Jefferson Hall

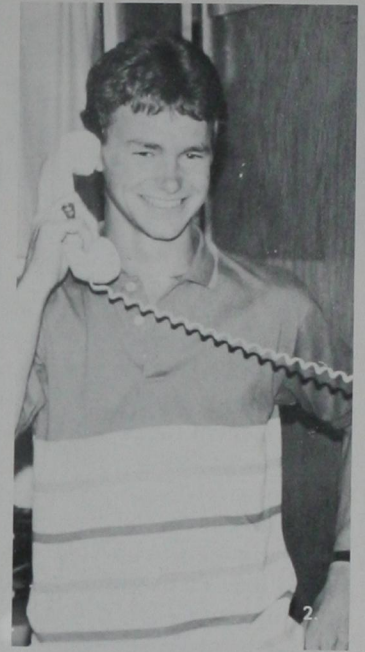

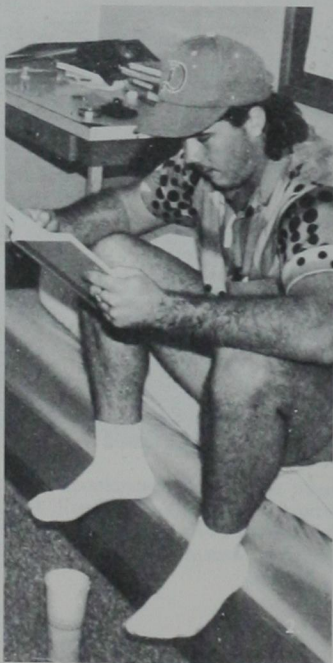

Neff Hall

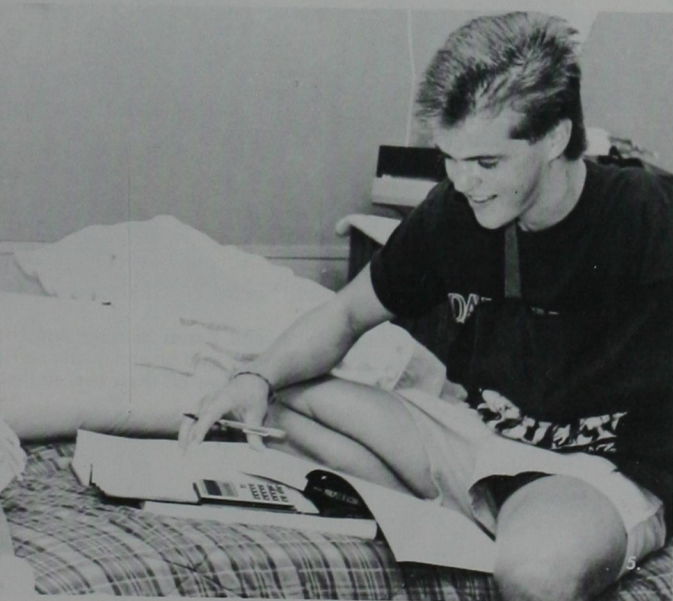
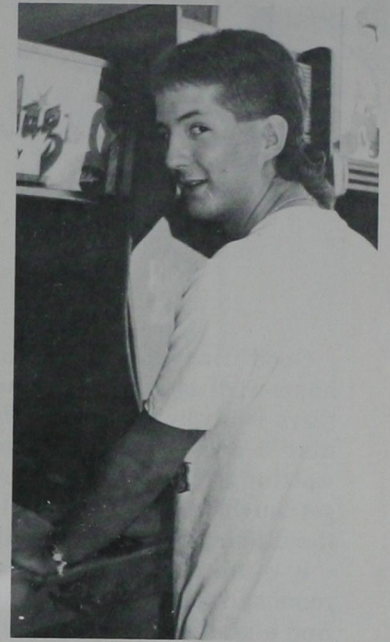

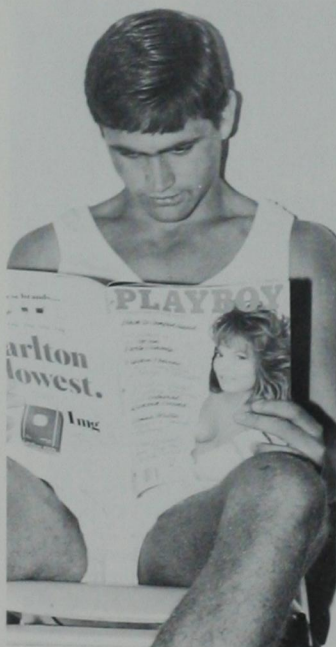

Parker Hall

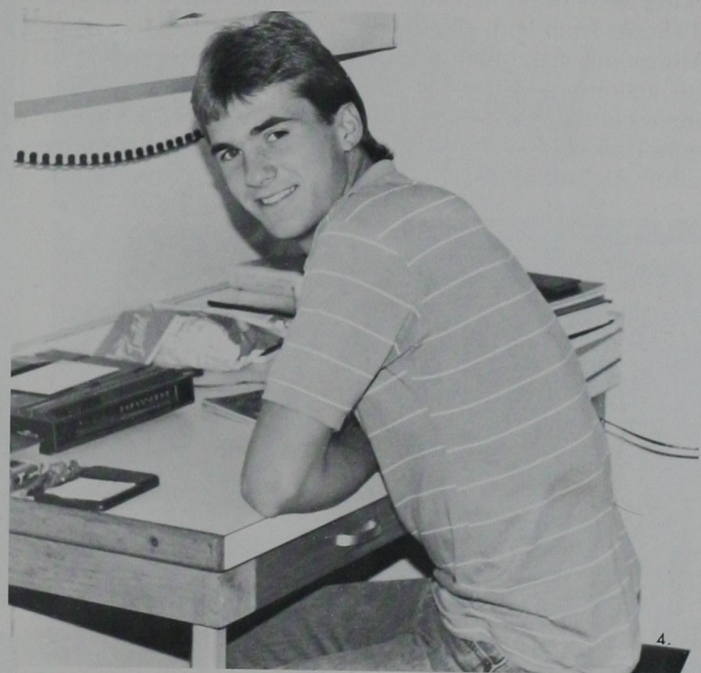
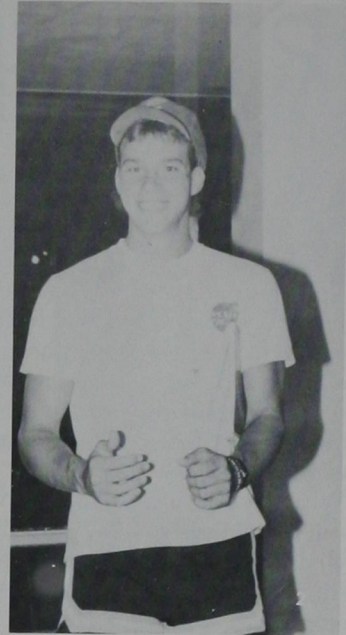

