Exactly where and when and how the spark is struck, for the individual as for the college, no one can say. But it doesn't happen at a



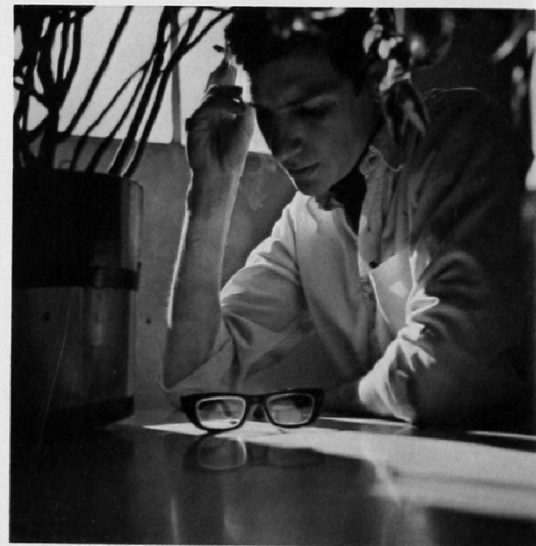
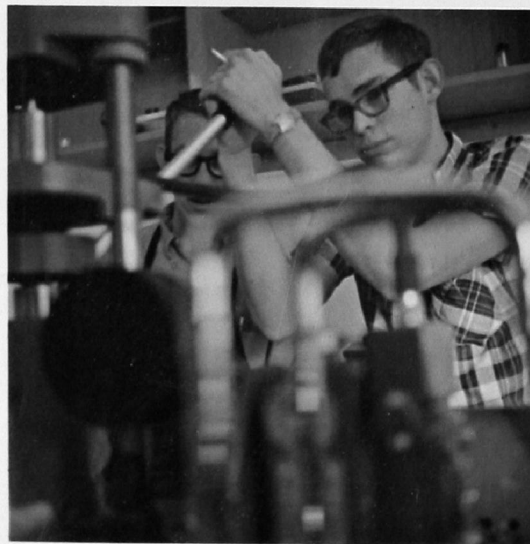
ribbon-cutting ceremony, or in the bedlam following a game-winning touchdown.

It happens, very quietly, in the secret heart. Without cheering and speeches, without the din of riveting hammers, without drum-rolls

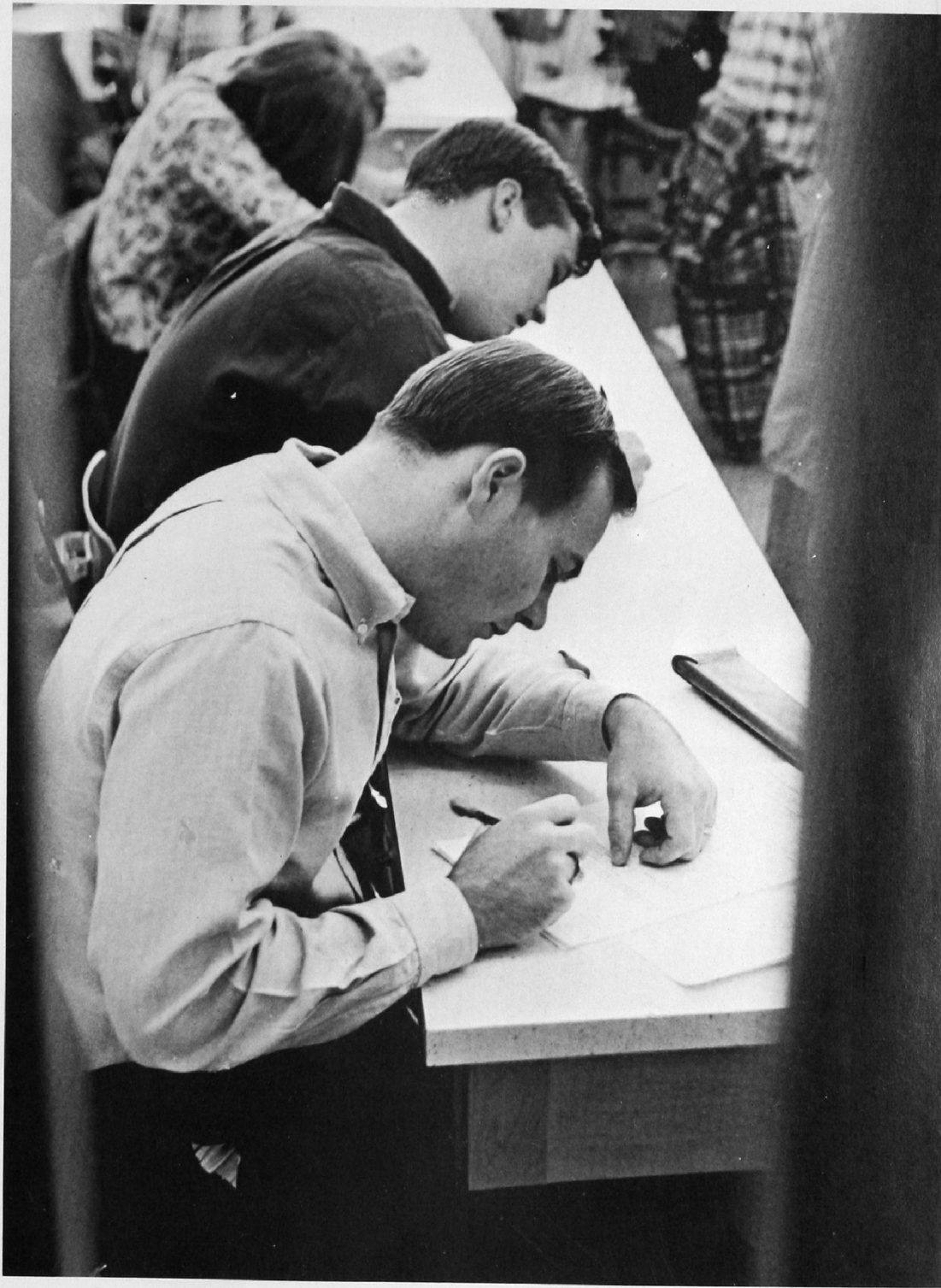
and fanfares.

The main business at Southwestern is learning ... but every hour at the books is a solid investment in a productive, responsible future.



