But more unique is the special atmosphere which permeates classes and relationships. The camaraderie and rapport between students and faculty is indeed special. It is often described as a big family.



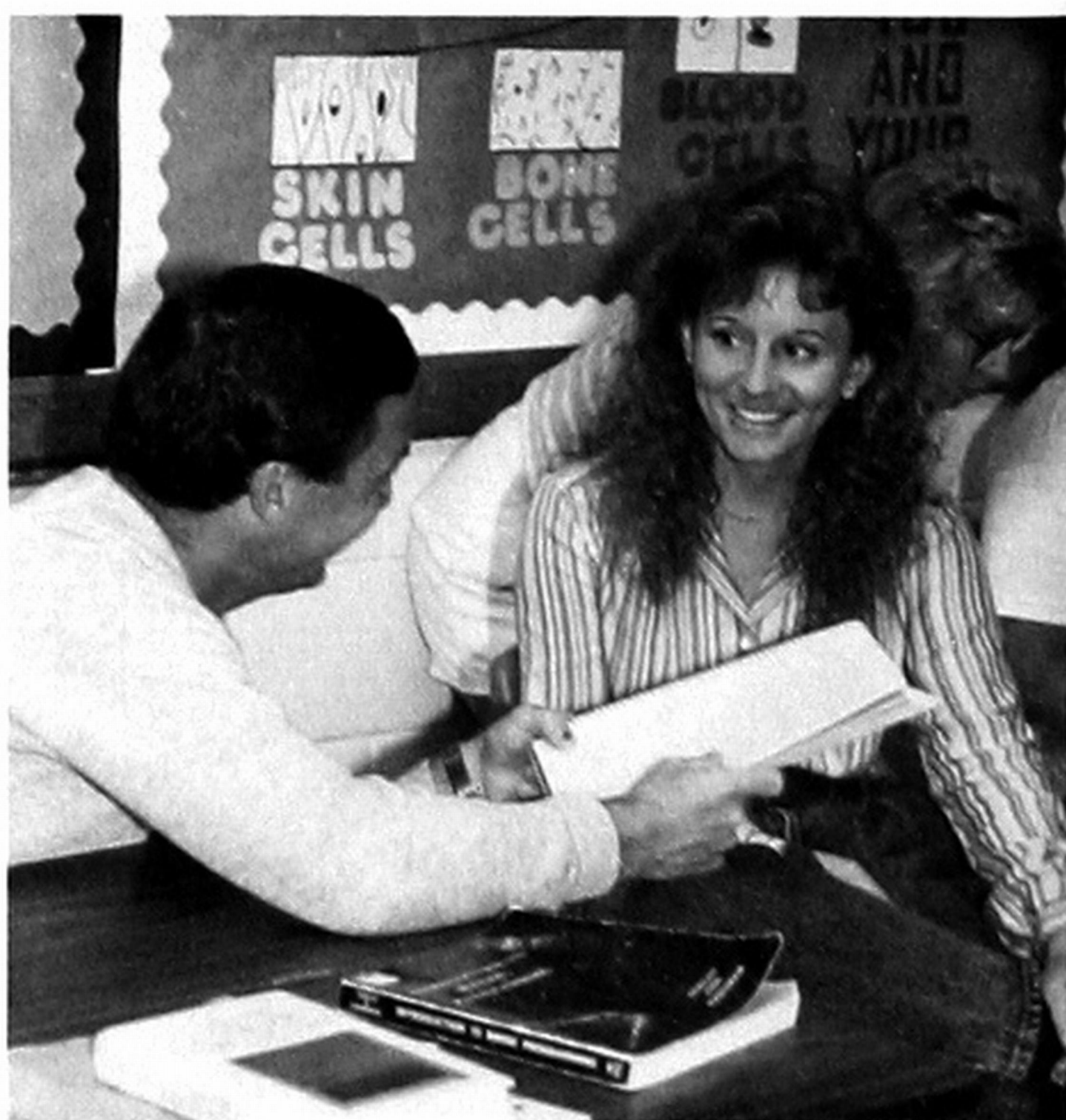

Staff . . . 'Specially Skilled in Coordination

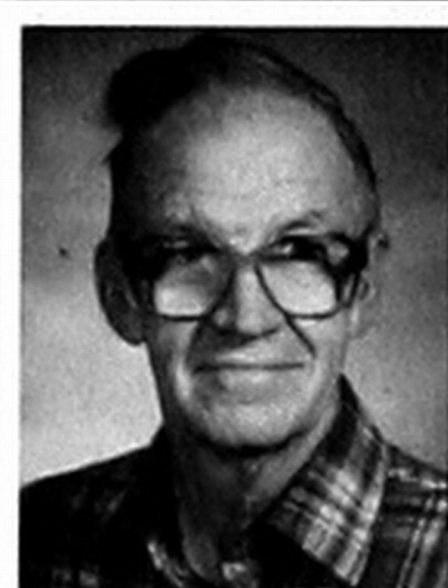

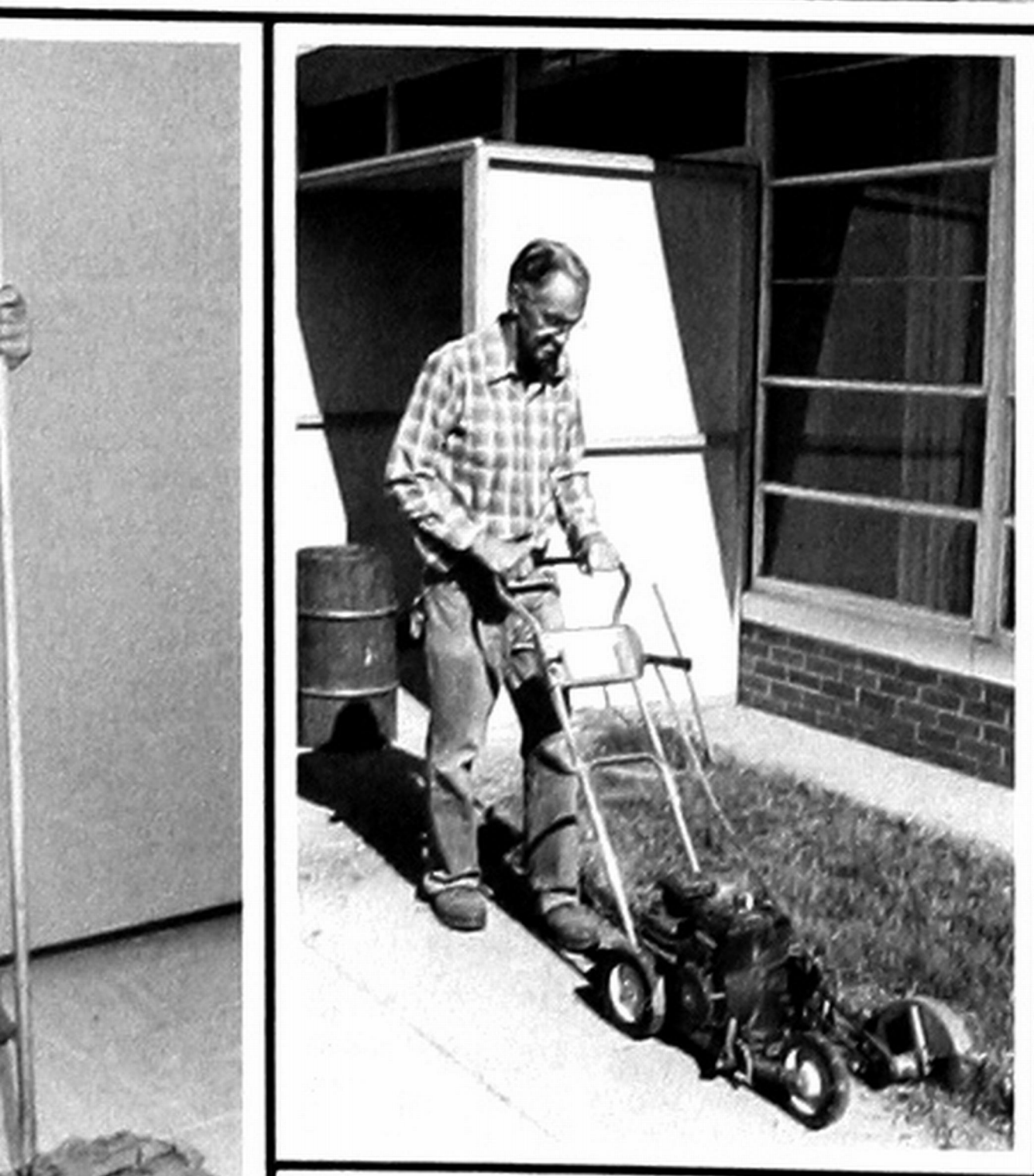

These students received personalized certificates at graduation ceremonies.