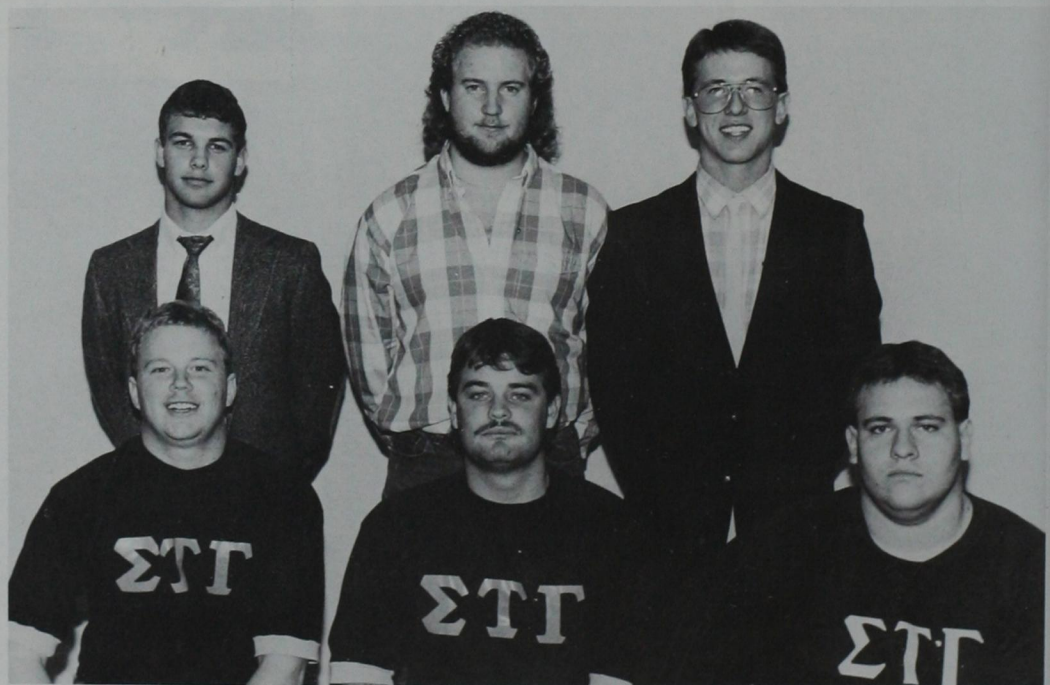

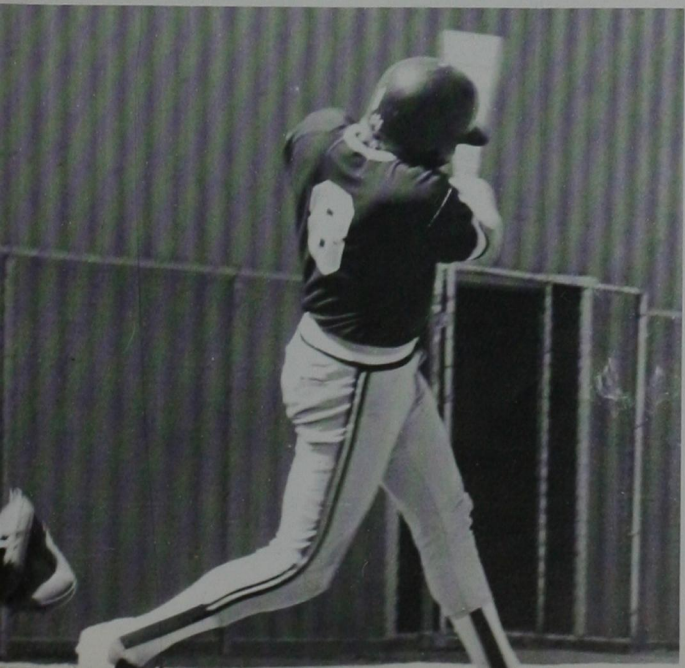
Baseball

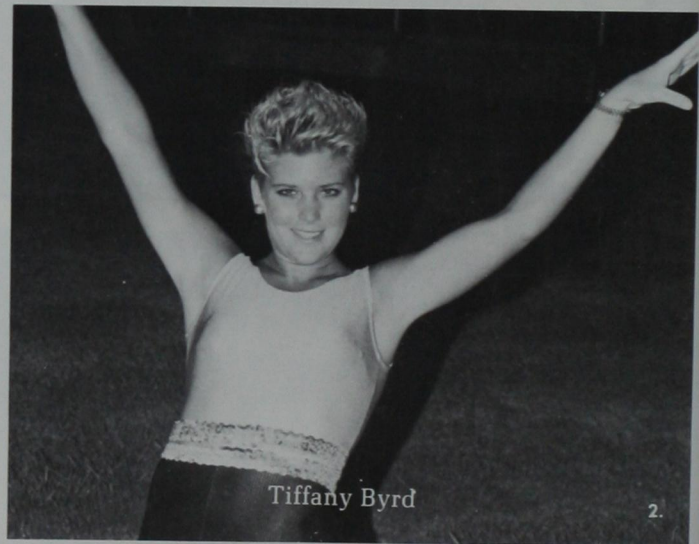

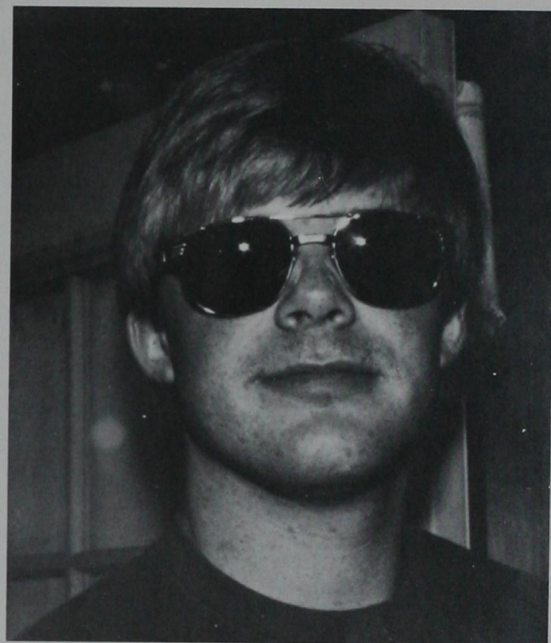

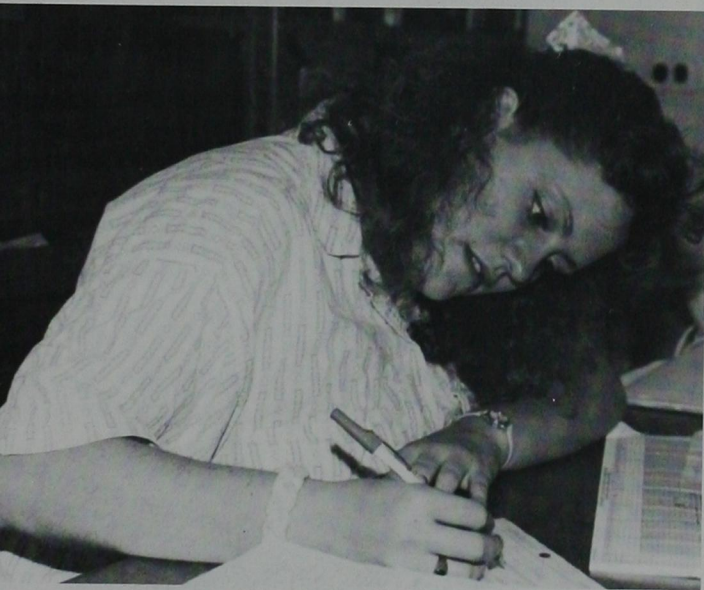

Chi Alpha is a campus ministry affiliated with the Assemblies of God. During the year students participate in parties and fellowships which are open to all students.

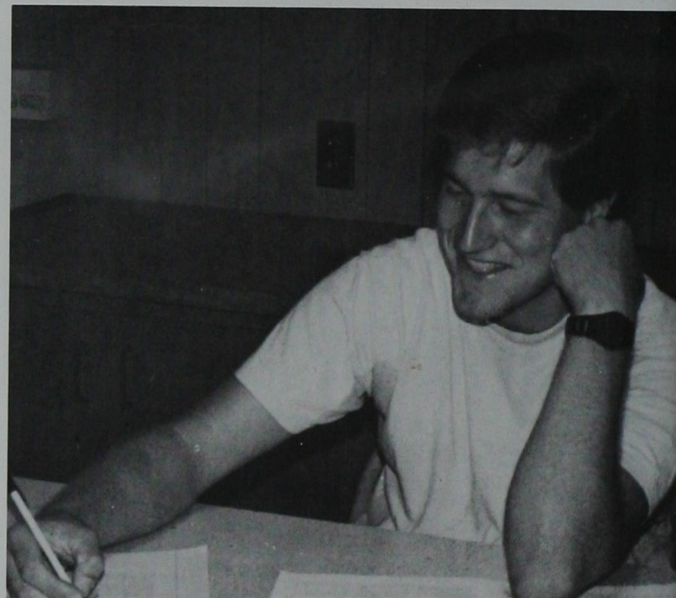

One of the major events TECA sponsors is the Metric 500 race in the spring. Many students from junior highs and high schools around the state come to compete in this event.

