Thirty-four seniors were named Who's Who at Southwestern this year, and automatically received listing in "Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges," a national publication.

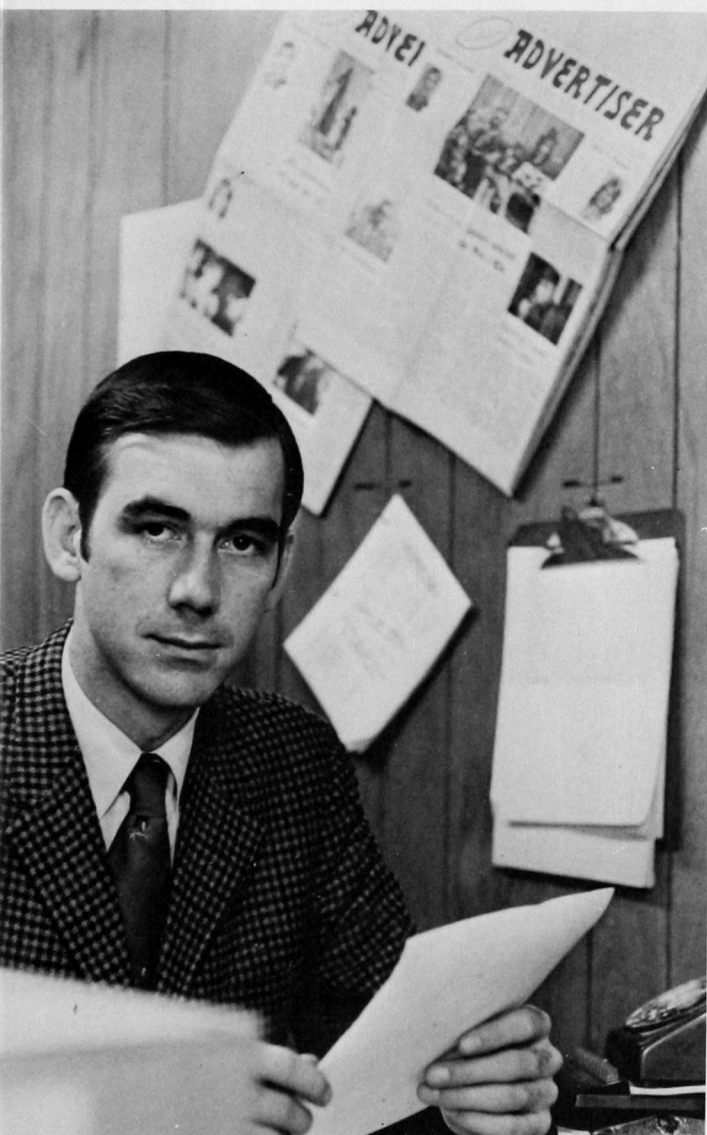
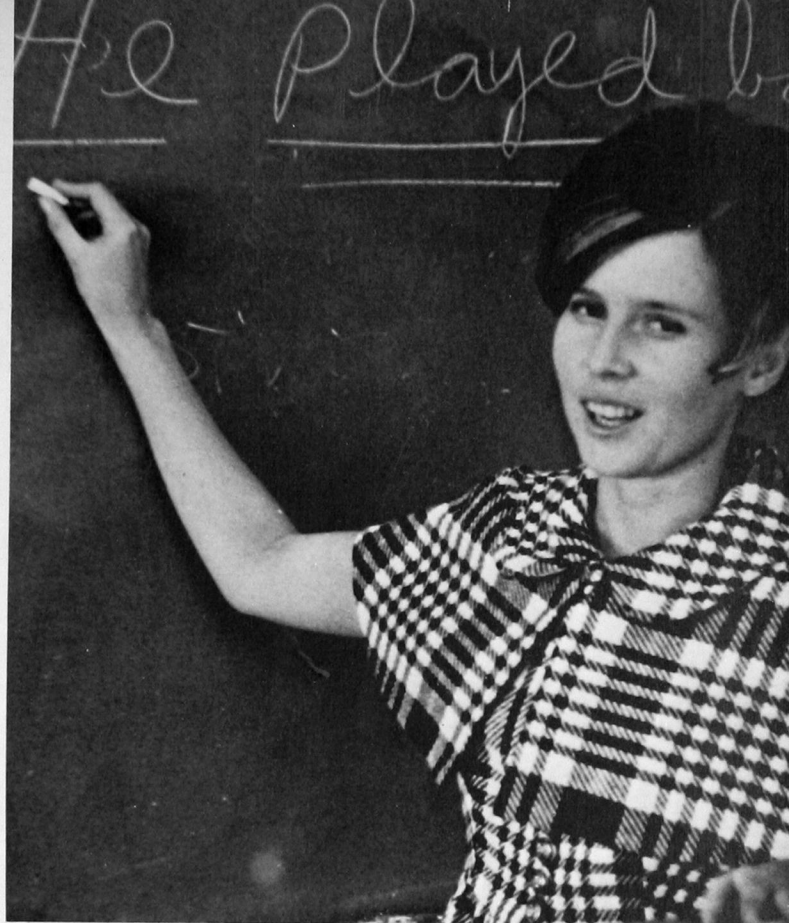
Students also gained the benefit of the publication's placement service which aided some in obtaining post-graduation employment and received a certificate at the annual Duke Awards assembly in May.

Each department on campus nominated three to five candidates, and a faculty committee appointed by the dean of the college made the final selection.

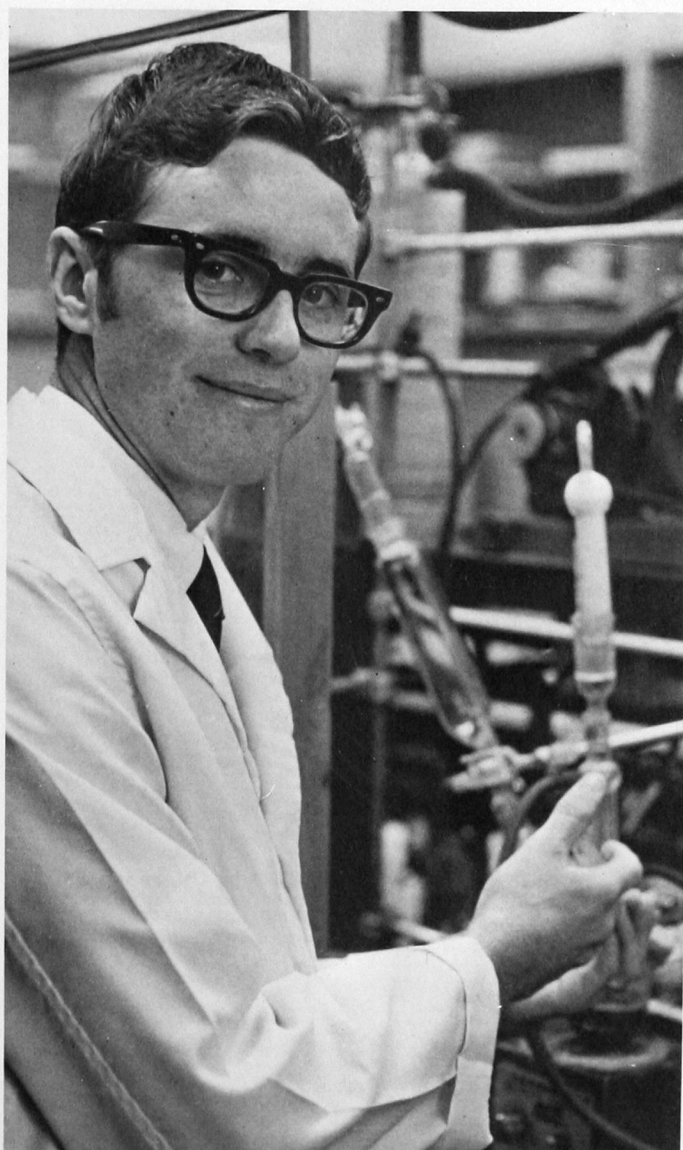

State Attorney General G. T. Blankenship was the principal speaker. He challenged violent dissent on campus, pointing to European universities and students who are limited in degree of dissent. He urged working for change from within the system.

Music was provided by the stage band during the one hour, 30 minute assembly.

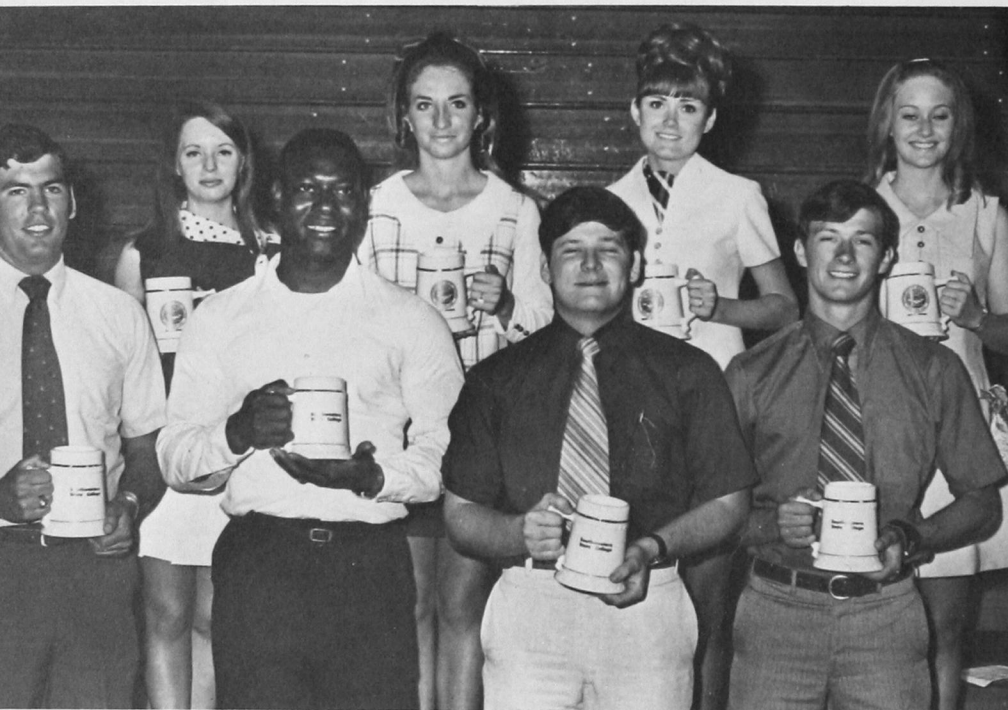

## 1970 BULLDOG Opens The Dawn of a New Era

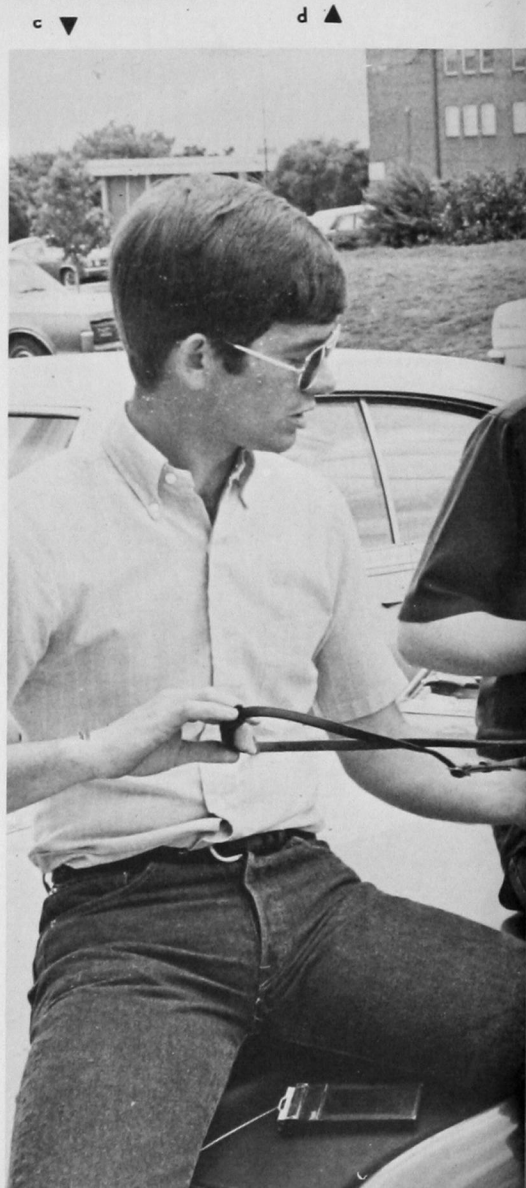

Candy Meyer and Toni Finrock helped immeasurably to meet our deadlines and turn them into lifelines.