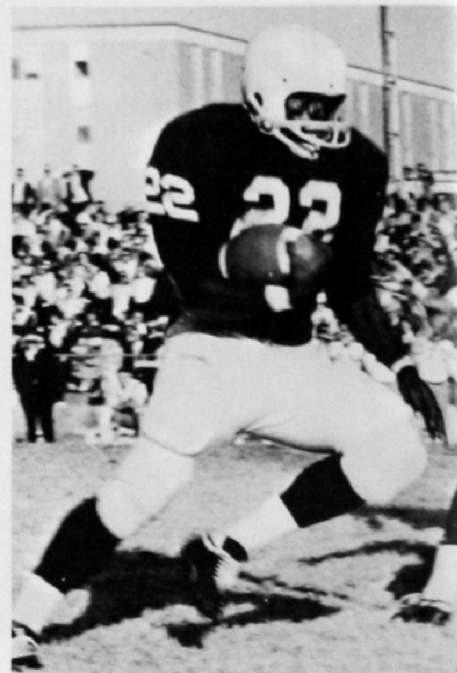

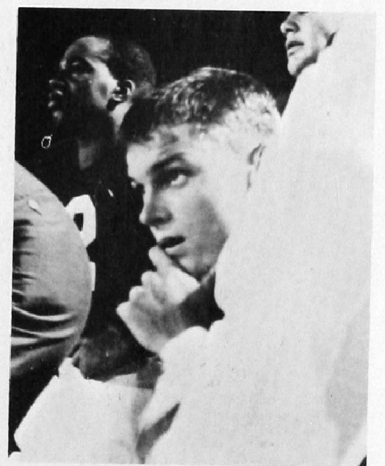
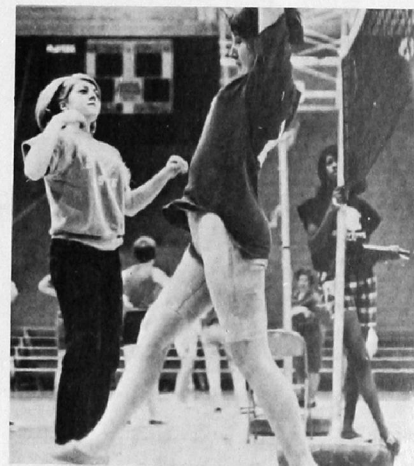
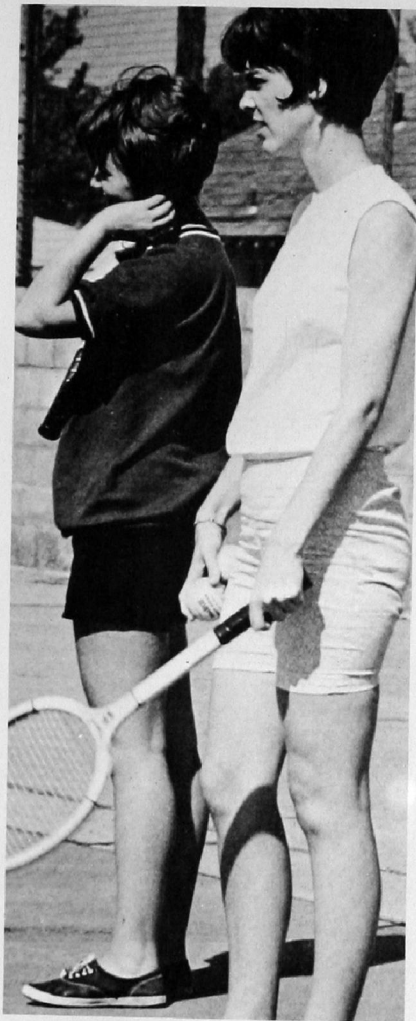
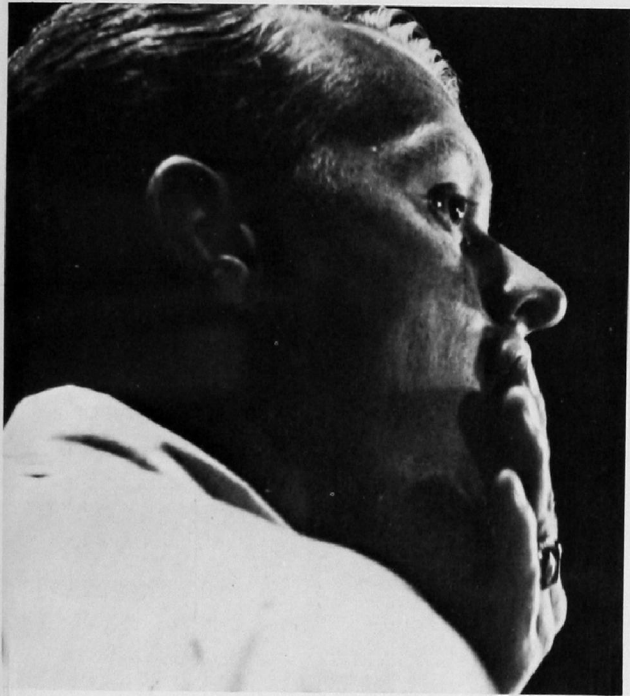


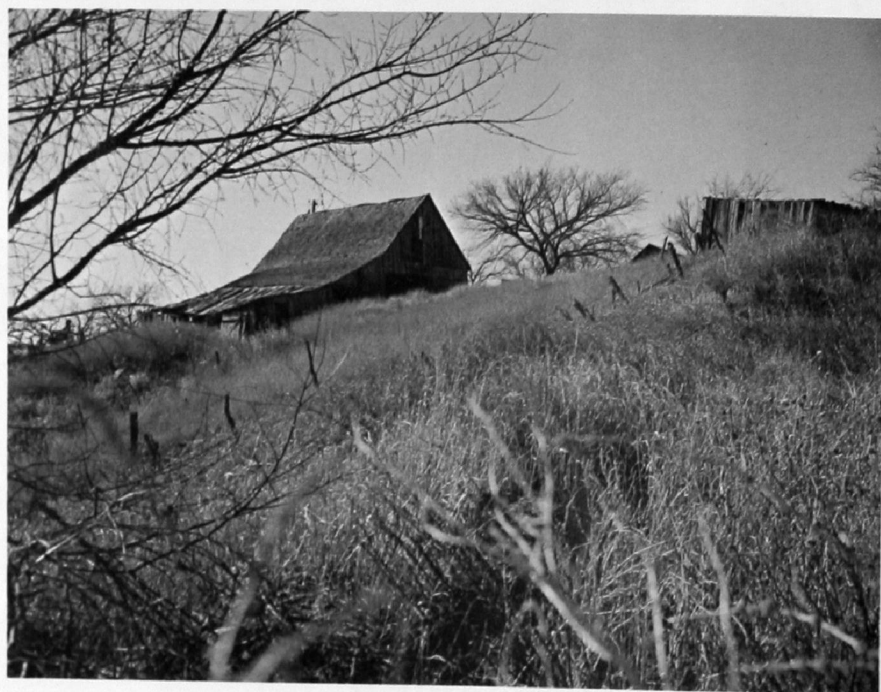
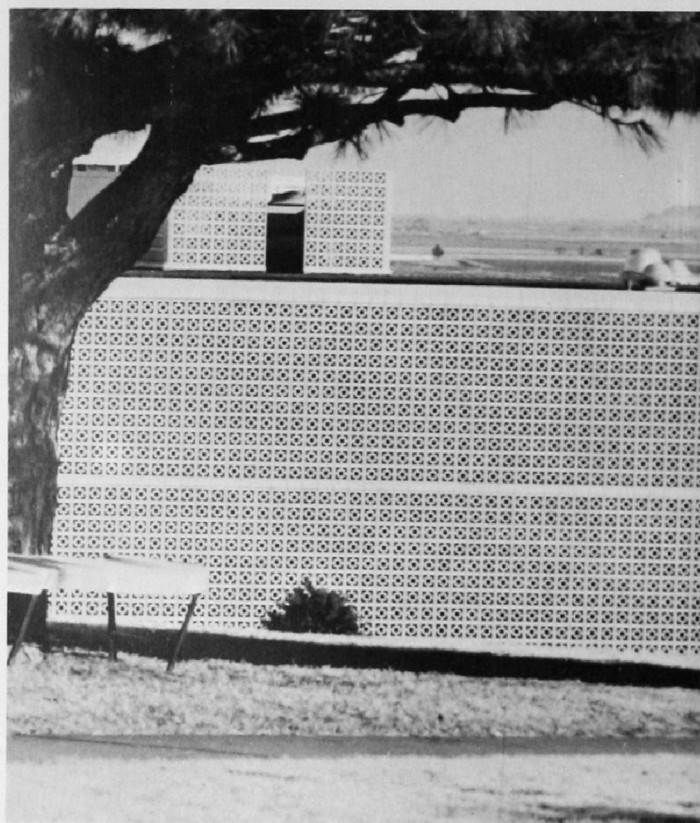
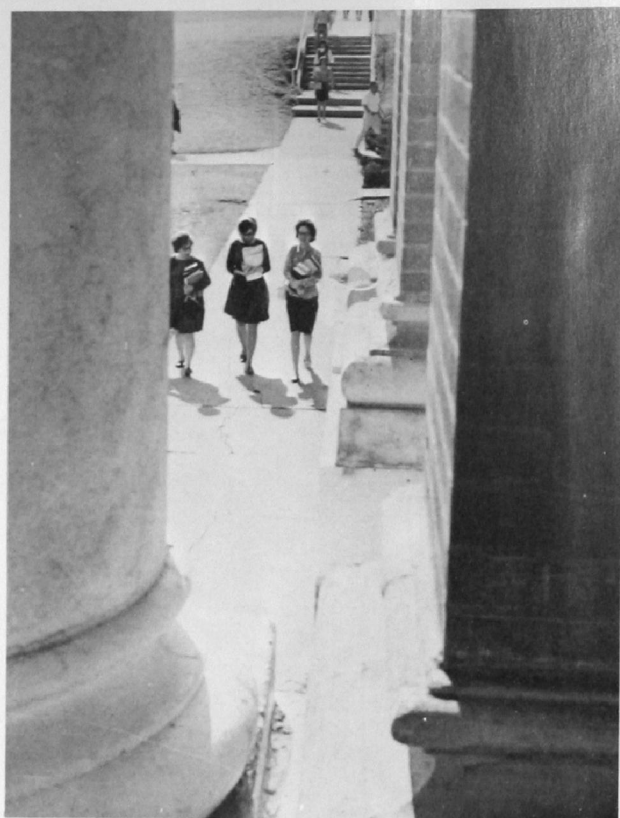
College wouldn't be college without sports—and at Southwestern it's the rare student who doesn't take an active part in some kind of athletic program.

Golf, tennis, bowling, even sailing—Southwestern has its enthusiasts (and not a few experts) in all these.

