starting guard on the 1988 Millwood basketball team which won the Class 3A state championship. He averaged 14 points per contest. The 5-11 Parks was also a first team selection on the Little All-City team in Oklahoma City.

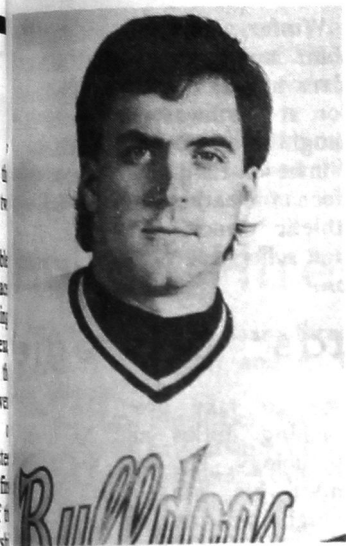

The 18-year-old Park is the son of Meredith Martin and William Lynch of Oklahoma City. Parks' high school coach was Varryl Franklin.

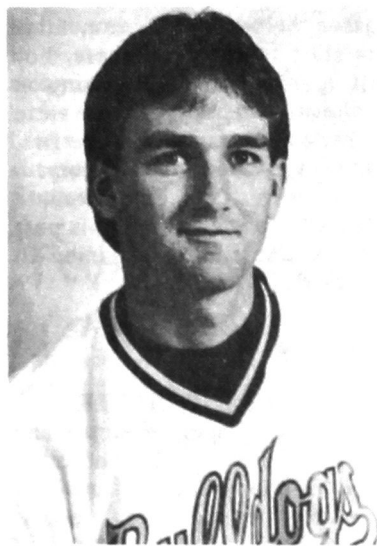

Golf coach Cecil Perkins saw his golf team come alive at the end of the season as the Bulldogs took second at the Oklahoma Intercollegiate Conference tourney and fifth at the NAIA District Nine Golf Tournament.

At the OIC meet at Durant, the Bulldogs were edged out for the championship by Northeastern. The Redmen had a 628 total while Southwestern was next with 631. Making the all-conference team were Mike Smith of Carter and Duane Faust of Clinton.

Southwestern competed in the District Nine tourney at The Greens Country Club in Oklahoma City. The 'Dogs finished 5th with a 951 score after three rounds of play. Winning the tourney was Central State with a 913. The Bulldogs' leading player was Faust who shot 77-78-82 for a 231 total.

In men's tennis, Southwestern took third place at the OIC tourney finishing just 1½ points behind second-place East Central. Herb White of Weatherford and Roy Thevenot of Altus finished second in #2 and #3 singles, respectively. In doubles, Southwestern team members Larry Wheeler of Weatherford and Clinton Clark of Happy, Texas, placed second in #2 doubles, while Wayne Thomas and Kelly Kerr, both of Oklahoma City Western Heights, took second in #3 doubles. Coach of the men's team is Rocky Powell.