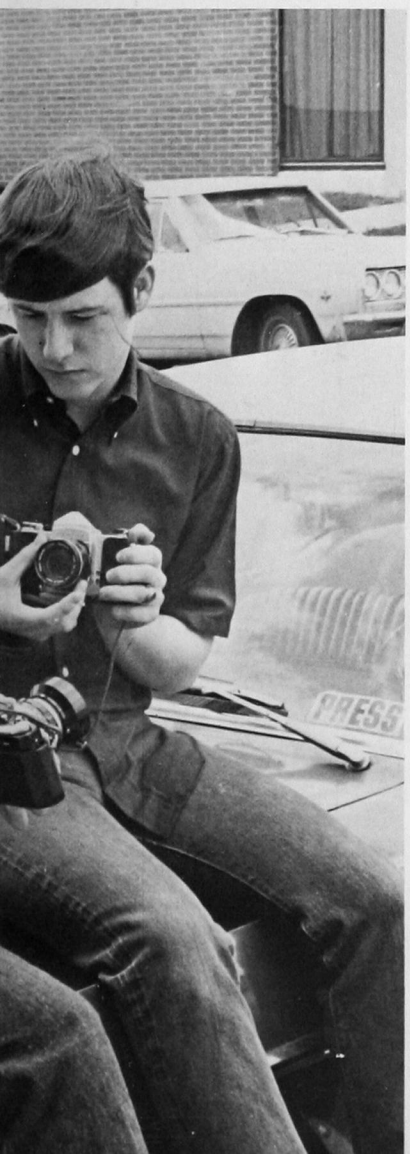


## Newspaper State's Best

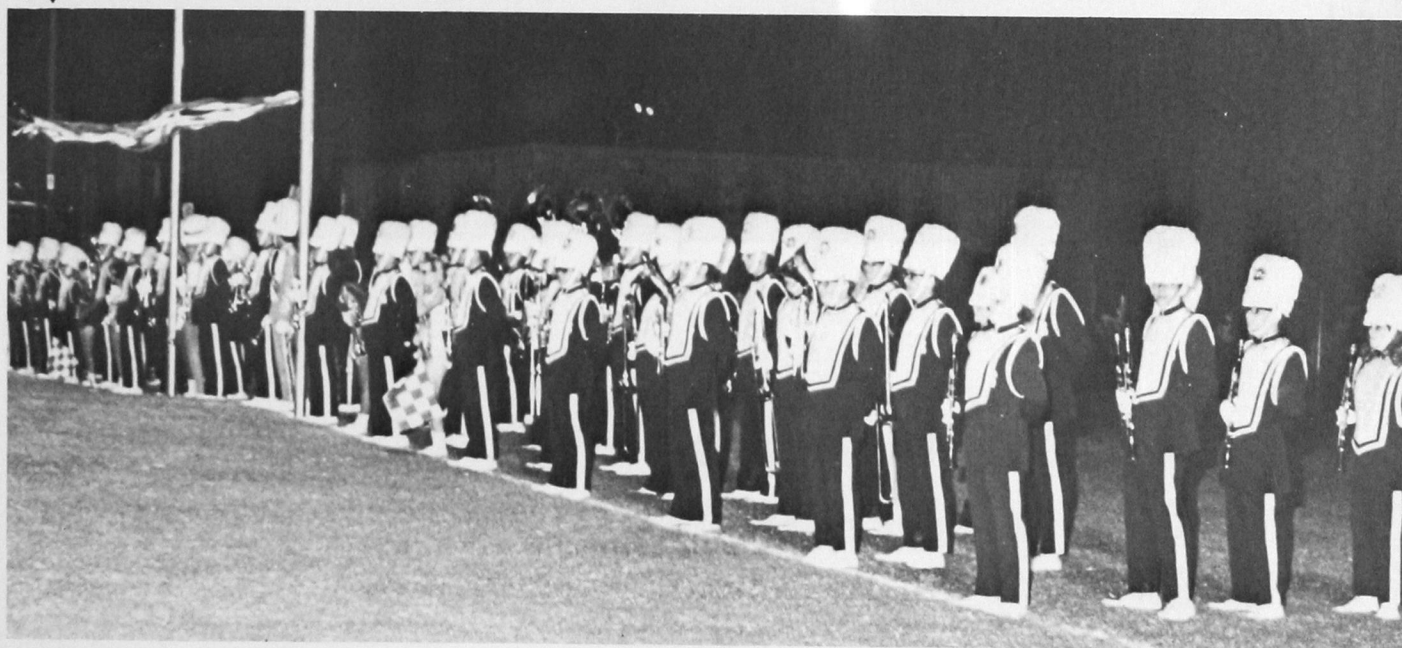

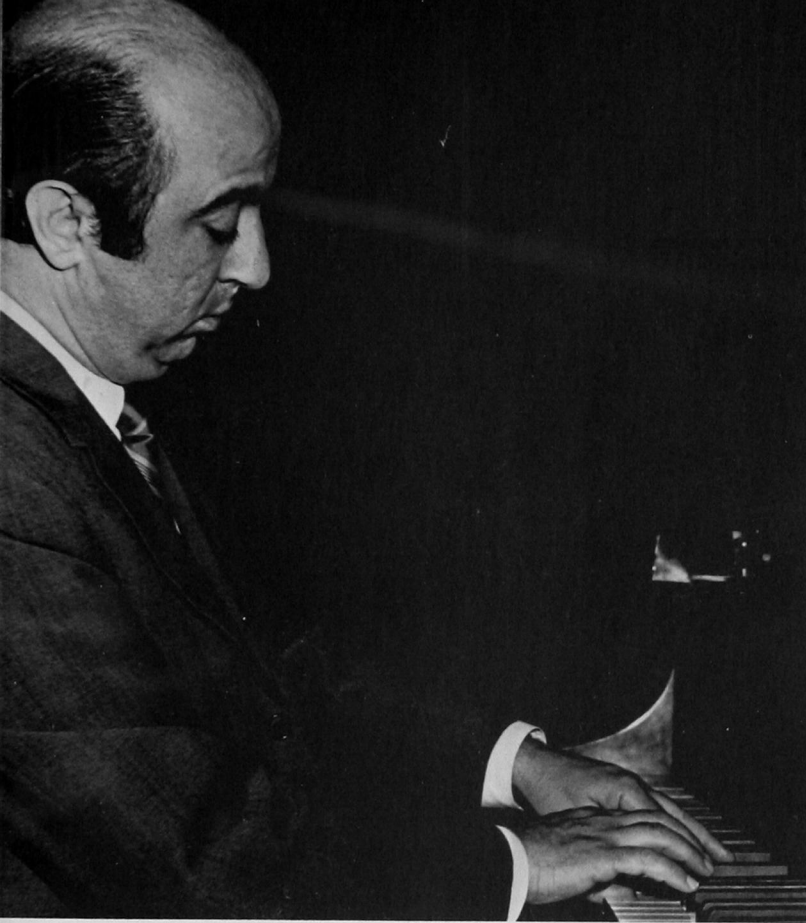

Southwestern Singers made three tours of area high schools and the Choraliers two. The groups also helped with state vocal contest hosted on campus.



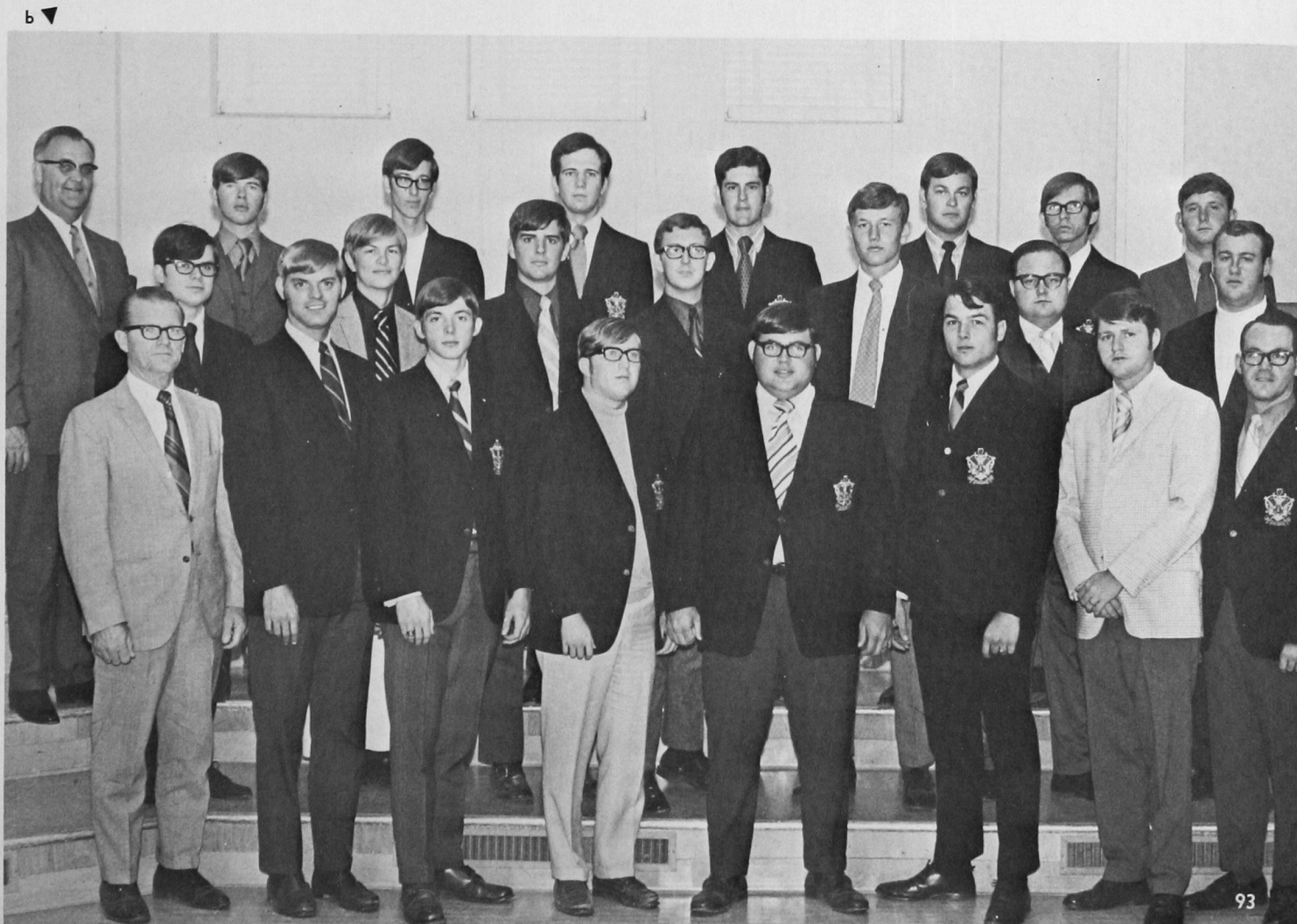
## Phi Mu Alpha Ushers, Sponsors Music Events

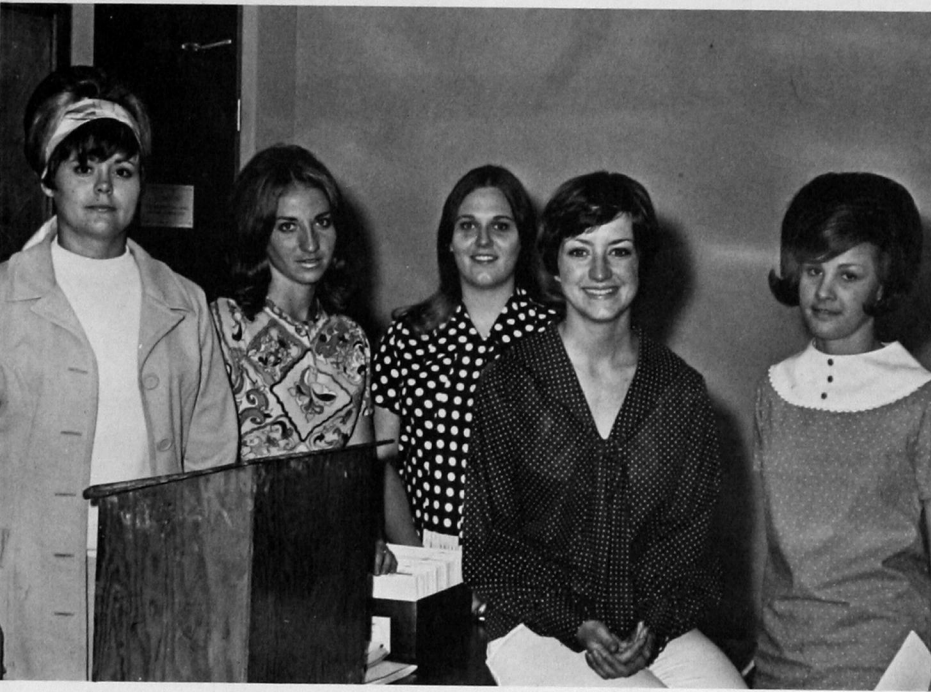

"To Thine Own Self Be True; Thou Canst Not Be False To Any Man" is the motto of Gamma Delta Kappa, women's honorary fraternity.

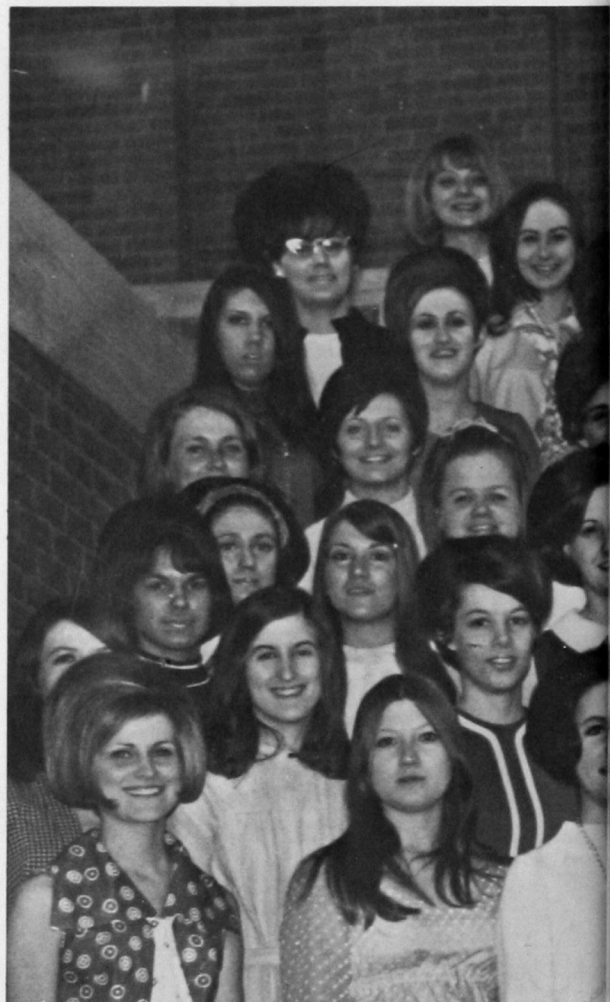
Approximately 140 members were required to maintain a "B" average or to have a sister or mother in the organization to be eligible for membership.

