## Distinguished Alumni Induction at Game

Three outstanding alumni of Southwestern Oklahoma State University will be inducted in the Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame. They are: Margaret Renz Replogle, M. A. Diel, and Frances Avritt Curb.

The three honorees will be recognized Saturday, Oct. 22, at the Southwestern Alumni Luncheon at 11:30 a.m. in the Student Union Ballroom, with formal inductions scheduled at halftime of the 2 p.m. Homecoming football game.

Dr. Leonard Campbell, Southwestern Oklahoma State University president, will present each a bronze plaque mounted on walnut. The plaques read in part: "Presented with pride for achievement of eminence in his/her community and to his/her nation."

A color portrait of the honorees will be hung in the Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame located at the Al Harris Library in the Southwestern Room.

Tables will be reserved for the classes of 1933, 1958, 1973, and the 1933 football team. Southwestern alumni blankets will be presented to the alumni that traveled the furthest distance, alumni that had the most children to graduate from SWOSU, and the oldest alumni.

Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame member, Margaret Renz Replogle, was born in Odessa, Russia, where her father was Indo European telegrapher. When she was only a small child, her parents, Jacob and Marie Renz, decided to leave the wealth and prosperity of their heritage and move their young family of six away from Russia's increasing turmoil and impending bloody revolution. On Aug. 15, 1911, they boarded the passenger ship Hanover for the 22-day trip to the United States.

After visting with relatives for several weeks in Hillsboro, Kan., the Renz family settled on farmland at Weatherford. Mrs. Replogle remembers well the hours she spent helping bale hay, chop corn, milk cows, and wash the family laundry on scrub boards.

Determined and intensely interested in acquiring an education, she worked for the Ben Kramer's for her room and board while attending high school and college. Upon receiving her coveted bachelor of science degree, she began teaching school in Erick.

She later accepted a position as a laboratory technician in the University of Oklahoma Medical School Histology and Embryology Department, and still later became an X-ray technician in the Balyeat Hayfever and Asthma Clinic in Oklahoma City where she met her future husband, Dakotah Replogle. They were married in 1944.

Since the loss of Mr. Replogle in 1957, Margaret has kept an active volunteer involvement with a number of organizations.

In 1975, Mrs. Replogle made a \$38,400.00 contribution to Southwestern Oklahoma State University for the purpose of establishing a permanent scholarship fund and named the Margaret Renz

Replogle Scholarship.

The Replogle Chapel at the First Christian Church in Oklahoma City was funded in the amount of \$35,000.00 by Mrs. Replogle in 1978.

In 1982, Margaret presented Deaconess Hospital a gift for \$100,000.00 earmarked for equipment and furnishings for the hospital's center for newborn infants. The gift was one of the largest in the hospital's history. The center has been named the Margaret R. Replogle Neonatology Center.

Mrs. Replogle was involved in the organization of the Ladies Advisory Board of the Deaconess Home and served three terms as president. She also was active in planning the new home which was completed in 1971. She served on the executive committee and co-chaired the fund drive for the home, contributing \$40,000.00 toward its construction.

The Margaret R. Replogle Endowed Chair in Religion was established at Oklahoma City University through the generous gift of \$250,000.00 in memory of her late husband, D. Replogle. She received an honorary doctor's degree from OCU at the commencement ceremonies in 1982. She also endowed \$200,000.00 for music scholarships at OCU in 1965 and 1967.

She serves on the Board of Directors and the Executive Board of the Salvation Army and Women's Auxiliary. She donated total funds (\$100,000.00) for the "Heart of the Hills" Salvation Army Chapel in Tahlequah, and donated total funds of \$100,000.00 for a new Salvation Army Chapel being built in Oklahoma City.

She is on the Administrative Board of her church, St. Luke's United Methodist; the Ladies' Advisory Board of the Home of Redeeming Love; and a member of the Board of the Willow View Psychiatric Treatment Center in Oklahoma City.

