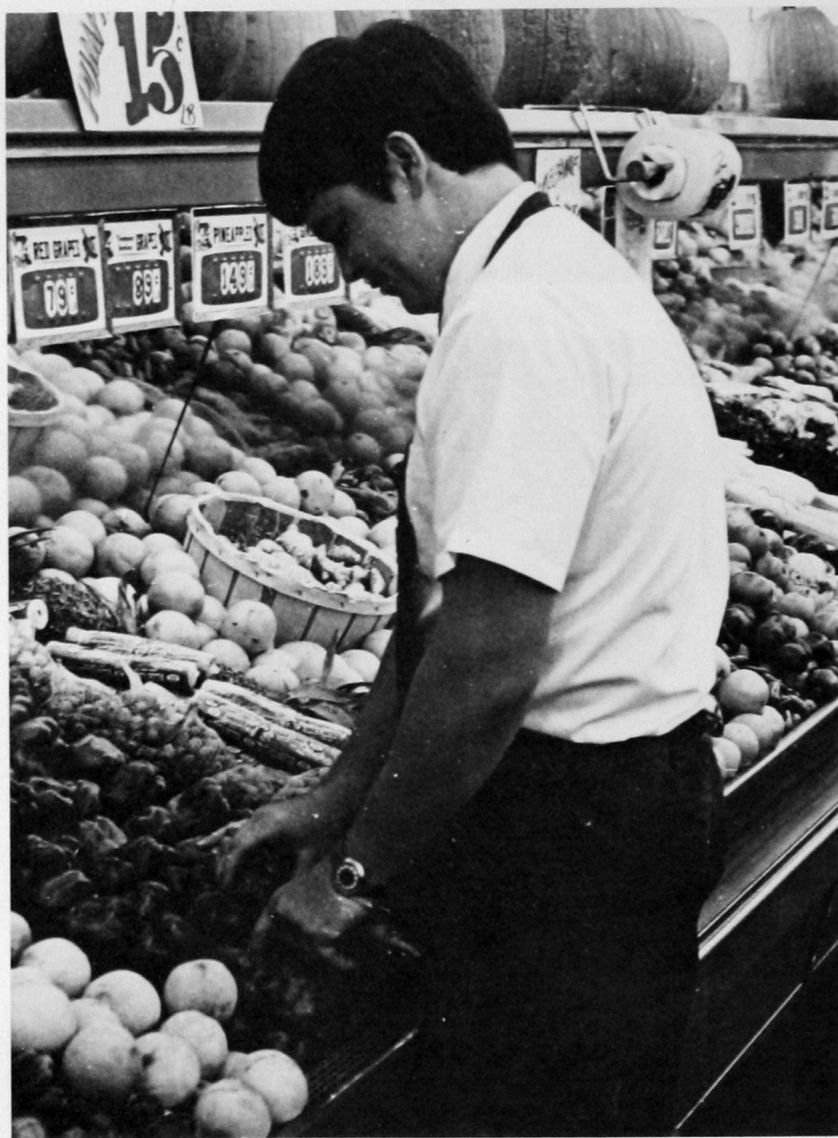


What we become is a product of the way we live. Whether we develop it on our own or follow a family tradition, a lifestyle reflects our personalities.

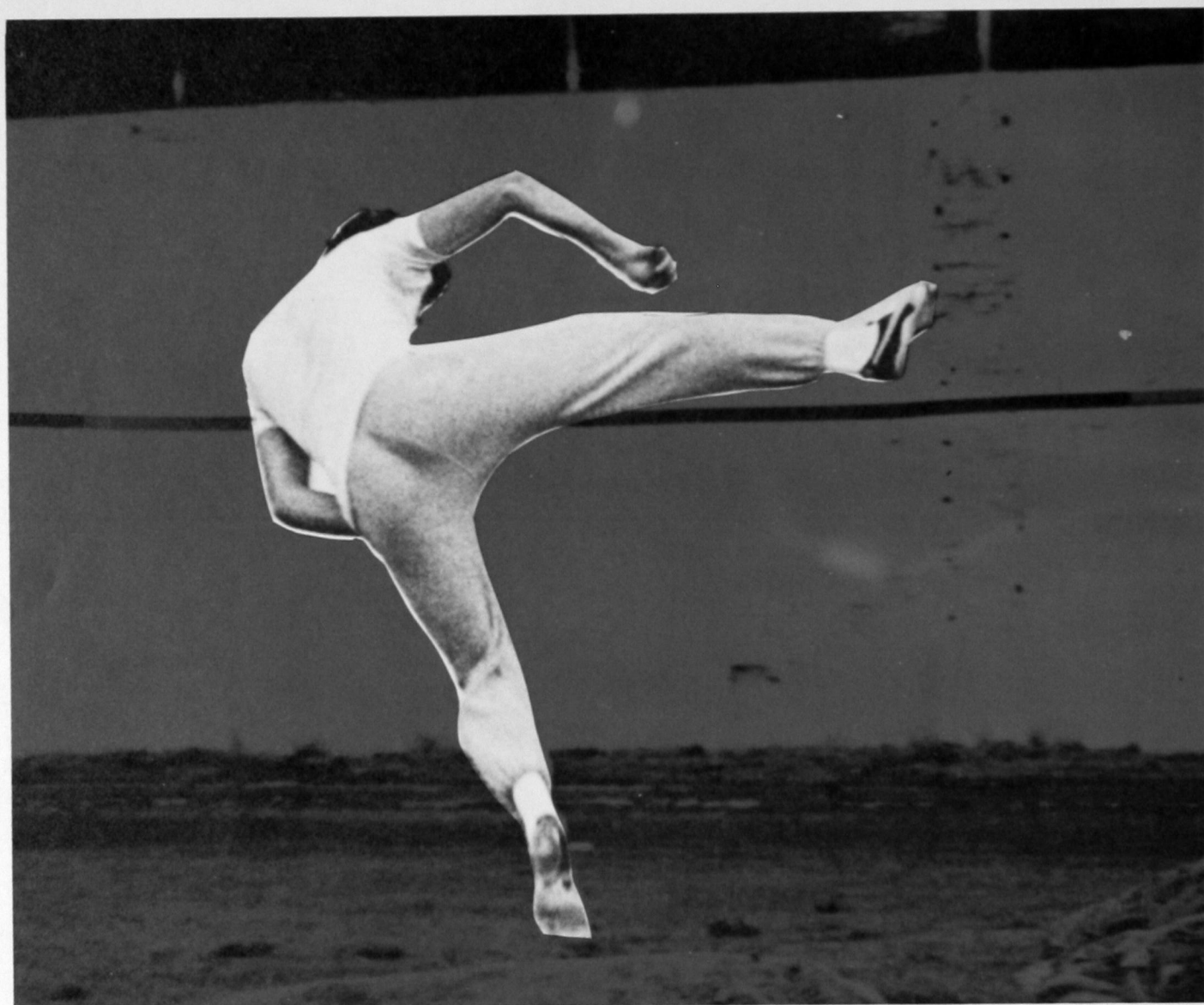
We live in a world of colorful cultures, creative decor and simple styles that we use to express ourselves.

Although we exist in separate little worlds, we remain a part of each other by sharing and living side by side.

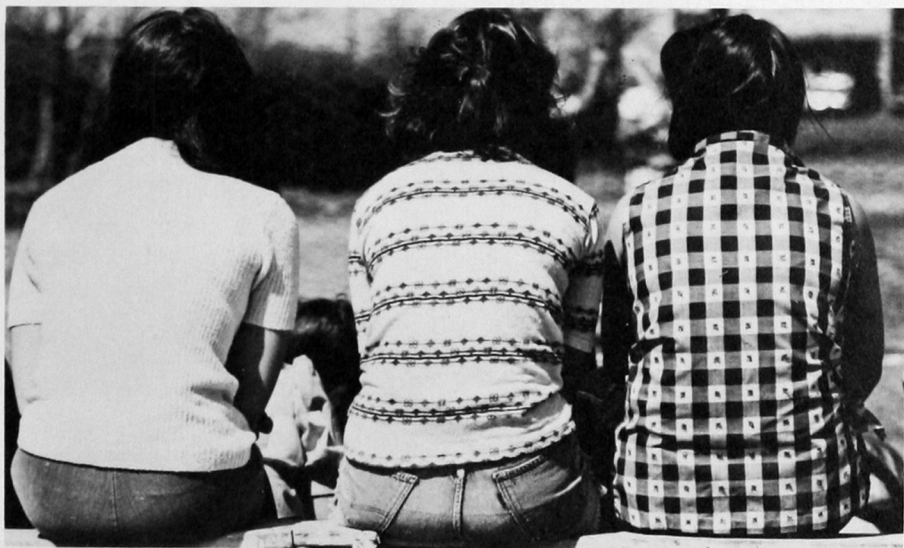

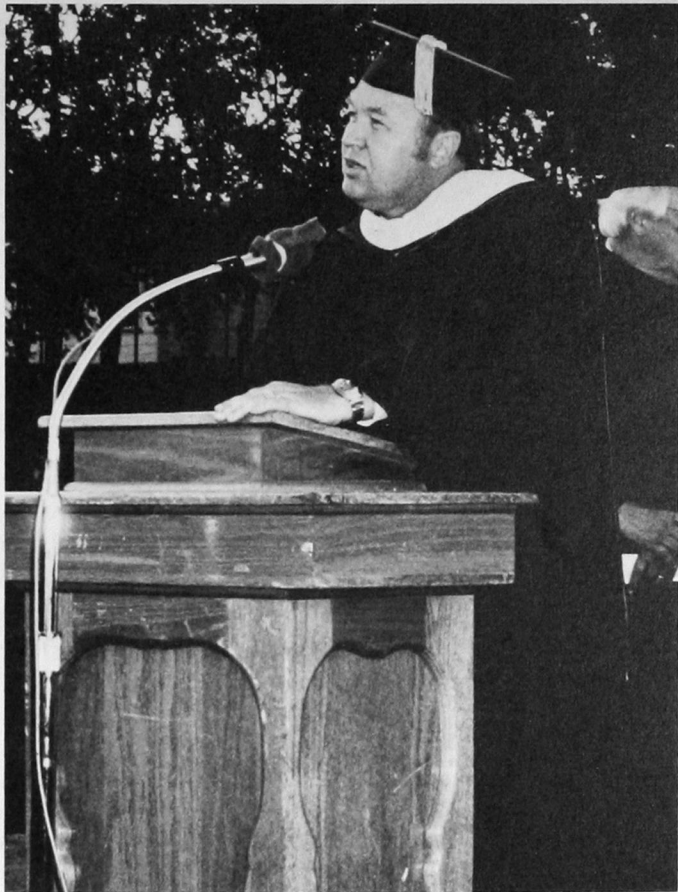
Upon the decision to convert the president's campus home into the new nursing school, the Campbells moved in November to their newly built home northeast of Weatherford.

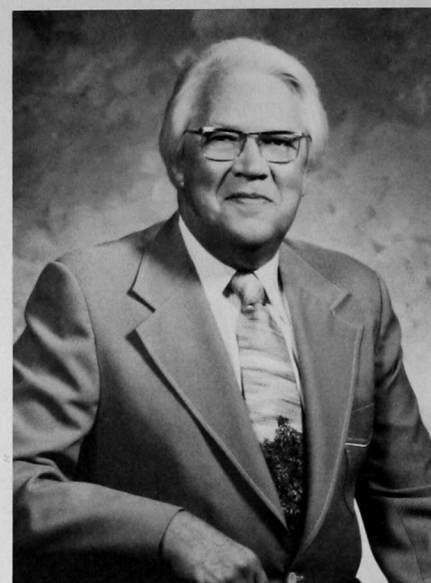

Registrar

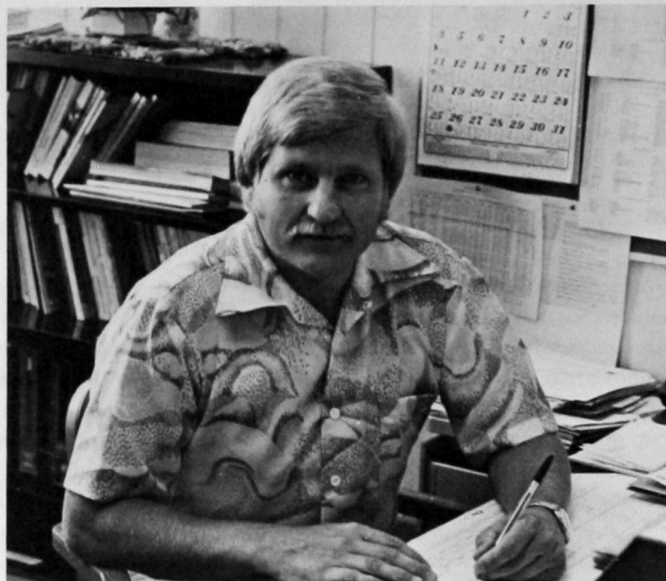
The little-heralded Registrar's Office is the heart of record-keeping for the Southwestern student. Here are kept a transcript of grades (for better or worse!), permanent admission

