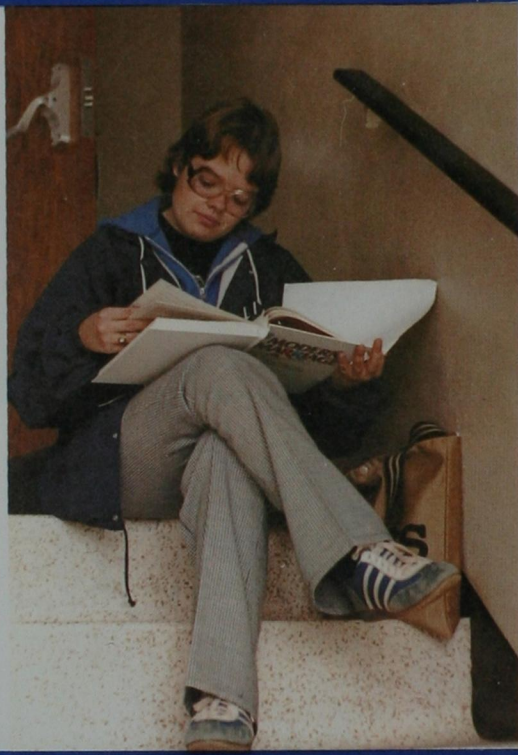
I see a college as a huge gray brain containing knowledge sitting on a hilltop with the tranquil dignity of Buddha.

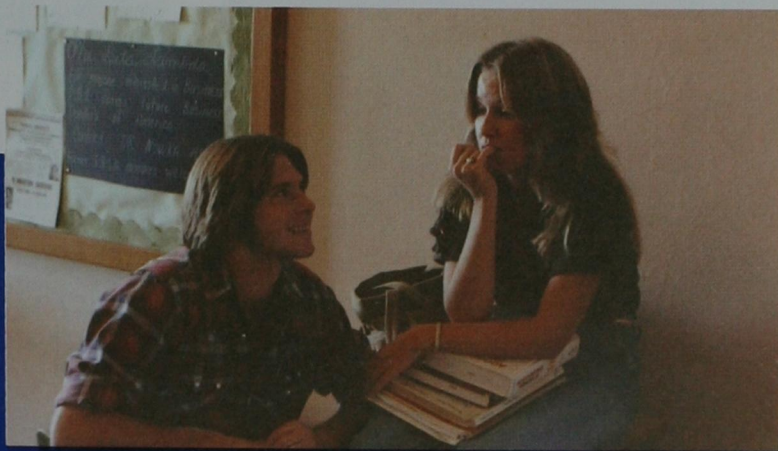

The School of Arts and Sciences consists of twelve departments: Art; Biology; Chemistry; Health, Physical Education, and Recreation; Home Economics; Industrial Education; Language Arts; Mathematics; Military Science; Music; Physics; and Social Sciences. About 60 per cent of the faculty teaches in these departments and about 60 per cent of student enrollments occur in courses offered in our departments.

The School of Arts and Sciences provides courses for students who wish to complete a major or minor in the disciplines listed above, and for students who are studying to become teachers. We also offer curricula for students who are preparing to undertake studies in one of the variety of the professions — such as law, medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, and engineering. Beyond this we offer most of the courses included in the General Education requirements. Thus most students who enroll at Southwestern take one or more of our courses. Many students conduct most of their studies with us. We consider this our good fortune.

The School of Business faculty has a strong commitment for involvement in professional and service activities.

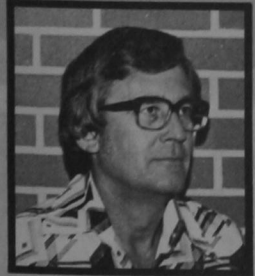
The recent expansion of the evening/night program extends the offering of the School of Business to area adults. The program offers a significant number of specialized courses for adult education needs.

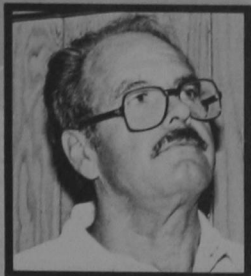

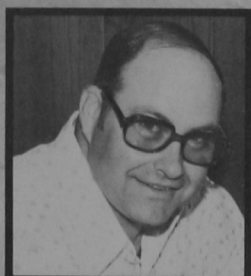

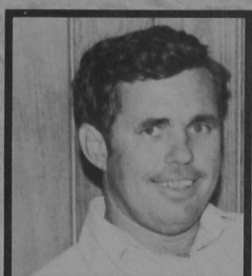

School of Education

Earl A. Reynolds, dean



The "School of Education", on July 1, 1978, became the new name for the division of the University responsible for the education of teachers; however, its role has been greatly expanded from that visualized at the time Southwestern was founded. In 1901, Southwestern State Normal School's major function was the preparation of teachers; today, the School of Education prepares professionals in the areas of psychology, teacher education and many related areas such as library education, counselor education, school administration, and special education.

When students began attending their first classes of a two-year teacher education program in 1903, we wonder if they could have visualized the School of Education seventy-five years later: reading specialists; high school coaches; driver education teachers; computer science; micro-teaching with color TV; Talk-Back TV from other parts of the State; special education practicums; psychology laboratories; animal laboratories; and master's degrees in applied psychology and every field of teacher education?

No matter how great the changes have been over the years, some things remain the same at Southwestern: a quality education; professors who care; students committed to the work ethic; and a community of scholars working together to bring to Oklahoma's young people a vision of hope and opportunity for the next seventy-five years.

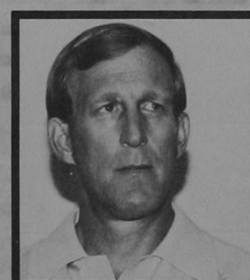
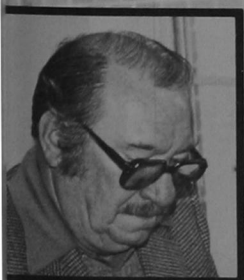
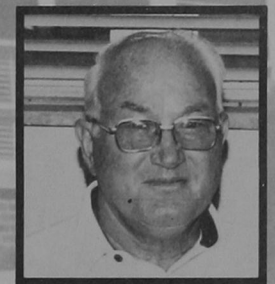

School of Pharmacy, Nursing and Allied Health

The shortage of qualified health professionals serving rural America is a national disgrace. Today, affluent metropolitan America has an excess of physicians and other health professionals, but efforts to induce this excess to move to rural America and live and practice in small towns have been spectacularly unsuccessful.

What is wrong? Is there any way that qualified health professionals can be obtained for rural America?

The answer is "yes". The way is simple. We must educate health professionals *for* rural America *in* rural America! The sociological and psychological bases for this phenomenon are difficult to explain, but the important thing is that it works. Part of the result is, no doubt, because of the small town locale; but perhaps equally significant is the observation that the rural based university attracts a different clientele of students than the city based "multiversity." These are capable candidates who would not choose to study a health discipline in the traditional metropolitan health science school.

The 1978-79 administrative reorganization of our University brings together all of our present health career educational programs — both pre-professional and degree granting — and provides an atmosphere and incentive to add others. We believe that this reorganization provides a golden opportunity to make Southwestern *THE Health Professions School* for rural Oklahoma. Beyond this, Southwestern has the potential to become *THE* model producer of Health Care Professionals for rural America. It will take hard work, vision, and dedication — but it can be done.

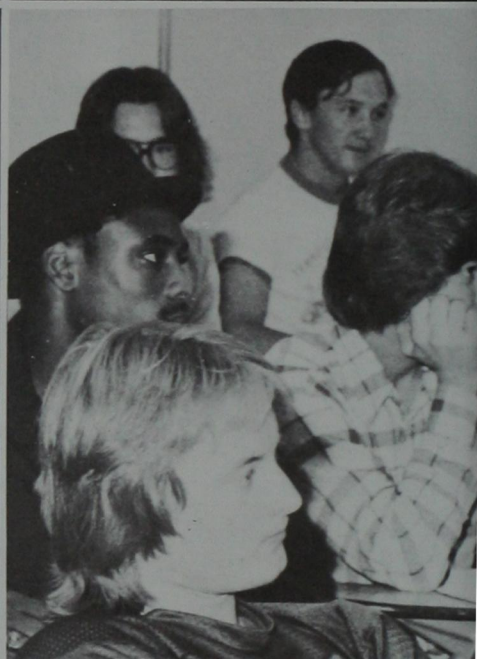


Art

The Art Department has four primary goals: to provide the essential education needed to develop an awareness of art in the students' daily lives, to enhance the general education program, to train art teachers for the public schools, and to furnish a sturdy foundation in commercial art for the media-minded artist.

