Southwestern Oklahoma State University has come a long way since it was established as a Normal School in 1901. This site was once the Cheyenne Arapho area and was opened to settlement in a way similar to the Great Run of 1889.

In 1901 there was a great need for teachers to teach in the prairie schools that cropped up, so the school was established with that purpose in mind.

Before final legislation authorizing the school was even passed, several communities indicated interest in hosting the Normal. Among these were:

Granite, Mangum, Cordell, El Reno, and Weatherford.

After a long hard fight, which even found it's way to the courtroom, Weatherford, finally won the right to build the school, but there were some governing conditions. The town that was to receive the school must provide, free to the territory of Oklahoma (Oklahoma was not yet a state) a forty acre site located within one mile of the corporate limits of the town. The selected town must also provide \$5000 for fencing, planting trees, and beautifying the campus of the proposed school.

The news that Weatherford had been selected reached town on a Saturday night. Suddenly, the town was aroused by the sound of steam whistles, shotguns and pistols being fired and the shouts of happy people. It was a scene straight out of "Gunsmoke".

By 1903 the town could boast of five churches, a school, and a fairly efficient city government. Even so, the community possessed many of the characteristics of semi-frontier towns. Transients, many rootless and others seeking haven from the law, frequented the Territory. The saloons and dancehalls enjoyed a thriving business.

Violence accompanied by frequent deaths resulting from robbery and drunken brawls, was not uncommon. Posses occasionally ran down criminals and disputes were decided in gun fights.

But these conditions were not limited to Weatherford, but prevailed throughout many towns in Western Oklahoma. But now that the Normal was coming to the community, several leading citizens sought to improve the environment in which students would live. Subsequently, the saloons were closed on Sundays and gambling, alcohol and prostitution were banned by law.

When he walked on campus in June of 1903, he had neither a building nor a staff, yet the prospects for large enrollment in the fall seemed good.

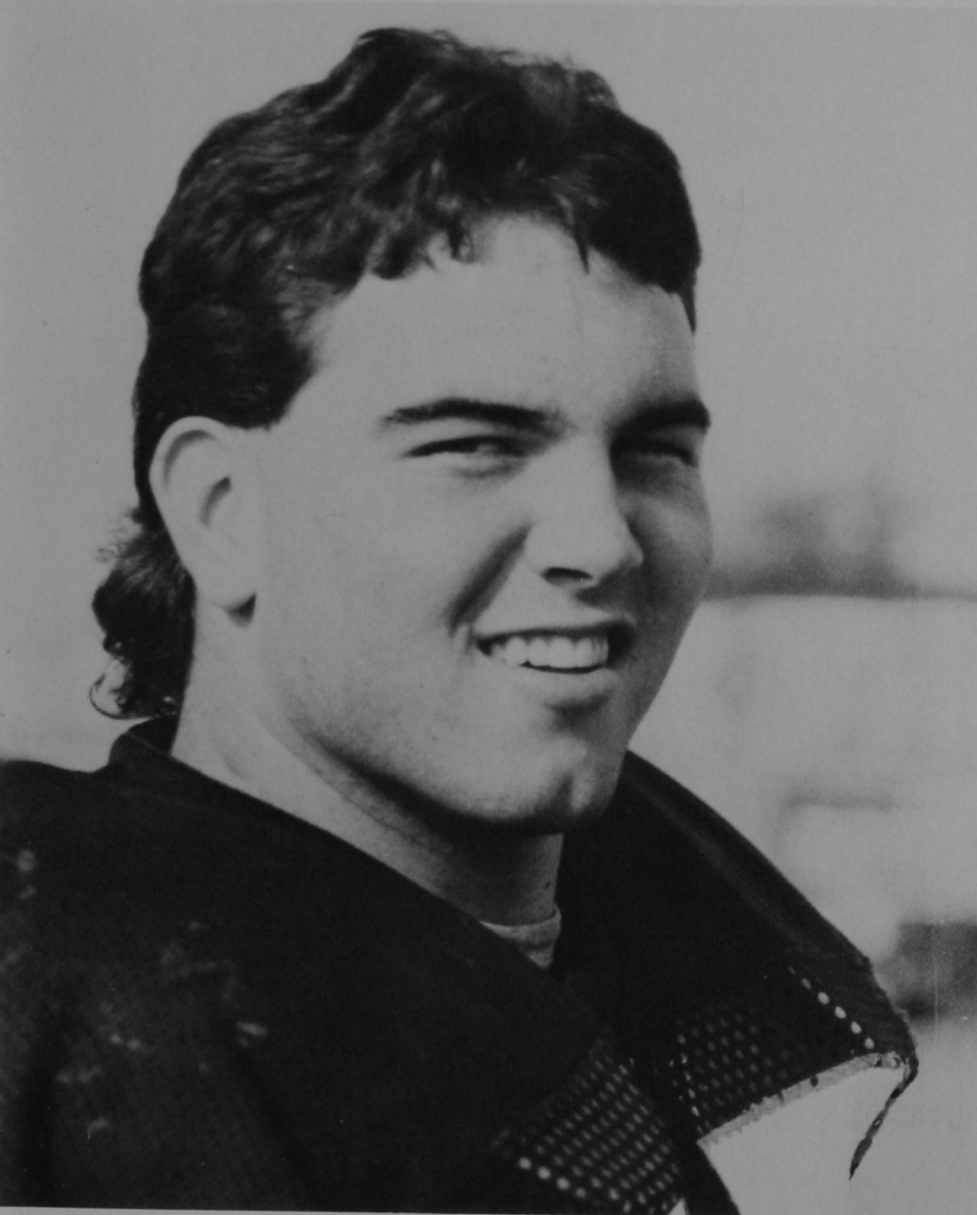
The Corner stone for the first building was laid on July 4, 1903.

September came and with it, eager students. They came by horseback, wagon, and train. The school was officially opened September 15, 1903.

Because the school building was not yet finished, classes were held in an abandon church and an old saloon until February of 1904.

The new school was located on the crest of a hill overlooking the town and the valley of Little Deer Creek. From the top of this hill one had a beautiful panoramic view for miles in every direction. On the horizon to the south of the valley there arose a ridge dividing the streams which flow toward the Red River and those which flow toward the Arkansas River. The view from the hill-top was striking; there were broad areas of grassland, cultivated fields and deep canyons bordered by clumps of trees and brush. It was truly a beautiful sight.

Yet little could be said for the nearby town of Weatherford during the early years of the 20th century. Like other frontier towns, it consisted of mostly unpainted frame buildings. The streets were seas of mud when it rained, and the passage of horses and wagons stirred clouds of dust when it was dry. The false-fronted stores, hitching rails and watering troughs were all present.

Early student life was, shall we say, "different". They lived in homes of townspeople and Room and Board was \$10 a month. A late night buggy ride was the in thing.

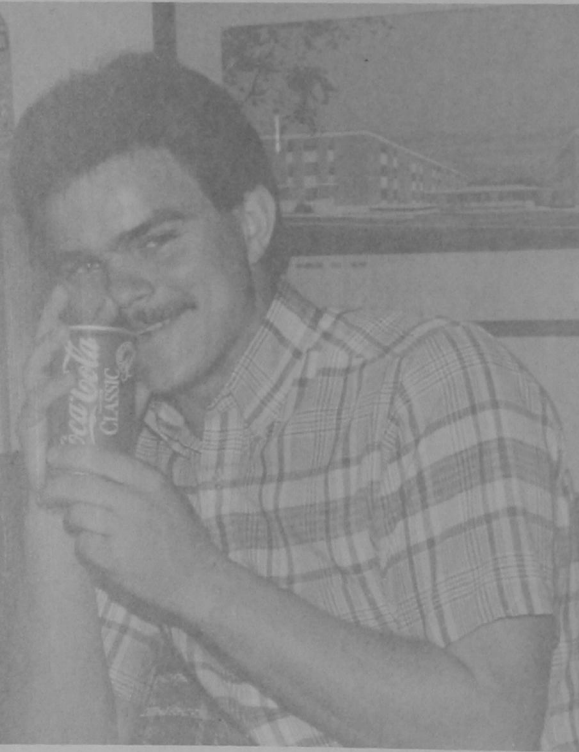
In October of 1903 the Athletic Association was formed, but was short lived due to lack of student support. However, before the group disbanded it accomplished one thing of a permanent character; it chose the school colors, although quite by accident. When the group purchased their first jerseys for the football team, blue and white were the only colors available on such short notice.

Today Southwestern employees over 230 professors and teachers, consists of over a dozen buildings and hosts over 5,200 students each semester.

Southwestern is truly "standing firmly on the hilltop".