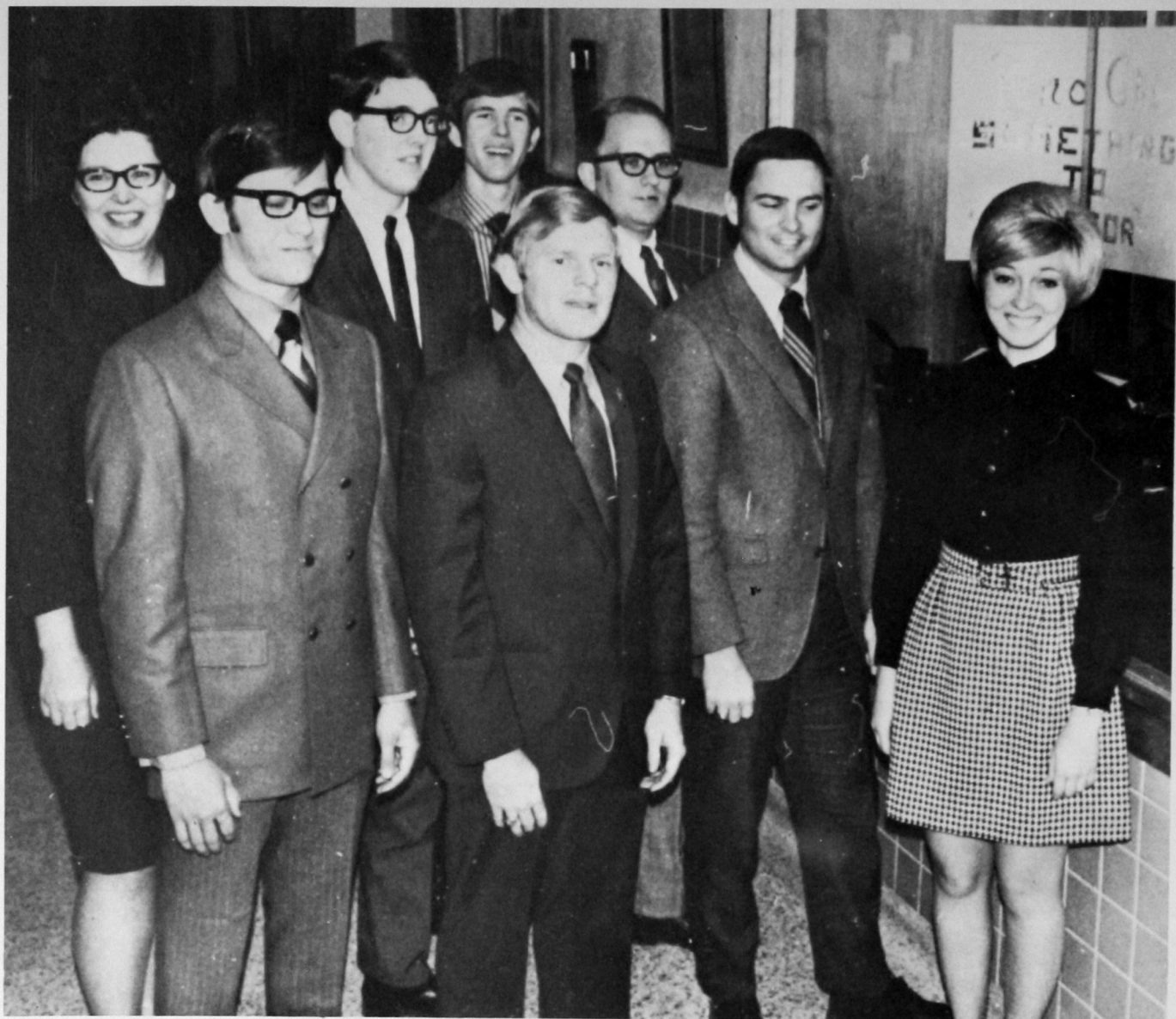

## Pharmacy Frat Installs Grad Chapter at Banquet

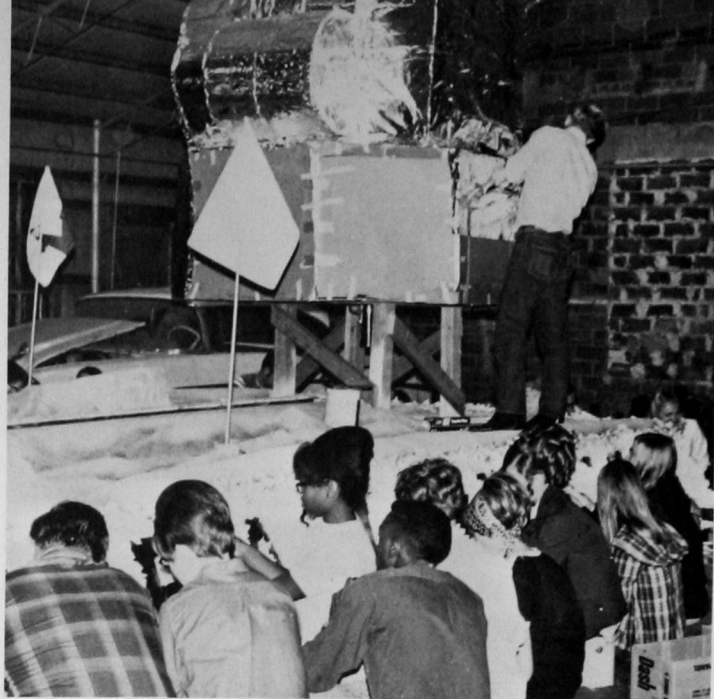

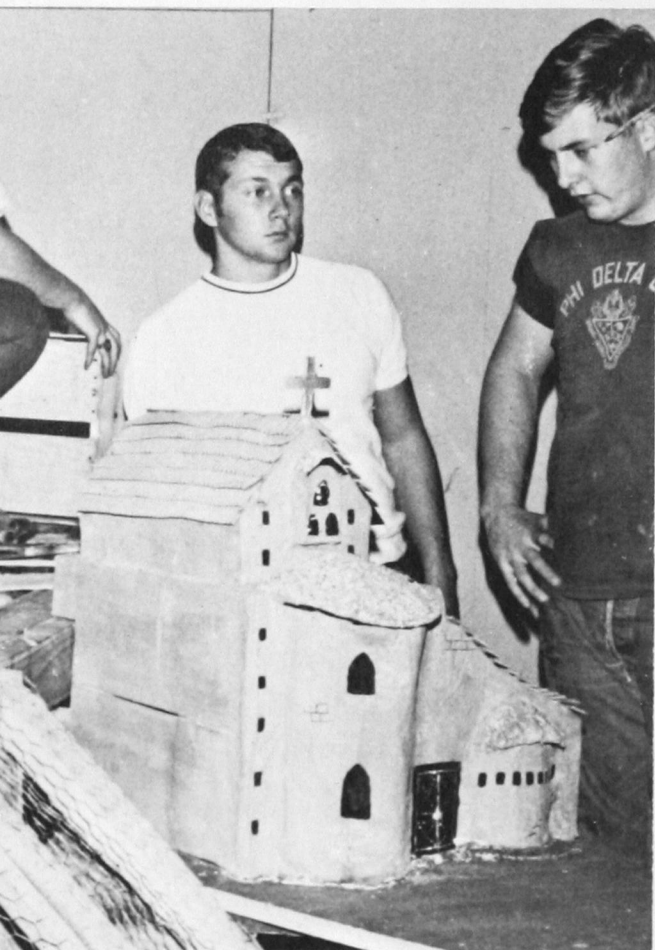

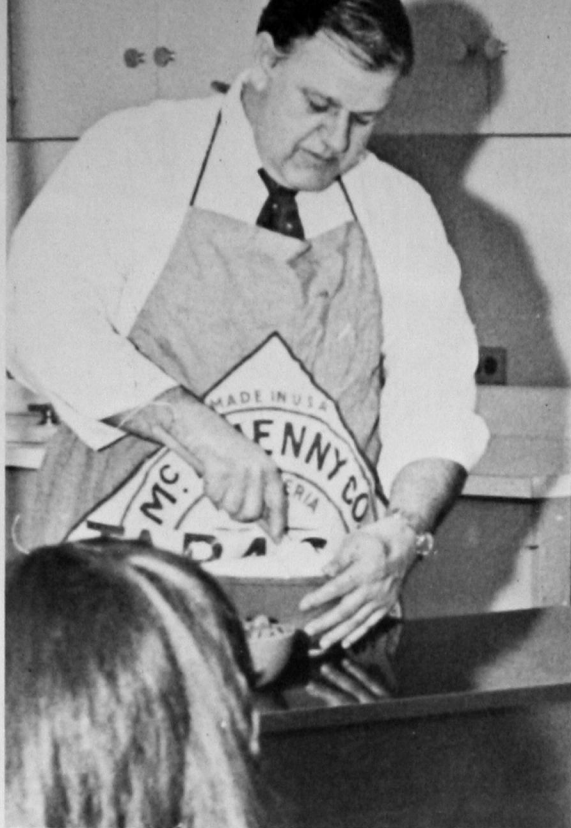
## Float Captures First For Home Ec Club

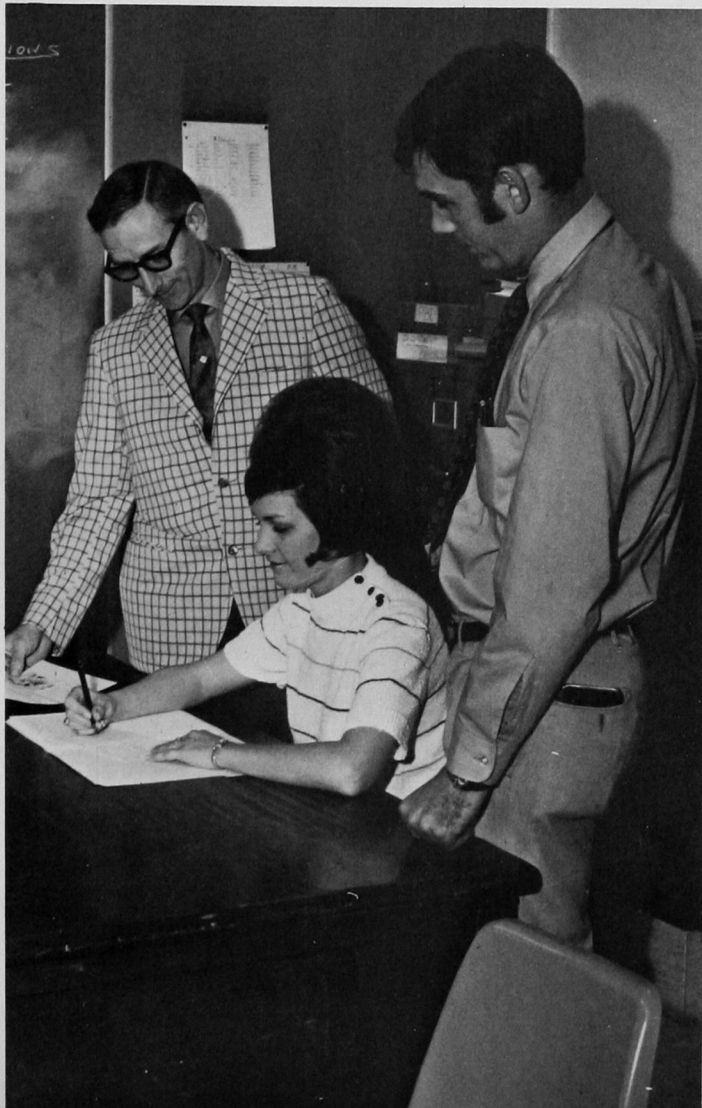

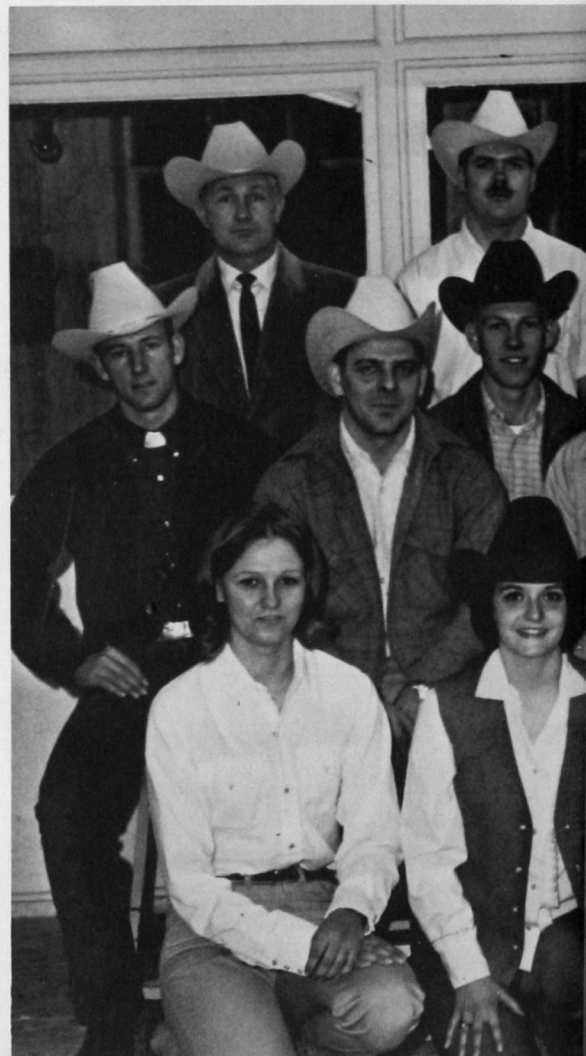
## Wranglers Competed in Regional Preliminaries

Southwestern Wranglers were a social group with a membership of 30 who had an interest in rodeo, horsemanship and western culture.