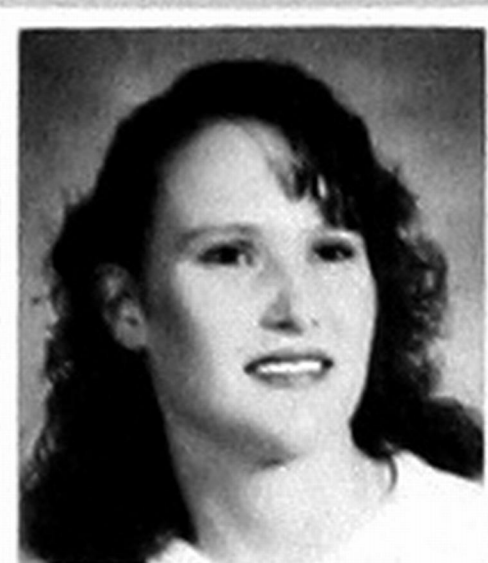

Special studies

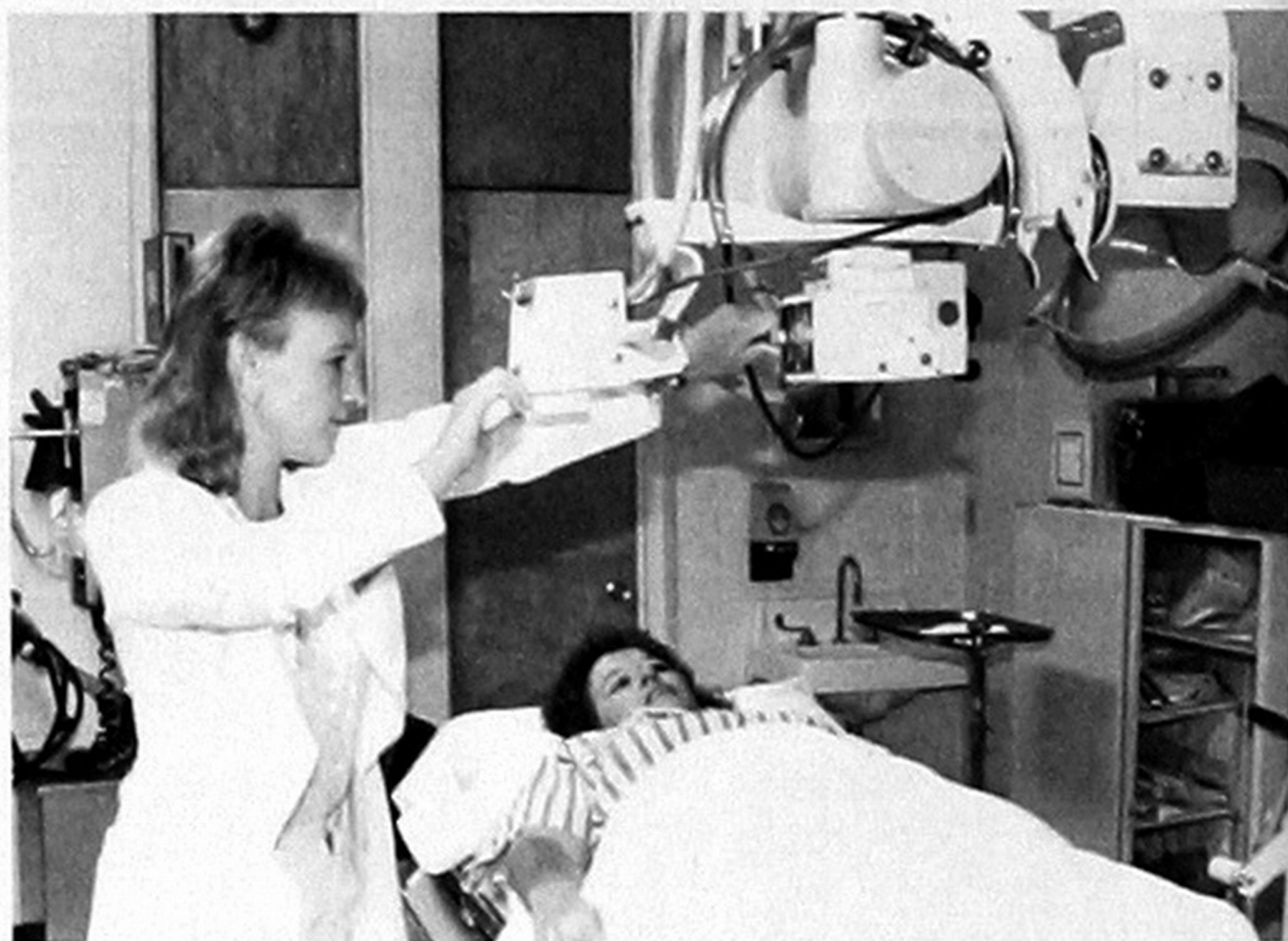
Along with studies in general education, the special programs in medical technology and radiology attract a large enrollment.

Internship in radiology at the Sayre Hospital requires students like Terri Diltz and Barbie Reed to become familiar with the use of x-ray.

