SWOSU Holding Auditions for Live Radio Show Production

Southwestern Oklahoma State University Department of Art, Communication and Theatre is holding auditions for a very exciting project—a live radio show.

In partnership with the SWOSU Department of Music and Wright Wradio, SWOSU will stage and broadcast *Rick Lowell, Private Eye – 'The Stuff That Dreams are Made Of'* during three different weeks in late October and early November.