The Oklahoma City woman is a co-organizer of the Junior Auxiliary to the Salvation Army and has been its advisor for more than 10 years. She is an active participant in the Big Sisters organization, a staunch supporter of World Neighbors, the Oklahoma City Symphony, and the Oklahoma Art Center.

In 1970 she established, and has since made sizeable contributions to a fund in the Oklahoma City Community Foundation, with annual proceeds going to World Neighbors and the Salation Army.

Mrs. Replogle is the sixth of eight children. Her two younger brothers were born in the United States. One brother, Oscar Renz, also graudated from Southwestern

where he lettered in basketball, and served for a time as postmaster of Weatherford. He now lives in Torrance, Calif.

Other members of her family are two brothers--Reverend F. J. Renz, Coronado, Calif., and Richard Renz, New Smyrna Beach, Fla. Her sisters are Mrs. Walter (Emma) Kaiser, Santa Fe, N.M.; Miss Peggy Renz, Tulsa, Okla.; Mrs. Ben (Adelia) Kissler, Denver, Colo., and Elinor Anderson, who died from an accidental drowning.

M. A. Diel, a lifetime supporter of Southwestern Oklahoma State University, was born in Hitchcock and graduated from high school there in 1932. He received both his B.A. degree in 1936 and his master's degree in 1958 from Southwestern. He spent one year as elementary principal at Watonga before going to Cyril in a similar capacity for four years.

From 1941 to 1946 he was employed as an accountant in California, and he returned to Oklahoma and operated a hardware and implement business firm of Lorenz and Sons and Lorenz and Diel.

He was named principal of Southwest Elementary School in Clinton in 1956 through 1964, when he accepted the position of superintendent of the Corn Public Schools. He resigned at Corn when he was appointed registrar at Southwestern, a position he held from 1966-68. He accepted the position of superintendent of schools at Clinton for seven years until his retirement.

Diel served as a member of the state House of Representatives from 1960-1964. He was appointed to the Board of Regents for State Colleges in 1973. In 1979, Governor Nigh appointed him as District Seven Highway Commissioner for the Oklahoma Transportation Department which includes the counties of Ellis, Roger Mills, Dewey, Custer, Washita, Beckham, Greer, Kiowa, Harmon, Jackson, and Tillman.

He served as the Mayor of Thomas' Executive Board of the OEA, Board of Directors of the Chamber of Commerce, Drive Chairman of the Clinton United Fund, member of the Rotary Club and the United Methodist Church.

Marion married Virginia Lorenz, and they have two daughters--Mrs. Wayne (Jody) Salisbury and Mrs. Don (Sue Ayn) Moore, both of Clinton. Marion was a former debate partner of Ed Berrong, who was inducted in the Hall of Fame last year.

It is a coincidental oddity that Frances Avritt Curb will be honored as a distinguished alumnus at Southwestern University 53 years to the day that she was crowned Homecoming Queen at that same institution.

Mrs. Curb is thrilled to "be able to return to my alma mater to make the same walk to the center of the field in Milam Stadium."

The homecoming day on Oct. 22, 1930, was a gala affair for Southwestern as the then-new football field was to be used for the first time. The Honorable William Holloway, then-Governor of Oklahoma, was present to inaugurate the new stadium.

A native of Weatherford, Okla., Frances attended the public schools here, graduating from high school in 1928. She completed high school in three years and was valedictorian of her senior class. Southwestern is her college home. Here she received a B.A. degree and the M.T. degree. Additional graduate work in administration was completed at the University of Oklahoma.

During her tenure at Southwestern, Mrs. Curb recalls working on "The Oracle" and serving as a reporter for "The Southwestern." She played the lead in "Madame Butterfly," and was a member of the Women's Chorus and the Bull Pups. In 1929 she was selected Sophomore Queen.

Besides her husband Joe, of 51 years, Mrs. Curb has had four great loves to which she has given 110 per cent of her life and energies: family and home, her profession and youth, Church, community and America.