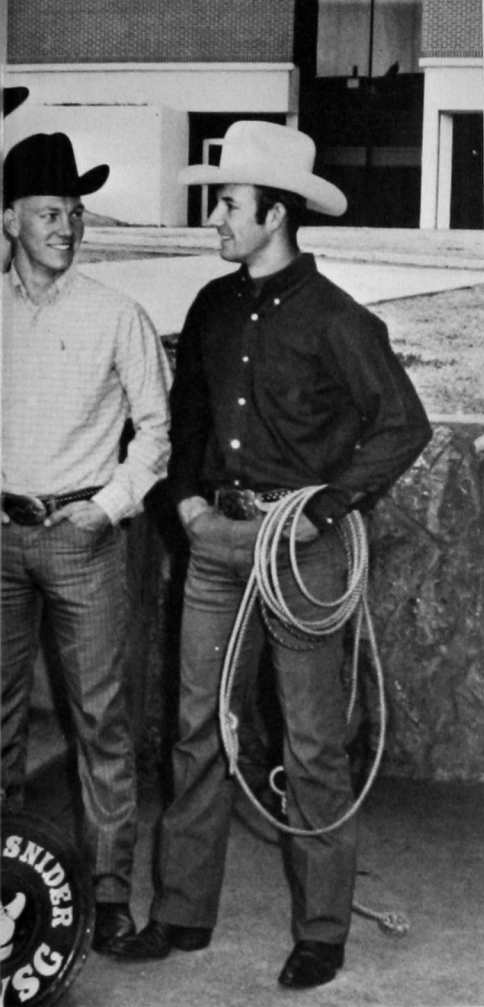

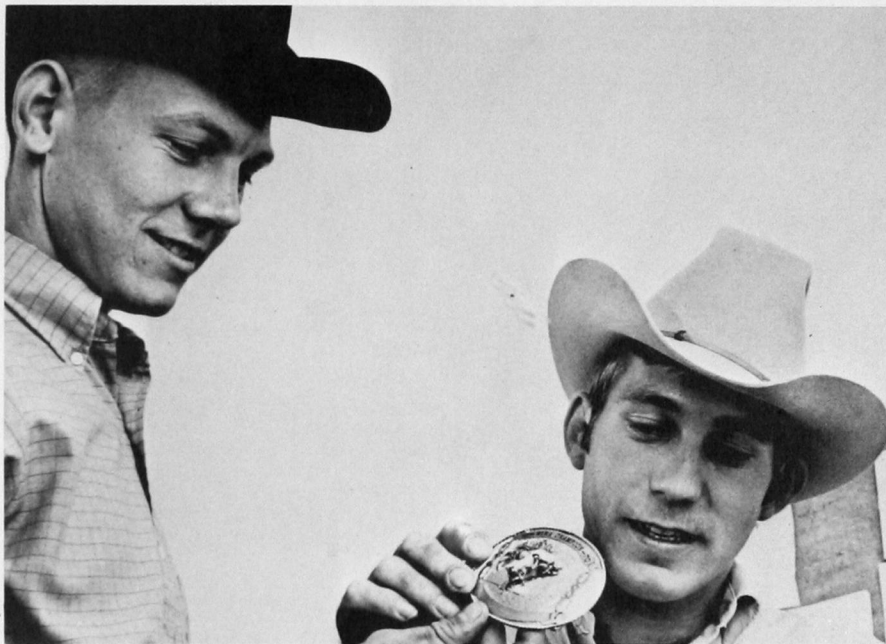

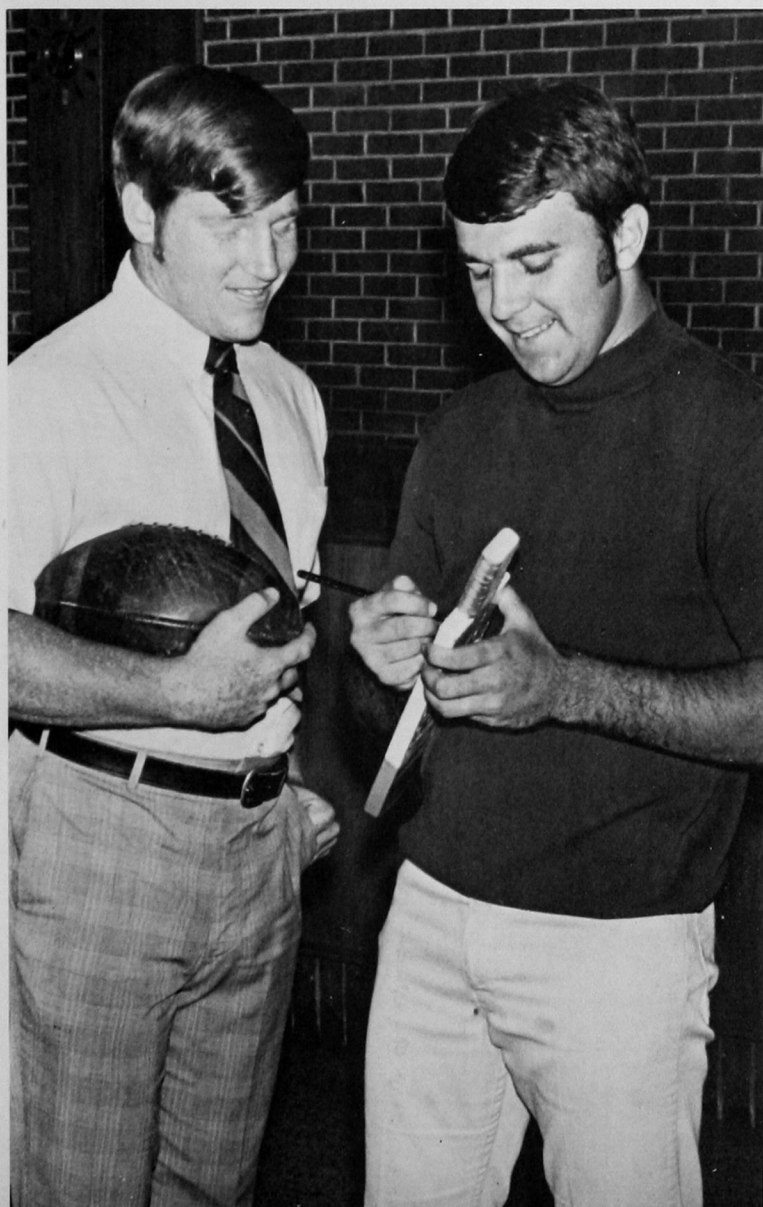

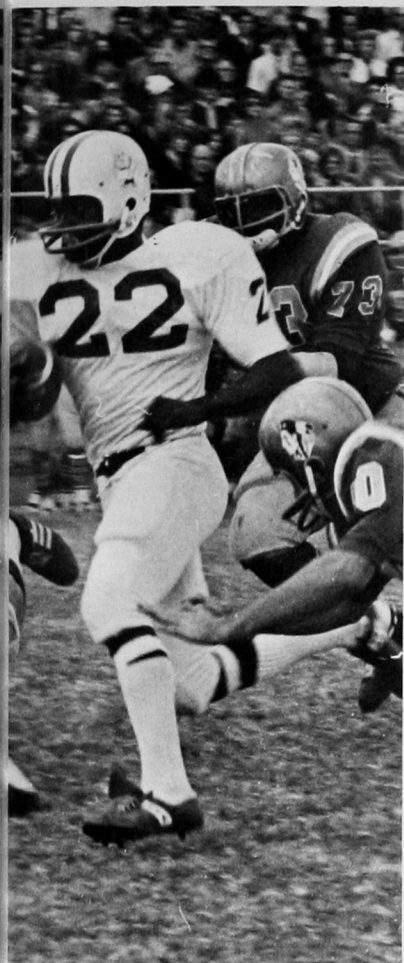

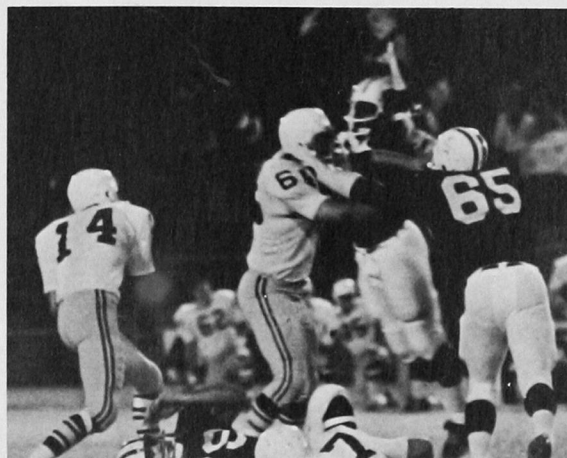

## One 1st Place Vote Bowl Bid Difference

With football madness gripping the autumn air with every Saturday game, Southwestern marched through its 10-game slate, narrowly missing a post-season bowl bid, and finished fourth in the final NAIA ratings.

Only one first place vote (Northeastern Coach Tracy Norwood would not give the 'Dogs his vote even though the Bulldogs defeated his team earlier) kept Coach O. T. Delaporte's squad from the four-team NAIA championship playoff.

It was a year that saw Southwestern improve with every ball game, winning the last three, 52-7, 56-0 and 66-0, and yet drop in the NAIA ratings from fifth to sixth to eighth each week, respectively.

But, despite the disappointment, the Bulldogs recorded their best record, 9-1, in over 20 years and tied for the conference crown with Northeastern State.

One point separated the 'Dogs from an undefeated season, a rain-dampened, 6-7, loss at Central State early in the year. Yet, the Blue-and-White might have been the best team in the country at the year's end.

The Bulldogs coupled an imaginative offense with a rugged, stingy defense, outscoring opponents,

34.6-5.7, and shutting our four foes enroute.

The year opened with Southwestern avenging a seven point defeat a year ago, crushing Sam Houston State's Bearkats, 31-0. Richard Henderson, Teddy Bentz, Gene Wilton, Jim Frazier and Hugh Monts scored touchdowns as the 'Dogs amassed 282 yards rushing and 117 passing.

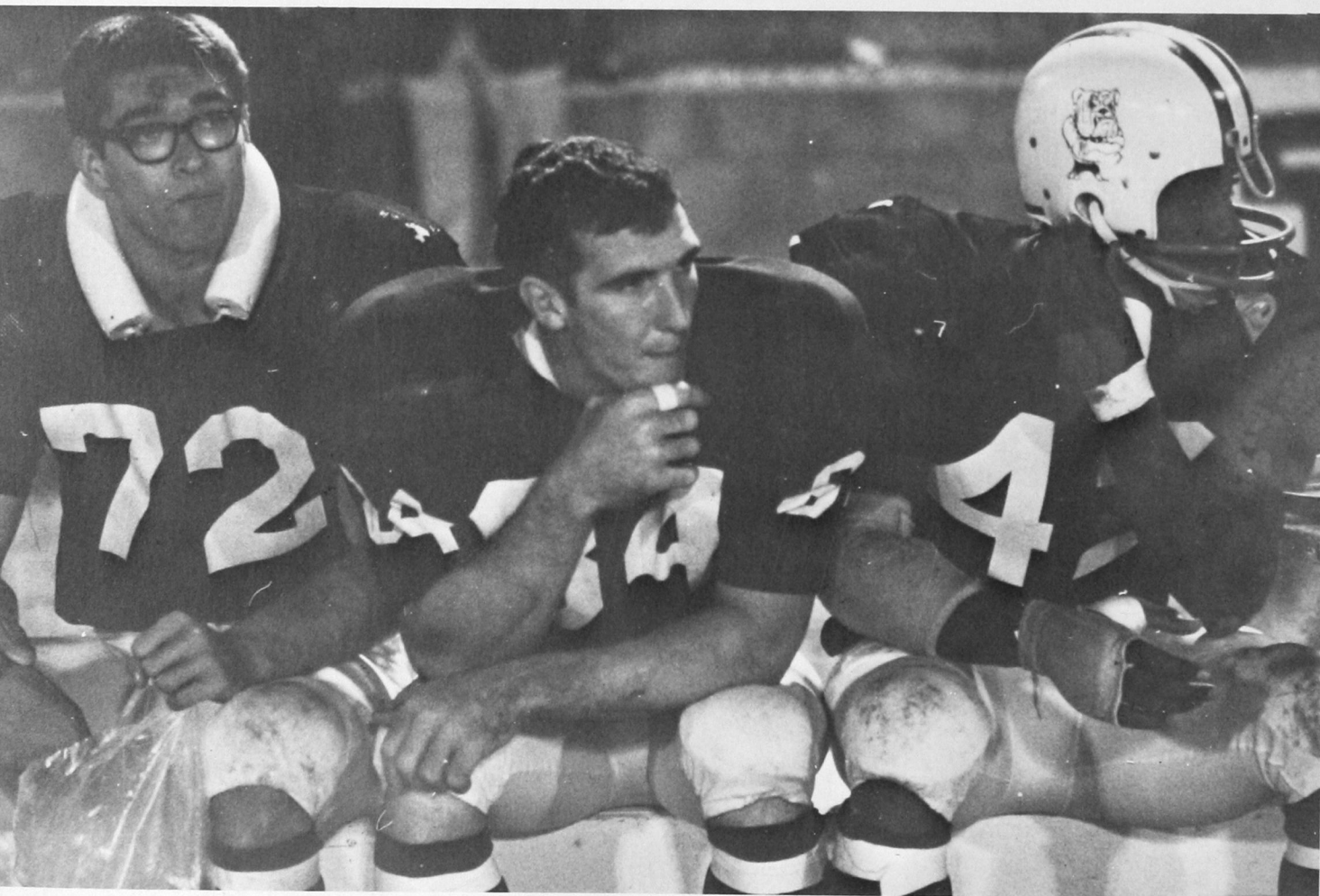
The stage was set for the conference opener. Coach Delaporte-coached teams hadn't beaten East Central in five meetings and Southwestern itself hadn't won in 10 years. But the Tigers hadn't counted on Charles Hicks who played his "best game as a collegian," rushing for 140 yards and scoring one touchdown on a 55-yard run. Henderson scored the other two touchdowns, on a 12-yard pass from Quarterback John Lombard who assumed the reigns when Starter Walt Covington was injured. The final score was 24-14 as Wilton hit three-of-three points-after-touchdown and one 27-yard field goal.

Northwestern almost proved more than the 'Dogs could handle in the third game. Superb defense, plus an 80-yard punt return by Monts, sparked a hardearned 21-0 victory.

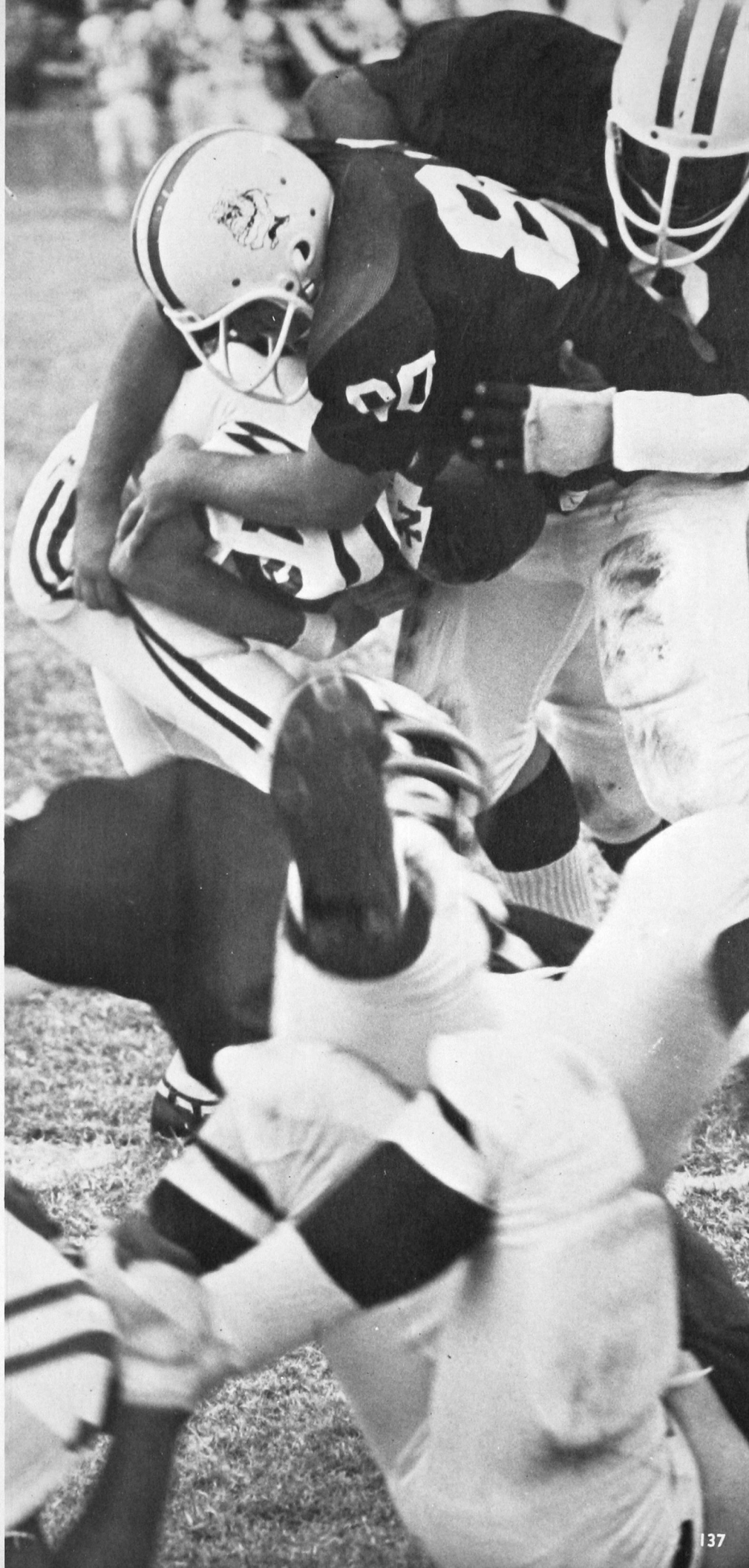

Heartbreak struck next as Central upset the 'Dogs applecart. Both teams scored in the first half as first fog and then rain kept the ball between 30-yard lines. Central drove 49 yards in 14 plays and Paul Hildendorf's PAT put the Broncos on the scoreboard first. Two plays later, Hicks brought the 'Dogs within one with a 78-yard burst off left tackle. Neither team could move in the second half as both teams tried to ground out victory by run.

Homecoming was the beginning of the Bulldogs rise to recognition as a superlative team effort startled previously-unbeaten and NAIA No. 2 ranked Northeastern, 22-15. Bentz, Frazier and Jim Calip scored for Southwestern and Wilton added a field goal as Queen Sue Jenkinson shouted her approval.

Then flexing their might, the Bulldogs really went to work, dumping unceremoniously their last five opponents: Southeastern, 40-7; Panhandle, 28-7; Tarleton, 52-7; Langston, 56-0, and Eastern New Mexico, 66-0.