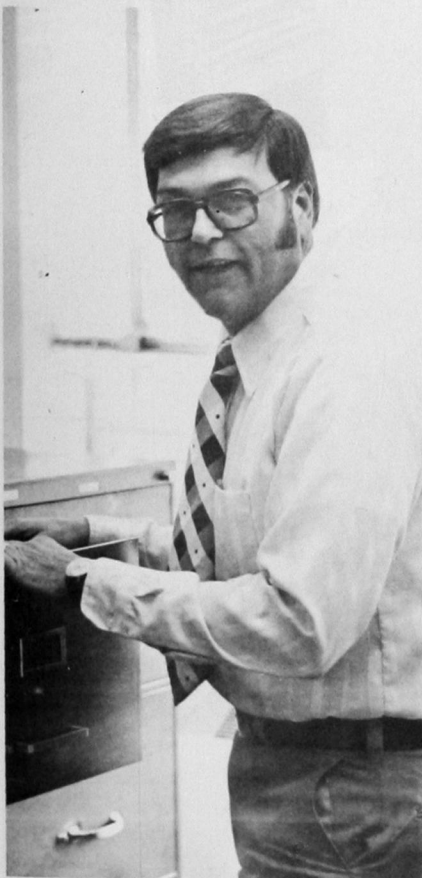

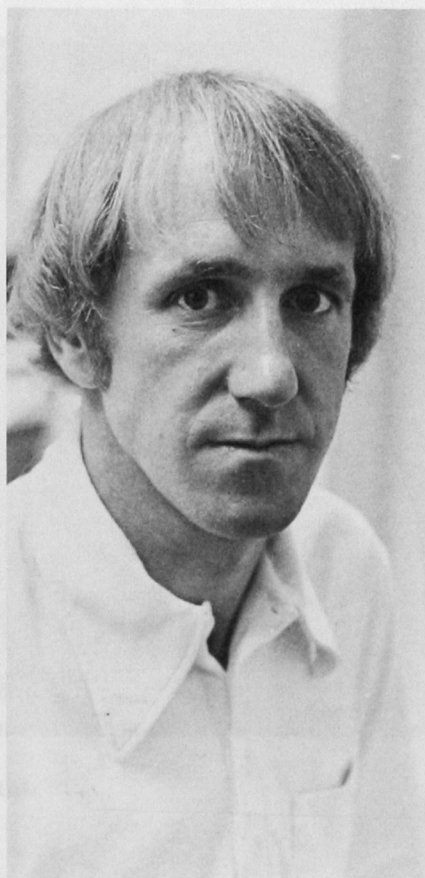

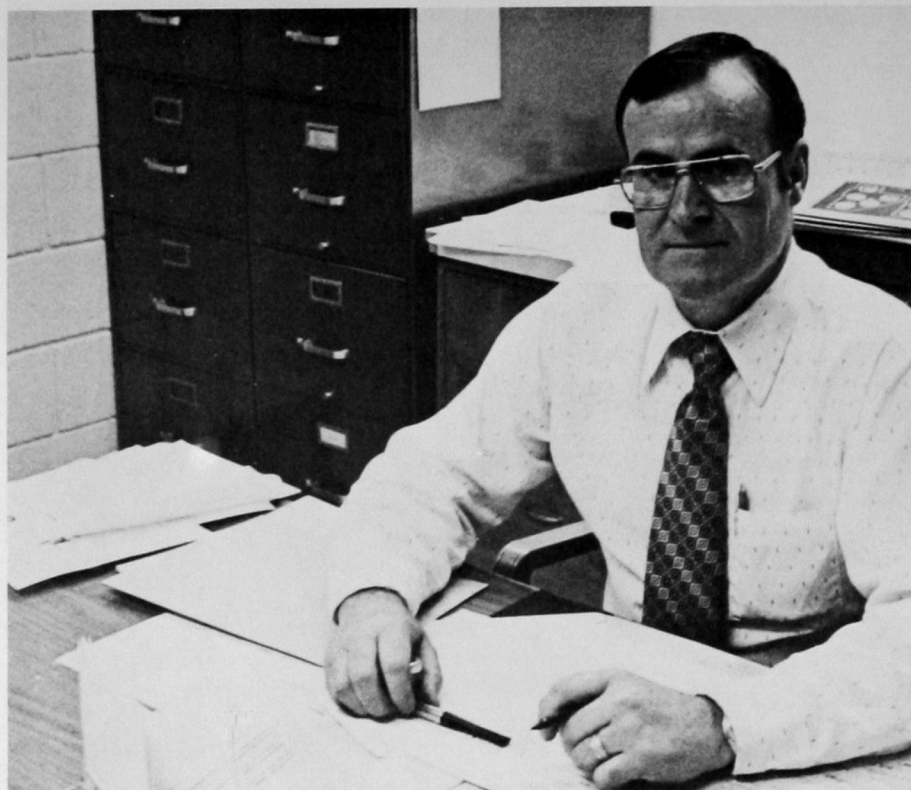
Public Relations

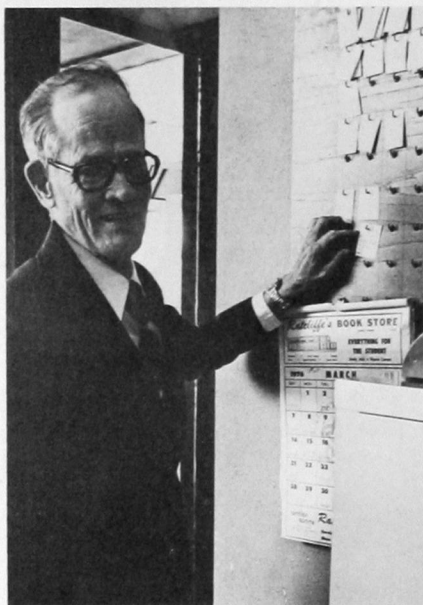

head against the wall every day trying to figure out how to provide students with nutritious meals. Wouldn't it be sad if the only place at Southwestern to meet other people was the classroom?



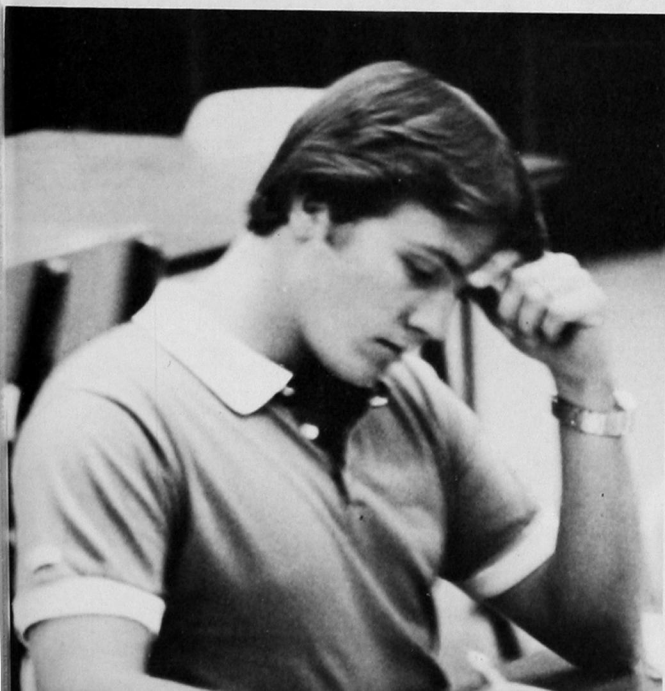

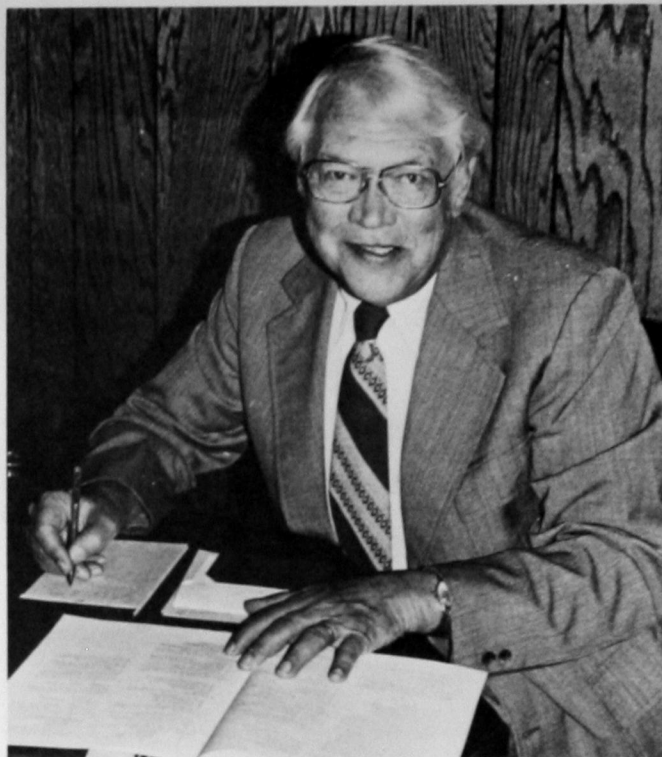
School of Pharmacy

The School of Pharmacy continues its revolutionary curricular changes as pharmacy education and the profession of pharmacy move toward a more active role in patient care.

In addition to the traditional departments of pharmaceutics, medicinal chemistry, physiology-pathology, pharmacology, pharmacognosy, and pharmacy administration, the relatively new department of clinical pharmacy continues to assume an increasingly important role in pharmacy education. Five faculty members devote their full time to this expanding instructional area, assisted by faculty personnel from all other departments of the School who find an increasing portion of their work load involved in clinical instruction. In addition, more than fifty volunteer physicians, pharmacists, and other health professionals holding appointments as adjunct faculty members are actively involved in this department's offerings.

The School of Pharmacy is a state-wide educational activity, through affiliation agreements with a number of progressive private hospitals, the U. S. P. H. S. Indian Health Service Hospitals of Oklahoma, selected community pharmacies and skilled nursing facilities, all of which serve as clinical instructional laboratories for our students.

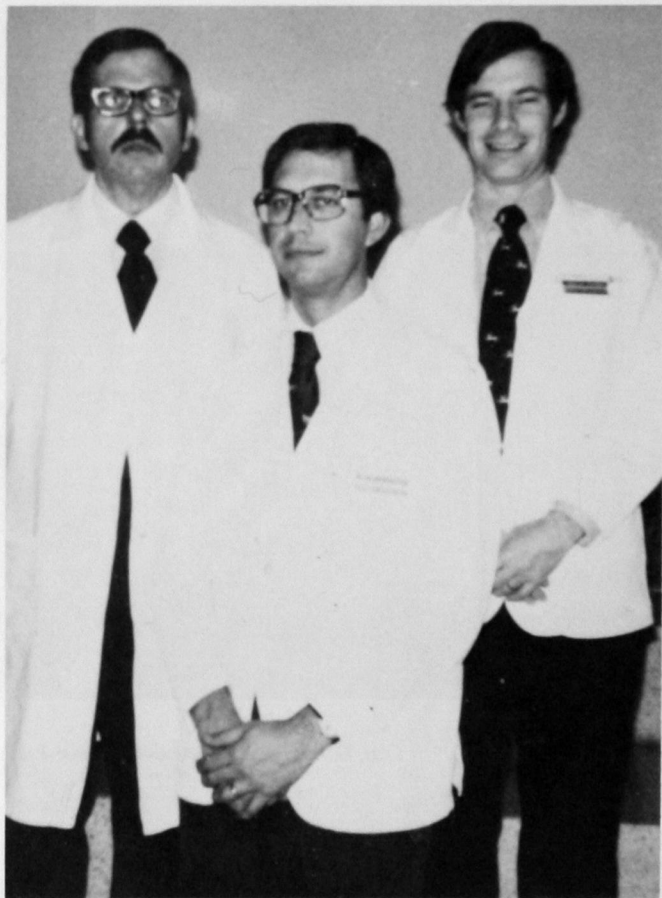
The more traditional academic offerings of the School of Pharmacy have also been modified and revised to more adequately prepare students for a more active and positive role in patient care.