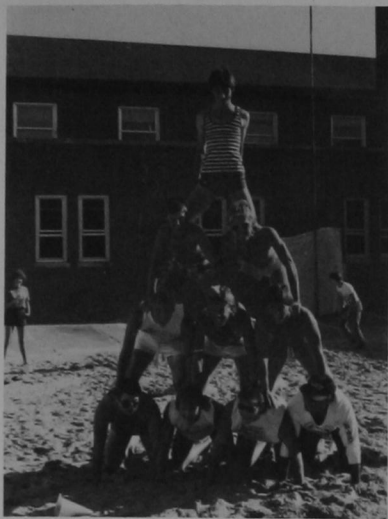

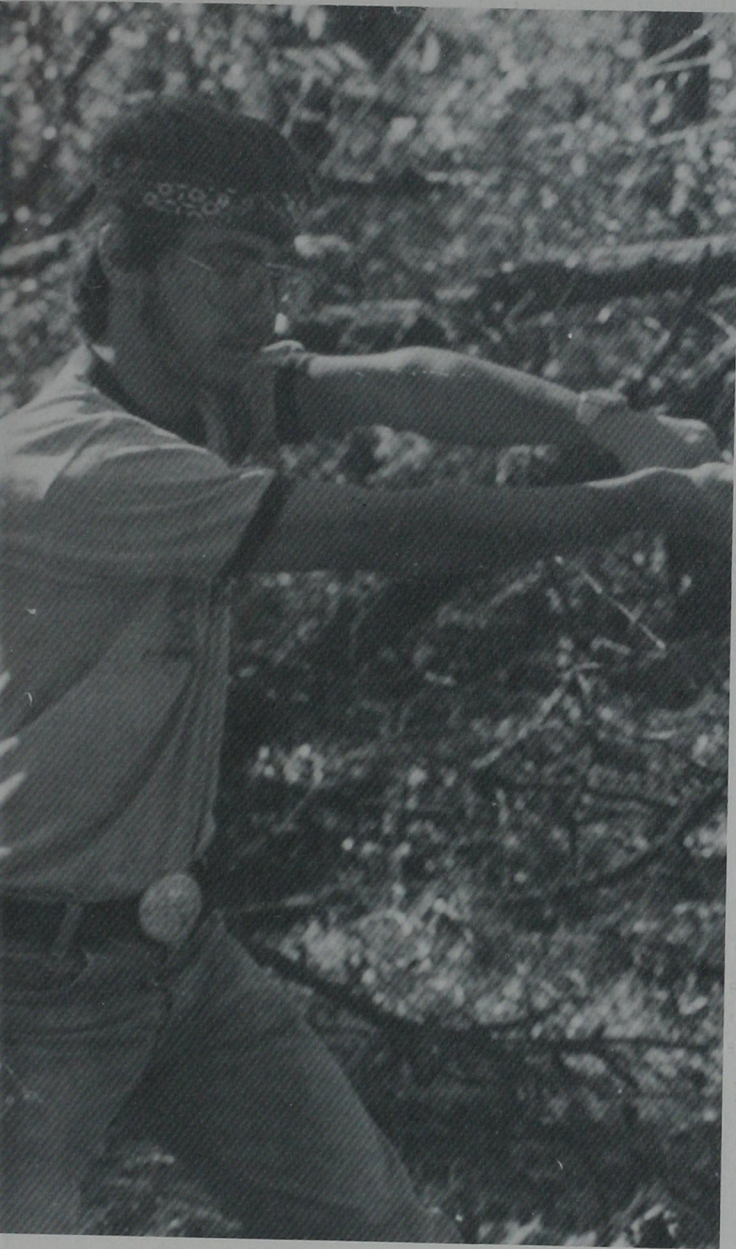


Accounting Club

Baptist Student Union

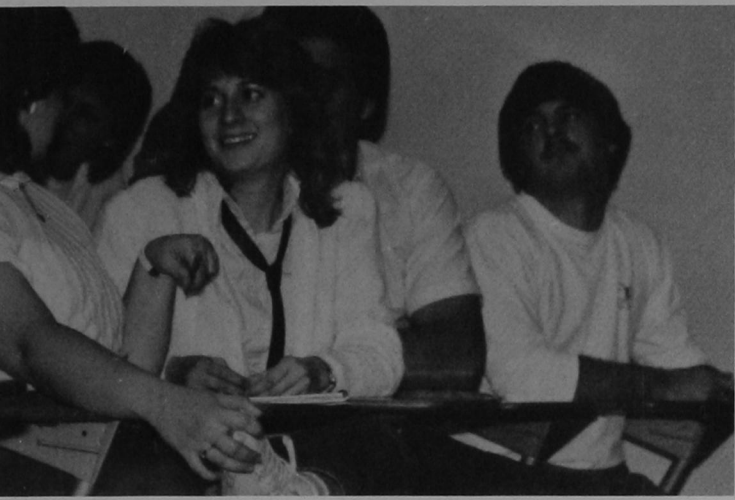

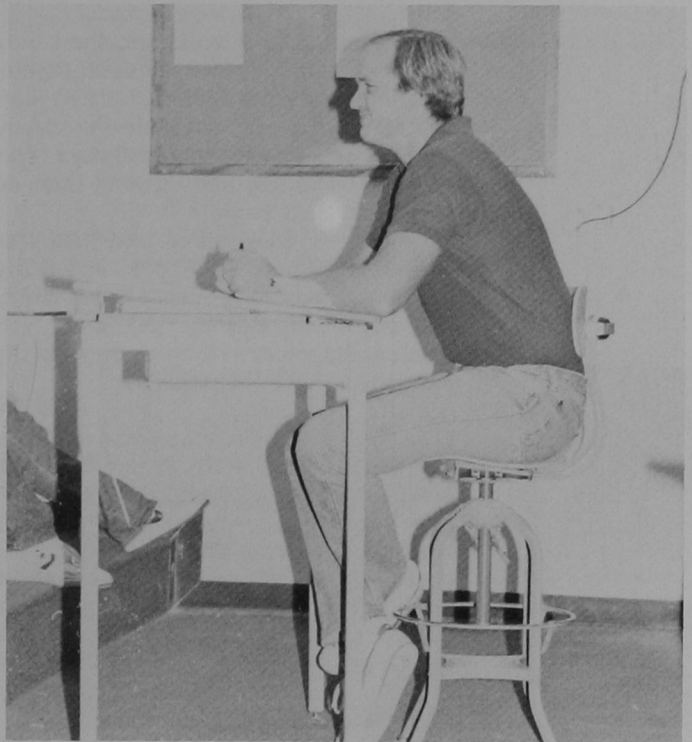