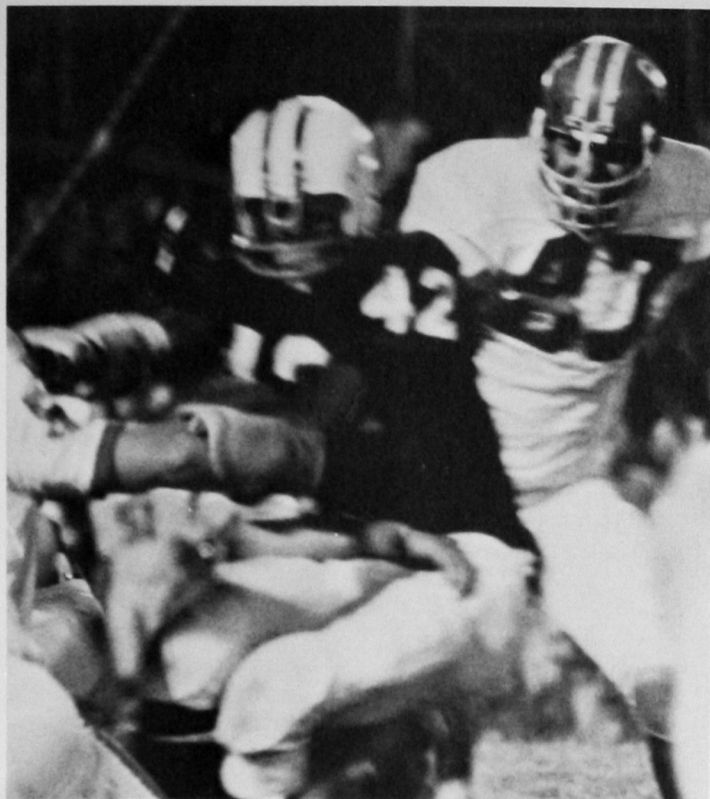

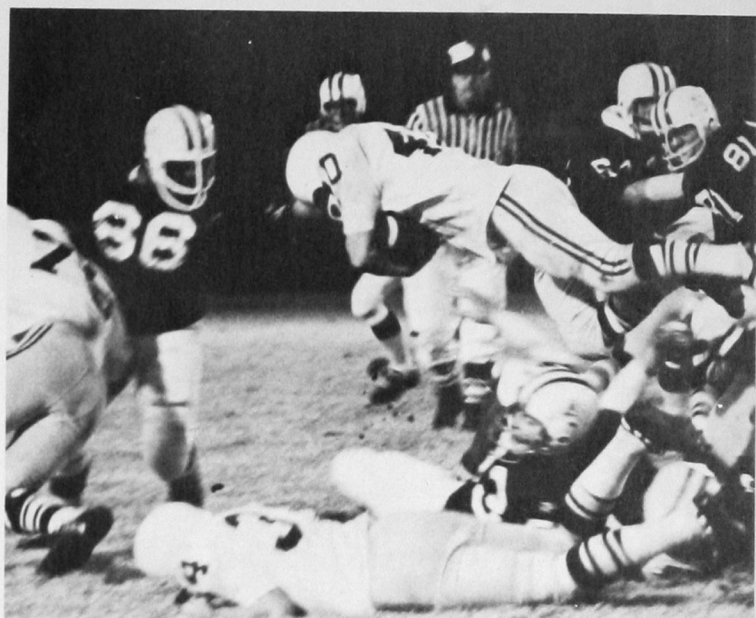

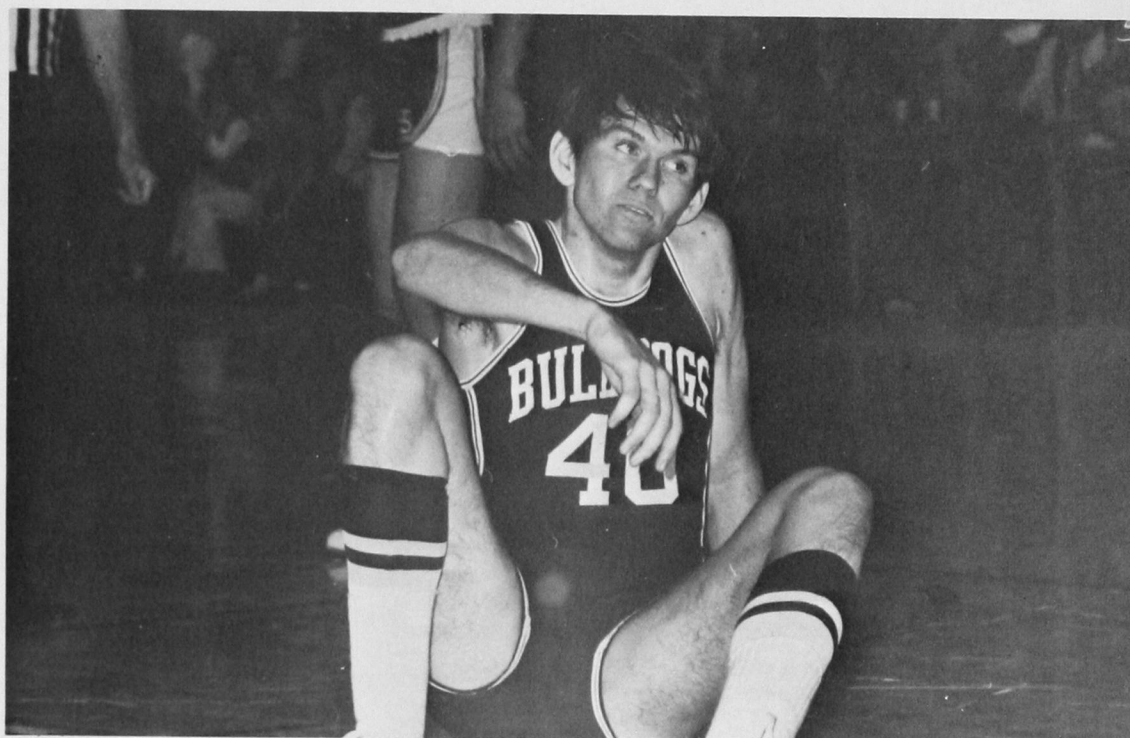

Southwestern's fortunes were as bouncy as a basketball during the 1969-70 cage season. Ten players shuffled in and out of the Bulldog lineup and were instrumental in reaching the District 9 finals and in finishing in a tie for third in the Oklahoma Collegiate Athletic Conference.

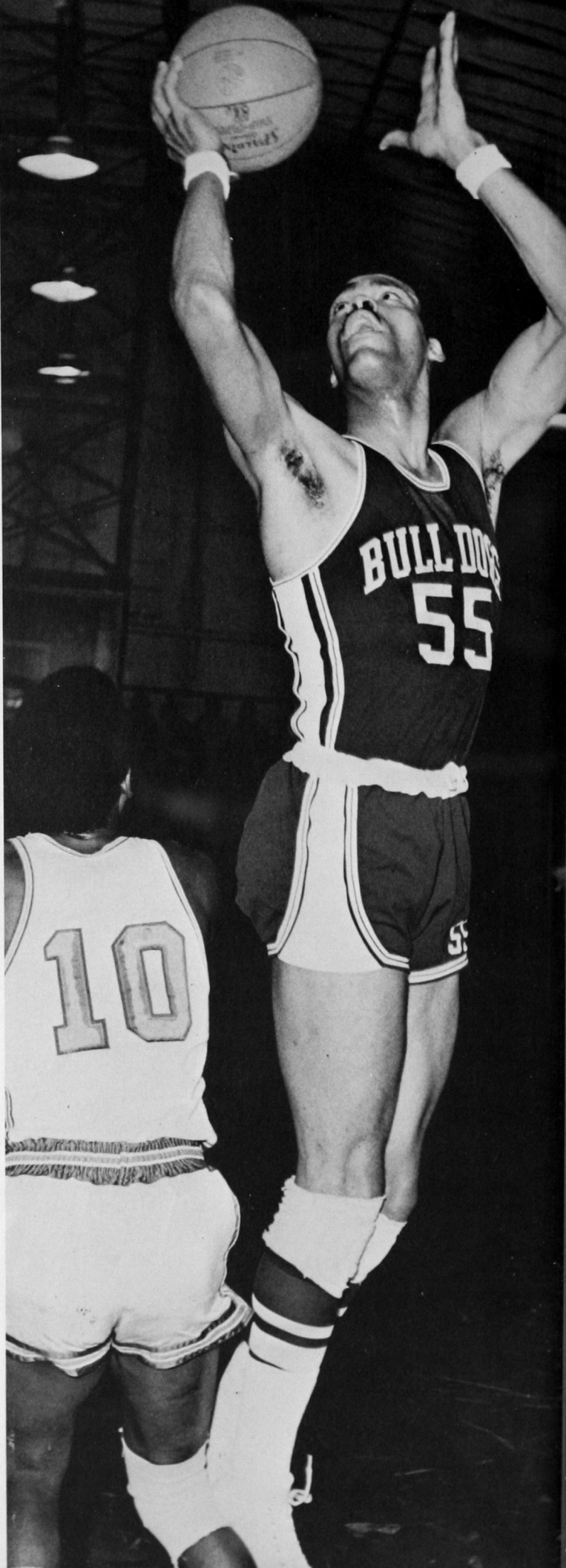
Coach Jerry Jobe's cagers, in what was termed a rebuilding year, finished 17-12 for the season and 13-7 in the conference. High points were three wins over Oklahoma Baptist University, one a 13-point victory in the first round of the District playoffs at Shawnee, a second place in the Kiwanis Tip-Off Tournament, and a gutty effort in the District finals.

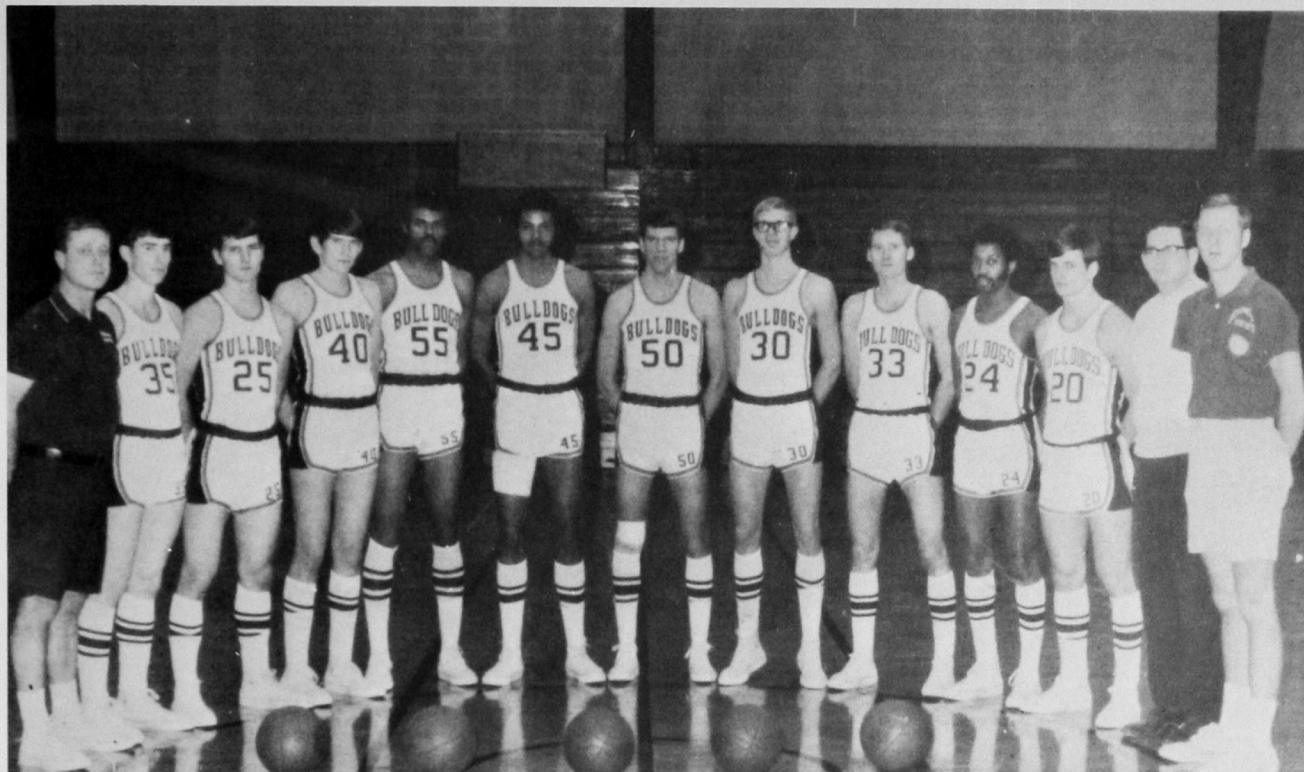

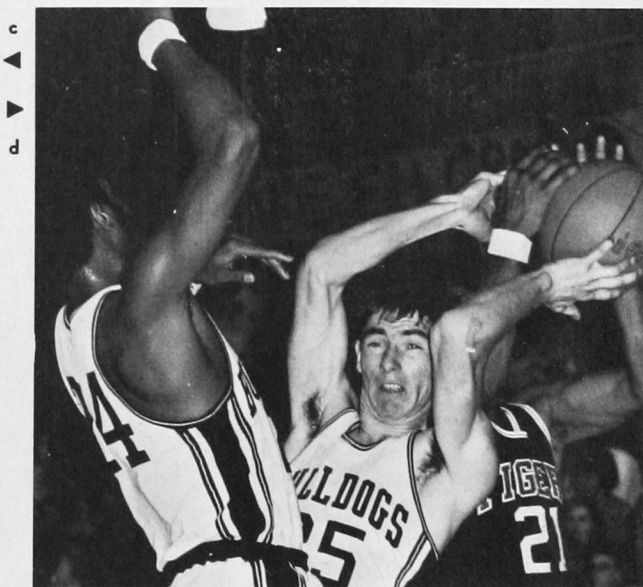
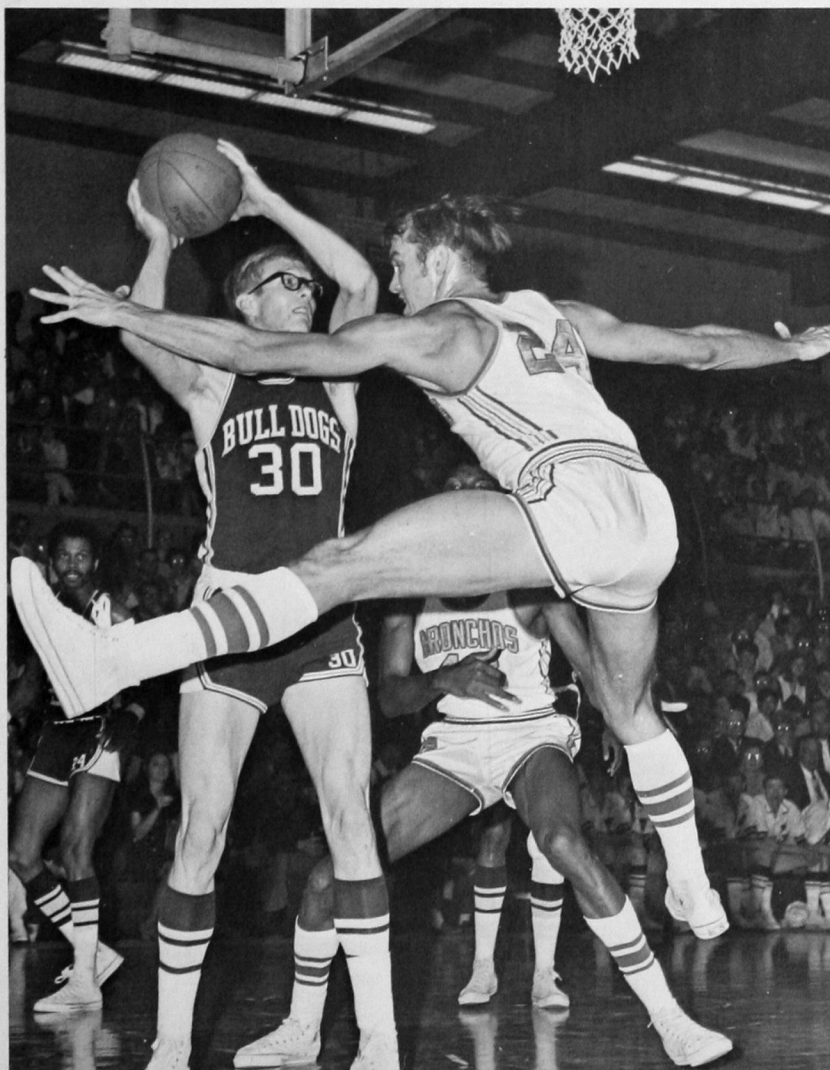