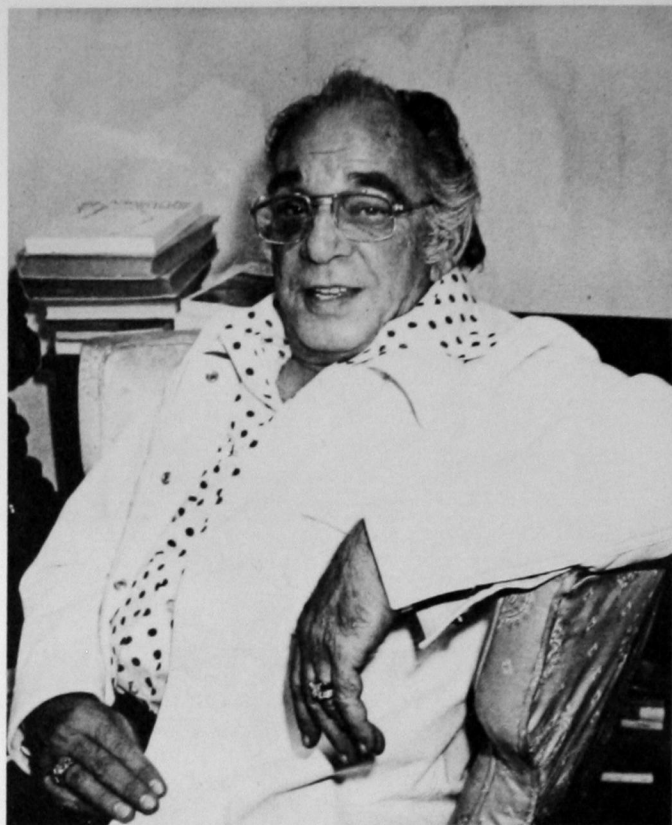

Art

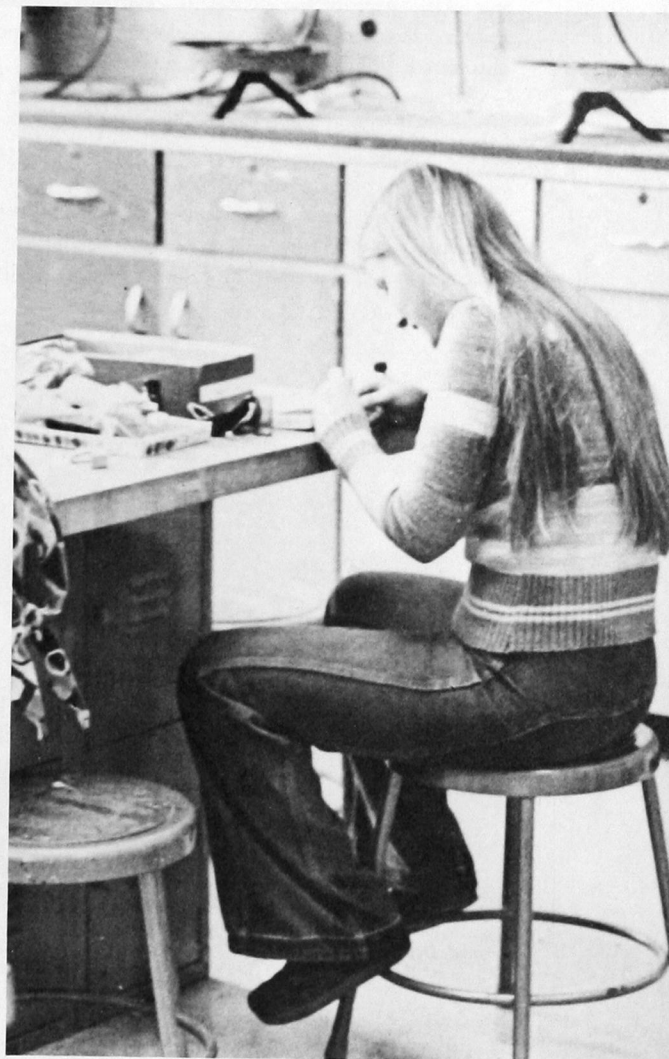
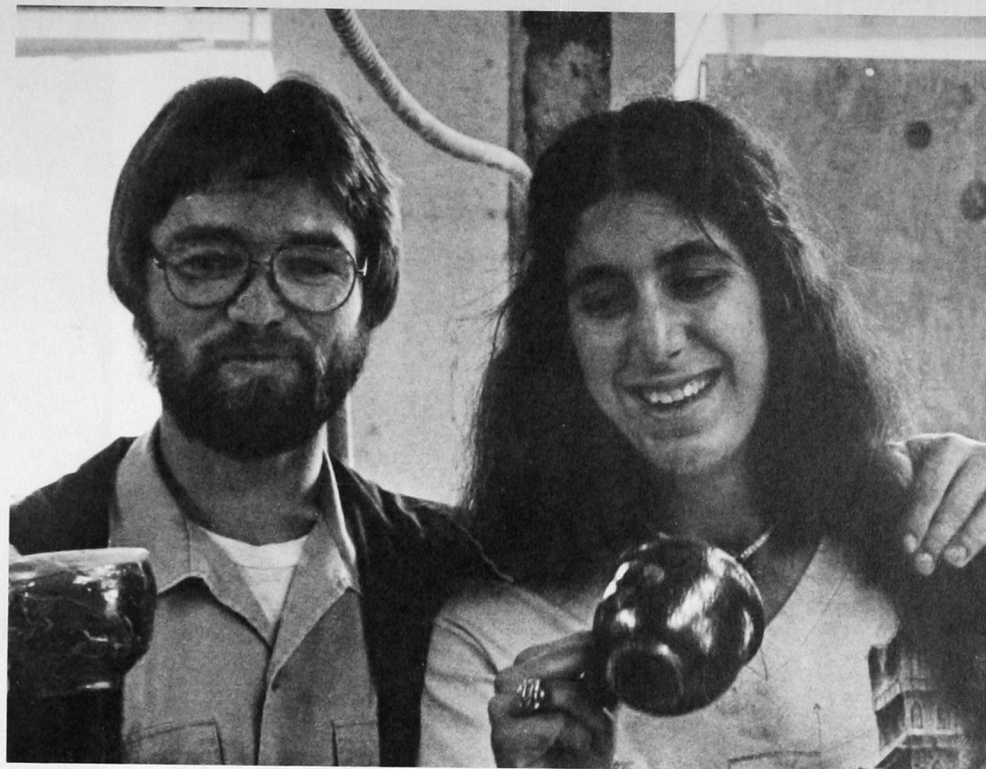

Biology Department

The very essence of life is being studied by students who attend classes at Southwestern's Biology Department. Each course offered in the biological (life) sciences can open a multitude of doors to scientific processes taking place every day.

Individuals may delve into various studies of life and living things in the area of biological concepts. In this introductory course, students learn about the basic functions and materials of all living substances.

More detailed studies are offered in courses on plant life (botany) and on the behavior and characteristics of animals (zoology). As more advanced biological studies are explored, students encounter genetics, microbiology, physiology, ecology, and biochemistry.

Career opportunities for biological sciences majors are unlimited in professional biology fields and in the Allied Health Professions (medical technology, administration of allied health services, medical record administration, and nursing, to name a few).

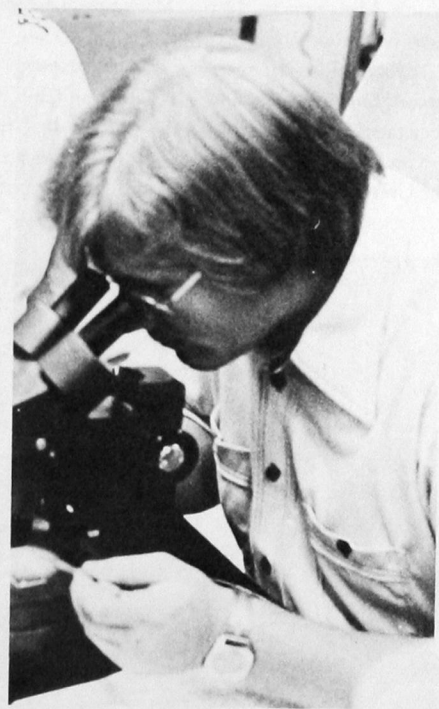
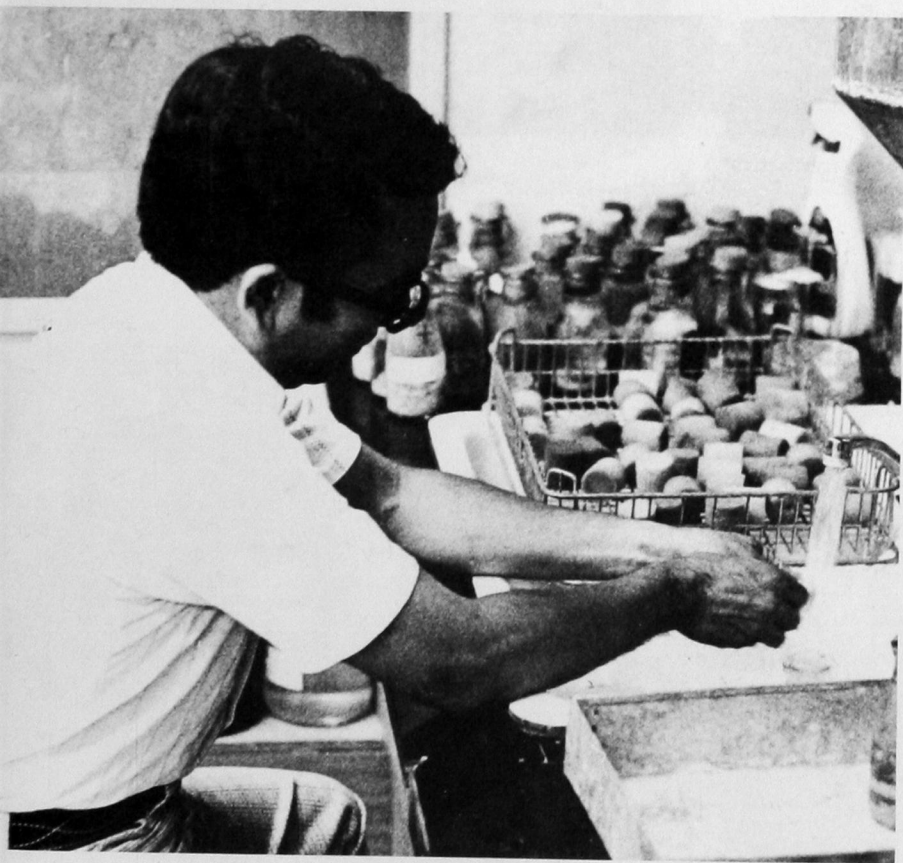
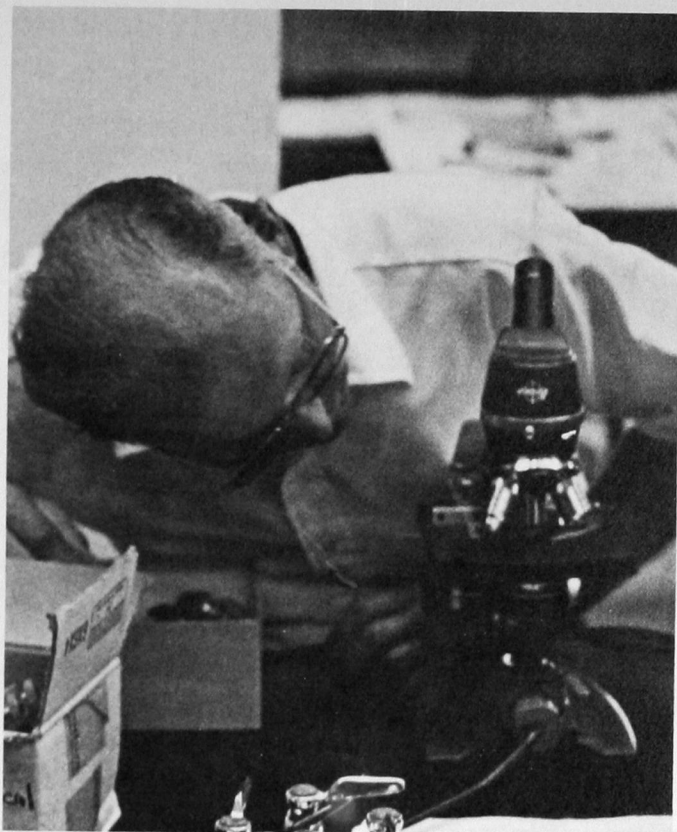
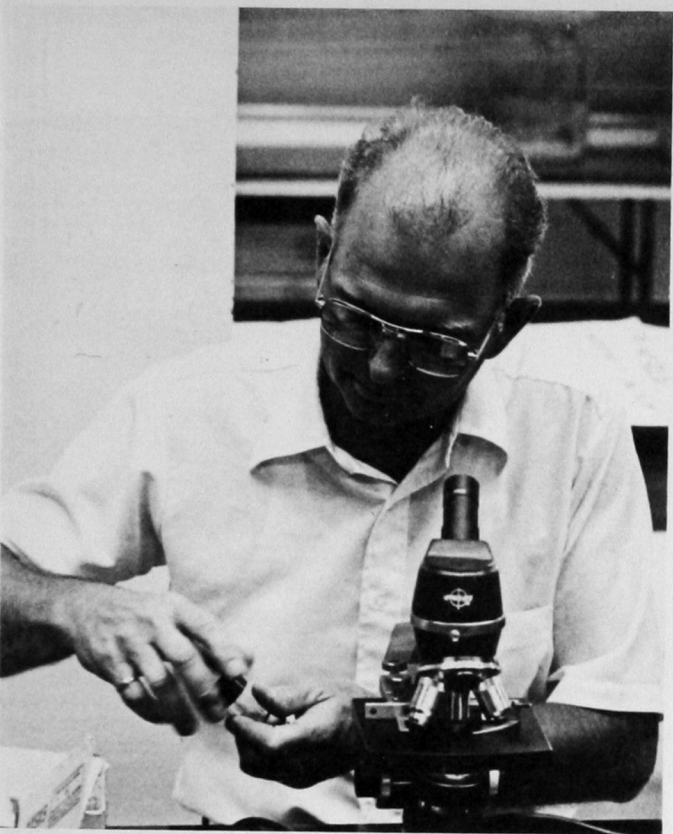

Business Department

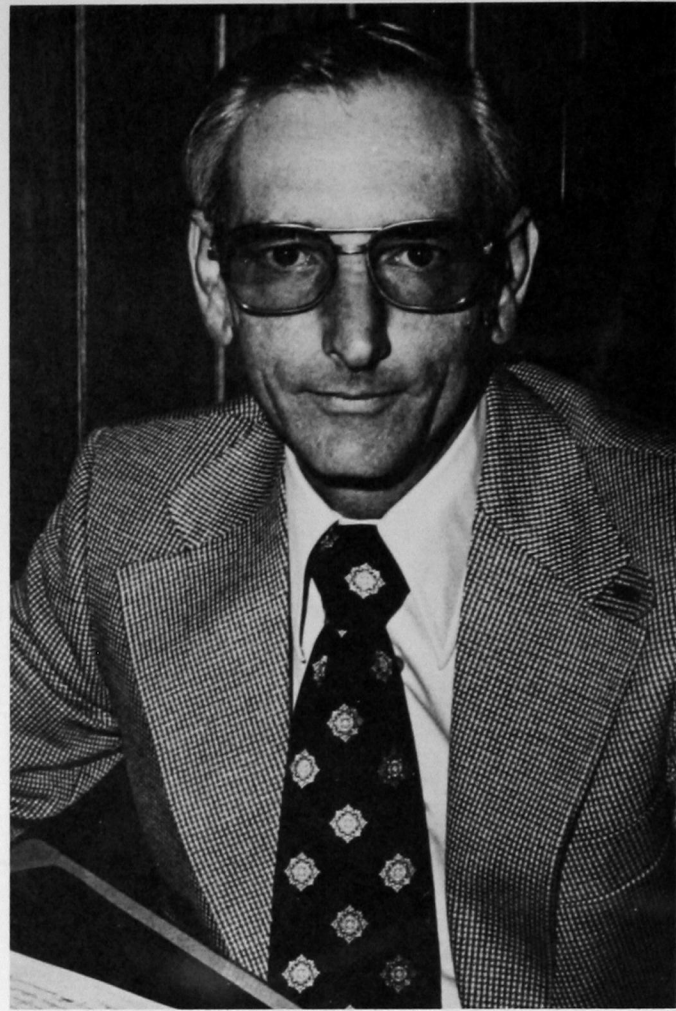
Dr. Roger Egerton is the new head of the Business Department.