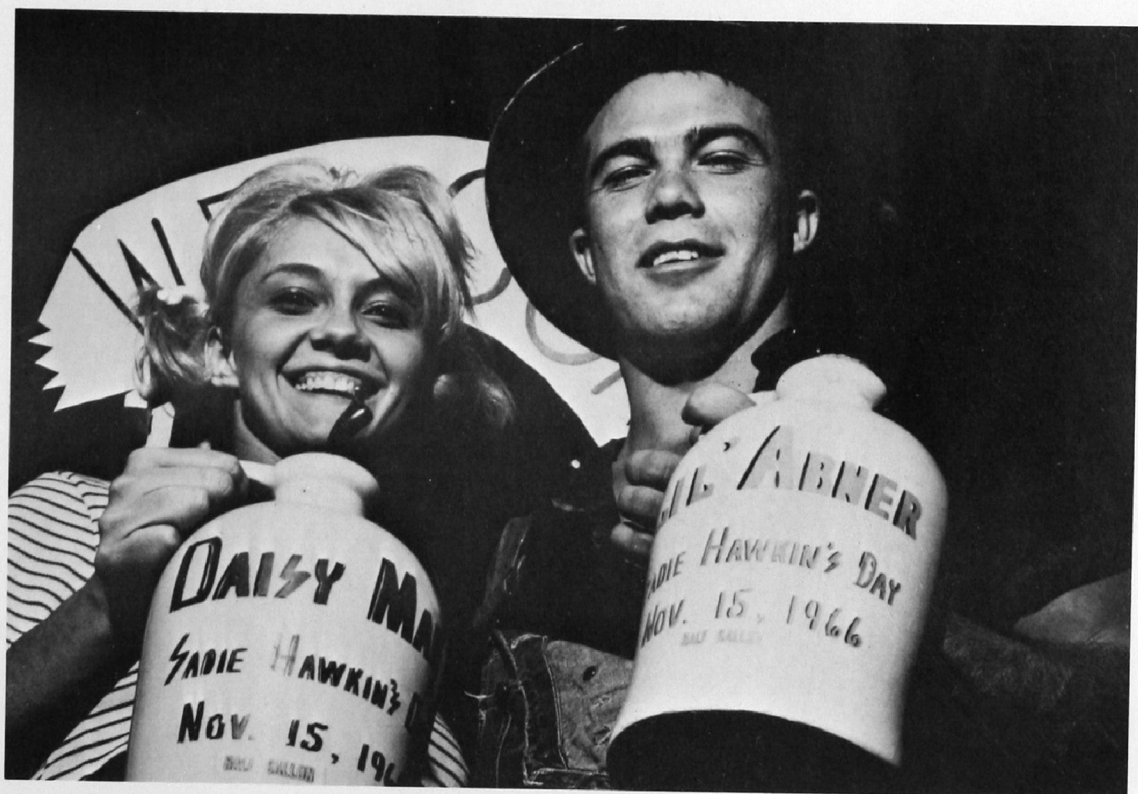
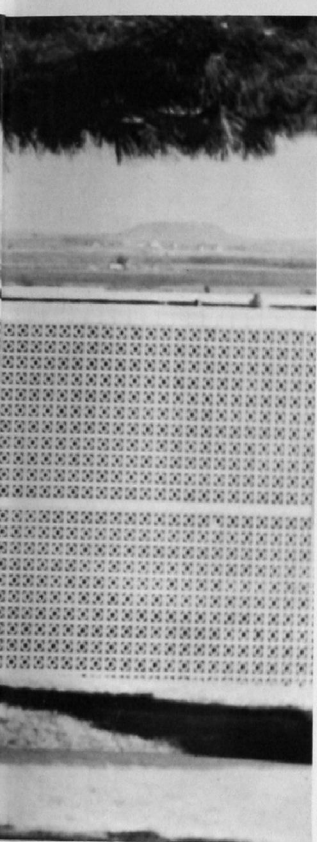




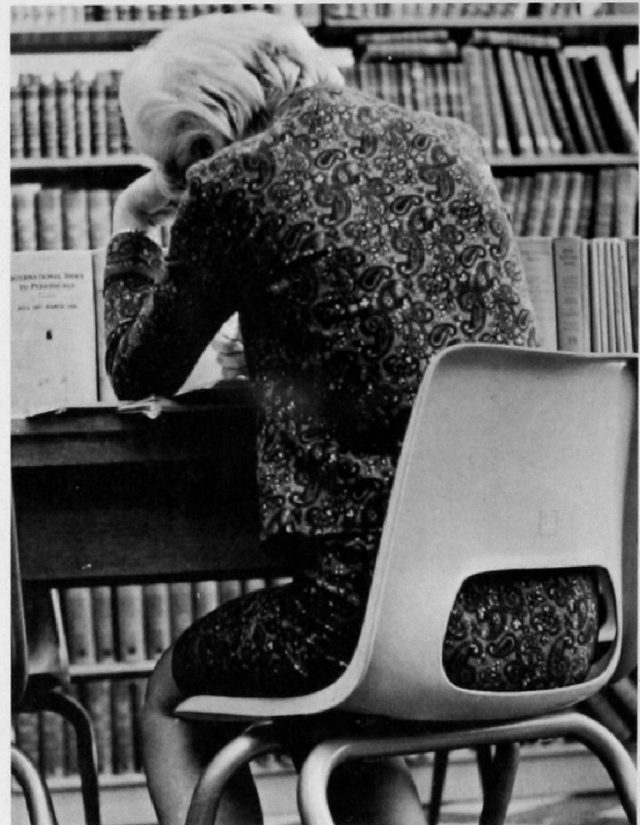

ing of water navigation in 1970; with the creation of local action groups to assist in the location of industries.

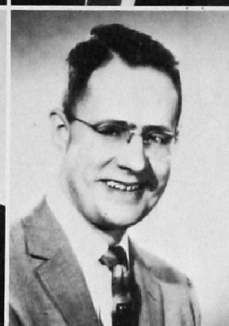
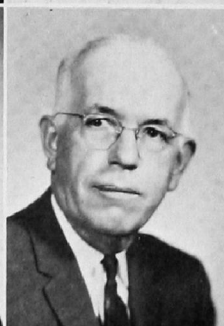

Through fighting determination and enthusiasm, the Bulldogs, after dropping their first two out of three games, ended the 1966 grid season successfully with a seven win and three loss record over-all, and a five win, two loss record for second place in the tough Collegiate Conference.

The Bulldogs opened the season by scoring a 13-7 victory over Fort Hays State. Quarterback Mike Freeman took to the air for both touchdowns, one to John Bailey and the other to John Goodner. Kicking specialist Lynn Alexander, who booted all extra point tries for the Bulldogs, converted one of the extra points.

Playing host to East Central, the Bulldogs were nosed out by 14-13. Versatile Mike Freeman ran for one TD and passed to Goodner for the other. A safety by the Tigers made up for their failing on two conversion attempts, which proved to be the margin of victory as Lynn Alexander's first extra point try was good, but was called back on a 15-yard penalty. Alexander missed his second attempt, which left the 'Dogs behind by one point.

Southwestern's second conference game ended with the Bulldogs dropping a heart-breaker to come-from-behind Northwestern, 14-7. Battling to a scoreless tie in the first half, the Bulldogs struck for a touchdown late in the third quarter by halfback Charles Randle. With less than two minutes to go, the Rangers charged back for two touchdowns on an interception and penalty call.

Against Central State, the Bulldogs bounced into the victory column, throttling the Bronchos, 21-14. Workhorse fullback Gene Dillman plowed through the Bronc defense for the first tally. A Freeman-to-Randle pass connection brought the 'Dogs their second score. The third TD came on a pass completion to Dale Minor from Freeman. Defensive standouts were James Poole, Bill Henly, and Dale Minor, with pass protectors Ron Marvel, Eugene McGlory, Lee Brower, and John Goodner coming up with interceptions.

With its offensive machine in full gear, Southwestern crushed Northeastern, 34-13. Gene Dillman rambed for two TD's, Freeman ran for one and tossed another to Larry Smith, and Charles Randle added the Bulldogs' fifth touchdown.

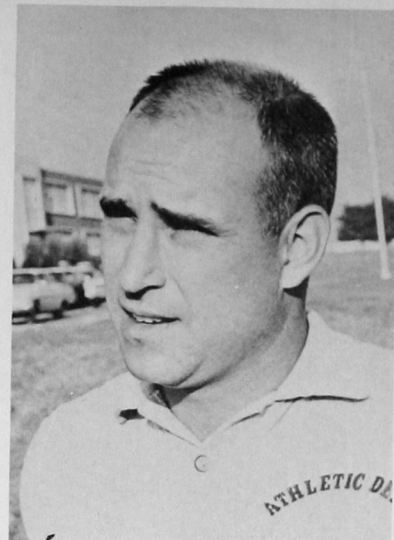

On the home field, the Southeastern Savages fell before the Bulldog power, 28-14. Talented Freeman proved to be the 'Dogs' spoiler, on pay-dirt passes to Jack Rose, John Bailey, and Randle. Gene Dillman figured in the 'Dogs' other score. James Poole, Dennis Skinner, John Goodner, George Perko, and Elmer Hill shined on defense.