In women's tennis, Angela Kettler was Southwestern's bright

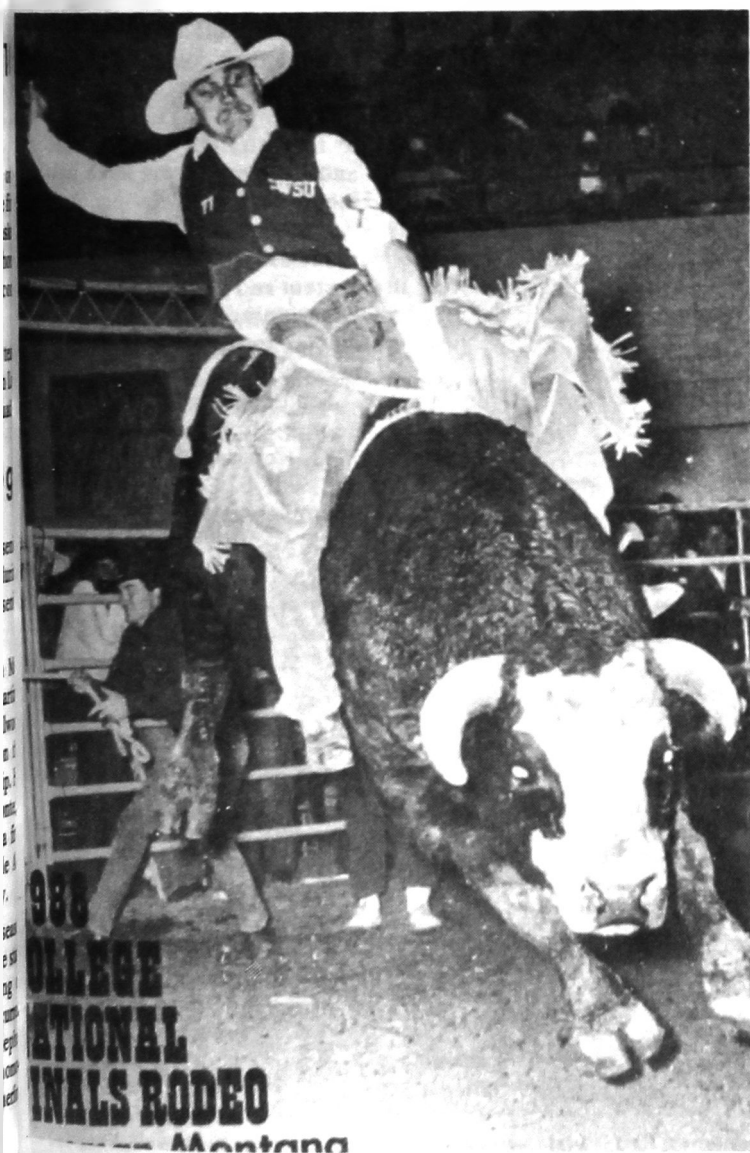
spot. The Tuttle product advanced to the District Nine tourney semifinals before bowing out in #6 singles. Coach of the women's team is Kelli Litsch.

DeCelle led the team in runs scored with 45, was third in hits with 45, led the team in doubles with 13 and led the team in home runs with 6.

In track, Mike Clyde's squad finished fourth in the OIC meet, one point behind third-place Northeastern. Weatherford's John Dill led the Bulldogs by placing first in both broad jump and high jump. Also placing first in the 800 meter run was Steve Smith. Taking second in shot put was Kefrin Rusk of Houston, Texas. Daniel Marsh of Hardin, Texas; Mark Williams of Pampa, Texas; and Eric Lacy of Midwest City each placed third, respectively, in the 110 high hurdles, 400 meter hurdles and broad jump.

In team events, Southwestern's 400 meter relay team was second while the 1600 meter relay squad placed third.

# Five High Schoolers Sign With Lady Bulldogs

Southwestern Oklahoma State University's women's basketball coach John Loftin signed five Oklahoma high school seniors to basketball letters-of-intent for the 1988-89 season.

Signing with the perennial women's basketball power were Oklahoma's all-time high school career scoring leader Shelly Mooter of Oney; Jackie Snodgrass of Ames; Lori Hopkins of Mustang; Amber Smith of Binger; and Andrea Winter of Drummond.

Loftin will be counting on the young ladies to hopefully help Southwestern get back to the national tournament after a one-year leave of absence. The Lady Bulldogs have won national championships in 1982, 1983, 1985 and 1987.

Mooter had an outstanding career at Oney. She now holds the state's all-time scoring record with 4,499 points. The Oklahoma All-Stater, who led Oney to three state tourney appearances in four years, picked up several prestigious awards for her accomplishments. She was named the Naismith Foundation Girls Player of the Year in Oklahoma; the USA Today newspaper's Player of the Year in Oklahoma; and one of three forwards on the Daily Oklahoman's Super Six Team.

"I felt comfortable with the people there," Mooter said when asked why she chose Southwestern. "I thought all year I would go there, but I didn't want to decide until the end."

Mooter had a 4.0 grade point average at Oney and was co-valedictorian of her graduating class. Mooter's parents are Kenneth and Romelda Mooter of Oney. Her high school coach was Mike Zurline.

"I feel she is the best long-range shooter I've seen in the 13 years I've been here in Oklahoma," Loftin said about Mooter. "She is fundamentally sound in every phase of the game."