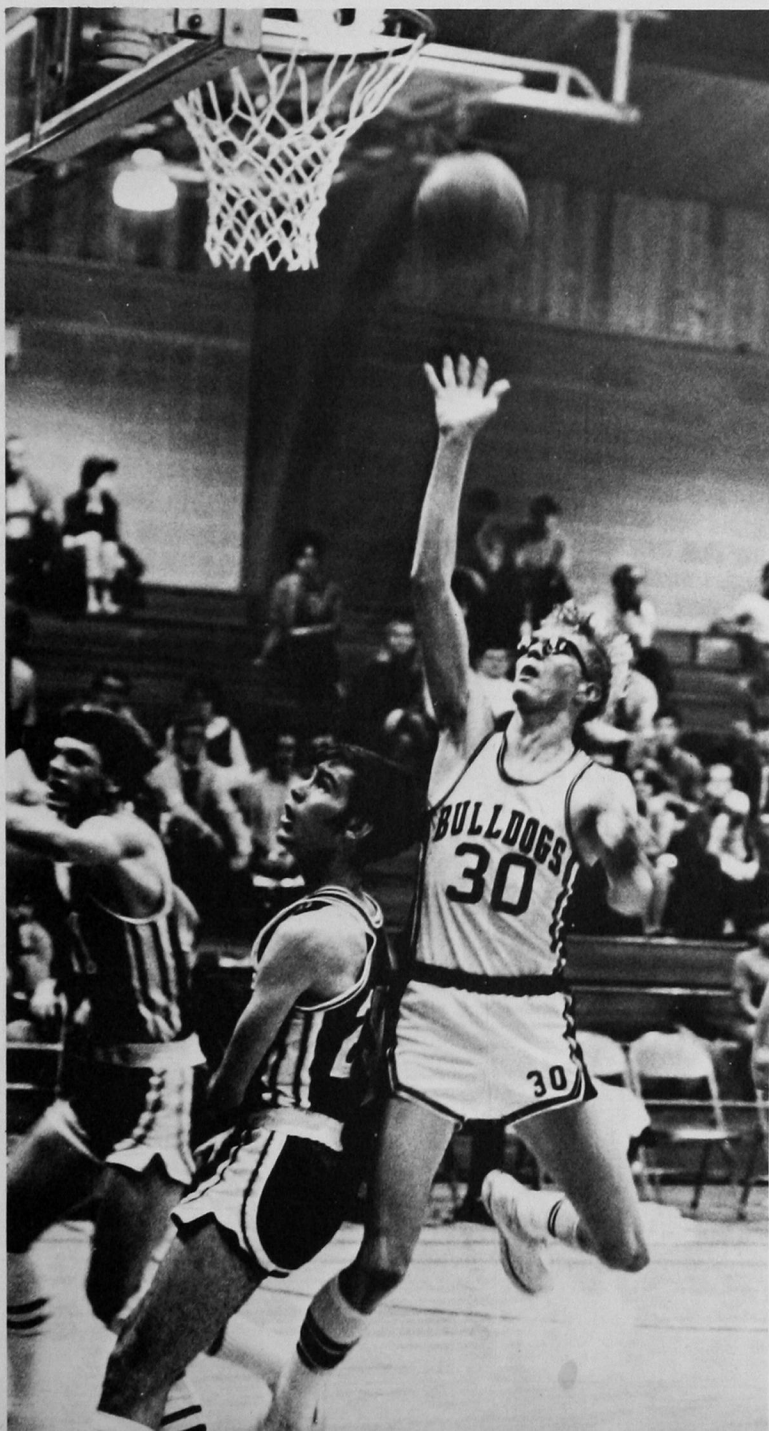

## Gutty Comeback Halted At Ada Championship

Ada was the scene of the season finale as the 'Dogs never could get over the hump fighting from 16 points down (39-54 with 15:44 remaining in the second half), only to lose 63-66. It was the third time the Tigers defeated the Bulldogs during the year. Thomas had 22 points with Pierce and Turner chipping in 11 each. During one stretch, Jobe's lineup outscored their rivals, 21-5, and yet, never could gain the lead.

Turner was named to the 2nd team All-Conference. Sullivan and Hull received honorable mention. Turner was also awarded the Blue-and-White award for making the largest contribution to the team as voted by the players.

The Bulldogs started the season quickly beating Baptist Christian, 74-62, in the opening round of the Kiwanis Tip-Off Tournament, then losing a heartbreaking one-point decision to Howard Payne (NAIA No. 1 rated team last year), 90-91, in the finals.

The 'Dogs also broke quickly from the conference gate, winning seven of their first nine games. Steady play by Turner, Sullivan, Hull, Callen, Jones and Rickner were decisive in the fast paced title race.

Jobe's cagers did lose two games to defending NAIA Champion Eastern New Mexico at Christmas, but carried the fight to the Greyhounds in the opener.

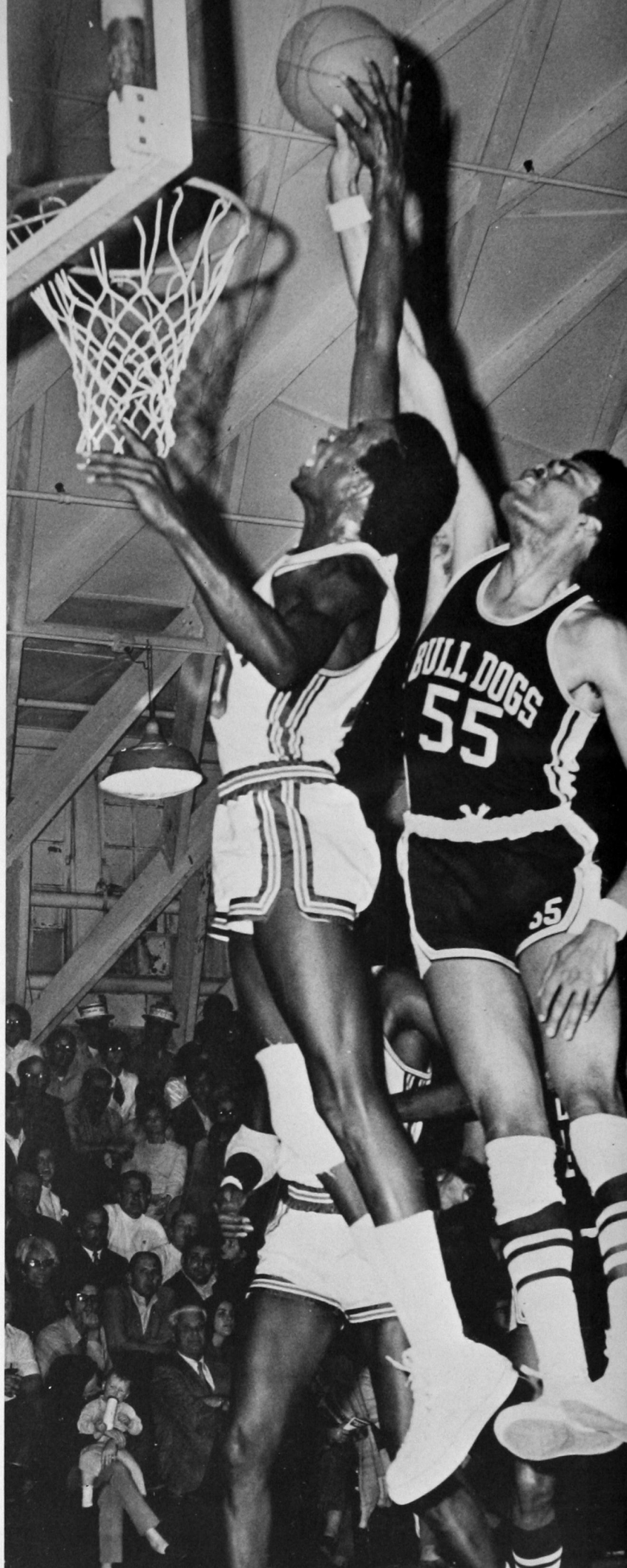
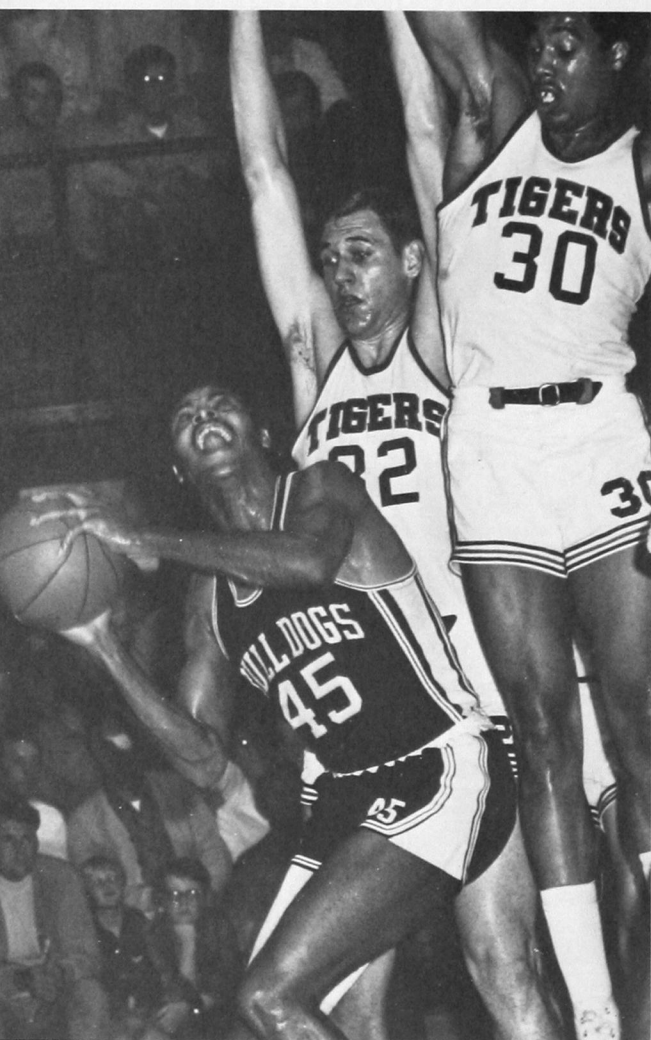
## Bulldogs Finish 3rd In Conference Race

Teamwise, the Bulldogs outscored foes, 75.8-71.3, hitting 45.4 per cent from the field and 70.2 from the charity stripe.



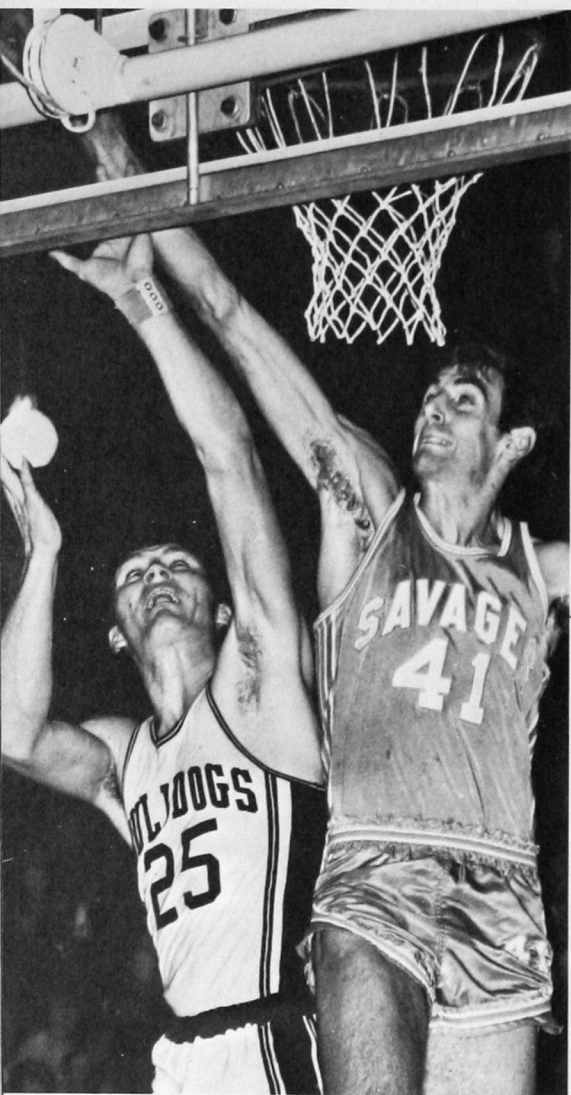

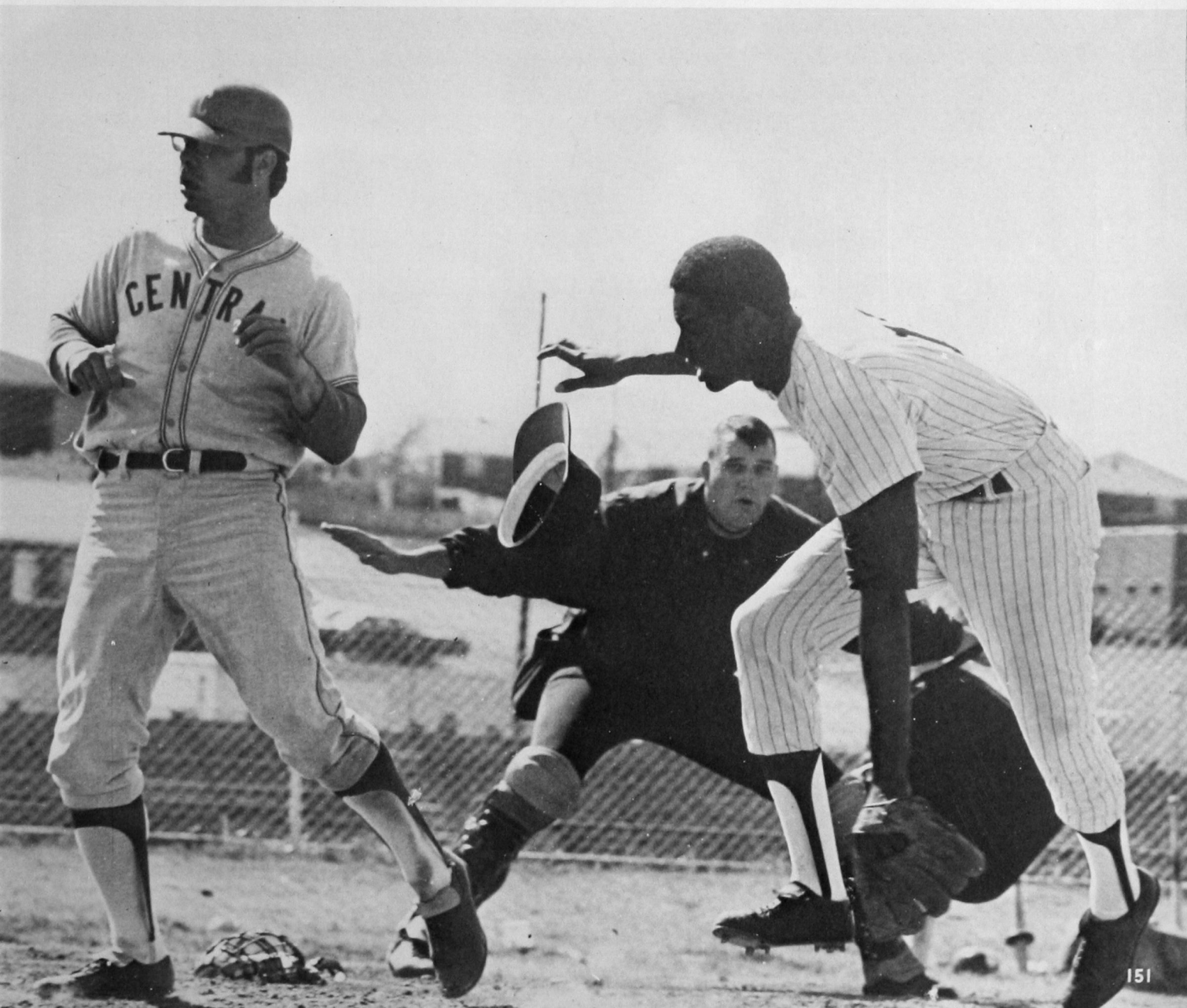

## Glasgow, Martens Only 'Dog Conference Track Champions

Jim Glasgow and Dennis Martens won first places with school record breaking times in the Oklahoma Collegiate Conference Annual Track Meet at Edmond and Southwestern finished third behind Central State and Langston, 67-61-48.

Glasgow won the 880 in 1:57.2; Martens the pole vault at 13-9. Other school records were set at the meet with all three relay teams running faster than ever before. Teams of Charles Hicks, Jim Calip, Randy Richardson and Jim Pothorst combined in the 440 relay for 42.9 and in the 880 relay in 1:29 good for a fifth and fourth, respectively. 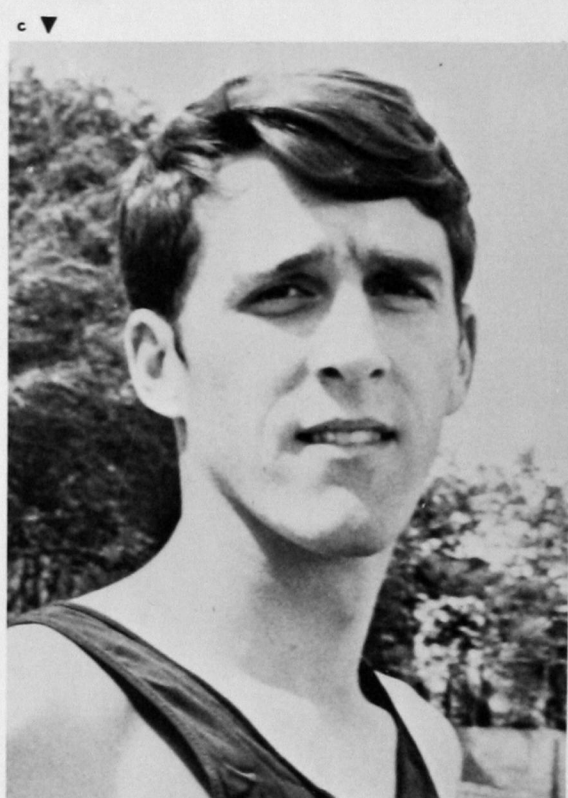
Hicks ran the Bulldogs' school record breaking total to seven with new marks in the 100 (9.5) and 220 on the curve (22.15).

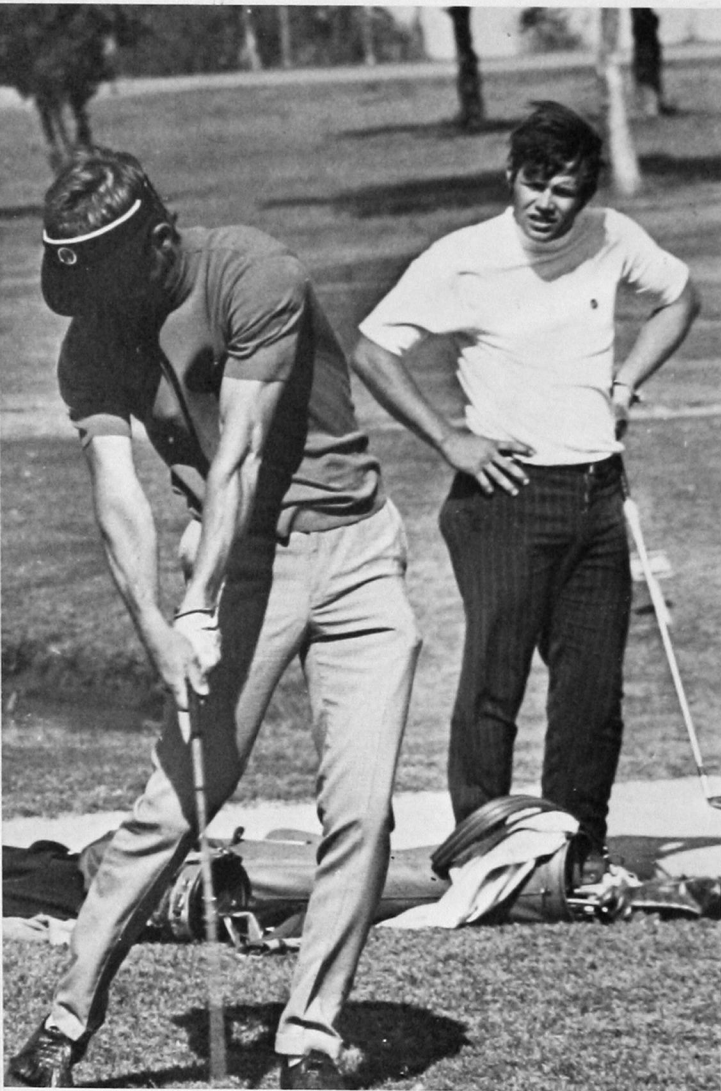
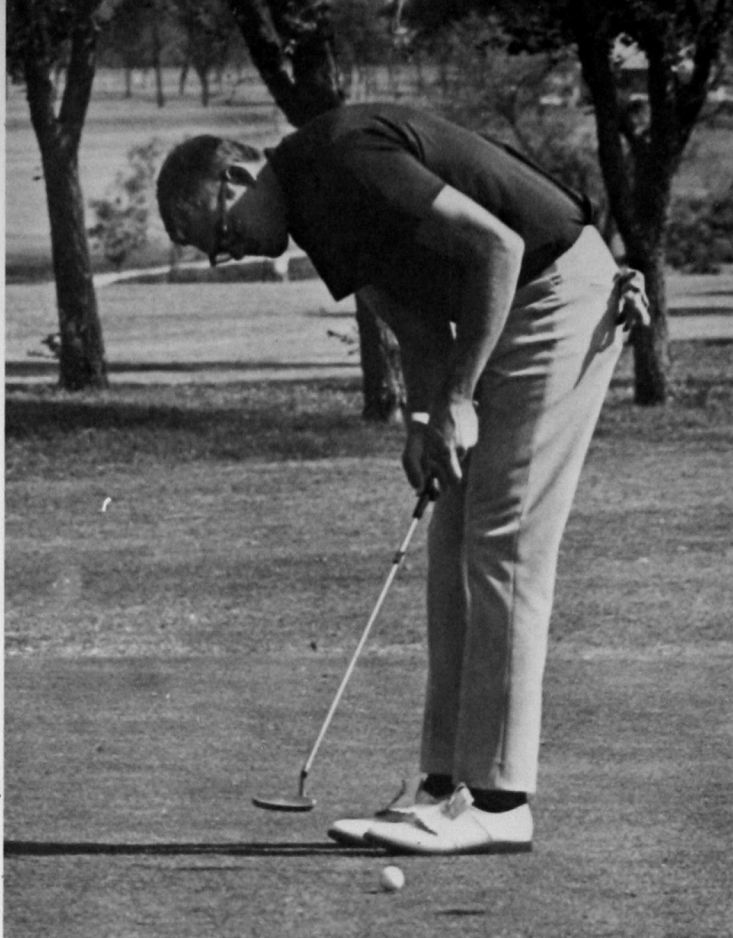


## Hatchett's 151 Captures OCAC Medalist Award

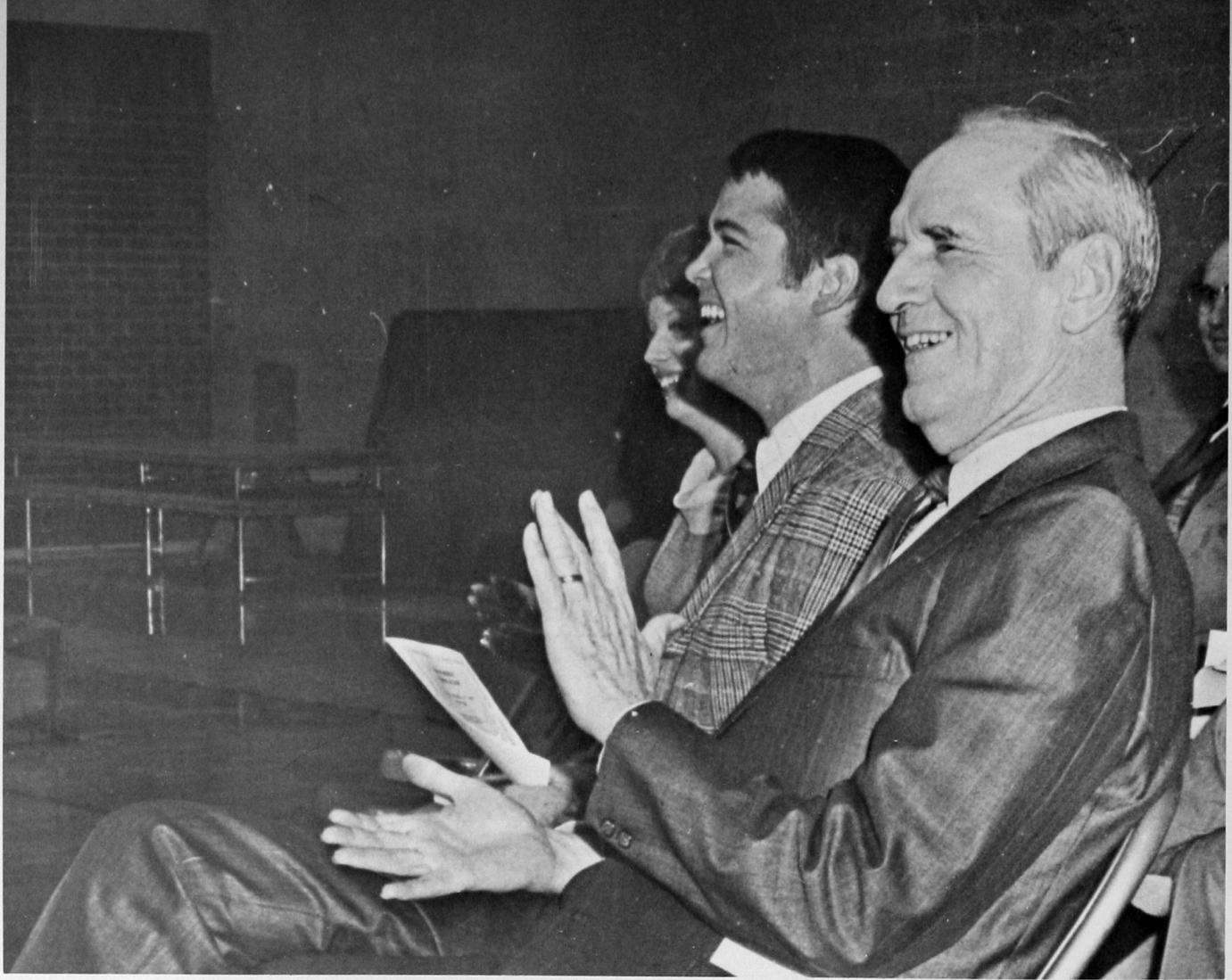

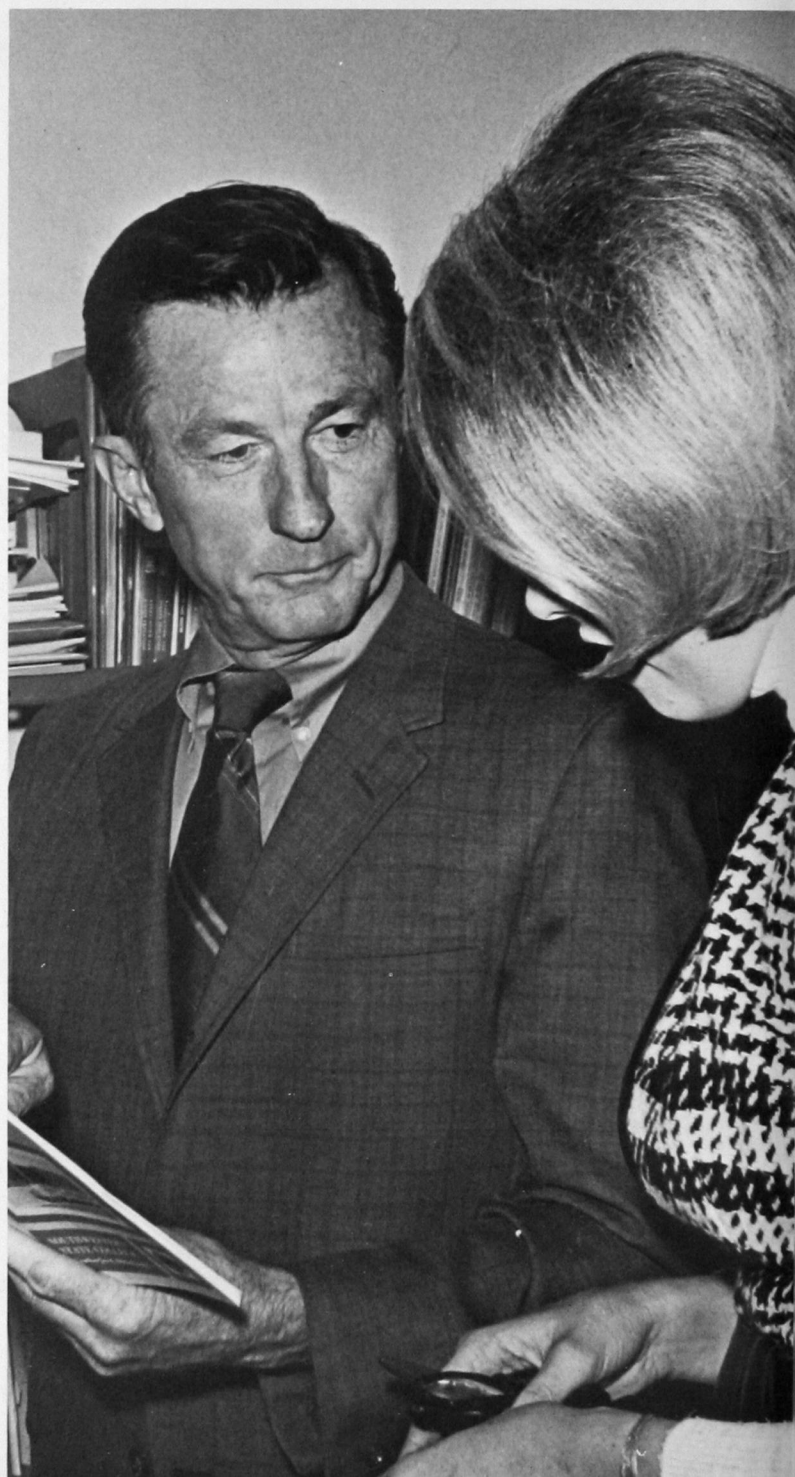

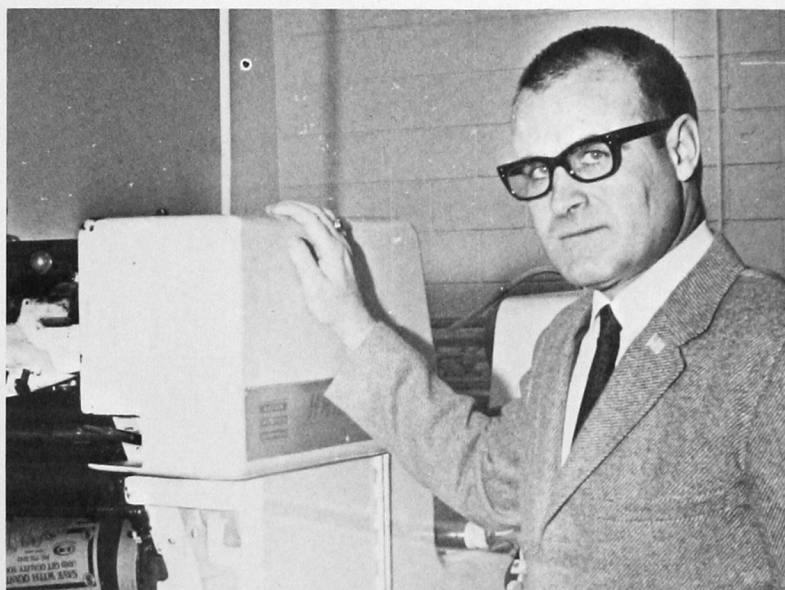

## Graduate College Has 18 M.E. Programs

Southwestern offers Master of Education degrees in 18 areas of study, including Elementary Education, Art, Biological Science, Business Education, Chemistry, English, Health, Physical Education and Recreation, History and Social Studies, Home Economics, Industrial Arts, Mathematics, Music, Natural Science, Physics, Reading Specialists, Spanish and Secondary Counseling. The Graduate College also offers a certificate program for public school superintendents.