Before an overflowing Homecoming crowd, the Bulldogs trounced Panhandle, 35-14. The Bulldogs' second-half strength was too much for the Aggies, as Freeman flung two passes for TD's to Rose and Bailey. Bailey also scampered into the end zone for another score, as did halfback Larry Smith. A Lynn Alexander aerial to Joe Bieger TD pass gave the 'Dog victory its finishing touches. Alexander added all five conversion attempts.

In a non-conference match, the Bulldogs whipped Eastern New Mexico, 21-6. Fullback Dillman figured in all three TD's, two coming on passes from Freeman, the other as Dillman crashed through the Greyhound defense.

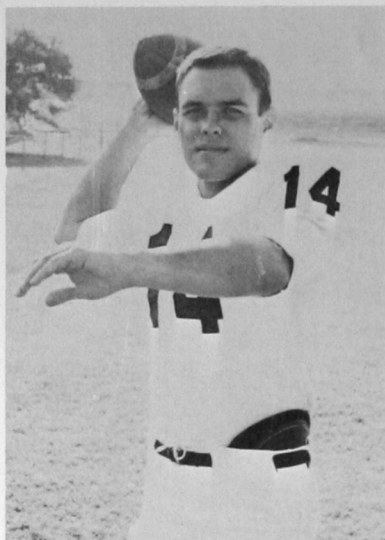
The Bulldogs notched their sixth straight victory in a row in a hard-fought battle by edging Langston, 14-13, for second place in the conference. Playing a key role in the victory were five enemy passes picked off by the Bulldog defense to kill any sustained Lion drives. Randle scored the first Bulldog tally, and a Freeman-to-Rose pass play brought the other.

The Bulldog victory streak was stopped abruptly at the season's end by Tarleton State, 43-7, in a non-conference game. Halfback Charles Randle was the only Bulldog to put the 'Dogs on the scoreboard.

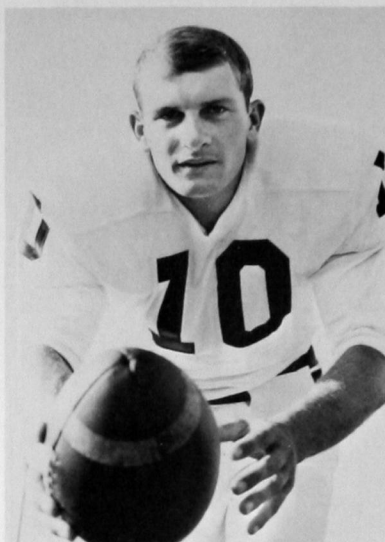

In the Homecoming game, halfback John Bailey charges up the middle against the Aggie defense as Mike Blaser (71) comes up to throw a possible block.

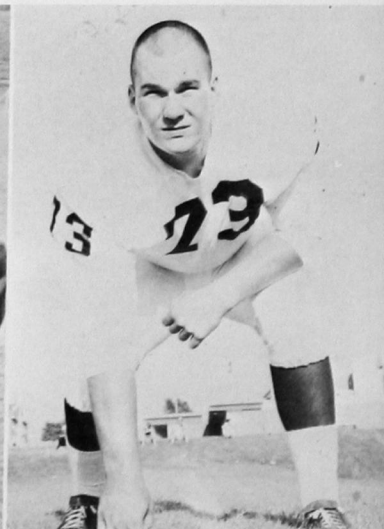
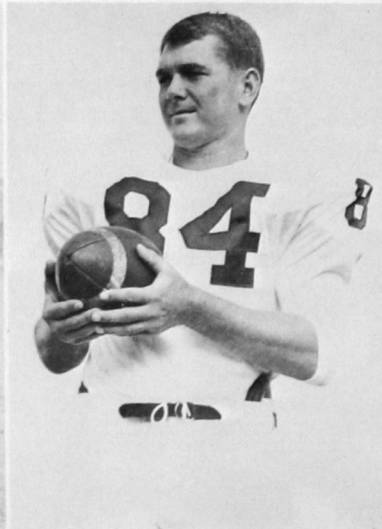

Bulldogs Share Conference Championship

Southwestern finished the 1966-67 year by compiling a 22-5 record overall, and finished with a 16-2 record in the tough Collegiate Conference to earn a tie for first place.

The Bulldogs opened the season by taking a non-conference game from Santa Fe, 75-56, to start an eight-game winning streak. In their second game the Bulldogs handed the Mexican Olympic team a 65-50 setback.

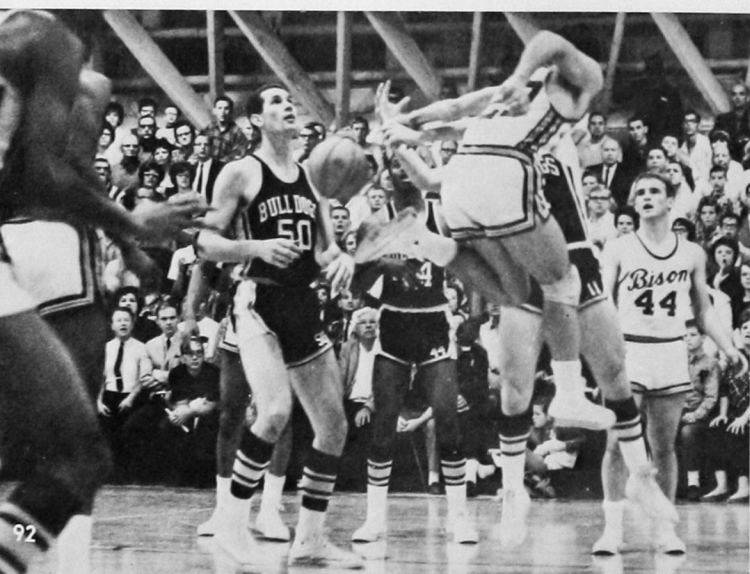
Southwestern then ran its high-scoring machine at

full throttle by scoring a 107-92 trouncing of Fort Hays State, then proceeded to whip East Central, 98-56, in the conference lid opener. The Bulldogs then tangled with Southeastern, as they nipped the Savages, 46-44, in a tight defensive battle.

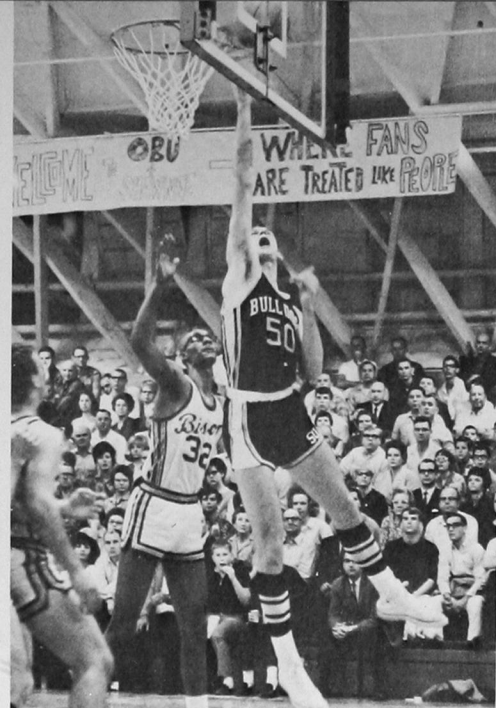
Langston University was the next Bulldog victim, as the 'Dogs gave the Lions a 114-86 lashing. Six Bulldog players scored in double figures. The Red-men of Northeastern tried to slow the Bulldog scoring machine, but they too fell short by a 57-46 score. Southwestern racked up another conference win by defeating the Northwestern Rangers, 67-57, to take sole possession of first place.

The win streak was stopped abruptly when Fort Hays, a non-conference foe, upset the 'Dogs, 71-66. However, Southwestern continued its winning ways by thumping Northwestern, 93-57, in the finals of the Top of the Nation tournament at Alamosa, Colorado, to bring home the tourney trophy.

The Bulldogs ran away with a first-round win as they defeated Southern Utah, 79-49. The second round in the tournament was rougher going, as the Bulldogs edged out Illinois State by 87-85. The Bulldogs recorded their twelfth victory by handing College of Santa Fe its second defeat from the Bulldogs.

Finish Season 22-5

Southwestern lost its first conference game and a hold on first place in the battle of the unbeaten against OBU and lost by an 87-76 upset. The Bulldogs bounced back by licking a good Central State team, 65-61, to regain a tie for first after OBU lost the same night. Northeastern came back for revenge from an earlier loss, as the Redmen scalped the Bulldogs, 66-65, to put a slight dent in the Bulldog title hopes.

The Bulldogs strengthened their hold on second place by whipping Northwestern, for the third time, 93-76. Phillips gave the Bulldogs a scare as they lost by a slim three-point margin, 59-56. Langston also fell before the Bulldog victory machine, 74-67, as did Panhandle by an 82-60 score, to set up another showdown battle, with OBU holding down first place and Central State in third place in the conference.