Chemistry

Three degree programs are provided for chemistry majors in the School of Arts and Sciences, as well as a degree program for chemistry majors in the School of Education. The Chemistry Department cooperates with the Biology and Physics Departments to provide a degree program for secondary education majors in the field of Natural Sciences. The Department also offers the American Chemical Society Professional Degree.



Health, Physical Education, Recreation

The Department of Health, Physical Education, and Recreation performs a three-fold purpose: to improve the quality of life of the student through health and fitness, to prepare teachers in health, physical education and recreation, and to render health services and recreational pursuits in the interest of better living.



Industrial Education

The courses in the Industrial Education Department are divided into five general areas: Communication and Drafting, Construction and Woods, Manufacturing and Metals, Transportation Power and Energy Conversion, and Teacher Education. These courses provide preparation and technical instruction for students who wish to pursue careers in selected industrial fields and competence in the use of tools in vocational activities.



Biology

The Biology Department offers courses to prepare professional biologists for various industrial and government careers, to provide the pre-professional training required for entrance into such fields as dentistry, medicine or optometry, to train teachers in the field of biology, to prepare students for graduate study in the biological sciences, and to assist students minoring in the biological sciences.



General Education

Every student must complete a number of General Education courses in order to obtain a baccalaureate degree. Courses are required in six major areas: English and Speech, Mathematics, Physical Education, Biology, Physical Sciences, History and Social Sciences. At least fifteen hours of General Education electives are also required.



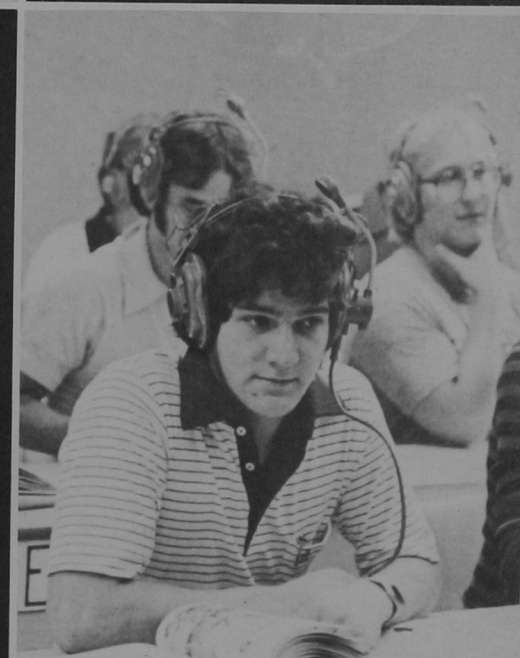
Home Economics

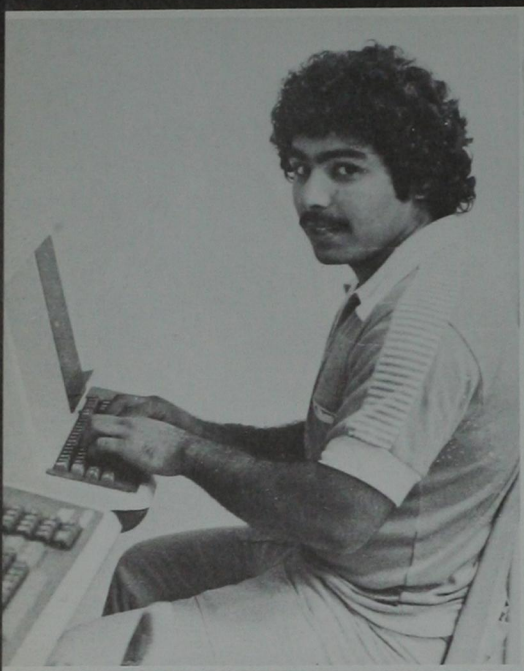
The Home Economics Department offers courses which prepare students for teaching and other professions in home economics. Classes such as Home Nursing, Child Development, Problems of Today's Consumer, and Marriage are instrumental in displaying attitudes and skills which contribute to satisfying home and family life.



Language Arts

The Language Arts Department is composed of four curricula. The English curriculum's main goal is to help all students improve their use of the English language as effective means of communication. In the Journalism curriculum, students may gain experience on the campus newspaper and yearbook. Courses in the Foreign Language curriculum give students cultural background. The Speech-Theatre curriculum provides theory and practice in speech and theatre.





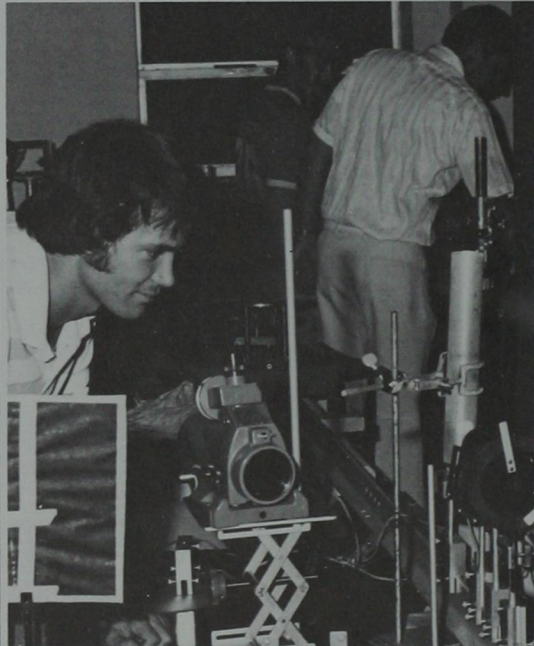
Mathematics and Computer Science

The Mathematics and Computer Science Department provides two major programs of study in mathematics. One is designed to equip professional mathematicians with a Bachelor's Degree in Science. The other program leads to a Bachelor's of Science in Education. Students planning careers in the field of Computer Science can complete a well-balanced sequence of specialized courses leading to a major or minor in Computer Science.



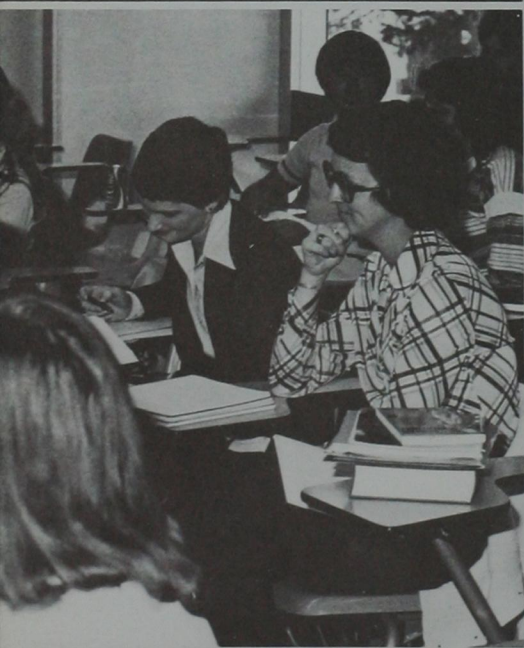
Physics —

The Department of Physics offers courses which present a broad understanding of such subjects as contemporary physics, geology, electronics, and astronomy. These courses are designed to prepare students for graduate study in physics, geology and related fields such as engineering, astronomy and meteorology.



