Topic Suggestion


Here is a topic suggestion for the local branch discussions: "Men, Halflings, and Hero-Worship" by Marion Zimmer Bradley, which is the eight in a series of fifteen essays on <u>The Lord of The Rings</u> in the book <u>Tolkien and The Critics</u>, edited by Neil D. Isaacs and Rose A. Zimbardo, published by The University of Notre Dame Press. (\$7.50 hardcover, \$2.95 paperback). This is one of the most readable and enjoyable essays in the book and could be used on a discussion term broad be used be in the book, and could be used as a discussion topic when your branch discusses Tolkien. The oral reading time is a little less than 30 minutes. Some might want to read it aloudand then discuss the ideas presented, or have the moderator present the basic ideas and read bits, before beginning the group discussion.