Another top prospect is Jackie Snodgrass of Ames. The Oklahoma All-Stater was named Northwest Oklahoma Player of the Year in 1987-88 and was selected as Most Valuable Player for the Orient Conference at the Ames Tournament.

Snodgrass said she picked

Southwestern because ever since seventh grade, she had heard about Kelli Litsch--current assistant coach and former four-time All-American at Southwestern--and Southwestern's winning tradition.

"I honestly think she is the top college prospect in the state of Oklahoma this year because of her height and overall game," Loftin said at the time of her signing.

Snodgrass averaged over 27 points per game during her sophomore, junior and senior seasons. She is the daughter of Noble and Anna Mae Snodgrass and she also had a 4.0 grade point average at Ames. Her coach was Mark Van Meter.

Also signing with Southwestern is Lori Hopkins, a Mustang graduate and Yukon resident. She was a member of the Mustang girls basketball squad which won the Class 5A state championship title this past season. She averaged 15.0 points per game and was a 56% field goal and 70% freethrow shooter.

Hopkins was named to the state all-tournament team and was named alternate All-Stater. She was also named an all-conference forward at Mustang.

The 18-year-old daughter of Harold and Beverly Hopkins went to Mustang from Carter High School where she was named conference freshman of the year in 1984-85 and all-conference forward in 1985-86.

Hopkins, who was coached by Bob Pigg at Mustang, had a grade point average of 3.3 and plans to major in psychology or general education at Southwestern.

Amber Smith of Binger will also be playing at Southwestern. Smith averaged 28 points per game for Binger in 1987-88. She was named to the All-State team and was also selected as an all-conference forward. In addition, she was named to the all-tournament teams at the Eakly and Caddo County tournaments.

The 18-year-old daughter of Darrel and Lana Smith of Binger was coached by Greg Druba. She had a 3.06 grade point average and plans to major in elementary education at Southwestern.

And, Andrea Winter of Drummond will be playing basketball for the Lady Bulldogs. Winter, who averaged 18 points this past

season, helped lead Drummond to the state tournament where they lost to eventual state champion runnerup Leedey. The state tourney appearance was the first one ever in Drummond history.

Winter was named an alternate All-Stater for her efforts this past season. She was also named to the Enid All-Area team.

## Schumpert Leads Carnegie

Doug Schumpert means many things to many people, but to the small Caddo County town of Carnegie, he is a history maker.

Schumpert, a 1981 graduate of Southwestern, led the Carnegie High School Wildcats to their first-ever Oklahoma state championship title in boys basketball in 1988.

The Wildcats overcame a seven-point deficit against #1 ranked St. Mary's in the Class 2A title game by scoring 10 points in the final 23 seconds of the game to win by one point.

"I've never been involved in anything like that," Schumpert said. "The kids really hung in there."

Although winning the state championship title made the Wildcats and Schumpert instant heroes, the story goes much deeper.

# Maxwell Wants Athletic Trainer Certification

Jason Maxwell, a product of Borger High School class of 1983, is one of those "behind the scenes workers" you hear about.

Maxwell is the guy with the roll of tape, the bucket of ice and the ace bandages. As a trainer, it's

his job to keep finely tuned bodies in one piece and hitting on as many cylinders as possible.

As a testament to his success, Maxwell wears two national championship rings. He kept the Southwestern Oklahoma State

University Lady Bulldogs patched together enough to win basketball championships in 1985 and 1987.

Maxwell also spent two years with the SWOSU football team and four years with the rodeo team. He didn't get a ring for it, but the rodeo team also won a national championship in 1985.

Borger High School gave Maxwell his start in training. Although he ran track in high school, Maxwell said he was too small to play football but he still wanted to be involved.

"I like to help," Maxwell said. "It's my way of contributing to the sport and to the team."

Maxwell said he got interested in sports medicine in the 7th grade and continued from there. His high school coaches told him about training seminars, which he attended mostly with other coaches.

The Borger Bulldog was good enough to get a training scholarship to SWOSU. He graduated in December 1987, with a degree in health and physical education after four long years of locker rooms and injured athletes.

