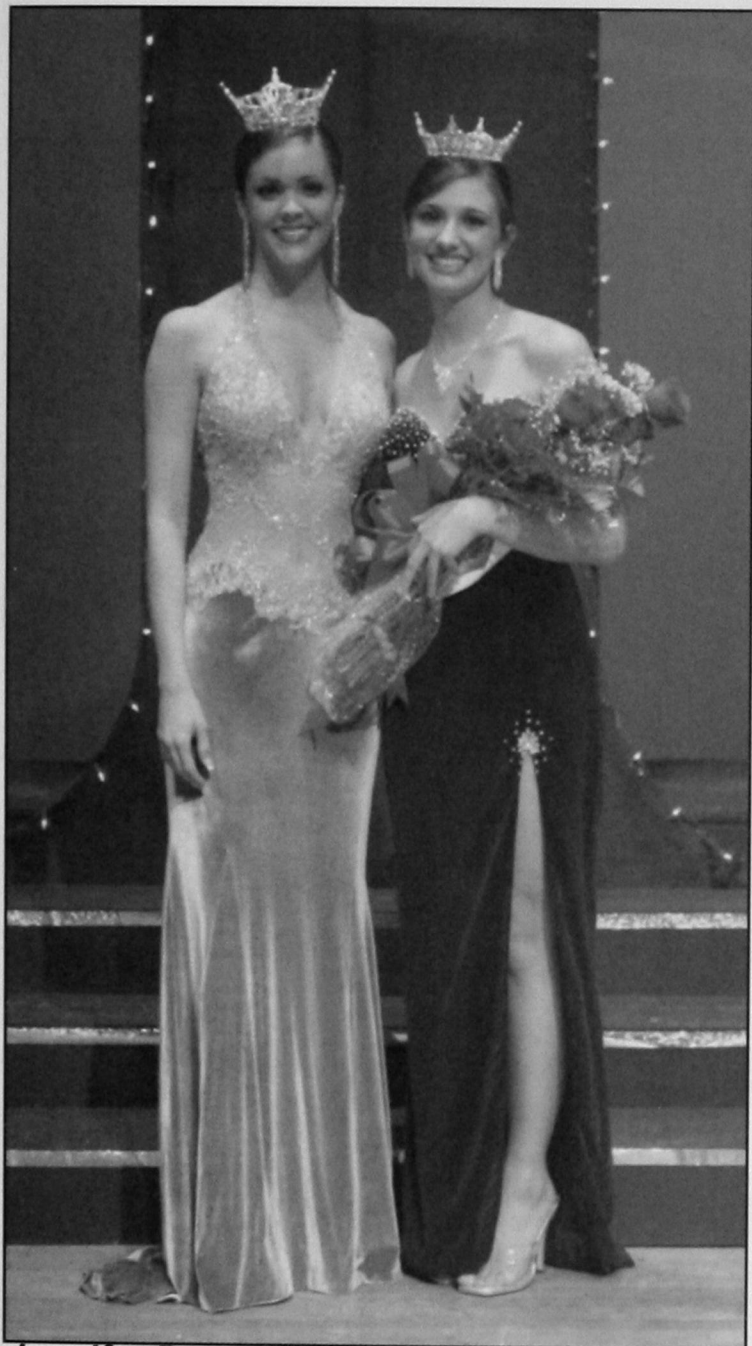
Ashley Bledsoe was crowned Miss Southwestern 2006. Bledsoe is a junior from Altus and is majoring in biology/pre-dentistry.

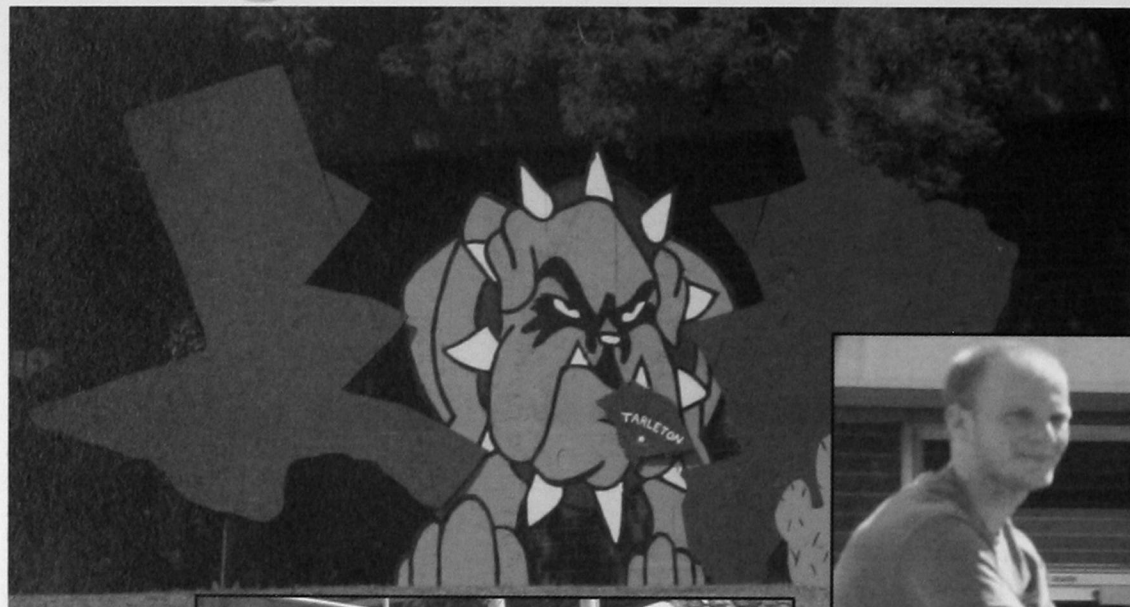

The big event of the day was the football game and the many activities surrounding it. The Dawgs lost in a 16-9 heartbreaker against Tarleton state.

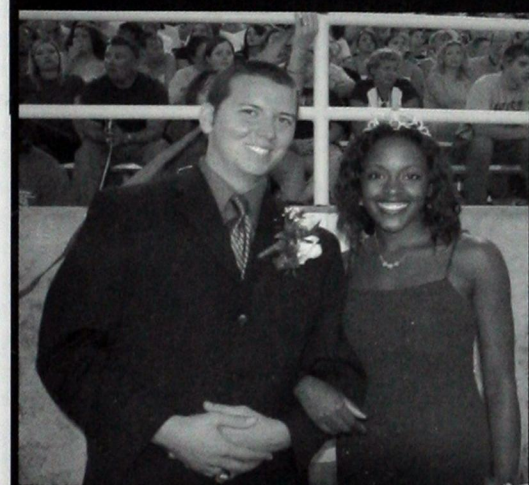
Despite the Dawgs' loss there was still much to celebrate.

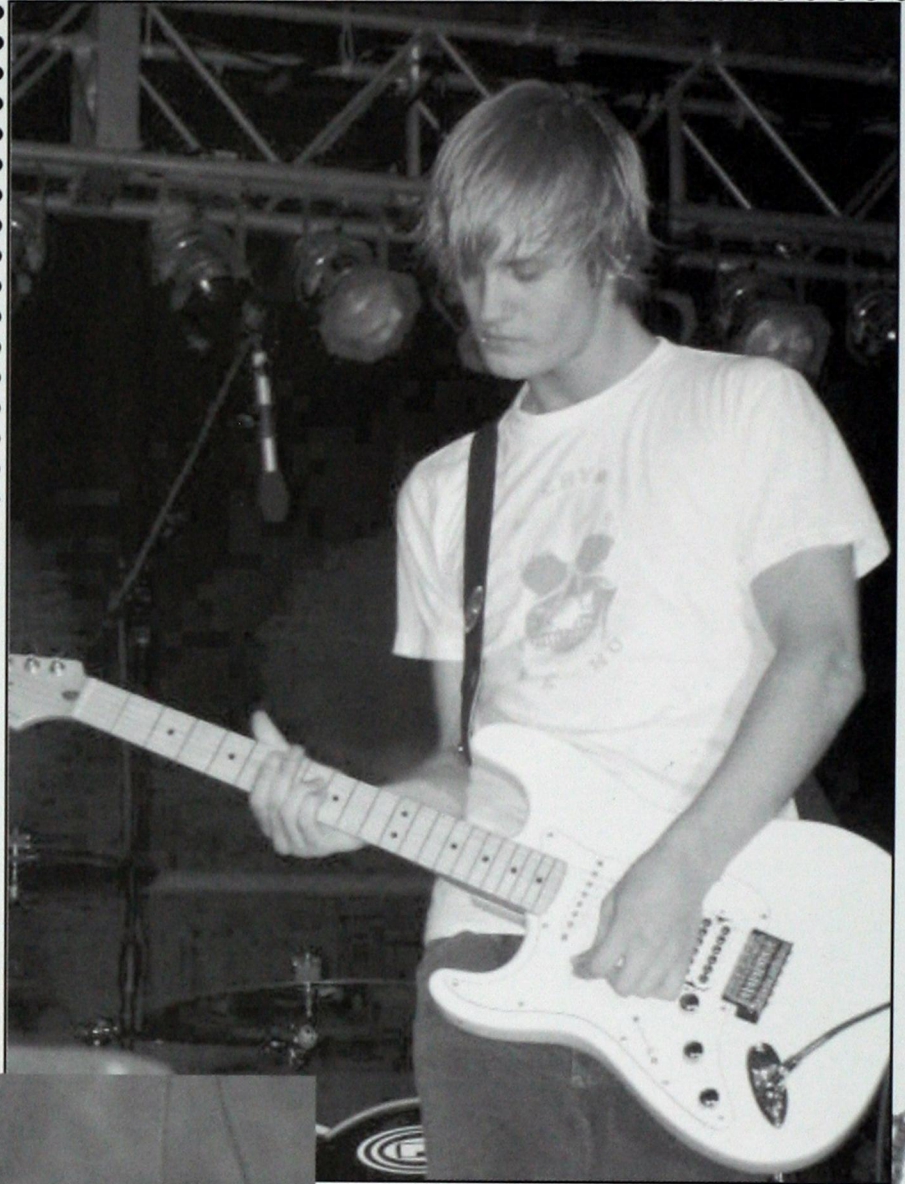

94.7 The Buzz, an Oklahoma