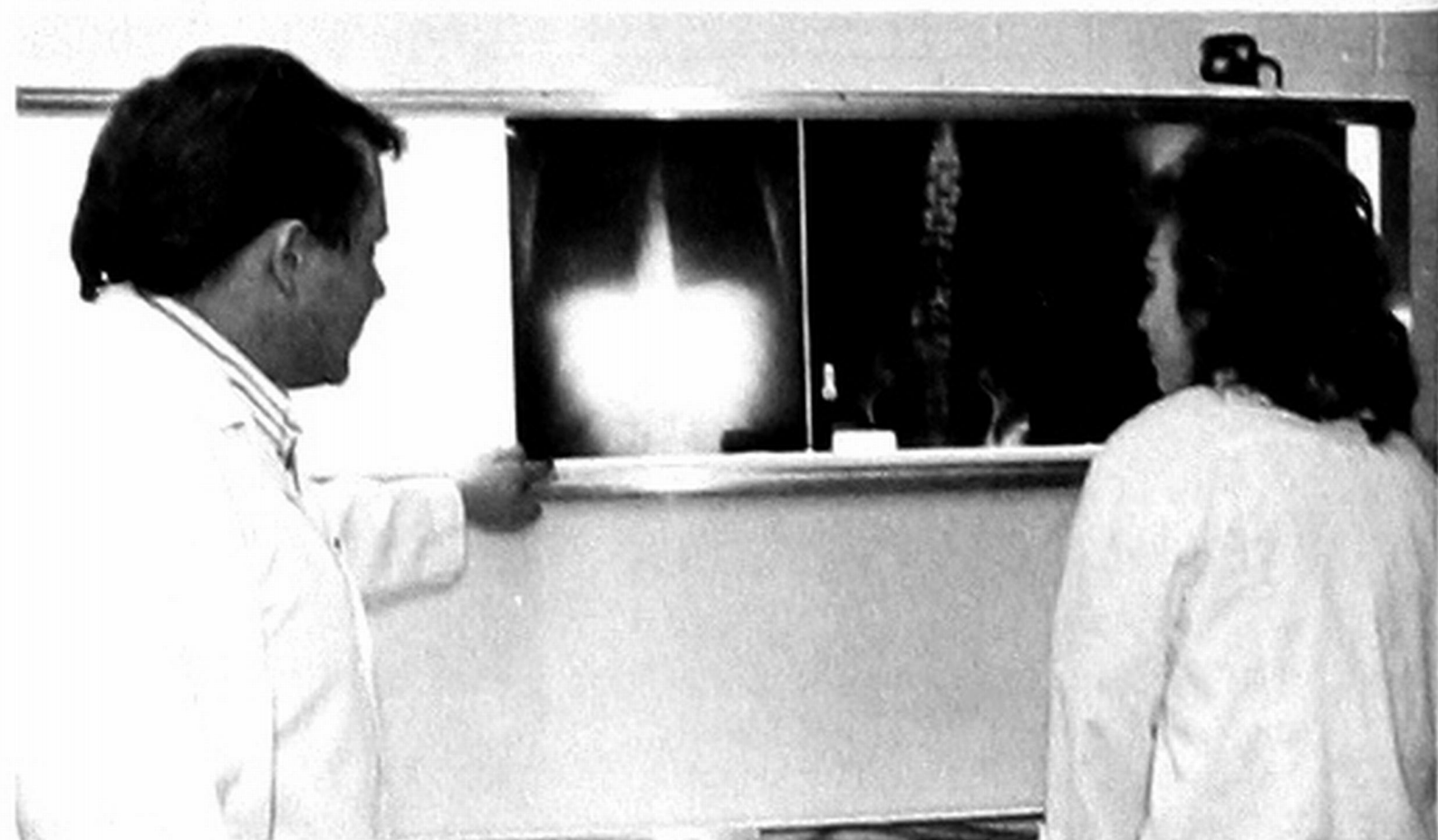
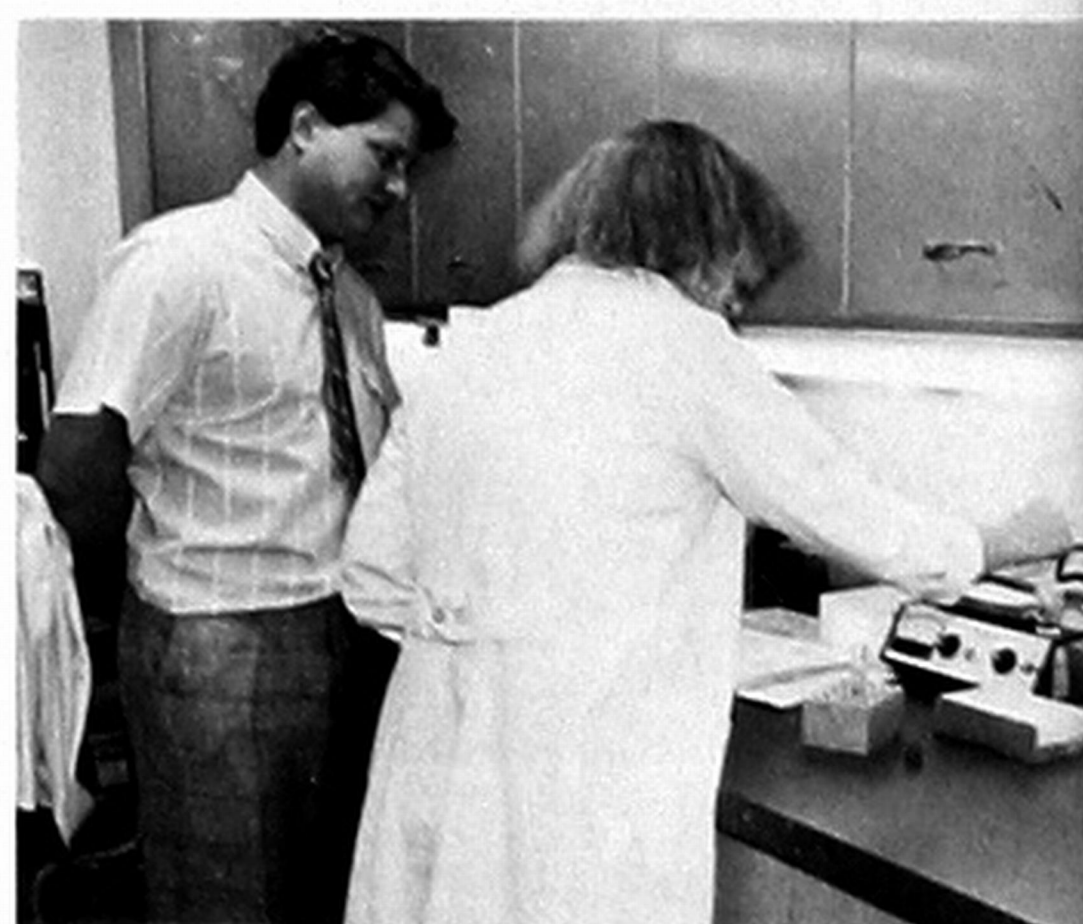