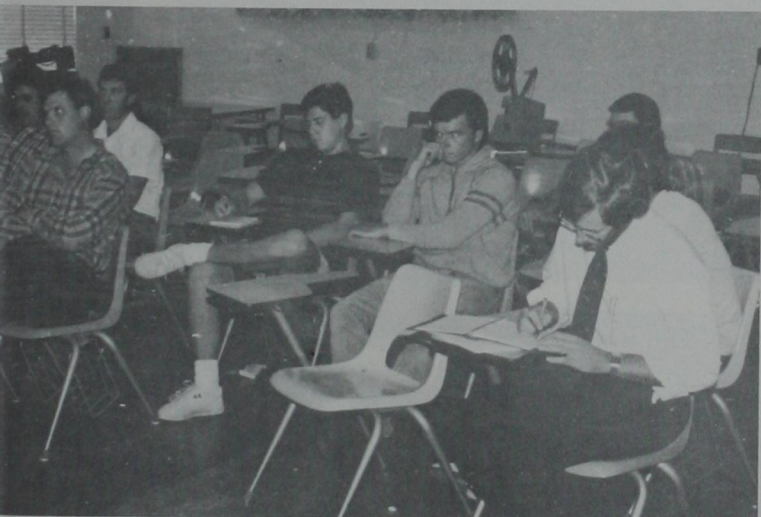

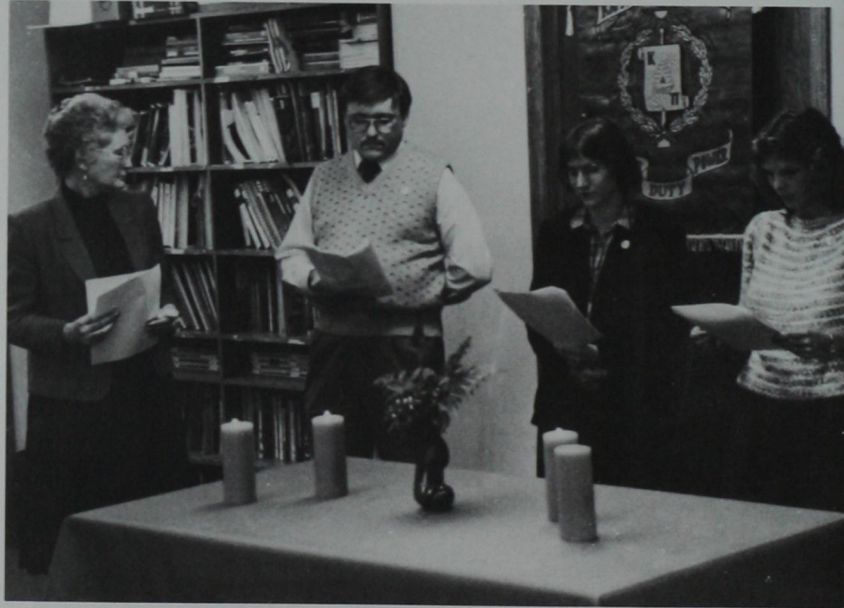


Kappa Delta Pi

Kappa Delta Pi awards scholarships to outstanding students and holds a banquet annually to initiate new members.

