Six To Compete At CNFR

The following Southwestern Oklahoma State University students will be participating in the College National Finals Rodeo which will be held in Bozeman, Mont., June 14-19.

They are: LaDeana Matteson, Mooreland, Breakaway Roping; Donna Fox, Altus, Barrel Racing; Penny Hughes, Syracuse, Kan., Rodeo Queen Competition; Puddin' Payne, Stillwater, Calf Roping; Joe Leonard, Muskogee, Bronc Riding, and Jon Greenough, Abilene, Kan., Bareback Riding.

During the week of the rodeo, up-to-date information may be obtained by calling (406) 994-3120.

There are two out of the six going to the national finals who were in the top ten in the national standings. They are: Puddin' Payne, third place, 320.50, and Joe Leonard, seventh place, 231.00. Micah Lynch, seventh, saddle broncs, 378.00, did not qualify to go to the C.N.F.R.

The finals started on June 7 with the people setting up the stables at the Fairgrounds. Followed by press luncheons, parades, awards banquets, art shows, Miss Rodeo Contest, and different events which will go on until Saturday night.

Jon Greenough had this to say

about going to the College National Finals, "It feels pretty good because I have always wanted to go and this is my first time."

He also told us what he has to do to win at Bull Riding. "You have to ride for eight seconds, and the judges will judge on how well the bull bucks and how well you are under control. Monday and Tuesday I will ride, and if I score good enough I will be in the finals on Saturday," he replied.

Before his ride he likes to find out how the bull bucks and the things this particular animal likes to do. Then he gets himself mentally ready.

During the year most of the rodeo team members will have to pay for their own food and transportation when they go to different rodeos. But for the C.N.F.R. they will have some help from their rodeo held at Southwestern, the Jaycees, and from the University.

This will be everyone's first time at the C.N.F.R. except for Don Mitchell and Puddin' Payne who went last summer. When asked how his recruiting is going for next year, he had this to say, "Well it is kind of hard to say, we have some letters of intent out, but we really won't know until the College National Finals Rodeo is over."

ROTC Students Attending Advanced Camp

Twelve Southwestern State University cadets will be attending Advanced Summer Camp at Fort Riley, Kan. Advanced Camp is five weeks and four days during which college students and graduates try out campus-acquired military skills in the Army environment.

An estimated 3,000 cadets from 16 states are expected to attend this ROTC Advanced Camp in two cycles from June 2-July 21. Cadets are from colleges and universities from the central and southwestern United States. The states include Alabama, Arkansas, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Michigan, Missouri, Mississippi, New Mexico, Ohio, Oklahoma, Tennessee, Texas, and West Virginia.

More than 500 women are scheduled to attend camp this summer. Women are assigned to every company, will perform all activities of camp, and will be judged on the same standards as men cadets with one exception. The Advanced Physical Fitness Test has different standards for men and women.

Approximately five hundred members of ROTC staffs from the Second and Third ROTC Regions will compose the ROTC camp cadre. These cadre members will perform training, administrative and staff functions as required. From instructing cadets on water training at Breakneck Lake to overseeing the camp safety program, these officers and non-commissioned officers will form the nucleus of the support required to train the 3,000 cadets. Firing rifles and machine guns, wielding dummy hand grenades,

scrutinizing tasks and armored personnel carriers, inspecting land mines, rappelling towers, completing the survival course and undergoing night defense, escape and evasion and bivouac exercises. . . cadets perform all these activities and more, within the short time of camp on the 103,000 acre military reservation.

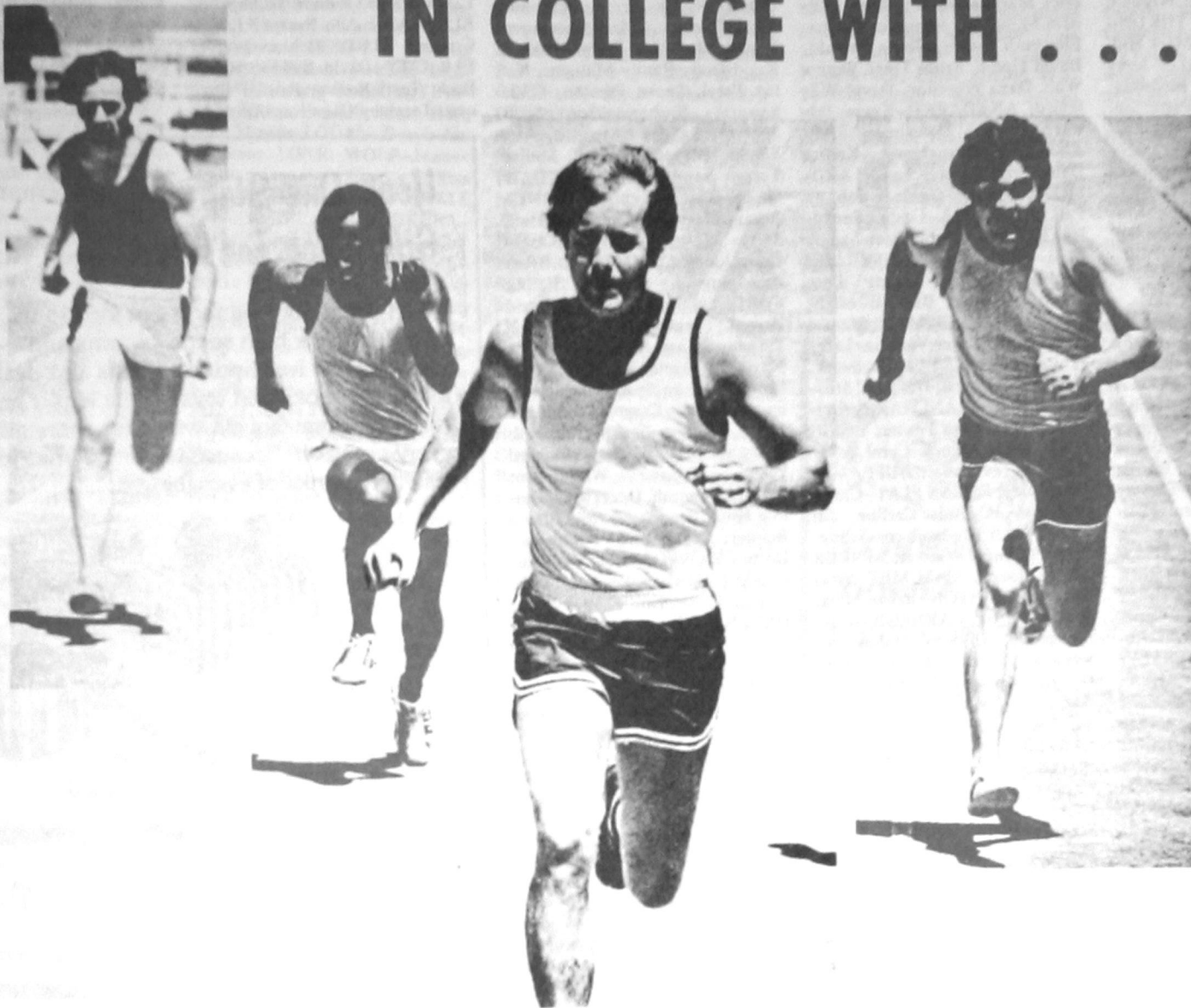

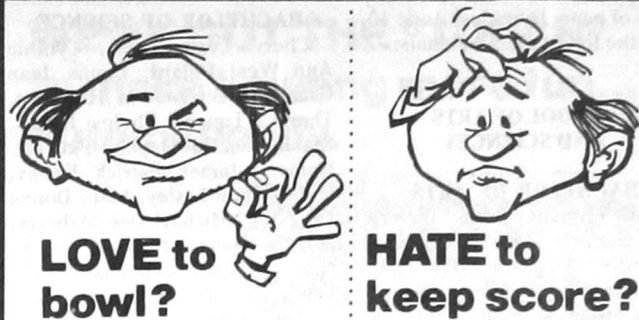

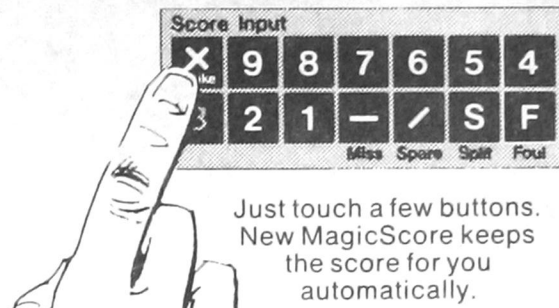