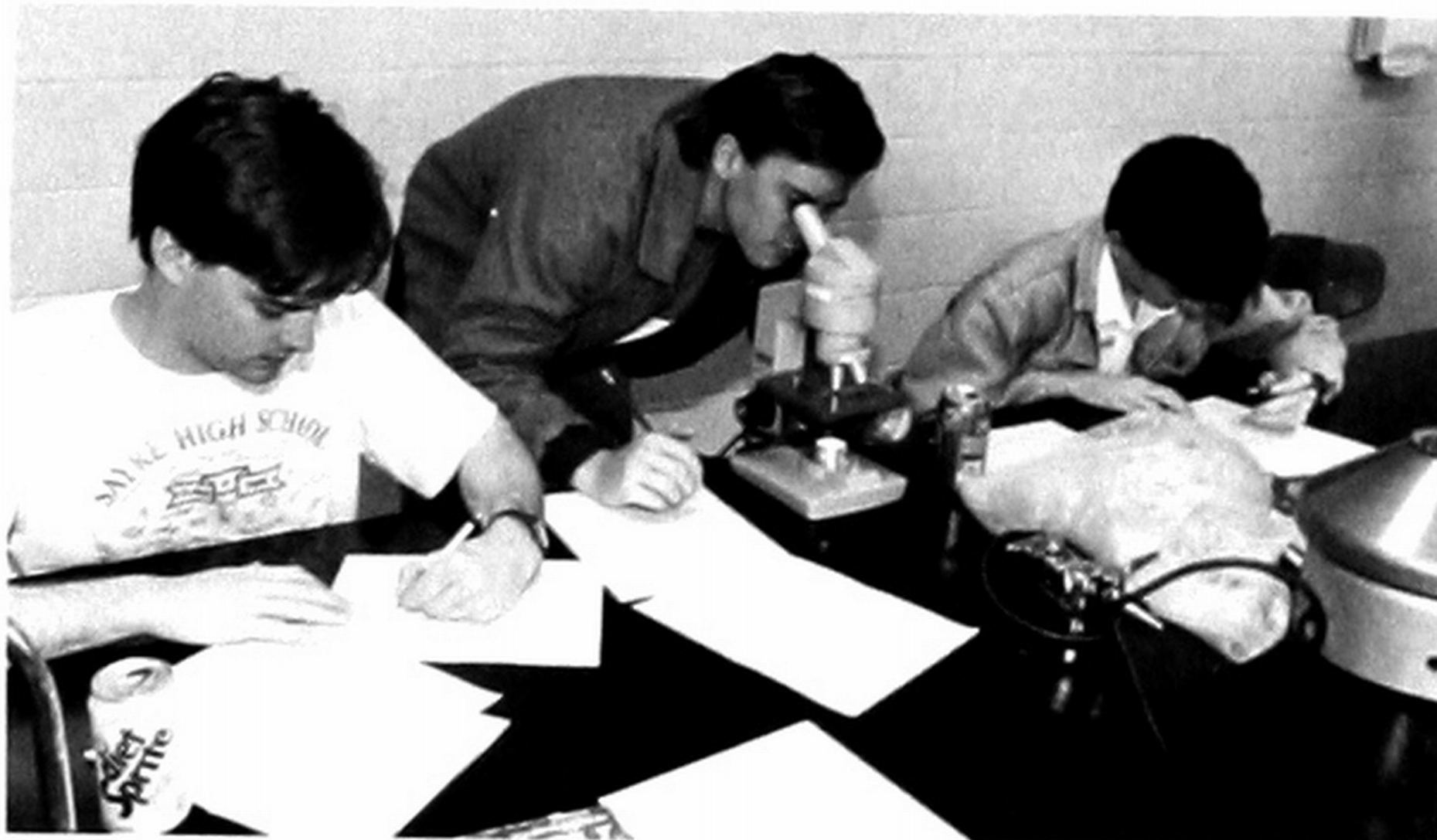

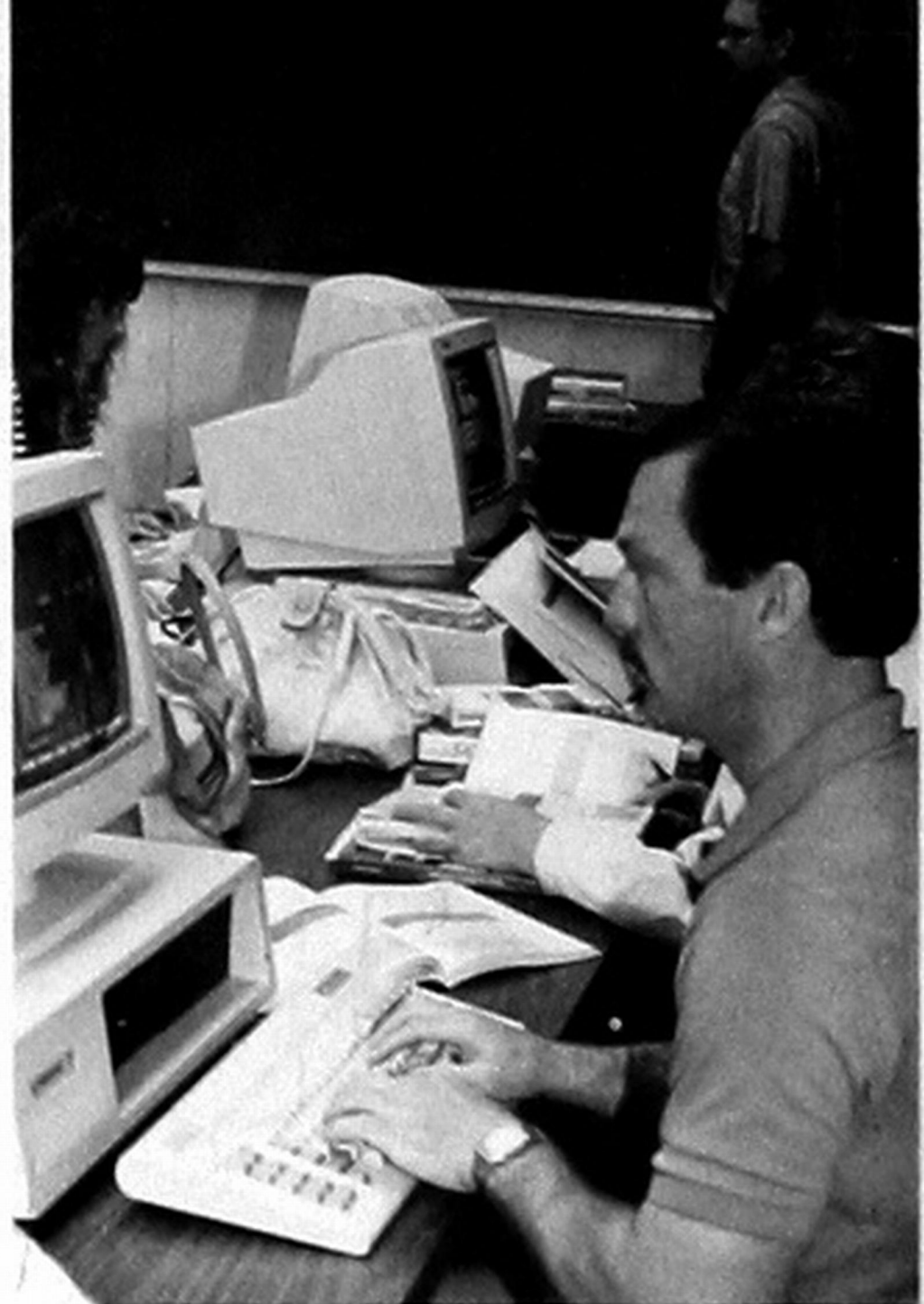

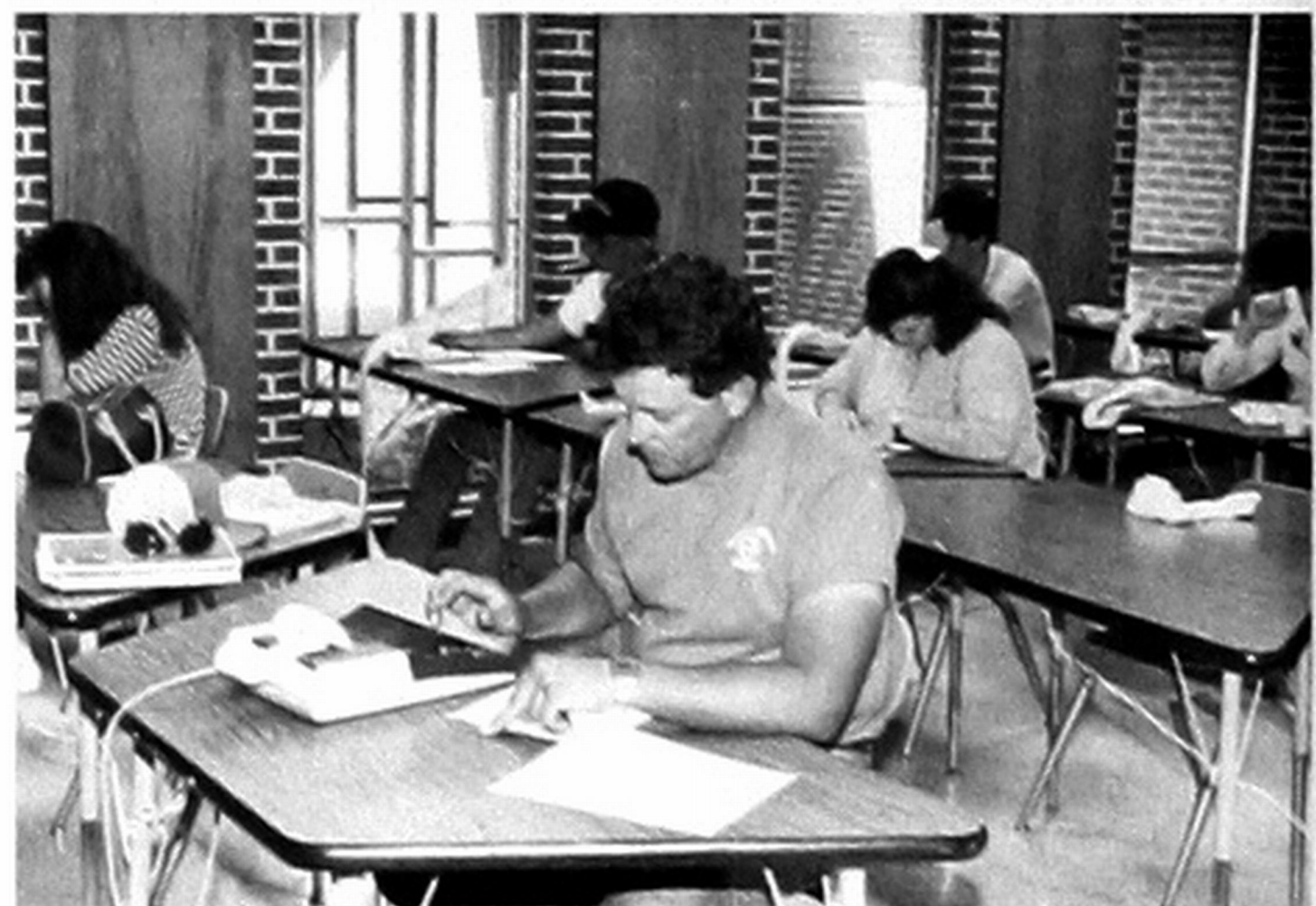