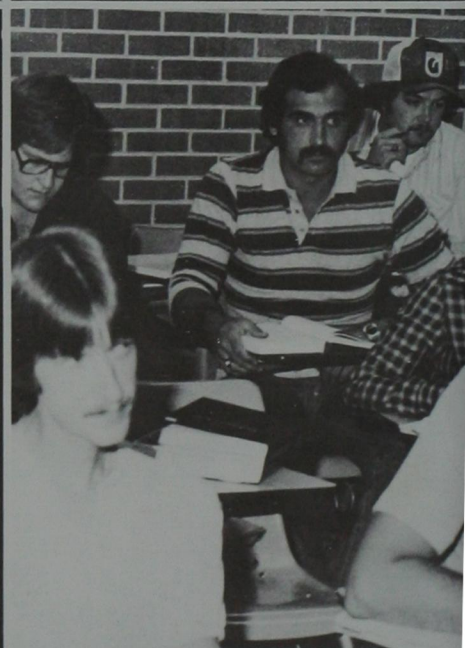
Social Science —

Through a study of American Heritage, the Social Sciences Department enables students to understand the basic problems confronting man, the nation, and the world. The preparation of public school teachers in the Social Sciences include a broadening of Heritage understanding to encourage future teachers to identify their personal value as they assess and investigate problems concepts, and events in social sciences.



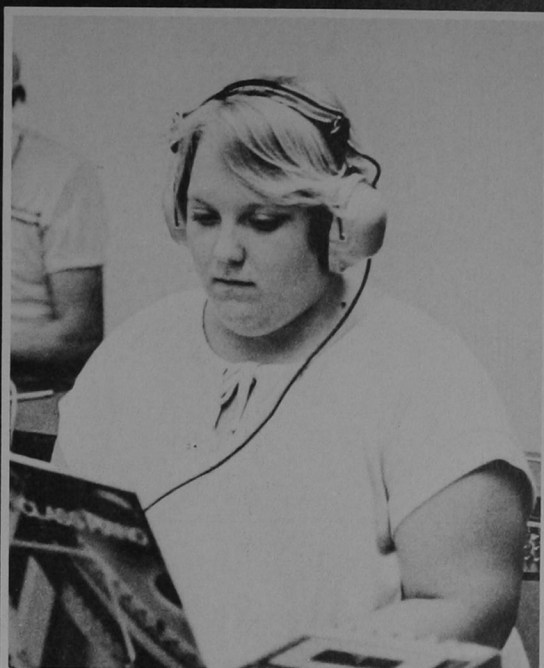
— Business Administration

Major programs of study in Management, Marketing, Retail Management, and Business Administration are pursued by more than 350 majors each semester. Career prospects are excellent in all of the business administration employment fields. The Master's Degree in Business Administration is also offered to qualified students.



— Military Science

The Military Science Department provides courses for elective hours, Military Science majors or minors and Physical Education credit. A few of the subcourses offered for Freshmen and Sophomores are Mountaineering, Survival Techniques, Combatives, and Orienteering. Eight hours of Military Science credit provide students opportunities to enter the advanced program which ultimately leads to a Commission in the United States Army.



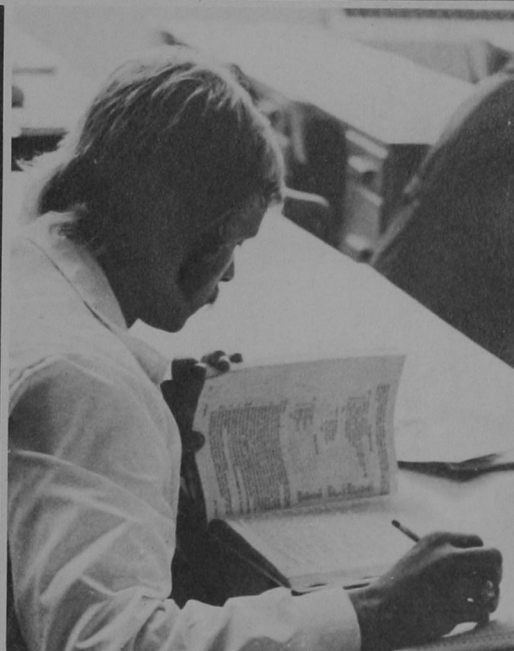
— Music

The Music Department's main objectives are to enrich the individual students' understanding of music, to provide the future teacher with skills and material to teach music, and to help the student gain performance experience. The department also provides musical service to the student body and promotes the development of good music.



Accounting —

The Accounting degree prepares students for a wide variety of career opportunities in both public and private accounting. Career openings in the accounting field are at an all time high in business, government, and industry. The accounting major at Southwestern prepares students for the C.P.A. Examination. Accounting is one of the "core" disciplines for all business careers and relates to the individual's success in many occupational fields.



— Economics/ Finances

The Economics degree prepares students for careers in governmental positions, research, and industry. Courses are available for students interested in investments, income analysis, economic systems, and general economic theory. Finance is a rapidly growing career field. Many opportunities exist with banks, savings and loan associations, and credit institutions. The degree program was designed to serve students interested in this field and to meet the job demand situation in Oklahoma.



— General Business

The General Business area provides support courses for all majors in the School of Business. Courses include Introduction to Business, a survey course, Business Mathematics, and the areas of Law and Communications.

Office Administration and Business Education —

Office Administration continues to be one of the "peak" employment fields in the nation. The department of Office Administration offers both degree and certificate programs. Business teacher preparation is available in Business Education. An "optional" graduate program is available that permits content concentrations for those who wish to teach in community and/or junior colleges.



Elementary Education —

The utilization of sound teaching principles are primary objectives of Elementary Education. Knowledge of subject content, objectives and teaching techniques are also heavily stressed. With the cooperation of an extensive knowledge of communications, the Elementary Education student learns to demonstrate such humanistic qualities as concern toward all his future students and the development of conductive self-discipline.



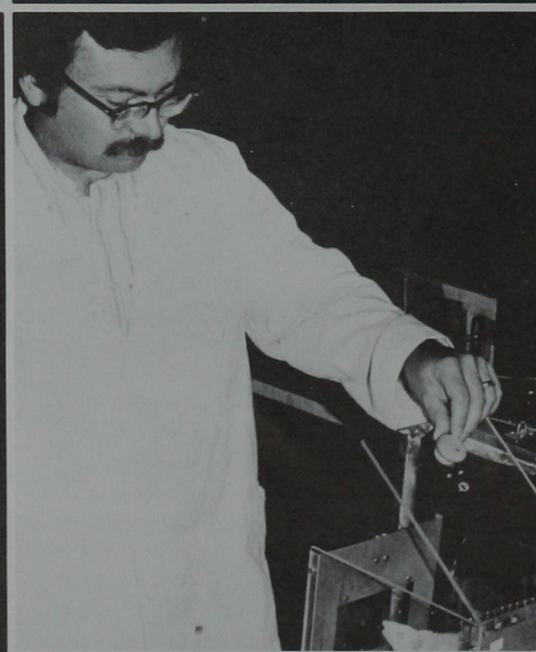
— School Administration

The Department of School Administration is a Graduate Program in the School of Education. The department is concerned with training its students in the areas of school administration. Courses provide students with views of the urgent and recurring problems found in the administration of school systems and how to deal with them.



Psychology —

The Psychology Department provides courses for teacher education and general education. The department also offers a comprehensive major and minor in psychology with a graduate program leading to a master's degree in psychology. Students gain early laboratory experience and take scientific approaches to the study of the discipline of psychology.



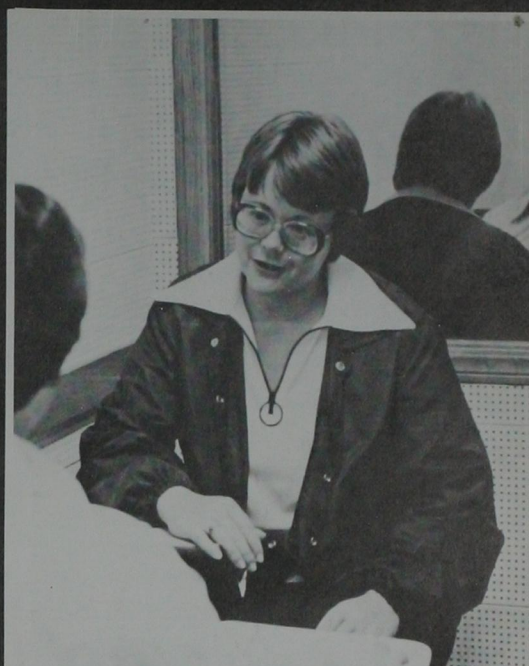
Division of Nursing —

The four year course leads to a B.S. in Nursing. Two years are Pre-profession and two years Professional training. The curriculum includes academic classes plus clinical experiences in different hospitals and allied health care facilities. In the clinical phase patient-nursing relationships are also stressed.



