Hibler inaugurated as 15th president

The Inauguration of Dr. Joe Anna Hibler as the 15th president of Southwestern Oklahoma State University was held Friday, April 26, 1991. Almost 600 people attended the ceremony with royalty from other colleges present to induct Dr. Hibler into a prestigious group of presidents that have served this University in the past.

Many spoke on her behalf testifying to her qualifications and training that will and have enabled her to do the job at hand. Hans Brisch, State Chancellor of Higher Education stated, "We welcome you into the community of builders. We stand ready to support you as you accept this responsibility."

The ceremony itself was one of honor and excel-

lence as senior faculty members Dr. Albert Gabriel and Dr. H.F. Timmons gave Dr. Hibler the symbols of her authority which were the Medallion and Mace. Then it was official as Dr. Belva Howard, President of the Board of Regents of Oklahoma Colleges, presented her to the faculty of Southwestern Oklahoma State University as their 15th president. The faculty then gave her a standing ovation.

In her opening remarks to the audience it was clear that Dr. Hibler knew the difficulties of the task that lay before her. She of course thanked everyone; her family and friends; former Southwestern President, Dr. Leonard Campbell; and her colleagues. She also pledged her willingness to meet the needs of the student body.

Immediately following the ceremony a reception had been set up by the University Cafeteria staff headed by Duncan Taylor and Home Economics Department Chairman, Dr. Nancy McClain. The tables were adorned with white table cloths, silver services and centered with

flowers. Several students from various departments on campus served the guests.

I spoke privately with Dr. Hibler after the ceremony when her hair was less than perfect and her feet must have been hurting and simply asked her about her day. She said, "I

knew that the ceremony would be nice, but it was even nicer than I expected. One of the nicest things was getting to see many of my old classmates." And I present to you Southwestern Oklahoma State University students PRESIDENT JOE ANNA HIBLER.

SWOSU rodeo teams travel to Nationals

The SWOSU women's rodeo team and two members of the men's team have qualified for the College National Finals Rodeo which will be held June 16-22 in Bozeman, Montana.

The women's team earned the trip by winning the Central Plains Regional championship title in Dodge City, Kan. Representing Southwestern at the finals will be Jackie Barnard of Leedey, Anessa Musil of Guthrie and Kim Stamps of Norman.

Two Southwestern cow-

boys also earned trips to Bozeman. Chad Rameriz of Chandler, Ariz., qualified by winning the CPR individual title in steer wrestling, while Michael Mullen of Tecumseh will be going since he tied for 2nd in the individual calf roping competition.

In addition to being on the women's championship team, Stamps also won the CPR women's all-around title while Musil won the individual title in barrel racing.

Southwestern won the regional title by racking

up 1,210 points. Southeastern was the other CPR team which qualified for the national as the Durant school finished second with 841 points. In men's competition, Panhandle won the CPR title with 2,582 while Ft. Scott, Kan., finished second with 1,375 points. SWOSU was third with 1182.5 points.

In the final rodeo of the season held May 2-4 in Dodge City, Southwestern's women placed third while the SWOSU men tied for seventh. Ft. Hays, Kan., won the women's title while Ft.

Scott was the winner in the men's competition.

Southwestern ended doing quite well in barrel racing. Musil took 1st place in both the short go and average and 2nd in the long go. Staci Baber of Devol ended up 4th in the long and 2nd in the short go and average. Teresa Avery of Ponca City tied for 4th in the short go round.

In goat tying, Barnard tied for 3rd in the long go and Cassie Honey of LaJunta, Colo., placed 4th in the short go and 3rd in the average. Tracy Stowers of Tishomingo was the lone SWOSU cowgirl to

place as she tied for 3rd in the long go.

In men's action, Scot Quick of Cheraw, Colo., won 1st in the long go and 3rd in both the short go and average of steer wrestling. Shawn Wright of Canadian, Texas, ended up tied for 3rd in the long go of steer wrestling. Mullen ended up 4th in the long go of calf roping, while Drew Thomas of Wheeler, Texas, took 4th in the short go of calf roping. Mitch Davis of Blair teamed up with a Western State cowboy to place 2nd in both the short go and average rounds of team roping.

Students named to honors lists

Exchange program sends Dill to Russia

In the fall, students from the Universite Sorbonne Nouvelle in Paris, France, the Universite Stendhal in Grenoble, France, the Minsk State Pedagogical Institute for Foreign Languages in Minsk, Russia and The Music Pedagogical Institute in Rostov-on-Don, Russia will attend SWOSU. While students from France have previously attended school at SWOSU, Russian students will attend for the first time. In addition, nine SWOSU students will study abroad at these universities. SWOSU students participating in the exchange program in-

clude: David Dorrell, Bob Duke, Bill George, Casey Sutterfield, Kelly Shepherd, Terry Larson, Earl Dalke, Jeff Ballard and Brian Winter. To increase relations with these foreign exchange programs, Dr. Dan Dill, Dean of School of Arts and Sciences, will spend two weeks touring these universities. At the Universite Sorbonne Nouvelle, Dr. Dill will join Dr. Frances Feeley, SWOSU professor and founder of the foreign exchange program in Paris, France which is in its third year. Feeley has paved the way for additional programs. Dr. Dill and Dr. Feeley will then travel to the