City radio station, broadcast the show live.

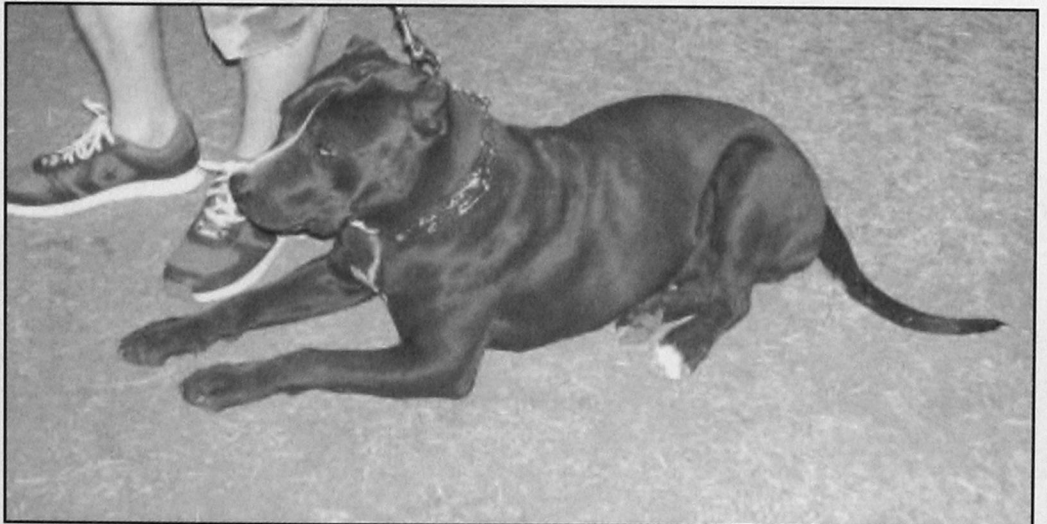
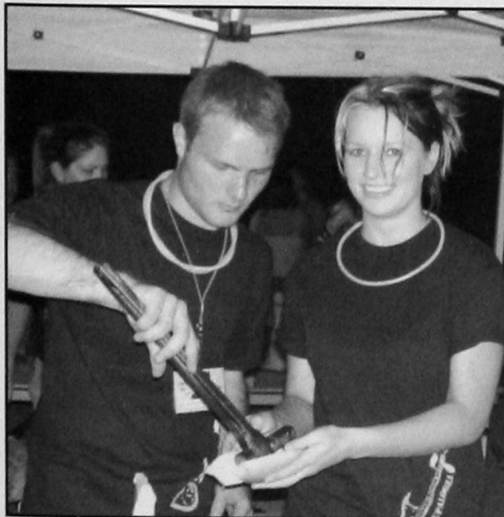
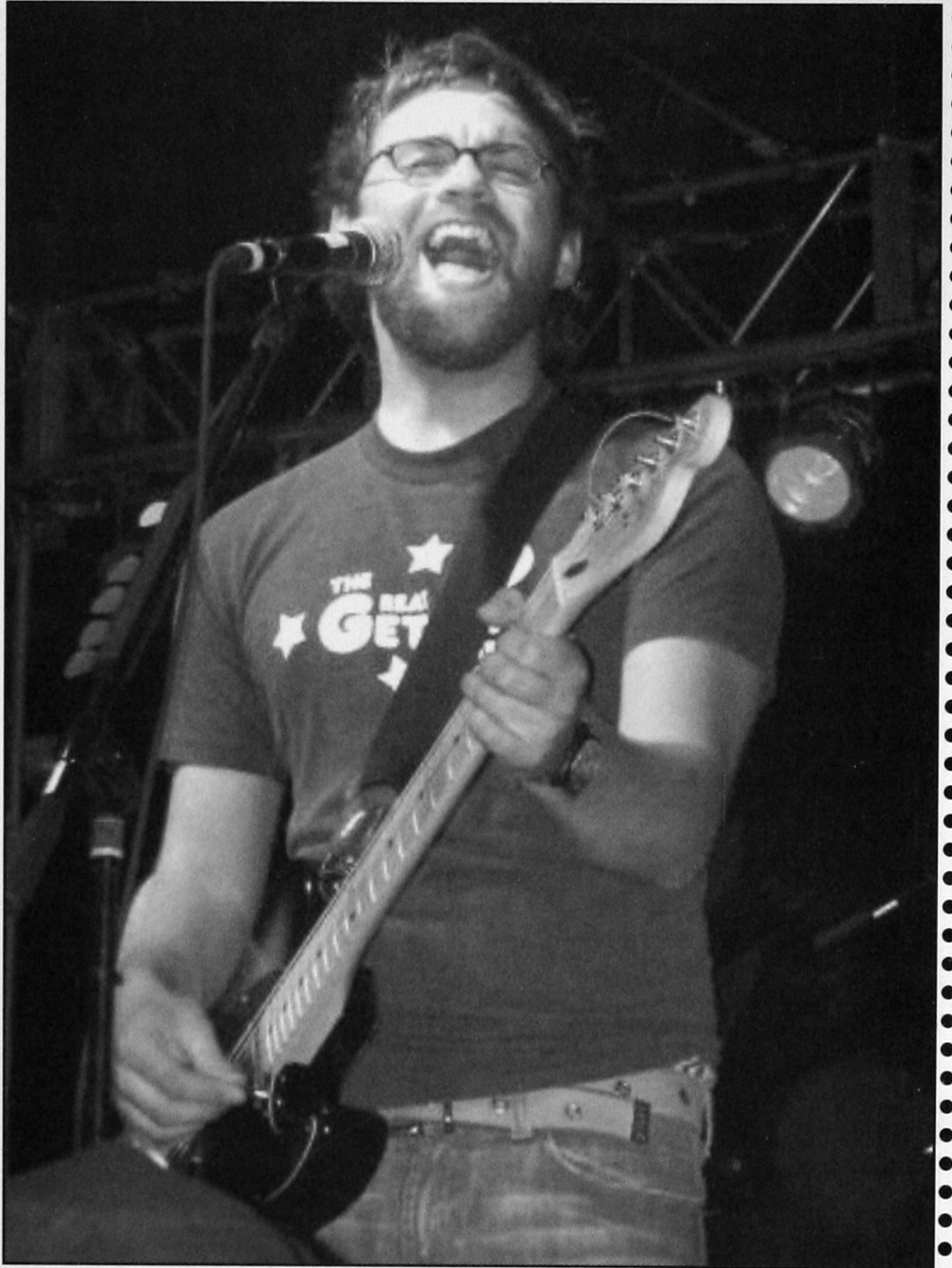