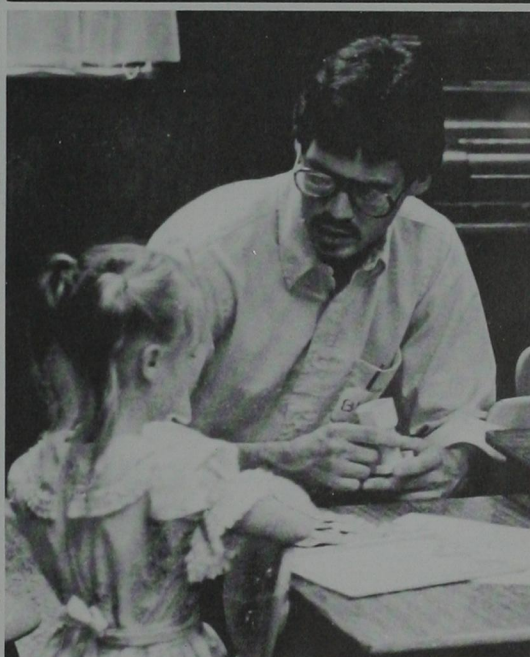
Guidance and Counselor Education —

Guidance and Counselor Education is a department in the graduate division of the School of Education. The principle goal is to prepare individuals to serve as school counselors, both elementary and secondary levels. Since counseling and guidance are expanding in terms of ages and in terms of those served, the counselors are expected to widen their range of programs to become a part of their communities as well as their schools.



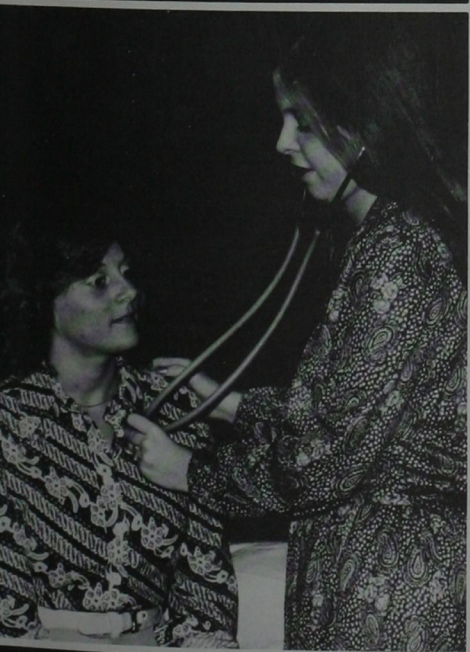
— Secondary Education

The Secondary Education Department stresses creative learning activities by using techniques of reinforcement, value clarification and group dynamics. The department offers courses which enable the future teacher to be able to exhibit an awareness of the social, emotional, mental, intellectual and cultural environment of each future student.



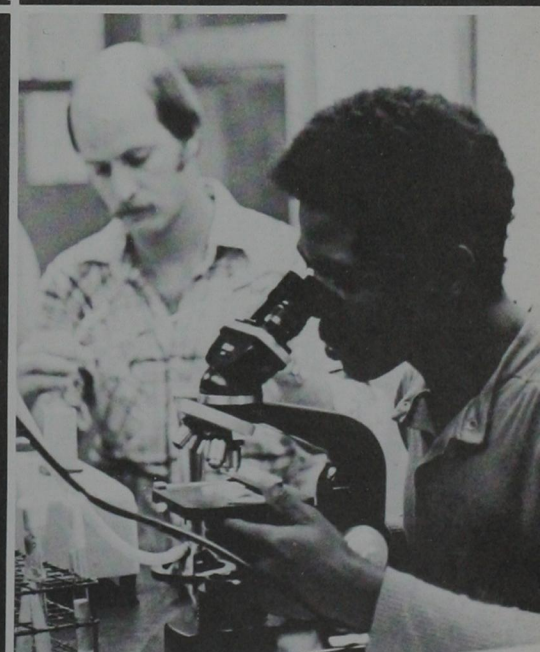
— Special Education

Application of instructional techniques in a classroom setting with the mentally handicapped and learning disabled child is the basic concern of the Special Education program. Demonstration of knowledge of special education theories and ability in construction of appropriate classroom materials for working with the mentally handicapped and learning disabled child are also stressed by the department.



Division of Allied Health —

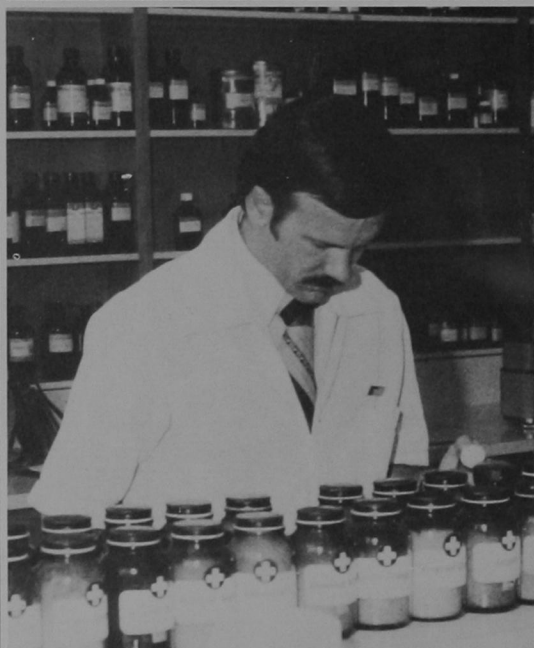
Allied Health includes Medical Technology, Medical Records, and Allied Health Administration Services. In the Medical Records training, one is trained as a Medical Records administrator, which includes filing and coordinating of all medical records of the patient. The Allied Health Administration Services include training of Administrators for hospital, nursing home and related health areas.





Clinical Pharmacy

The Department of Clinical Pharmacy encompasses the courses Clinical Pharmacy and Pharmacy Practicum. These courses involve a patient-oriented correlation of the student's specialized pharmaceutical knowledge of drug therapy with its application in the clinical situation, utilizing the hospital as a laboratory, and institutional and community settings for realistic experience.



Pharmaceutics

Pharmaceutics is a series of courses concerned with the study of modern prescription dispensing with emphasis on applied therapeutics. This includes the dispensing function of drugs and drug products and a patient-oriented application of pharmaceutical knowledge of drug therapy and its application in community and institutional pharmacy.



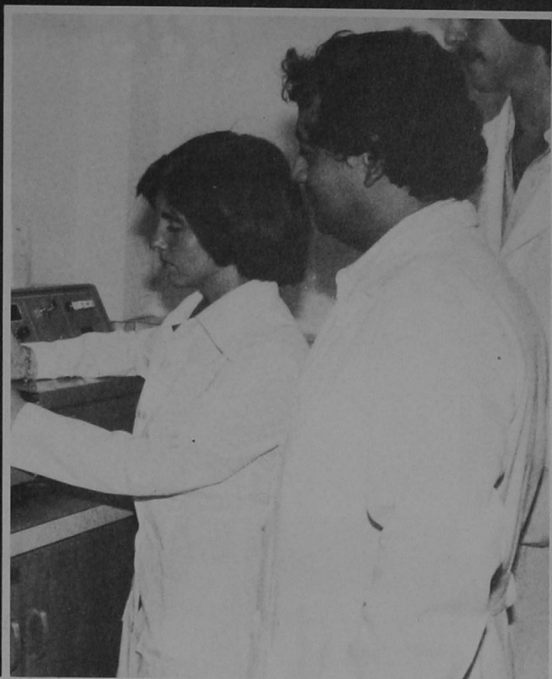
Pharmacology

The Department of Pharmacology includes courses in Pharmacology, Clinical Pharmacology and Toxicology. Purpose of the courses is to present in a rational basis the use of drugs in the treatment and prevention of disease. The academic lectures are supplemented by laboratory experiments to reinforce the lecture material and to demonstrate principles impossible to depict in the academic lecture situation.



Health Care Administration

The Department of Health Care Administration is charged with the responsibility of providing the student with a background in the financial management and operation of a pharmacy, both community and hospital. In addition, several areas in the behavioral sciences are emphasized such as Human Relations and Communications, both of which are directly related to the operation of a business and profession.



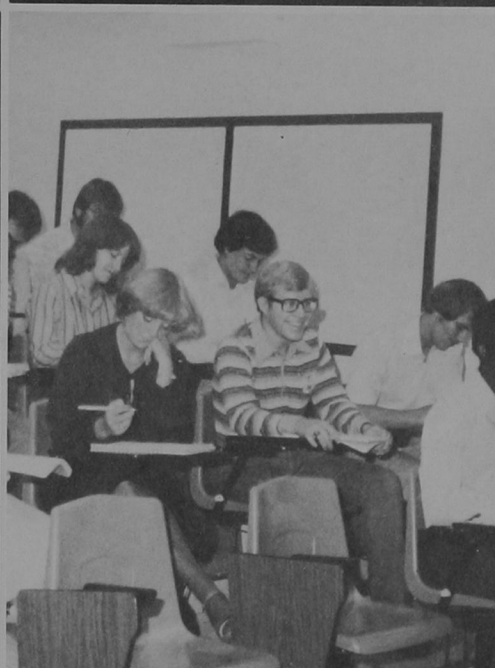
Medical Chemistry

The Medicinal Chemistry Department offers a Drug Analysis course, a Medicinal Chemistry I course, and a Medicinal Chemistry II course. The Drug Analysis course deals with the description of analytical techniques and their application to bioavailability and drug activity. The other two courses relate the physiochemical properties of organic medicinal agents to their respective physiological responses.



Pharmacognosy

Pharmacognosy includes courses describing drugs derived from plants and animals and their modern application in medicine, pharmacy and commerce. It emphasizes the clinical application of the various natural products. It shows how new drugs are developed by the medicinal chemist by modification of the natural product.



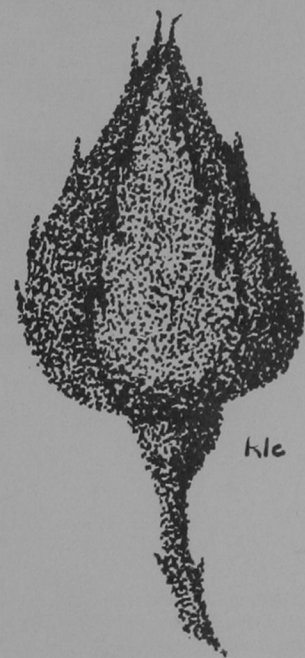
Physiology

The Department of Physiology is responsible for instruction in three courses: Human Physiology I, Human Physiology II, and Pathology. The courses in human physiology are concerned with the normal structure and function of the human body. The course in pathology is an introduction to the human body. These three courses are prerequisite to the required courses in pharmacology.

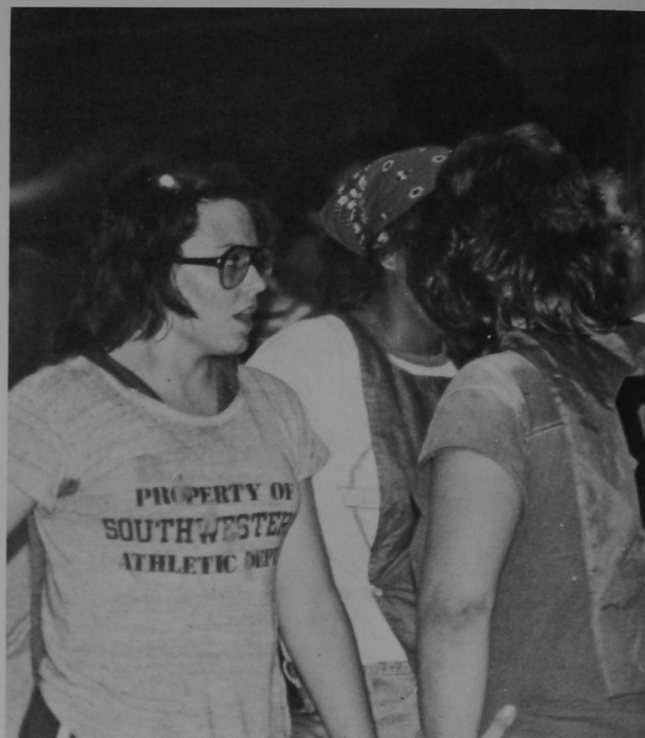
Upward Bound

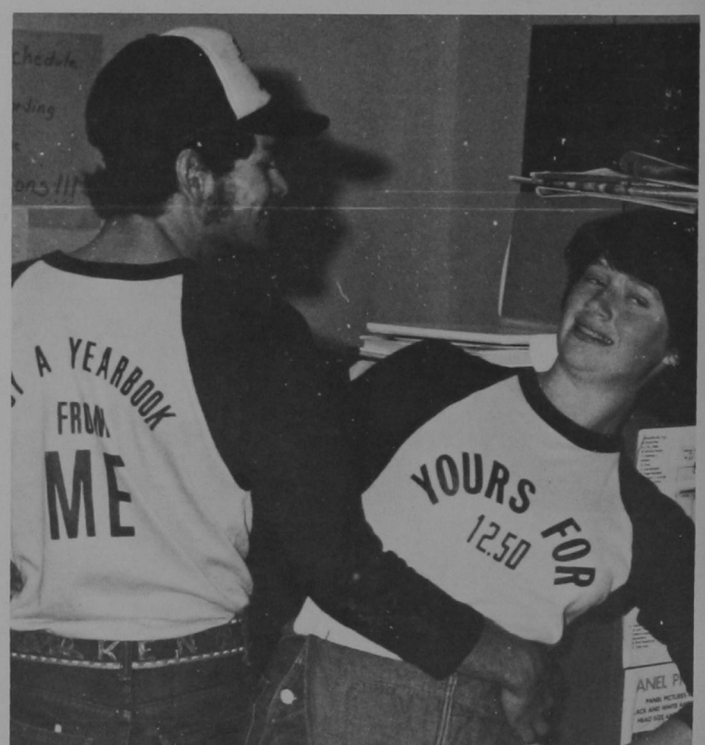
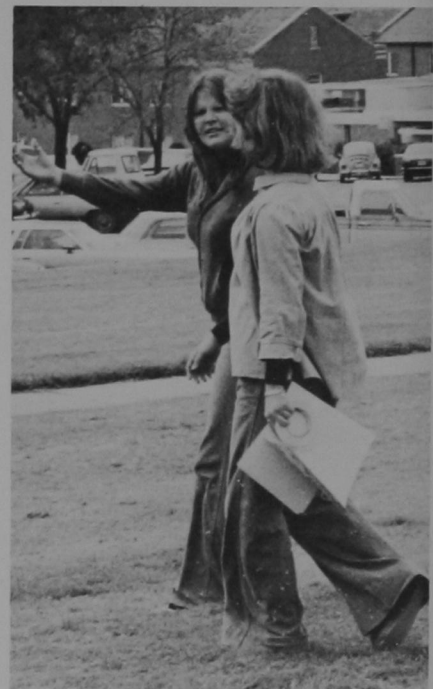
Newspaper

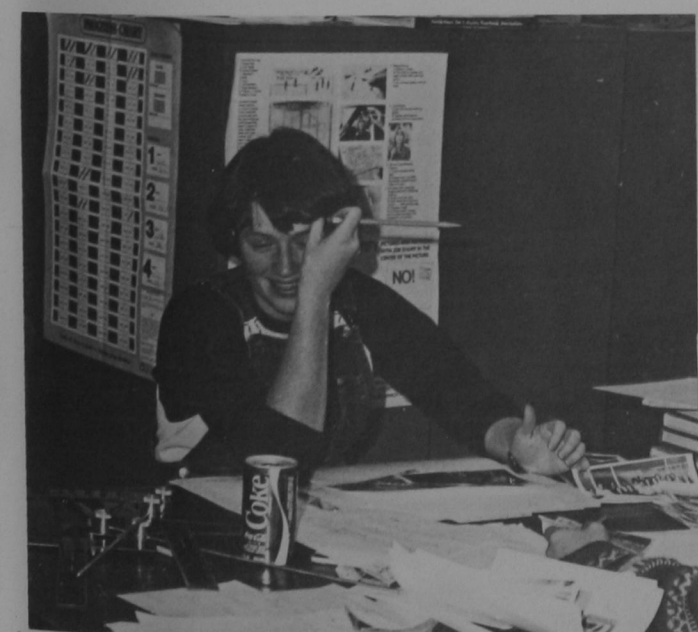


Yearbook

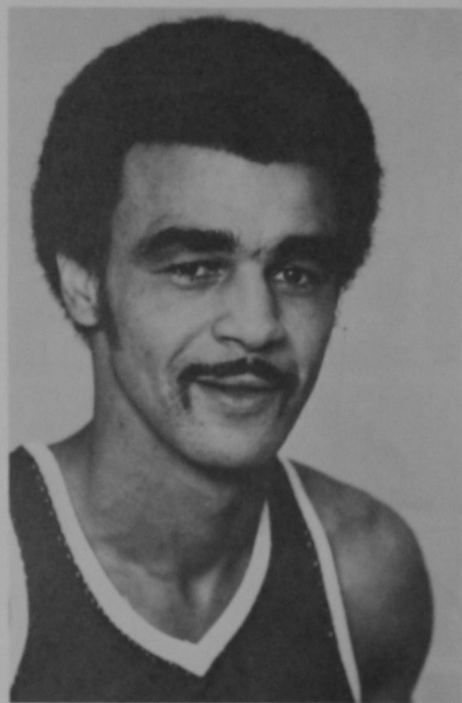
In his third year as the head coach of the Southwestern Bulldogs, George Hauser has once again put together a winning season.

The Bulldogs returned three starters from the 1978 team and five lettermen returned to the Southwestern workouts.



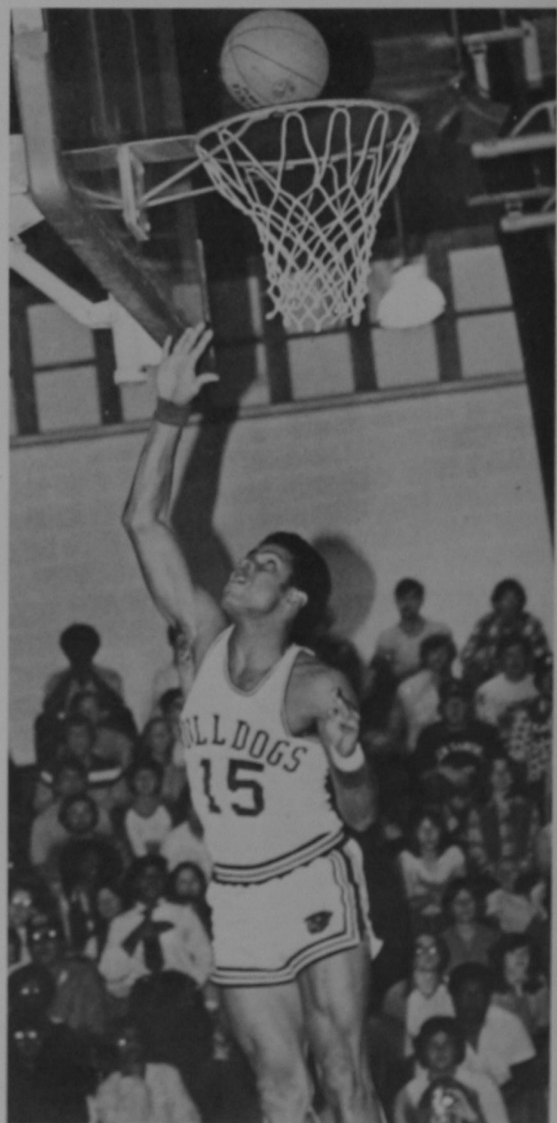

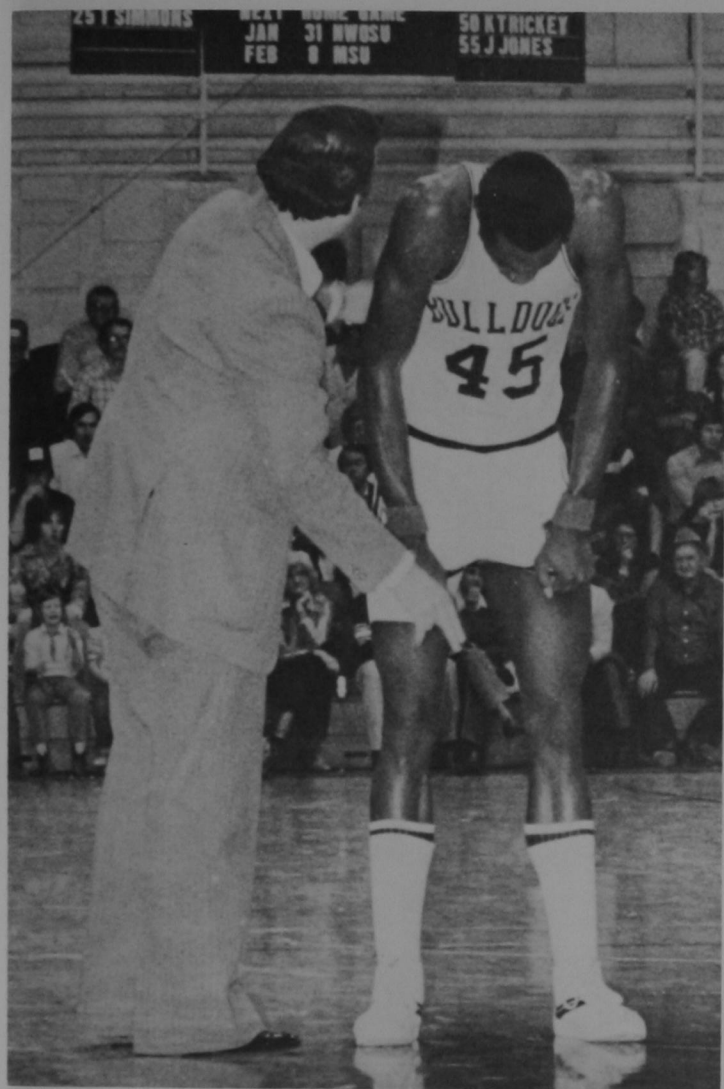

Gerold Nipp, catcher, and Rex Enterline, third baseman, were named to the All-Conference and All-District 9 teams.

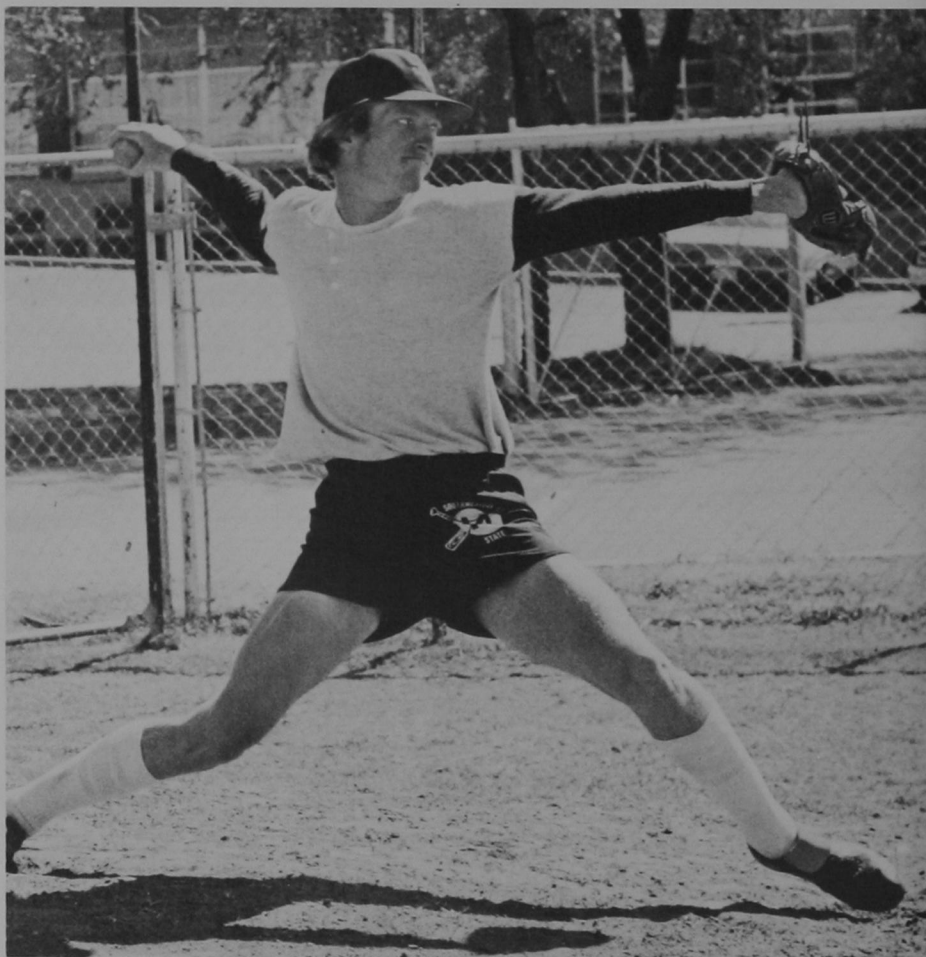
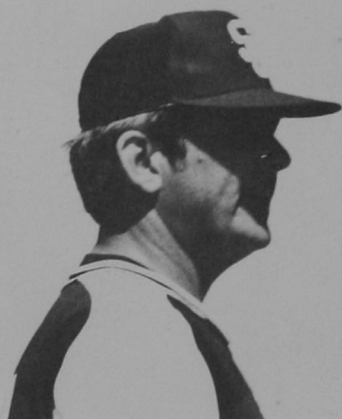