Before an overflow crowd, the Bulldogs pulled one out of the fire by edging OBU, 63-62. Playing the next night in another tough contest of a must weekend, the Bulldogs again defeated the Central State Bronchs, 73-70. The Bulldogs, looking to a first-place finish in the Collegiate Conference, blasted East Central, 78-59, and narrowly escaped upset-minded Southeastern in overtime, 75-71.

The Bulldogs closed out the season with a conference record of 16-2, for a tie with OBU as Collegiate Conference Co-Champions.

The Bulldogs season ended as they were stopped in the NAIA playoffs. OBU victimized the Bulldogs twice, by the scores of 76-64 and 89-70. The Bulldogs were rated second, third, and fourth throughout the season by the NAIA national polls.

Archie McGill and Bert Rickner were selected to the Collegiate All-Conference first team and Lloyd Lacy was named to the second team. Head coach Jerry Jobe will have everyone back for next year's basketball season.

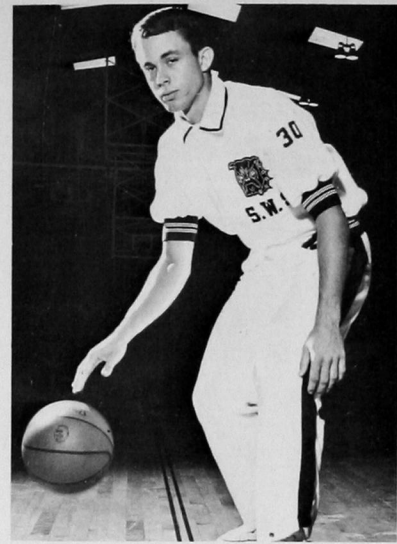

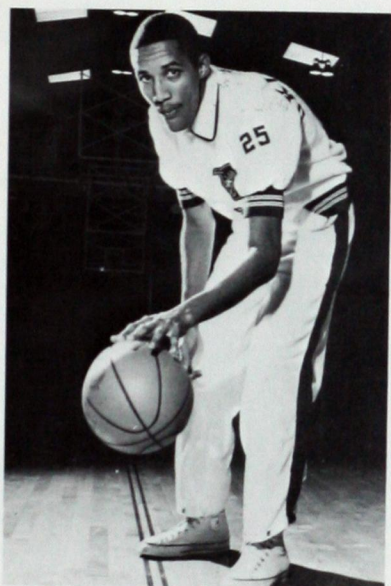

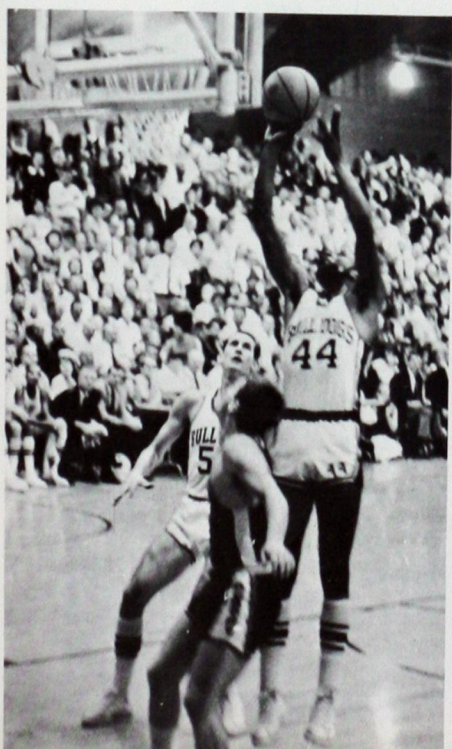

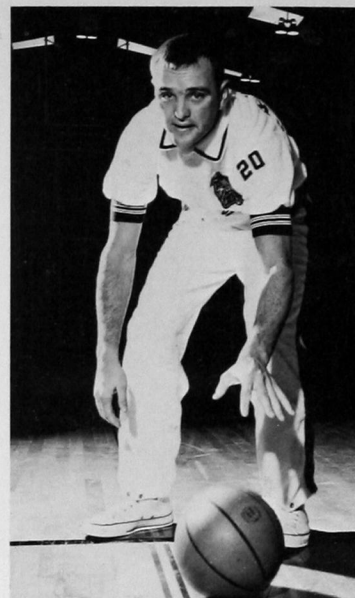

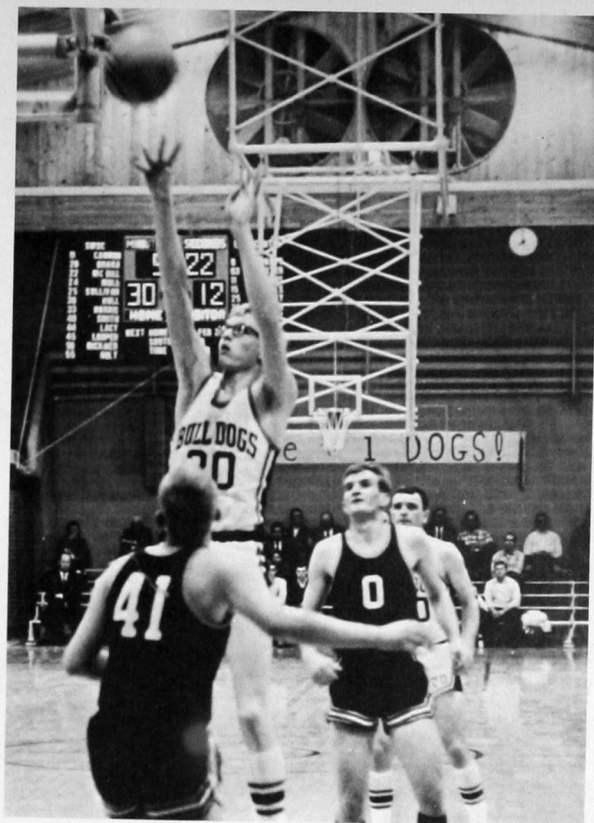

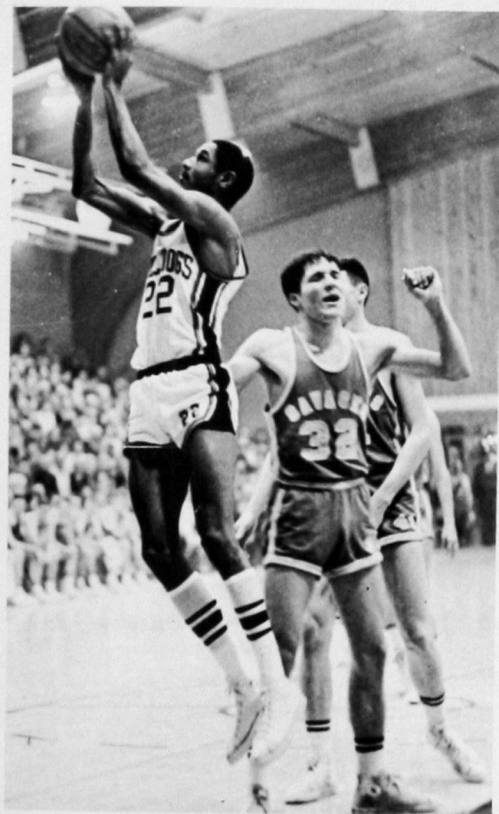

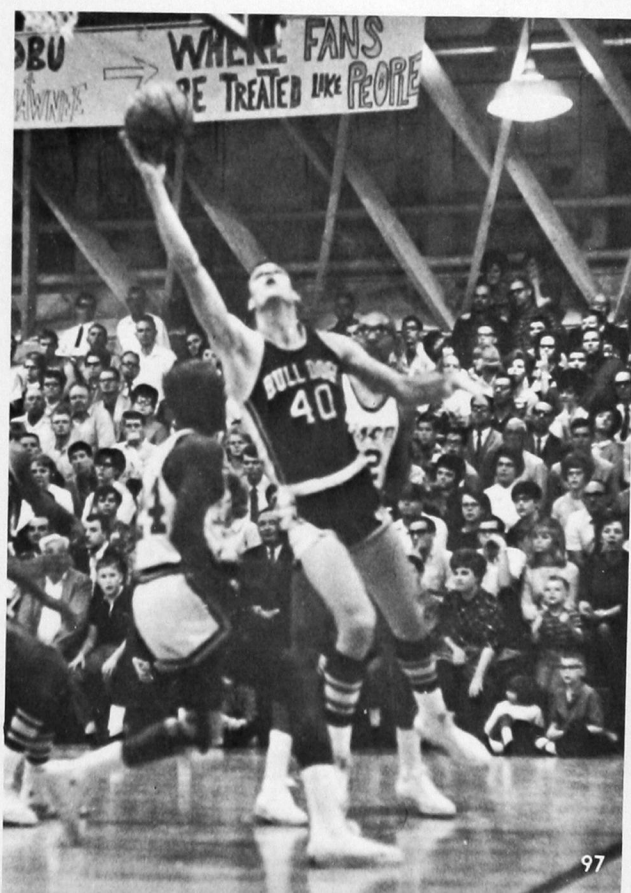

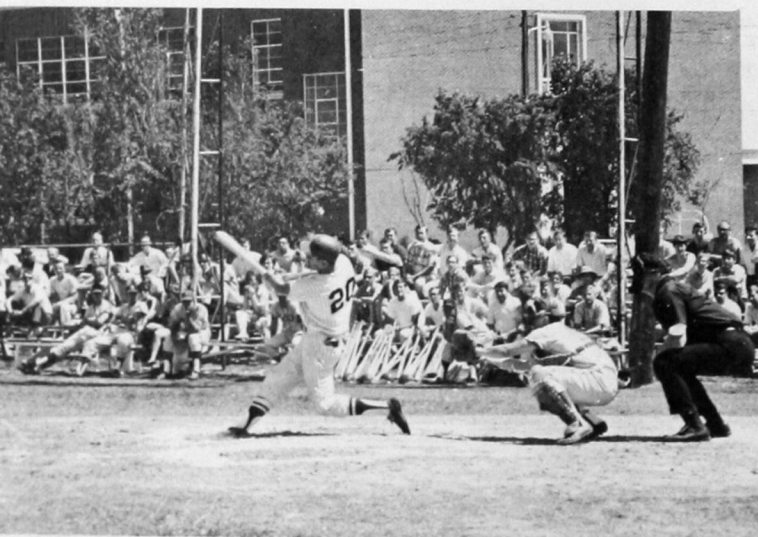
Bulldog Nine Wins Conference Championship

The Southwestern baseball team opened the season late because of basketball and dropped three out of its first four games, but finished fast by compiling a 20-9 record and winning the Collegiate Conference championship.

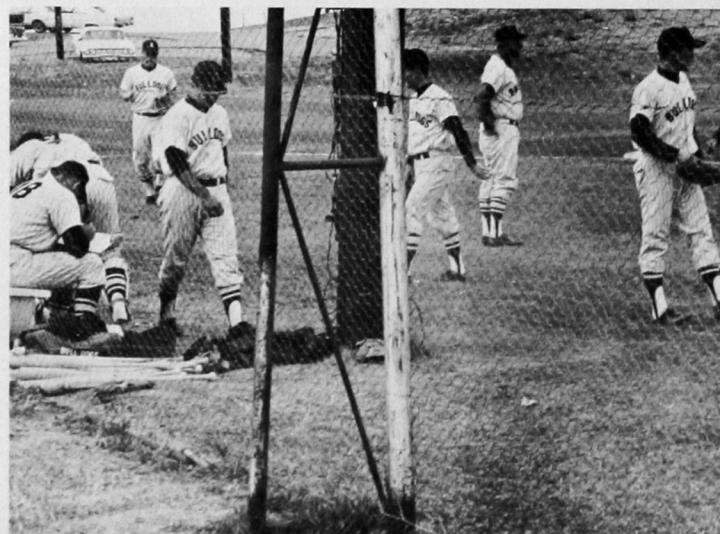
Kearney State of Nebraska dealt the Bulldogs a double loss, 4-0, 7-2. The Bulldogs got into the win column by taking a 2-0 decision from OBU in the first game, but dropped the second, 6-3. In their first western division conference games of the season, the Bulldogs swept a doubleheader from

Central, 10-2, 7-2, to start a seven-game winning streak. The Bulldogs whipped West Texas State in two non-conference tilts, 13-3, 7-2. However, West Texas later came back to snap the Bulldog win string 7-6, after being bombed 17-6 in the first game.

Southwestern added another twin victory to its unblemished conference record of eight wins by downing Panhandle, 3-0, 4-2. The Bulldogs lost two out of their next five games, but still led the conference.

The biggest splurge of the season came at the tail end when the Bulldogs played seven games in five days, four being makeup games, and won six of them. The first two wins came when Central State was defeated in a doubleheader. The Bulldogs then locked in a doubleheader battle with Northwestern, splitting two games. The loss dropped the 'Dogs into a first-place tie with Phillips. Southwestern then went on to defeat Phillips, 7-2, for the western division championship.

OBU was the Bulldogs' next opponent in a three-game district playoff and conference championship series, in which the 'Dogs took the first two games in succession, 4-2, 7-1. This brought the Bulldogs the Oklahoma Collegiate baseball title.

The Bulldogs lost two games in the NAIA regional tournament to end the season at 20-9.