Graduates of Southwestern's Business Department are everywhere in the United States, holding both public and private offices.



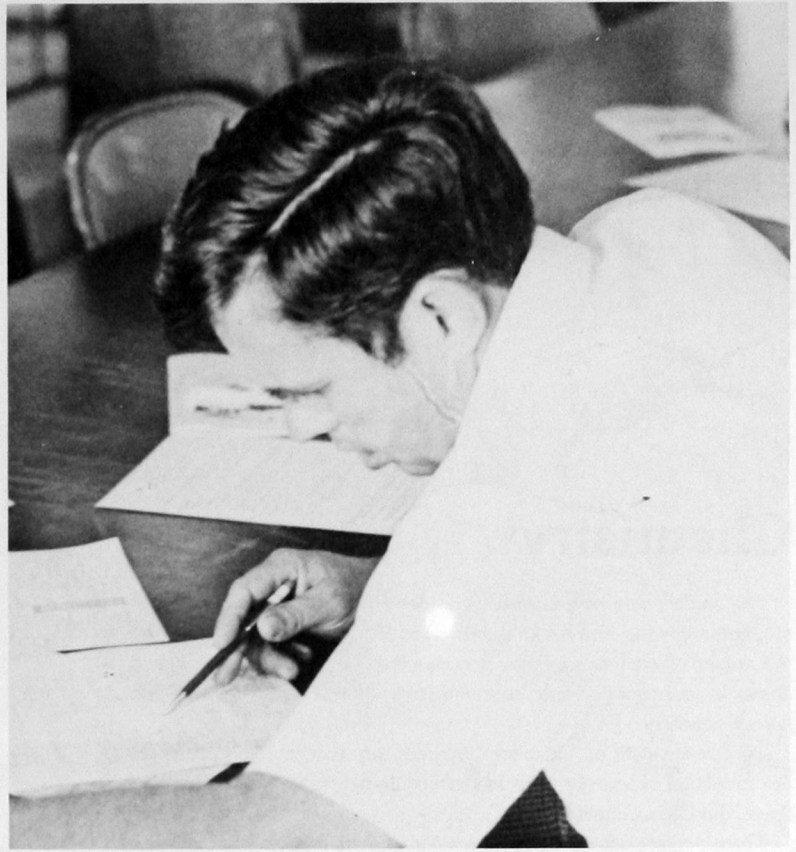

Three degrees are offered, a Bachelor of Arts and two Bachelor of Science degrees.



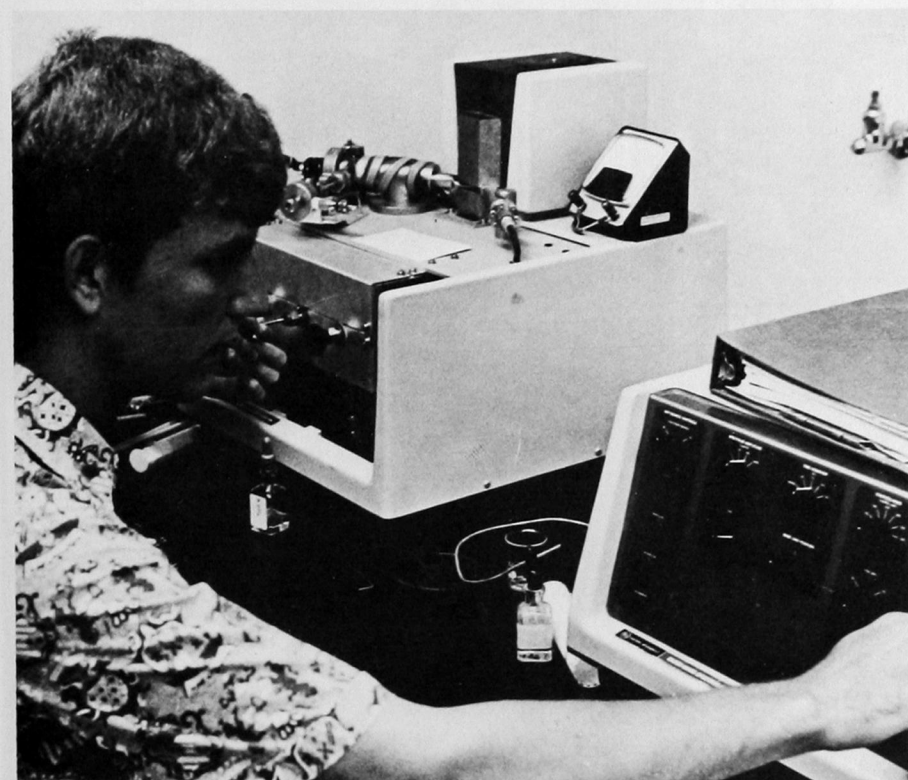
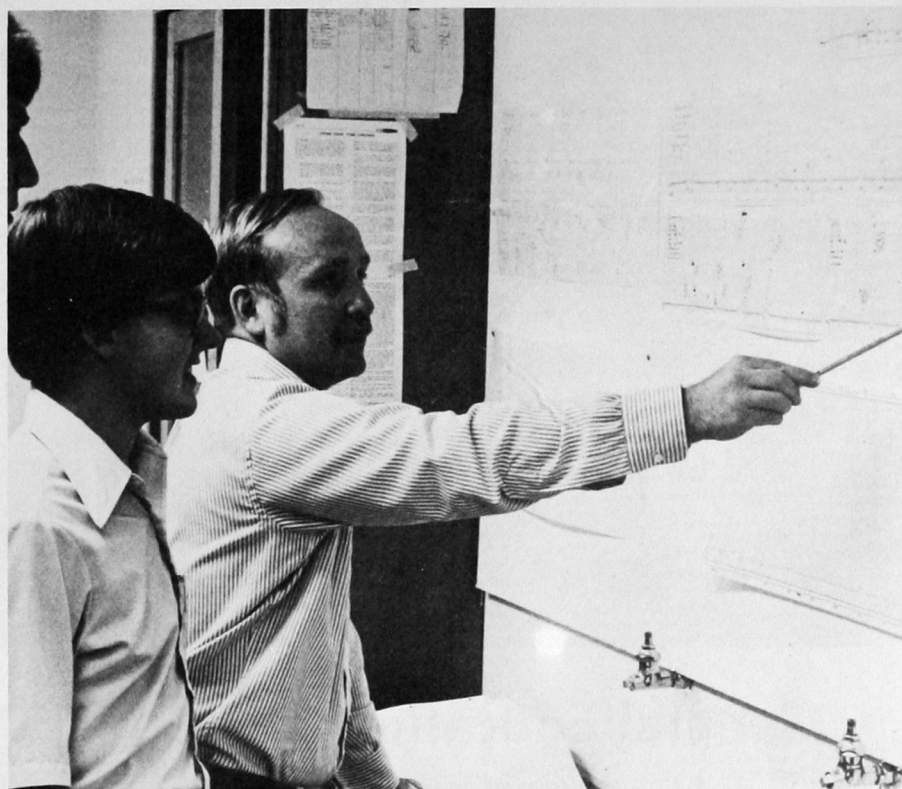

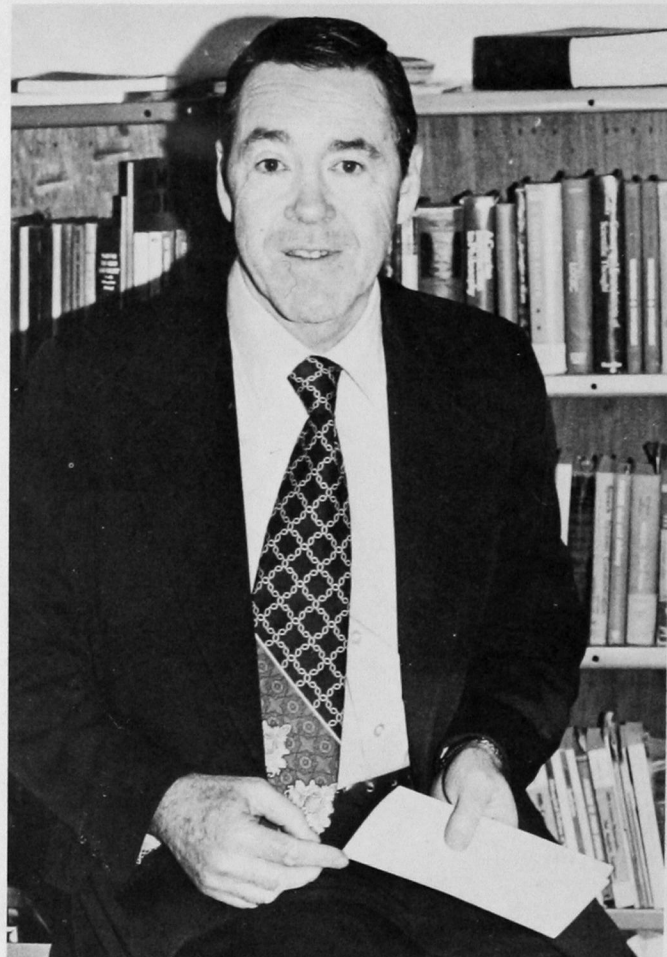


General Education

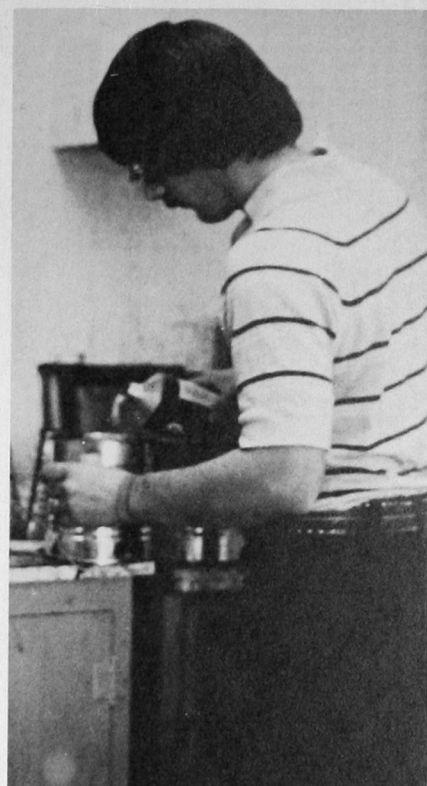

Health, Physical Ed. and Recreation

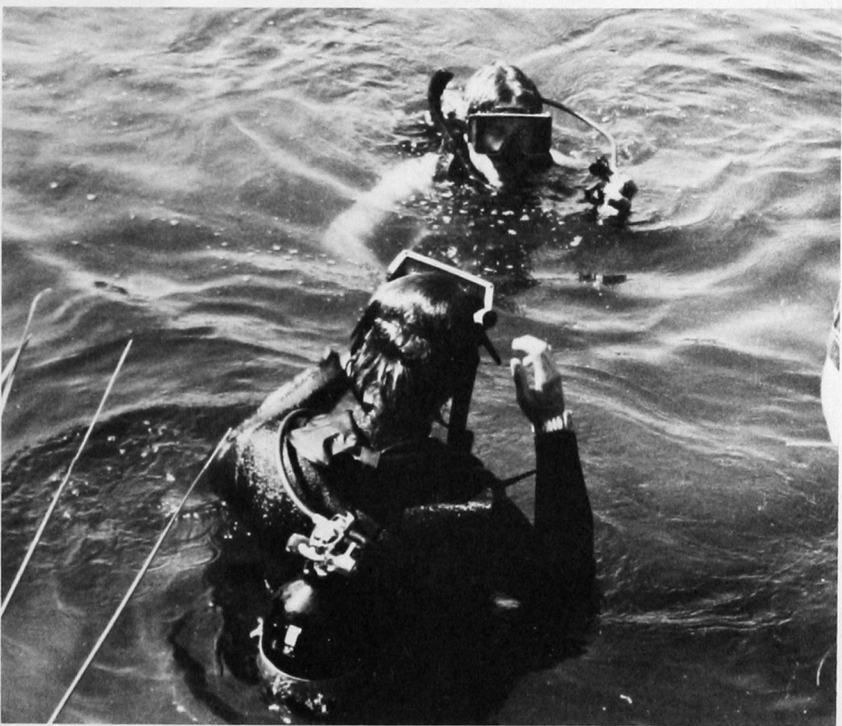

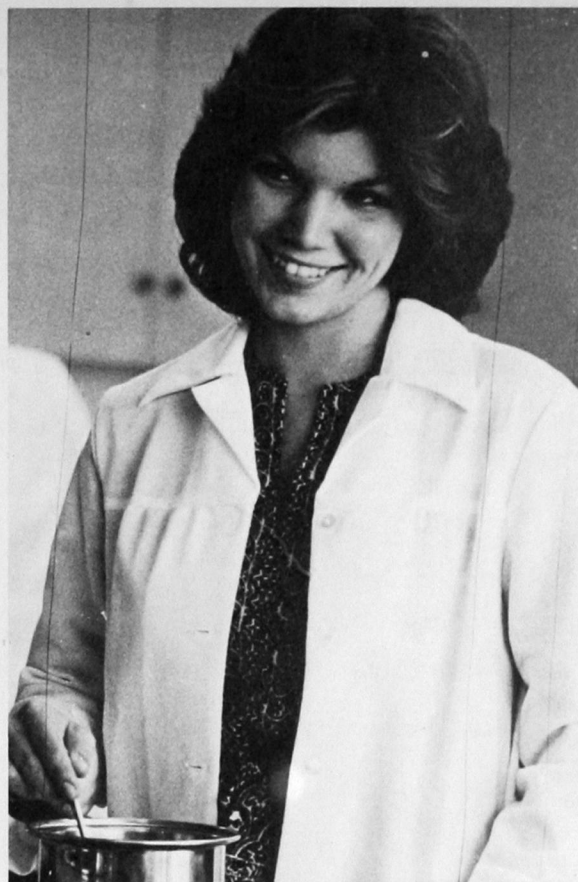
Facilities for the Home Ec. students have been extended over the past years. These facilities enable the students to increase their knowledge in the field.

