that leans like a ship run aground.■

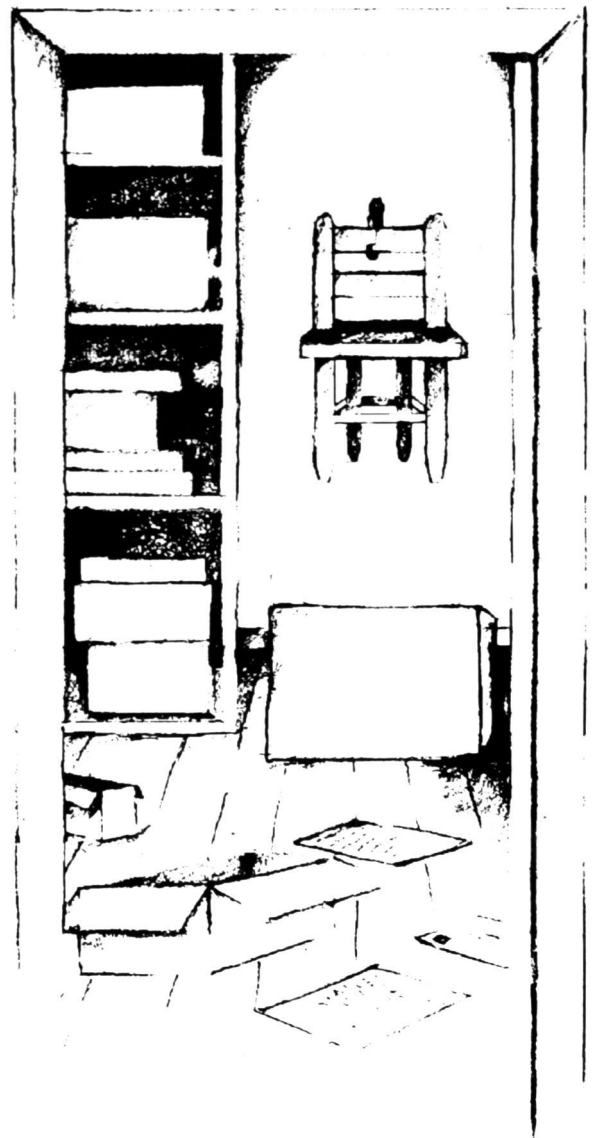