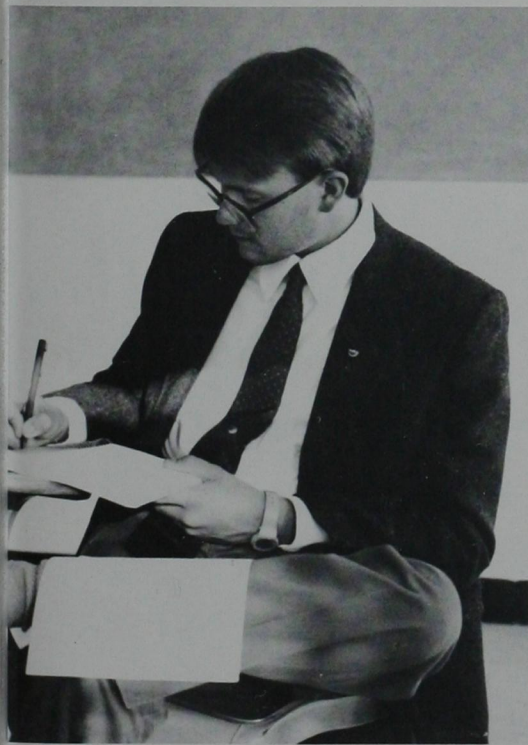

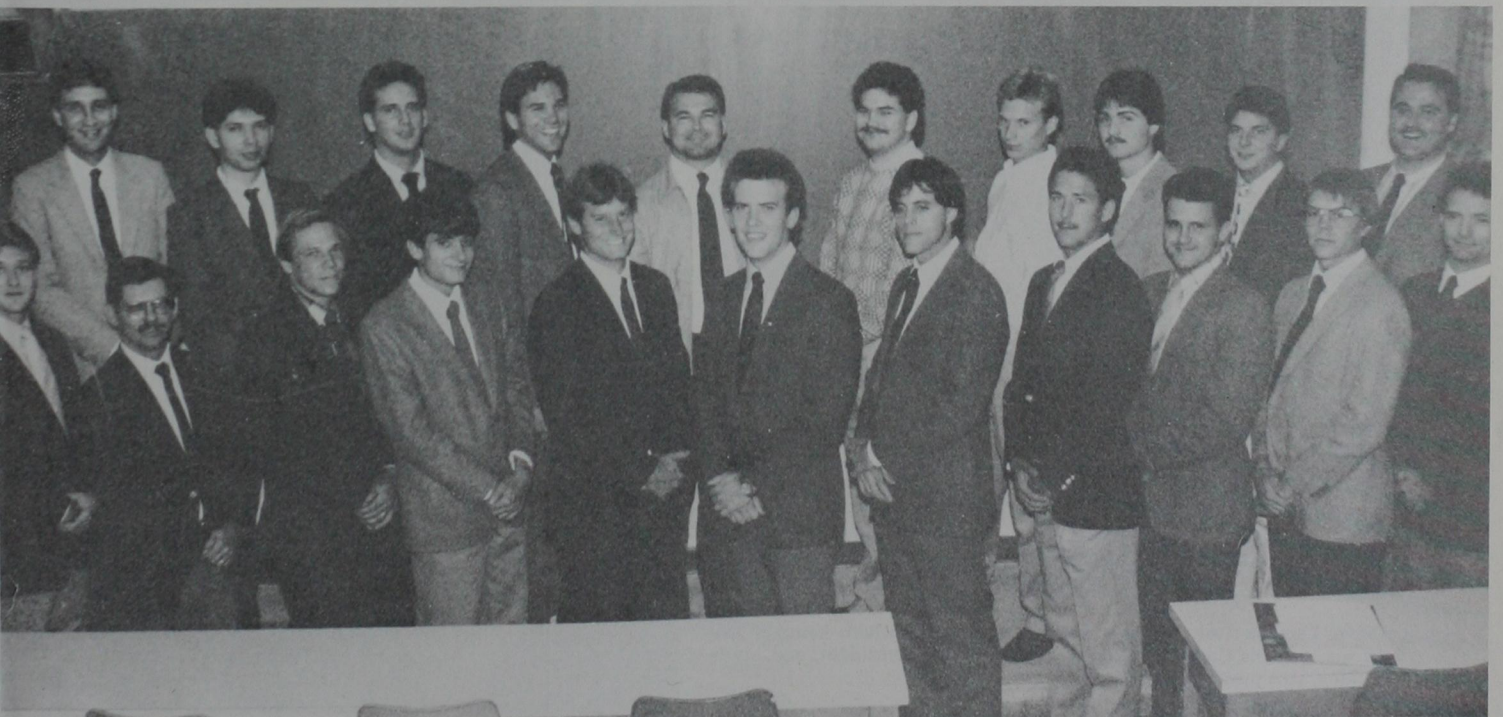


Kappa Psi

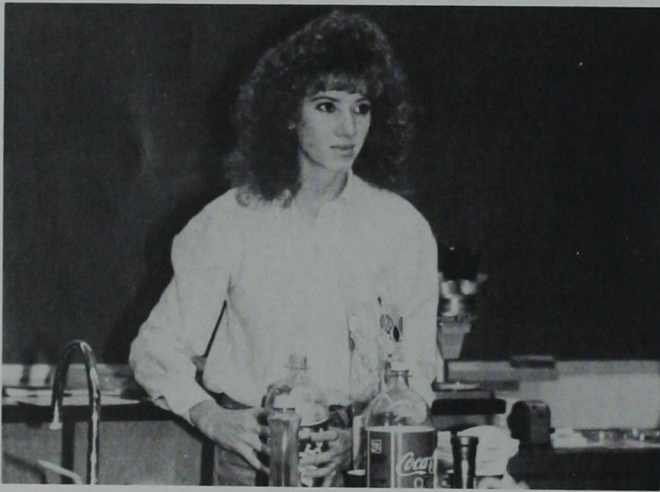

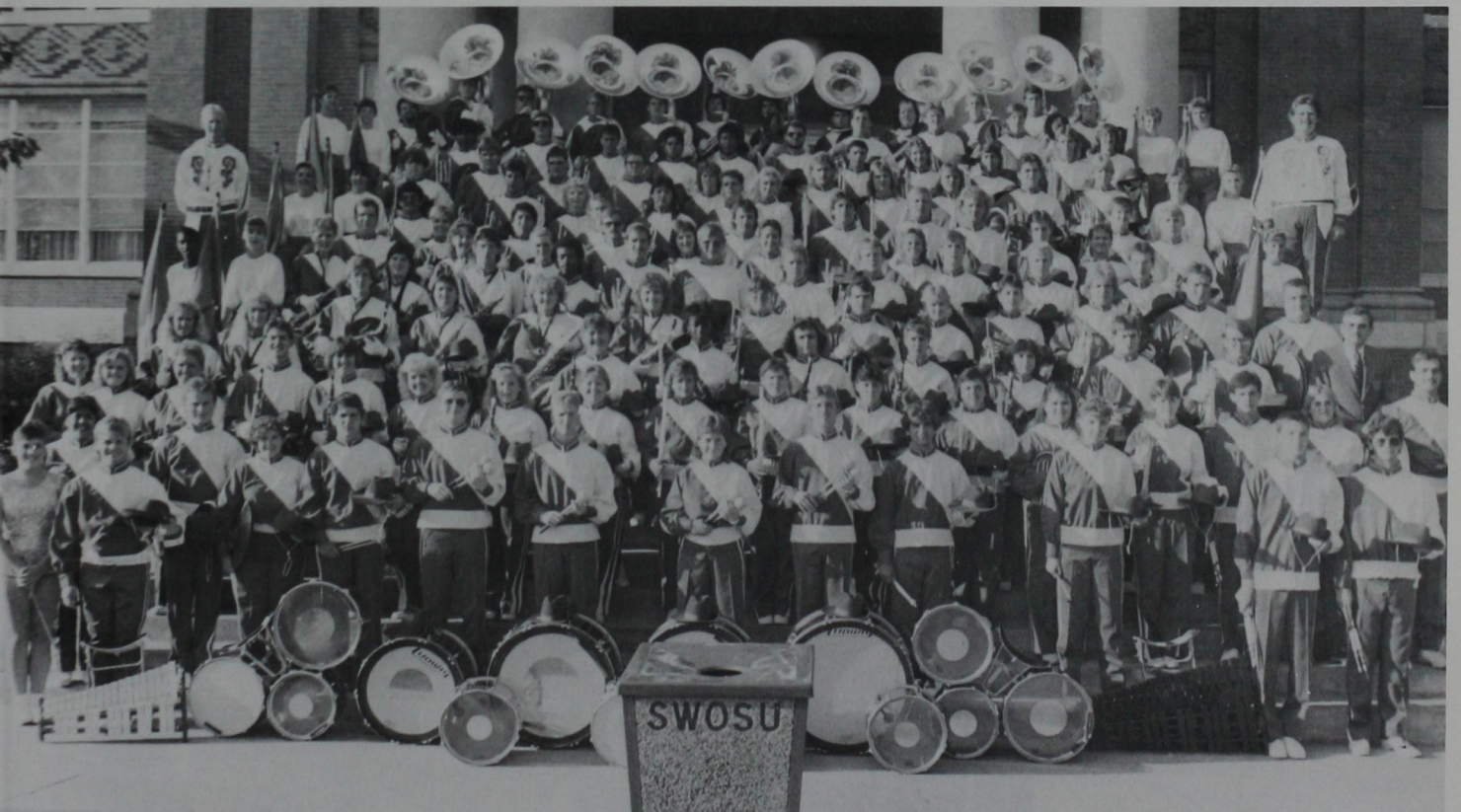