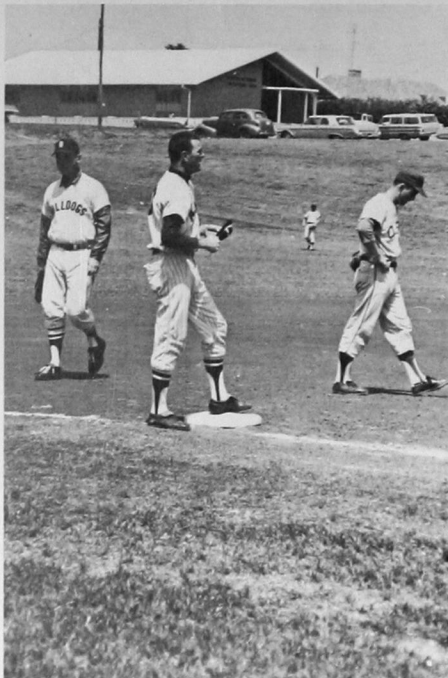

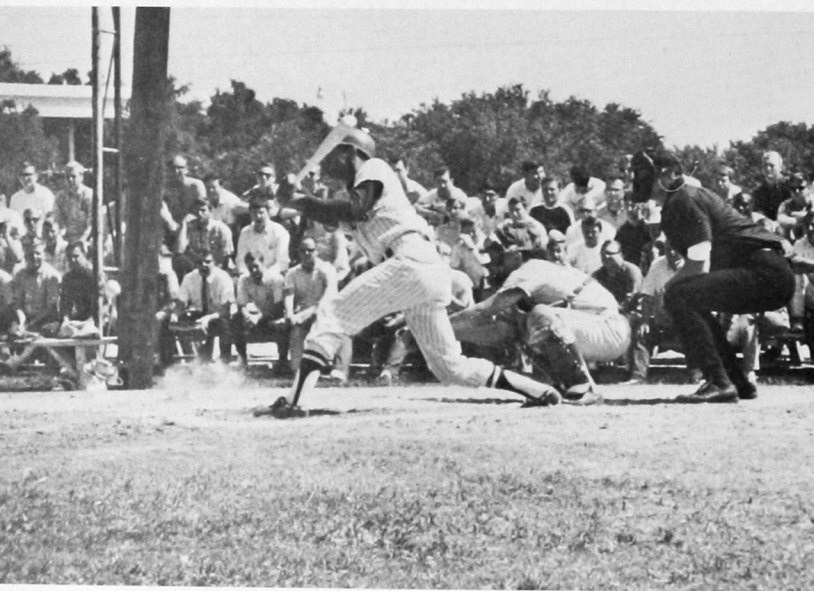

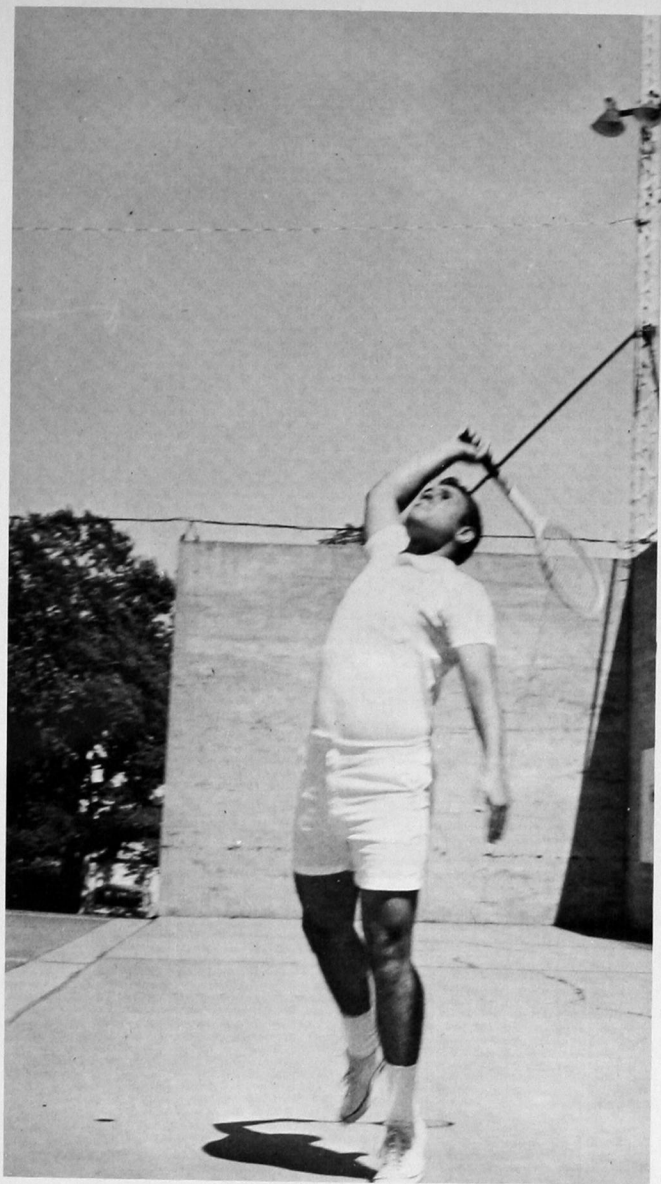

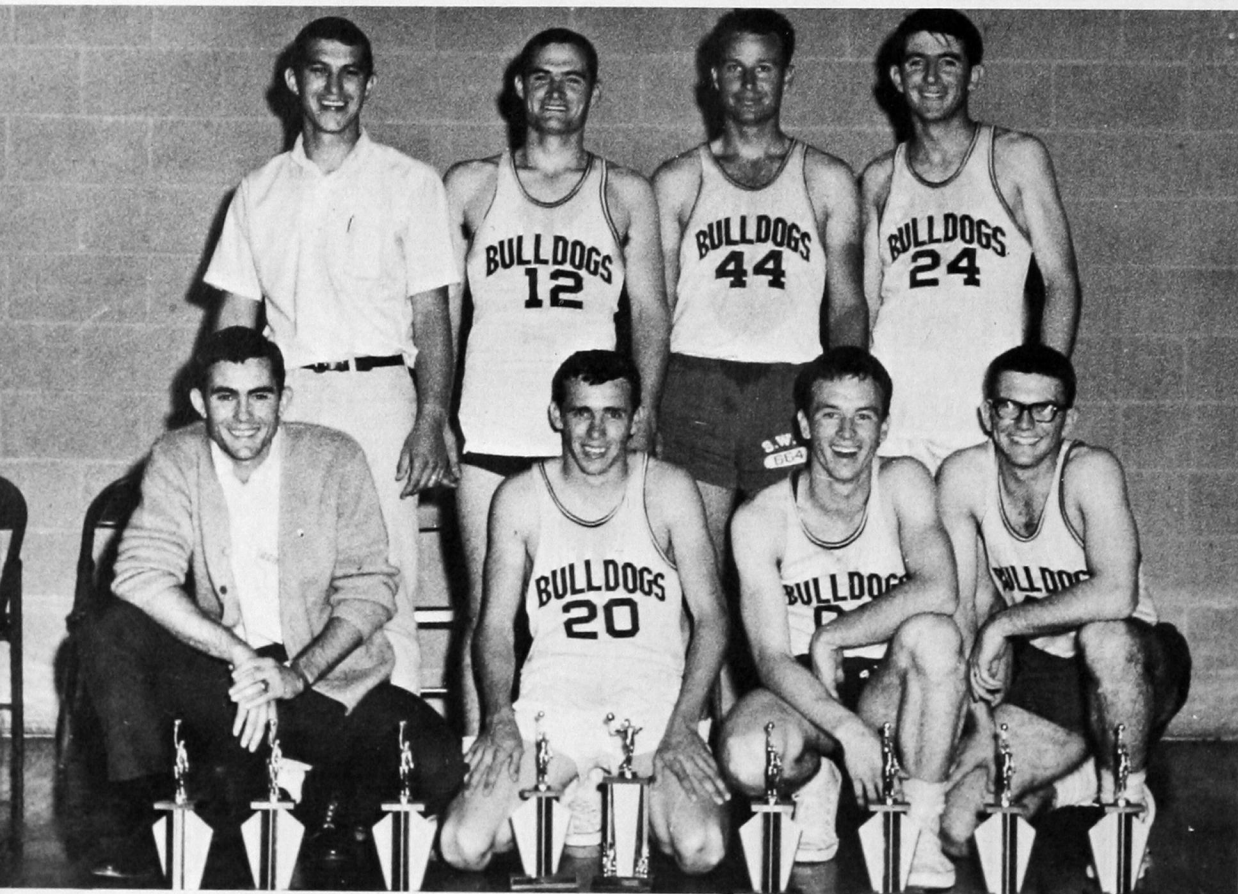

Duke Awards

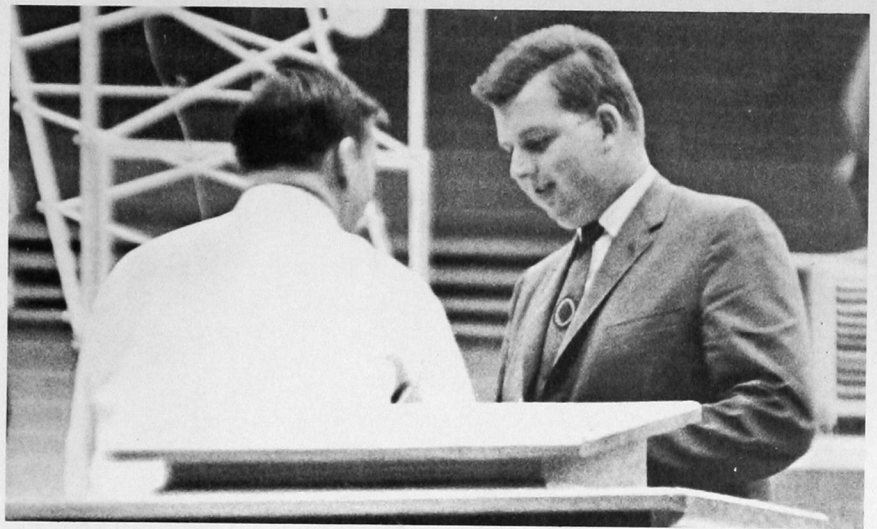

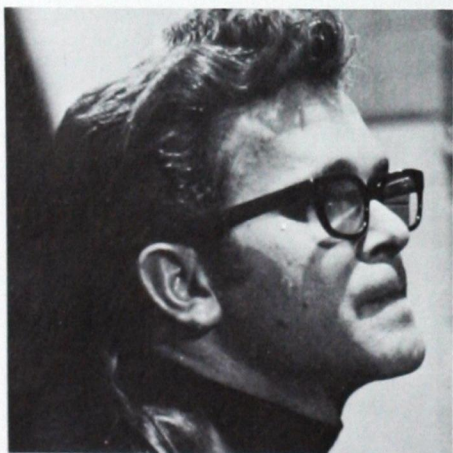