Both Joe and Frances have spent their lives as educators, teaching from 1933-1942 at Lahoma and Arnett Schools in Harmon County and in Lawton from 1950-1973 when they retired. Frances served the Lawton Schools as a teacher, elementary principal, and director of federal programs.

During the war years, while her husband was in Naval Service, Frances was a naval aircraft inspector, examining planes doing Atlantic duty. She also was a foreman for the Douglas Aircraft Company in Chicago, building C-54s.

In her profession as an educator, Mrs. Curb was active in many capacities at local, district, state, and national levels. She was Southwest District OEA president and served on the Executive Committee. Other organizations served included: president

of Lawton and Southwest District Classroom Teachers, president of the Oklahoma Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development and on the National Board of Directors for that organization, secretary to the Lawton and Southwest District Elementary Principal's Association, secretary to the Oklahoma Elementary Principal's Association and yearbook editor for the state group, president of the Comanche County Retired Teachers' Association, historian for the Lawton PTA Council and decorations chairman for the state conference, PTA, a member of the Board of Directors of Southwestern Oklahoma State University Alumni Association, and a member of the AAUW, Lawton.

Six governors and two mayors have honored Mrs. Curb with appointments as follows: Oklahoma Curriculum Improvement Commission, Oklahoma Teacher Education and Professional Standards Commission, National Teacher Education and Professional Standards Commission, Oklahoma Health Committee of the State Department of Health, Oklahoma Conference on Education, White House Conference on Education, Oklahoma Commission on Teacher Education and Certification, Governor's Council on Pride in Oklahoma, and Our Heritage in America.

Mrs. Curb enjoyed conducting workshops for teachers and was involved in this capacity throughout the state in the following areas of instruction: Teaching Disadvantaged Youth, Americanism, Character Education, Health in the Elementary School, The Living Textbook, Elementary School Art Activities, Our American Heritage, and Pride in Oklahoma. These were conducted for the State Department of Education, the Governor's Office, and the State Health Department.

Serving on the editorial staff for the Curriculum Division of the State Department of Education, Mrs. Curb assisted in the development of the following state teacher's guide books: Health Education, Drug Education, Art Education, Oklahoma History, Vocational Guidance, Nutrition, Physical Fitness, Elementary School Evaluation Manual, Pride in Oklahoma, and Our Heritage in America.

Mrs. Curb served as elementary advisor and consultant for The Daily Oklahoman.

Involvement in activities for community improvement has been important and rewarding to Mrs. Curb. She was chairman for a committee to sponsor a contest and select a design for a Lawton

City Flag. She served as chairman for Lawton's first summer park activities for children. Other activities include: Charter member of Lawton Human Relations Commission and chairman for the Social, Cultural and Recreation Committee, member of the Lawton Park Board, Lawton Block Grant Committee, Lawton Bicentennial Project, member of the Board of Directors of the Museum of the Great Plains and Long-Range Planning Committee, Art Director of Lawton Women's Forum, president of Altrusa International, sponsor of Allied Officers at Fort Sill, member of Southwest Oklahoma Genealogical Society, and Daughters of the American Revolution where she has been active at local and state levels. She has been a Red Cross Gray Lady, a Den Mother, and Girl Scout Leader.

A member of the First Baptist Church, Mrs. Curb is a member of the Community Service Committee. She, in the past, has served as a Sunday School teacher, superintendent of departments, Church Clerk, and Scholarship Committee.

Other honors Mrs. Curb cherishes include the Lawton Outstanding Educator Award, a Lawton city park has been named for her in recognition of service to children, listed in Who's Who in American Women, "Two Thousand Women of Achievement, International" in 1969, and national awards from the National DAR for work with children in Junior American Citizens in 1967-69, 1972, and 1973.

Robert E. Lee School, where she served as principal for 10 years, this year established a "Frances Curb Award" which is given annually to a sixth grade boy and girl who most exemplifies good character and citizenship. The school motto while she served as principal was "Don't wait to be a great man or woman. Be a great kid."