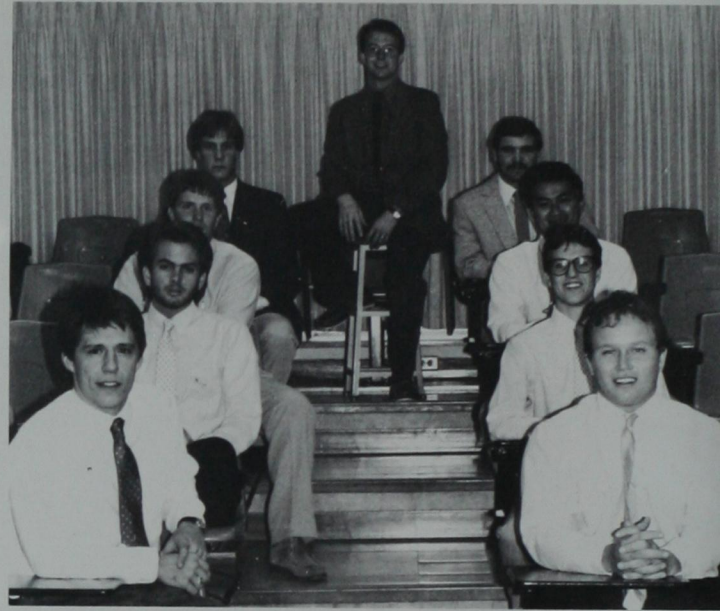
The Physics Club also supports the Marsh White program and original research through the Allied Corporation.