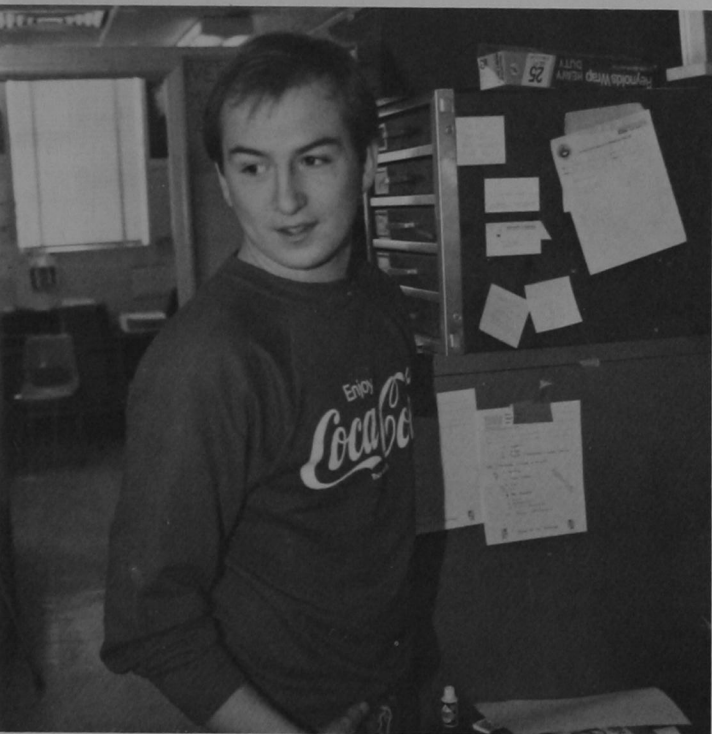
BULLDOG Staff

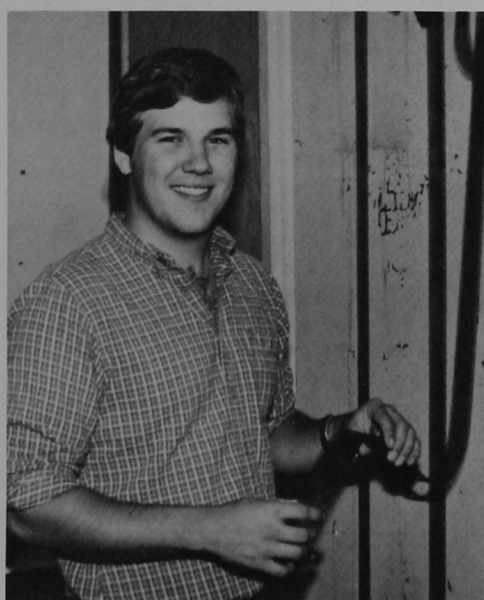

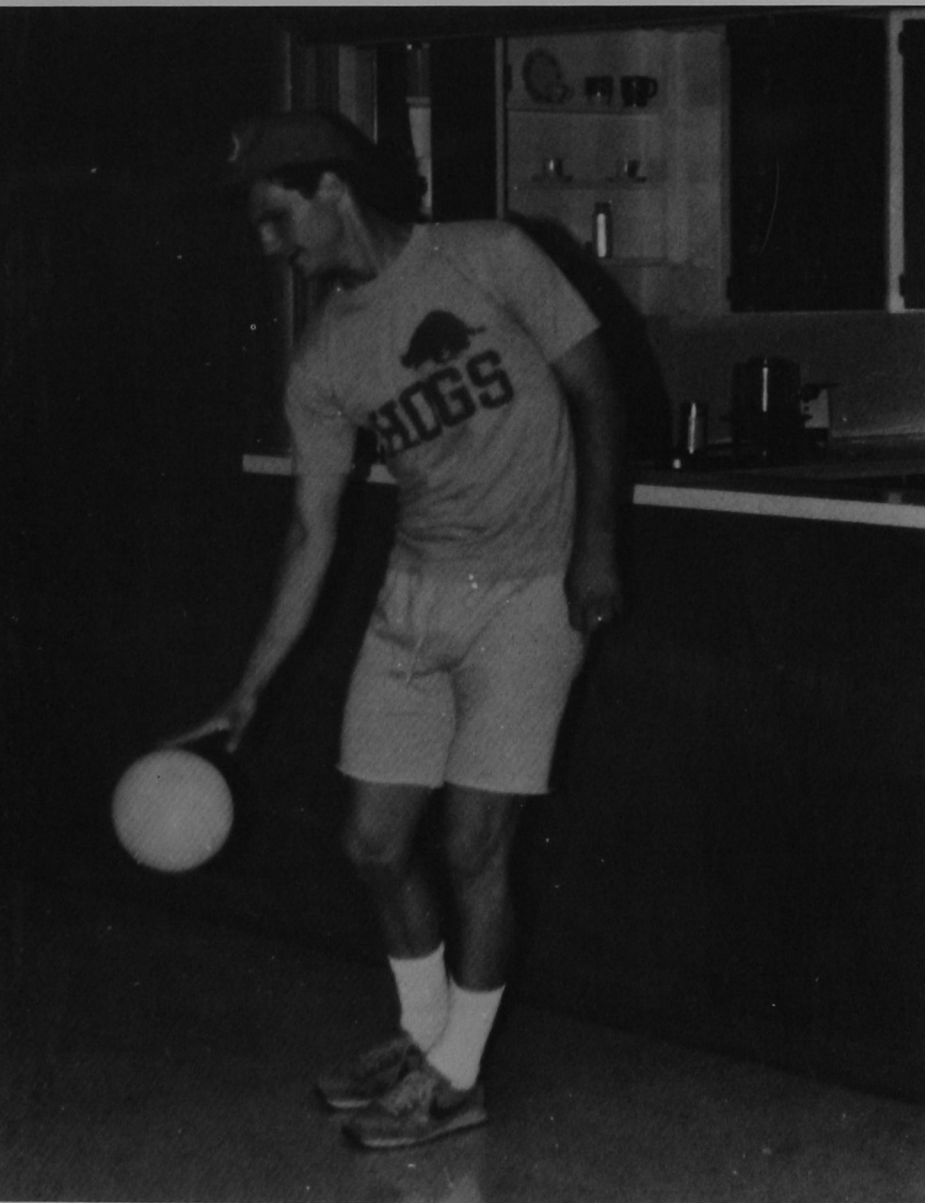


Bible Chair

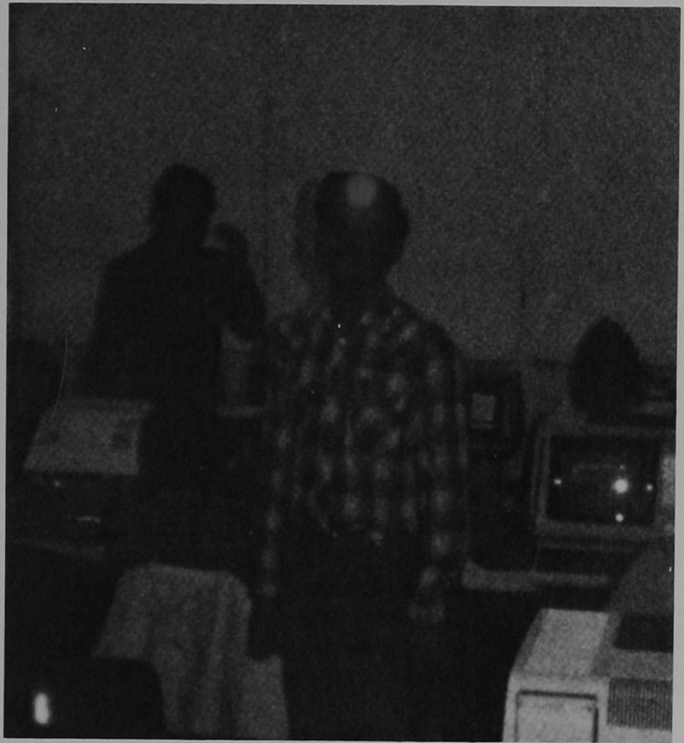
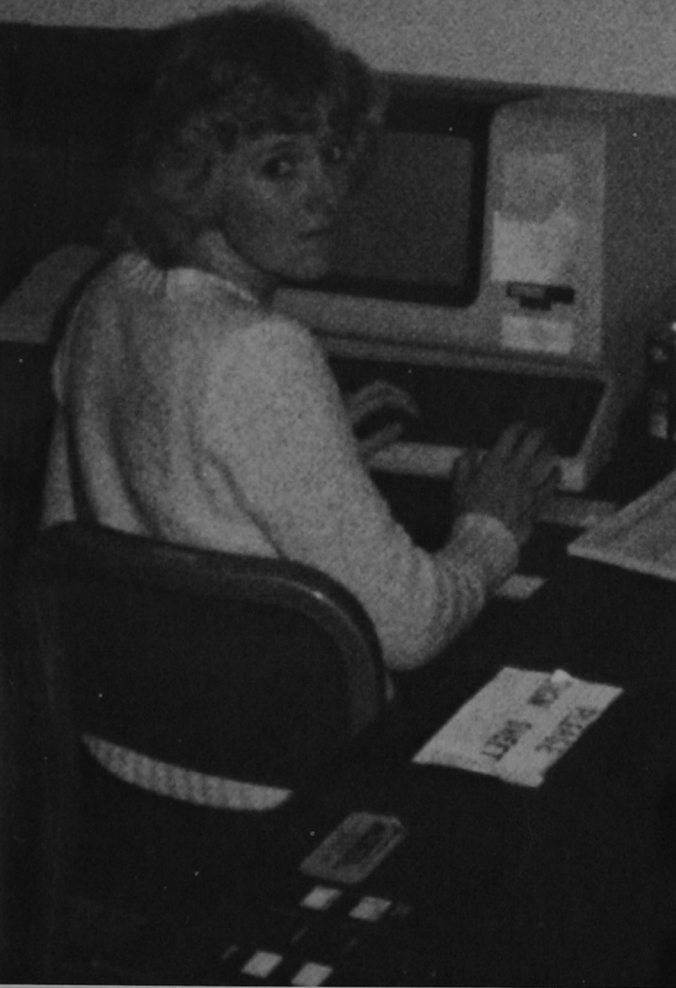
Chi Alpha