Universite Stendhal before taking a train from Warsaw, Poland to the Minsk State Pedagogical Institute for Foreign Languages followed by a visit to The Music Pedagogical Institute. Although the program at the Universite Stendhal is in its first year, Dr. Feeley has personal contacts with both universities in France. Dr. Dill said that the purpose of the trips to the universities in Russia is to establish personal interaction. He went on to say, "I hope to establish working relationships with representatives of the universities,

to become more personally familiar with the environment the students will experience." In Russia, one of the Russian exchange students who will attend SWOSU will travel with Dr. Dill and Dr. Feeley. English will serve as the language of the university tours in Russia. "Their English is excellent," said Dill of the two exchange students. SWOSU hopes to expand its foreign exchange programs to include additional countries as well as languages taught at SWOSU. While in Russia, Dr. Dill

and Dr. Feeley will explore the possibility of the other two universities in Rostov as future exchange programs. Foreign exchange programs offer many advantages to students as well as the countries and universities they visit. Students gain educational and cultural knowledge as they contrast their native country to the country they are visiting. In regards to France and Russia Dr. Dill stated, "People there will get a more personal knowledge of American culture as they interact with our students."

Over 40 students from Oklahoma high schools are attending the Second Annual Southwestern Summer Science and Mathematics Academy. The Academy is directed by Dr. Harold White. The Academy, which is funded by a grant from the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, offers the experience at no cost to the students. One of the main purposes of the Academy is to bring together several bright young students, expose them to an intensive study of several topics of mod-

ern science and mathematics and closely associate them with scientists. To be accepted to the program, students had to meet two of the following requirements: rank in the top 10 percent of their class, have a 3.5 GPA in college prep classes and rank in the top 90th percentile level on the MATS, IBTS or ACT tests. Once accepted, students selected three areas of study from biology, chemistry, computer science, mathematics and physics. Southwestern faculty members instructed all of the classes. Each subject involved about eight hours of lecture, discus-

sion and laboratory work each week. Additional enrichment activities included a weekly colloquium, discussions of special topics (including possible careers, scholarships and ethics in science), viewing sessions at the SWOSU astronomy observatory, physical education and social activities. Upon completion of the Academy each participant will be asked to give a presentation to one or more of his high school science and math classes on activities in which they were involved during the Academy.

The Academy will continue to monitor the academic progress of all participants for at least two years.

Yearbooks arrive in August

Library creates network system

Al Harris Library has become the first university library in the state to successfully create a computer network capable of running CD-ROM computer disks.

The PC-based system at the Al Harris Library uses LANTASTIC software and hardware to provide public access from six diskless 386SX workstations to five CD-ROM drives connected to a 386 server. Users at the network's public access workstations may access any of the CD-ROMs, and all may access the same CD-ROM simultaneously. The system was developed by Dr. Michael Deimling, Assistant Professor of Pharmacology, under the direction of Jim Wilkerson, Serials and Automation Librarian.

CD-ROM products currently available on the network are: Reader's Guide to Periodical Literature, Social Sciences Index, and General Sciences Index. Various demonstration

disks of the ERIC database are also being tested, and more CD-ROM products will be added annually.

CD-ROM disks for computers can store the equivalent of 275,000 pages each; five disks, for example, will store all of the telephone books for every city in the United States. CD-ROM products at the library typically contain seven to ten years' worth of indexing to journal articles or research reports. This allows library patrons to search all years of a particular index in just seconds, rather than having to painstakingly search through dozens of volumes of printed indexes. The computer also enables students to create complex searches impossible to perform in printed indexes.

Until recently, a separate computer was required to run each CD-ROM disk owned by the library. New networking technology — and some innovation by Automation Librarian Jim Wilkerson and Dr.

Deimling — allows all of the CD-ROM disks to be accessed through any of six network computers. Very few libraries in the country have yet been able to create networks capable of doing this.

Future plans call for providing access to the network from every building on campus and to anyone owning a computer with a modem, as well as access to Southwestern's branch campus in Sayre. Librarians at the Al Harris Library are also in the process of "computerizing" records in the card catalog in preparation for an online computer catalog that will bring the library

up to modern standards.

Half-hour instruction sessions on usage of library CD-ROM programs will be given Monday through Friday at 8:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. from June 10th to June 28th. Instruction will take place in the northeast corner of the Library on the 1st floor. Registration is required. Please sign up at the check-out desk for the session you would like to attend.

All librarians and library organizations in the state are encouraged to visit the Al Harris Library for a demonstration of the network. For more information contact Wilkerson or David Corby at 774-3730.

The Library and the Student Center have new copy machines that use credit card-type "Copy Cards." With the cards, coins are not necessary; copies are simply debited from the card.

Copy Cards may be purchased in the Library and Student Union Snack Bar. The cards come in the following denominations:
