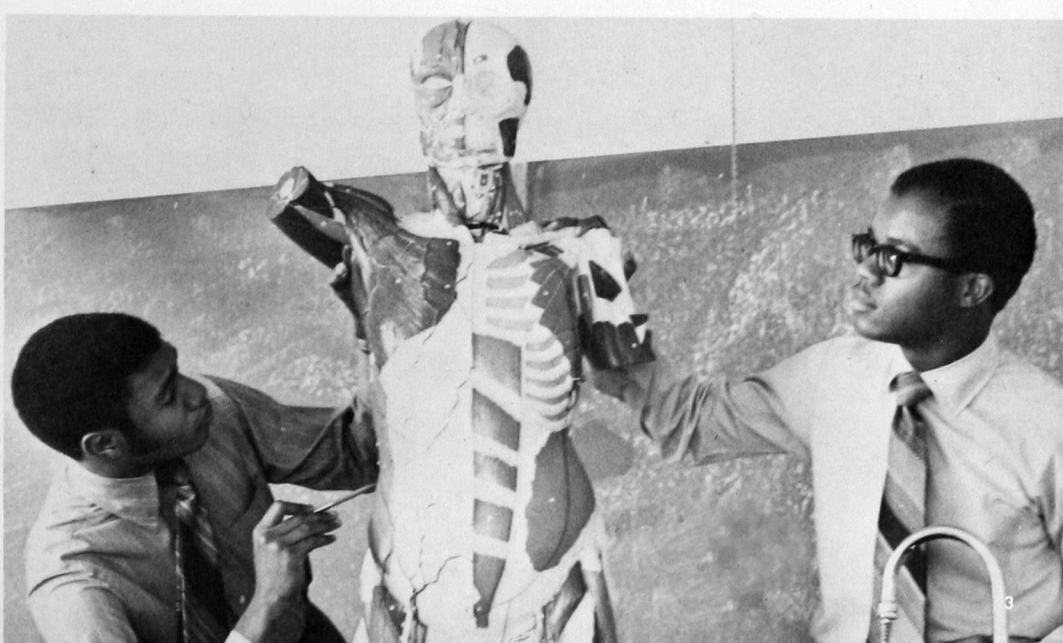
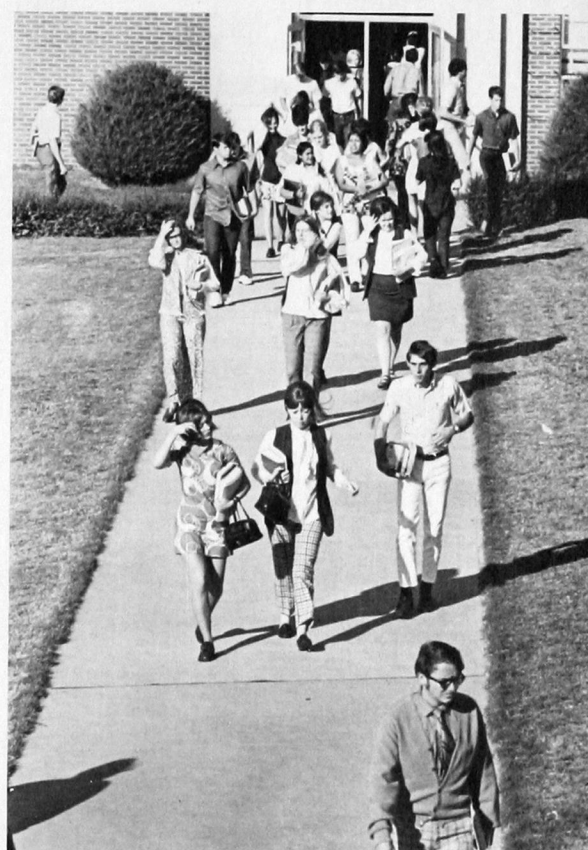

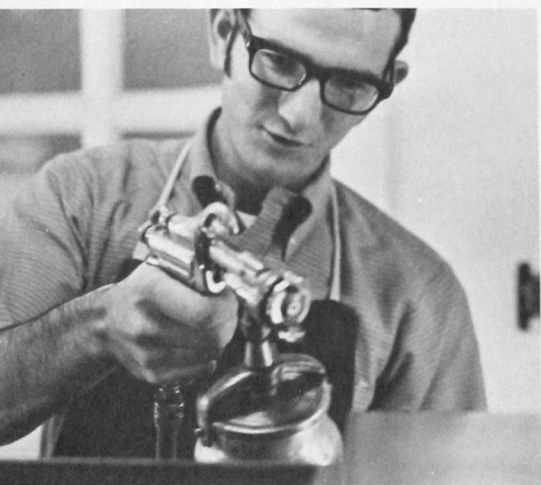




Learning is not an easy process and not often exciting.

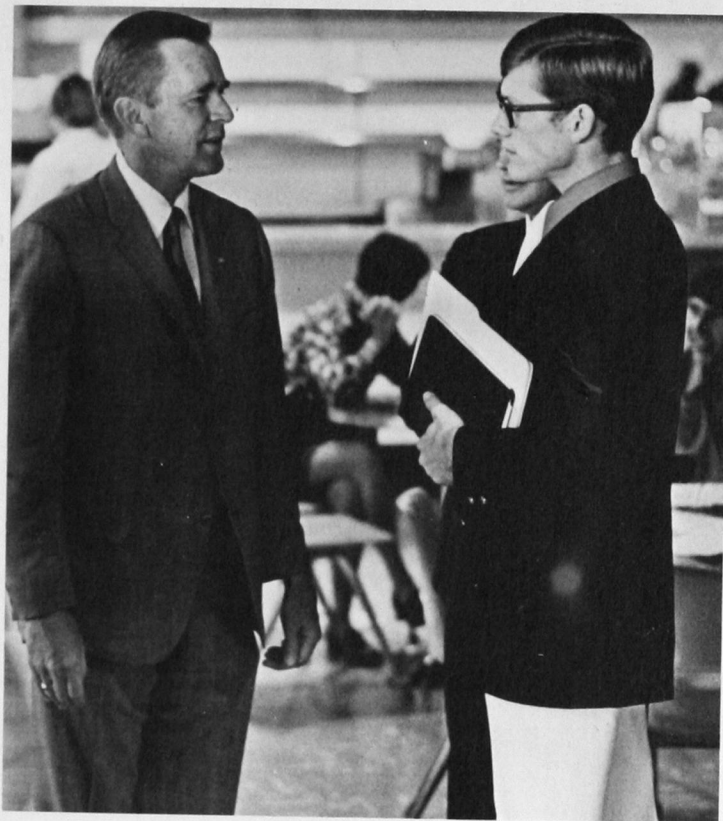






Peace has different values.

Southwestern.





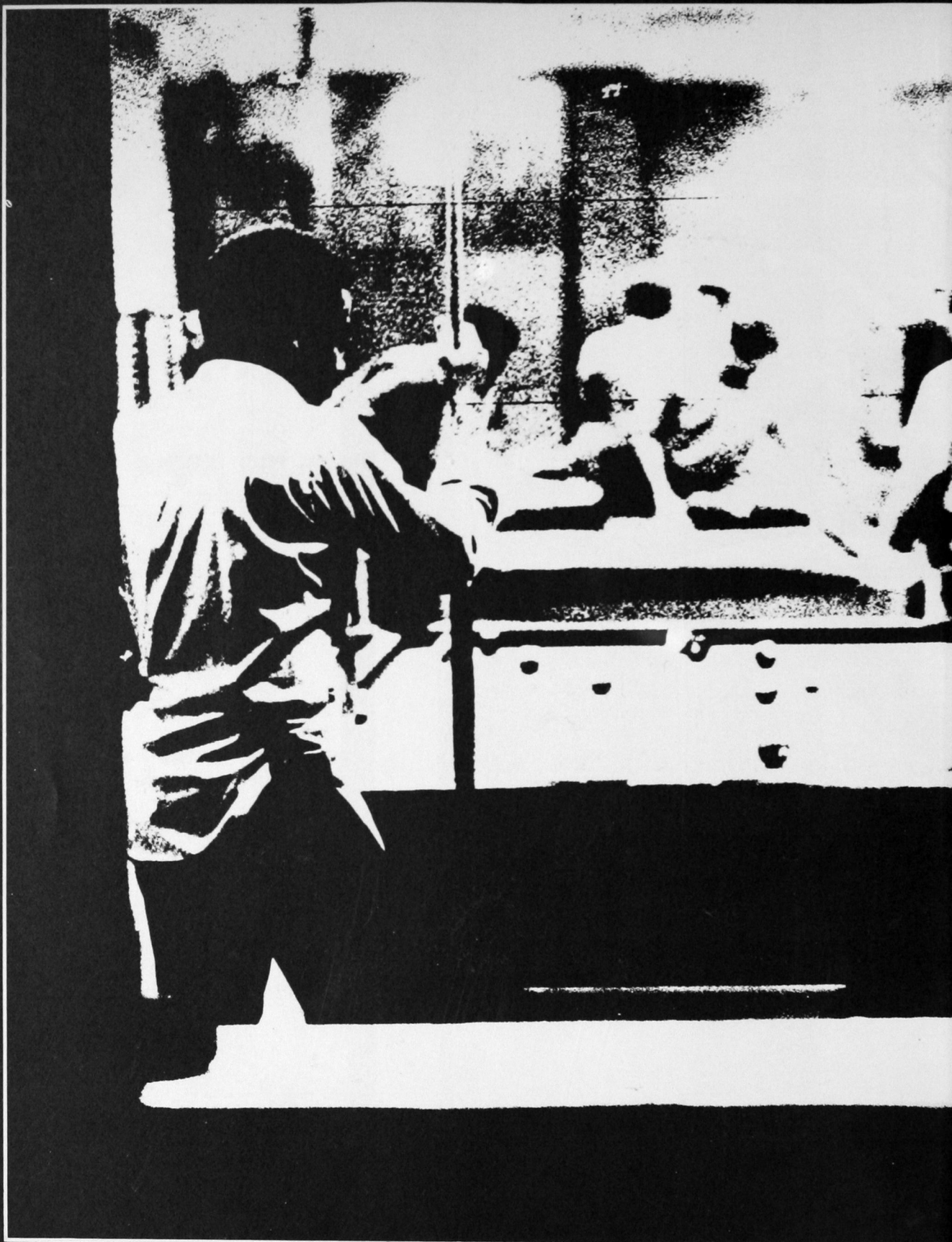

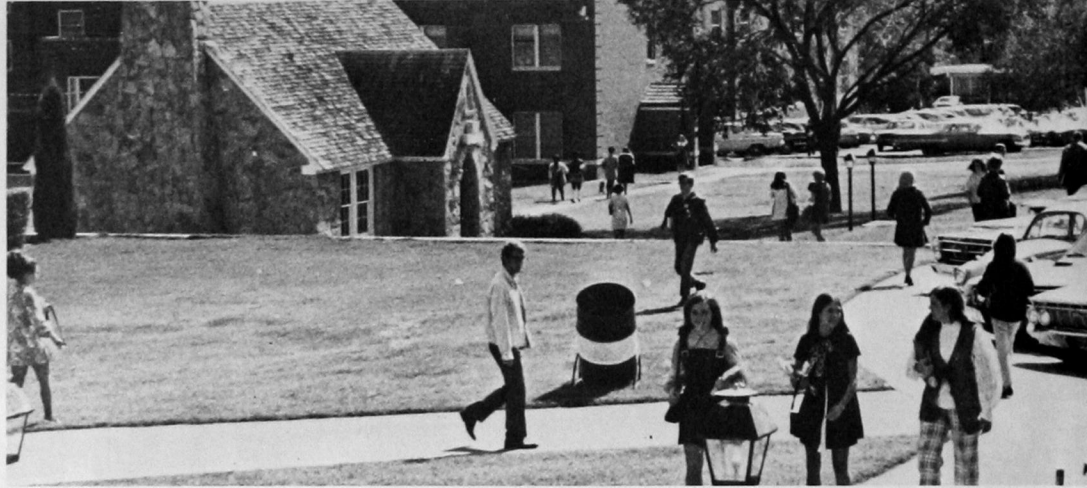

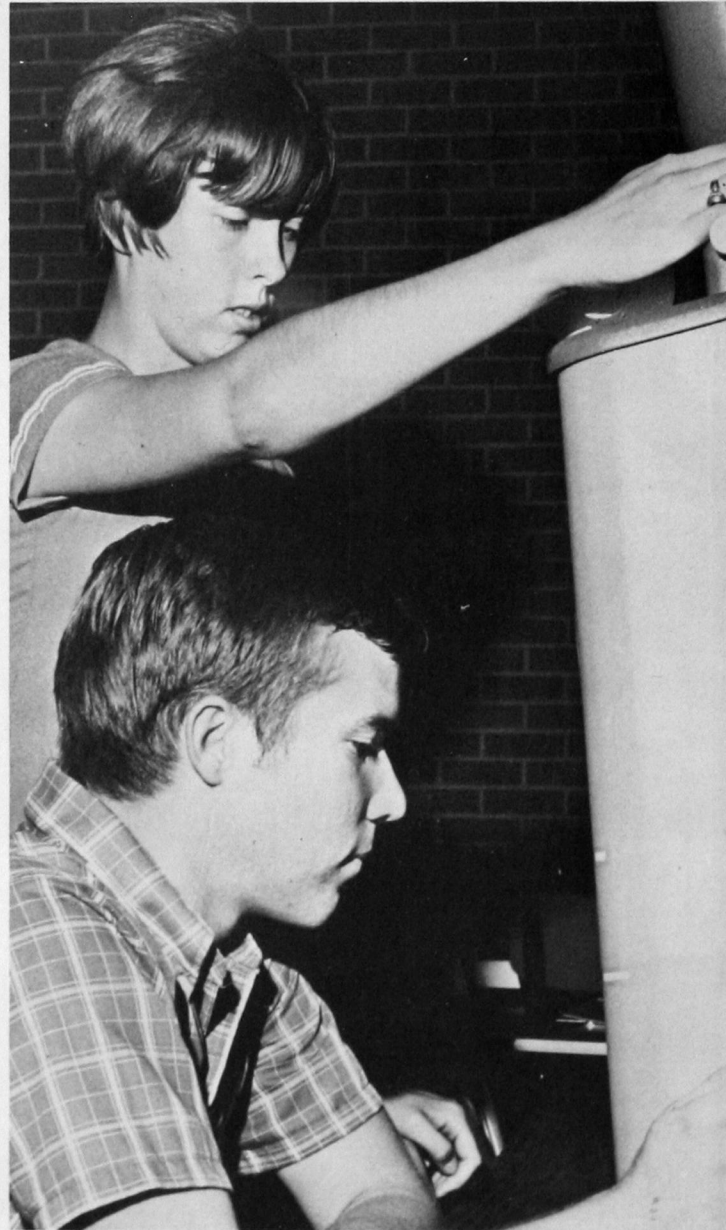
The campus life at Southwestern never ceases to stop moving.

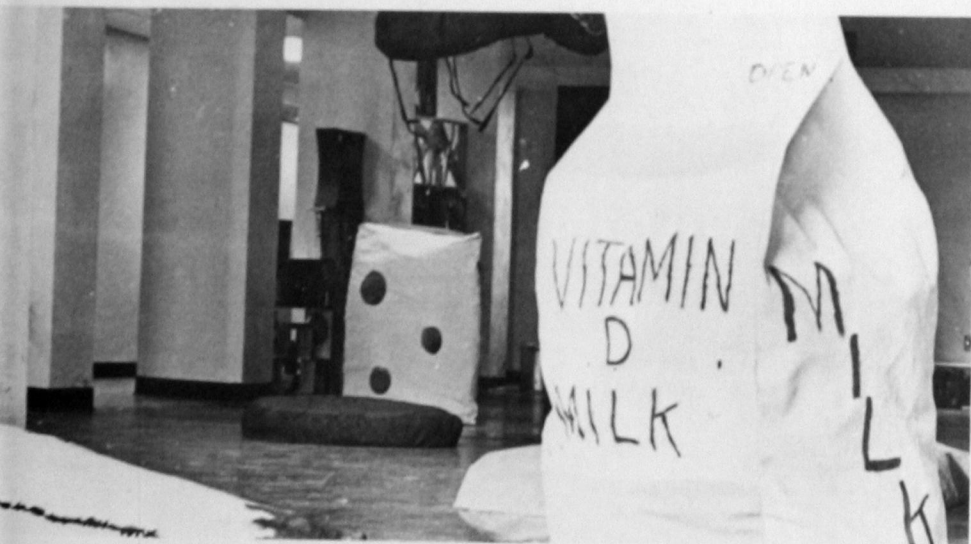

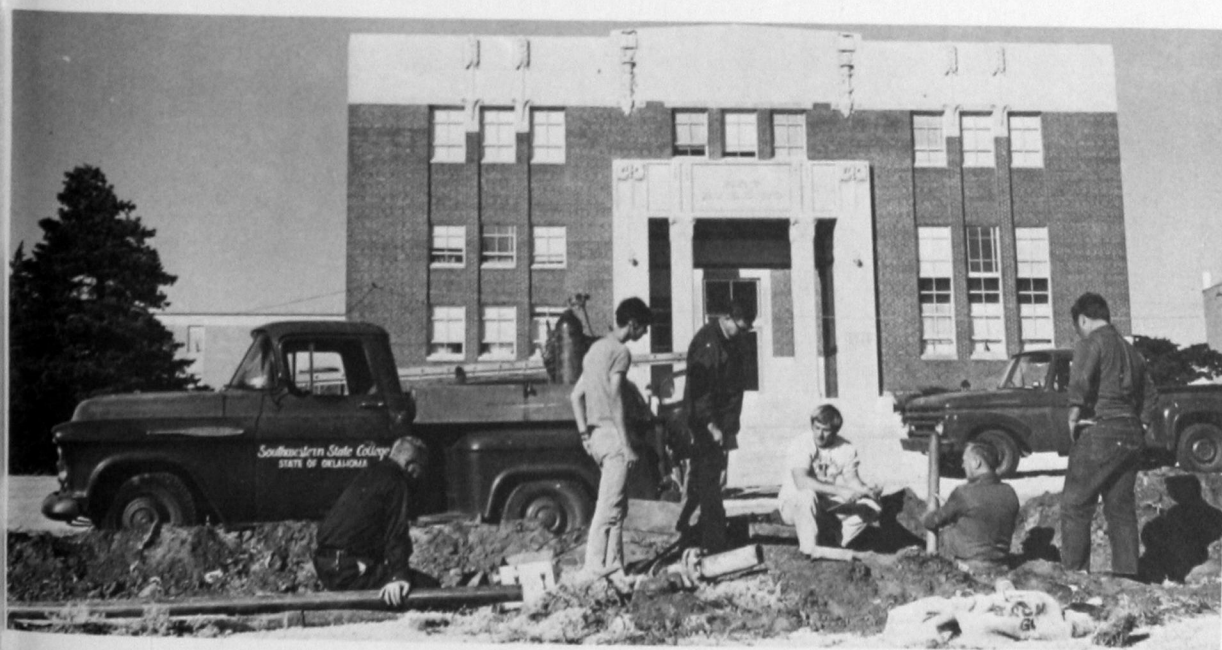

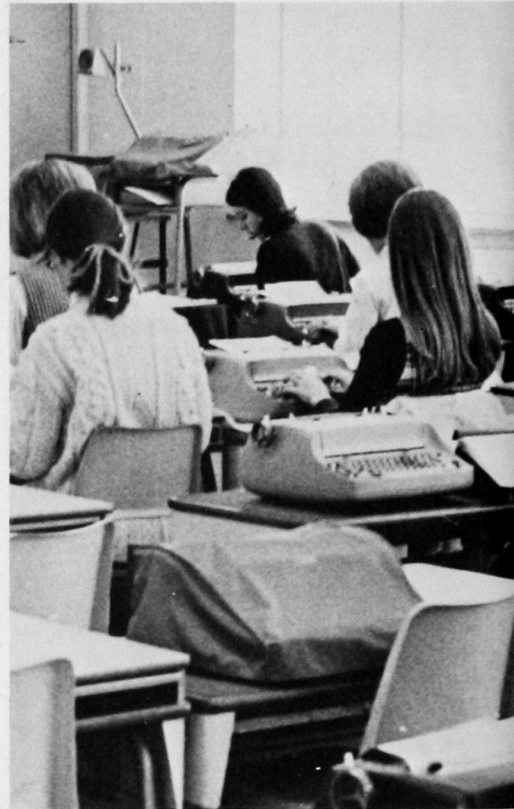
Making Life More Worthwhile

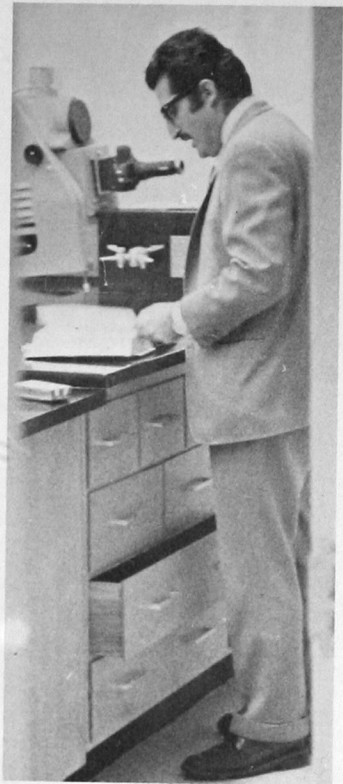

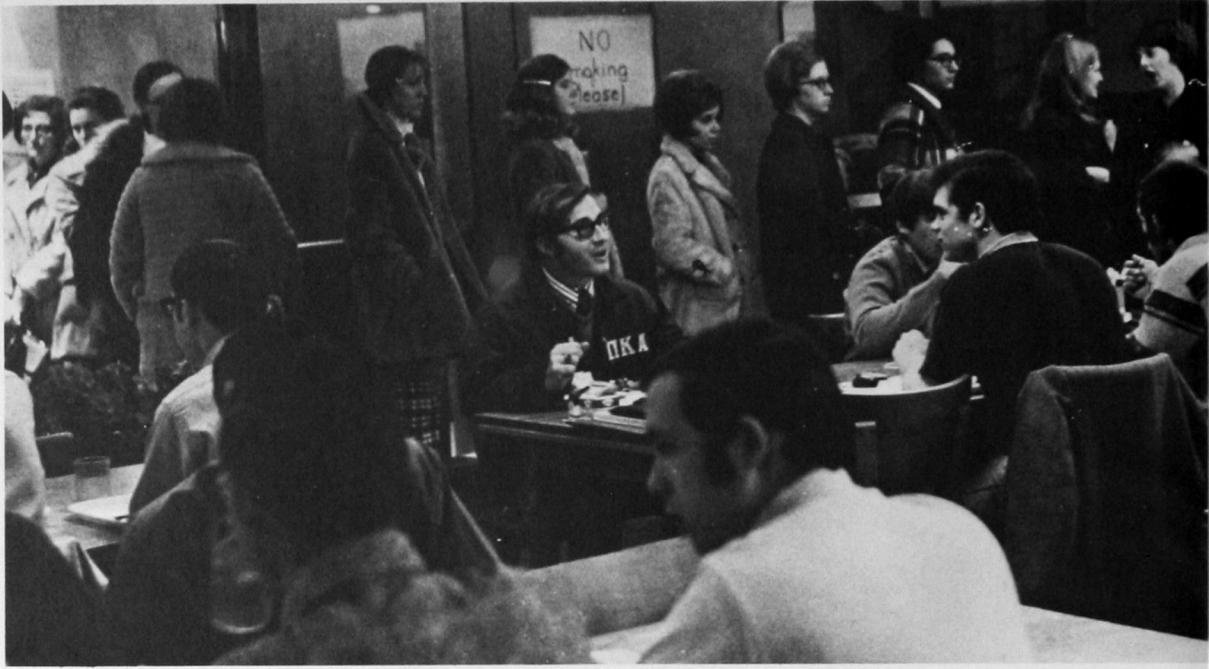

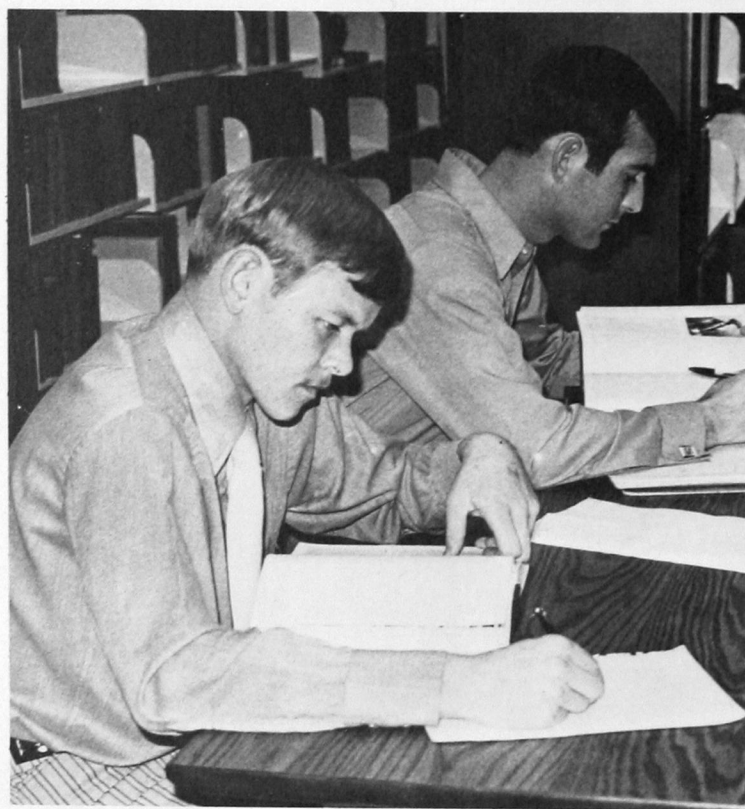

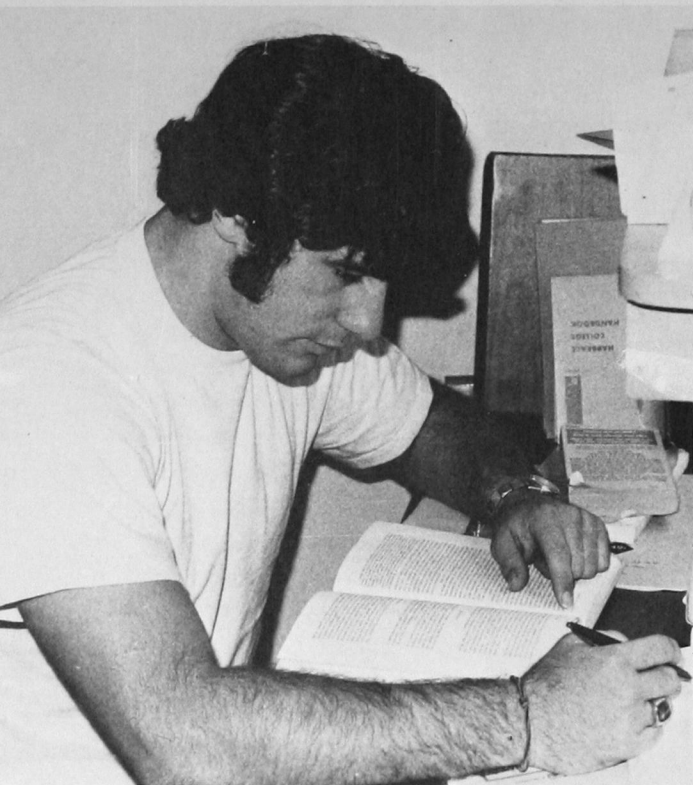

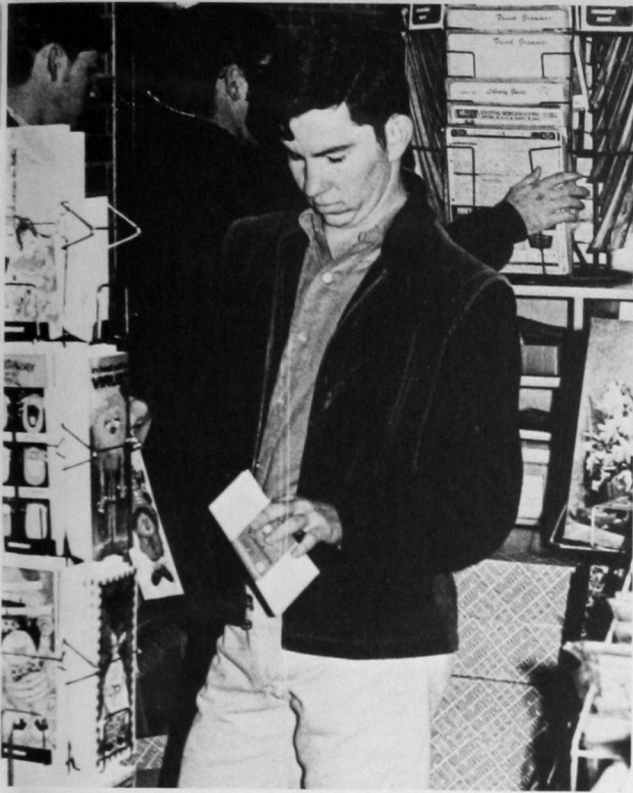

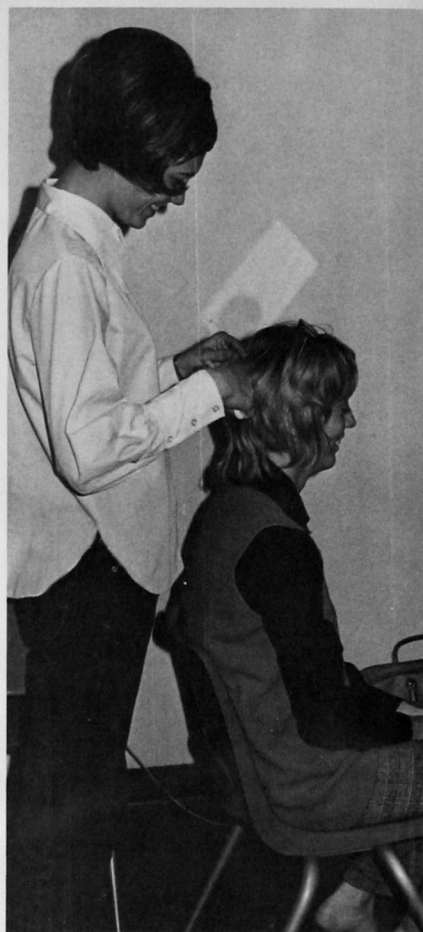

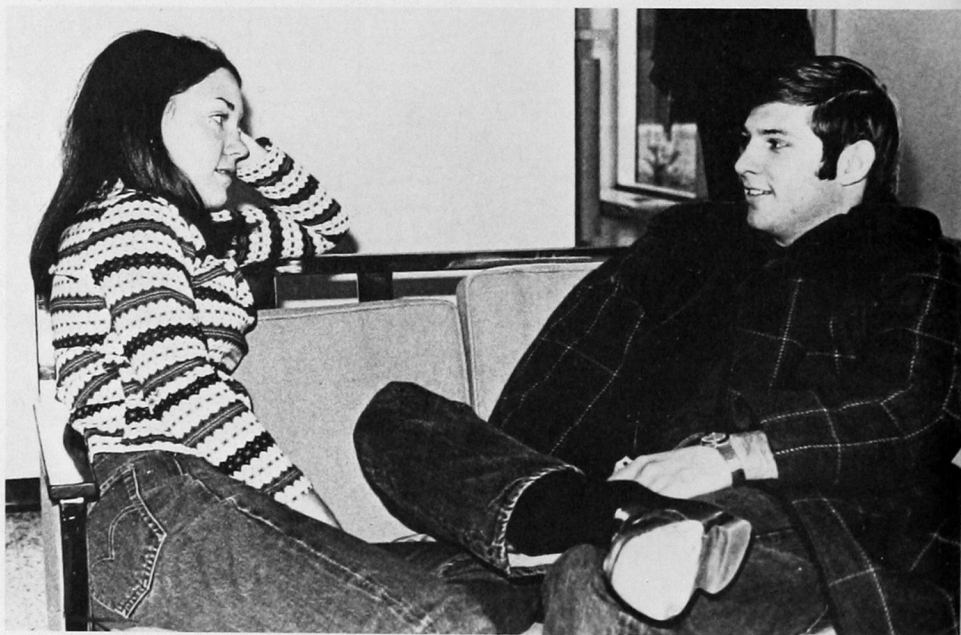

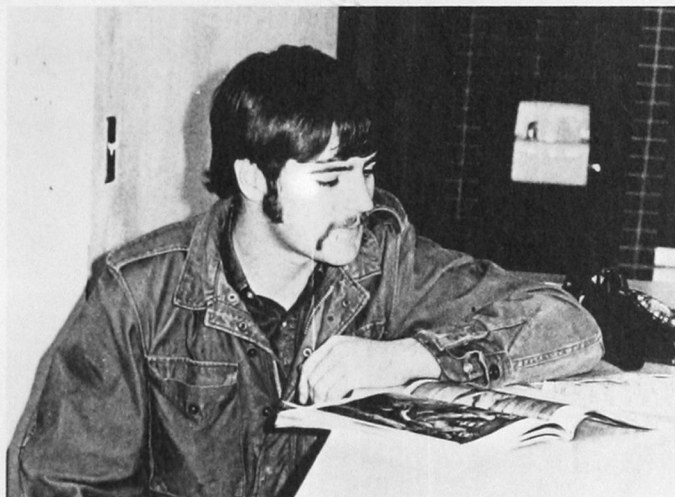

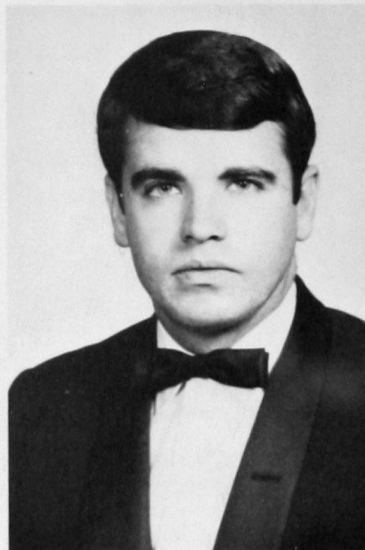
Who's Who Honors 32

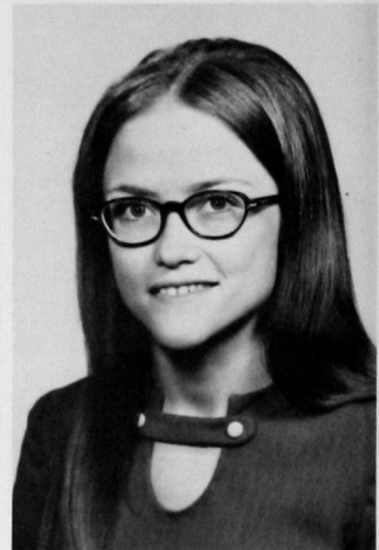
candidates, and a faculty committee appointed by the dean of the college made the final selection. Nomination for the honor was based on scholarship, character, leadership, and contribution to the college.



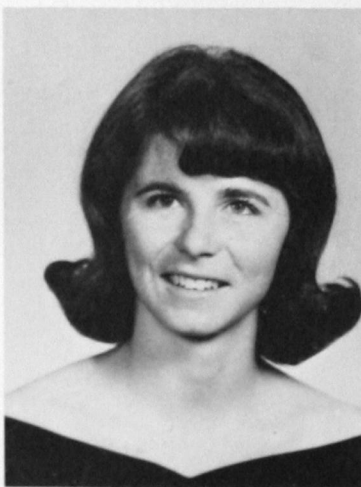

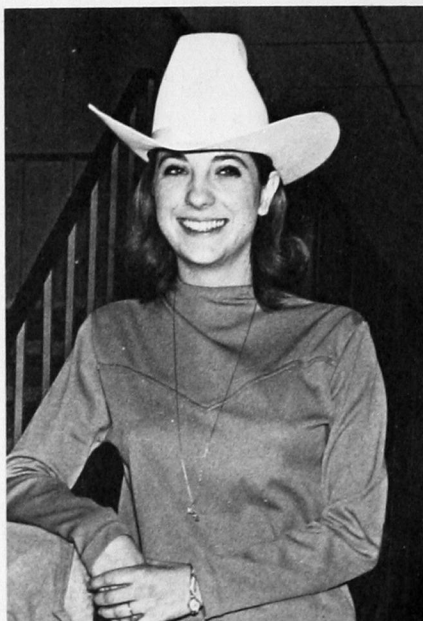

President Boosts Dogs



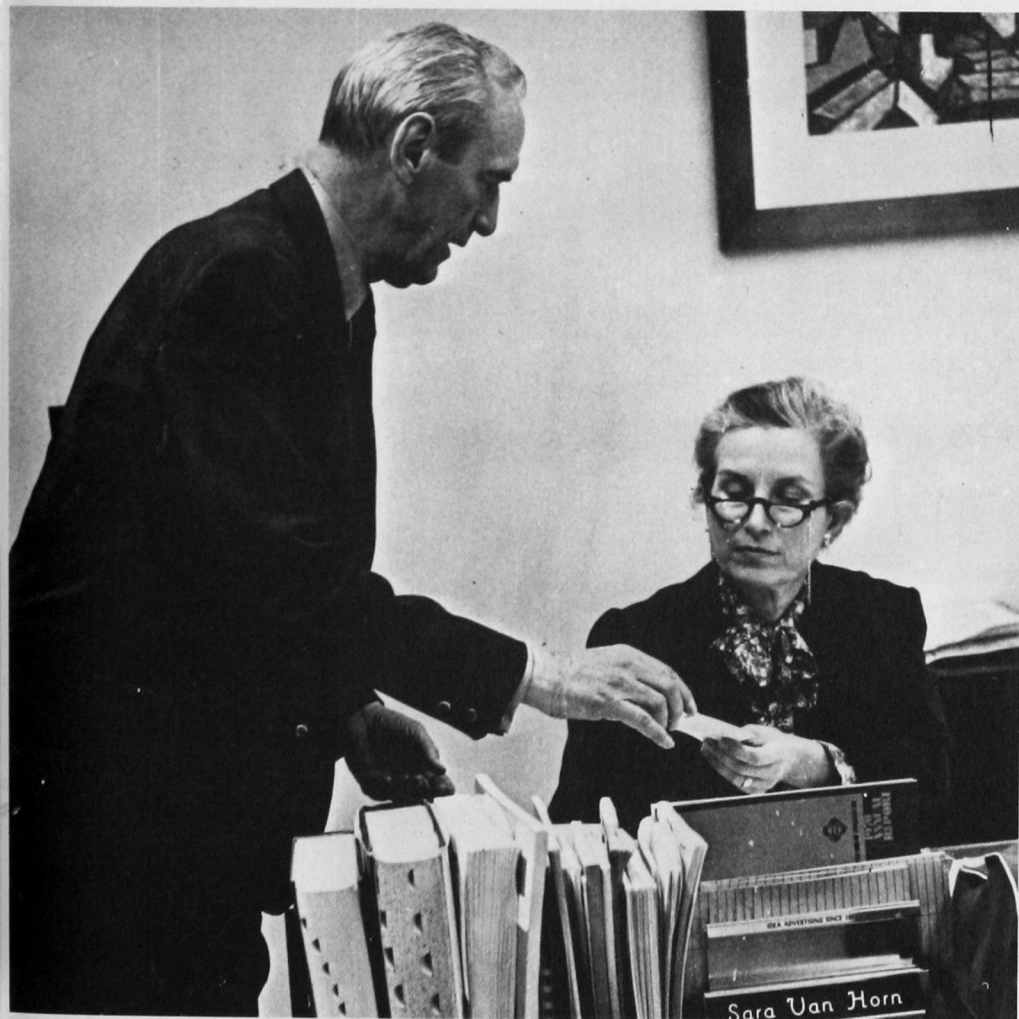
President Al Harris

Public Relations.

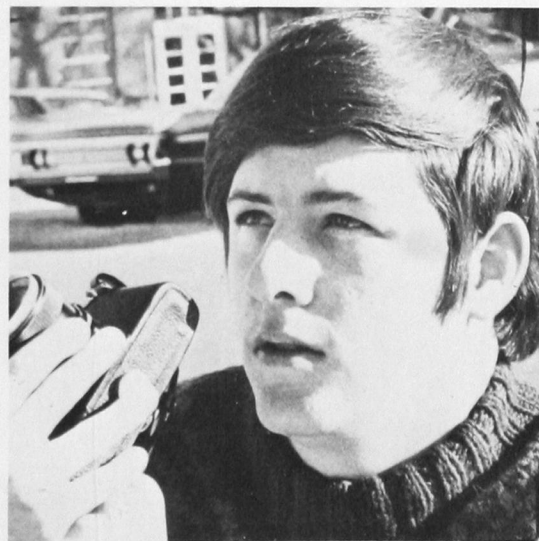

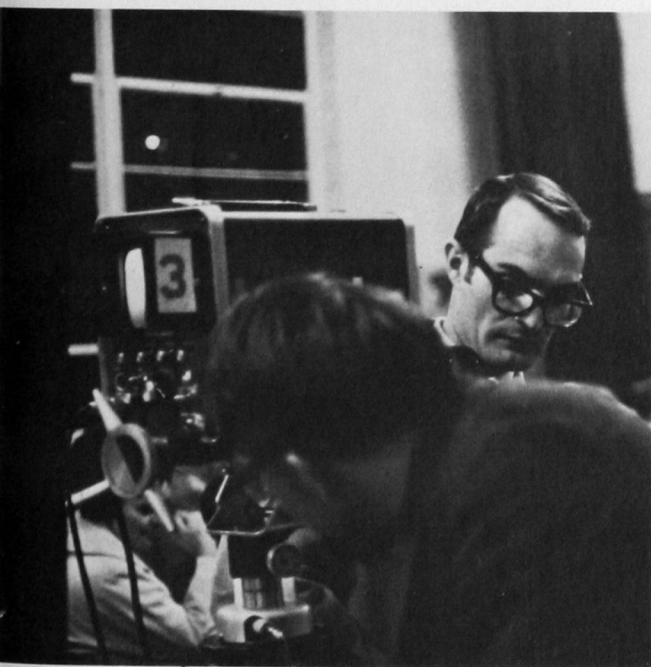
Master of Education degrees can be earned at Southwestern in 18 areas of study — elementary education, art, biological science, business education, chemistry, English, health, physical education and recreation, history, and social studies, home economics, industrial arts, mathematics, music, natural science, physics, reading specialists, Spanish and secondary counseling. The Graduate College also offers a certificate program for public school superintendents. In conjunction with the Education Department, all 18 areas are reaccredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education and the State Professional Standards Board. According to past records and statistics, the majority of graduate students at Southwestern commute during the regular school term to attend night classes and enroll as full-time students during the summer.



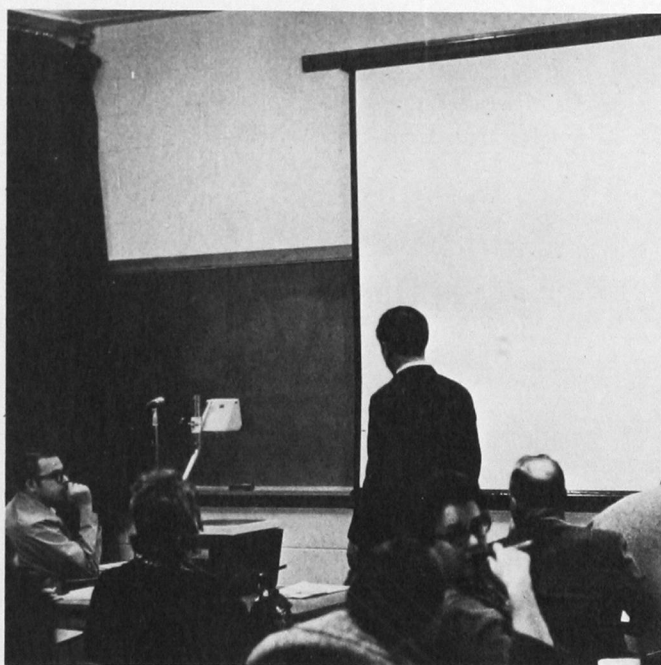

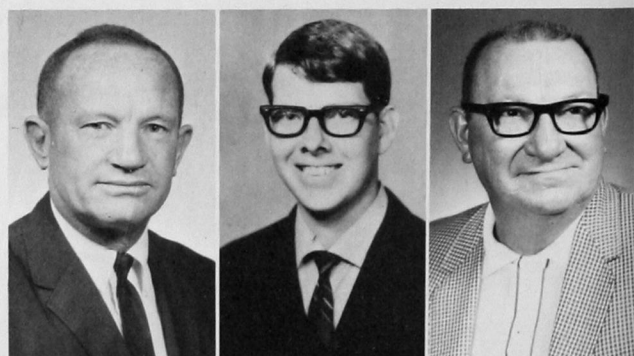

Teacher Education

The division of Teacher Education and Psychology proved to have a popular educational tool this year — video tape equipment. The division has its own studio, complete with cameras, special lighting, recording equipment and a master console which was specially designed and built for the project at Southwestern. Equipment was purchased by the college to offer a more advanced method of teaching to the college community. Programs offered in Teacher Education include Elementary Education, Art, Health and Physical Education, Music, Foreign Language, Home Economics, Industrial Arts, Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Speech, Administrator's Provisional, Reading Specialist, School Counselor, and Driver and Safety Education. The Teacher Education program at Southwestern has been approved and accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education. Each degree area within the program also received a "stamp of approval" from the Standards committee of the State Board of Education. These departments sponsored many activities at Southwestern this year which included Student Education Association, National Education Association, Kappa Delta Pi, Psychology Club, and a Periodic Language Arts Workshop. In conjunction with these activities were the major projects for the year. Among these projects were a charter for Kappa Delta Pi, a television studio, and education teaching programs. Team teaching, micro teaching, and individual study were new teaching methods used for improvement.

Seven curricula areas, teacher and liberal arts-oriented, attracted approximately 1,000 students to the Department of Business this year. Four of the curricula areas lead to a Bachelor's degree and one to a Master's degree. Bachelor degree areas of concentration are economics, secretarial science, accounting, business administration with general business, marketing and salesmanship as specialized concerns. Other degrees are Bachelor of Science and a Master of Teaching, both in education. New typewriters and several electronic calculators have been purchased this year in the Business Department. The Pi Beta Lambda business organization worked to serve student and industry alike.



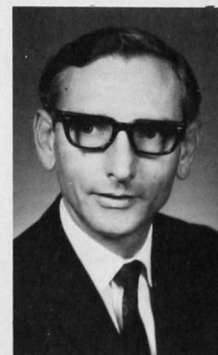

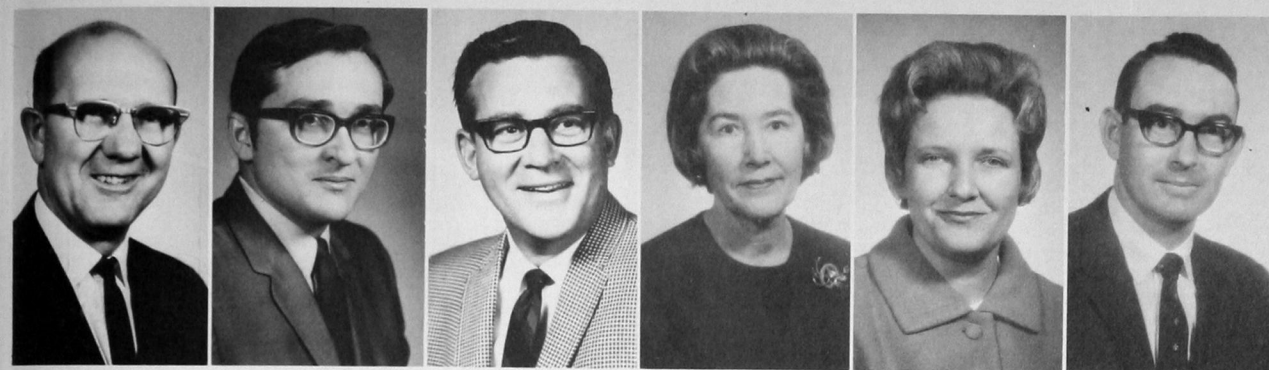

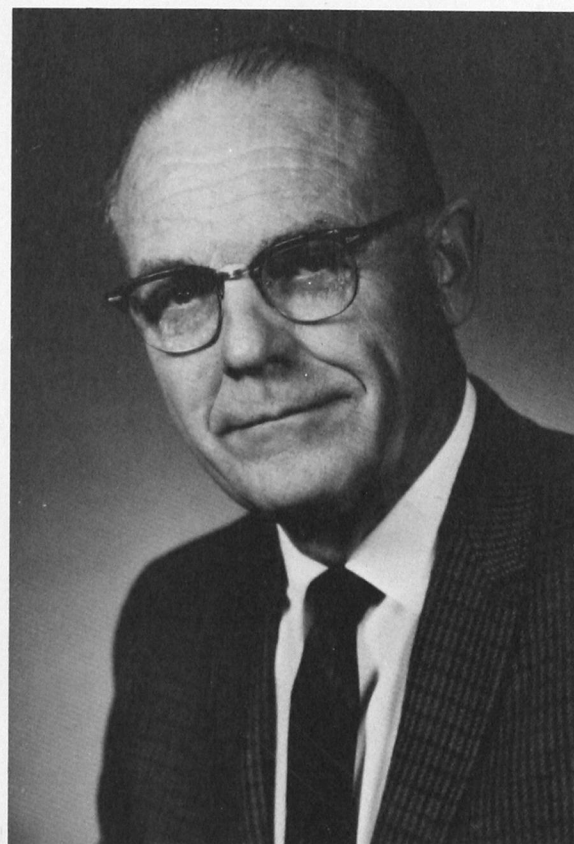

Pharmacy

Dr. W. L. Dickison, *Dean*

The School of Pharmacy has been at Southwestern for 30 years, and is ranked nationally in the upper ten percent of approximately 75 fully accredited undergraduate pharmacy schools in the United States. Facilities of the School occupy the entire third floor of the Chemistry, Pharmacy, and Physics building. Enrollment this year included 352 students in the professional school and approximately 300 students in pre-pharmacy training. Faculty members this year numbered 19. The pharmacy program itself is a five-year curriculum, two years of pre-professional work and three of professional study, leading to a Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy degree. To graduate, one has to complete more than 160 hours of college work, including approximately 40 hours of Biological Science and 40 hours of Chemistry and Applied Chemistry. There are six departments within the School of Pharmacy — Physiology and Anatomy, Pharmaceutics, Pharmacy Administration, Pharmacology, Medicinal Chemistry and Pharmacognosy. Graduates enter community practice, hospital practice, government service (Public Health, Veterans Administration, state hospital practice) or employment in the pharmaceutical industry.

Social Sciences

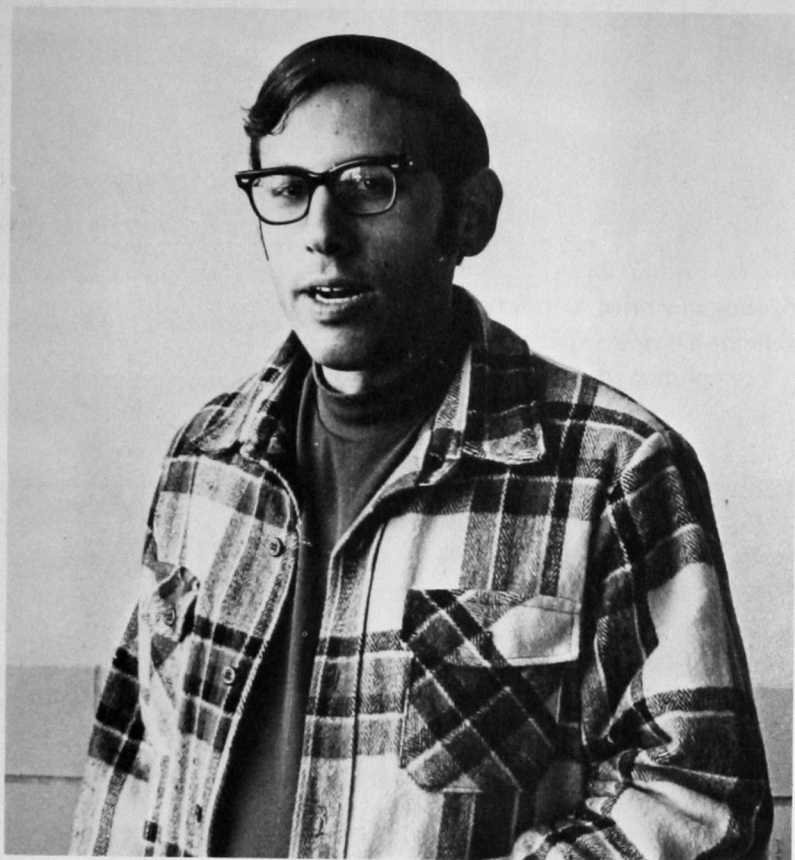

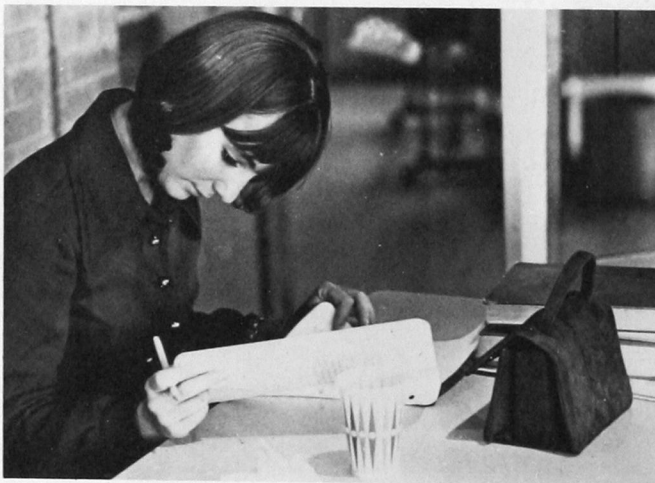
Student Center

Student Senate

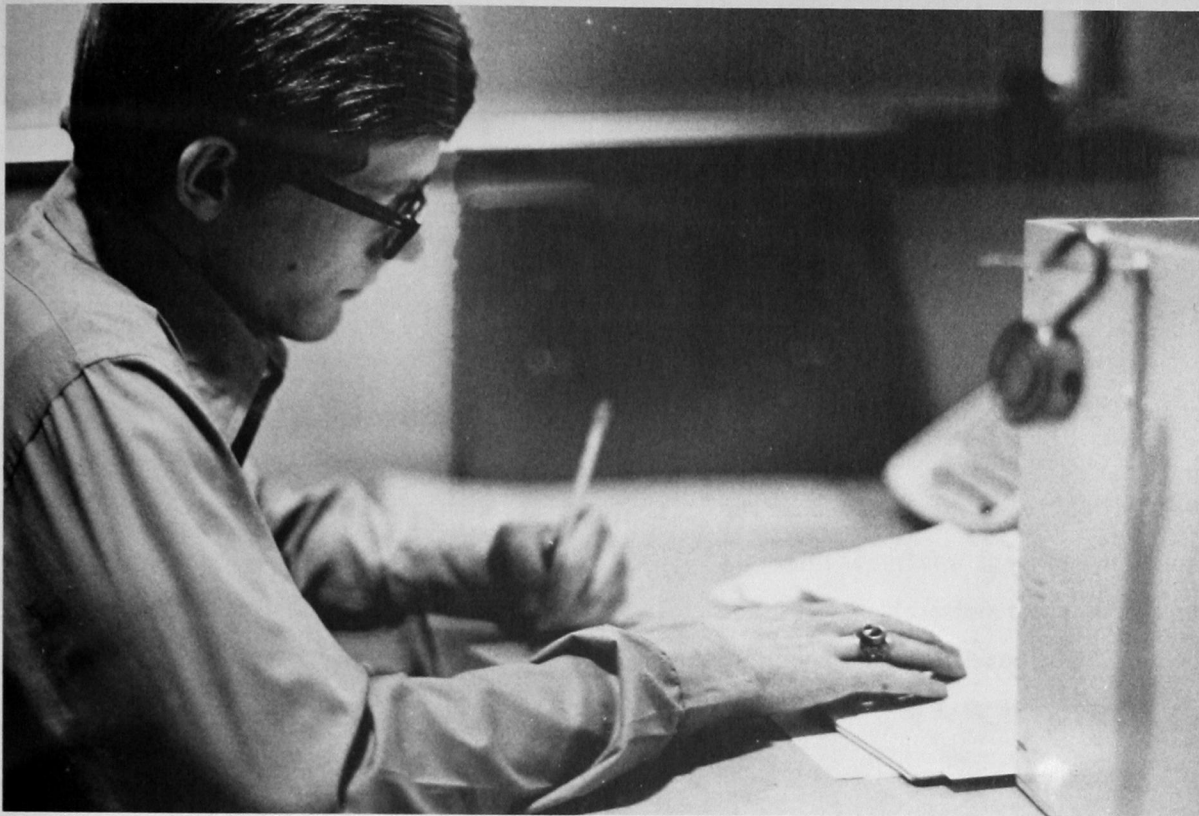

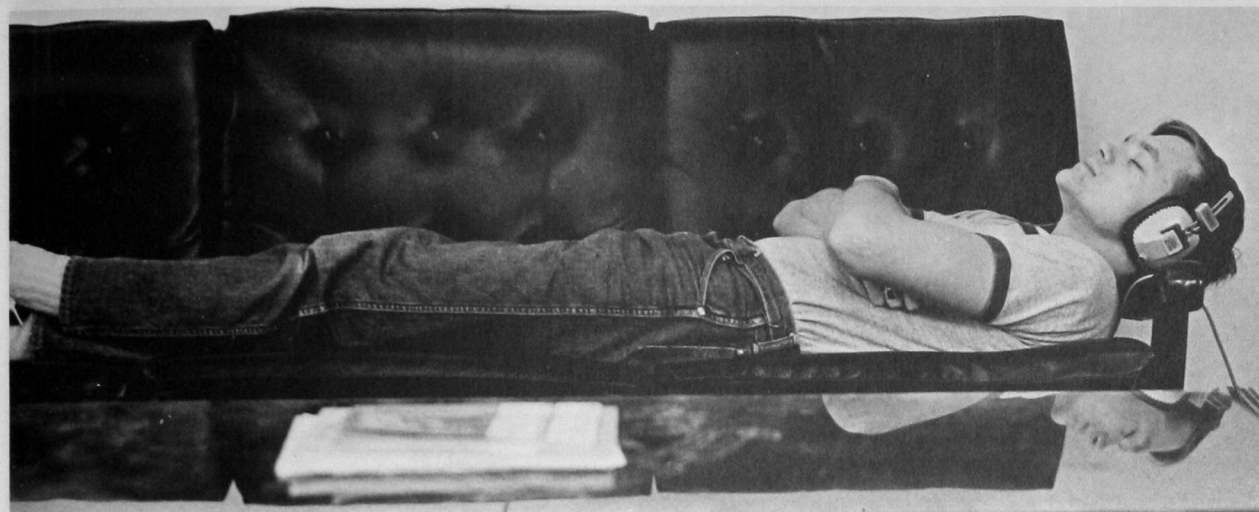

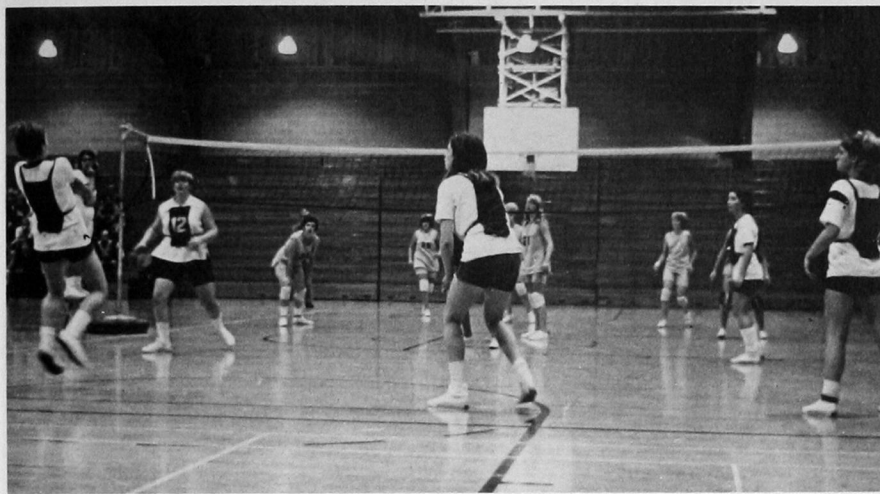

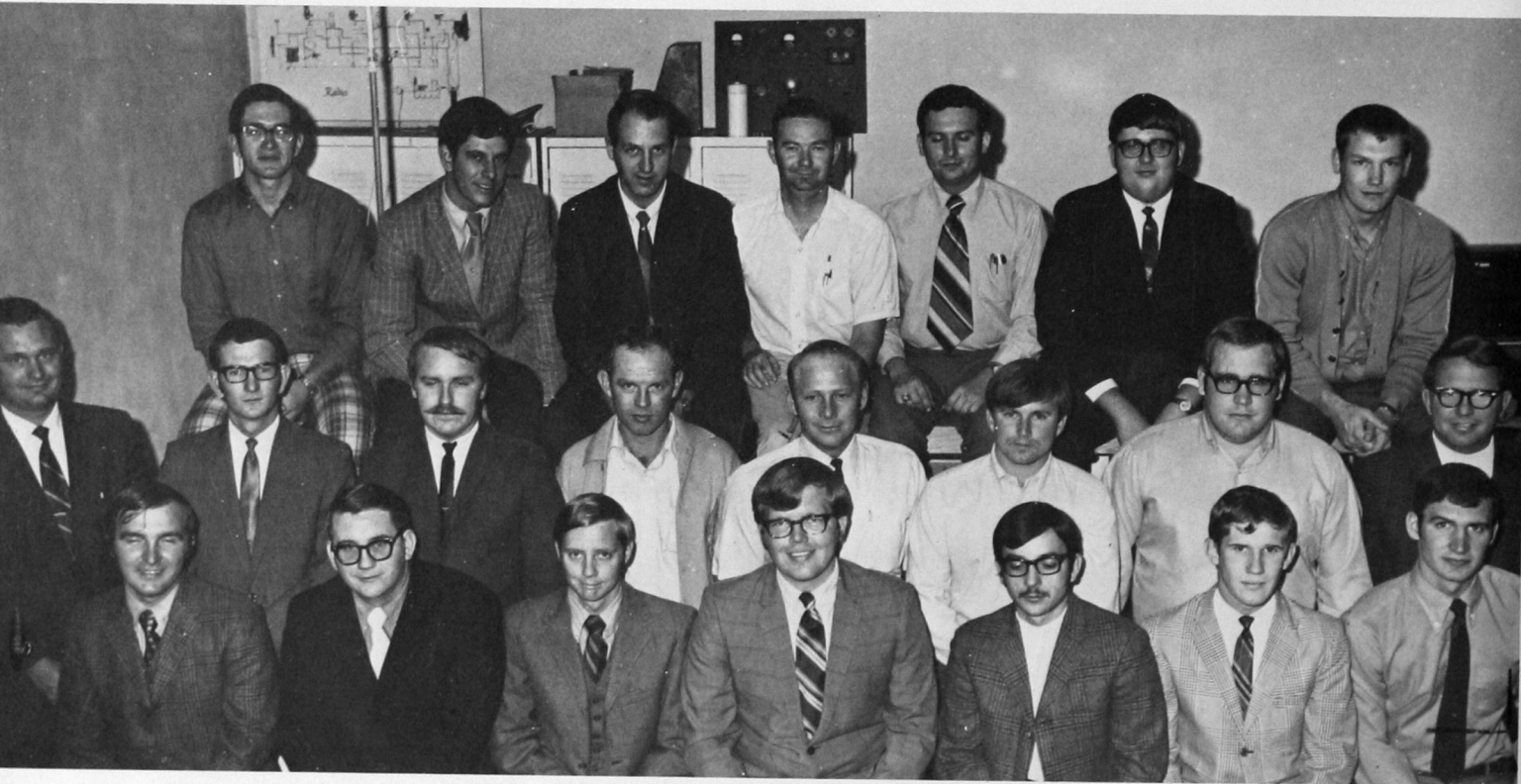

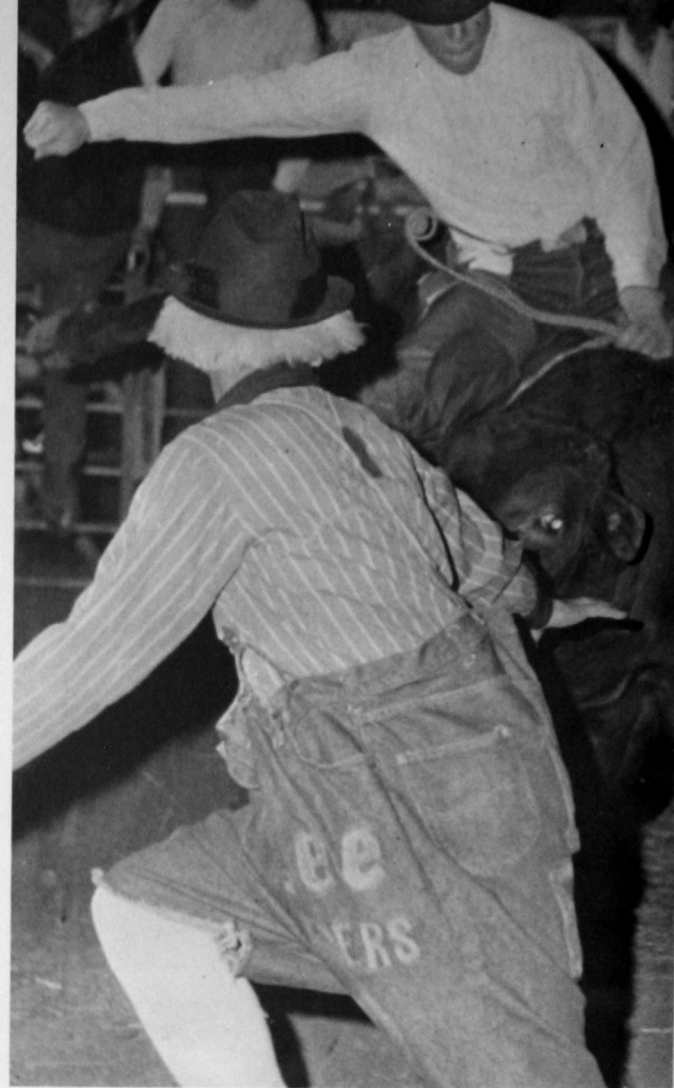

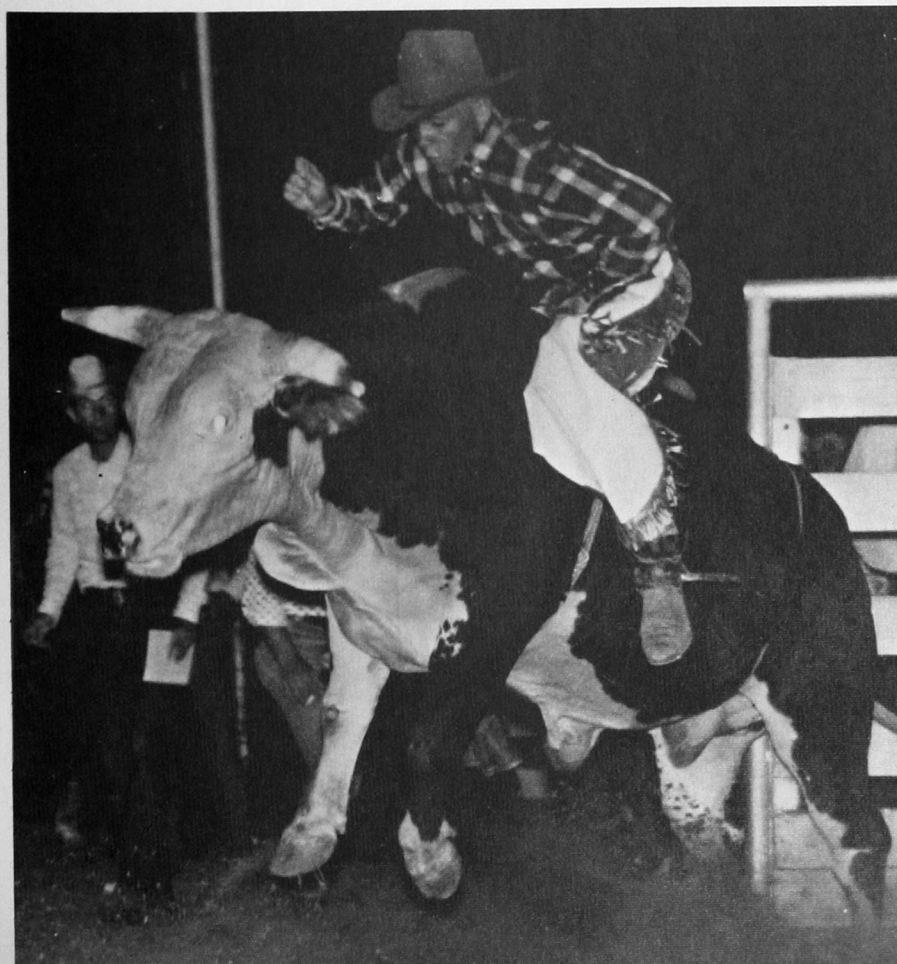

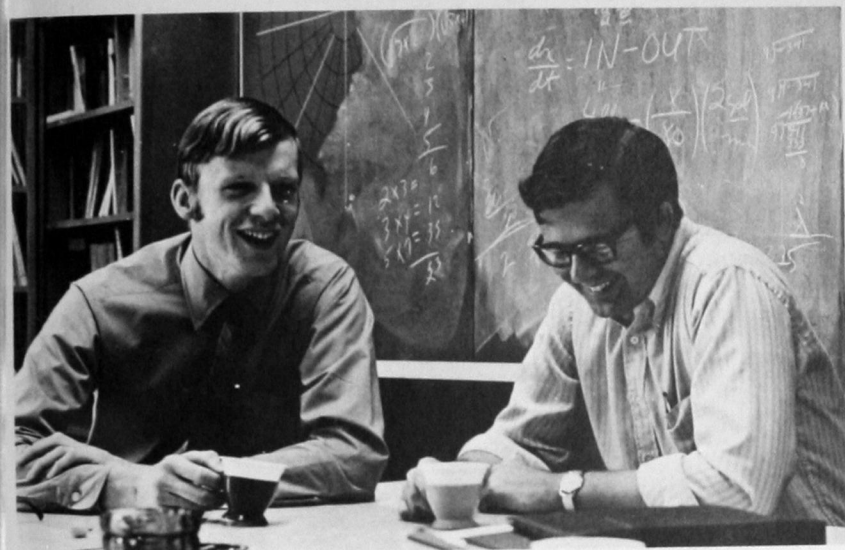

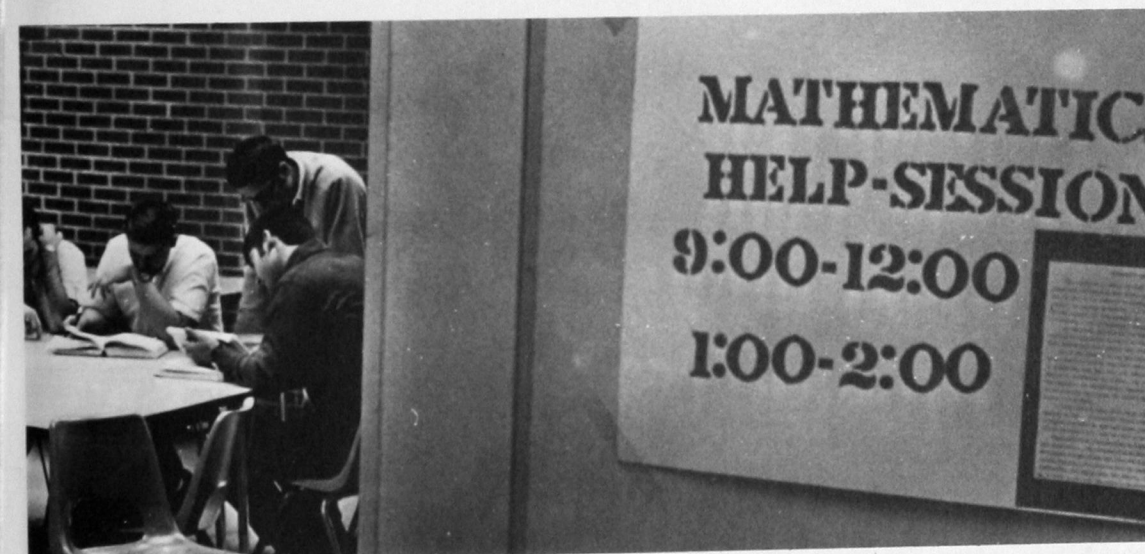

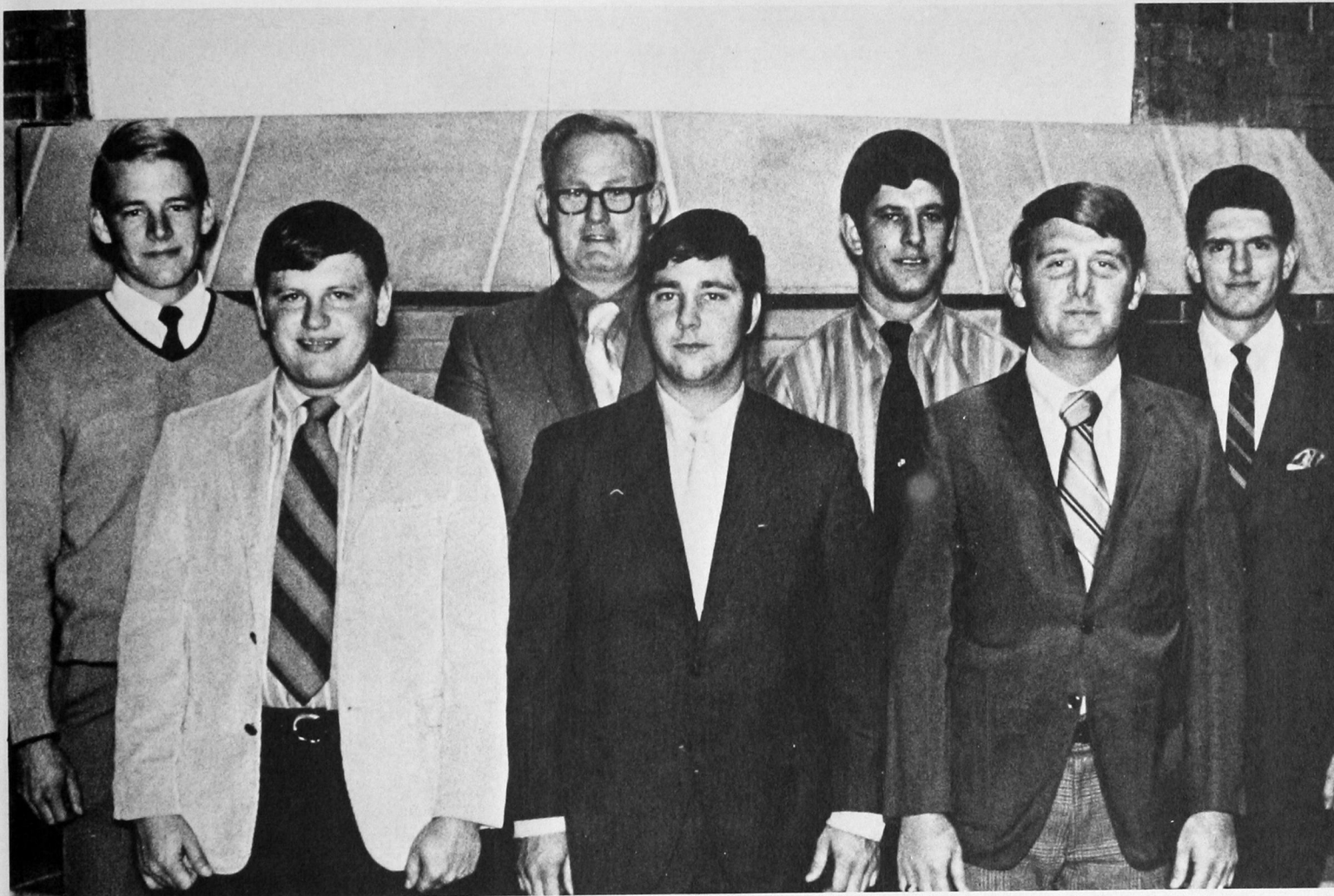

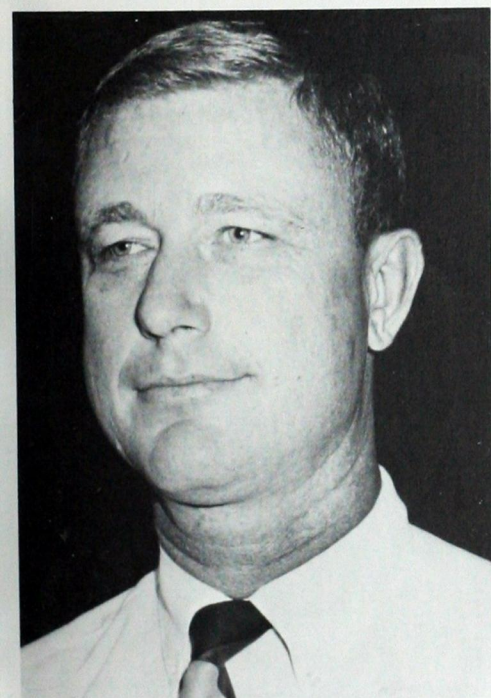

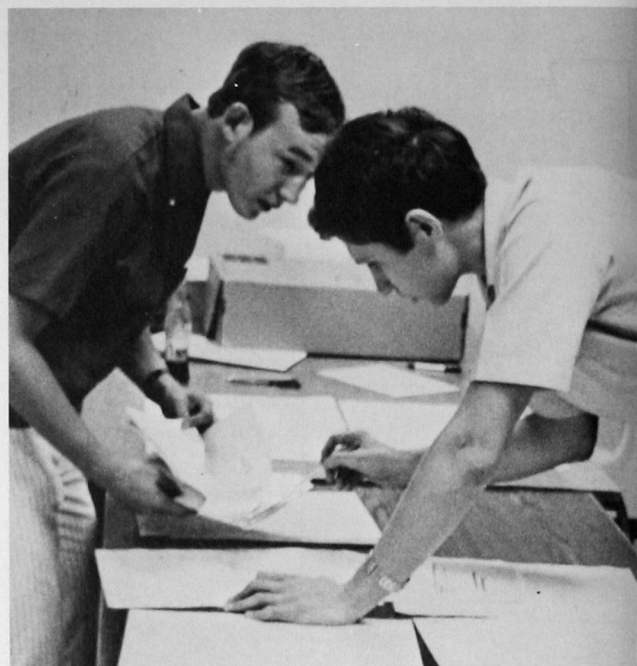

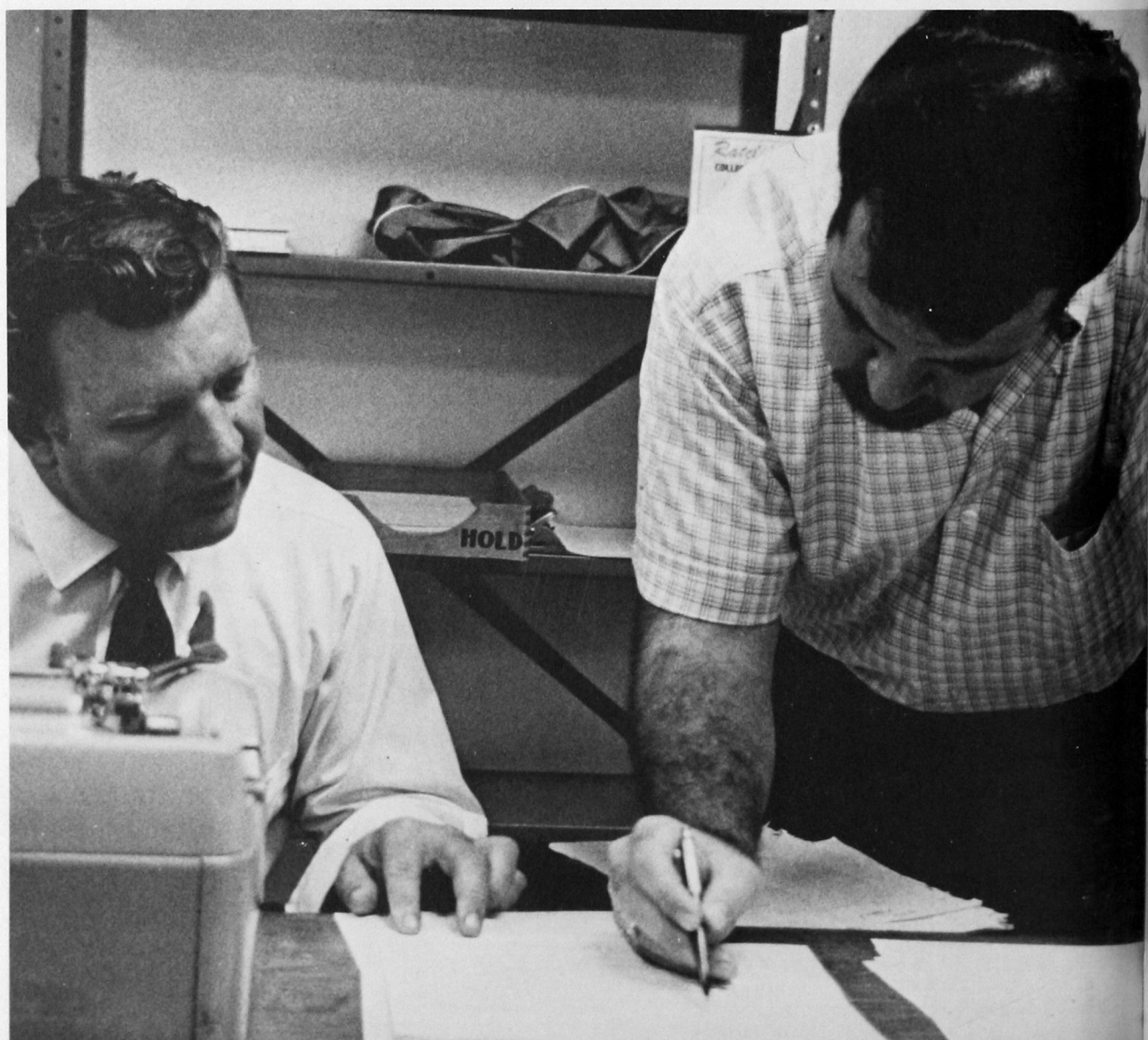

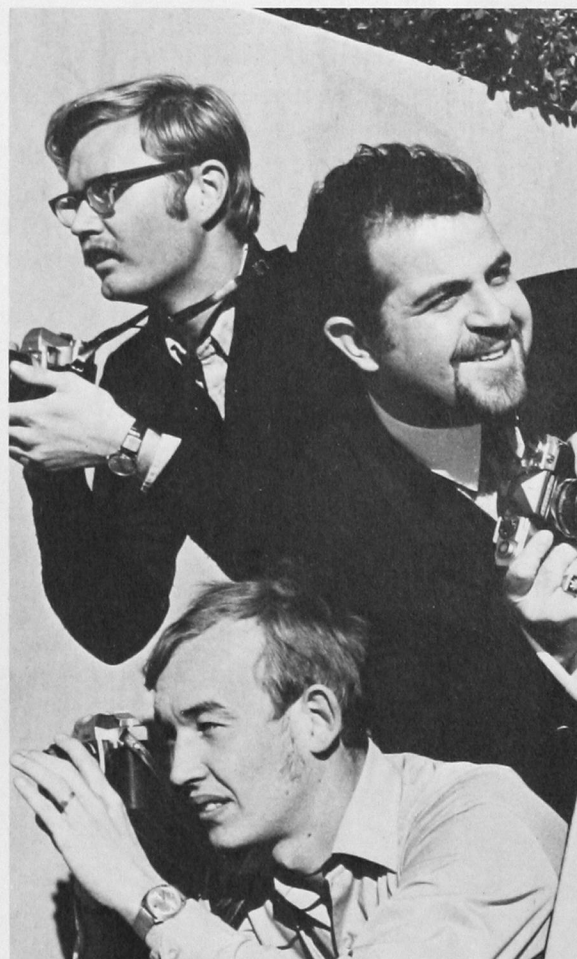


The Southwestern — Student Produced Newspaper

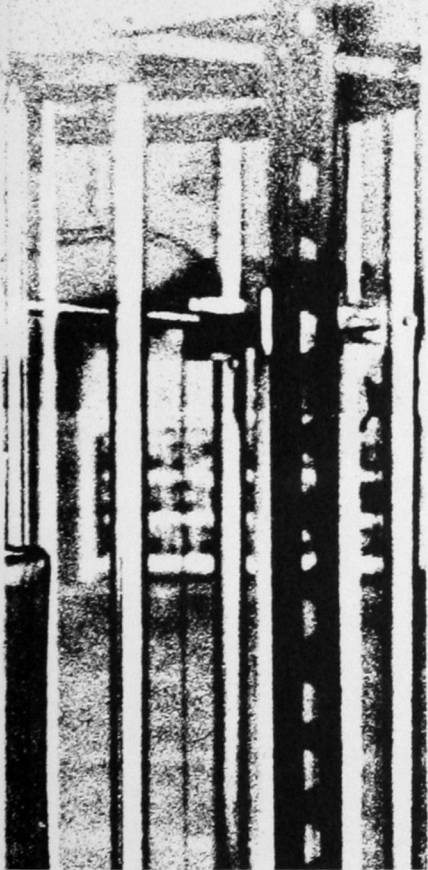

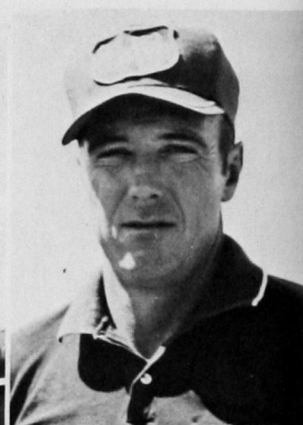

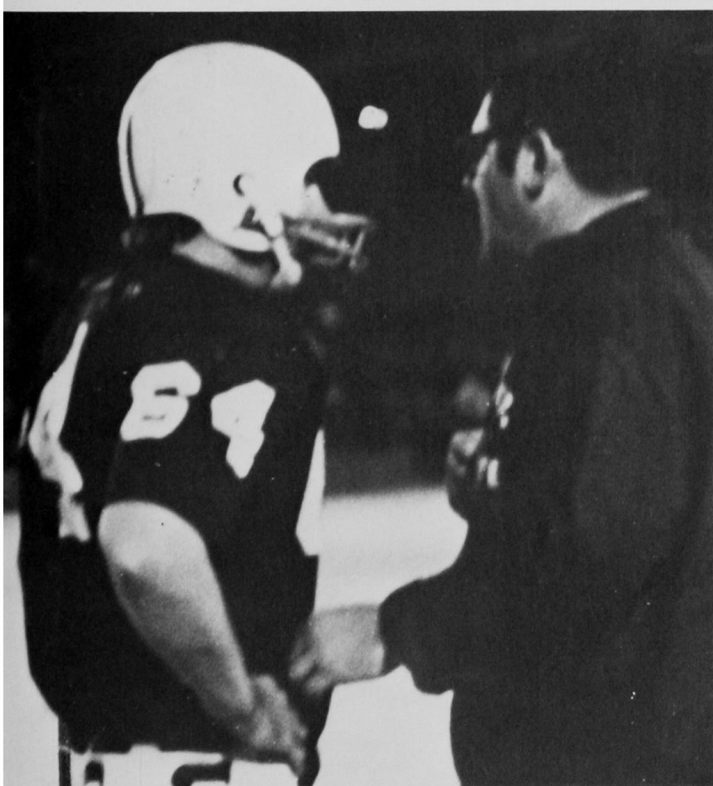

But the fabled toe of Eugene Wilton came through and won a last minute 24-21 victory for Southwestern.

Southeastern proved to be no match for the now co-ordinated SWSC bunch and a 42-13 game was a different tale as the Dogs took on sixth ranked Northeastern. Travelling out of state and out of conference seemed to agree with running back Charles Hicks in the Dogs next outing and enroute to a 31-20 victory, Hicks reeled off 294 yards to set a new OCAC mark.

East Central was the Homecoming foe and represented a real threat to Southwestern as the Tigers had one of the most impressive offenses in the nation. The opponents maintained its large yardage average, but SWSC came out on top where it counts — the scoreboard with a 30-19 victory.



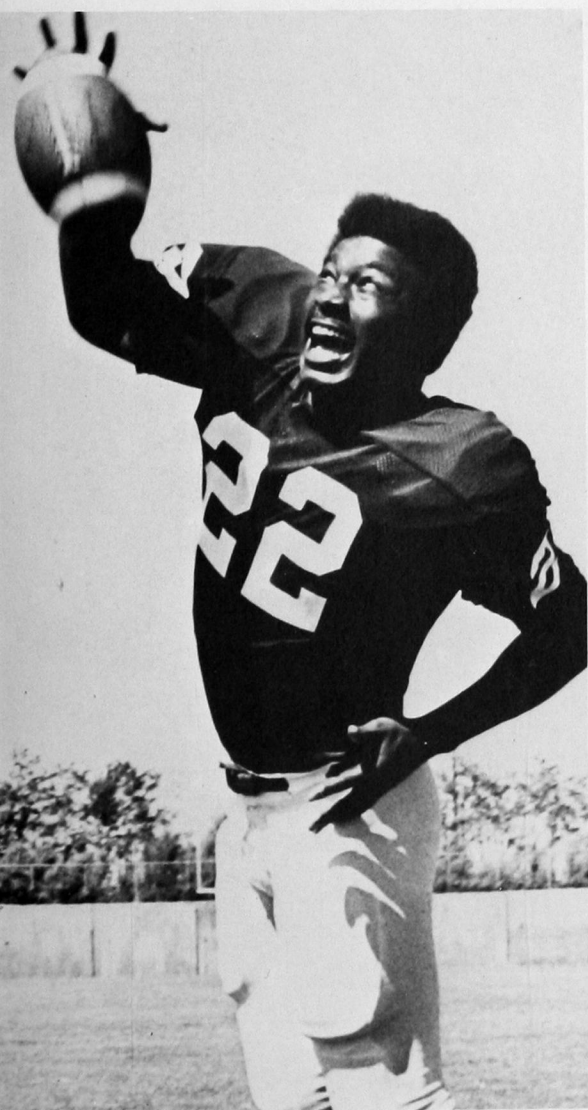

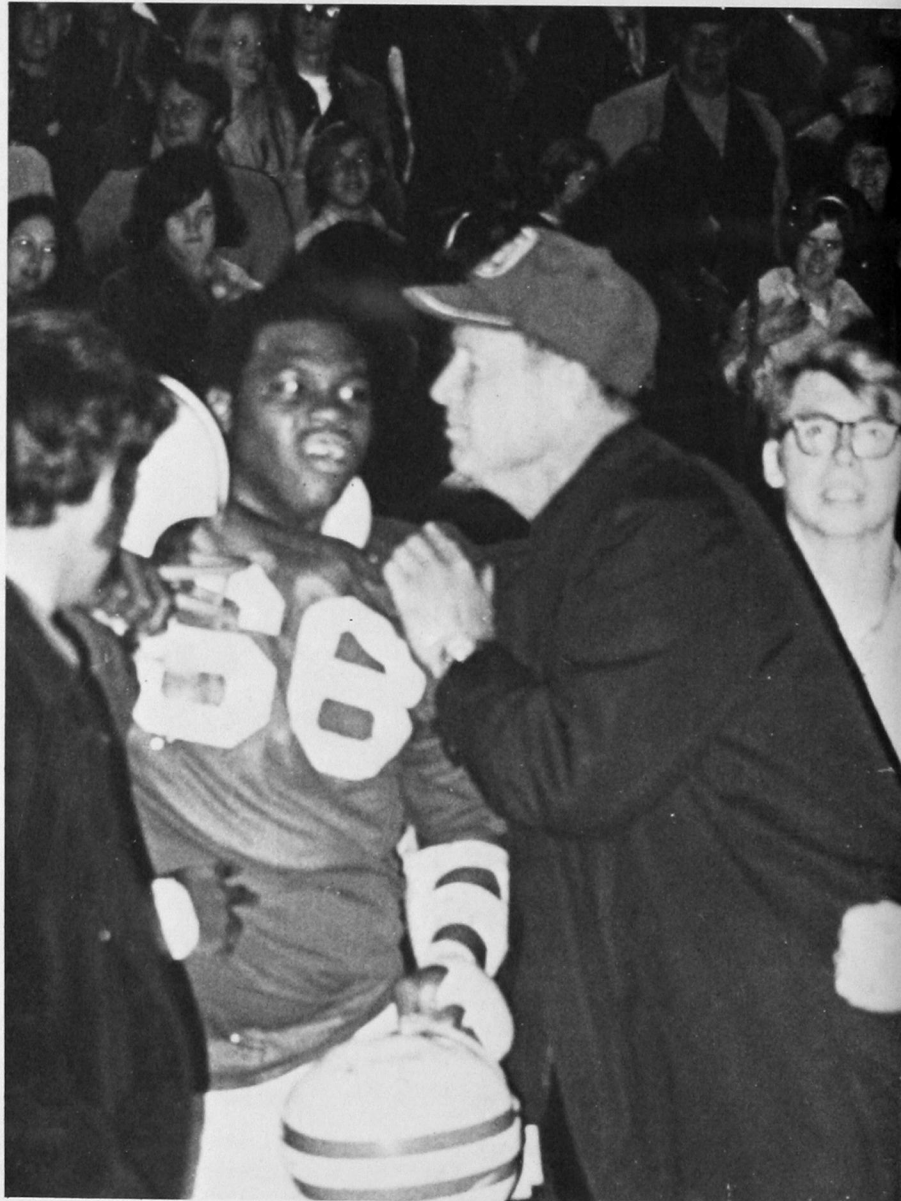

The second shock came in the form of a fired-up Northwestern team. The Rangers put on an outstanding defensive show and Southwestern had to be satisfied with a 7-0 win.

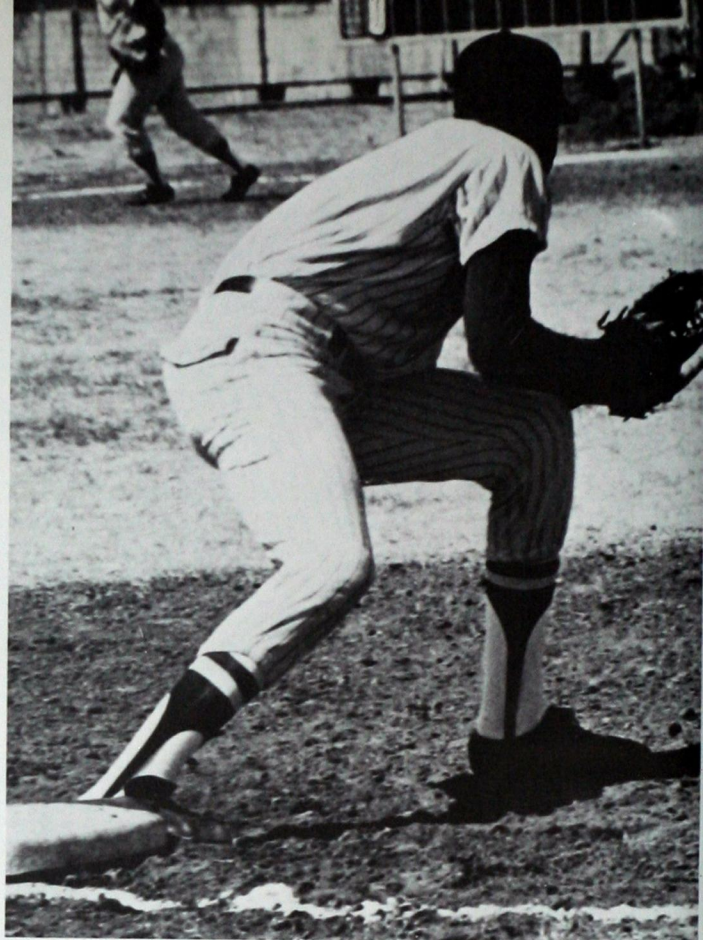
Dogs Promise Good Year

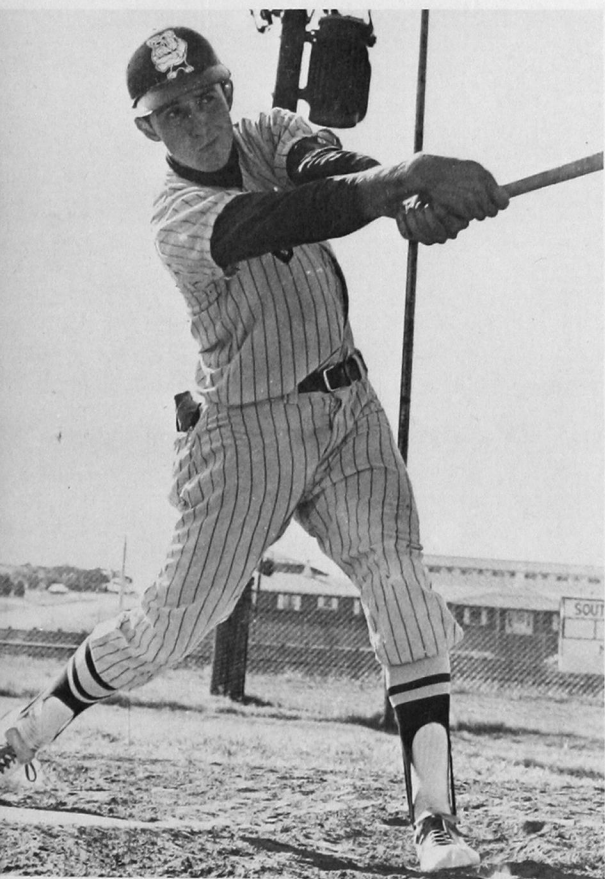

Leisure Time Sports Grow at Southwestern

In a recreation oriented world the health, physical education, and recreation programs will have an everlasting value by aiding students in learning a greater appreciation and understanding of outdoor living and other leisure time skills through instruction, participation, and the learning of safety skills through first hand experience. Students are offered the added benefit of two sessions of summer short courses in a variety of

sports skills, orientation experiences, including golf, water safety, sailing, canoeing, archery, bait casting, rhythms, and a camp cooking demonstration. These courses are offered from May 30 through June 6 and from August 1 through August 8. Two college hours in Physical Education are given for each session after the students have completed all of the requirements.

Students in the swimming classes must swim many laps across the pool to keep in shape.

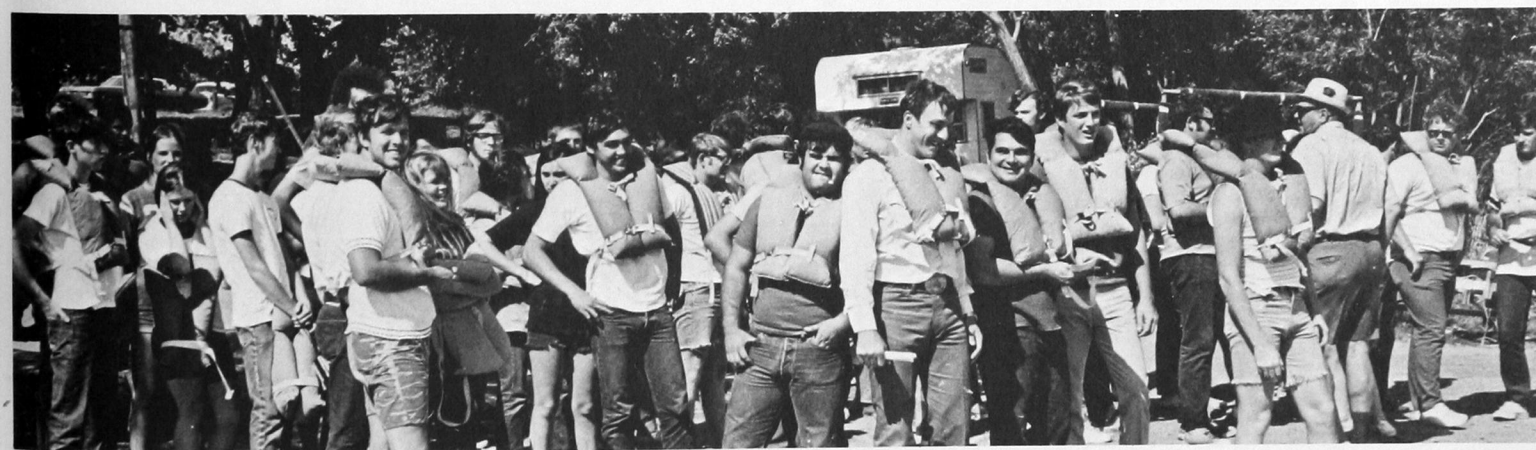

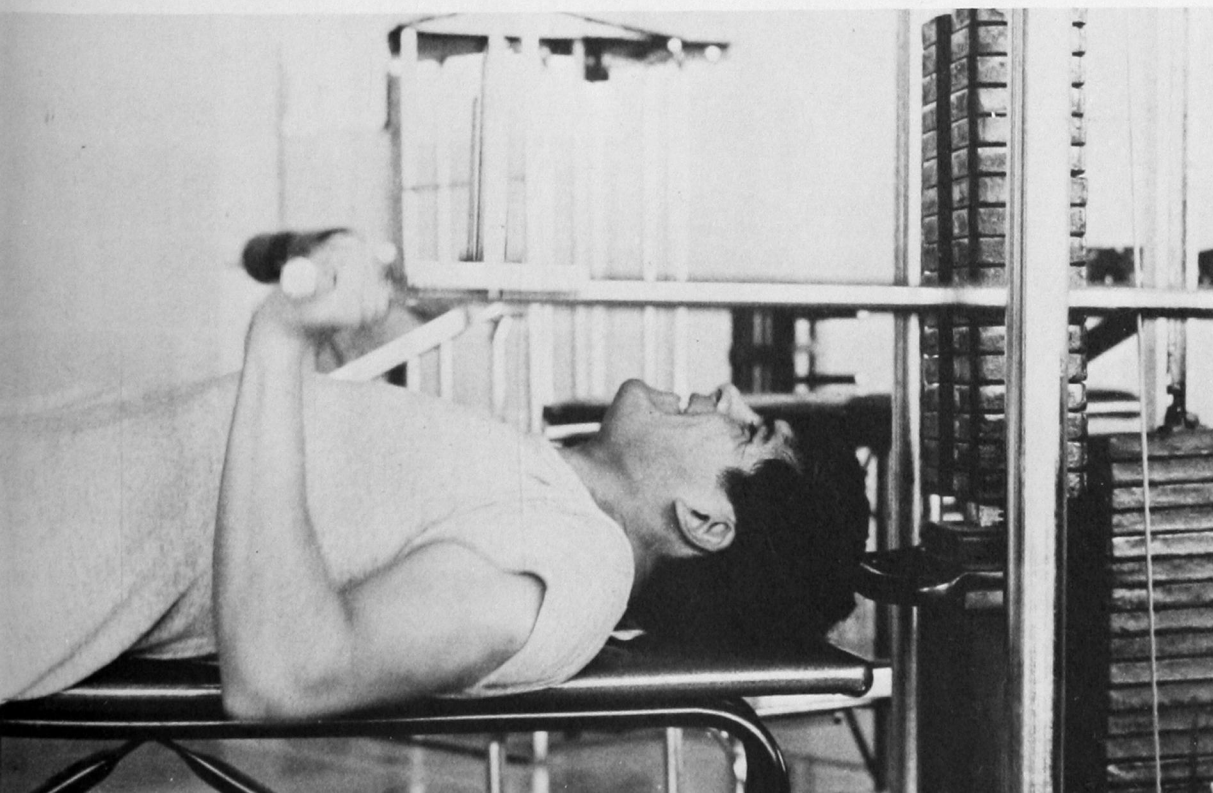


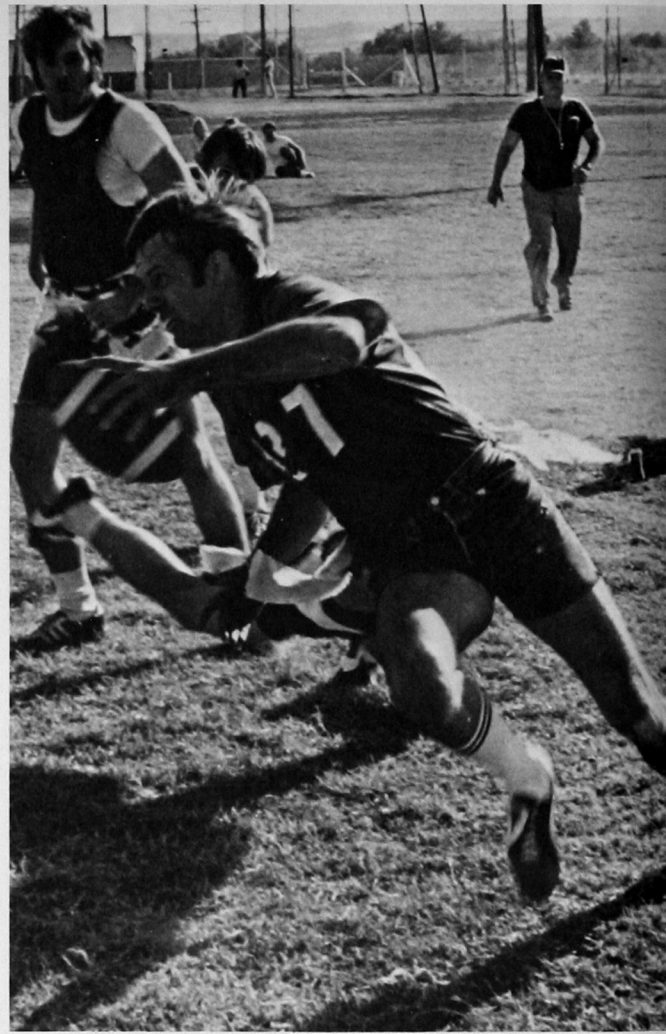

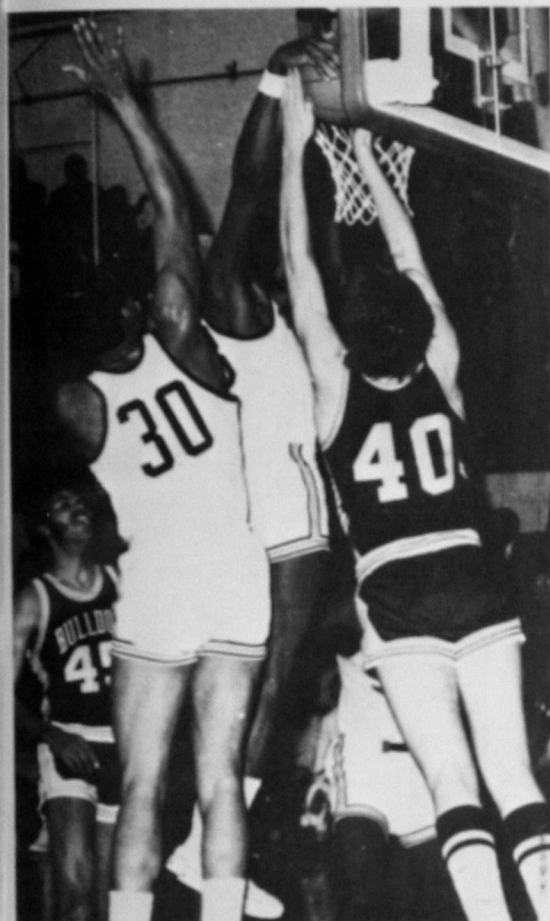

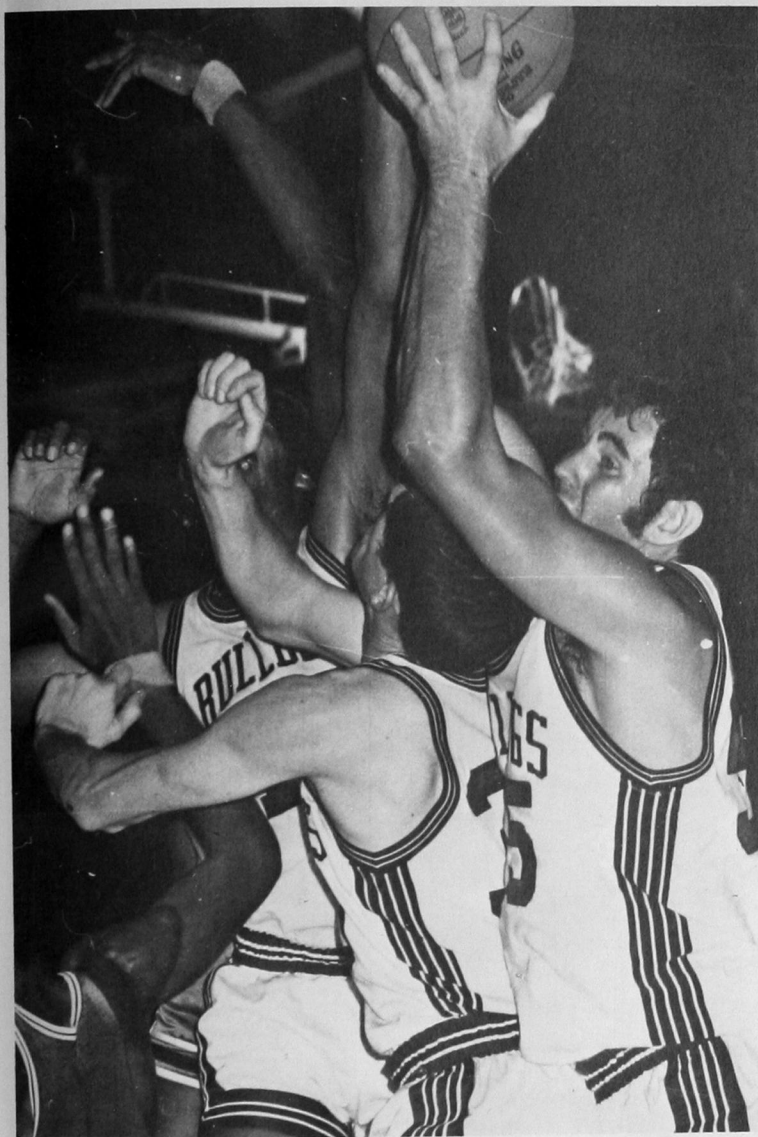

Bulldogs battle together to get their hands on the ball.

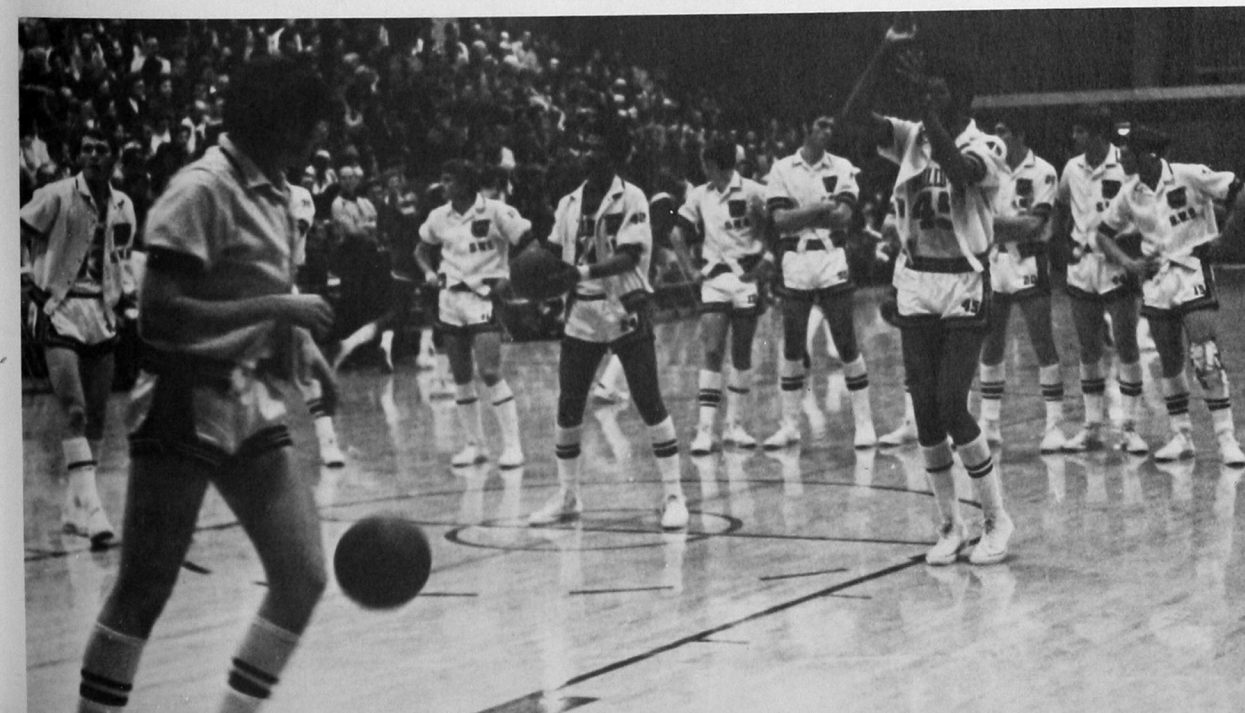

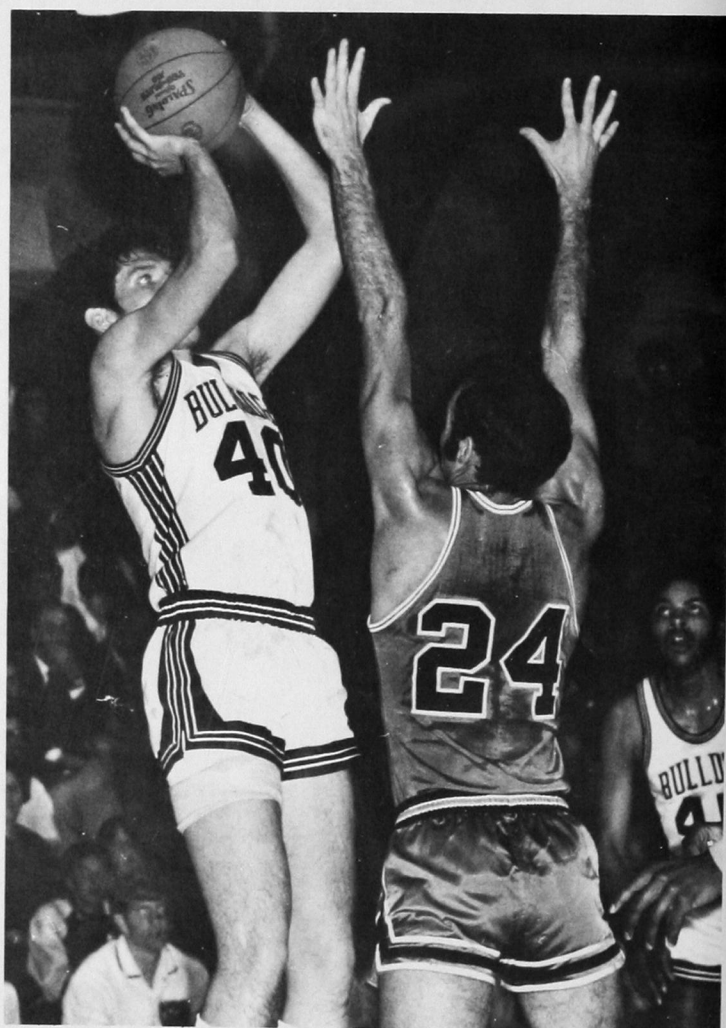

Southwestern went on to win 10 straight games and set its record at 18-5 overall and 14-3 in the OCAC.

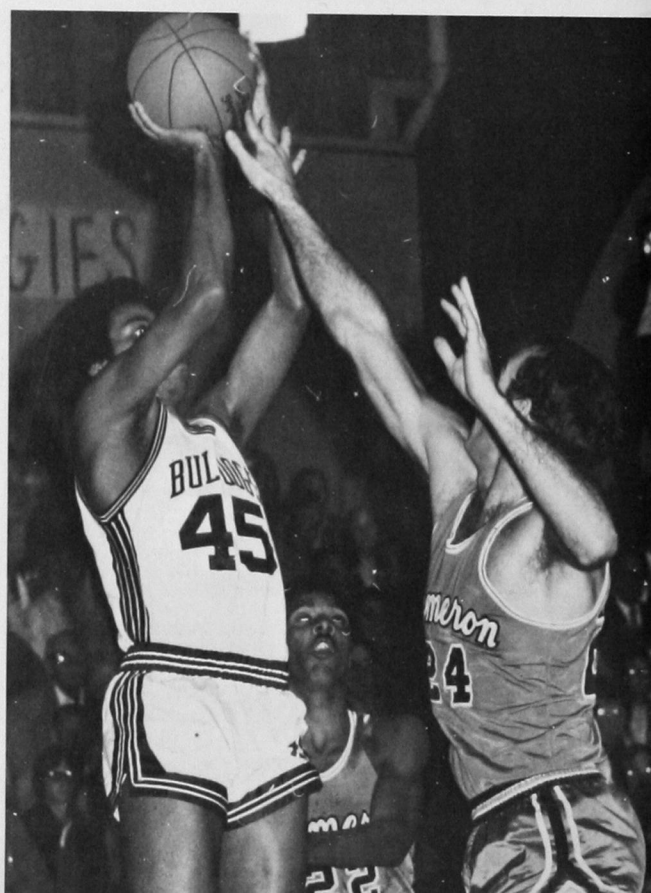
Ken Turner was quarterback of the cage Bulldogs this season. Working out front, Turner set up patterns and was the ball handler of the team.

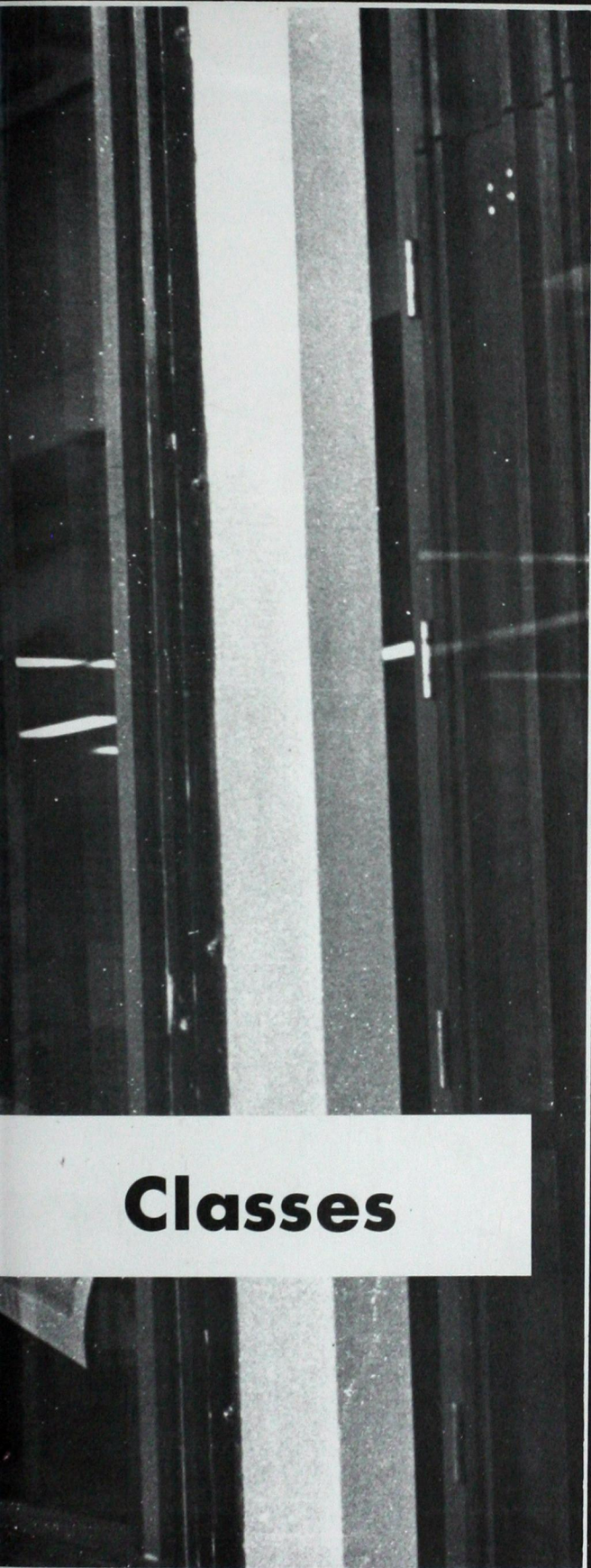