A degree in Industrial Education can lead to numerous job opportunities such as junior high and high school teaching, teaching in hospitals, physical therapy, and engineering and drafting.

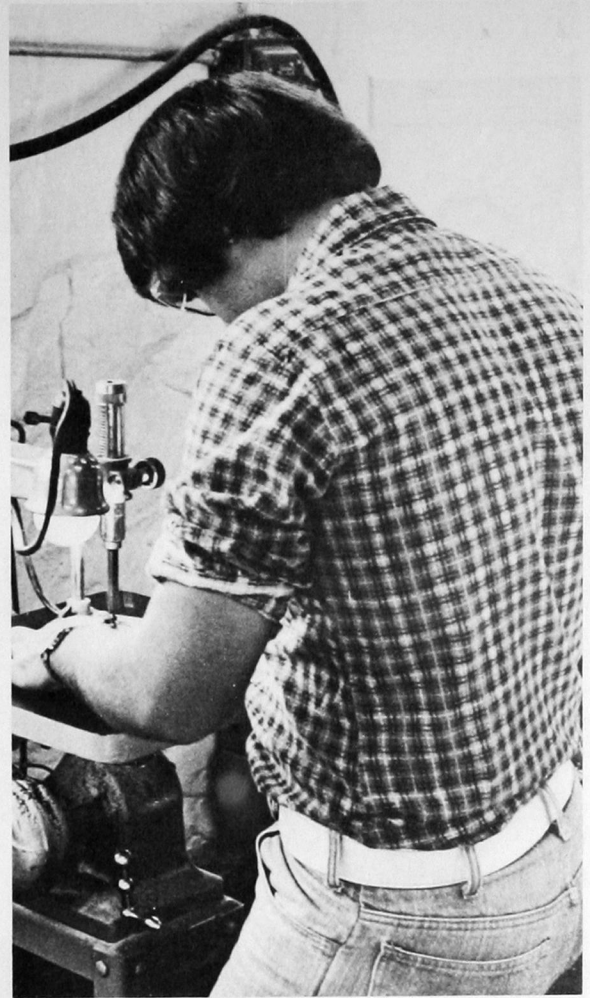
The staff of this department has proven successful in producing many talented teachers and professionals and is looking forward to the same measure of success in the future.

Language Arts

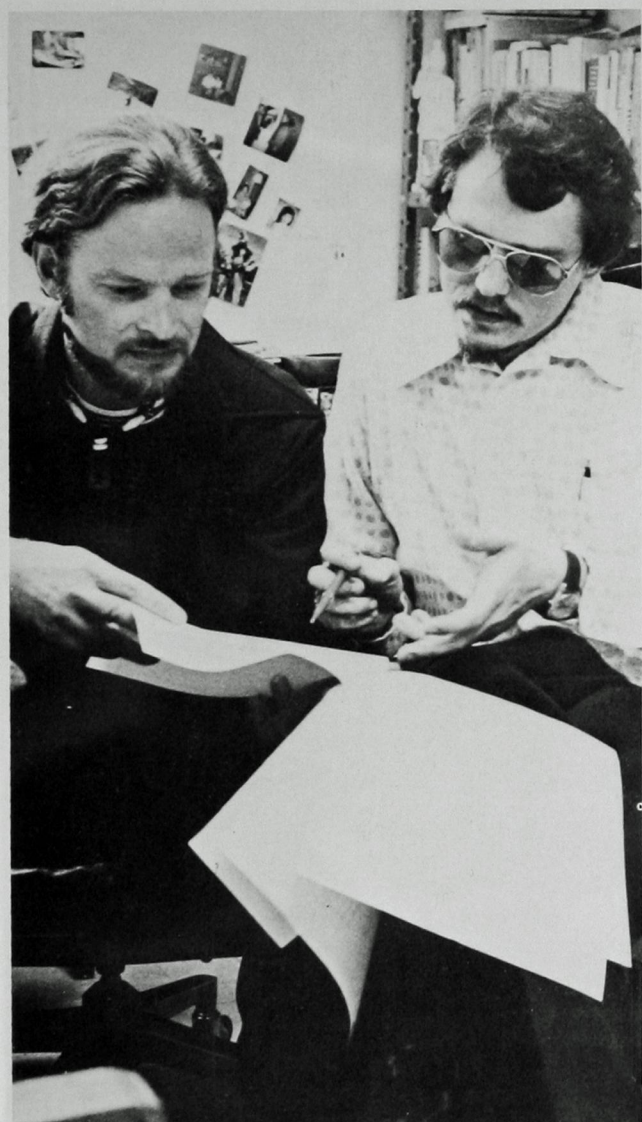

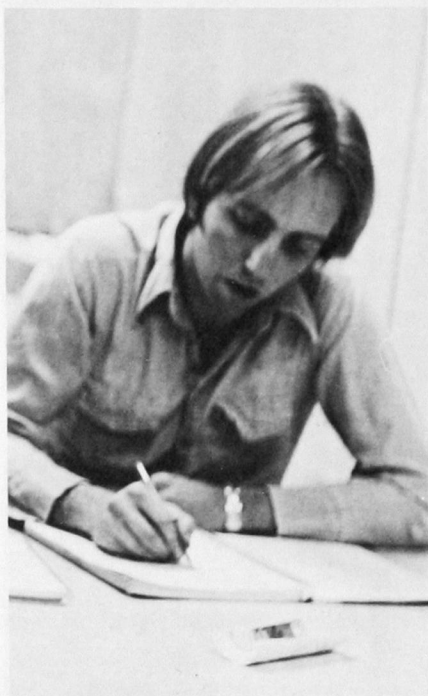
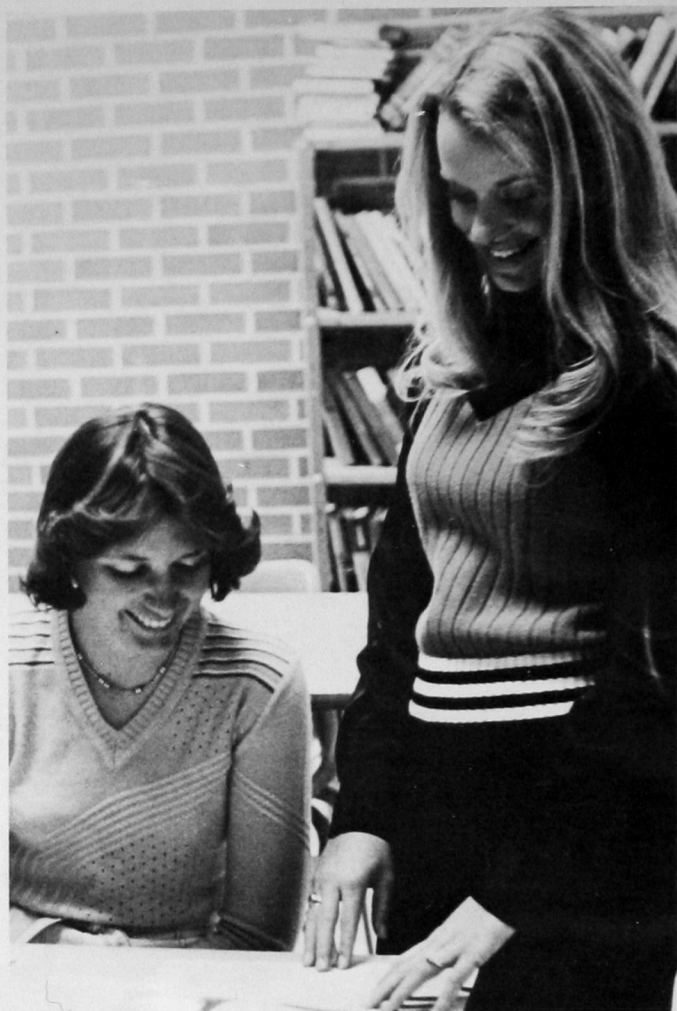
Mathematics

The Department of Mathematics and Computer Science provides career education for those interested in the teaching profession, science oriented industries, and any business utilizing computers. Mathematics is both a language and a tool, and the computer has provided the means to make mathematics a desirable and useful approach to research in almost every area of intellectual endeavor.

The Mathematics Department offers two major programs. One is designed to prepare professional mathematicians leading to a Bachelor of Science. The second leads to a Bachelor of Science in Education.

For students planning careers in the field of Computer Science, Southwestern offers a program of study leading to an academic minor. Two options for obtaining a Computer Science minor are offered. Students majoring in the sciences may obtain the required mathematics courses while pursuing their major fields, or students in Business and the Arts may take the required courses for a minor in Computer Science.

A well qualified staff under the direction of department head Raymond McKellips works to help each student develop his mathematical potential. The department also sponsors Math Club, Computer Club and Kappa Mu Epsilon.

Military Science

The Military Science program at Southwestern has had a number of changes since its beginning in 1971. Col. Jode Wilson's retirement in January gave the leadership role to Lt. Col. Leon Thurgood.

New faculty members provided additional active training programs in hand-to-hand combat and reconnaissance training.

The first year student is introduced to the military customs and designs. Then, when given a basic knowledge of the military, the students learn about the role of the Army in society and its importance in the national defense. The second year's instruction will include the history of the American military, map reading, and tactics.

Junior level work begins the advanced leadership seminars and the advanced philosophy of tactics, which carries on through the senior year.

Undergraduates become familiar with the Social Science department when they take the required geography, American History and American Government classes.

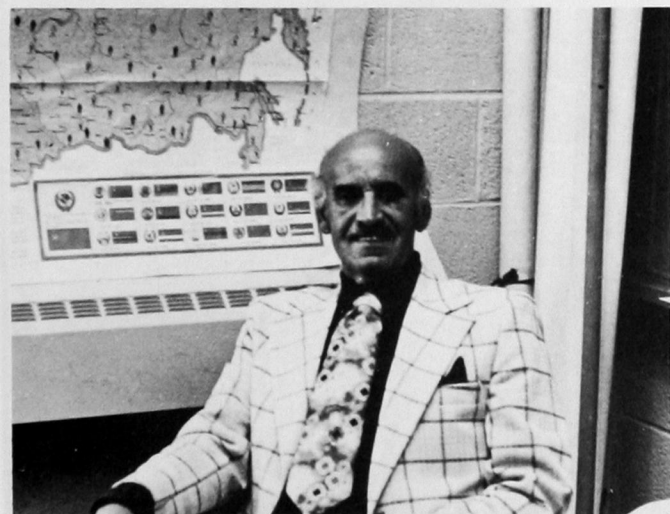
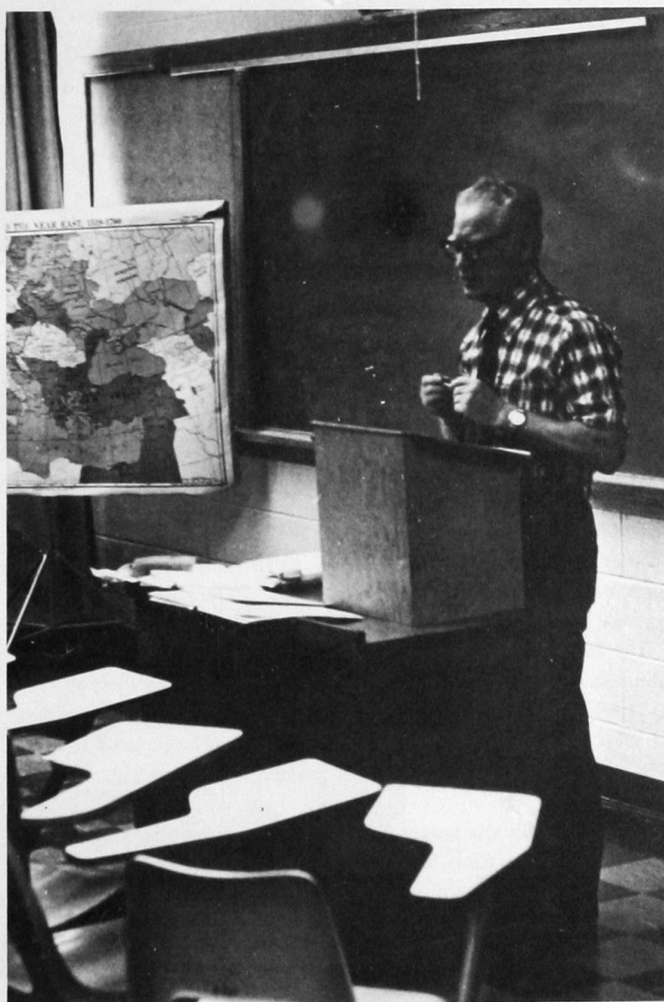
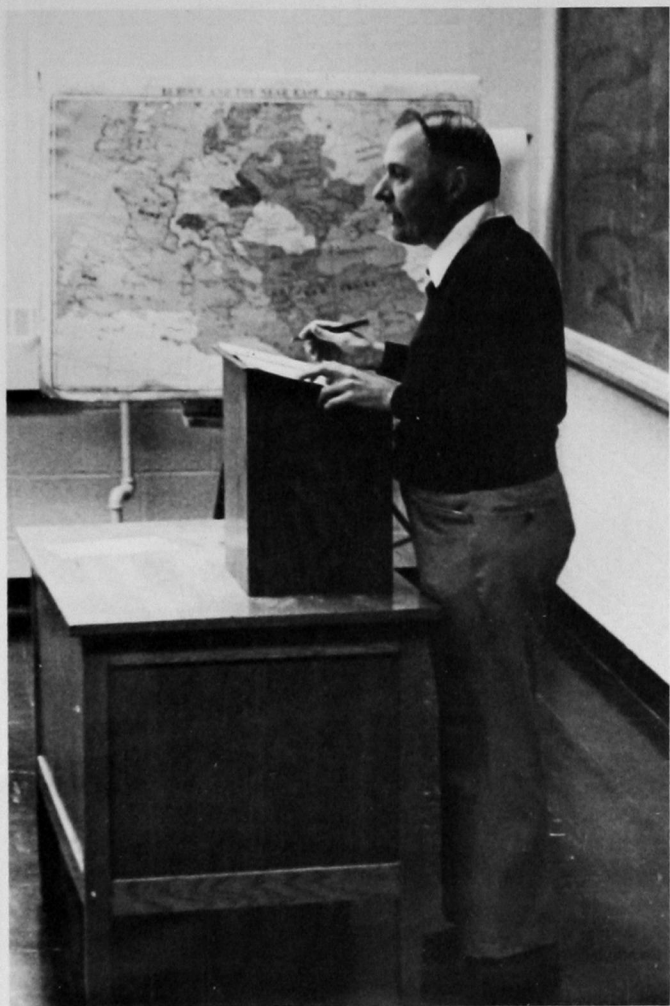

The club features guest speakers from the business professions at meetings. Other activities include tours of business organizations

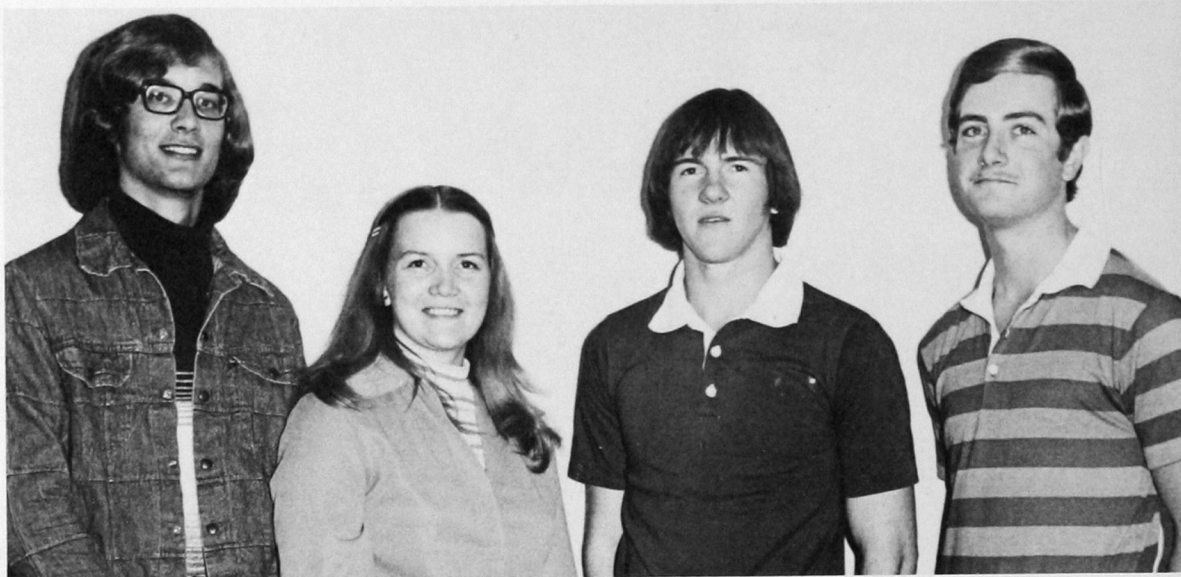
in Oklahoma City during the spring semester.

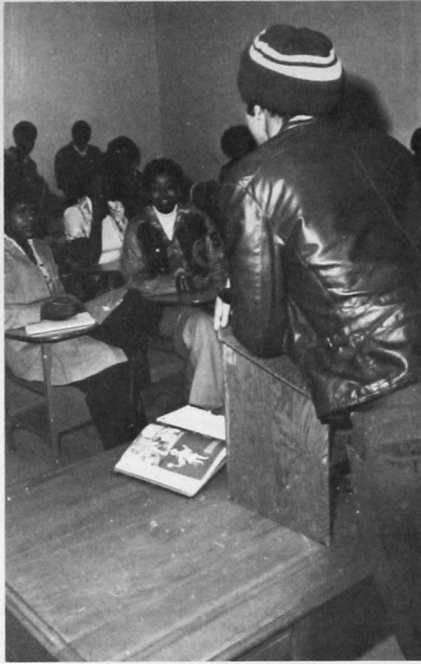
In order to be a member of Kappa Delta Pi, honor society, a student must be a junior or senior education major, have a 3.0 grade average and be a member of SEA.

The club dedicated itself to engendering more interest in the study of English and the understanding and awareness of cultural concerns.

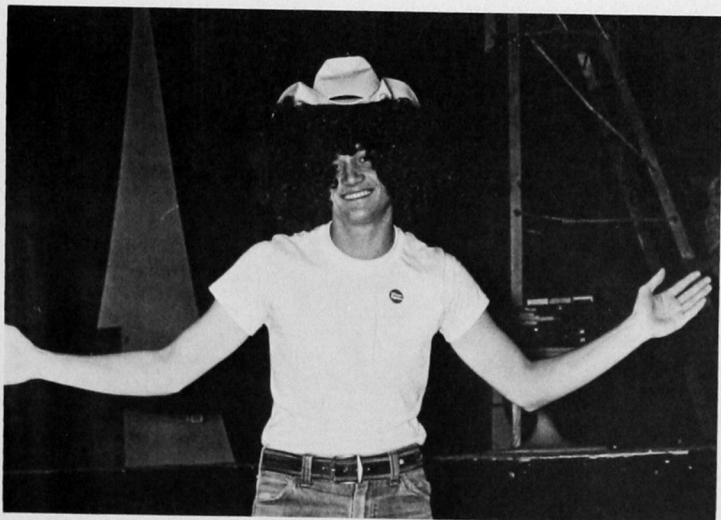

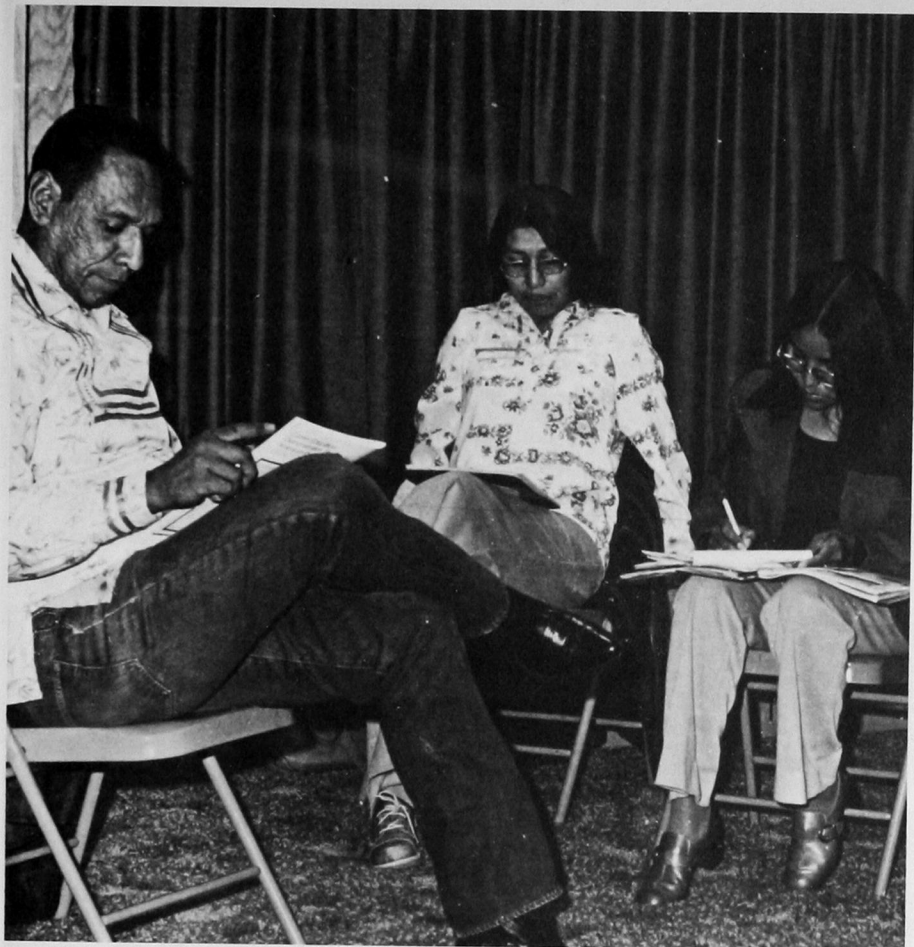

Cooperating with Cheyenne-Arapaho Education Programs, the club financed and sent members to the NIEA convention and provided tutors for area youth.

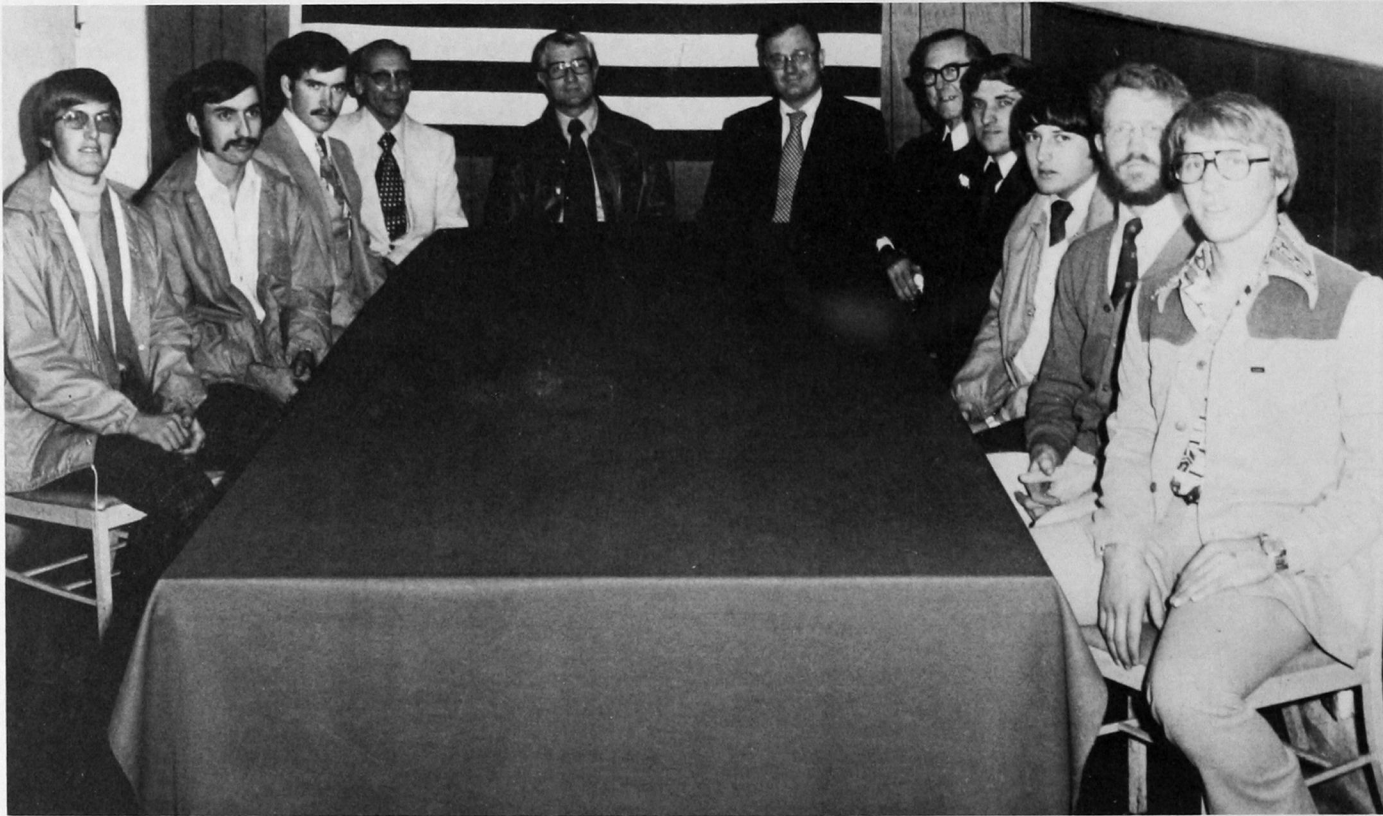

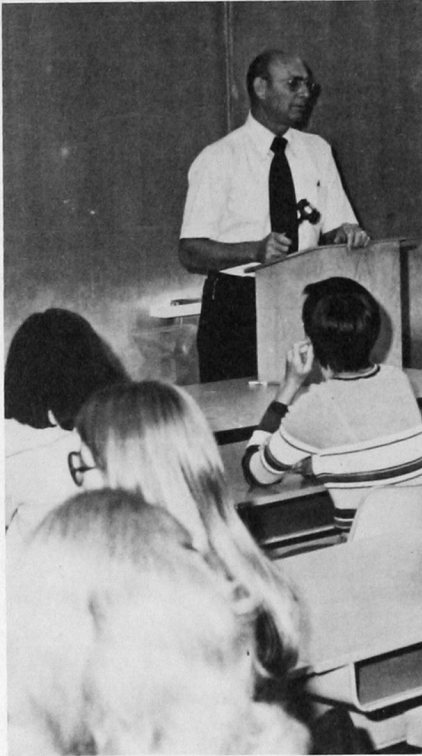

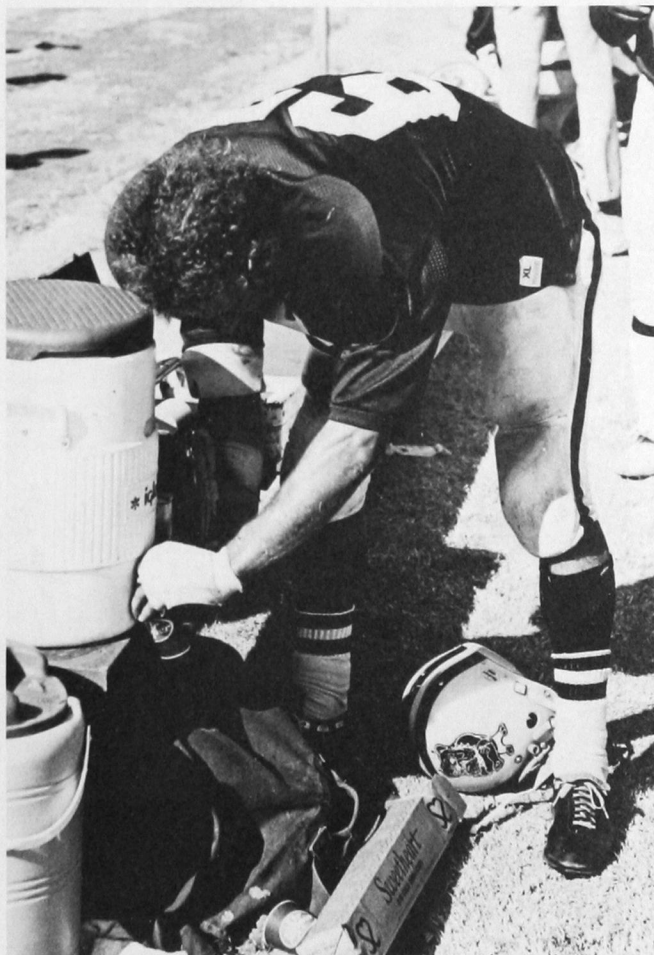


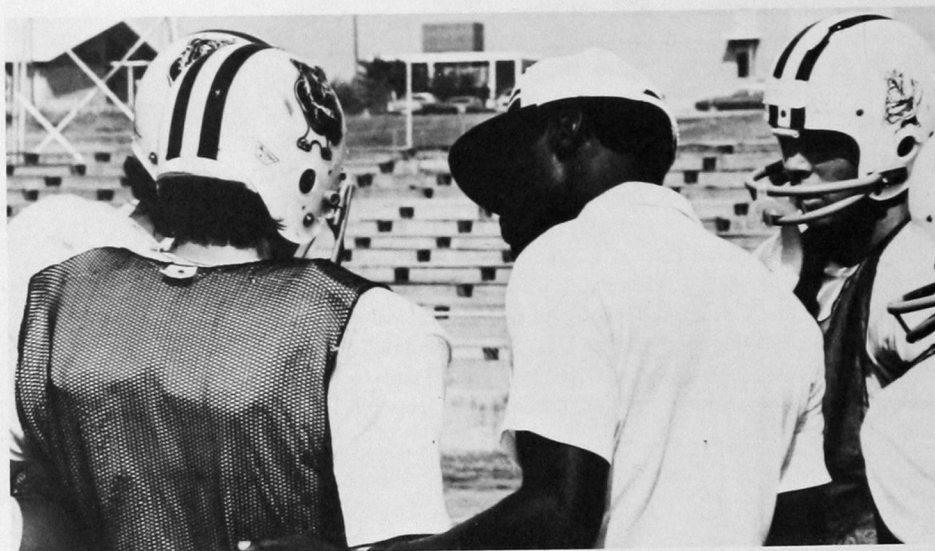
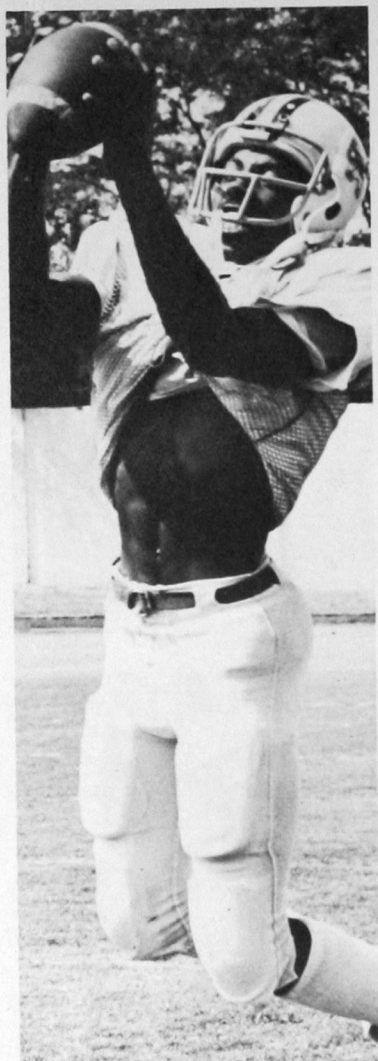


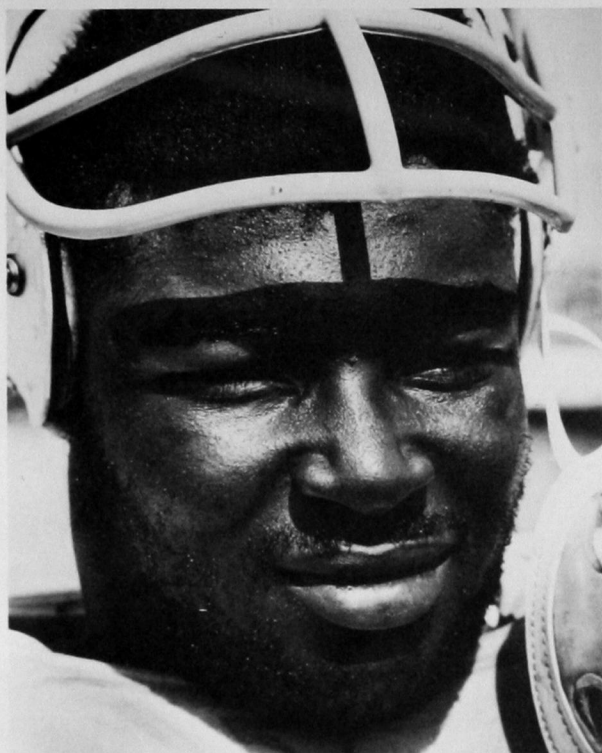
Football

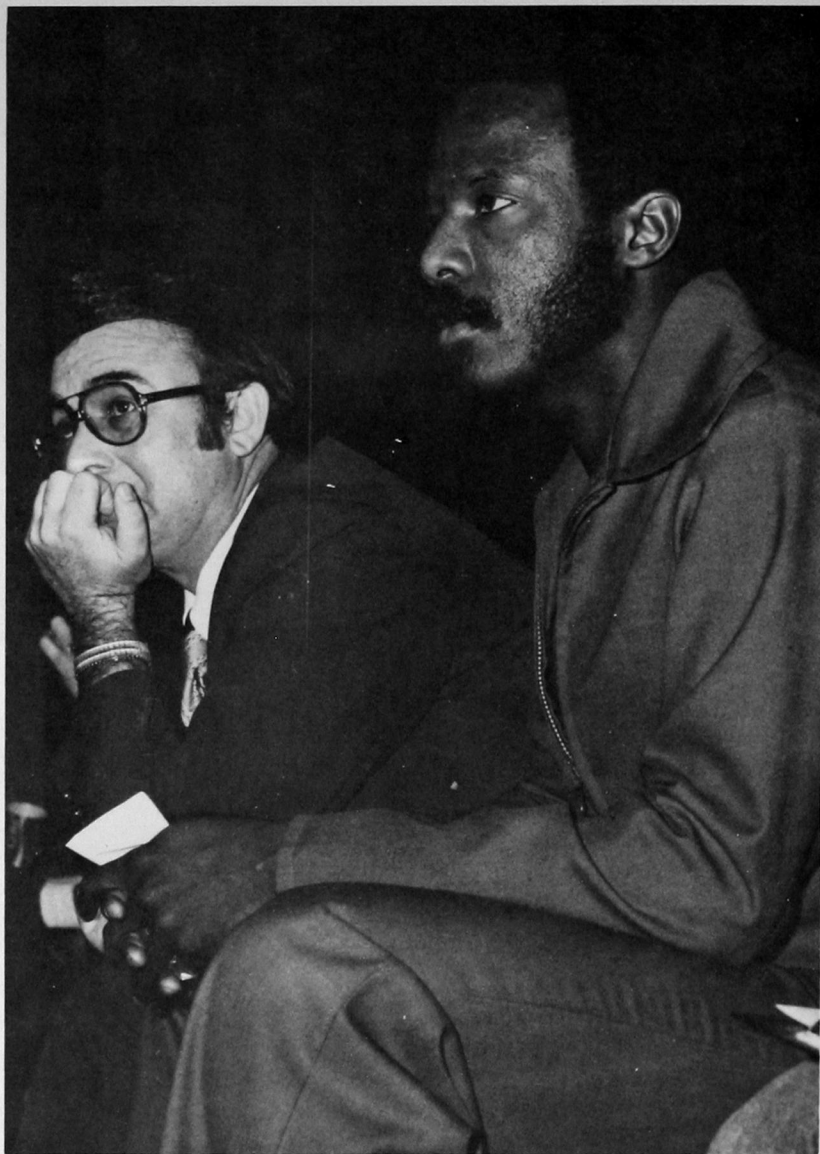
In the hard fought battle the Bulldogs clinched a spot in the finals with a 95-91 victory over the Eagles.

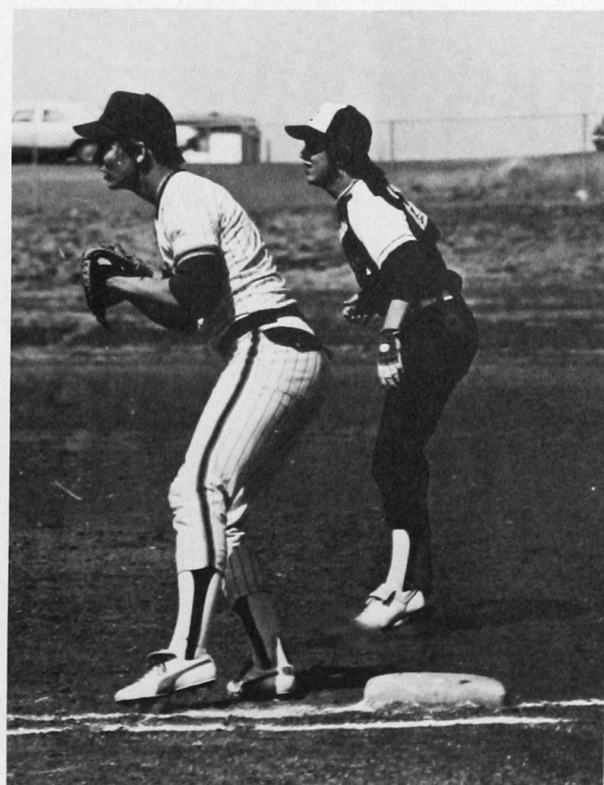
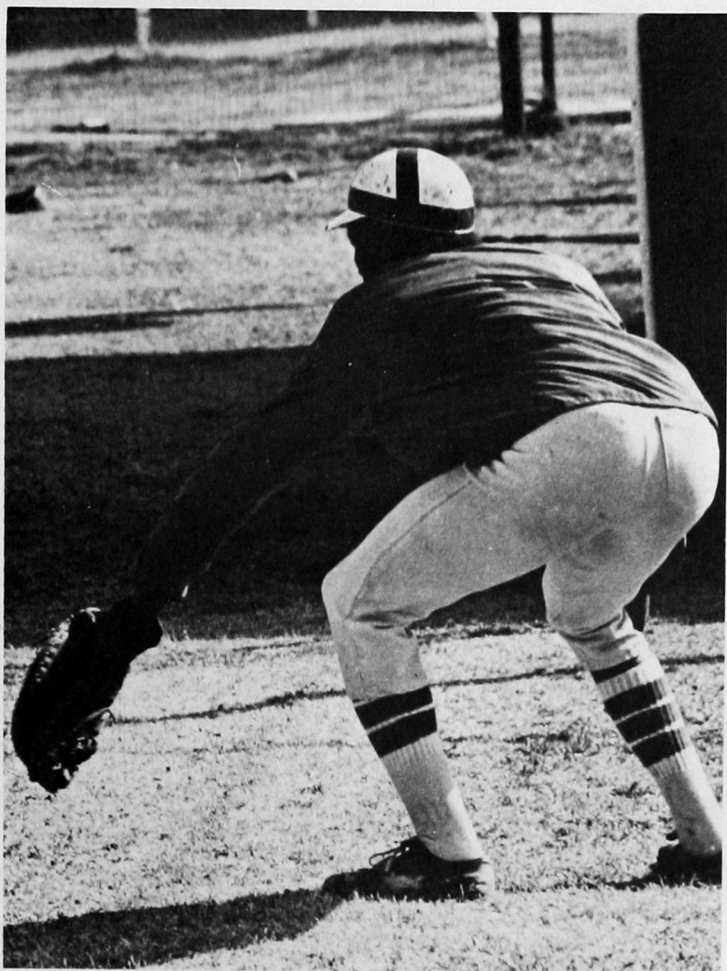
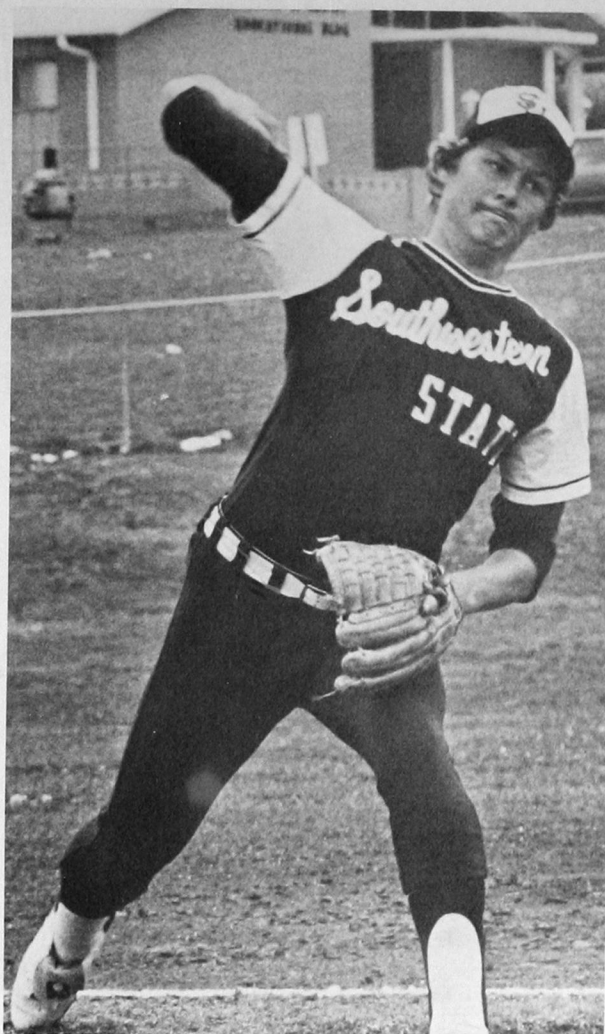
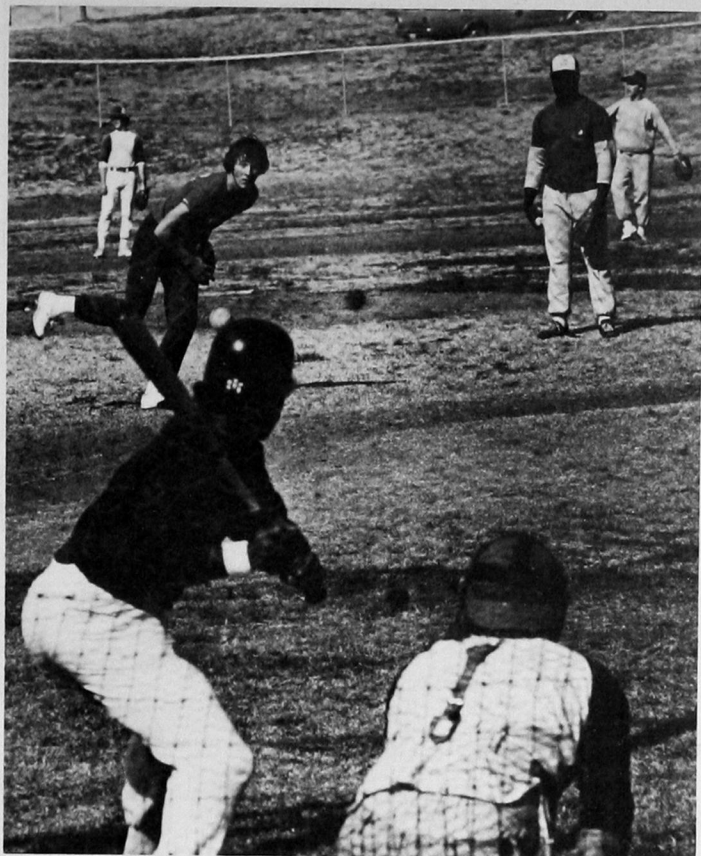
A very respectable season was turned in by the Bulldog baseball team as they finished second in the conference and third in the District Nine playoffs.

