## SWOSU Mind Games Teams Win Over \$10,000 in Scholarship Money

Southwestern Oklahoma State University's two Mind Games teams were very successful during the inaugural season of the academic challenge game, which was aired this fall on KSBI-TV in Oklahoma City.