The majority of graduate students who attend Southwestern commute for night classes and go full-time during the summer. For example, nearly 1,000 students were enrolled last summer, while 425 attended fall classes.

In conjunction with the education department, all 18 areas were reaccredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education and the State Professional Standards Board.

## New Wing Doubles Pharmacy Facilities

The School of Pharmacy occupies the entire third floor of the Chemistry, Pharmacy and Physics building, and recently doubled the office and laboratory space with the addition of a new wing.

Nationally known and reaccredited this year, the School is divided into five departments—Medicinal Chemistry, Pharmacognosy, Bio-Pharmaceutics, Pharmacy Administration and Pharmaceutics. The latter has a sub-department, Hospital Pharmacy.

Added, in addition to equipment needed to equip the enlarged facility, was a \$20,000 closed circuit television unit with video tape capabilities which enables faculty members to record laboratory experiments for future use.

Southwestern's student enrollment—over 350 in the professional school and 300 in pre-professional training—places the school in the top 10 per cent of the 74 accredited schools or colleges of Pharmacy in the U.S.

The program itself is a five-year curriculum, two years of pre-professional work and three of professional study, leading to a BS (Pharmacy) degree. To graduate, one has more than 160 hours of college work, including approximately 40 hours of Biological Science and 40 hours of Chemistry and applied Chemistry.

Graduates enter community practice, hospital practice, government service (Public Health, Veterans Administration, state hospital practice) or employment in the pharmaceutical industry.





## 18 Teacher Ed Programs Reaccredited

Teacher Education programs were reaccredited for a 10-year period by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education. In addition, the Teacher Education Professional Standards committee of State Board of Education reapproved the 10 program areas.

Undergraduate numbering 1,433 work toward degrees with emphasis in Elementary Education, Art, Health and Physical Education, Music, Foreign Language, Home Economics, Industrial Arts, Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Speech, Administrator's Provisional, Reading Specialist, School Counselor and Driver and Safety Education.

Equipment added were: \$1,000 worth of individual testing scales for guidance and counseling; \$4,000 worth of equipment for experimental psychology; \$1,000 worth of models including a life-size human torso and enlarged models of the head for teaching physiological psychology; \$1,800 worth of controlled readers and filmstrip libraries for courses in teaching reading; \$300 worth of cassette tape recorders and cartridges for methods class.

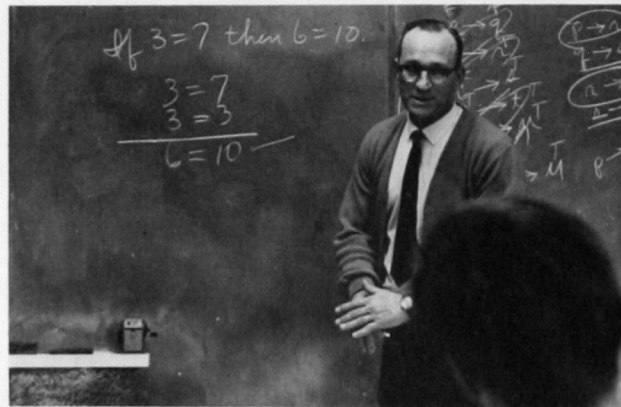

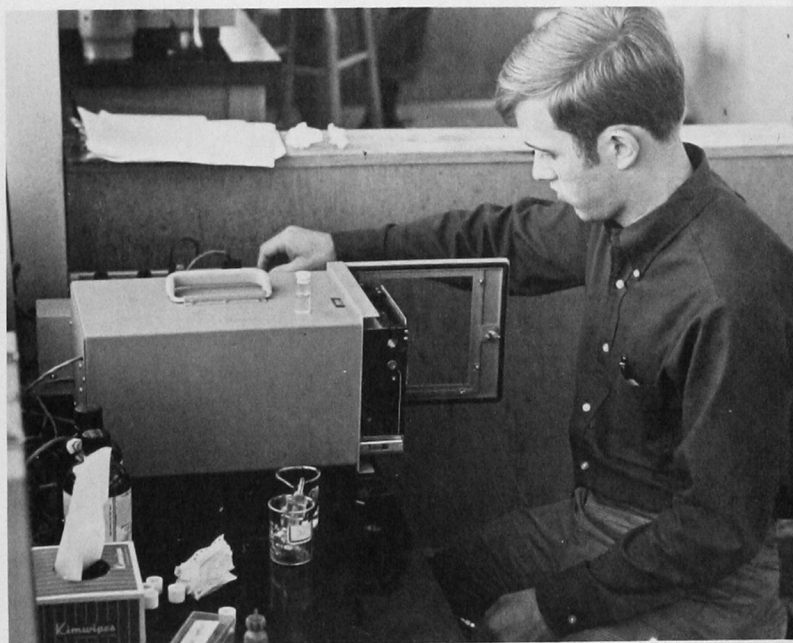

Over 1,000 students were able to utilize 63 new Selectric typewriters, two executive models, five electronic calculators and a new dictaphone dictating machine.



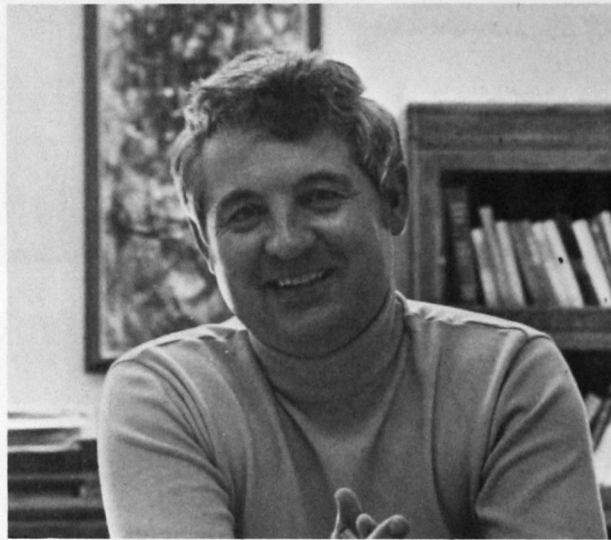


## Drama Department Stages Original Play

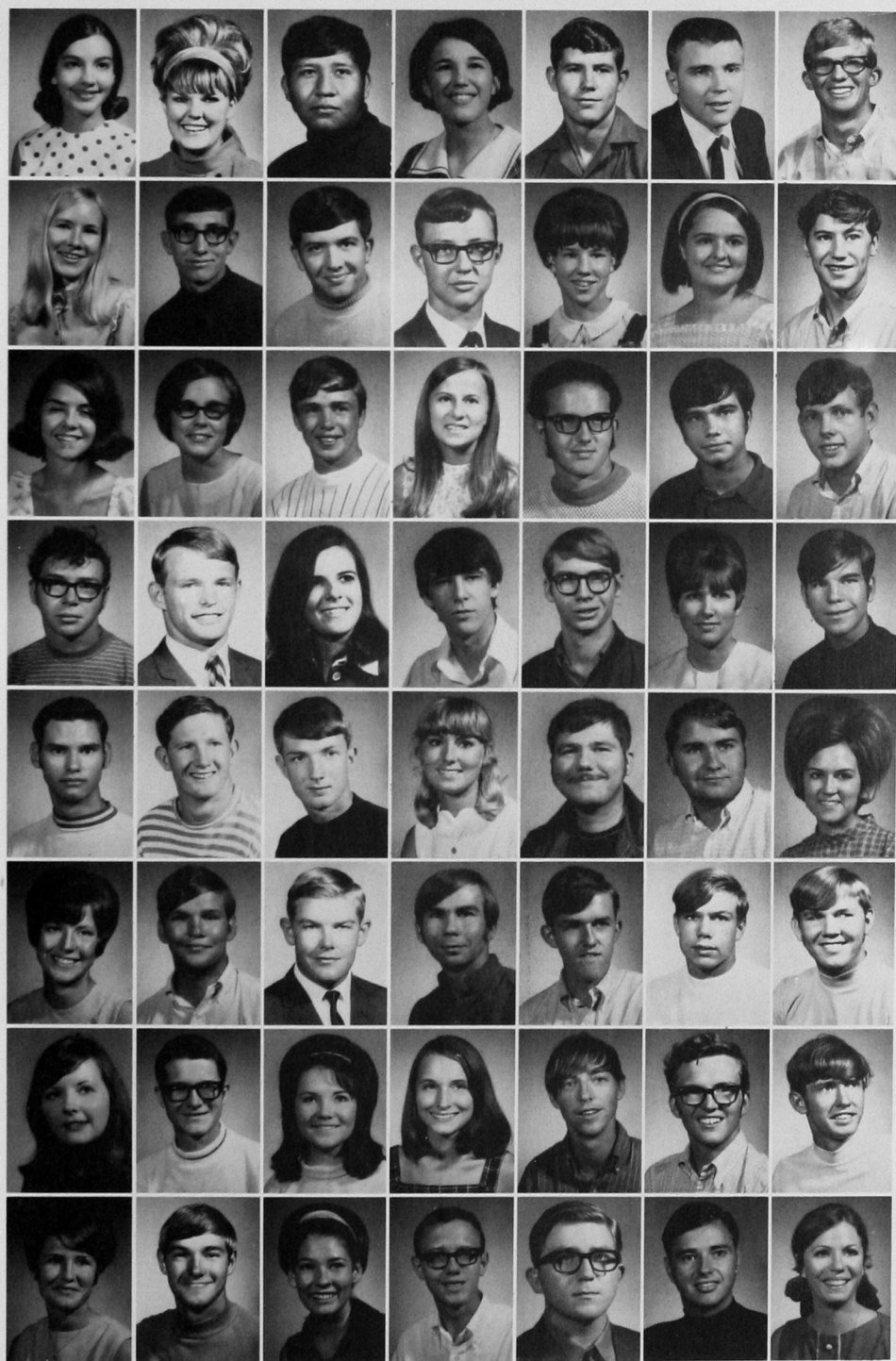

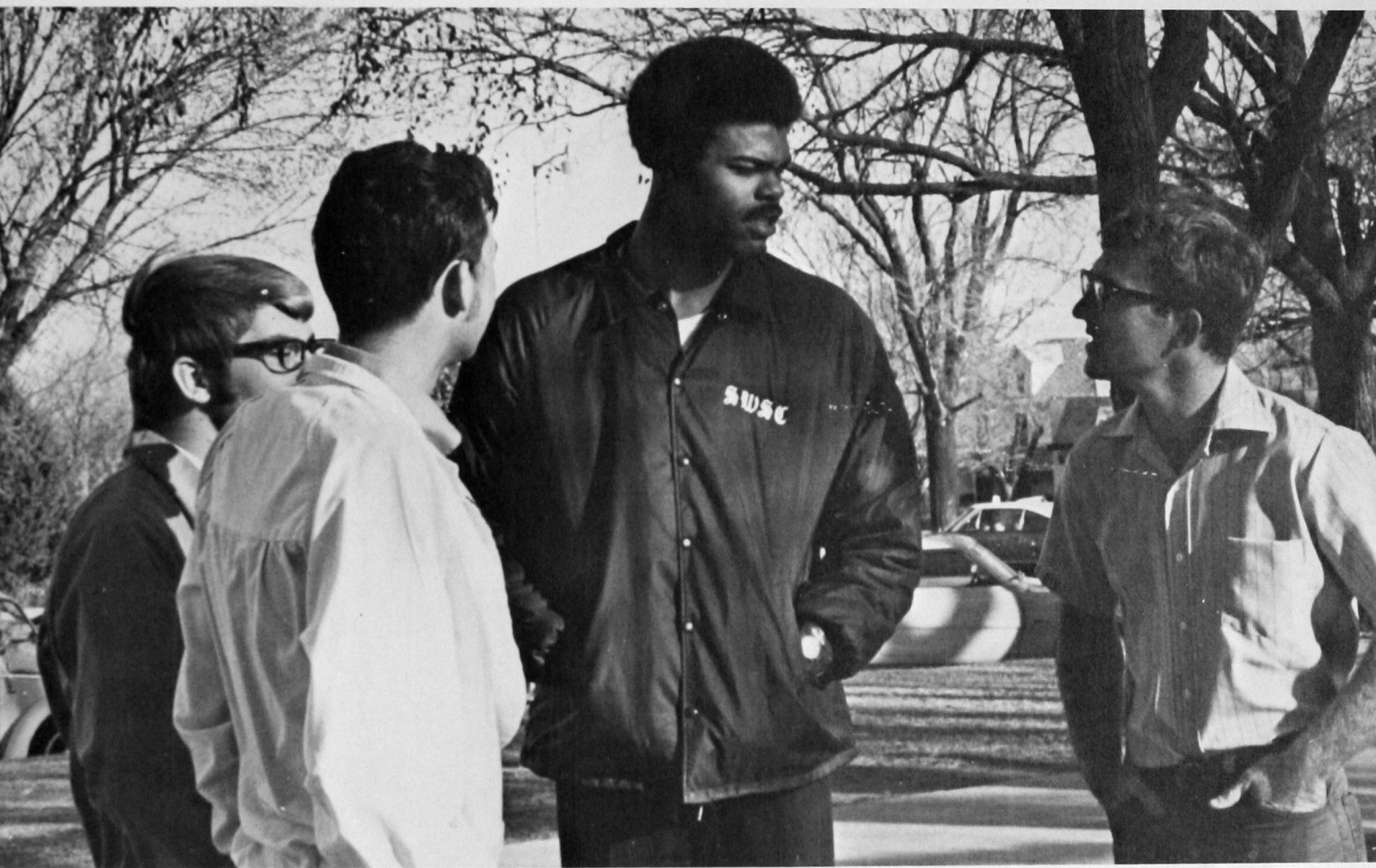


The last leaf