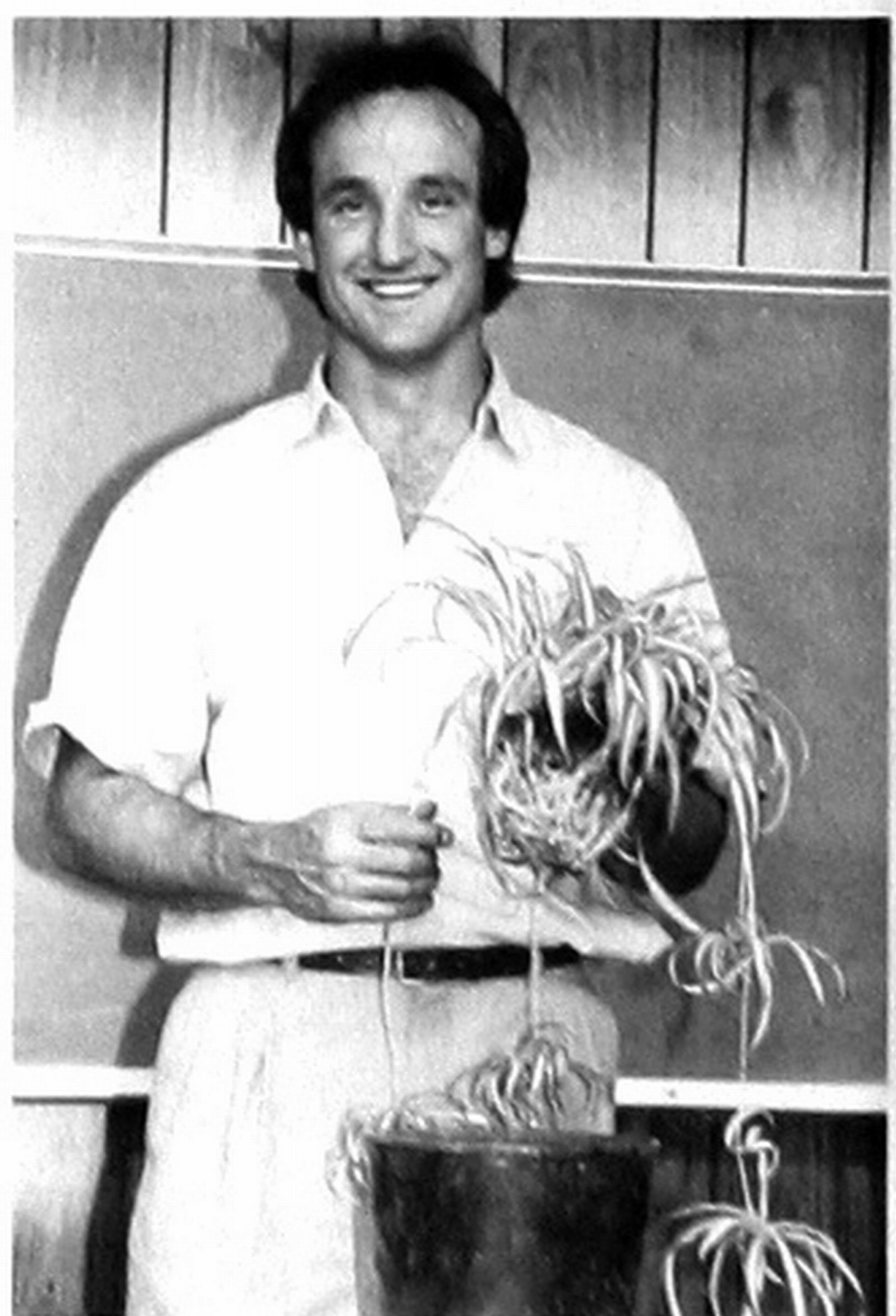

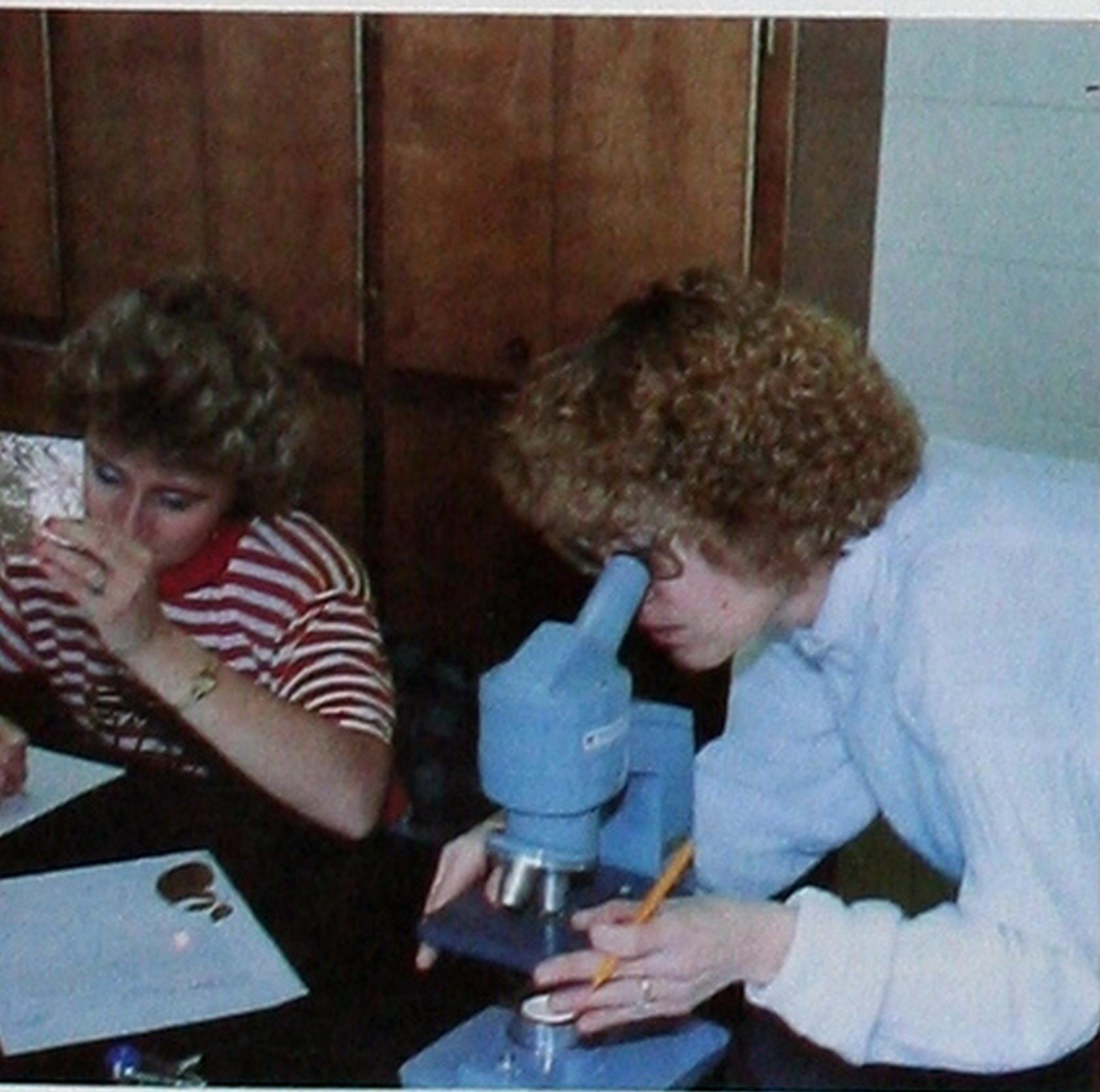

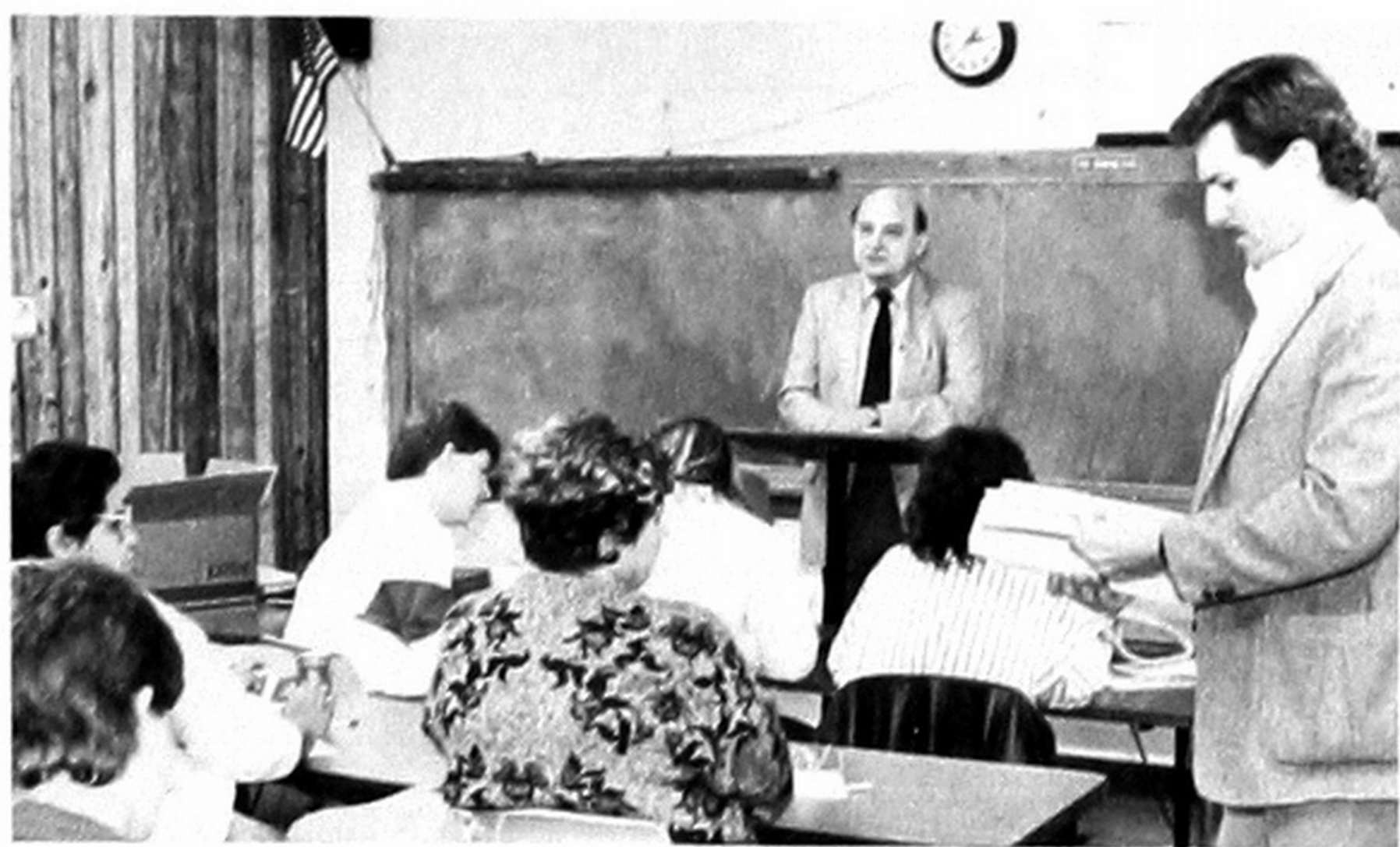

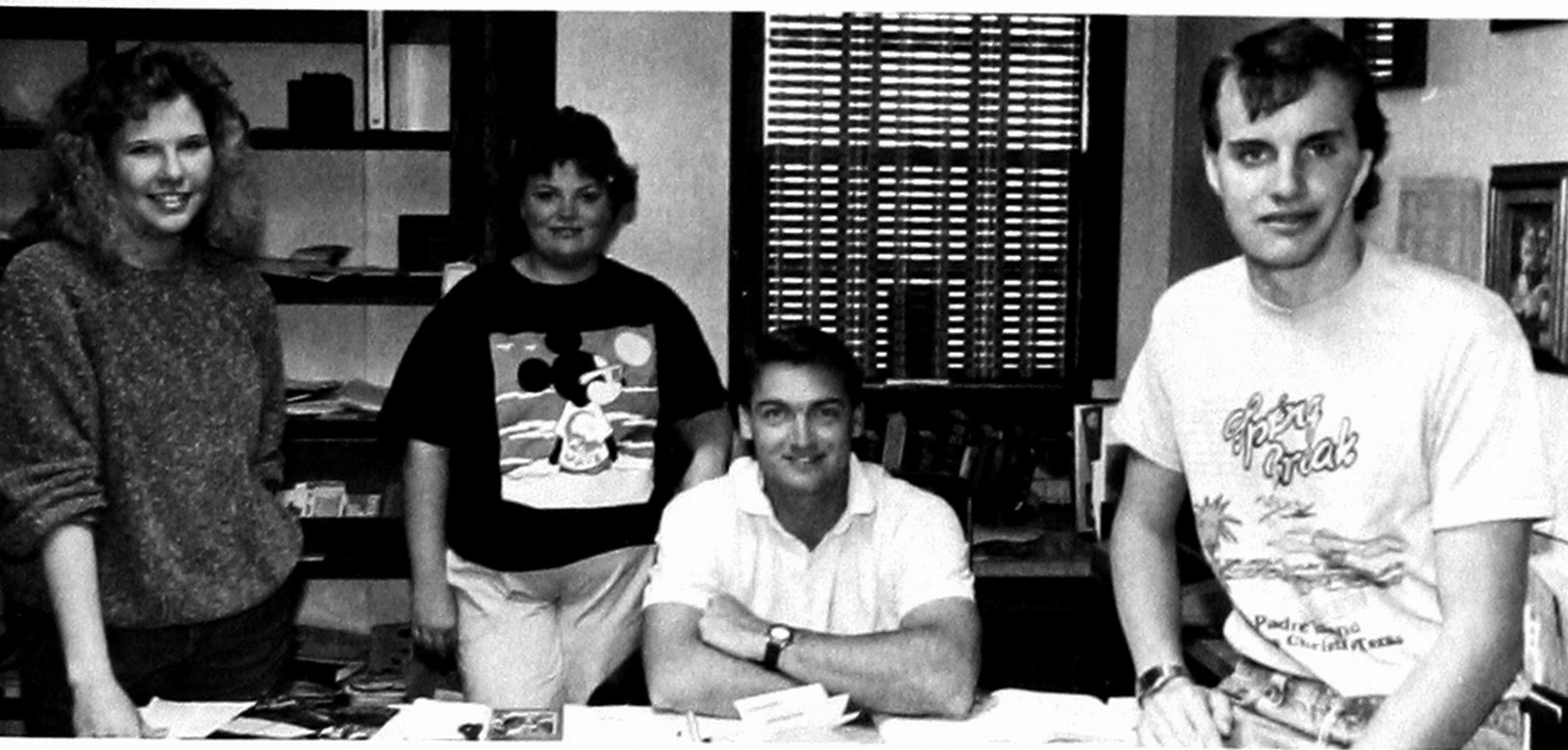

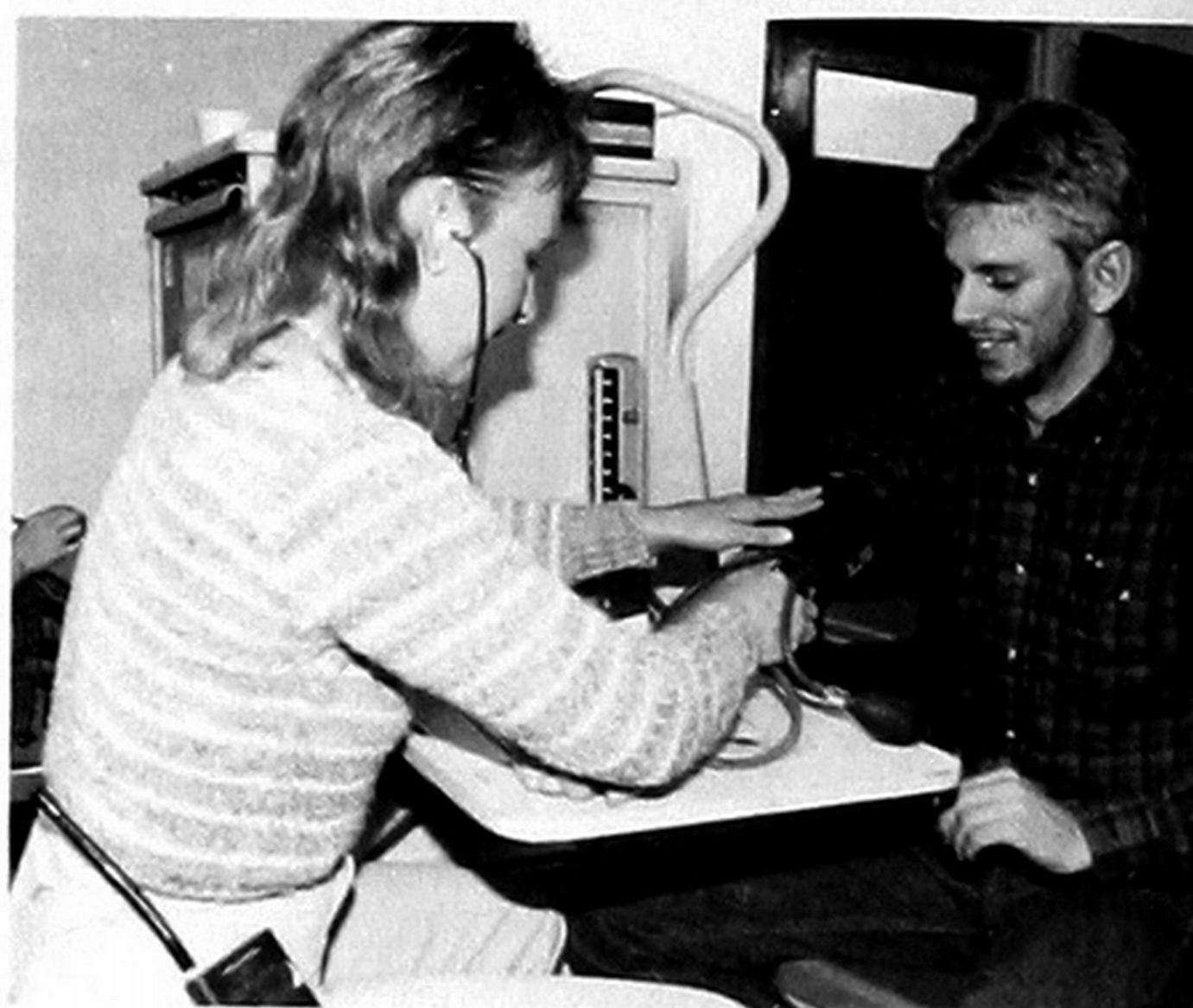