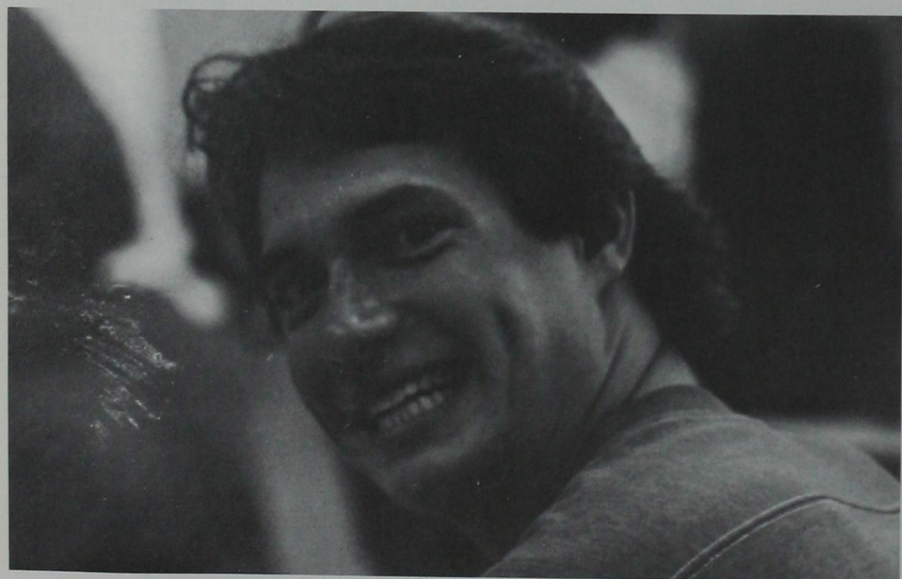

Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia

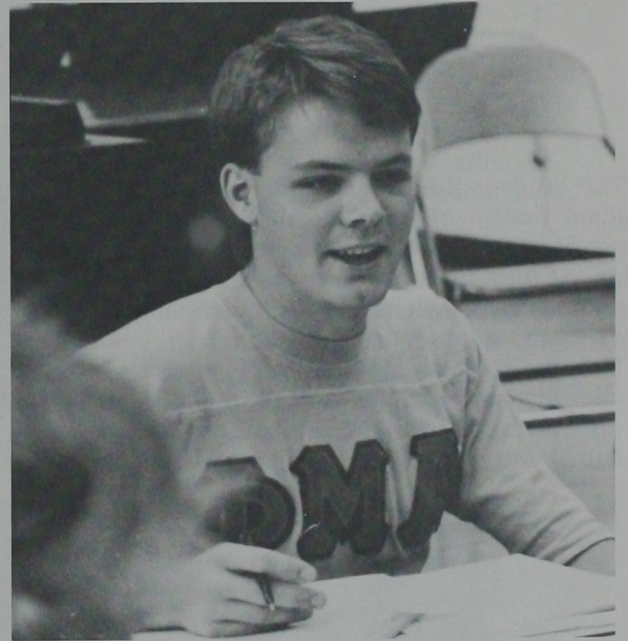

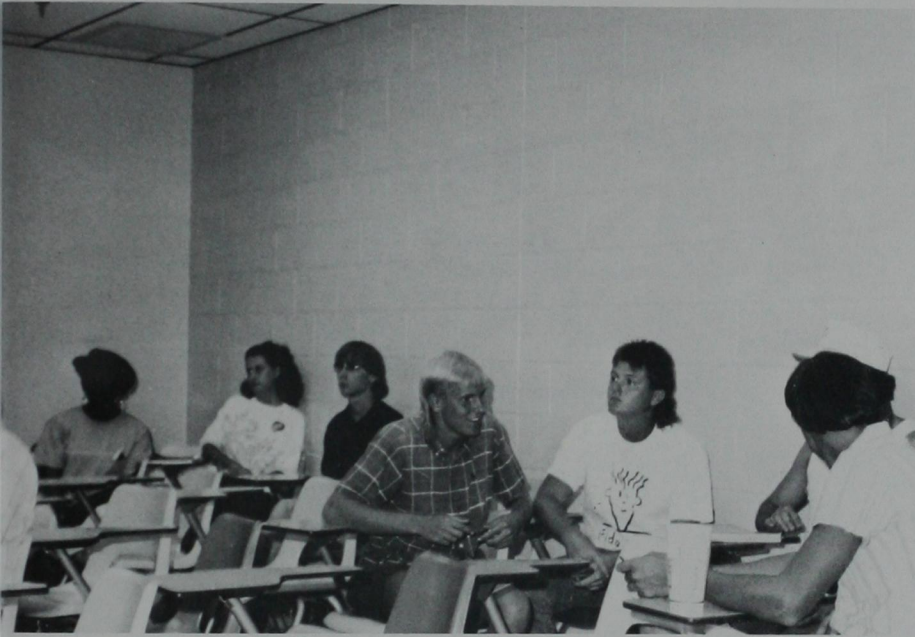
This pre-professional organization for education majors promotes education and prepares students for student teaching and their eventual entry into the teaching profession.