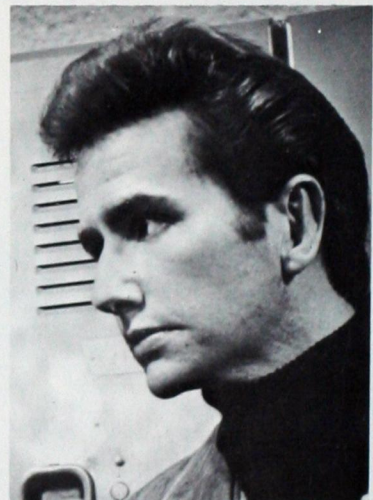
Southwestern Singers

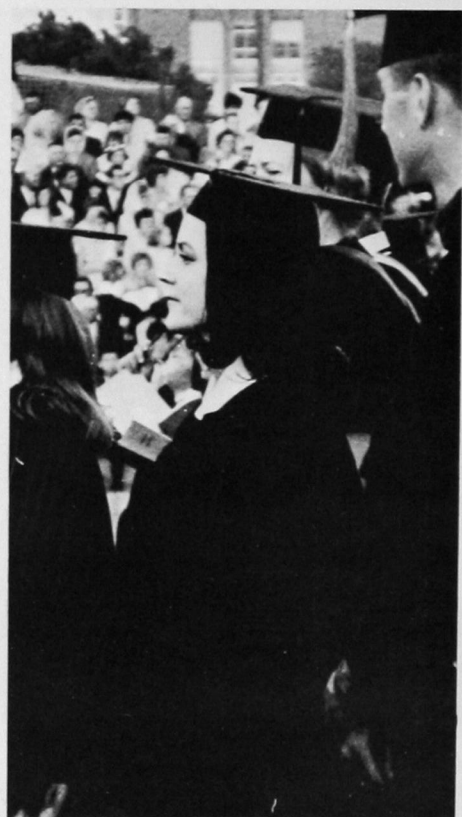
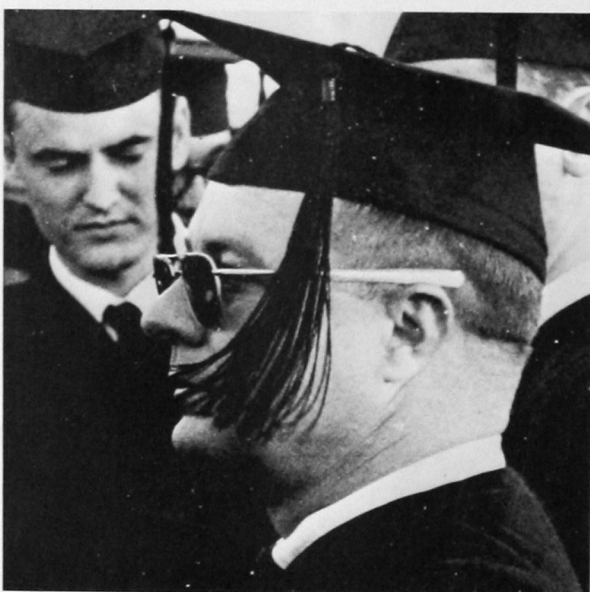

The colorful ceremony was a fitting climax to Southwestern's 1966-67 school year—a hectic year, but one of unparalleled growth and accomplishment.