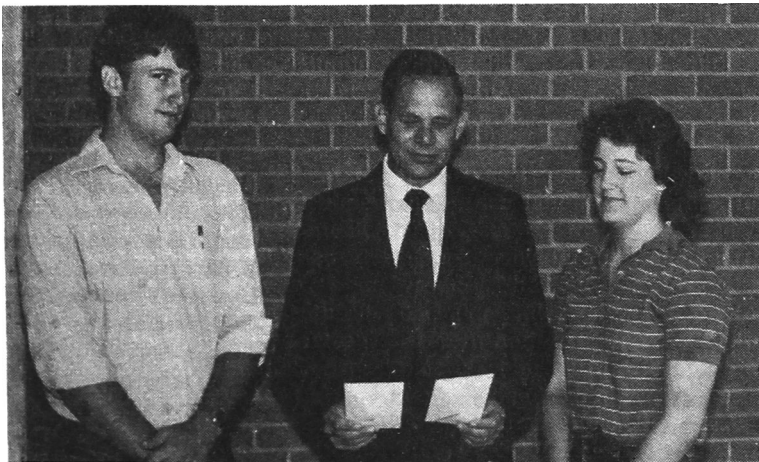
The newly-retired instructor says she thinks it was ironic that her retirement came one year before air-conditioning was to be installed in her second grade classroom.

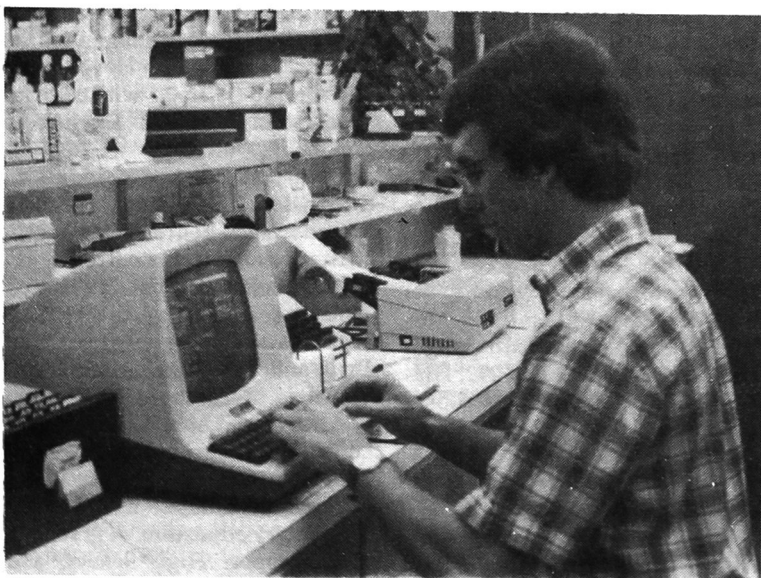

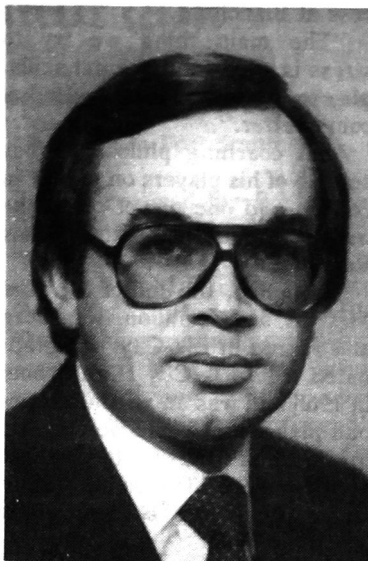

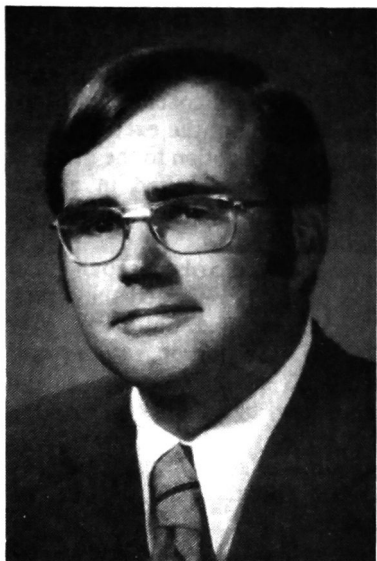

# Vermillion Honored Southwestern Athletic Hall of Fame Member Honored

Most people don't have places named after them until they're very old or have passed on. T. J. "Sonny" Vermillion Jr.--very much alive and coaching in Blanchard--is one of the exceptions. A lifetime of devotion to the game of baseball has resulted in a rare honor for the 35-year-old Elk City native.

The Blanchard baseball field was officially renamed the Sonny Vermillion Field Saturday, May 21, in recognition of Vermillion's 13 successful years as the Blanchard baseball coach.

"I tell you what," said Vermillion, "it's something you don't dream about. It's a tremendous honor."

Blanchard, a small city of 1,600 located 20 miles south of Oklahoma City, has brought home two state high school baseball titles in the last five years under Vermillion's tutelage. But that's only part of Blanchard's baseball success. Vermillion has put together a 305-87 record at Blanchard and is one of just three active coaches to have won more than 300 games.

In the past six years, Vermillion has coached Blanchard to the state baseball tournament six times, resulting in two runnerup trophies in addition to the two state titles.

"I've had outstanding cooperation from the community and the school and some very good ath-

letes," Vermillion says of his success at Blanchard.

"The main thing we try to stress is good fundamental skills, play to the utmost, and try to become better."

That coaching philosophy has sent 26 of his players on to play in college and one player on to the major leagues with the Texas Rangers.

Vermillion, the son of Mr. and Mrs. T. J. Vermillion, was born and reared in Elk City. He graduated from Elk City High School in 1965 and was an all-state baseball player that year. He went on to play four years of baseball at Southwestern Oklahoma State University before beginning his coaching career.

"It's a great community to be from," Vermillion says of his Elk City roots. "Western Oklahoma gave me the background and encouragement to have some success."

Besides coaching at Blanchard, Vermillion also serves as president of the Oklahoma Baseball Coaches Association and vice-chairman of the Region 5 National Baseball Coaches Association that represents coaches from six states. That's a lot of baseball involvement, but Vermillion says he doesn't tire of it.

"Not really," he said.

Vermillion has had offers to coach at the college level but says he plans to stay in Blanchard.

Neither the threat of rain nor tornadoes dampened the enthusiasm of former pupils and teaching companions who turned out en-masse to give Mose and Virginia Sims a hearty "Well done!"

Sims, high school principal, retired after 39 years of service. Virginia, his wife, retired two years ago. The two were honored earlier by the graduating senior class, and a plaque with a statement of their dedication and loyalty was set permanently in the school hall near the door of the principal's office.

Sims, widely known in state teaching circles, took it all in stride. He was never squelched during his career as a teacher and was not squelched as it ended.

Originally from Erick, Sims was inducted into the Southwestern Oklahoma State University Athletic Hall of Fame for student achievements that included the National Amateur Athletic Union heavyweight wrestling title. He was an All-Conference football player twice, team captain, and in 1940, outstanding student on campus. He served in the Navy during WW II.

He was an assistant football coach after the war, but then the Sims' moved to the Con. 8 community where they still live. When the Con. 8 school was annexed to Roosevelt, Sims came along as high school principal and held the post 26 years. Mrs. Sims joined the faculty in 1962.

Sims made his mark early. Bill Sheet said, a way back in 1947, "If he ever quits, I don't know how the school will survive."

Sims inaugurated a football program here in the 1950's and produced Cecil Perkins, one of the state's great backs who is now athletic director at Southwestern. Football was abandoned after several years when "We ran out of kids."

Tributes were many on the honored night, following homemade ice cream and cake. A surprise climax was the presenting of a color television set from the community.

The two came down to inspect it, and Sims said, "Well, gosh, you all don't know how this makes us feel. I can't even begin--"

Mrs. Sims, into the microphone: "Thank you very much."