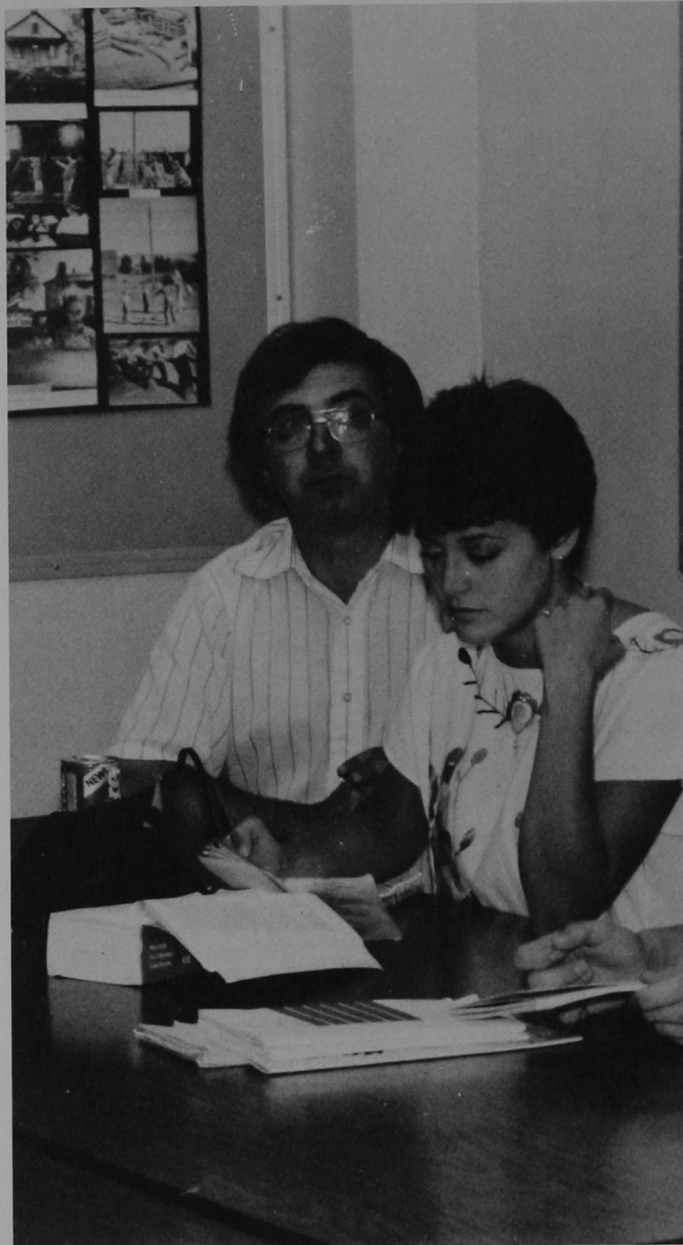

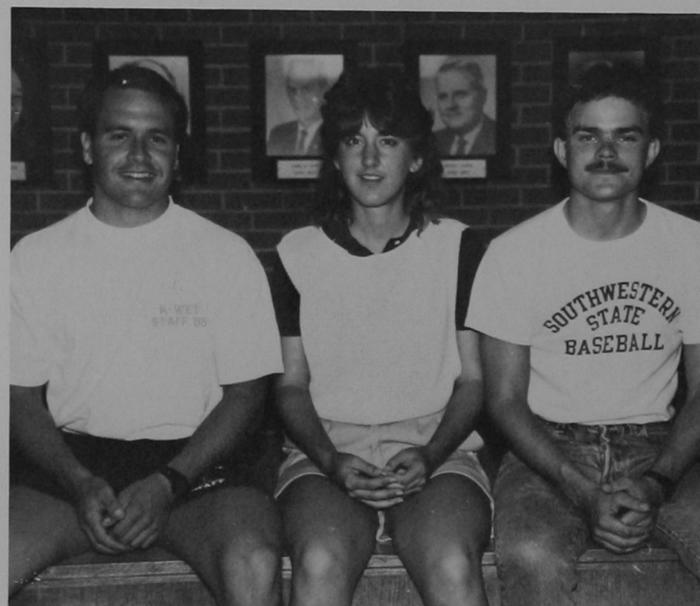

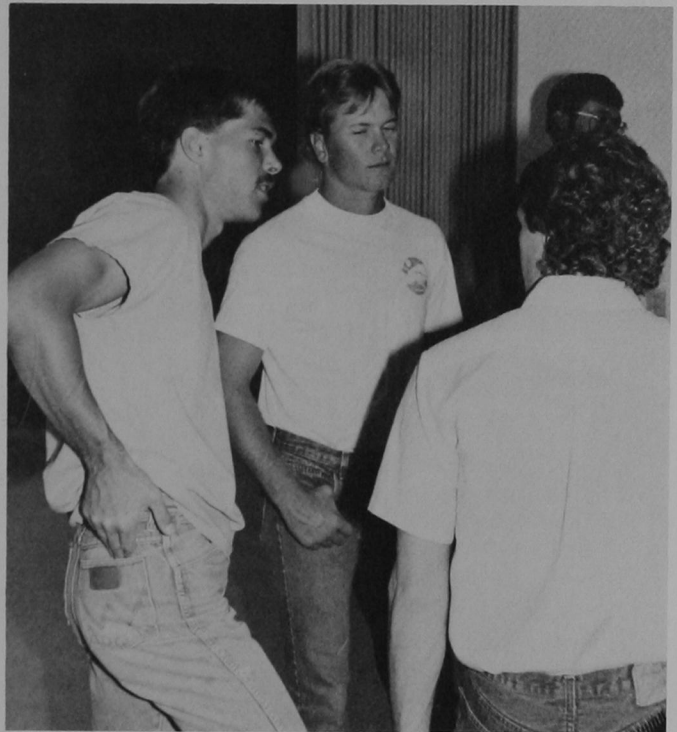

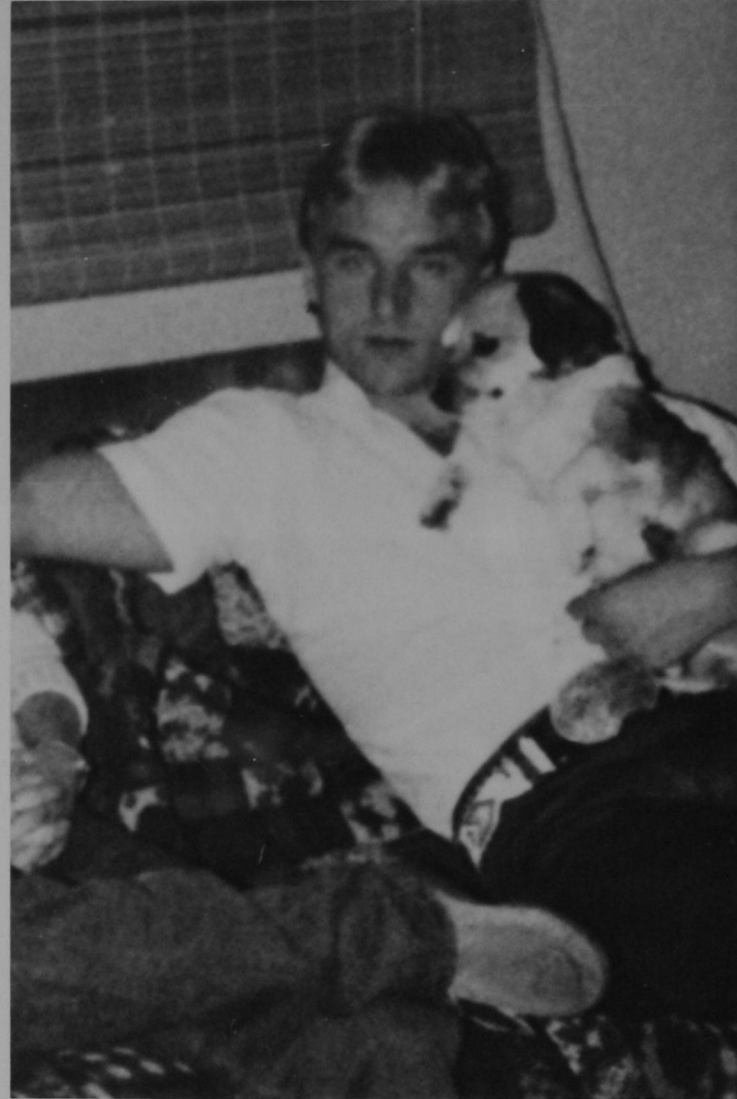




Institutional Pharmacy Assoc.

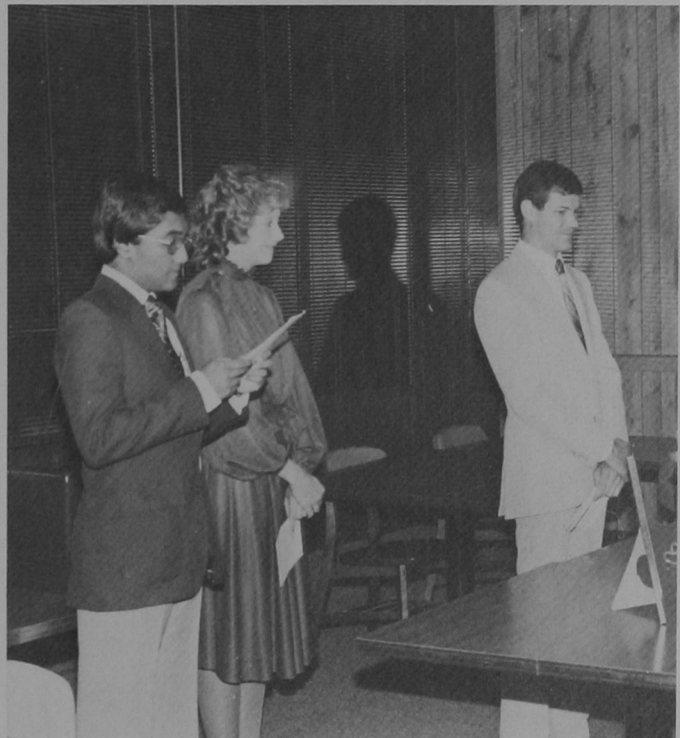

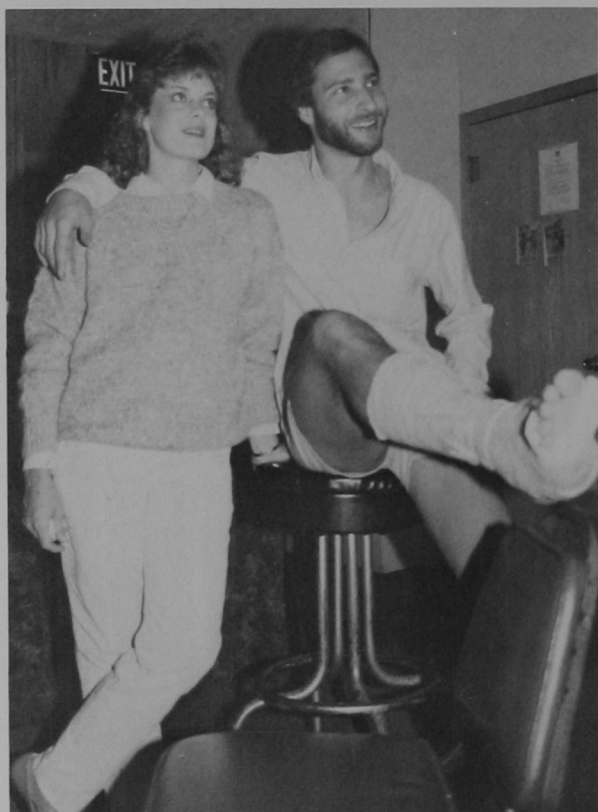


Kappa Mu Epsilon

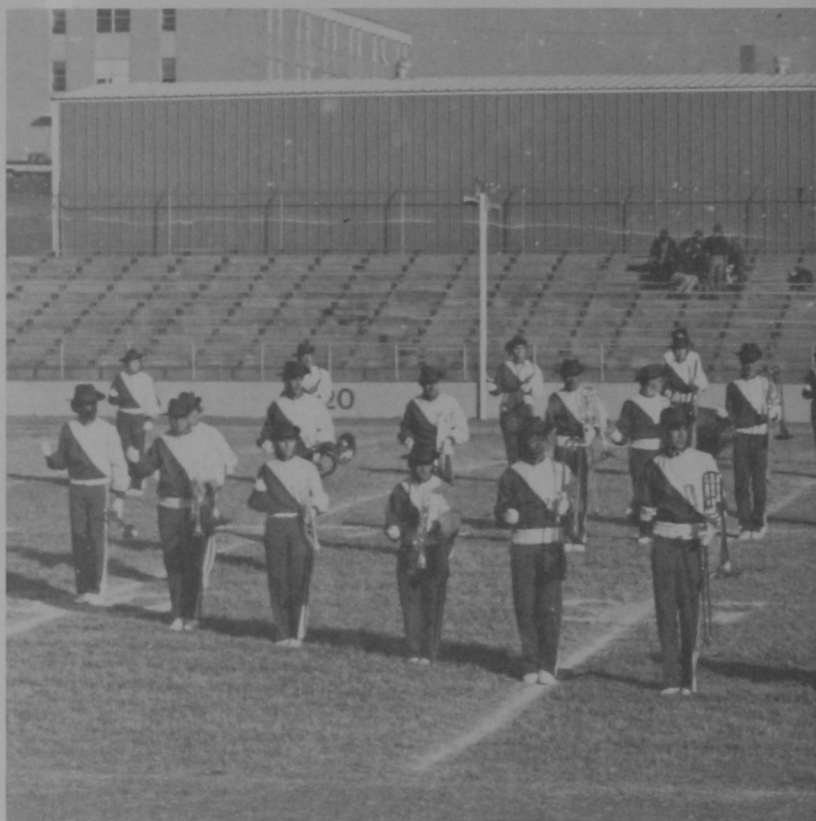

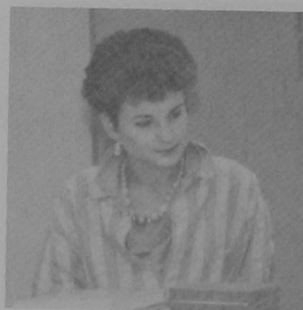

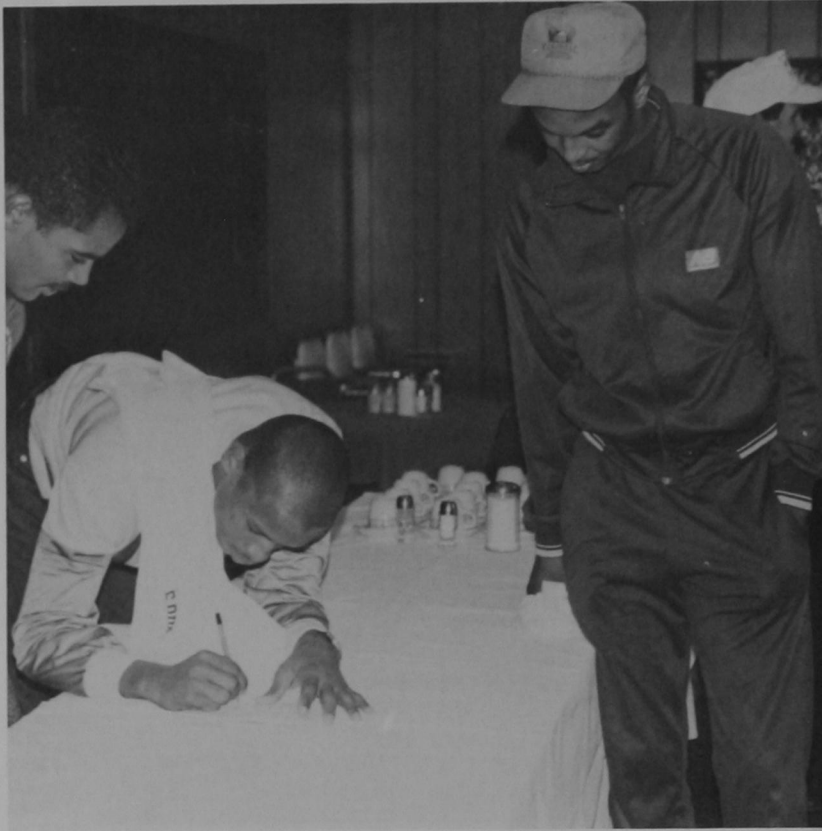
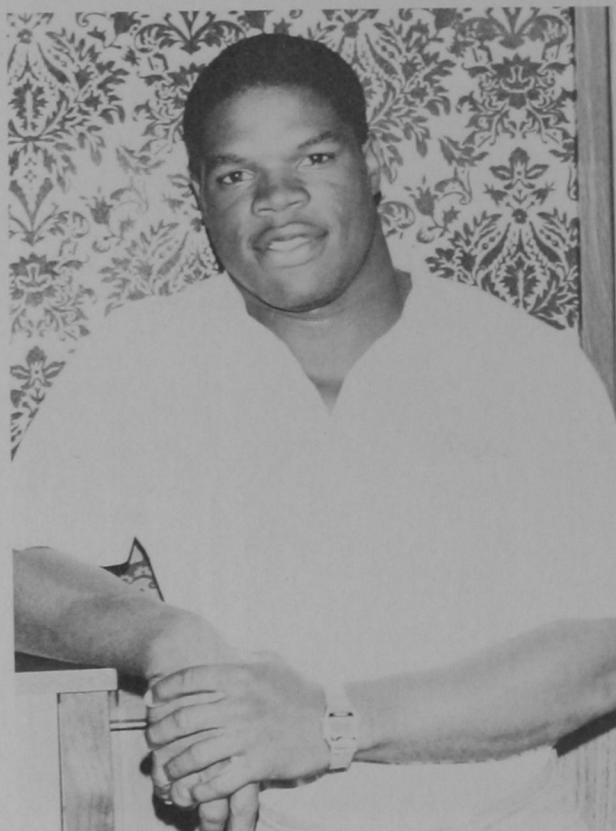
Music Therapy Club

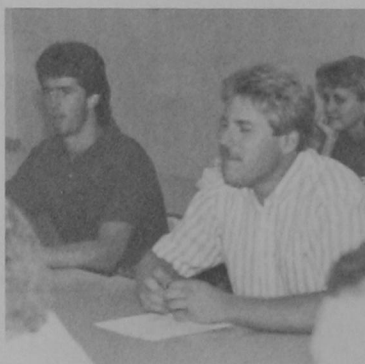
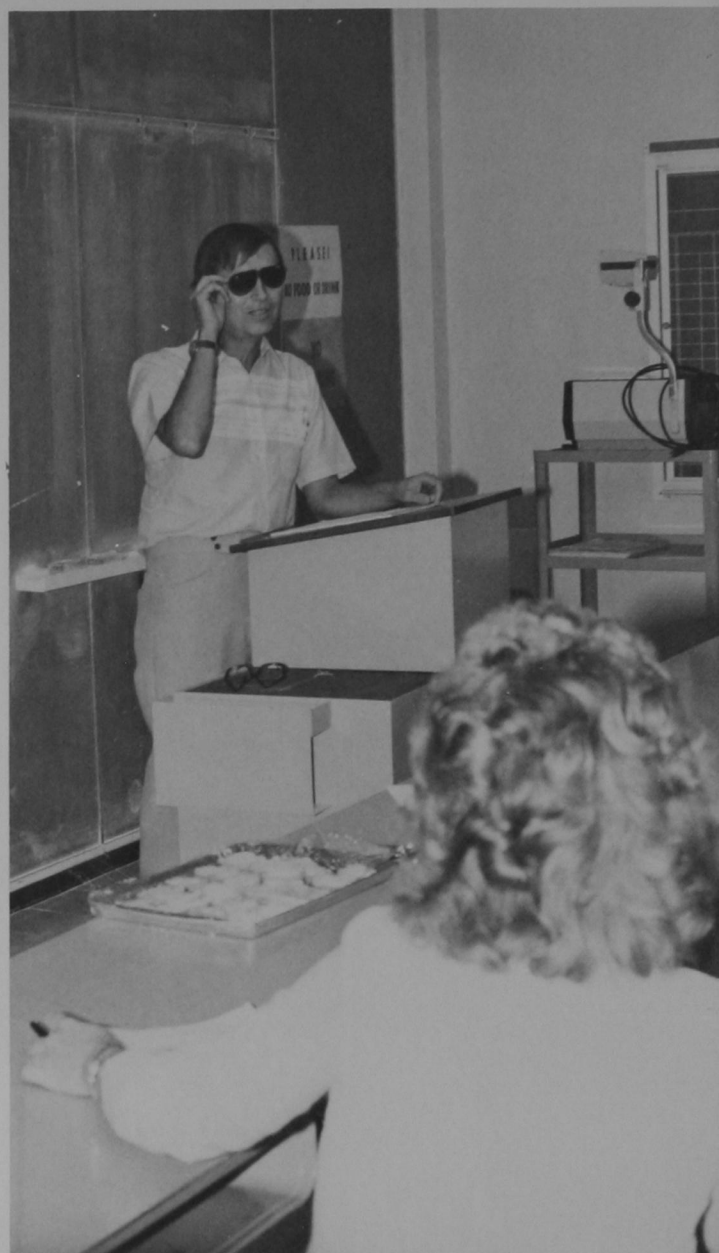

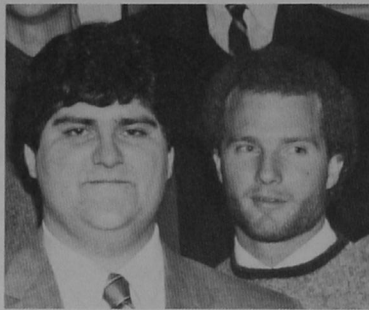


Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia

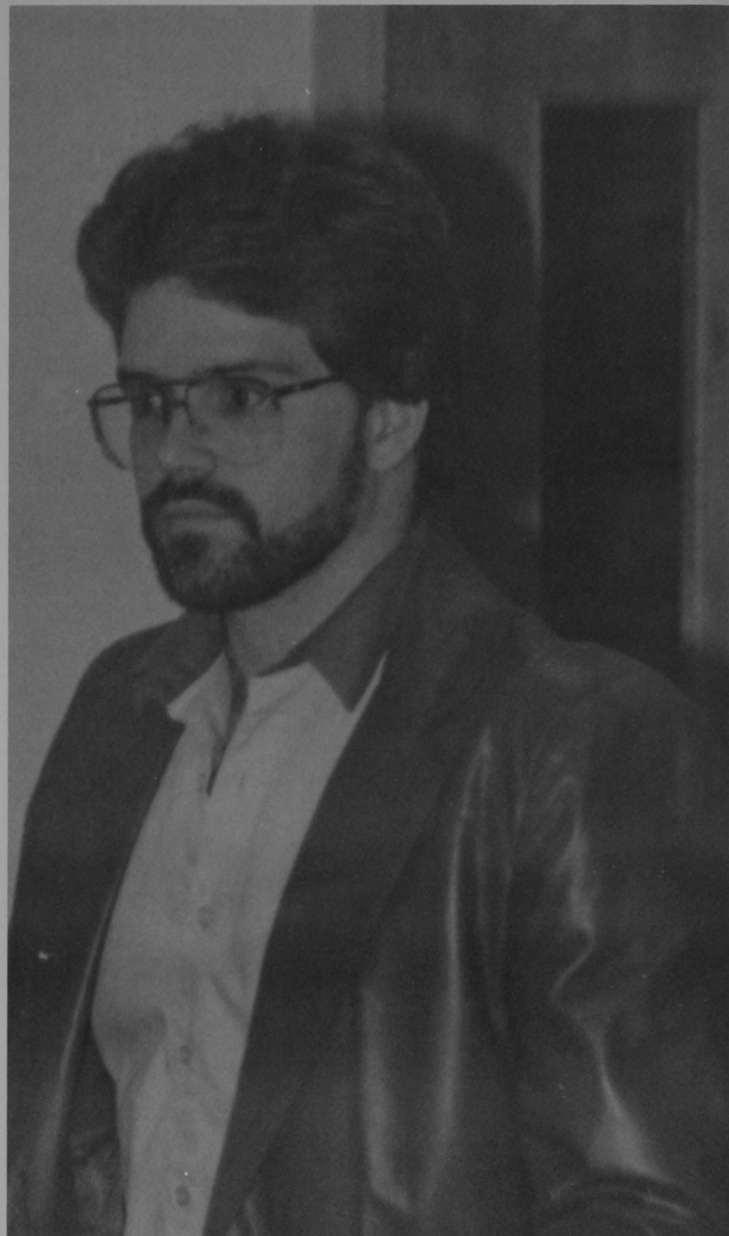


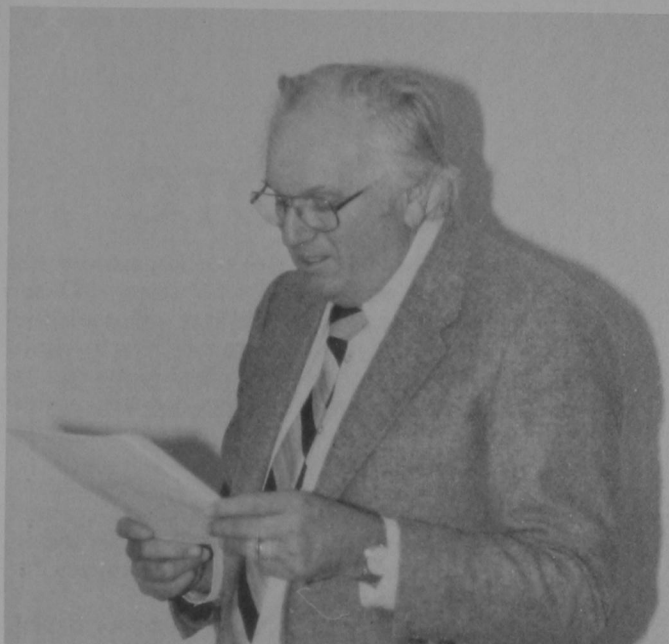

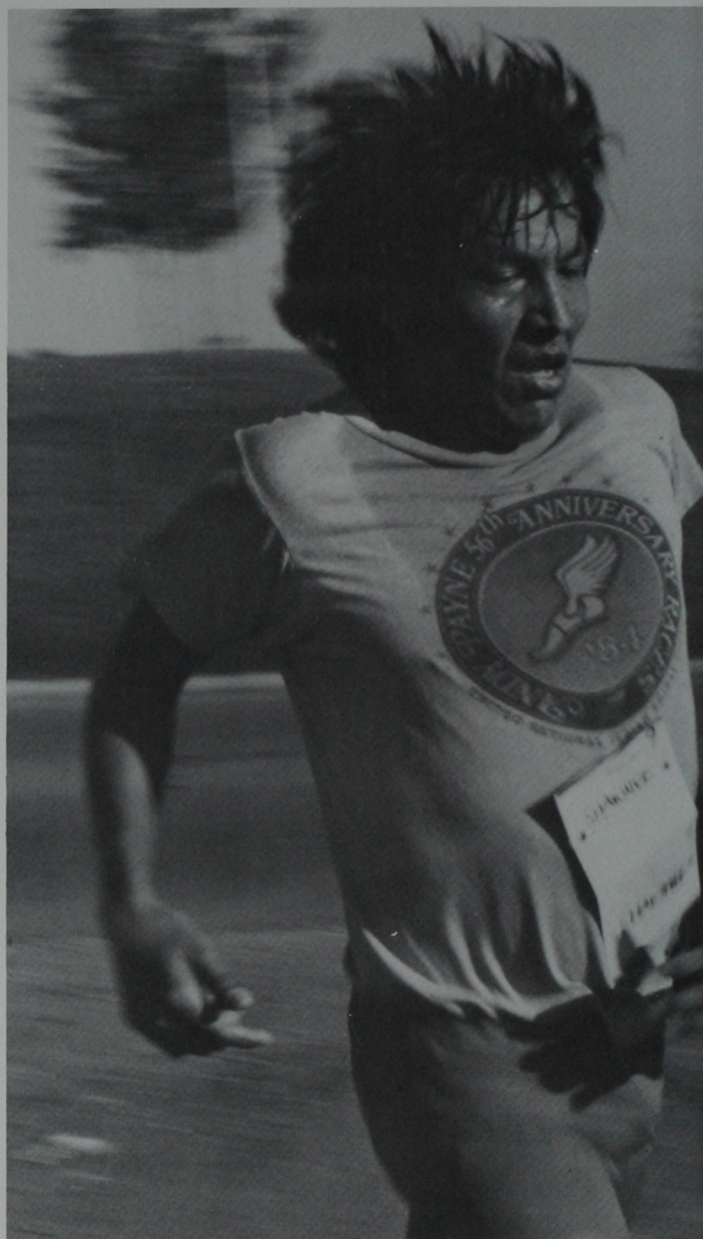
ROTC

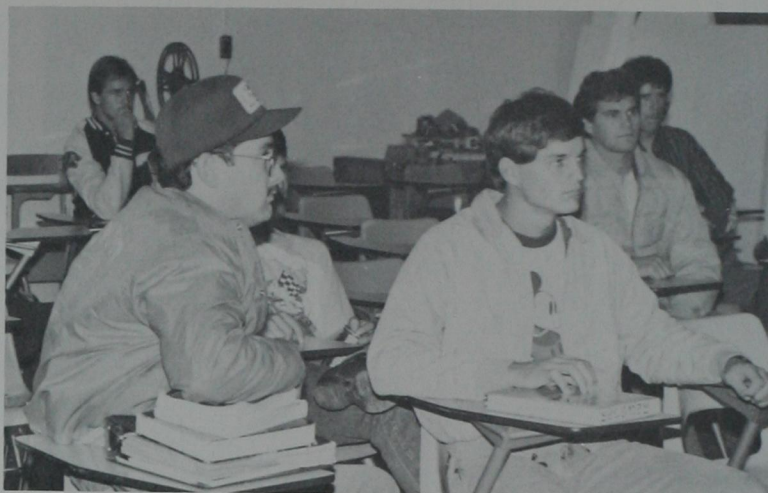

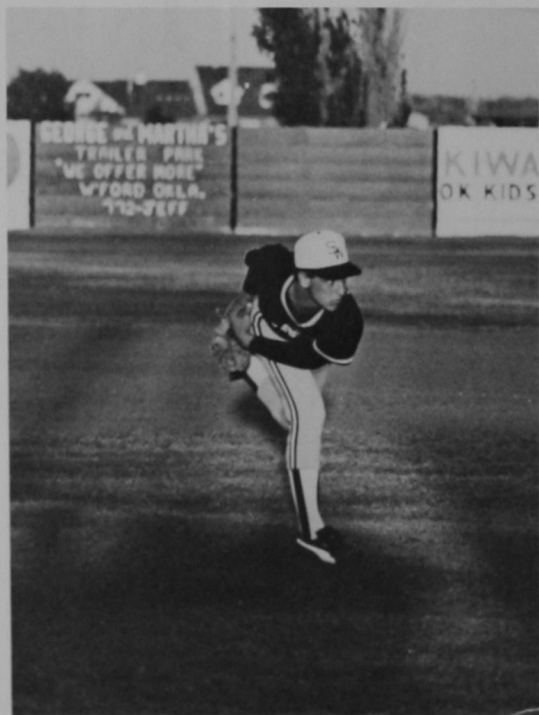
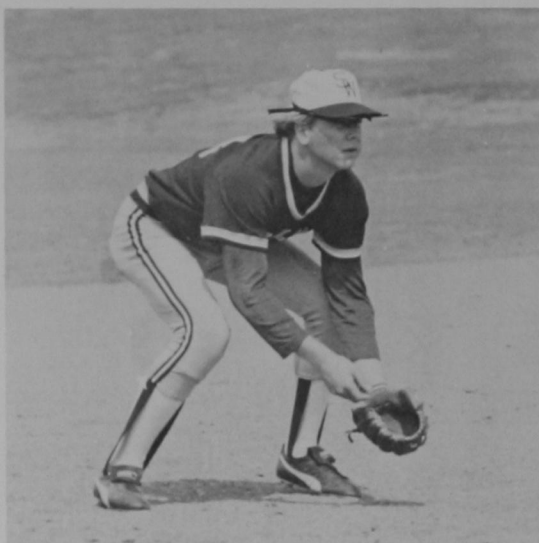


One, Two, Three Strikes —

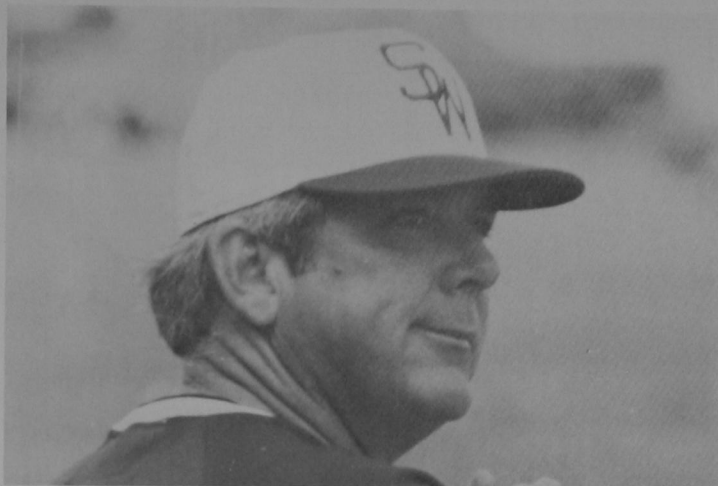

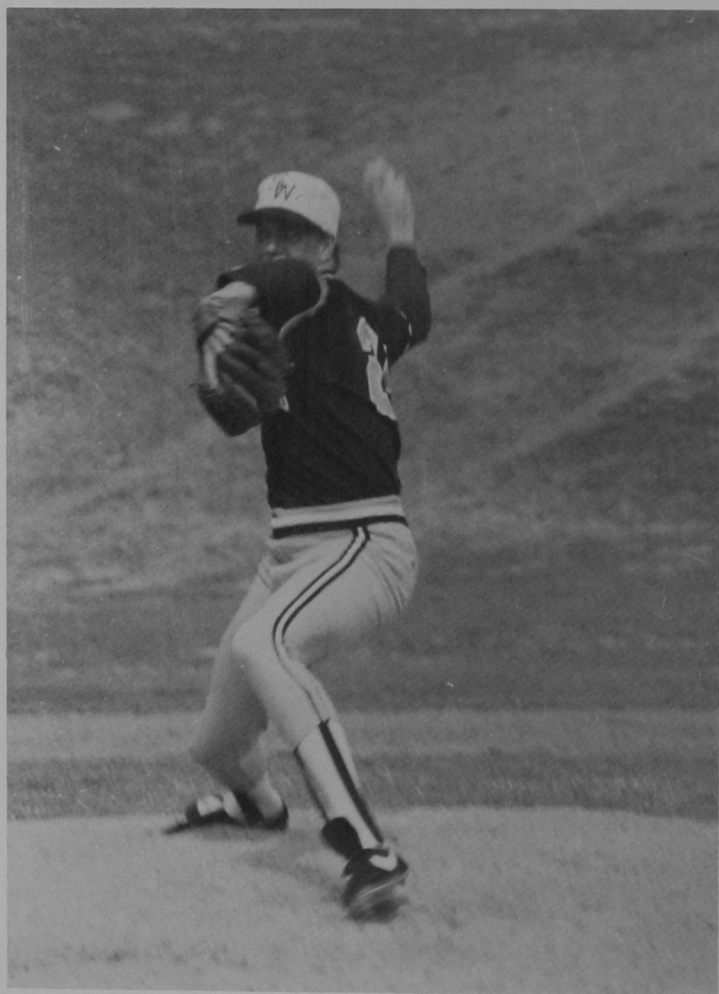

Even if the ladies do not win the National Championship or even go to the tourney, they will know they're still #1 in Weatherford.

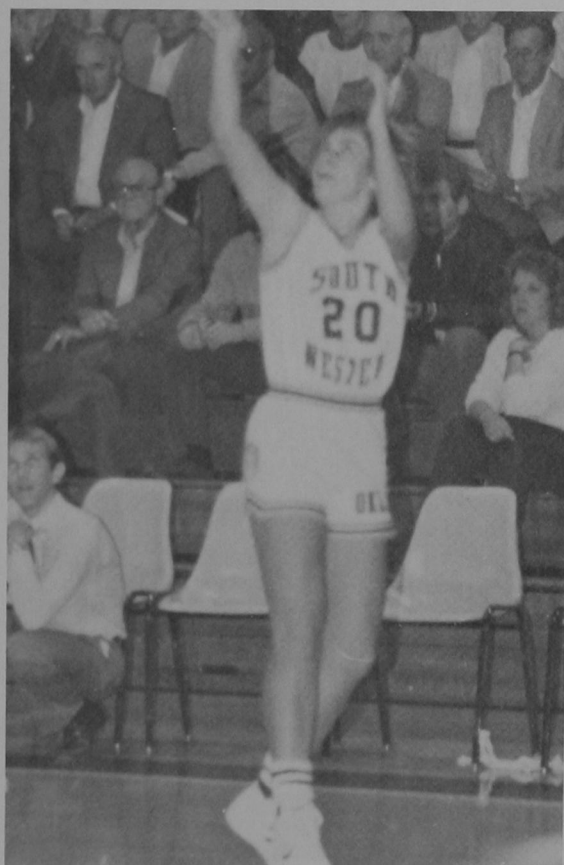


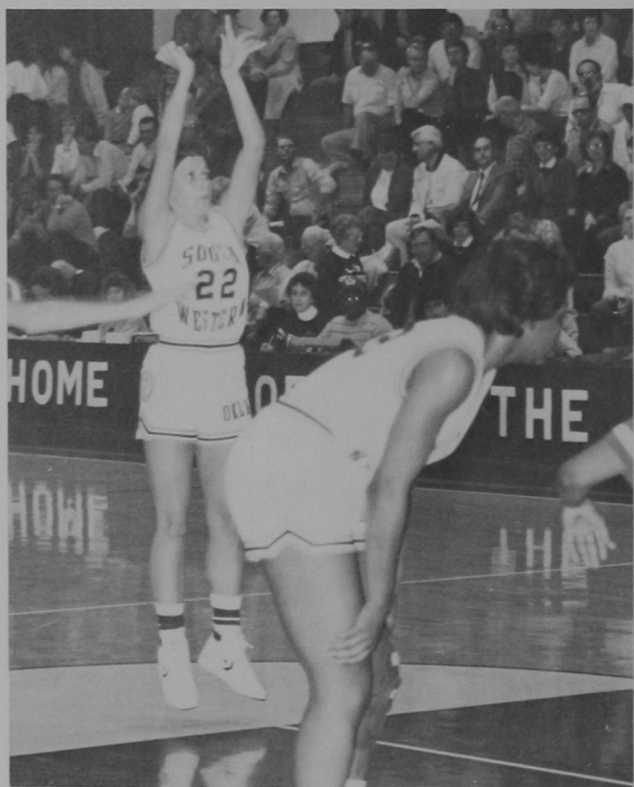

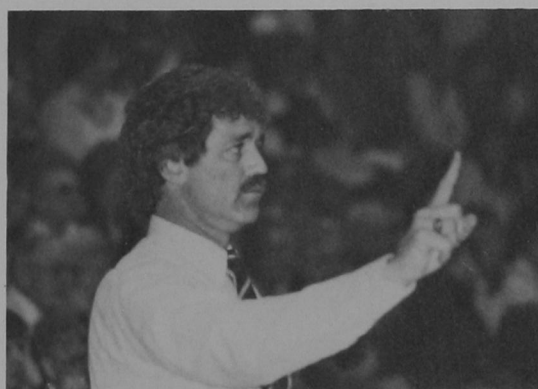

EXTRA EXTRA SWOSU MEN'S RODEO TEAM WINS NATIONALS

When Southwestern first began competing for rodeo honors, some people considered it intramural activity. It surely isn't. Southwestern belongs to the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association or the NIRA, which is the equivalent of the NAIA in basketball and football. The far-sightedness of Dr. Mitchell's intuition told him that if they could finance the necessary practice stock, facilities, and develop Oklahoma high school talent into professional athletes, then they would receive the national recognition that goes with a championship.

Dr. Mitchell's goal is education first. Southwestern's rodeo team has averaged 30 graduating athletes. The real credit for their program lies in the fact that approximately 80 of those graduates are members of the professional Rodeo Cowboys Association. Eight of those people qualified for the National Finals Rodeo held in Oklahoma City.

Riding with pain is nothing new to rodeo cowboys and cowgirls but it takes more than wranglers and a big hat to win. Practicing riding bulls is like practicing knife fighting; only the most dedicated brave the cold winter days to brush the snow away from a Brahma bull's hump just for practice. Cowboys get on approximately 300 head of bucking bulls in the hopes of developing the correct technique to make themselves a winner.

Roping calves is so competitive that the winning edge must be honed sharp through the sacrifice of long lonely hours in the practice pen. Not only standing around winding rope but constantly perfecting the timing. Even resting is throwing practice loops at a bale of hay. Abilities are put to the test on the back of a horse that must be trained but not tired, ready, and not road foundered. Taking a horse across the country and competing in head to head competition with professional caliber cowboys, is a challenge that separates the men from the boys in the winners circle.

Muscle reflexes must be in perfect condition to coordinate the moves necessary for a cowboy to throw a 600 lb. steer flat on it's side. Muscles are constantly overcoming the aches and pains that go with dropping off a horse running 40 m.p.h. and then landing in front of a steer that has just set up.

Confidences need that extra special courage to back in the dogging box and come out riding as fast as possible to catch a steer and know what missing him would feel like. Cowboys fear the impact of grabbing horns and finding out what a "dead stand still" really is. Steerwrestling can be 4 seconds of perfection or the combination of horrors that cowboys call "A Wreck". Winners avoid the wrecks and put together winning runs that make

it through a year and become champions.

To find out what a winner is, watch a team make it through these events with talents of the men Southwestern has on it's team. The Rodeo Bulldogs travel around the Southwestern region of Oklahoma outpointing approximately 13 other teams, also vying for a chance at the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Finals. Only the top two teams out of 12 regions make the Finals Rodeo. This year Southwestern Oklahoma's Men's Rodeo team captured the #1 ranking at the College National Finals Rodeo in Bozeman, MT the week of June 17-21.

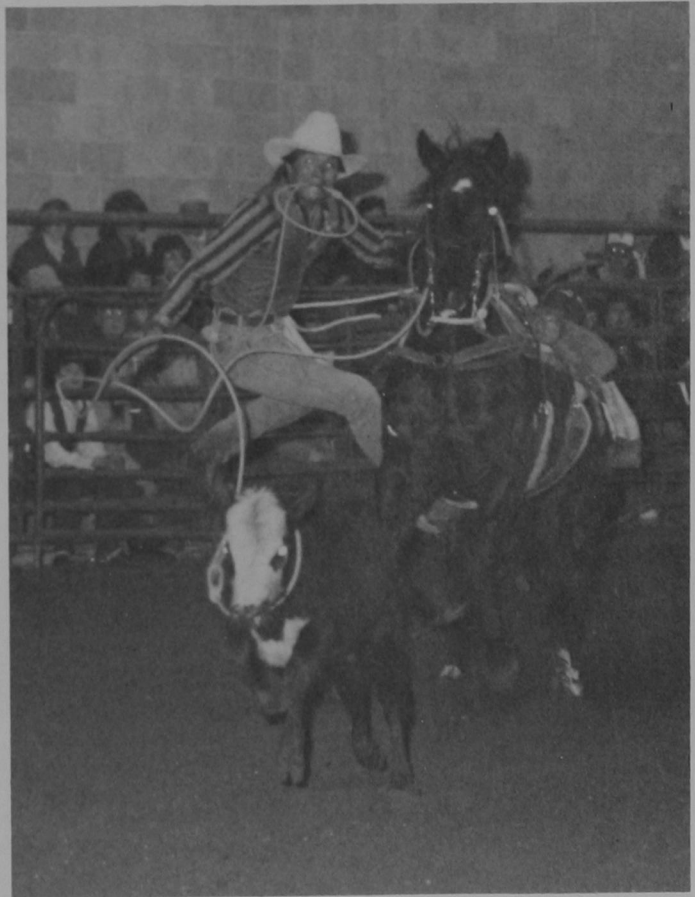
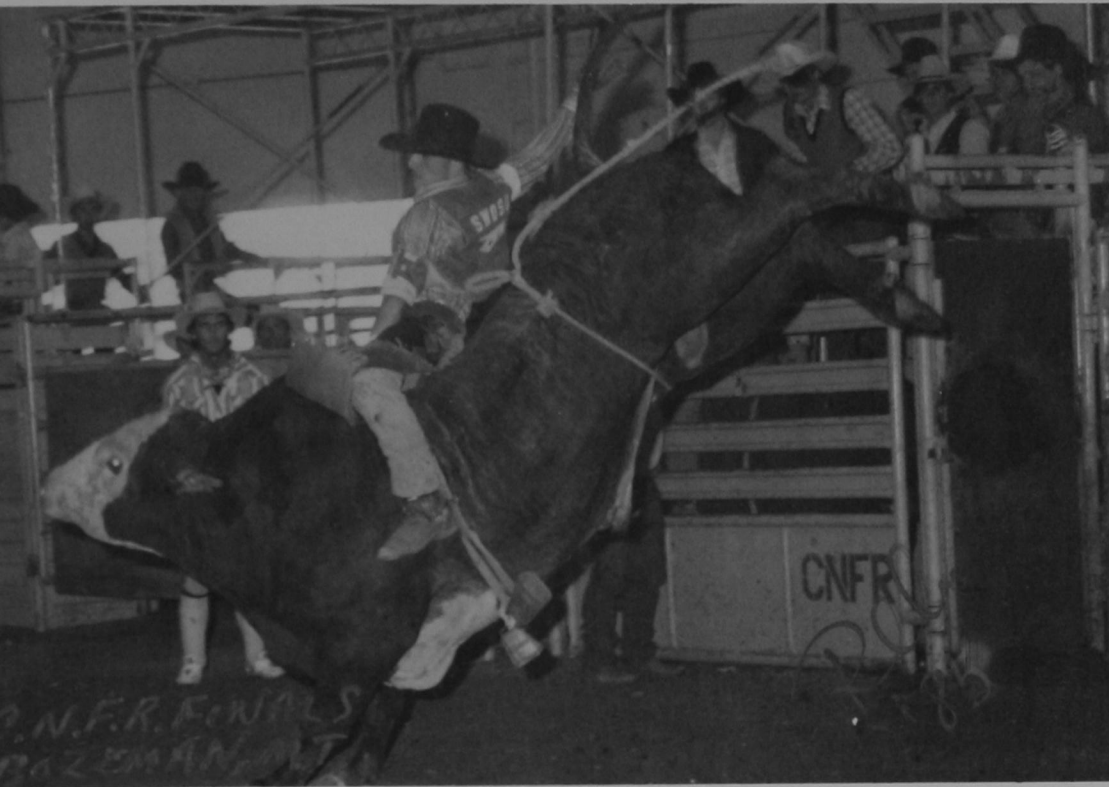

University of Arizona's 394.50 points.

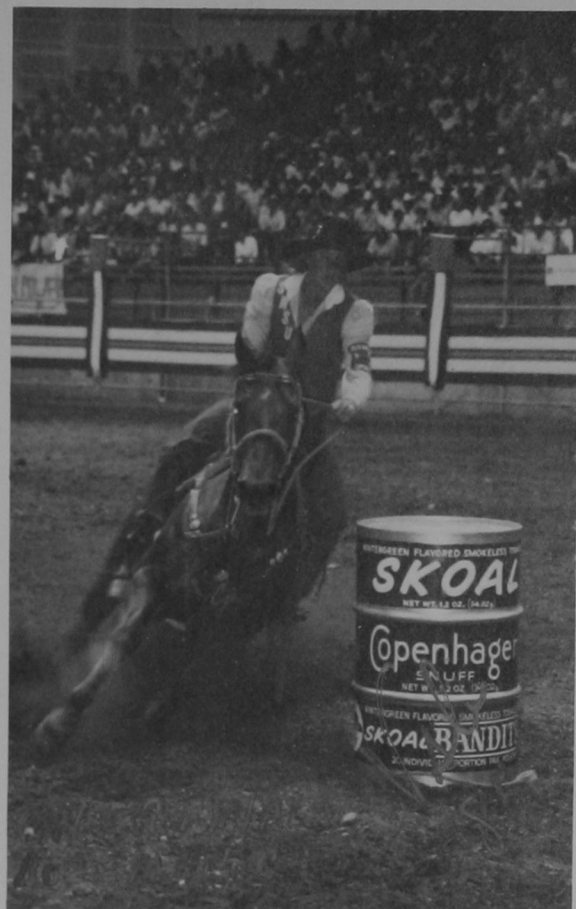
In the All-round Final National Standings, Kerri Beaman came in fifth with 825.50 points and Charlottia Noble was 14th with a 671.25 point score.

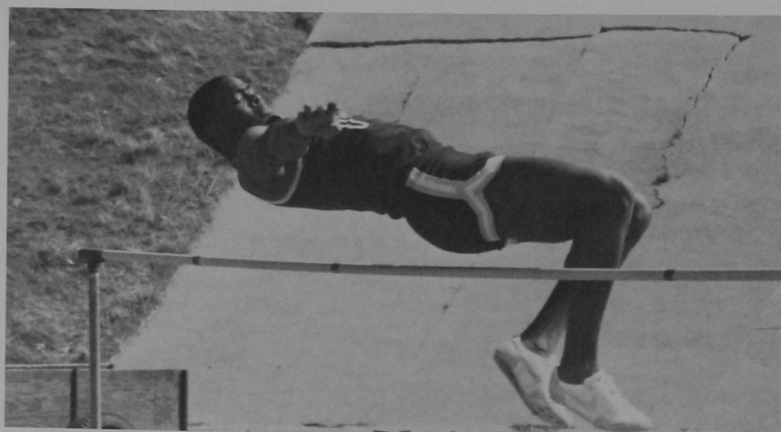
This past year another Bulldog team became champions for the second year in a row. The Bulldog Tracksters won the Oklahoma Intercollegiate Championship held at the East Central University

win the Championship. In the usual Dawg style, the Bulldogs didn't just place second, they placed first, winning the OIC Championship.

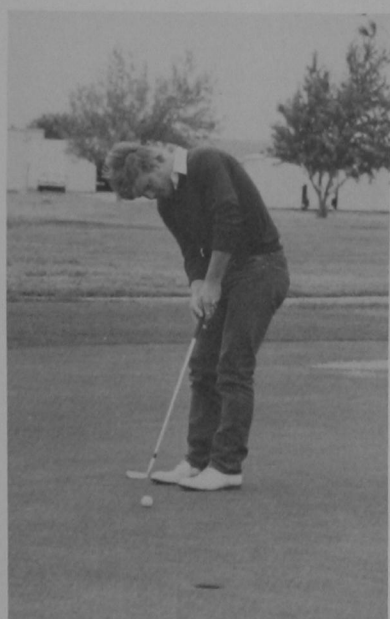
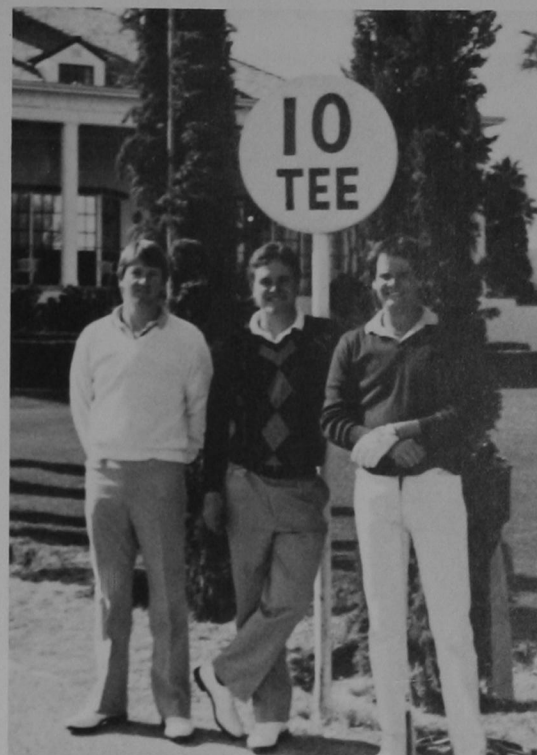