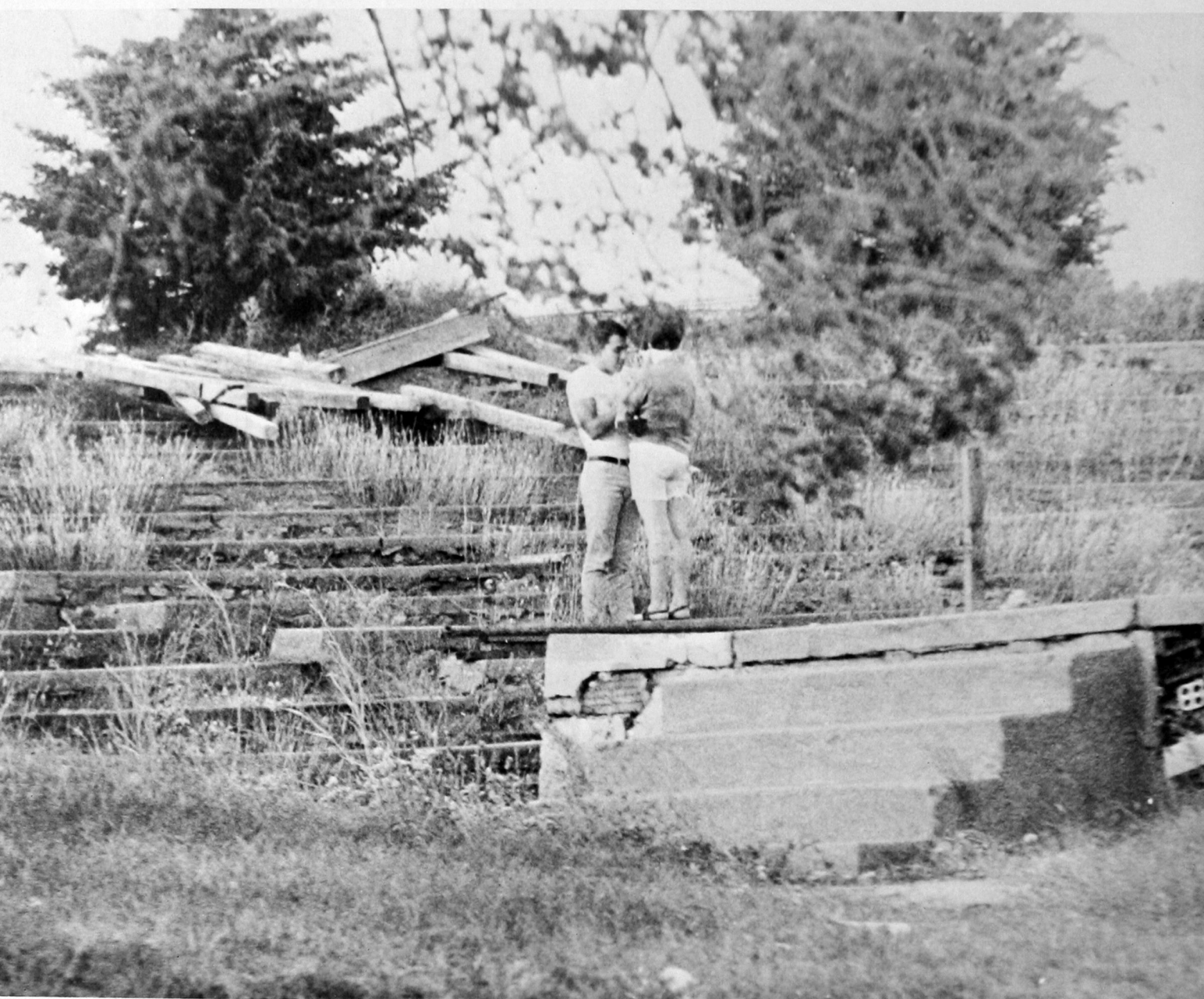


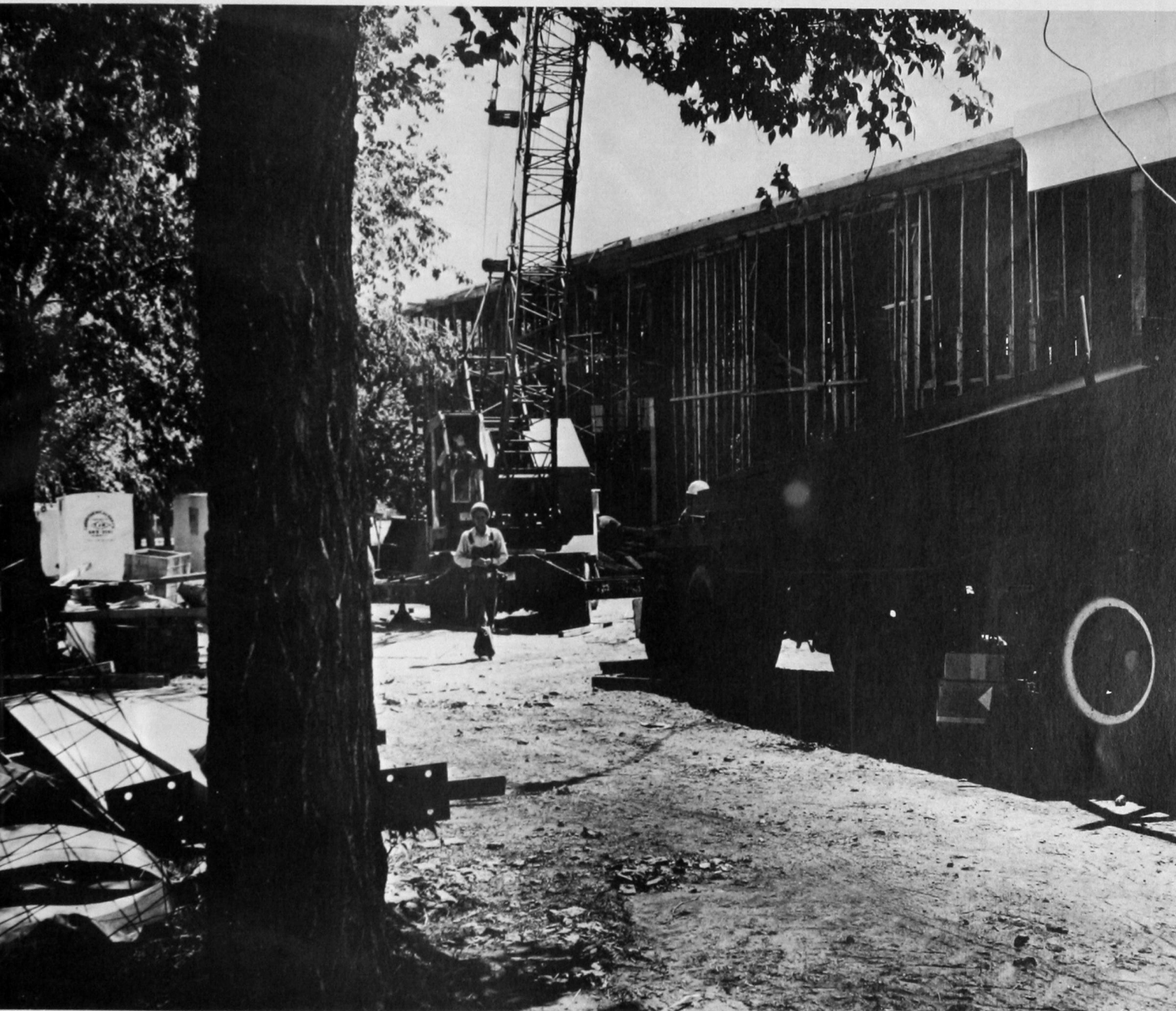