## Hostetter Honored with Banquet

One of Clinton's sports legends was honored at a dinner in connection with the alumni week activities. Claude "Hoss" Hostetter, who coached the Clinton Red Tornadoes in football, basketball, baseball, and track from 1925 to 1939, was honored at a dinner in the Oklahoma Room of the Oklahoma Bank and Trust in Clinton. Numerous former athletes who played for Hostetter attended.

Hostetter, now 83-years-old, guided the Reds to state championships in numerous sports. His football teams had successes that were not equalled by Clinton teams for nearly a half century. In 1928, he coached the Reds to their first undefeated football season. His teams had lost only one game in each of the two previous seasons.

In basketball, Hostetter's best teams compiled records of 28-2 in 1928 and 1929. During his entire coaching career, Hostetter had only two losing seasons in football and none in basketball.

As an athlete, Hostetter was also very successful. Having grown up on a farm near Foss, he was recruited to play for the Elk City semi-pro baseball team in 1916 where he earned \$10-15 a game as an infielder.

His athletic career continued at Southwestern Oklahoma State University where he played basketball, baseball, and football for four years. Although only 5'6", he was the Bulldogs' starting forward in basketball along with Rankin Williams, who later became a coach at SWOSU and for whom the school's field house is named. In baseball, Hostetter played catcher and second base for a Southwestern team that won an intercollegiate championship.

After graduating in 1922, Hostetter coached at Hydro and Mangum before coming to Clinton. Now he lives alone in Clinton. In 1970, he was diagnosed with cancer of the left jaw and underwent a painful operation that has left him partially disfigured.

His master's degree was granted at Western State College of Gunnison, Colo., in 1957, and in 1970 he received his doctorate from National Christian University of Arlington, Tex. He served as classroom instructor, coach, principal, and superintendent during his 32 years in the educational field in southwestern Oklahoma.

Survivors include his wife, Metta Ruth, of the home; two daughters, Adrianna Sue Reed of Stillwater and Jacquelyn K. Allen of Minco, and four grandsons.

## DR. LLOYD L. KUTCH

Dr. Lloyd L. Kutch, superintendent of Woodward Public Schools, died at Woodward Memorial Hospital following a brief illness. Kutch was 55-years-old. He was born in Colony on March 12, 1928. 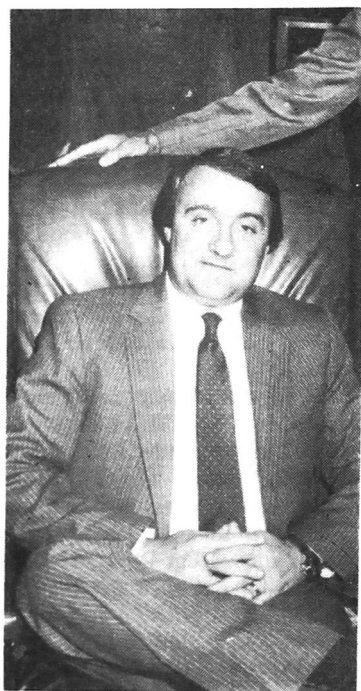
## CHARLES H. KENDALL

The announcement was made this spring after Rodman's teams again proved to be formidable in all levels of competition across the state.

## Bergner Receives Award

Doyle Bergner, retired long-time Weatherford baseball coach, was honored in Yukon at the Oklahoma City All-Star baseball game. He was named honorary coach of the South team. Bergner received a plaque honoring him for his 31 years of service to the youth of the state of Oklahoma.