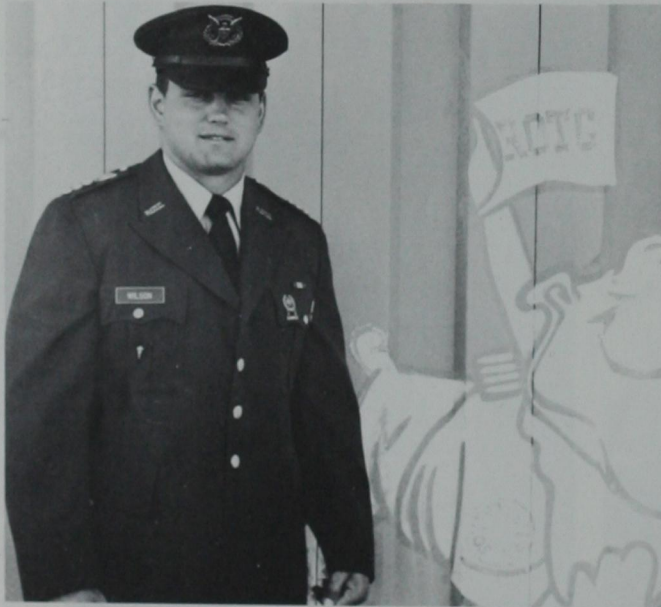
ROTC

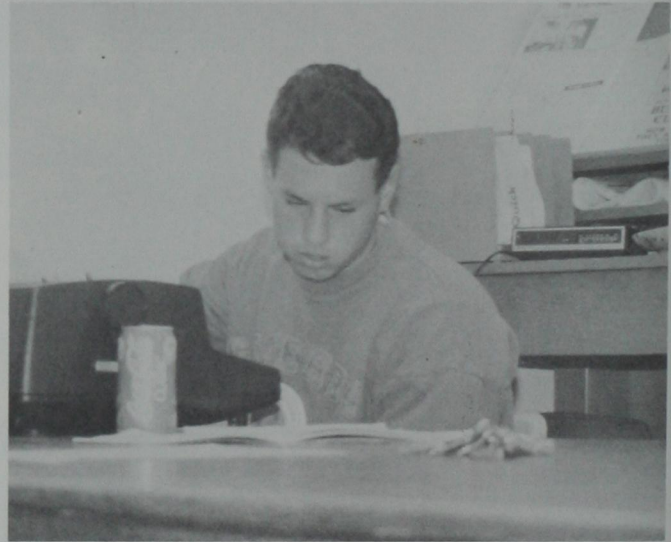

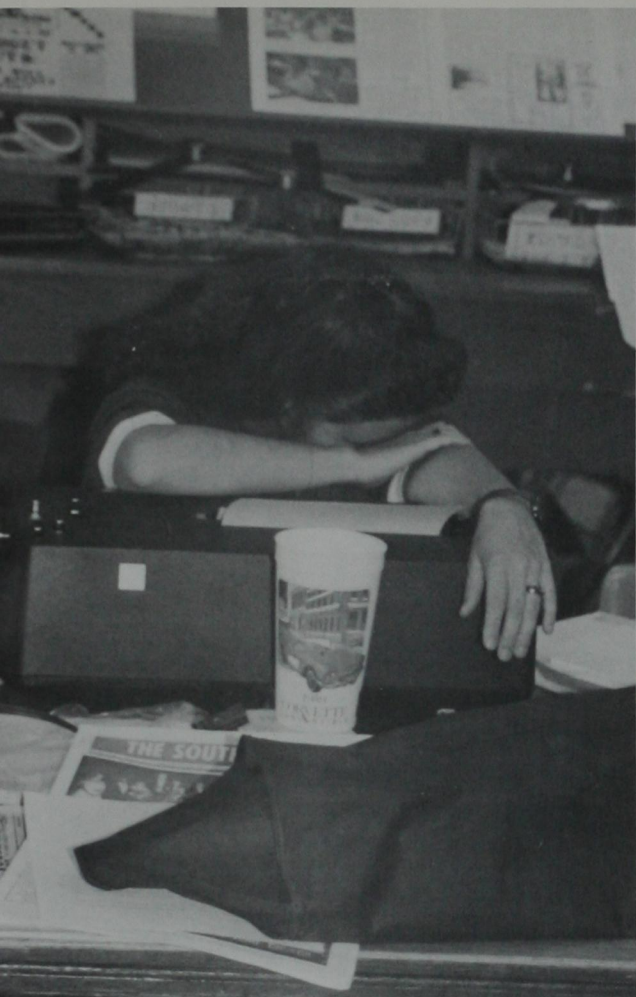
Southwestern

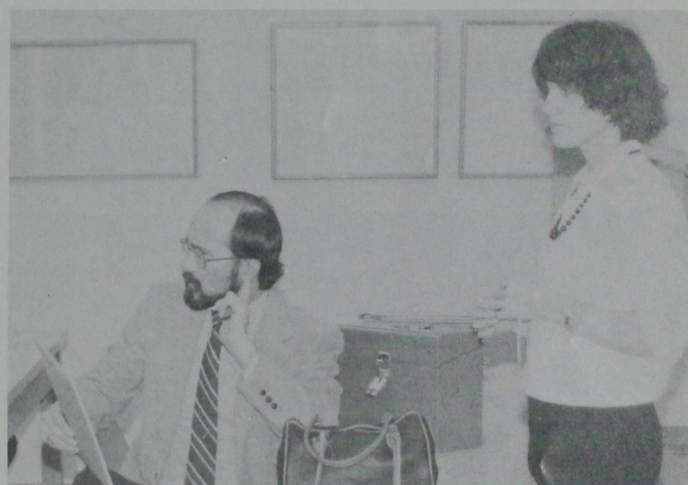
Southwestern Pharmaceutical Assn.

SWPHA is open to pre-pharmacy and all pharmacy majors.



