Four Southwestern Oklahoma State University biology students in Weatherford and SWOSU Assistant Professor Dr. Andrea Holgado presented their research findings at the recent 2010 Society for Neuroscience annual meeting held in San Diego.

Carissa Fischer of Weatherford, Erica Benda of Yukon, and Taylor Baxter and Tyler Hardin, both of Broken Arrow, accompanied Dr. Holgado to the meeting that brought together 31,975 neuroscientists from around the world. The annual meeting is the premier venue for the neuroscientists to debut cutting-edge research.