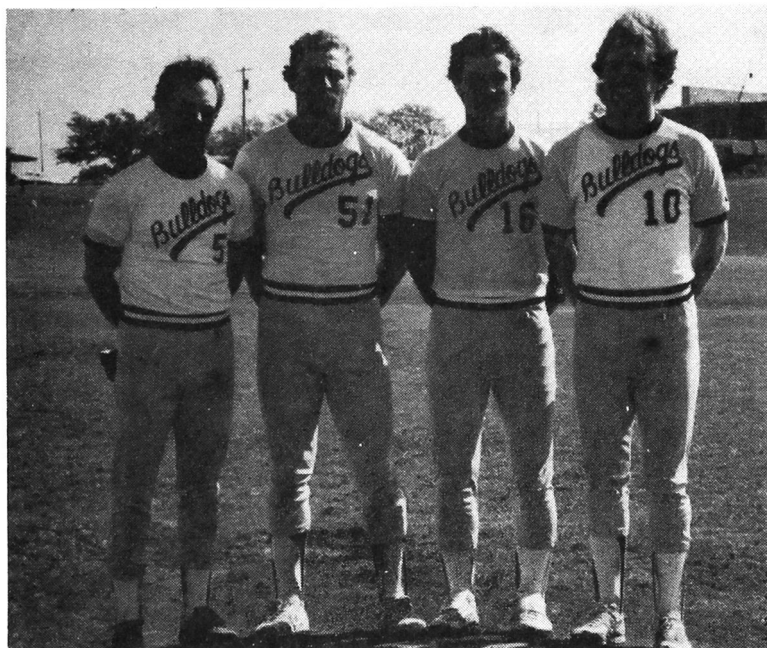
Bergner retired from the Weatherford Public School system last summer after teaching and coaching 23 years at Weatherford. The successful coach started his career at Independence, a school outside of Custer City, and then spent six years at Custer City before going to Weatherford in 1959.

"Doyle," as he is commonly referred to, was known primarily for his outstanding baseball teams. But, he did coach football and basketball teams also. His baseball record as a coach was 510-236, his basketball record was 370-184, and his football mark

was 10-9-1. Add all the records together and you come up with an impressive 890-429-1 record. Wow!

The 1944 Weatherford High School graduate led the 1973 WHS baseball team to a state championship; and in his years as a baseball coach, he led teams to six regional and 17 district championships. He was named the state district baseball coach of the year in 1971, 1972, and 1973, and was selected athletic director of the year in 1980. His biggest award came last year, his last to coach, when he was named District 5 National Baseball Coach of the Year.

Bergner coached 12 Oklahoma All-State players, 14 alternate All-Staters, 15 college baseball players, and one professional leaguer. This honor was just one of many for the Weatherford resident's service to the youth of Oklahoma.

The Redmen of Northeastern State have taken the championship the past two seasons, last season by defeating Southwestern 30-13 in Tahlequah. In 1981, Southwestern defeated the team 14-7, although an ineligible player caused Southwestern to forfeit the game and the championship trophy.

Things look good for both teams this season. Southwestern's coach Bob Mazie feels positive about his team's abilities--although he does feel the group is young and inexperienced. "I wish we could play 10 practice games before our season begins," Mazie said. Mazie will rely heavily on senior quarterback Steve Price, who he claims is a definite All-American candidate. He also expects much from split end Tony Shelton and place kicker "Fred" Rezaie, who Mazie describes as

"the best place kicker in the NAIA."

Northeastern's head coach, George Elliott, has his entire starting backfield back for his 1983 edition of the Redmen--quarterback Frank Marsaln, tailback Calvin Farrow, and fullback Joel Sense. Northeastern is also in possession of a solid place kicker with the return of NAIA All-American Arthur Garcia.

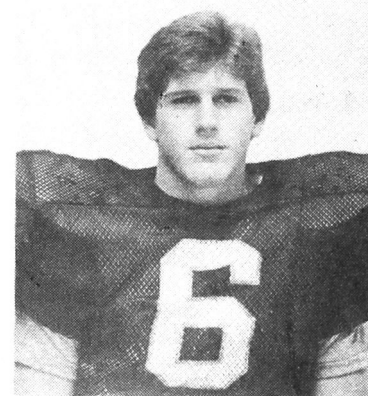
Last season's Bulldogs finished their season with a 7-3 record, while Northeastern made their way to the NAIA semi-final championship game with a perfect 11-0 record before being knocked out of the finals by District Nine power Central State.