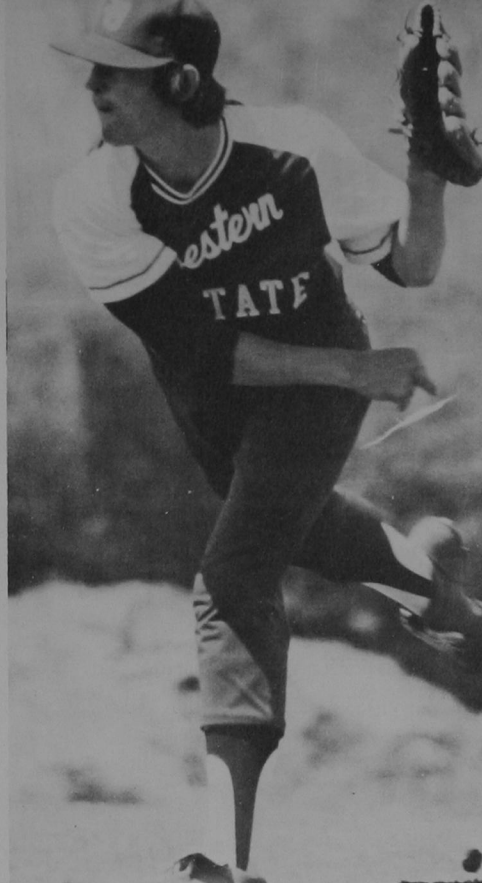

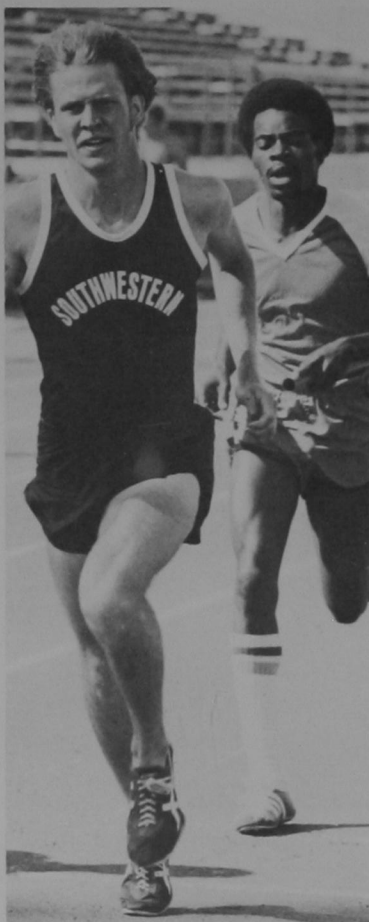

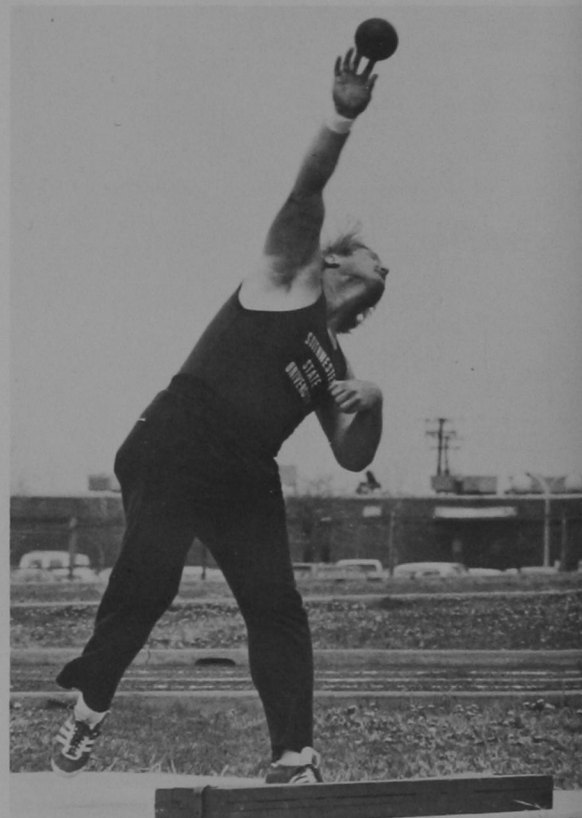

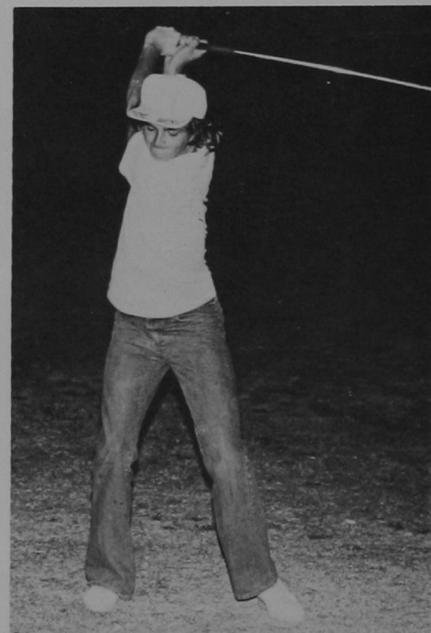

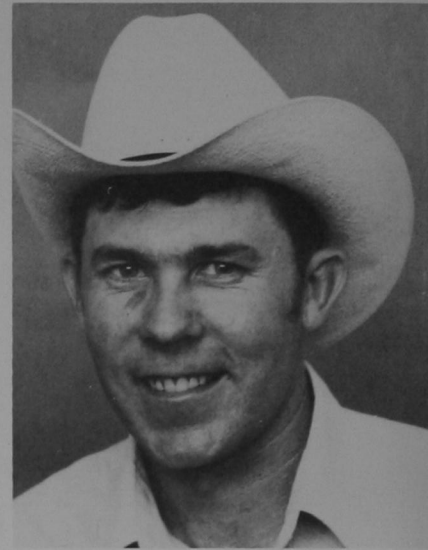
Rodeo

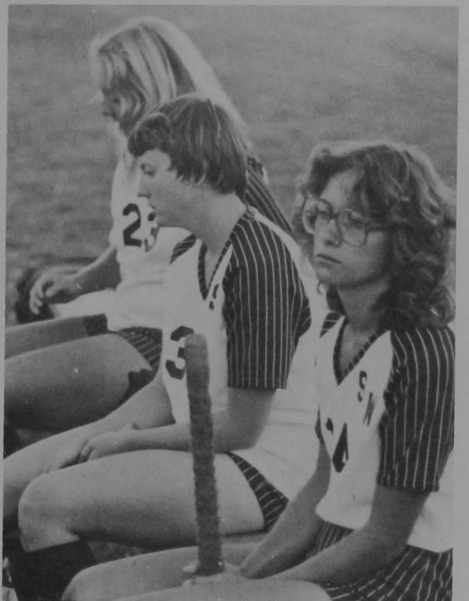