Health Careers Require Special Skills

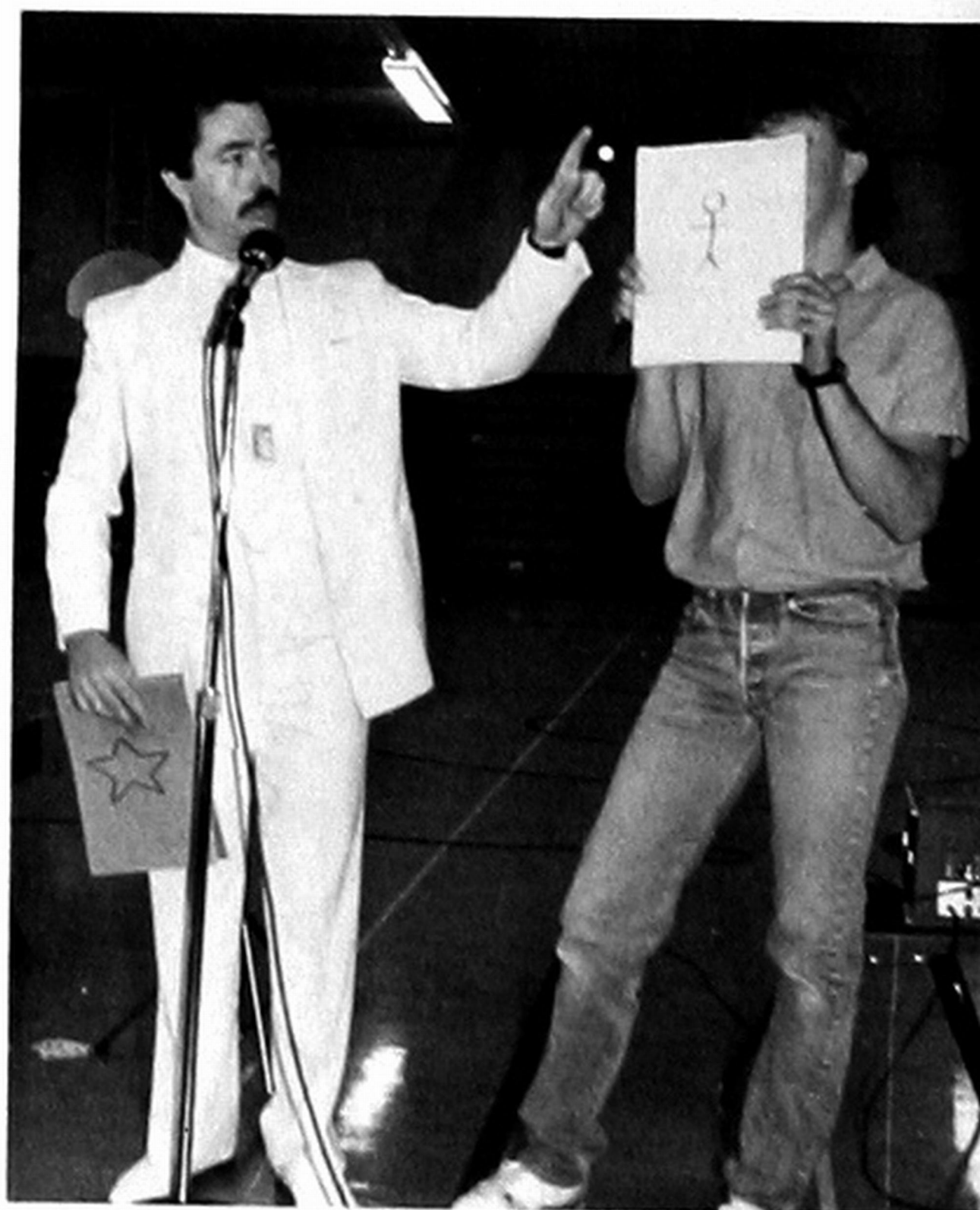
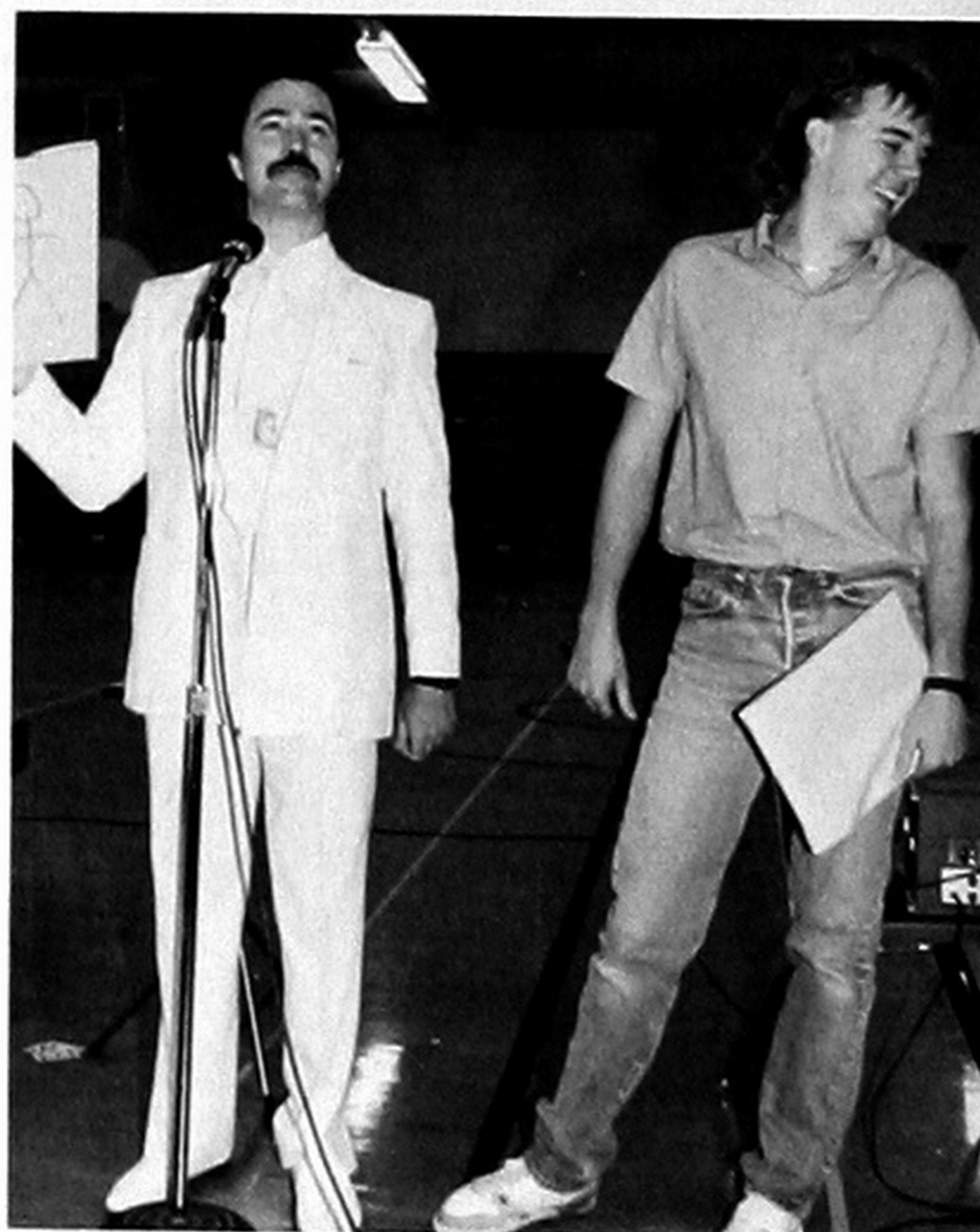

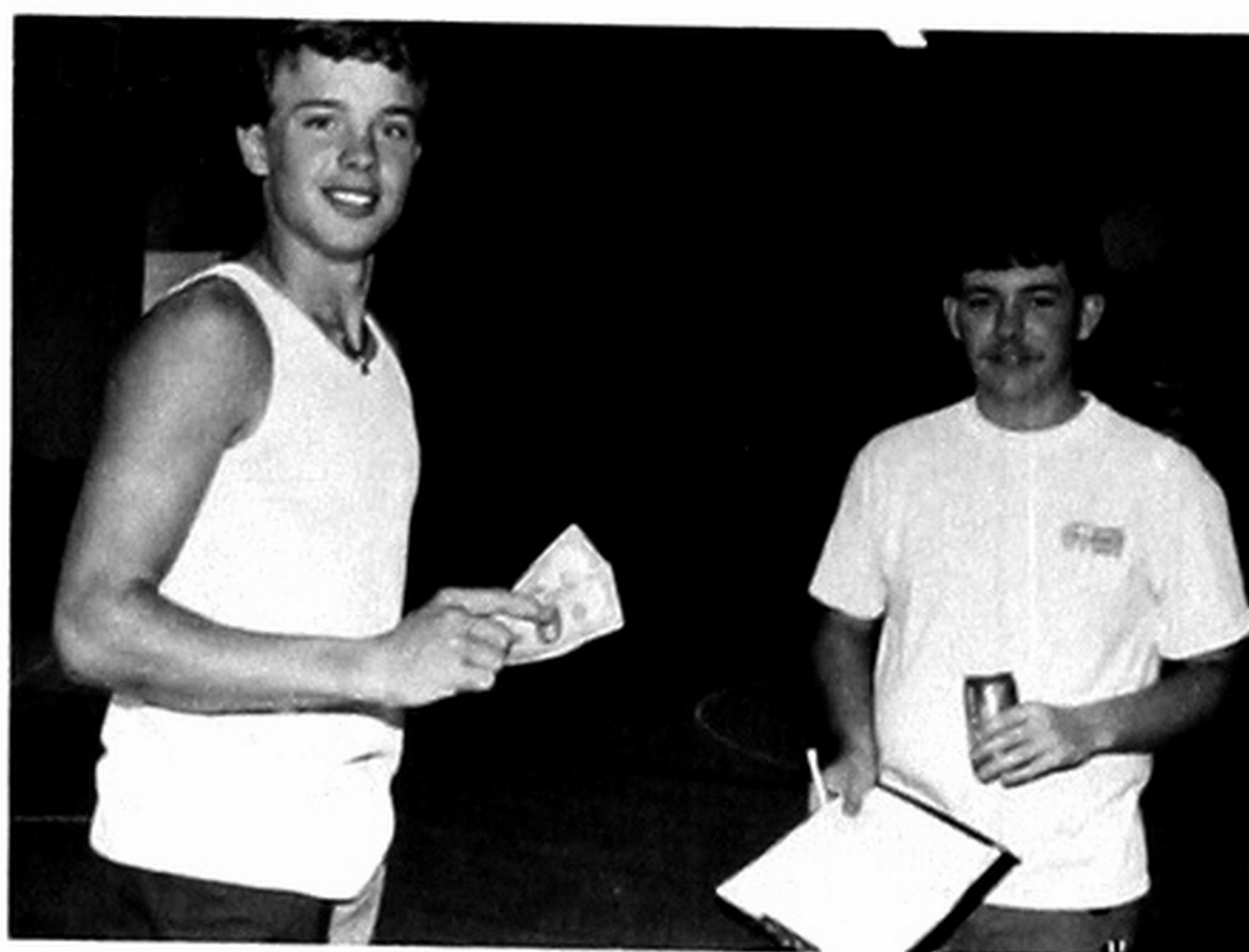

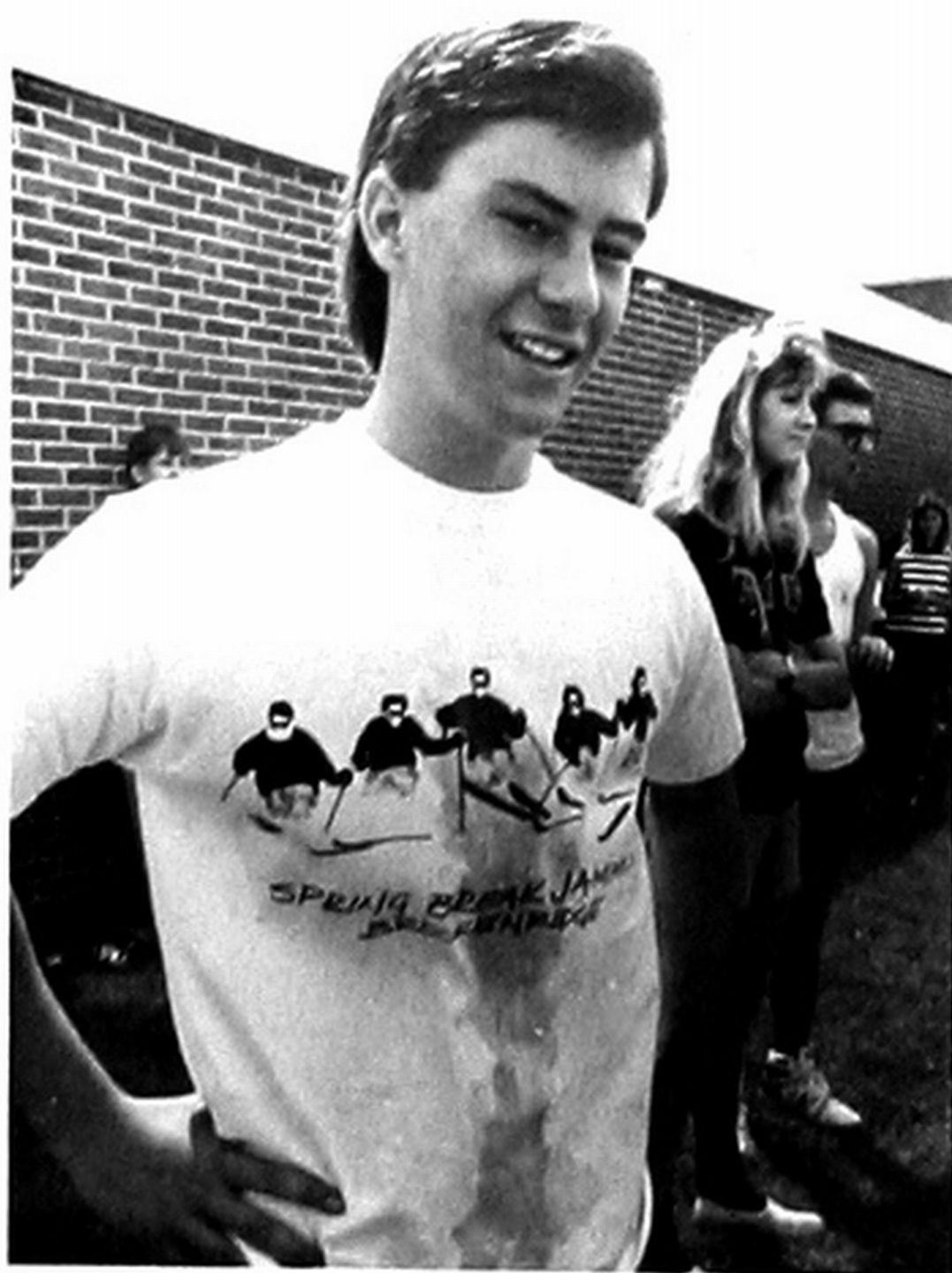