It was Maxwell's job as trainer to treat injuries and see athletes through their rehabilitation. He's taped many a knee and ankle, but he's also taped up his fair share of shoulders and wrists and everything else between the eyebrows and toenails.

"This isn't like wrapping a hockey stick; different sports call for different taping requirements. Football players, for instance, don't need to be able to jump as

well as basketball players do so they don't need as much mobility in their ankles," Maxwell said.

Maxwell said his most memorable experience at the university was winning the first national championship. He said working with the women's team was by far easier than working for the men's.

"Whenever something was wrong they'd (the women) let me take care of it instead of arguing," he said. "Women are more picky about how it's done, but they're easier to get along with."

Maxwell is getting along with his career by enrolling in the physical education program at West Texas State University. While there, he also plans to get his certification from the National Athletic Trainers Association.

Besides broadening his area of expertise, the certification will allow him to work as a professional trainer for pro sports teams.

The certification process is arduous at best as Maxwell must complete 1,800 hours of internship under another certified trainer, as well as extra course work such as anatomy.

WTSU has a certified trainer and Maxwell said he'll probably be working with the football and basketball teams during the off season.

"Every hour you work counts toward your certification," he said. "You're allowed to get 300 hours a semester. That shouldn't be too hard."

## Hobart Hires Two Alumni

The Hobart school board hired a new band director and math teacher/coach.

Phillip Paul Phyllaier, former band director at Garland Christian Academy, Garland, Texas, is the new band director. He graduated from Southwestern Oklahoma State University, Weatherford, in 1970 and received his master's in music education in 1976.

He has taught for 17 years, the last six in Garland. A graduate of Carnegie High School, Phyllaier,

40, has been band director at Carnegie, Anadarko and Snyder, among other schools.

Geary Gambrell, former Hobart teacher/coach before going into banking, is the advanced math teacher at the high school and high school girls and junior high girls and boys coach. Before his appointment, Gambrell was an employee at Home State Bank of Hobart.

Gambrell is also a graduate of SWOSU.

## Roof Named Altus Basketball Coach

Kim L. Roof, math instructor and coach at Northeast Junior High, has been selected to fill the position of girls' basketball coach at Altus High School, according to Dr. Morris Foster, superintendent of Altus Schools.

Roof has taught at Northeast for 10 years and has served both as head girls' basketball coach and head girls' and boys' tennis coach. During that time the girls' basketball team has won 72 per-

cent of their games, winning 120 and losing 47. The team has won five conference championships, has gained runner-up honors three years and has finished third one year.

The girls' tennis team has won 87 percent of their matches with 66 wins and 10 losses. In 1980, 1984, 1985 and 1986, the team went undefeated and has won the conference championship for the past five years.

Winning 62 percent of their games, the boys' tennis team won the conference championship in 1986.

"We are glad to promote someone with Kim's talent and experience to the position of head girls' basketball coach at the high school," said Dr. Foster.

"She has demonstrated by her fine record at Northeast that she has the ability to work with young people successfully.

Roof is a 1978 graduate of Southwestern Oklahoma State University where she majored in mathematics and minored in physical education. She was a member of Kappa Mu Epsilon, the mathematics honor society, and Kappa Delta Pi, the education honor society.

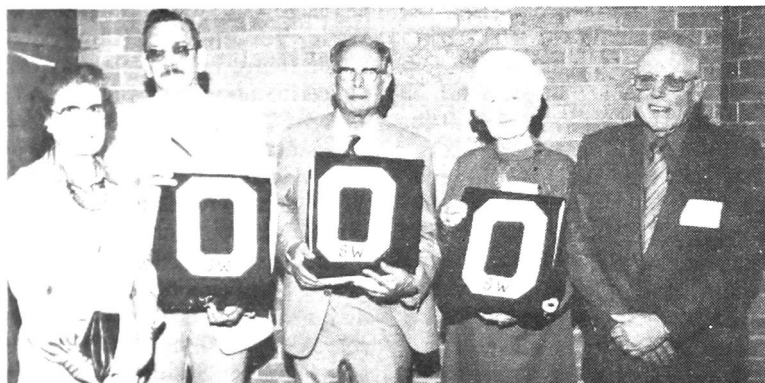