Women's Field Hockey

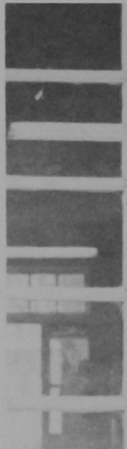
Intramural Sports

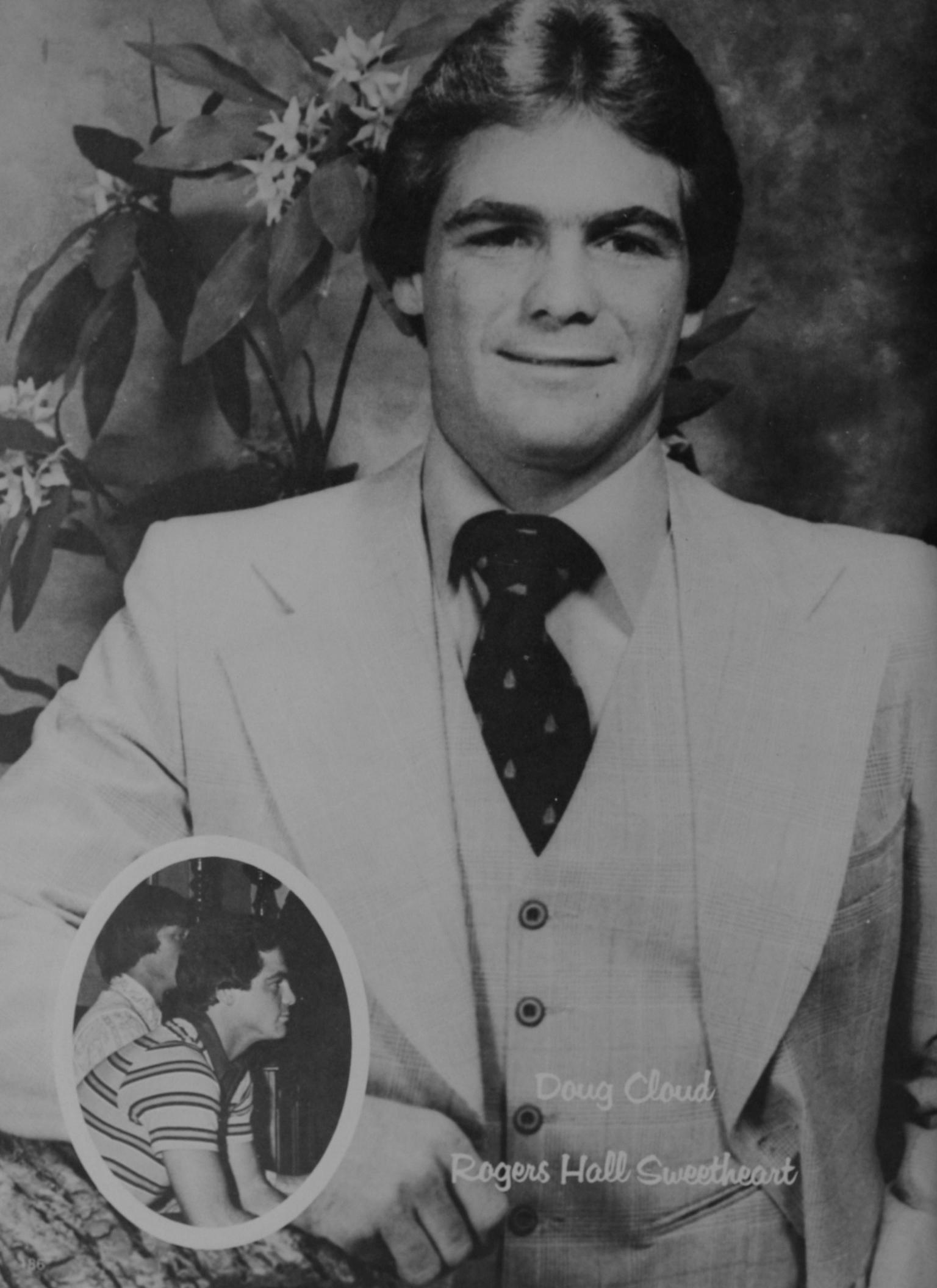

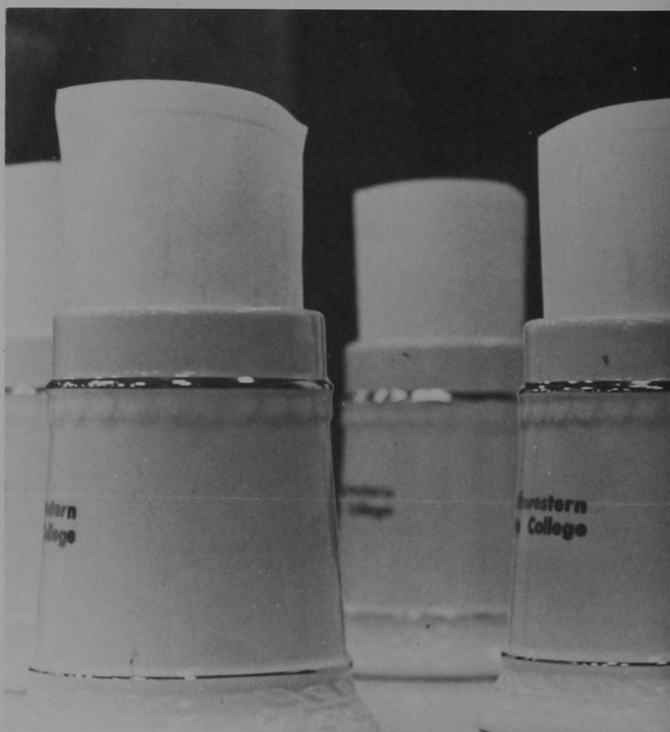
Duke Awards

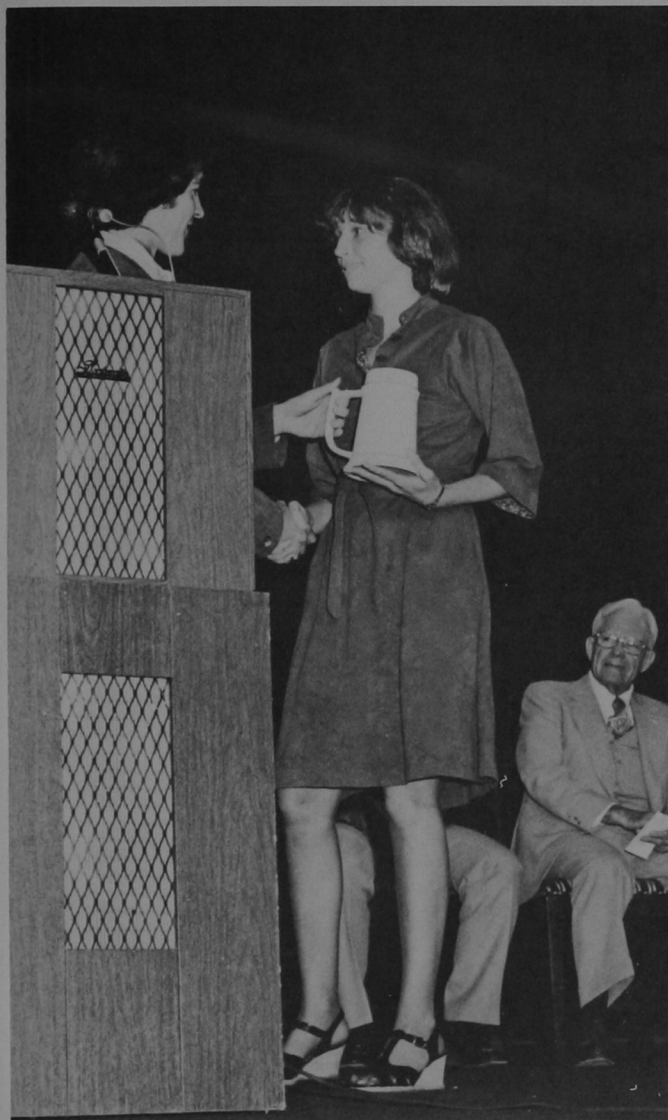