The upcoming season will find the Bulldogs with a new head coach as Cecil Devine steps down to devote all his time to football.





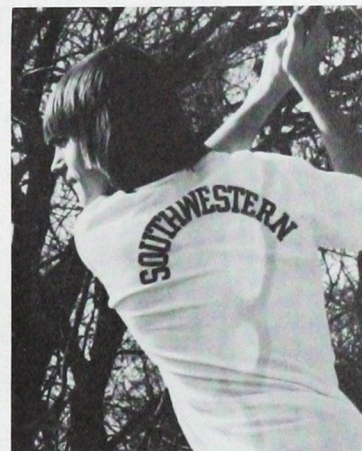
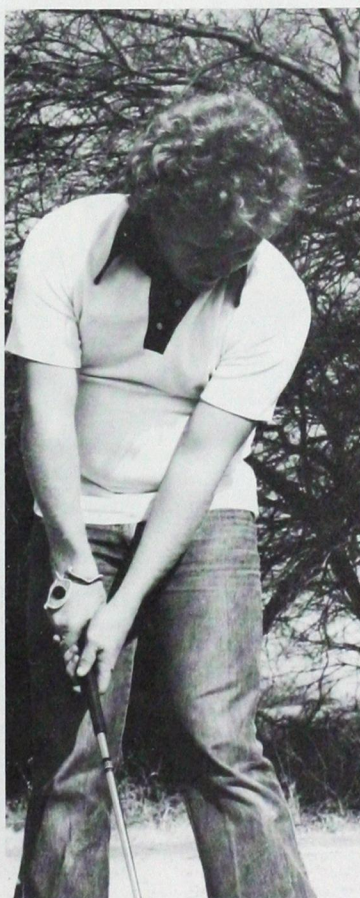


Tennis

Southwestern's track team managed a second place finish in the Oklahoma Intercollegiate Conference meet in 1976 as they could not surpass the surging Broncos of Central State. The Bulldogs ended the meet with 71 team points compared to 86 for Central State.

Individual winners in the tourney were Larry McDonald in the mile and two mile events, Tom Henry in high jump, and Ed Hayes in the 220 yard dash.

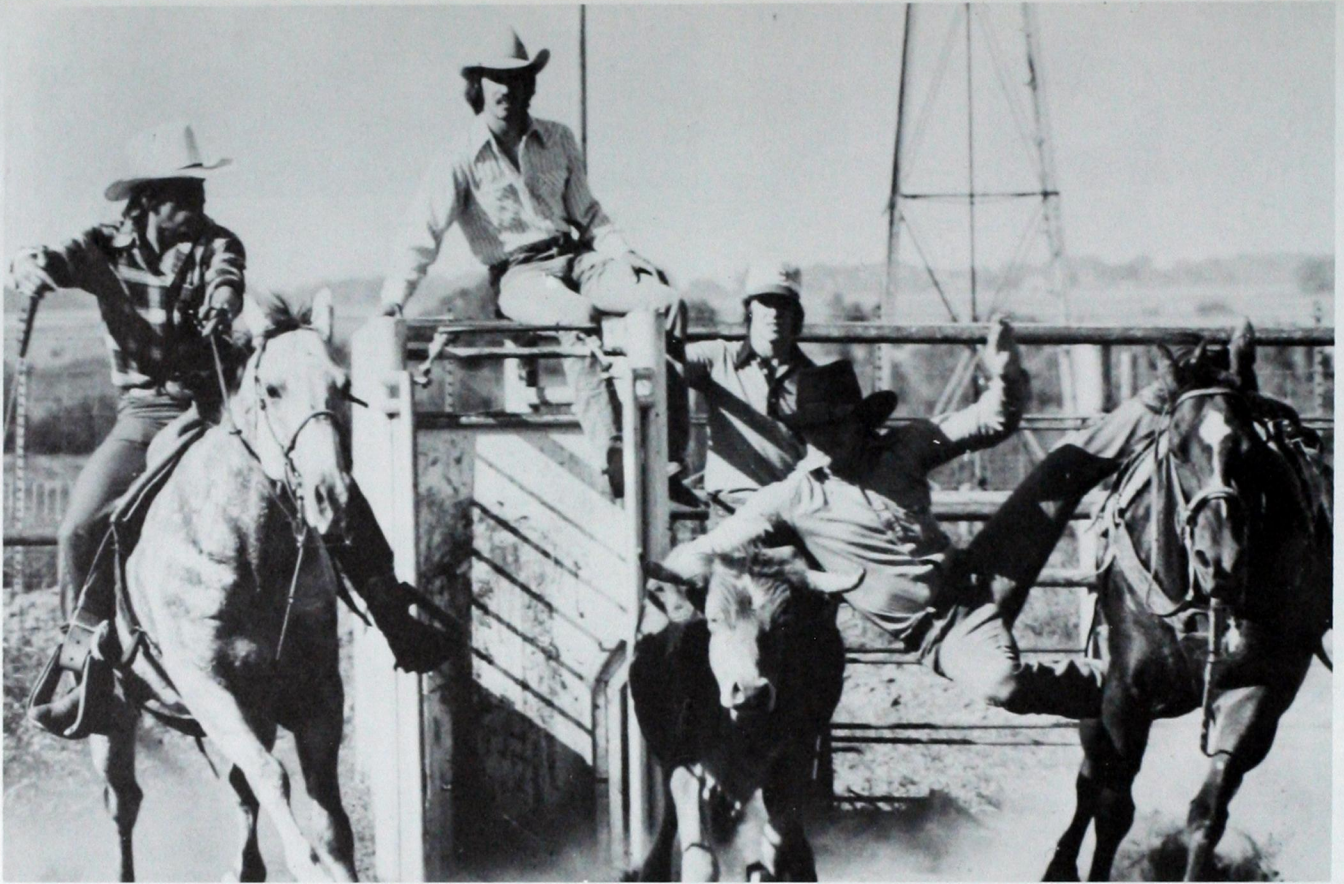

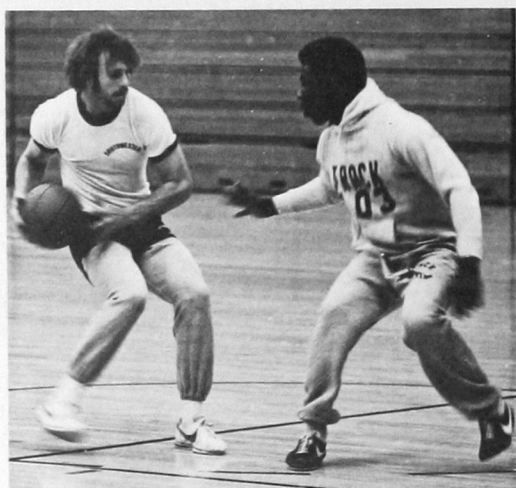
Rodeo

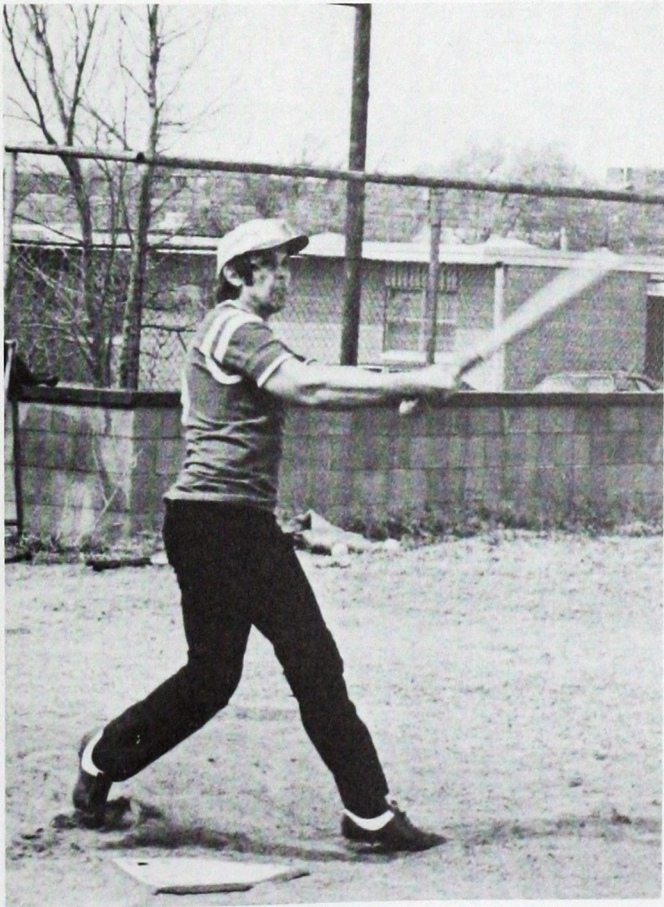


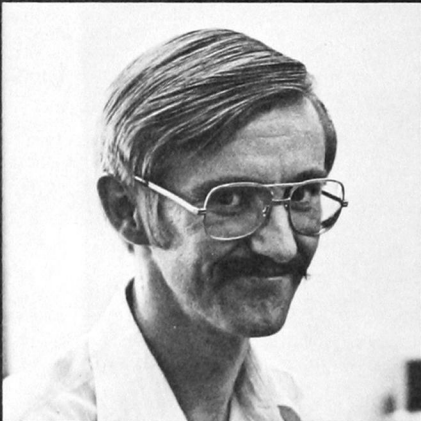
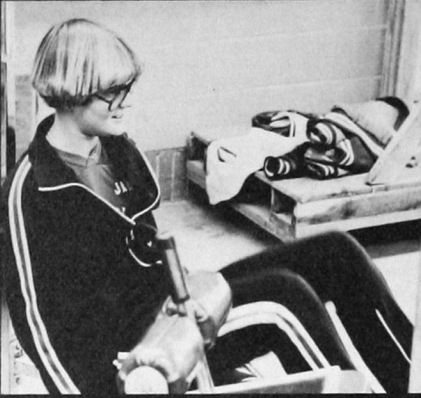
Intramurals