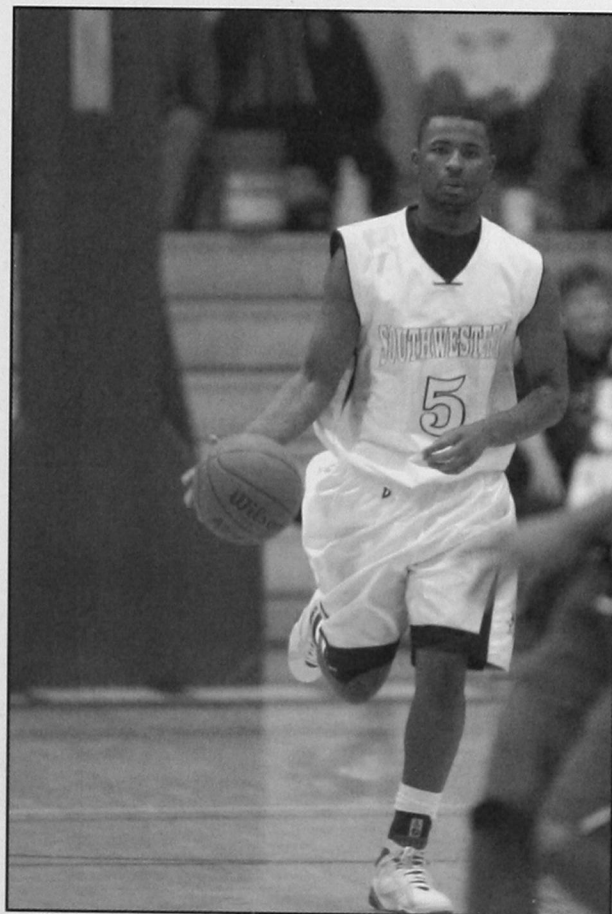

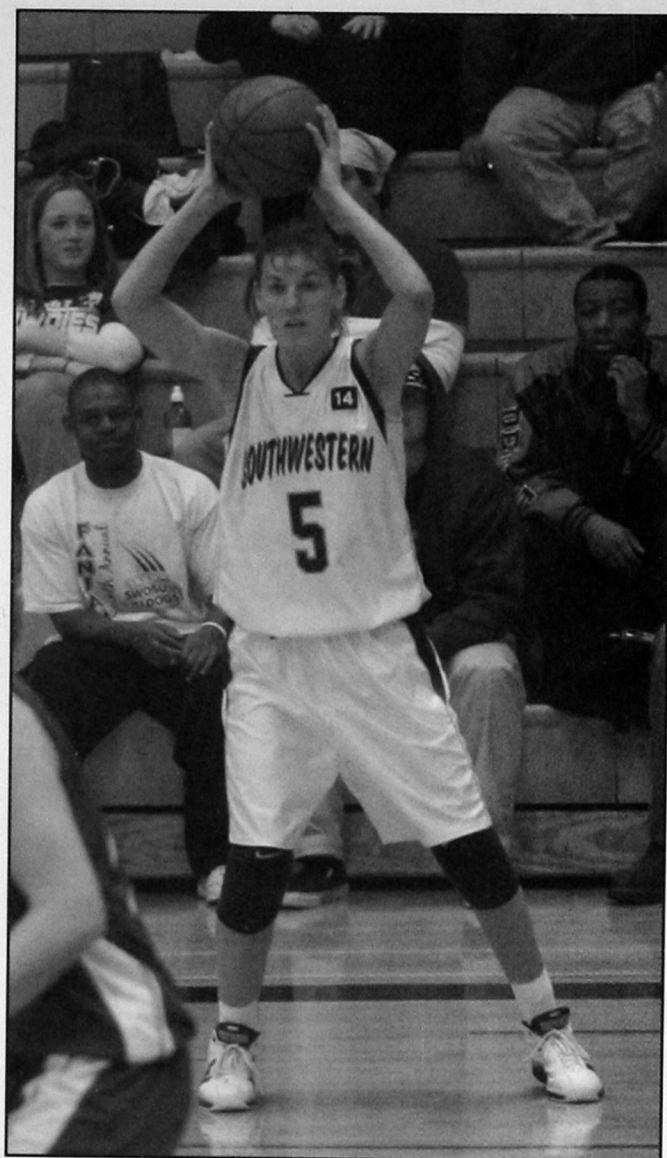
points a game.

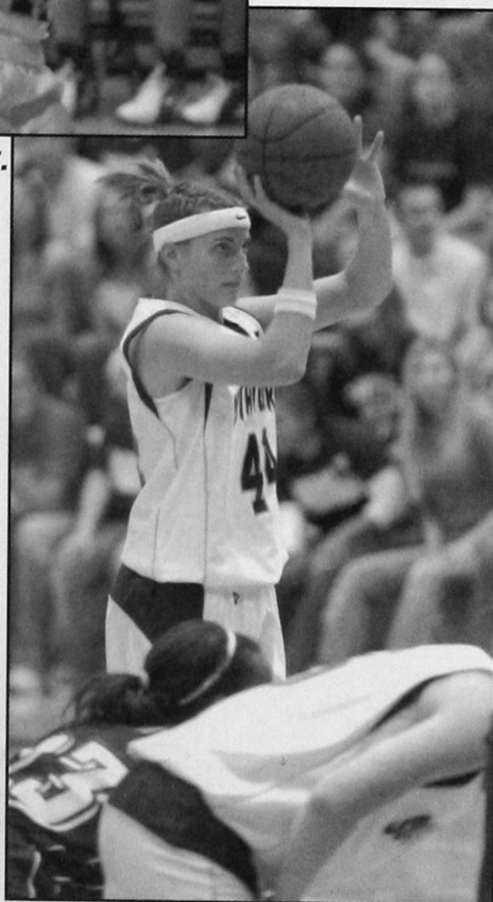

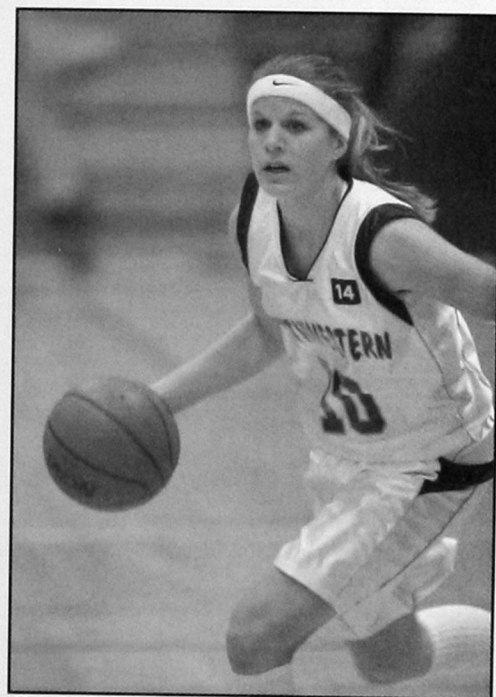

"Basically we were a young, new division II volleyball team", said student- assistant coach Josh Collins.

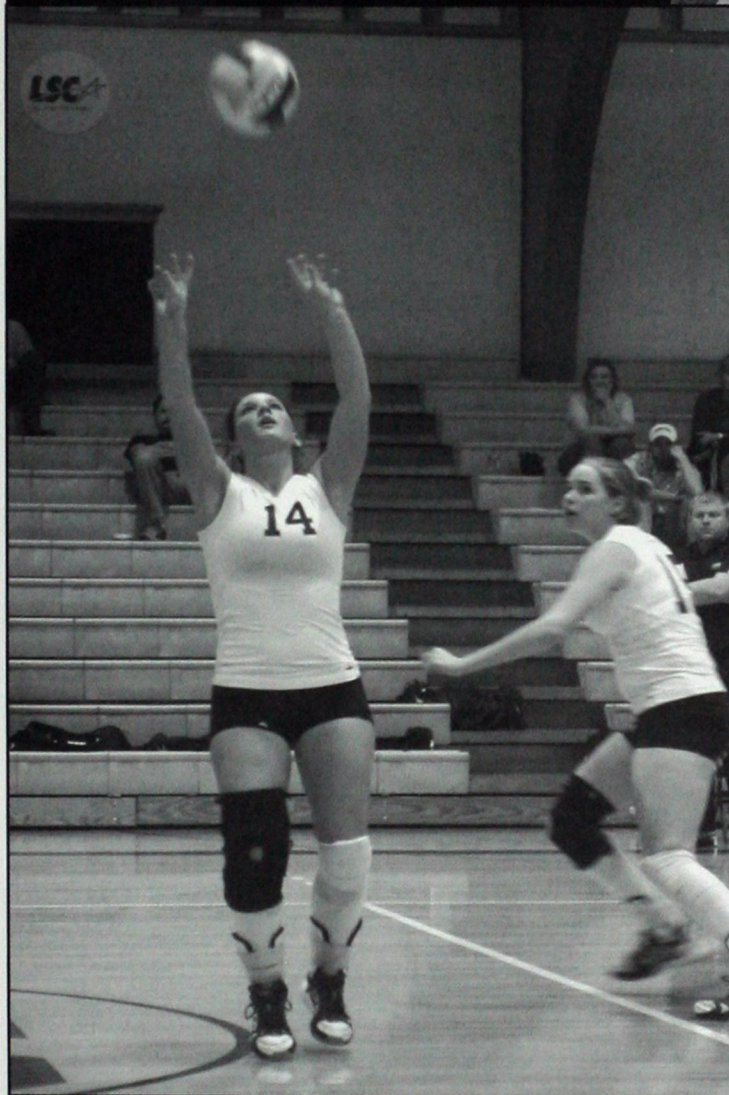
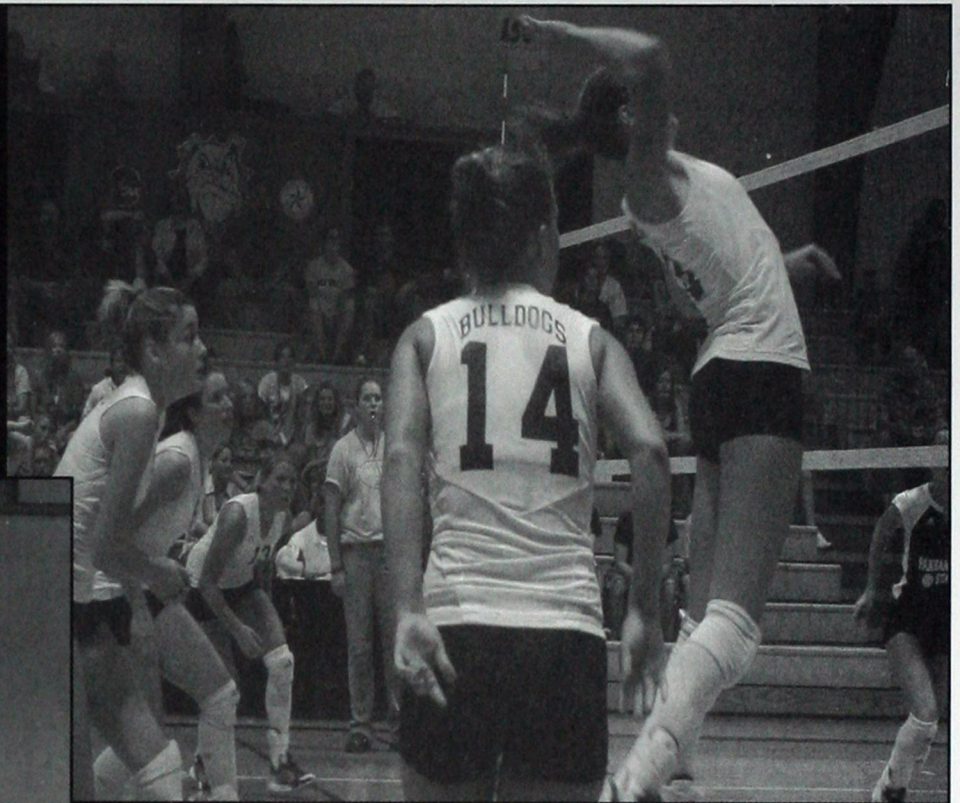
"A lot of the teams we played had veteran players and established programs and we were just getting our feet wet.

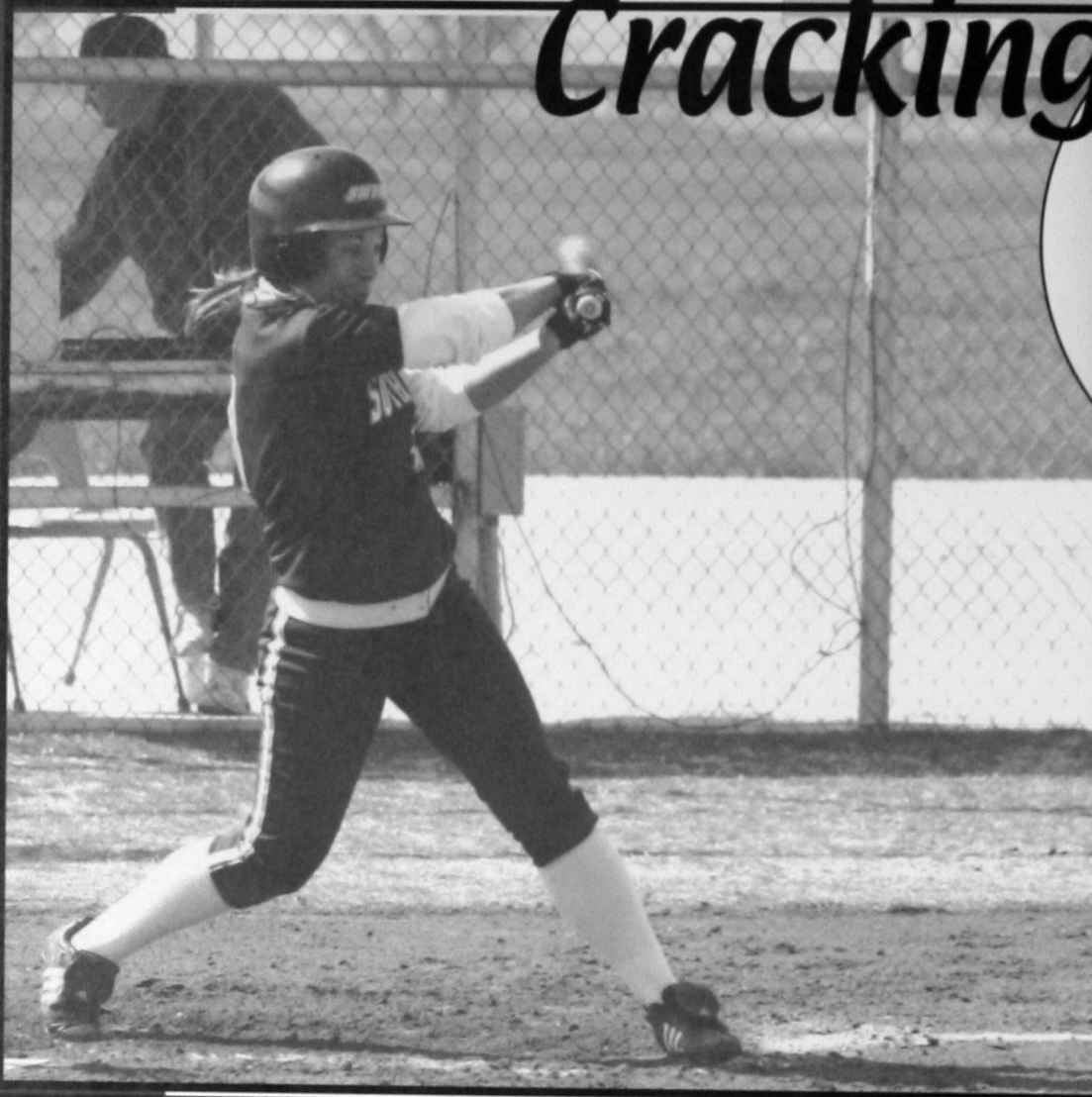

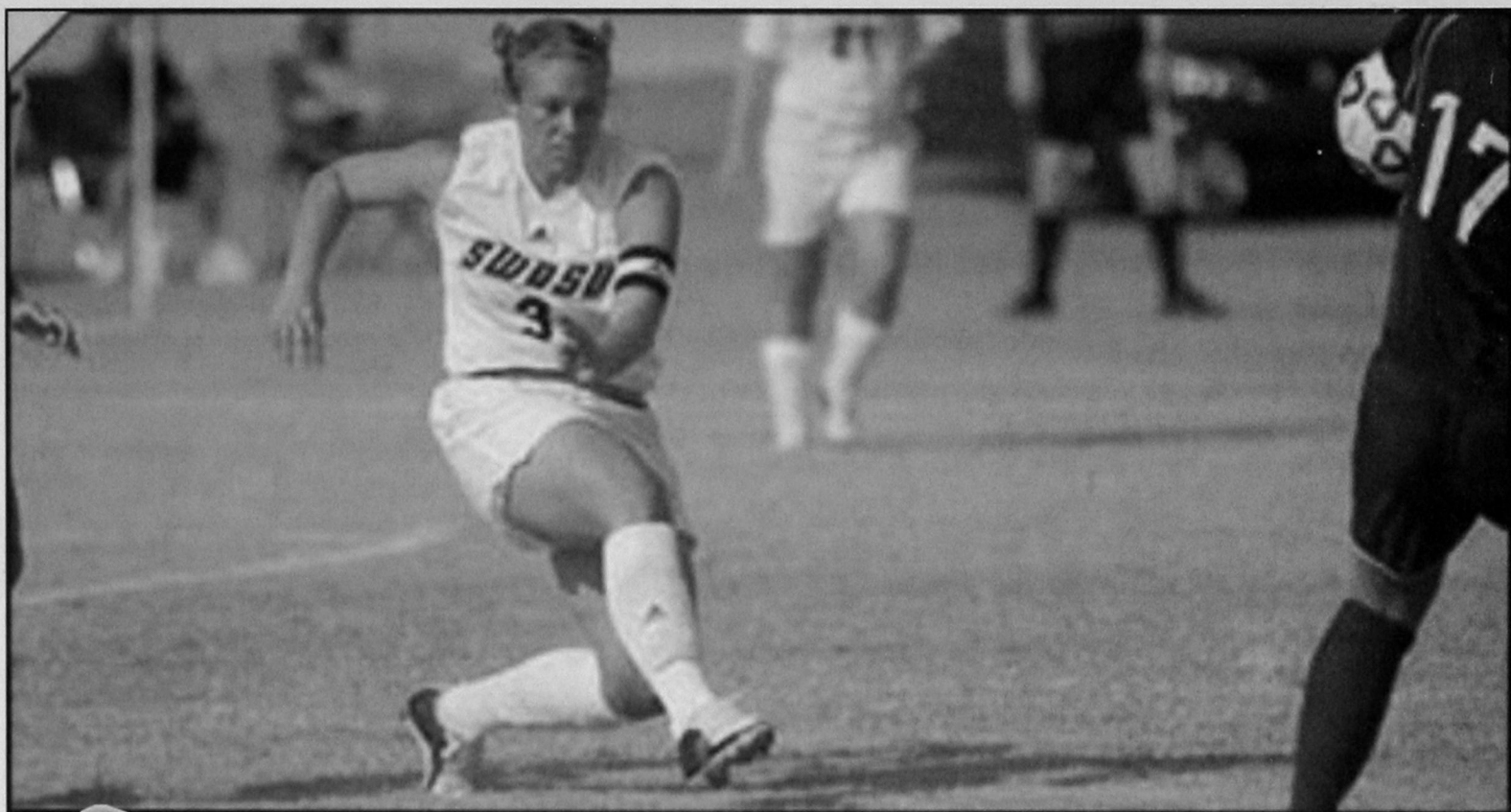

Ingram earned all-conference honors and won two meets this year.

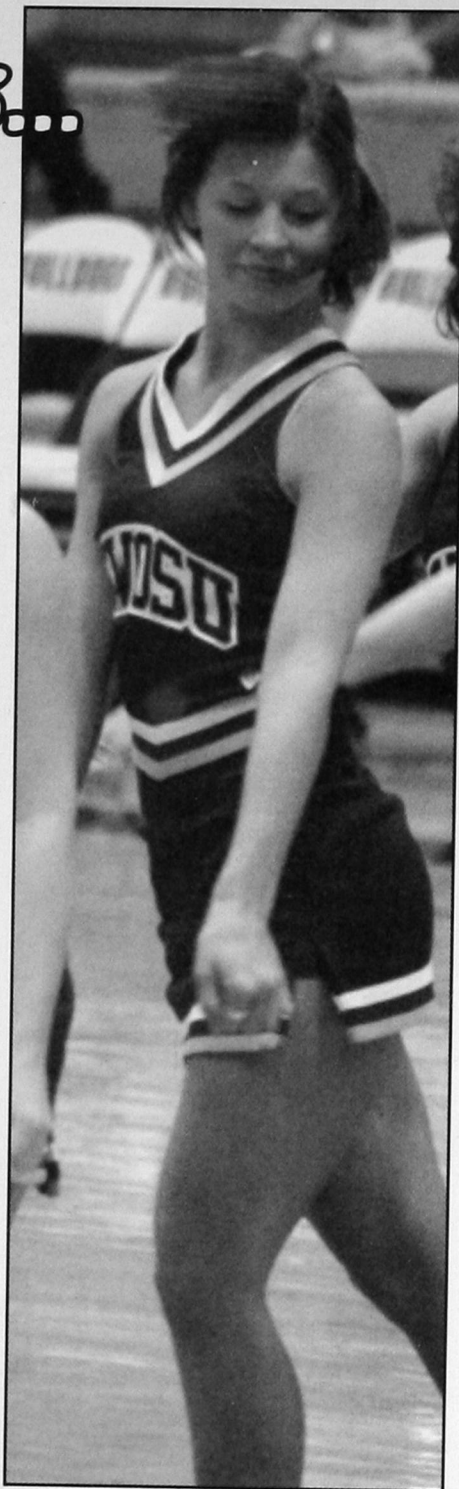

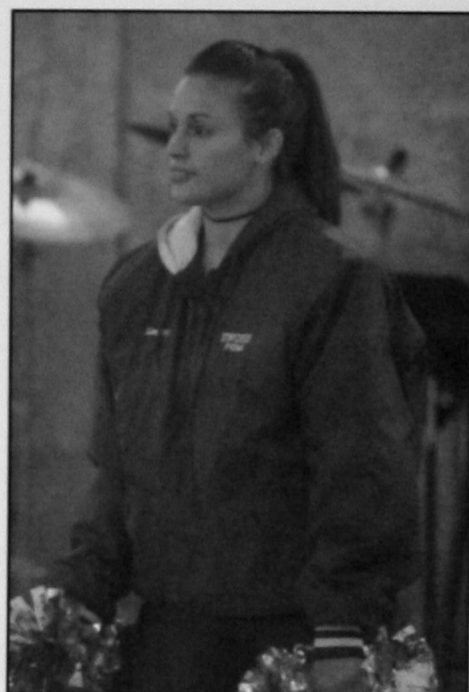

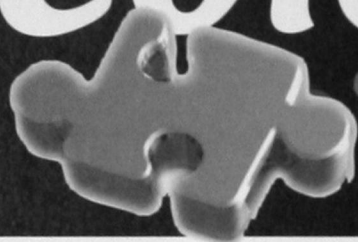