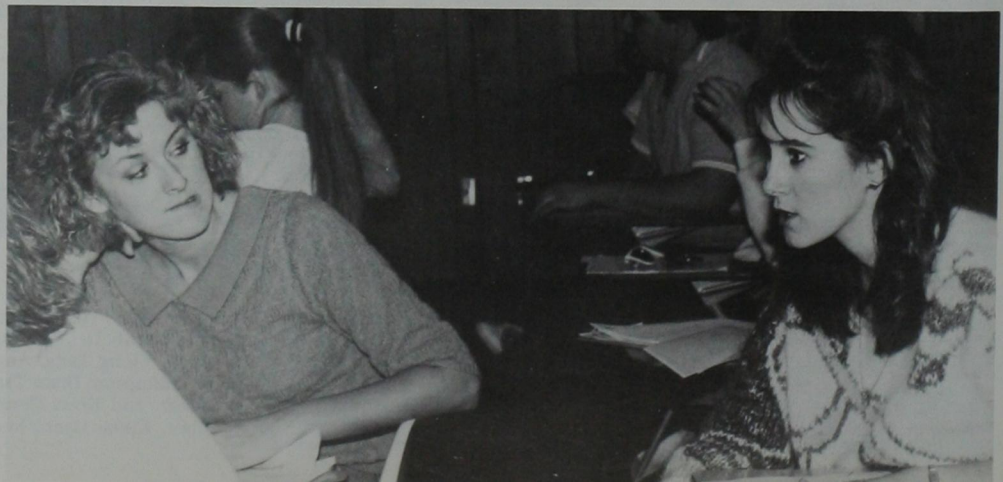

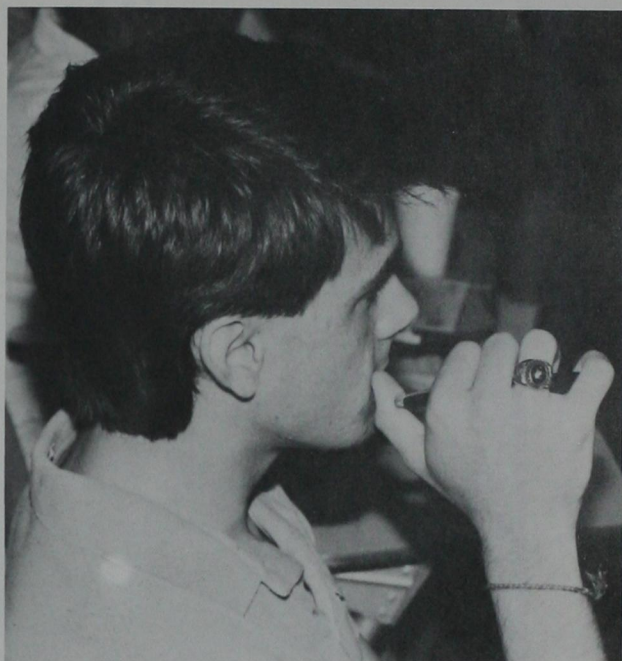
Student Senate

This year they concentrated their fund-raising efforts in a haunted house in the basement of Stuart Hall.

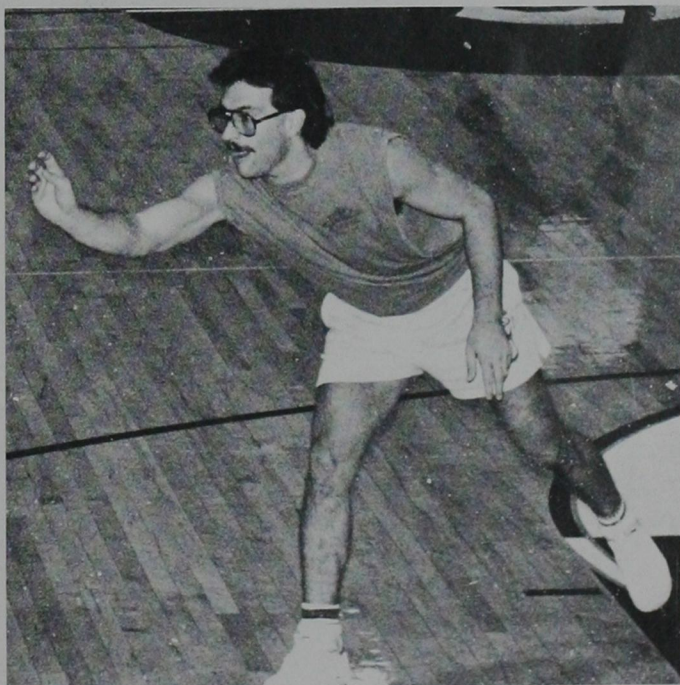

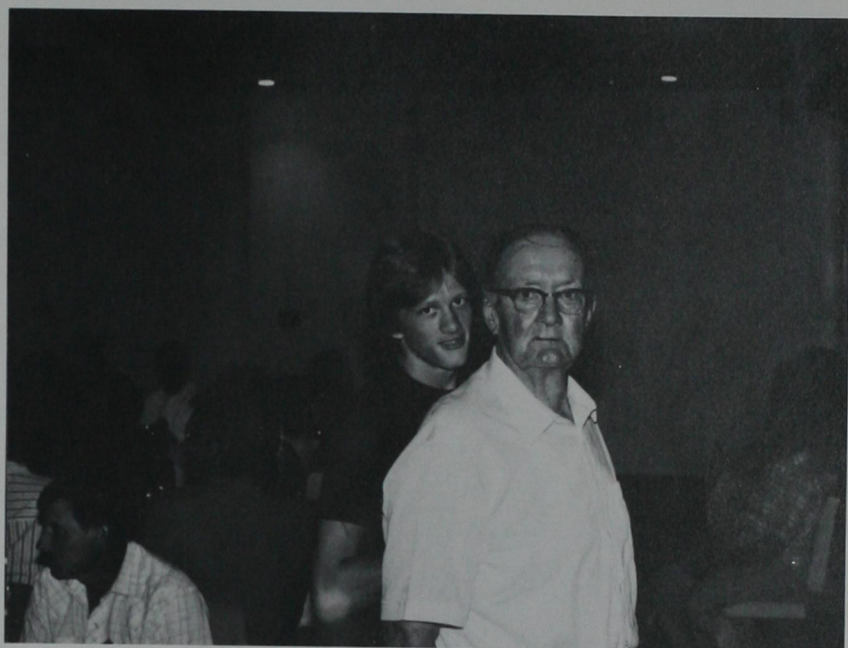


Upward Bound

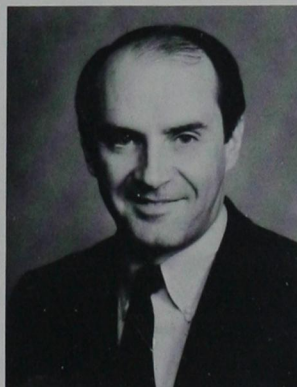
